

Discover Art Deco elegance in everyday objects


The appeal of modernism shows no signs of waning. Yet, the focus of collectors is evolving. Where mid-century design once reigned supreme, there is growing enthusiasm for the wider array of modernist styles. Notably, the sophisticated charm of Art Deco and the sleek lines of Streamline Moderne are attracting a fresh wave of collectors.

For those new to the world of Art Deco, its origins trace back to France around 1910. The style gained prominence after being showcased at the 1925 International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts (Exposition Internationale des Arts Décoratifs et Industriels Modernes) in Paris. The style celebrated modernity, social progress, and the allure of machine-made creations, while simultaneously embodying the glamor and opulence of its time.

Art Deco blended perfectly into the "Roaring Twenties," capturing the extravagant essence of flapper culture and the Jazz Age. As it barreled into the 1930s, designers pivoted to meet economic challenges with practical, yet still elegant, designs. By the early 1940s, Art Deco evolved again, as designers adopted sleek streamlined motifs.

The Art Deco movement is most celebrated for its transformative effect on architecture in the 1920s and 1930s. Its distinctive flair can be seen in the era's majestic skyscrapers built in cities like Chicago and Detroit, as well as in more approachable forms, like the charming hotels that grace Miami's South Beach. Yet, the impact went well beyond architecture, transforming everyday items into works of art. From furniture and glassware to kitchen appliances, each was reinterpreted with the movement's hallmark clean lines and streamlined forms.

The style often featured bold vertical elements juxtaposed against more

understated horizontal lines. Both symmetry and deliberate asymmetry were employed. Motifs included repetitive geometric patterns such as triangles, trapezoids, and zigzags, alongside elegant concentric arches and smooth, rounded edges. Designers occasionally incorporated

Collectors reeled in great information at ORCA event

FRANKFORT, KY – Everyone knows about the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky bourbon, but what about the Kentucky reel?

A style of baitcasting reel used in the 1800s to catch black bass that flourished in Midwestern rivers and streams, the Kentucky reel was as well-known across the country by 1900 as the state's famous derby and equally famous bourbon.

In mid-September, it had center stage at the annual convention of the Old Reel Collectors Association (ORCA) which lured about 75 members to the Capital Plaza Hotel in Frankfort to buy, sell and admire hundreds of antique fishing reels.

Frankfort holds a special place for antique reel collectors since it's considered the home of the Kentucky reel. In the 1830s, Frankfort jewelers Benjamin and Jonathan Meek modified a bait-casting reel for a local doctor who wanted it to work better, and thus was born the Kentucky reel. Over the decades, well-crafted fishing reels made by the Meeks and other Kentucky makers set the bar for high quality, finely tuned reels.

The ORCA convention featured many Kentucky reels ranging in price from \$500 to well over \$3,000. Betty Barr and Don Kleier, local retired dentists who hosted the convention, have collected some of the finest examples of Kentucky reels over the years. Many of their reels are on display at Frankfort's Capital City Museum, which has a room set aside to highlight reels, reelmakers, and their contributions to Kentucky history.

For reel bargain hunters, a former ORCA president, David Lehmann of New York, had about 20 small brass

fishing reels for sale at \$55 each or three for \$150 – a fair price for anyone looking to start a collection. Countless brass fishing reels were made in England, Ireland, Scotland, the U.S. and elsewhere as early as the 1750s into the early 1900s. Some reels bear the name of the reel maker or a patent date, but many – like those Lehmann was selling – are

unmarked but still nice collectibles. One reel in Lehmann's display appeared to be especially early, with more than a dozen holes drilled into the reel foot, the long brass piece that holds a reel on a fishing rod. Those holes were drilled so the reel could literally be laced with twine onto the butt of a fishing rod to hold it in place.

Antique fishing reel collectors also have a soft spot for what they call "go-withs" – an interesting item that could complement or "go with" a display of old reels, rods and tackle.

A go-with could be an 80-year-old rub-

Springfield Extravaganza flourishes despite political rhetoric

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — The Springfield Antiques Extravaganza, a beloved event that draws thousands of antique dealers and enthusiasts from across the country, returned to the Clark County Fairgrounds in Springfield the third weekend in September. Yet, it faced unexpected concerns in the aftermath of the inflammatory political rhetoric concerning Springfield's immigrant population.

The September 20-22 show promised to be better than ever. Jenkins Management, the event's promoter, was excited about the prospects as Ohio's weather looked favorable — no rain in three weeks and clear skies ahead. While local fauna was parched, showgoers and vendors welcomed the bright skies and warm temperatures. Early September emails announced, "The show is here and it's going to be bigger and better than ever! Dealer counts are up already over the 2023 shows and we are still booking spaces every day."

However, the September 10 Presidential debate introduced a disturbing narrative, with bizarre claims about immigrants eating local pets, casting a shadow over Springfield. In the aftermath came bomb threats that led to the closure of two schools and even



ber weight used for rod and reel casting practice, an iridescent blue and green salmon fly for fishing in New Brunswick, or a letter from a reel manufacturer bent on marketing a reel endorsed by Boston Red Sox great – and avid fisherman – Ted Williams. That marketing plan failed and only one prototype reel was ever produced by the Bristol Manufacturing Co. under Williams' name. The letter and reel were among the many displays at this year's gathering.

Fishing-related items also drew the interest of collectors. Rick Kosek, an ORCA member from New York, offered a rare wooden 10-drawer cabinet for holding fishing flies. Bearing a label from Hardy Brothers, a well-known British tackle maker from the 19th and 20th centuries, the cabinet has ivory drawer pulls and labels and brass hardware. It was tagged at \$6,950.

During the four-day convention, ORCA held a silent auction with dozens of reels and fishing-related ephemera up for bid. The top dollar item was a heavy-weight Bronson saltwater reel that sold for \$775. In the "go-with" category, a vintage Looney Tunes comic book featuring Bugs Bunny water skiing with a rod and reel hooked into a leaping marlin went for \$55.

Besides buying and selling reels and related items, the convention included a seminar on publishing books about antique reels, a casting accuracy contest using vintage rods and reels, and an antique tackle fishing contest, which was staged in nearby Elkhorn Creek. Richard Taylor, author, professor and former poet laureate of Kentucky, was the keynote speaker at Friday night's banquet, presenting a lively history of the region around Elkhorn Creek.



Springfield's City Hall. That backlash left some potential Extravaganza attendees feeling apprehensive, leading to a drop in early registration. Media outlets reported that show promoters were worried about turnout after the negative publicity. In an interview with the Springfield News-Sun, Jon Jenkins noted a definite impact on presale tickets compared to previous events, with many expressing safety concerns.

The team at Jenkins realized they had had to double down. In emails dated September 16 and 19, they announced heightened security measures to reassure attendees and vendors. In part it read, "Due to recent negative comments about Springfield, some people have shared concerns about attending our show. Depending on the time of day, we employ up to a dozen off-duty Sheriff's deputies to provide security and direct traffic. It is one of our largest expenses and has been for years as a commitment to a safe event. We take the safety of our vendors and customers seriously and always have." They aimed to keep the focus on an enjoyable weekend celebrating the treasures hunting, rather than the turmoil.

That's exactly what happened. Extravaganza went on smoothly, the atmosphere was vibrant, and attendance was substantial. Vendors consistently reported a steady stream of shoppers—and more importantly sales—at their booths. Ohio dealer Sarah Downey summed it up, saying, "Traffic has been good and people are definitely buying." Another Ohioan, Maureen Bruner who's been selling at Springfield for over 10 years, remarked, "It's just about as busy as it could be," although she did mention

attendance didn't match May's event which backed up Interstate 70. Bruner also added, "I do appreciate the extra protection." Tammy Pennington from nearby Xenia, Ohio, commented specifically on the "line buying" event in which dealers can shop from each other's vehicles during load-in, describing

it as "really big" this time.

In the end, the weather had a more significant influence on Extravaganza than any political strife. By noon, temperatures reached 92 degrees, prompting some attendees to leave due to the heat. Shade under tents was in high demand, and vendors with canopies or

under trees tended to see more traffic than those without. Air-conditioned buildings naturally filled with visitors, although one dealer observed that, ironically, customers inside appeared to be buying less than those outdoors.

As shoppers wandered the aisles and buildings, discovering treasures from the past, it was evident that the Springfield Antiques Extravaganza remained largely unaffected by the recent political comments.







Art Deco

representational elements like animals and sunbursts, while also drawing inspiration from exotic lands, especially those of ancient Egypt. These elements added a touch of opulence and intrigue, capturing the era's fascination with ancient cultures and their symbolism.

Although Art Deco designers occasionally used natural materials like animal skin, exotic wood, and jewels or semiprecious stone, their primary focus was on innovative manmade materials that highlighted industrial progress. Materials like Bakelite, vibrant colored glass, and stainless steel became staples, satisfying peoples' fascination with technological advancements.

As the Great Depression set in, the exuberance of early Art Deco gave way to a more pragmatic approach. Designers migrated toward austerity, often replacing costly materials like silver with chrome and elegant stone with stylized plastic, adapting to the economic realities of the time. By the 1940s, Streamline Moderne emerged, characterized by its sleek polished surfaces and allusion to speed and motion. This style variant embraced a futuristic vision, drawing inspiration from aerodynamic shapes and the sleek sophistication of modern trains and ocean liners.

While collectors can easily find Art Deco in art, sculpture, and jewelry, its reach into industrial design is particularly intriguing. Consumers of that era sought products that symbolized progress and marked a break from the past. Retailers obliged,

with catalogs and displays rife with furniture and household goods that idealized modernity. Designers like Coco Chanel and Erté gained notoriety, while companies like Sunbeam and Zenith made everything from bicycles to coffee makers embodying the era's innovative spirit. That left a treasure trove of Art Deco pieces for today's enthusiasts. Here is a glimpse into the variety:

Automotive Accents: With cars booming in the 1920s and 1930s, design took center stage. Streamlined forms signified speed and style, and Art Deco elements showed up in body trim, hood ornaments, and interior details.

Barware: The early 20th century embodied sophisticated social life often tied to the rise of cocktail culture and Hollywood's portrayal of the flapper lifestyle. Prohibition initially stifled the cocktail scene, but its repeal spurred a resurgence in drinking and entertaining. Factories obliged, producing merchandise like cocktail shakers, traveling bars, and tables with brass rails. Major glass companies like Cambridge and Heisey created striking cocktail sets in cobalt blue and ruby red. Accessories such as garish cigarette holders also became trendy.

Books: The early 20th century witnessed a remarkable evolution in literature, as exemplified by F. Scott Fitzgerald's iconic *The Great Gatsby*. Illustrated books, in particular, were profoundly shaped by the Art Deco movement. Books from this period frequently featured eye-catching covers and illustrations, and innovative typography, with lavish details like oversized initial letters and elegant borders.

Ephemera: Art Deco's impact on the printing industry extended far beyond books. Its artistic and typographical trends are vividly captured in travel posters that featured aircraft, modern skyscrapers, ocean liners, and sleek trains. Stock certificates of the time often featured illustrations of manufacturing and transportation, reflecting the spirit of the machine age. Even sheet music from popular stage and screen productions was often emblazoned with striking cover art from the period.

Furniture: At the 1925 Paris Exposition, furniture was a central element. Visionary designers such as Le Corbusier championed minimalist pieces with bold geometric forms, a marked departure from the ornate furnishings of earlier generations. This period also gave rise to large-scale availability of factory-produced materials like wood laminates, lacquered finishes, and polished metals, bringing the elegance of Art Deco furniture to a mass audience.

Housewares: a plethora of companies sold consumers a vision of a future full of conical coffee cups, avant-garde light fixtures, and gleaming streamline toasters. No home was complete



without these modern marvels. As industrialization expanded the availability of goods, manufacturers constantly introduced new offerings, pushing older designs out of vogue.

Technology: During the Jazz Age, entertainment was transformed by innovations like phonographs, radios, and cameras, all featuring Art Deco style. Radios often came in sleek Bakelite casings, while cameras, phonographs, and telephones held Art Deco accents. The glamorous style even extended to office machinery.

By the 1940s, Art Deco had become so widespread that its distinctive brilliance began to fade. Additionally, a societal shift followed World War II, driven by concerns over the dehumanizing impact of mechanization. A movement towards even simpler, more functional design began to take its place. Nevertheless, the era's wares hold great appeal for collectors who value the unique charm and recognize Art Deco's role in the evolution of modern design.

There are many good research sources on the Art Deco style and collecting objects from the era. Among them are the Art Deco Society of New York, www.artdeco.org, and the Art Deco Society of Washington, www.adsw.org.
