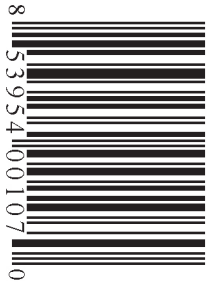

Breaker-Breaker: Hit the airwaves with collectible CB radios

In an age when you can access everything from turn-by-turn directions to weather reports on your phone, it's hard to imagine the Citizen's Band (CB) radios were once important communication tools. They were a lifeline for truckers and a simple way for people to connect with the touch of a button.

For those who remember, the turning of a channel dial and chatting with a friend over the crackling static of a CB was nothing short of magical. Vintage CB radios now offer collectors a nostalgic link to 1970s technology and popular culture.

CB radio has been around since the late 1940s. It's part of the Federal Communication Commission's (FCC) "personal radio services" which use low-power, short-range radios for personal communication without requiring a license.

In its early days, CB radio provided a communication tool for rural residents and long-haul truckers, keeping them connected and informed about matters like traffic details and weather conditions. CB's popularity surged in the 1970s due to technological advances and media portrayals in films like "Smokey and the Bandit," TV shows like "The Dukes of Hazzard," and songs like CW McCall's "Convoy," which showcased how CB radios fostered camaraderie while capturing the rebellious spirit of the era.

The CB radio sparked a vibrant subculture with its own distinctive language. Operators adopted creative "handles" like "Silver Fox" to identify themselves. Unique lingo emerged, including terms like "breaker-breaker" for initiating contact and "10-4" for acknowledgment. This CB craze quickly spread, with everyone from plumbers in work vans to stay-at-home mothers chatting with their "good buddies" on their CB rigs.

CB's halcyon days were short-lived. By the 1980s, new technologies like cell phones and Family Radio Service (FRS) radios started eclipsing CBs. Nonetheless, CB radios are still used and sold today; truckers, RVers, rural folks, and preppers, rely on them for reliable communication, particularly in areas with poor cell coverage.

The Citizen's Band covers frequencies in the 27-megahertz band, just above

short-wave and amateur radio frequencies. Initially, the spectrum was divided into 23 channels. The earliest CB radios used vacuum tubes and rarely offered all 23 channels. Early radios typically offered 3-6 channels and buyers would purchase electronic crystals for the channels they wanted to use. For instance, channel 19 was popular with truckers, channel 9 was allocated for emergency communication, and low-power walkie-talkies, often made for children, used channel 14.

By the early 1970s, solid-state

electronics replaced vacuum tubes, and CB radios for both mobile and home use came with all 23 channels as standard. Handheld units still relied on plug-in crystals and generally offered only 1 to 3 channels.

In 1977, the Citizen's Band service expanded from 23 to 40 channels, marking a major upgrade. At the same time, technology shifted from crystal control to digital tuning, making 40-channel radios with digital readouts the new standard.

The FCC limited CB radios to five

watts of transmission power, providing a range of around 3-10 miles, depending on terrain, antenna, and weather. A more sophisticated variety known as single-sideband (SSB) could transmit at 12 watts, giving it further range, but required both users to have SSB radios.

Autographs from Declaration signers penned \$16,000 bid

WASHINGTON, Pa. — From Presidential autographs and classic automobiles to advertising memorabilia and a movie star's undergarments, a recent auction conducted by Joe R. Pyle Auctions reflected a wide range of American history. One of the stars of the two-day sale, which included some 1,100 lots, was a "massive" framed display, showcasing a copy of the Declaration of Independence flanked by images and signatures of each of the 56 members of the Second Continental Congress. It sold for \$16,000.

History buffs also vied for two similar displays, one containing images and signatures of the first 44 American Presidents, and the other, the signers of the United States Constitution. Winning bids were \$15,000 and \$11,000, respectively.

The sale, held on August 6 and 7 at Pyle's Washington, Pa., location, featured the holdings of a prominent Pittsburgh businessman, who spent five years traveling the world, making careful purchases, and keeping detailed records of his treasures, which were stored in a climate-

trolled warehouse. But his plan to open a museum of Americana in Pittsburgh's Strip District was sidetracked, thereby

leading to the sale of his inventory.

The first two sessions of what will ultimately be an eight-session auction drew hundreds of in-person attendees and approximately 3,000 bidders on four different online platforms, according to Garrett Wilkerson. Speaking for the auction company, which is headquartered in Shinnston, West Virginia, Wilkerson called the coordination of the sale "a clerking masterpiece." Enthusiasm for the much-anticipated auction led to coverage on "Pittsburgh Today Live," a local television show, he noted.

It didn't take long for bids to soar: Early on the first day, the costume worn by Christopher Reeves in "Superman III" made \$5,100.

The auction revved into high gear with the sale of a 1967 green Chevrolet Corvette; sporting a white top and leather interior, the car, with an odometer reading of 87,517, sold for \$52,000. Bids for a 1957 turquoise Corvette raced to \$66,500, while

Antique oil pull Rumely tractor scores \$12,760 at Mecum auction

WALWORTH, Wis. — There may have only been 30 lots in Mecum online Southern Wisconsin Tractors Collection sale; but they drew bidders and extraordinary bids. The auction featured a selection of 16 antique and vintage tractors, including two Rumely oil pull models from the 1920s.

Although the two most historic tractors drew the most attention, neither grabbed the auction's highest bid. That honor went to a 1960 Farmall B450 diesel, which fetched \$13,310 from 64 bids. This rare English-built model featured a unique direct-start 4-cylinder 55 HP diesel engine, unavailable in U.S. tractors of the time. It came with 2-wheel drive, a 3-point hitch, and new rear tires, but its operating condition was unknown.

The 1923 Rumely Oil Pull 16-30 secured second place with a final bid of \$12,760. Although its operating condition was unknown, the tractor featured a horizontal two-cylinder engine



powered by a kerosene Higgins carburetor, delivering 16 HP on the drawbar

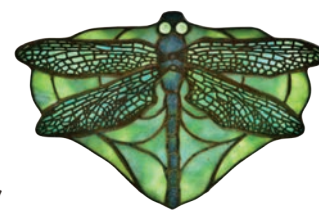

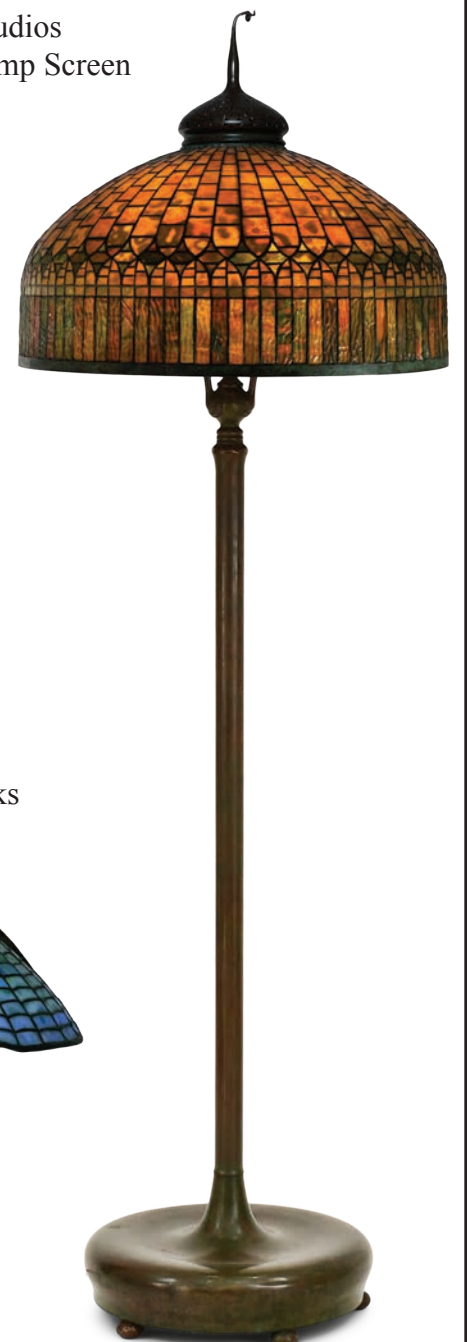

a 1954 Corvette with a red exterior and interior made \$56,500. A red 1960 Chevrolet Corvette with low mileage (under 10,000 miles) sold for \$70,000, and another General Motors product, this one, a 1958 Cadillac DeVille with a pink and purple exterior and a pink interior, topped out at \$33,000.

Other automobiles sold on the first day of the multi-day auction included a 1924 Ford Model T roadster, black exterior with a black top and black leather interior (\$10,500); and a 1931 Ford Model A "deluxe roadster," red and black exterior with a tan top, \$19,500. A 1957 red Ford Thunderbird brought \$47,000, and a 1972 Delorean DMC-12 coupe made \$41,500.

A myriad of advertising signs were hammered down in the course of the first day's eight hours of bidding. A sampling of what was sold includes a 1920s tin sign for "Drink Orange Squeeze/In Bottles Only" (\$250) and a 1920s porcelain sign with the words "Maryland Casualty Company Automobile Insurance" (\$500). A bright yellow sign with bold red lettering ("Hershey's Ice Cream"), dating from the 1920s, topped out at \$525, while a "Hershey's Chocolate" ice cooler from the same time period went for \$2,300.

Coin-operated machines in the sale included one from the 1920s, "Have Your Fortune Told by Hobo the Bum" (\$450); a 1940s "Hershey's Chocolate" dual column vending machine (\$250); and a 1920s "Wrigley's 5 Cent Gum" vending machine (\$500).

License plates were well-represented. A 1906 Pennsylvania porcelain plate, number 4181, sold for \$1,000; a 1908 Pennsylvania plate, number 21236, made \$850; and a 1910 Pennsylvania license plate, number 12848, brought \$700. Also of interest were an unrestored vintage Atlantic City rickshaw rolling chair (\$450); a 1920s wheeled all-season sled called a "Kne-Koster" (\$180); and a vintage wooden sign pointing the way to Kennywood, a popular Pennsylvania amusement park (\$500).

On day two, the stars came out at a ten-hour session. As Wilkerson observed, "There were tons of Marilyn Monroe items." Prices realized for memorabilia associated with the movie star, now dead

for 60 years, were strong. Multiple pieces of her clothing were sold at the auction, including a framed lot displaying her fur cape with an autographed photo (\$2,200). Personal items included the bloomers she wore in the movie "Baby Doll" (\$1,500); a bra, accompanied by images from "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes" (\$4,300); and a black half slip, authenticated by a handwritten letter from Joe DiMaggio and accompanied by a calendar illustration (\$1,000). Among her accessories sold was a grouping that included a compact mirror case, signed purse, and photos (\$2,000); black high

heels and a white pillbox hat (\$4,200); and a pair of pink gloves (\$2,200). A framed page from her high school yearbook, featuring a picture of her taken during her sophomore year, brought \$550.

And then there were those items associated with individuals on the other side of the law. A framed handwritten note from Charles Manson, signed and illustrated with a swastika, made \$500; signed cuts of Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow brought \$700; and John Dillinger's handgun, accompanied by letters and photographs, shot up to \$2,250.

Other noteworthy items included a \$1 bill, hammered down at \$3,200 in light of the fact that it had been signed by Babe Ruth; and a framed cream-colored pleated shirt worn by Elvis Presley, \$4,800.

But this is just the beginning, as the third session of this auction, set for October 15, will feature memorabilia from the world of sports and music, including signed guitars and Beatles items. The fourth session, on October 16, will include militaria dating from the Revolutionary and Civil Wars and beyond. The dates for the four final sessions of this extraordinary sale will be announced at a later time.

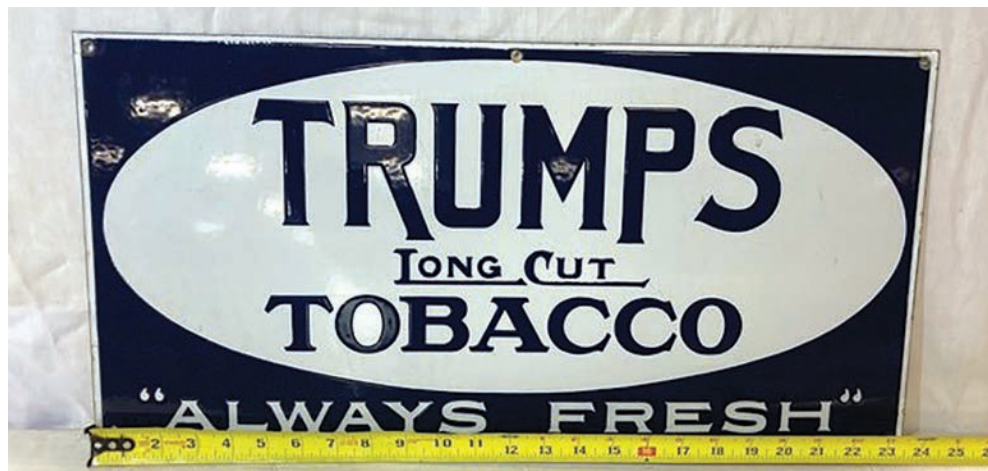

and 30 HP on the belt. It was equipped with steel wheels, a steel frame, a full canopy, and rubber on the rear wheels.

The other oil pull rig, the 1928 Rumely 25-40 X, achieved fourth place. It bid to \$7,535 from 45 offers, surpassing its reserve price of \$6,600. It featured steel wheels and frame, a full canopy, a spoke flywheel, new spark plugs, and a Bosch magneto ignition. Another \$7,535 was bid for a 1937 John Deere B, which boasted round spoke rear wheels, new rubber all around, and expo-quality paint.

Eleven more vintage Farmall tractors were available, including a 1954 Farmall Super M-TA diesel that took third place at \$8,085 on 41 bids. The

restored rig had a PTO, belt pulley, clamshell fenders, stainless steel muffler, front and rear weights, and a toolbox. Bidding went to \$5,060 for a 1940 Farmall International Model AV. The rare wide-front unit was believed to be a prototype. It had a rebuilt magneto, PTO, pulley attachment (no pulley), and new rubber.

The other Farmalls included models H, Super H, M, and Super M, spanning the 1940 to 1954 model years. All were sold as-is. Winning bids varied from \$440 for an original, unrestored Model H, which featured a PTO, fenders, rear weights, and a belt pulley, to \$6,435 for a 1954 Farmall Super H, equipped with a PTO, belt pulley, drawbar, a new seat, and nearly new tires.

Paper calendars still appeal to us

Despite every smart phone having a calendar; paper calendars still hang in almost every home, office, and business in America. Many of these calendars are looked at solely for the beautiful photographs, artwork, or daily prayers that adorn them.

Archaeologists believe timekeeping in general began in prehistoric times as early as the Neolithic Age. The first known calendar dates to the Bronze Age. The Gregorian calendar was introduced as a refinement of the Julian calendar in 1582, and, today, the Gregorian calendar remains the world's most used secular calendar.

The word "calendar" is taken from the Latin word "calends," which was the term used for the first day of the month in the Roman calendar. Calends is related to the verb calare that means, "to call out," referring to the announcement of a new moon. The Latin term was adopted into Old French as the term calendier and later into Middle English, circa 13th century, as calender. The word "calendar" is an Early Modern English word.

An easy field test for the age of a calendar, besides the year printed on the calendar, is the calendar's illustrations. Most modern calendars use photographs as illustrations; however, vintage calendars were most often illustrated with prints of paintings or other artwork. Many famous artists, such as N. C. Wyeth, Andrew Wyeth, and Norman Rockwell have had

their work used to illustrate calendars.

Vintage Coca-Cola calendars have always been collectible because of their Santa Claus illustrations for the month of December. Pin up calendars are collected for the models that illustrate the calendar, such as Marilyn Monroe illustrated the Golden Dreams pin up calendar from 1955. A copy of this calendar is occasionally offered on eBay for around \$200.

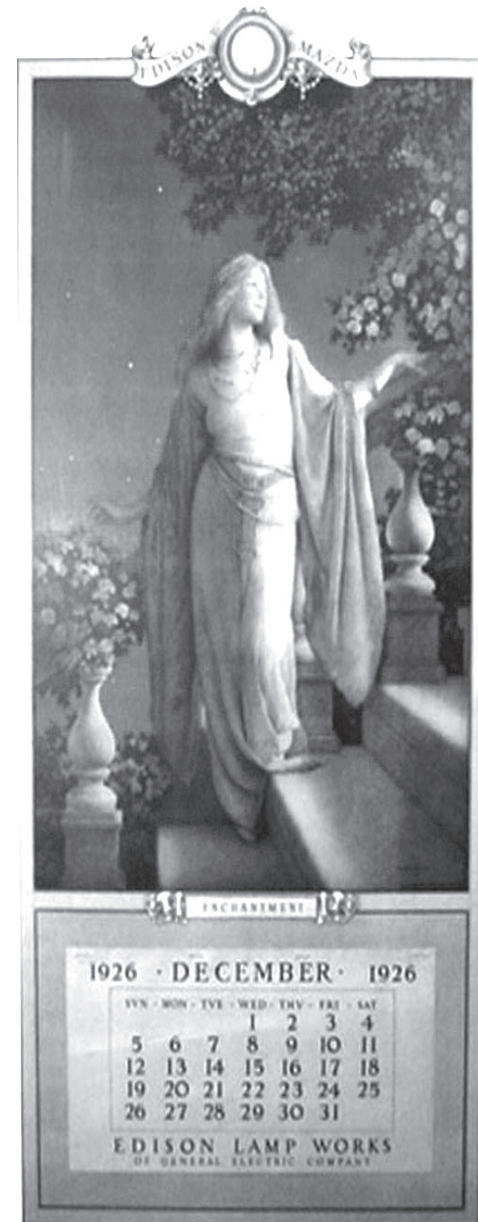
Fishing and firearm calendars are some

of the most highly sought after collectible calendars. Winchester Arms, Peters Cartridge Company, Remington, Shakespeare fishing calendar, and other outdoor game and fish calendars are some of the most collected calendars in America. Recently, a Ruger Firearms advertising calendar from 1976 was offered on eBay for \$250.

Novice calendar collectors may want to begin with inexpensive, modern calendars. Many of these may be obtained free simply by asking for one. Investment calendars should be chosen carefully with the future in mind.

Fontaine's will bring lighting and windows to Sept. 28-29 auction

PITTSFIELD, MASS. — Tiffany lamps and art glass will shine brightly at Fontaine's Two-Day Fine & Decorative Arts Auction Sept. 28-29.

Fontaine's is renowned for its aptitude for curating fine Tiffany lamps to bring to auction and this sale will not disappoint with a robust selection of choice examples. Expected to lead the auction is a Tiffany Studios "Laburnum" table lamp estimated at \$300,000 to \$500,000. This design came from the imagination of Clara Driscoll, then the head of Tiffany's female-led glass cutting department. This circa 1905 example, standing 30 inches tall, is even more rare owing to its "Bird Skeleton" base. The shade is impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York" and the base is impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 442."

On offer from another collection is a "Peony Border" floor lamp, a pattern name that immediately catches collectors' attention. The circa 1915 lamp in this sale, estimated at \$125,000-\$175,000, has a "Chased Pod" Senior floor base and a "Pig Tail" finial. The shade is impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 1574," the base is impressed "Tiffany Studios, New York, 376" and the lamp stands 78 3/4 inches tall.

Also worth noting is a set of four Tiffany Studios Turtle-Back ceiling lights (\$80,000-\$120,000), circa 1905, featuring rare red background glass, coming out of a private collection in California.

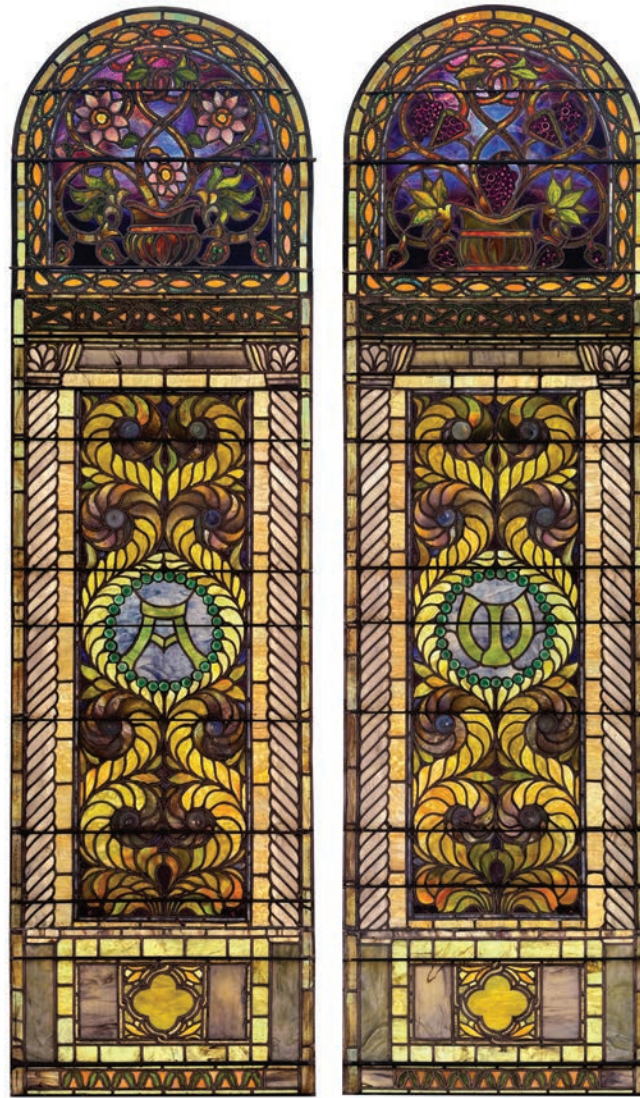
Leaded and stained glass Tiffany windows were such a popular product for the company around the Turn of the 20th Century that the firm created a whole department, Tiffany Glass Lamp; Decorating Co., to deal with them. Most were consigned from churches and today are highly desirable by private collectors.

Several fine windows are featured in the auction, led by a circa 1897 pair of "Alpha" and "Omega" windows (\$80,000-\$120,000), 96 1/4 inches tall, which came from the Church of the Transfiguration in Pottstown, Pa.

Boasting fine provenance and demonstrating the strong artistic collaboration between Louis Comfort Tiffany and Associated Artists is a pair of lanterns made for the "Moorish" smoking room in the Cornelius Vanderbilt II Mansion (\$80,000-\$120,000). The circa 1881 fixtures were also once in the collection of the late singer John Denver and are 33 1/2 inches tall. Additionally, there is a Tiffany Studios "Curtain Border" chandelier which once hung in the dining room of John Denver's Aspen, Colorado, Starwood Home.

While Tiffany and other lamps may seem to dominate the auction block the first day, there will be no shortage of other fine items commanding attention.

ly scooping up both large and small sculptures in stone, bronze and other media to enhance their outdoor living areas. Several sculptures that make quite a statement and require thoughtful placement due to their size, are on offer here with each estimated at \$10,000-\$15,000. A Robert Holmes bronze sculpture, "Spinning Dancer," standing 83 by 56 by 49 inches, from The Ledgerock Collection, overlooking the Hudson River; Additionally, there is a monumental head of a man by sculptor Roy Kanwit, carved circa 1990s in concrete and steel, 116 by 85 by 106 inches.

CB Radios

Because of their power restrictions, the differences among CB radios are mainly in configuration and features. The four varieties are mobile radios powered by a vehicle's 12-volt battery and which require an external antenna; base stations for tabletop use which can be plugged into a wall outlet and typically require an external antenna; battery-powered handhelds with built-in antennas; and self-contained emergency units which come with the radio, antenna, microphone, and 12-volt plug in a carrying case.

Several brands of CB radios rose to prominence and are now highly sought after by collectors.

Cobra Electronics: Founded in 1961, Cobra is almost synonymous with CB radios and is still active today. The "148 GTL," notable for its dynamic microphone and noise filter, was a trucker favorite due to its durability and clear sound.

Midland: Established in 1959, Midland is the oldest existing CB radio manufacturer. They produced a range of radios from early crystal-controlled models to 40-channel solid-state rigs.

Pace: Entering the market in 1972, Pace initially offered the 23-channel "123" and the single-sideband "SSB" model. They were known for affordable mobile

and base units until around 1980.

President Electronics: Known for models named after U.S. presidents, President was acquired by Uniden around 1978. The single-sideband "President Washington" base station, with adjustable power and other advanced features, became a status symbol among CB enthusiasts.

Radio Shack: Offered various brands' tube-type CB radios starting in 1961. They began offering units under their Realistic label in 1965. Realistic Navajo base stations and handhelds were particularly popular.

Uniden: This Japanese company gained prominence in the 1970s and continues to produce CB radios. They also rebranded radios for other companies, including Midland and Radio Shack.

Other notable sellers included major retailers like JCPenney, Montgomery Ward, and Sears, with CB radios typically made by Japanese firms such as Hitachi.

Vintage CBs are easy to find at yard sales and flea markets. Online marketplaces like eBay and Craigslist often have listings, but prices tend to be inflated. Hamfests, which are radio shows for amateur radio hobbyists, can be particularly good sources of old CBs.

With brand-new CBs running as low as

\$30, prices for vintage remain reasonable. Factors, including brand, model, condition, and rarity affect value. Common models can be picked up for \$5-\$15 for untested units. Everyday models in working condition will run as much as \$50. Some of the more popular radios like the Cobra 148 GTL or Pace CB145 can run \$50-\$100 in working condition. Popular base stations and single-sideband models, like the President Washington or Realistic Navajo, can exceed \$150, particularly if restored.

Because CB enthusiasts can easily buy brand-new radios, the biggest determinant of value in a vintage rig is whether it's working or not. However, because they need to be connected to an antenna and electrical source, it's often impractical or impossible to test old CBs where they are found. It's best to assume they are non-working unless the seller has the rig connected to demonstrate, or an online seller with a solid reputation has represented the rig as working. Be prepared to pay a premium for radios in those situations.

Incidentals like packaging don't affect value much, but features do. For instance, having the microphone is important, even though microphones are relatively easy to replace. The same goes for mounting hardware if the goal is to use the CB in a vehicle. Collectors also value upgrades that improved communication. Those include: automatic noise limiter (ANL) also known as a noise blanker which helps static from electrical interference; microphone gain which boosts the audio output of the microphone making the transmission sound louder; radio

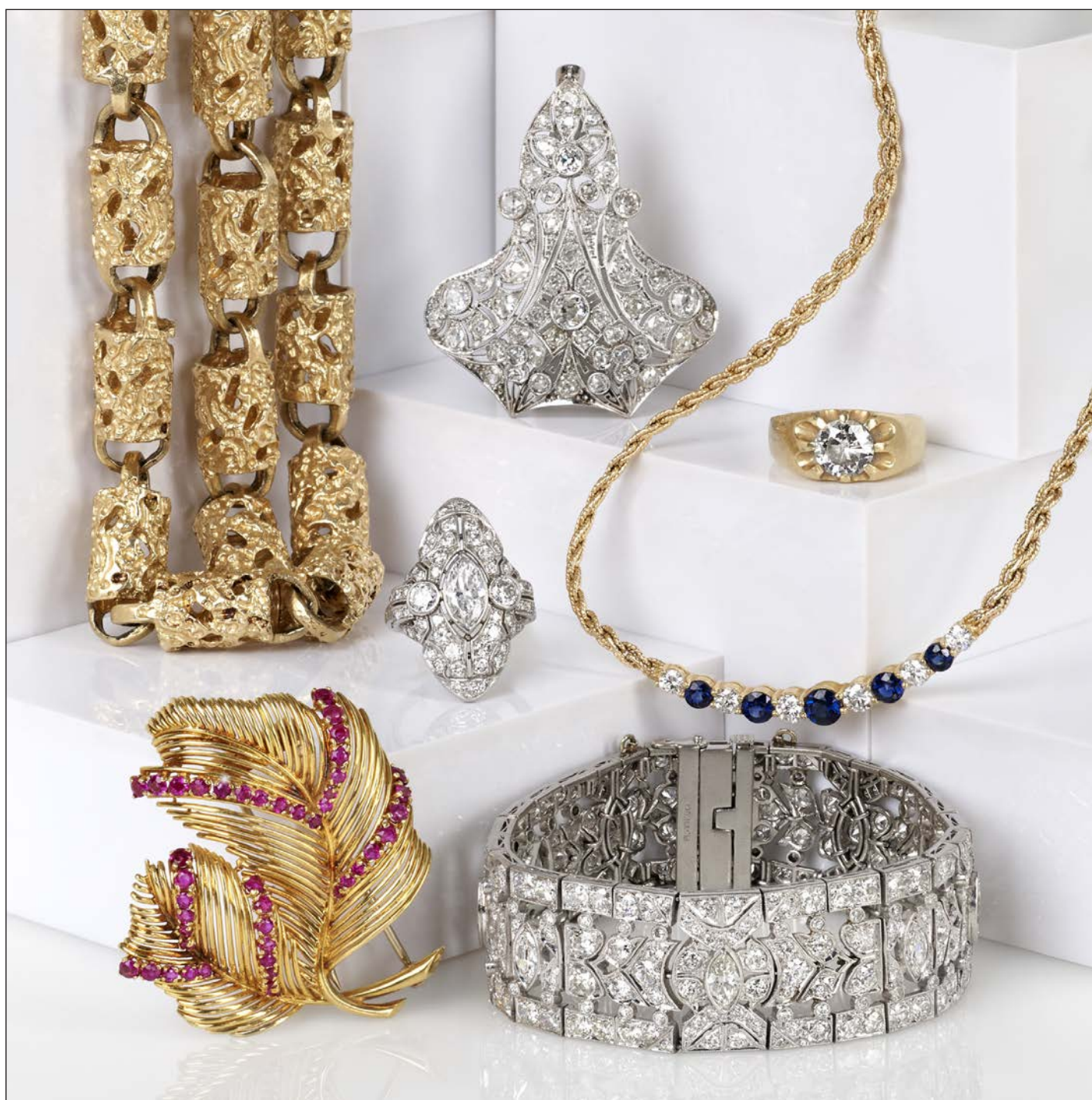
