Collectors love to tune in to radio's Golden Age

110 years ago, at Wanamaker's Department Store in New York City, there was something new in the air. Or rather, "on" the air. May 13, 1914 marked the first-ever radio broadcast in the United States, as Wanamaker's Philadelphia store transmitted phonograph music to its New York location.

Six years later, in 1920, the first local radio station, Pittsburgh's KDKA, set up shop in the garage of Dr. Frank Conrad. Interspersing local news with recorded music, KDKA also carried the first on-air commercial. When Dr. Conrad mentioned that the records he played were purchased at a local department store, the store was

With 1927's first nationwide radio hookup, America entered a "Golden Age of Radio," lasting well into the early 1950s. Its enduring appeal? Radio was the first communications medium that brought entertainment and information-drama, comedy, music, news, and plenty more-right off the stages and out of the newsrooms, into the comfort and intimacy of your own

living room. Vaudeville performers, who'd spent years trekking across the country in search of new

The Flower collection bloomed bright one last time at Strawser

WOLCOTTVILLE, Ind. — It has taken a year and three separate auctions to accomplish, but the Marilyn and Edward Flower Majolica Collection; an extensive, vibrant compilation sold via the Strawser Auction Group, is now in the hands of new owners.

Each auction had its "show-stoppers." Each was a celebration of the love Marilyn (1930-2017) and Edward (1929-2022) Flower had for this genre.

The first auction to disperse this collection took place August 23, 2023, where the circa 1856 "Art of the Earth' majolica palissy rustic basin by French artist Charles-Jean Avisseau realized \$40,000. Prices do not include the buyer's premium. Auction number two happened March 16 where a circa 1875 Minton tete-a-tete tea set; one of only three sets known sold for \$24,000. Recently, on August 20, the Grand Finale event to complete the selling of the Flower Majolica Collection was held. This final auction was held at Strawser Auction Group's facility in Wolcottville, Ind., as well as online via liveauctioneers.com.

It is only fitting Strawser was chosen to sell the Flower Collection. Many piec-

tureens and vases were common purchases and quickly filled curio cabinets, coffee tables and, finally, the entire dining room table in their spacious townhome in Bay Shore, Long Island, not far from Ed's office a few blocks away, where he enjoyed a long and successful career as a real estate attorney. Garden seats and large floor jardinières began to occupy the abundant floor space. As the years passed, the couple's collecting taste shifted a bit to Continental majolica. The large, colorful and highly detailed animal figures of the Massier Brothers, Choisy Le Roi and Hugo Lonitz found perfect homes in the Bay Shore

Teapots, game pie dishes, fish

as wall pockets, sconces, oyster plates and highly decorative mirrors came to line the walls. Finally, the neo-classical pieces consisting of vases, urns, ewers, and wine coolers found residence on the tops of cabinets."

The Flower Majolica Collection's third

Tiffany Studios lamp sparks a \$26,000 bid

DOUGLASS, Kan. — On August 24, Woody Auction hosted an impressive auction of distinctive antiques, including 26 pieces from Tiffany Studios. The sale showcased exceptional art glass hailing from a single Midwest collection, including not only Tiffany, but Daum Nancy, Galle, and Muller Fres among others. From another collection came fine Victorian-era furniture, including Eastlake, Rococo, and Renaissance Revival examples. The auction also featured bronzes, antique desk accessories, dining accouterments, and other period decor. The 368-lot sale was held live and simulcast on LiveAuctioneers.

Not surprisingly, the auction's highest bid of \$26,000 went for one of the Tiffany pieces. It was an original lily pad lamp marked Tiffany Studios #382. The 20-inch by 11-inch bronze 12-light lamp came with its original base, all original switch hardware, and all 12 of the gold Favrile shades bearing their "LCT" (Louis Comfort Tiffa-

installment consisted of 223 lots with a circa 1865 monumental Minton majolica Renaissance Revival ewer on stand leading the day. Designed by Hughes Protat and painted by Thomas Kirkby, this 23-inch-high ewer sold for \$22,000. This ewer had it all, putti in clouds, a cherub and dolphin as well as serpents and several Melusine; a figure of European folklore, a female spirit of fresh water usually depicted as a woman who is a serpent or fish from the waist down.

A 14-inch high and 14-inch wide centerpiece by George Jones featuring a giraffe and stag made \$21,000. One of only two known, this highly desirable George Jones item was once in the Anne and Robert Fromer Collection.

A Minton Neo-Classical vase with cover, circa 1865, was bid to \$18,000. Standing 30 inches high, the vase boasted a fluted 18th century Sevres style body with three rams heads conjoined by draped laurel, with three satyrs. The domed lid was decorated with a putti with pan pipes finial, all upon a circular pierced platform base with three rams head and hoof feet.

Majolica birds are always sought after. The Flower Collection final sale offered up a Hugo Lonitz majolica hawk modeled perched on a rock. This circa 1880 example stood 16 inches tall and sold for \$18,00.

Another Hugo Lonitz favorite with

buyers was the circa 1880 majolica wall pocket crafted like a conical basket with an applied bird. The basket appeared to be hanging from branches of an oak tree. This 11-inch-long beauty sold for \$6,000.

Rounding out the top eight lots of this third installment were three other pieces by Minton. A circa 1875 Aesthetic Movement pedestal having a splayed canted cornered body decorated with panels of Chinese motif with a pierced central design made \$18,000 against a pre-sale estimate of \$800-\$1,200, while a circa 1870 Minton majolica Renaissance Revival Sgraffito Azeglio vase by Thomas Kirkby, manufactured for the London International Exhibition 1871 came in at \$15,000. An iconic vulture and snake teapot and cover, circa 1874, designed by Henry Hope Crealock sold for \$17,000. The 10-inch-high teapot depicts a vulture fighting a python.


It must be noted that all three of the Flower Majolica Collection sales were fortunate to have majolica expert Nicolaus Boston curate and catalog all the items sold. After this past year's dispersal of the Marilyn and Edward Flower Majolica Collection, those active majolica collections that now include one of the Flower's pieces have surely leveled

ny) marks.

Later, a Tiffany zodiac turtleback lamp signed Tiffany Studios #541, went for \$6,500. The 14.5-inch by 10-inch by 6-inch lamp featured green panels with blue iridescence. It housed a single light and was in good working and cosmetic condition, with only a hard-to-see fracture in one

The auction's second-highest bid of \$10,000 went for a top-grade Austrian silver and enamel-covered horn. The circa 1890 piece, measuring 13 by 7.5 inches, featured hand-painted classical scenes, including cherubs and various mythological imagery. The base was adorned with a silver figure of Neptune holding the horn aloft, while the finial depicted Saint George slaying a dragon.

Bidding hit \$9,500 for a signed Galle Soufflé cameo art glass vase from the late 19th/early 20th century. The 10- by 10-inch vase was mold-blown with a highly-detailed rhododendron design, featuring yellow ground with an amethyst/orange cameo cutback overlay.

Cameo art glass continued to sell well, including a French, signed, Daum Nancy boudoir lamp from the late 19th/early 20th century that landed \$9,000. The 19.25inch by 6.25-inch lamp featured a winter scene in cameo cut and enamel. It was in good working and cosmetic condition, with

only two minor nicks on the upper interior shade ring. A complimentary Daum Nancy cameo glass piece, a vase also featuring a winter scene, reached \$8,000. The 21-inch by 7.25-inch vase was considered to be of exceptional size, form, and quality. Yet another Daum Nancy lot — a pillow vase from the late 19th/early 20th century reached \$8,000. The 4.5-inch by 5.75-inch by 5-inch vase featured cameo cutback swan decor in orange, pink, and mottled

Furniture offerings included a rosewood parlor table attributed to Alexander Roux (1813-1886) that sold for \$3,750. The French Renaissance-style table measured 30 by 40.5 by 28 inches and held a white marble turtle top. The base featured curved legs and a sectional fruit basket center adorned with detailed fruit and floral carving.

Coming close, at \$3,000 was an Eastlake-style burl walnut three-section bookcase. The three-door/three-drawer case measured an impressive 76 by 70 by 19 inches. The piece was in good condition, with its three original glass doors, and showed no apparent chips, cracks, or re-

A complimentary side-lock chest by Berkey & Gay did well at \$2,000. The six-drawer walnut cabinet measured 80 by 45 by 24 inches and was in good condition, with no apparent damage or repairs. It featured a single lock mechanism for the major drawers and another small upper drawer with its own lock. Both keys were included. The cabinet was featured in "Late 19th Century Furniture", by Brian Witherell. Two matching pieces — a bed and a two-piece vanity set - sold for \$1,600 and \$1,300 respectively.

In a different vein, an oak Regina music box bid to \$6,000. Its good-condition case measured 32.5 by 32 by 26 inches. It featured a double comb and 15 music discs. The unit was recently professionally restored and was considered to have outstanding sound.

A number of period tabletop accessories were also available. Among them was another Tiffany item — a five-piece desk set — that pulled \$1,700. The Venetian-patterned set showed no apparent damage



or repairs, and included a two-tier paper holder, a letter holder, a pair of blotter ends, and a pen tray.

The glassware portion of this auction was the first installment of what will be multiple sales.

Woody Auction will embrace the active fall auction season with an Art Glass, Lamps & Much More auction slated to happen on Saturday, Sept. 21, live and online. Expected top lots include a vase signed Galle and a vase signed Daum Nancy. Both are gorgeous French cameo art glass vases in souffle/relief from the late 19th /early 20th century.

Radio's Golden Age


created expressly for radio, were just as beloved by audiences of the 1930s and '40s as the characters on Ghosts and NCIS are by today's TV-watchers.

The difference? Outside of occasional promotional photos, what these radio characters looked like, where they lived, and how their interaction with other characters played out, existed solely within the imagination of the listener. Today, avid TV-rerun fans can recreate the domain of Andy Taylor, Opie, and Aunt Bee from The Andy Griffith Show right down to the last doily. But radio environments? Well. those existed only in the mind's eye. You may envision Fibber McGee's famed closet of noisy junk in one way. I might see it in quite another. Radio gave listeners the opportunity to imagine.


Although perceived and enjoyed as entertainment, radio was first and foremost in the business of selling things. Without "a word from our sponsor," there would be no words from the performers. Many programs became inseparable from their identifying products. "Soap operas," for instance, earned the name because nearly all were sponsored by soap manufacturers. (One of the most durable, "Oxydol's own Ma Perkins," lasted from 1933 until 1960.) Other programs made no bones about introducing their product right from the get-go. ("Jell-O again, this is Jack Benny!"; "This is Bob 'Pepsodent' Hope reminding you that it's better to have Pepsodent flowing over your teeth now, than to have water running under your bridge later!")

And, of course, there were all those premium tie-ins, yours for just a boxtop and the price of a stamp. Among the must-haves: "Lum and Abner's Family Almanac," "Don McNeill's Breakfast Club Family Album," and perhaps bestremembered, Little Orphan Annie's never-ending lineup of Ovaltine cups, shake-up mugs, and decoders.

Most Golden Age radio programs were presented "live", and the hilarious

horror stories of on-air mishaps are countless. There are apocryphal tales of rowdy newsmen waiting until one of their cohorts stepped up to the microphone, with a lengthy roll of paper freshly ripped from the teletype machine. They then set fire to the bottom of the roll. As the flames sped up, so did the announcer, reading faster and faster in attempt to get his stories out before the paper was reduced to ashes.

Sound effects men had an even more difficult time of it, since they were required to replicate, exactly on cue, almost every sound imaginable, from the clopping hooves of horses (think coconut shells being pounded in a box of dirt), to "a man being turned inside out" (the slow removal of a tight-fitting rubber glove, accompanied by the crunching of berry boxes). Among the most prized SFX memories: those which occurred at inopportune moments, such as this one from an action-packed adventure show:

"You swine! I'll take out my pistol and shoot you! Take that!" (The SFX man indicates that the prop gun is jammed; the quick-thinking actor bravely forges on:) "My gun—it's jammed! Luckily I have this knife, and I'll stab you with it! Take that!" (Gunshot, loud and clear.)

Film fans had their movie magazines. Couch potatoes in later years had TV Guide. For radio-ites, the latest program listings, and details on all their favorites, could be found within the covers of such publications as Tune In, Radio Romances (aka Radio Mirror), Radio Stars, and Movie-Radio Guide. Not only were there profiles of real-life performers, there were also articles 'written" by their fictional counterparts. ("Will Our Children Be Ready?" by "Mrs. Sam Aldrich," the mother of radio teen "Henry.")

Radio Romances offered reprints of beloved radio theme songs ("Here is Portia, the haunting tune that, each afternoon, raises the curtain on Portia

Faces Life.") Tune In profiled up-andcomers in the radio biz. ("New Singing Star Frank Sinatra Makes Feminine Hearts Flutter.") And, just in case you missed those "words from our sponsor" over the airwaves, each and every issue of each and every radio magazine offered plenty of reruns. ("Smoking less or smoking more? Call for Philip Morris!")

By the late 1940s, the glint was fading on the Golden Age of Radio. Television was the new communications craze, and the antics of "Uncle Miltie," "Lucy," and all the rest would soon captivate America. Although sputtering on into the 1960s, the heyday of the scripted radio show was over. Radio no revue, "On The Air." Please address longer took center stage. Instead, it inquiries to: donaldbrian@msn.com became a never-ending loop of music




Above: One of the earliest radio guides: "What's On The Air," September, 1930. \$10-15.

So sit back, relax, and revisit some old friends. (Or, make some new ones.) In the words of the announcer on The Lone Ranger, "Return with us now, to those thrilling days of yesteryear!"
