

Some cities are going vintage with their choice of outdoor features

Park benches and fire hydrants, traffic signals and streetlights, even drinking fountains: Like so many other things in the modern world, they don't make them like they used to. But thanks to the efforts of civic-minded municipalities, conservancy organizations, and downtown business associations, vintage fixtures are being reclaimed, restored, and reinstalled. Whether for economic or ecological purposes, or something as basic as a nostalgic desire to return to a simpler time, a number of American towns and cities have depended on experts like Barrett Williams to help preserve their past.

Working as a streetscape planner and designer, Williams' realm of influence includes decisions about such things as streetlights and traffic signals, as well as trees and brick streets. And although every project is different, overcoming the first challenge is often the same, that being to persuade "skeptical city officials" to embrace the feasibility of reclaiming these functional pieces and installing them to perform the tasks for which they were originally intended.

Supporting the argument against reuse is the claim that "old things are impractical because spare parts are no longer available and would have to be specially fabricated." Williams conceded that this is "sometimes the case;" as a result, many communities opt for replacing old fixtures with new



reproductions of the same. "Of course, by purchasing new historic replicas, such as new streetlights that possess a historic look, one can avoid the problem of unavailable parts," the St. Louis resident said.

But there's nothing like the real thing, and with ingenuity and effort, in addition to help from a number of available resources, there is little reason to compromise. As Williams (and others) counter, "The fixtures manufactured

years ago boast materials and craftsmanship superior to today's fixtures." He continued, "Using vintage fixtures is certainly responsible from an environmental-protection and resource-conservation perspective," saving these pieces from dumpsters, landfills, and city public works boneyards. The restoration of these original fixtures, he added, can ensure their operation well into the future, long after today's "flimsier counterparts" fail.

The process for restoring old fixtures begins with repairing the physical hardware. New steel parts can be fashioned to replace rusty pieces that are beyond repair; a chemical treatment might be necessary to "arrest and neutralize the rust." As for traffic signals and streetlights, they can be rewired and fitted with LED lamps. This switchover

Nautical treasures await at Northwest Ohio's Big Ship Salvage

MILAN, Ohio — Nestled in the heart of the Midwest, Ohio's Lake Erie shoreline stretches over 300 miles, offering an array of natural beauty and touring opportunities. From bustling cities to serene parks, the lake's coastline provides something for everyone. The Sandusky area offers a unique slice of Lake Erie, with a delightful blend of scenic waterfront, thrilling attractions, and small-town charms.

One of those nearby small towns is Milan, Ohio, where historic buildings and quaint shops line the picturesque town square. Milan's heritage is rich, with landmarks such as the Thomas Edison Birthplace Museum and a section of the former Milan canal, once home to a Great Lakes shipbuilding port, to explore.

Big Ship Salvage in Milan echoes the Great Lakes' maritime history with an extensive range of reclaimed nautical artifacts. They offer an extensive and ever-changing inventory perfect for collectors, designers, and restorationists looking for high-caliber nautical pieces.

Big Ship Salvage is a family-owned affair, in business since 2002. The company is owned by Jim and Kelly Unger. Jim was raised in the Lake Erie area. He worked in higher education for nearly three decades, including serving as the former president of Herzing University in Akron, Ohio. Kelly had a similar tenure managing area businesses. Their son Mitch, a graduate of Edison High School and Ohio University, eventually joined the business, bringing his knowledge of e-commerce, which has proven invaluable.

The company was originally based

in South Carolina. After deciding it was time for a career change, Jim Unger purchased it from the founder in 2002 and relocated it to Milan. It has since grown into the largest inventory of authentic nautical lighting and related nautical antiques in the country.

Their warehouse holds thousands of nautical artifacts and antiques from around the globe, with aisles lined with items like anchors, binnacles,

lanterns, portholes, and ship wheels. Unger said they work with some of the largest ship-breaking operations in the world, salvaging parts from decommissioned ships that are at the end of their useful life. They often acquire scrap from shipyards by the ton.

Most of what you will find in the warehouse and online has been painstakingly refurbished. Unger noted that the elapsed time from acquisition

to an item being available for sale can take as long as nine months. Since the items are generally salvaged from working vessels being cut up for scrap, they are covered in layers of industrial paint, rusty, and otherwise in disrepair. The staff at Big Ship Salvage removes old marine paint, polishes the

JACKSON, Mich. — More than 440 lots of antiques consisting of general store cabinets, architectural items, and 19th century hardware sold August 17 via Holler & Hammer Authentic Auctions of Jackson, Mich. All forms of buying were available bringing collectors and shoppers in droves to this event.

Leading the day was a wonderful 19th century, two-piece general store apothecary cabinet. Furniture with multiple drawers or cubbies are particularly in favor right now, and this 25-drawer example by W.B. McLean MFG was no exception coming in at \$2,350. Prices do not include the buyer's premium. The cabinet's overall height was 95 inches!

Another general store/multiple drawer item, 10 foot long solid oak paneled front counter was bid

metal, rewires lamps, refinishes wood, and makes repairs to most of the pieces. Whether onsite or online, shoppers will find a vast array of glimmering brass and polished teak.



to \$1,100, while a 21 drawer pine apothecary general store cabinet was a great buy at \$350.

Though furniture sales led the day, the decorative items are what really stole the show. Their uniqueness just stood out. For example, up for grabs was a set of five rotating, belt driven original Casablanca Fan Company ceiling fans that included the motors and full assembly. Each measured 14 inches by 17 inches by 33.5 inches with the set selling together for \$900.

A pair of 36 inch long Gothic chandeliers sold for \$500. Made of cast iron and having a pyramid shape, Holler & Hammer stated, "These are by far one of the most incredible pairs of hanging chandeliers we've ever had the opportunity to auction."

Framed stain glass windows were for sale with a late 19th century example featuring an ornate jewel floral motif bringing \$750. This beauty was 234.5 inches high by 8.5 inches wide and was an impressive 1.5 inches thick. An earlier 1800s Victorian era leaded stained glass window featuring 16 jewels sold for \$500. It measured 51.5 inches long by 19.25 inches tall, and was again 1.5 inches thick. With prism cut jewels in a myriad of colors of blue, amethyst, green, aqua and yellow, this window was a looker.

Starting the auction off in style were the first several lots made up of groups of majolica mantel floral

tiles. One set of 16 Trent tiles, each being 6 inches square in Green majolica showed minimal wear and were bid to \$450. Another set of 16 in the same design but being Fancy Pink made \$400, while a third set of 16; same design, in Amber was bid to \$350.

A 19th century Buckeye one horse drill No. 2 single horse plow, patent dated 1866 drew interest reaching \$500. The plow was made by P &

P Mast & Co. and measured 73 inches by 29 inches by 31 inches. In wonderful original condition with incredible stenciling, the plow sold with its original paper label on lid.

A wooden trade sign for "H.F. Drury, Justice of the Peace" measured 26.75 inches by 13.75 inches and sold for \$400. The sign wore its original green paint and black lettering and was made from a single board.



Textile collection of Dr. Virginia Gunn coming to Meander Auctions

WHIPPLE, Ohio – One of the most extensive, and thoroughly researched, collections of 19th century quilts, samplers, coverlets and nearly all manner of textiles will be sold at Meander Auctions in Whipple, Ohio on Sept. 28.

The consignor, Dr. Virginia Gunn, was a pioneer in the collection of 19th century textiles. At the time, textiles were largely overlooked by the collecting public. As a result, an important part of our history was totally ignored and often discarded. Gunn began collecting in the 1970s, when she bought her first 19th century dress at an auction, according to Andrew Richmond, co-owner of Meander Auctions. A highly inquisitive individual, Gunn taught home economics in New Haven, Conn. while her husband earned his Ph.D. at the Yale Divinity School.

After he attained his degree, Gunn continued her education while raising two sons, earning a master's degree in applied arts, clothing, textiles from Syracuse University, and a Ph.D. in history from the University of Akron, where she would spend the rest of her teaching career. She also served as the curator of the school's costume and textile collection.

Now in her mid-80s, Gunn is nationally recognized for her knowledge of all manner of textiles. Her collection of textiles mainly was created by early settlers from Ohio, according to Richmond. She has chosen to sell her collection so her work may continue.

There will be roughly 200 lots from Gunn's collection in the first Meander sale of Sept. 28. Given the size and quality of her lifetime collection, Meander Auctions will be offering portions of her collection in multiple auctions during the next 12-18 months, Richmond said.

The live auction will be simulcast

from the platforms of Hi-Bid and LiveAuctioneers, with previews available Sept. 23-27 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Meander's gallery. Appointments can be made for additional reviews.

Most of the items have provenance, as being a scholar, Gunn meticulously researched each piece she bought. Attesting to her work, there are 40-50 filing cabinets filled with research paperwork. "Her son is talking with several universities and institutions to donate the records to," Richmond said.

The opening auction will be an important one, according to Richmond,

there will be 75 quilts sold, "some of her best coverlets," beaded bags and other work from the local Iroquois tribe, signed and dated samplers and more.

"There are a lot of rare and exceptional pieces in this sale," Richmond said. "It's really a unique showcase of Ohio history, especially with the wide variety of art expressions and the number of signature blocks. It's plain to see that much of this work was done on a communal level, enhancing their historical value."







Collectors seek Bossons line of chalkware heads

W.H. Bossons and his son W. Ray Bossons founded W.H. Bossons, Ltd. in Congleton, England, in 1948. Bossons, Ltd. was a ceramics company that specialized in ceramic wall masks (Bossons Head Plaques), animals, barometers, thermometers, bookends, mirrors, lamp bases, pottery figurines, and many other decorative ceramic pieces.

Dr. Robert Davis (The Imagical World of Bossons, Book 1) stated that the history of the Bossons companies was essentially the story of two men, and "to borrow a phrase from Charles Dickens, a tale of two cities, or, to be more exact, a tale of two towns in England."

The towns that played such an important part in the lives of W.H. and W. Ray Bossons were Stoke-on-Trent, a manufacturing center in Staffordshire, England, and Congleton, a small rural community about eight miles north of Stoke-on-Trent where W.H. Bossons established his ceramic factories.

Both father and son Bossons were schooled in Stoke-on-Trent, so it is here, in this potteries district of England, that their love of all things ceramic began. W. H. Bossons graduated from the Burslem School of Art in Stoke, and he went on to be an honors student at Stoke-on-Trent College of Ceramics. Bossons son, W. Ray, followed in his father's footsteps and trained in pottery making at the Burslem School of Art in Stoke.

W. Ray Bossons served for six years in the British Royal Artillery during World War II. In October of 1946, he returned to Congleton where he helped his father found W.H. Bossons, Ltd.

Both men brought special talents to the company they founded. In 1944 W. H. Bossons'

health became a major concern, and he moved to Congleton to basically live out his life. Looking for something to occupy his time, he began to form lead soldiers and, using plaster, to make Christmas ornaments. Bossons' technical skills that included mold making allowed him to build his own molds for casting lead soldiers and plaster molds for the ornaments he created. What started out as a hobby soon


became a profitable business as people not only urged him to create but also paid him for his work.

His son, W. Ray, also had special talents that helped Bossons, Ltd prosper. Prior to World War II, W. Ray trained in advertising and publicity. In 1938 he became a Diploma Member of the Advertising Association of London. He also attended Manchester University, taking a Federation of Master printers' course in printing technology. For a short time, he worked for Smedley Advertising at Stoke-on-Trent that specialized in ceramic designs for local potteries.

W.H. Bossons died in 1951. W. Ray continued heading Bossons, Ltd. for the next four decades, stopping production and closing the company in 1996 just three years before his death in 1999.

Today, collectors search for anything

Bossons, Ltd. produced; however, one of Bossons most collected wares is its line of Character Head Plaques. Sometimes these heads are miss-called Bosson Heads, but in reality they are Bossons Heads, named for W. H. Bossons who created them.

Bossons Heads were made of high-quality chalkware. Chalkware is actually an American term for figurines made of molded plaster of Paris. The figurines are usually painted with oil paint or watercolors. Chalkware has been popular in three separate historic periods. The last period was the Mid-century Modern period when decorative lamps, figurines, and wall décor were made of chalkware, roughly from the late-1940s – 1960s. This is the time period that Bossons, Ltd. was at its height, turning out thousands of pieces of chalkware wall décor heads. Each piece was hand-painted with a 3D effect.

Many chalkware designers existed during Mid-Century Modern, but it was Bossons, Ltd. that gave the world an inexpensive, highly decorative line of chalkware heads, of both men and women. These heads represented people from all walks of life, and it was almost guaranteed that a homeowner could find a set of heads that reminded the homeowner of friends or family or some historic figure.

Most Bossons Character Head Plaques remain inexpensive with the average piece selling for less than \$30, but some rare pieces are offered on Internet auction sites, such as eBay, for thousands of dollars.

“significantly” reduces not only energy consumption but also saves labor costs in years to come, due to the fact that the new lights require less frequent changing than the traditional incandescent halogen bulbs. As Williams said, “The LED retrofit will usually pay for itself through cost savings in a short period of time.”

And then there is the additional economic “plus,” one resulting from an increase in tourism.

But dollars-and-cents advantages are not the only benefits associated with using vintage fixtures, according to Williams. Speaking of their aesthetic impact on a community, he said that it is worth retaining older streetscape elements because they are “critical to providing proper historical ‘context’ to a city’s cherished landmark buildings and streetscapes.” He continued, “For a historic district to truly be a success, compatible streetscape elements are required to provide proper context to the historic buildings.”

To illustrate this point, Williams, who, in 1992, founded the now-defunct American Streetscape Society, cited several examples of streetscapes that have benefited from his expertise (and that of others). Among his favorite projects is his work in a town that served as the backdrop for a motion picture. “I was heavily involved in the historic-streetlight project in Greenwood, from 2010 to 2020,” he said, noting that “The Help” was filmed in 2010 in this Mississippi city. Williams recalled that the film crew was “thrilled” to discover period traffic signals and included them in the movie.

The city of Seattle is home to “a revered downtown historic district,” the

Pioneer Square Historic District, that, like Greenwood, features a number of historic vintage stoplights. Managed by the nonprofit Alliance for Pioneer Square, this protected area is regarded as the city’s “most authentic, engaging and dynamic neighborhood.”

Williams credited streetscape planner Gene Carpenter for the major role she played some years ago in the preservation and renovation of the many historic squares (mini parks) located throughout Savannah. Carpenter was successful in finding and procuring historically-correct replicas of streetlights, litter bins, and benches, for the city’s iconic squares, Williams said.

The Kentucky town of Maysville, a historic Ohio River town, “wisely” chose to retain its old “torch” streetlights downtown and revamped them with new LED lamps, he continued. And then there are the iconic benches that have served generations of visitors to New York City’s Central Park.

As for sourcing vintage fixtures, this is one step in the process that has become less difficult than before. “Collectors are now rather easy to find, thanks to the internet,” Williams stated, noting that after years of working in the field of streetscape planning and design, “I know there are private collectors of traffic signals and streetlights, and I suspect there are collectors of benches, fire hydrants, telephone booths, and drinking fountains, too. There are collectors of everything.” Many times, he added, collectors bring to the table the electrical skills that are vital to restoration projects.

One such collector is Willis Lamm, a retired firefighter and longtime collector

of traffic signals, streetlights, and related items. Featured in a February 20, 2024, front page story of “AntiqueWeek,” Lamm has worked with Williams on a number of projects, with Lamm describing his colleague as “pretty much Gandalf the Wizard when it comes to historic preservation and repurposing various vintage amenities and street furniture.”

Lamm’s extensive collection is the culmination of a lifelong interest in electronics and making things work. But there’s more to collecting “street furniture” that they find appealing. “Most collectors who I know, myself included, have a sense of nostalgia for how things were when we were growing up.” It’s this attraction to “classic Americana” that continues to drive him. And although “some of us like having examples in our ‘personal museums,’” he concluded, “it can be thrilling to see historic examples still in service for the public to appreciate.”






