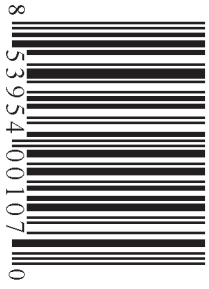

Collectors are still eager to adopt a Cabbage Patch kid

It is difficult to believe a doll could cause near riots at stores, but such was the case when Cabbage Patch dolls came on the scene 41 years ago.

Major retail stores as Sears, JC Penney, Montgomery Wards, KMart and Macy's all reported issues involving long lines, impatient customers and the need for extra security when the dolls hit the market in the fall and winter of 1983. Reports of violence included hitting, shoving and trampling, as well as some customers attacking others with weapons such as baseball bats in order to obtain a Cabbage Patch Doll.

At the time most stores only stocked a few hundred dolls, but thousands of customers wanted them, which is what led to the chaos. Coleco sold more than three million dolls by the end of 1983, but could not keep up with the demand.

It was not clear why the homey dolls were so intensely desired. A Time magazine article featured a theory from a doctor who said, "most children between the ages of 6 to 12 fantasize that they were really adopted," which made it appealing to experience the adoption fantasy through the dolls, which came with birth certificates and adoption papers."

The Cabbage Patch Kids toy line was a tremendous demand, and in 1982 Cabbage Patch's parent company, Coleco, was the best performer on the New York Stock Exchange, rising from \$6.87 to \$36.75 per share.

Cabbage Patch Kids weren't actually born in a field of vegetables, but out of the entrepreneurial mind of a 21-year-old art student, Xavier Roberts, of Helen, Georgia. In 1976, Roberts became fascinated with a German fabric-sculpture technique from the 19th century known as "needle molding."

Roberts wasn't the only one

enthralled by that turn-of-the-century craft. Martha Nelson Thomas of Louisville, Ky., alleged that she had been selling similar soft-sculpture baby dolls for "adoption" since the early 1970s and filed a lawsuit against Roberts in 1980. Thomas ultimately lost her suit because she had not copyrighted her dolls. She went on to manufacture her own Original Doll Baby.

Roberts' dolls were first called Little People Originals. They came with birth certificates and in 1977 he sold his

Little People Originals at craft shows across the South, where he learned

Warsaw Cut Glass has crafted brilliance for over a century

WARSAW, Ind. — In the dim workshop light at Warsaw Cut Glass, an artisan intern deftly glides a bare cocktail glass over a grinding wheel, skillfully hand carving intricate designs into the surface. Overhead, the rhythmic hum of leather belts and pulleys transports visitors to a bygone era. Embracing its heritage of hand-cut glass, Warsaw Cut Glass continues to employ century-old equipment and master craftsmanship to delight today's customers.

Warsaw Cut Glass is the oldest shop in Warsaw, Ind., and one of only three companies in the United States still making cut glass. According to Lauren Kirkendall, part of the family now at the helm, "We're the last surviving original glass cutting facility in the country." It is also one of the few remaining U.S. glass companies of any type still operating in its original building, where original shafts, pulleys, and leather belts still power the grinding wheels.

Warsaw Cut Glass doesn't produce glassware; instead, it specializes in cutting shapes and patterns into blank glass "canvases." This meticulous process has been the company's hallmark since it opened over a century ago. Master artisans etch each piece freehand, ensuring each creation is truly unique. Lucky visitors can watch skilled glass cutters at work and even take home a piece they witnessed being made.

The seeds for Warsaw Cut Glass were planted in 1911 when Chicago's Johnson-Carlson Cut Glass Company was trying to establish a satellite plant to meet demand. They met with the Warsaw Chamber of Commerce and settled on a location downtown. The factory opened in 1912 under the watchful eye of Oscar

Hugo, who was hired as master cutter and factory manager.

During its early period, the company was mainly involved in the production of American Brilliant ware, part of the U.S. industry revered for its exquisite glass craftsmanship. The firm employed as many as 55 artisans making the exceptional cut crystal. One of them was 14-year-old Jackson Dobbins who signed on around 1914 to apprentice under Hugo.

Warsaw Cut Glass continued producing American Brilliant Cut Glass until 1917. Yet, like many prestigious American glass cutting firms, it faced severe setbacks from soaring labor costs and the redirection of raw materials to the

war effort during World War I. According to the American Cut Glass Association, only 1 in 10 glass cutting shops survived these challenges. Fortunately, Warsaw Cut Glass was among them, adapting by transitioning from costly crystal to more affordable glass and by shifting to direct retail in the 1930s.

The economic challenges of the Great Depression brought further setbacks. Johnson-Carlson closed the factory for approximately a year before selling the company to Oscar Hugo in 1933. By then, Hugo and Dobbins were the only remaining glass cutters. The pair ran the company together for roughly 25 years. In 1957,

Craftswoman works to find how pieces should fit together

As the old saying goes, "Christmas comes but once a year," but not so with Halloween, where, at least in the Irino home, every day is a celebration of All Hallows' Eve. Even

before the family begins decorating for the holiday on October 31, the house already looks spooky, but in a good kind of way. All of which should come as no surprise for those who know a bit about the woman of the house: As it happens, Vanessa Irino holds the Guinness World Record for the largest collection of memorabilia related to Casper the Friendly Ghost.

Conceding that her style is somewhat different from that of most of her San Antonio neighbors, Vanessa explained that she finds inspiration from Disney's "Haunted Mansion" and, of course, Casper's home. Traditional Southwestern style? Not so much.

A lifelong fan of the kindhearted cartoon figure, Vanessa and her collection were featured in a story in "AntiqueWeek" in May. At that time, she recounted that even as a child, she was fascinated with old things. A "packrat from an early age," she continued, "I always thought that things should be given a second life." All the while, she identified her first best friend as Casper.

Early on, Vanessa exhibited an artistic sensibility, and while she was "still in the single digits," she became interested in crafting jewelry as a way to express herself. She soon found herself making intricate pieces, thanks in large part to guidance provided by a New Age shopkeeper.

Not surprisingly, her jewelry mak-

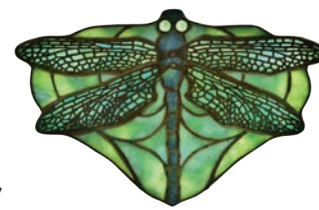

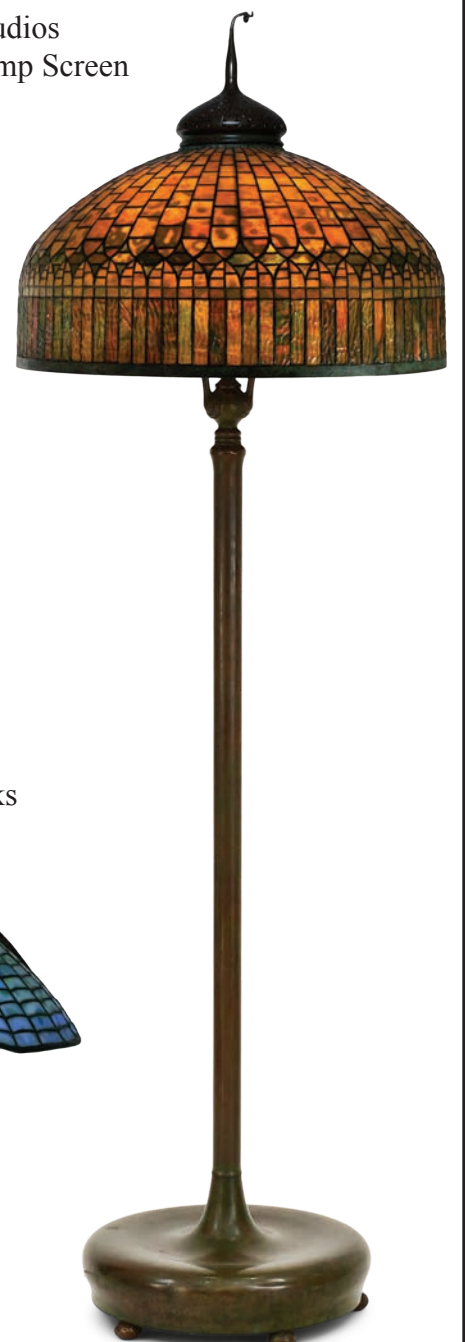

Hugo sold the business to Dobbins. Committed to preserving the company, Dobbins brought in his wife and stepdaughter to help keep things afloat. According to Kirkendall, "Dobbins even took on a second job to keep the shop running."

By the 1980s, Dobbins' health was declining and he was on the lookout for a new apprentice who could carry on Warsaw Cut Glass' legacy. That's when Randy and Linda Kirkendall came into the picture. The Kirkendalls were recent Indiana State University graduates with fine art degrees and experience with mediums like furniture design and silversmithing. At the time, Randy was 29 and Linda was just 23 and both were headed to graduate school in Wisconsin. As Lauren shared, "My Dad wanted to be an MFA and to teach college." But Randy had long admired the company's building, and when the opportunity arose to be a part of the company's legacy, he was quickly hooked.

Randy Kirkendall began apprenticing with Jackson Dobbins in 1980; however, his training lasted only about ten months. "He wasn't feeling well and knew his time was limited," Randy recalled in an interview with ABC News in South Bend. "He'd come in each morning to teach me a few tricks, but he would tire quickly." After Dobbins died, Randy and Linda took over the company, becoming the next chapter of its history.

When the Kirkendalls bought the business they faced numerous challenges, from inexperience and financial issues to a building showing its age. Fortunately, family members stepped in to help. "My grandfather was a huge business guy. He gave us advice and helped for a couple of years to get [the business] up-righted," Lauren explained.

The building on South Detroit St. in Warsaw is the second-oldest in town, now beautifully restored by the Kirkendalls. A hand-painted sign from 1915 still graces its exterior. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1984.

In the workshop, Matt, a new glass-cutting intern, is frequently found practicing the intricate craft of engraving glassware. It generally takes between six to nine months to master the skills. There are

around 15 different wheels used to create a variety of lines and shapes. The company has a repertoire of over 50 patterns, with their signature design a distinctive rendition of a rye sheath. Customers can order personalized items; they've even done custom work inspired by children's artwork. One notable project was a jelly bean jar for former President Ronald Reagan, featuring an intricate base decorated with an elephant motif. They also occasionally hold classes where visitors can cut glass themselves, amid the hum of the whizzing belts and spinning wheels.

In the showroom, cabinets display a rich collection of pieces from Warsaw's history, going all the way back to the American Brilliant ware of their found-

ing. Tables are lined with a variety of new merchandise for sale, including barware, decanter sets, pitchers, serving ware, and vases. Reflecting on their offerings Lauren said, "Generations of family members have shopped here. Holiday meals and momentous occasions mean Warsaw cut glass on the table. It's an honor to be a part of that."

Warsaw Cut Glass is a member of the Indiana Glass Trail, which includes about 20 Indiana locations with artisans, museums, and studios showcasing the history of glassmaking in the Hoosier state.

Joe Pyle Auctions will “rock” the days away with music memorabilia

WASHINGTON, Pa. – As Joe Pyle Auctions prepares for the fourth and fifth sessions of an eight-part sale of Americana, Garrett Wilkerson said it’s difficult to predict what will top the list of items offered on Oct. 15 and 16. Speaking for the auction company, which is based in Shinnston, W.Va., he said, “There’re so many good things” among the nearly 1,000 lots to be sold.

Those items include: a drum head signed by all four Beatles, followed by the shirt Elvis Presley wore in “Jailhouse Rock,” a copy of the album “Thriller” signed by Michael Jackson, and a signed copy of the lyrics to Prince’s “Purple Rain.” Then there’s Babe Ruth’s signed bat, scorecards signed by Tiger Woods, and a basketball signed by Michael Jordan. And that’s just for starters.

Music and sports memorabilia are featured in the fourth session, with guitars

used by a myriad of popular musicians, including Bob Marley, Glenn Campbell, and Bruce Springsteen. Wilkerson predicted that John Denver’s guitar would prove to be especially popular, in light of the musician’s relationship with nearby West Virginia.

Among the numerous signed albums in the sale are the Beatles’ “Hey Jude,” Lynyrd Skynyrd’s “Street Survivors,” and “Hotel California” by the Eagles. Even as the Beatles are well represented with a sizable number of lots, Wilkerson drew attention to one in particular, Lennon’s “Bag One Collection,” a grouping of very personal lithographs. Other music-related offerings include Frank Sinatra’s signed microphone and hair from both Elvis and Lennon. Rounding out the

ing endeavor has become more than a casual hobby. These days, she describes herself as an “old soul” as she continues to salvage old things that have hidden beauty. Sometimes, she blends new things (for instance, charms created thanks to the wonders of 3-D printing technology) with old things, bits and pieces of “random trinkets” that she picks up along the way. “What other people deem as junk is not junk to me” she stated. She works from her stash of odds and ends, which includes, among other things, old keys, doll parts, and broken pieces of china dinnerware. She pulls these individual elements together, experimenting until she discovers the way in which the fragments are “meant to

be together.” Branching out, she also makes memorial jewelry for those who have lost friends and family members as well as pets, incorporating hair and dried flowers into her designs, which are often preserved in an antique lock-

et. Vanessa’s finished products are accessories that appeal to a variety of tastes, with jewelry ranging from “big statement pieces” to pieces that are “small and dainty.” She makes “a ton of earrings” and “a ton of necklaces,” many of which she sells under the

name “Vantique” (available only at local venues). But even though making jewelry is fulfilling, the sentimentalist said that parting with favorite pieces can be difficult.

And finally, an update on her extraordinary Casper collection. Vanessa worked hard (and shopped a lot) to attain international recognition. To achieve that initial honor, she amassed a jaw-dropping collection

which included some 1,200 individual items. But, in the spirit of a true collector, she is not resting on her laurels. She reported that, recently back home from an extended visit to her in-laws in Japan, she managed to make significant additions to her collection. This time, she said, she only needed to purchase one additional suitcase for transporting her new finds back home.

As for sports-related items, a large representation of Pittsburgh Steelers memorabilia will no doubt please local fans. Additionally, Wilkerson said that the sale will include a "really good"



mix of baseball memorabilia, with items relating to Joe DeMaggio, Ty

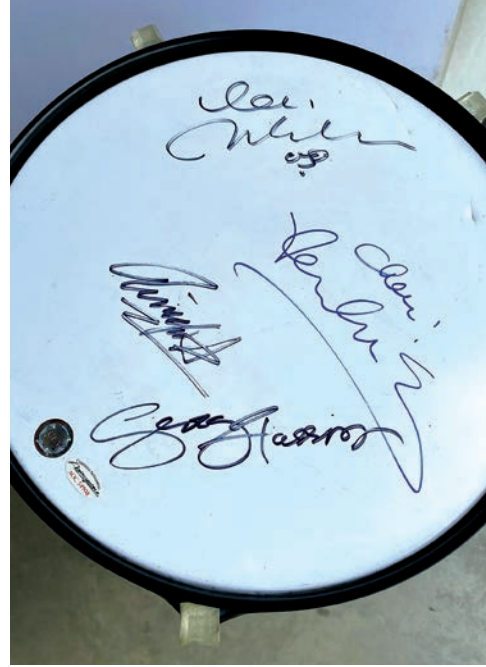

Cobb, and Lou Gehrig among those expected to do well.

The fifth session of the sale, set for October 16, will focus on military, presidential, and historical artifacts, Wilkerson continued. Stating that Civil War-related items are "very hot right now," he predicted high interest in the frock coat that once belonged to Paul Octave Hebert, a Confederate general. Straddling the categories of Civil War and presidential

collectibles is a framed "Andrew Johnson Civil War Letter Collage" that includes the signature of the 17th president of the United States.

Among presidential artifacts to be sold are several framed bits of fabric, including a swatch from Abraham Lincoln's coffin cloth, as well as a piece of material taken from the dress worn by Mary Todd Lincoln on the night Lincoln was assassinated at Ford's Theatre. John F. Kennedy-related items include a framed

invitation to his 1961 inauguration and a plate from his last "official" dinner.

Other artifacts of historical interest range from Robert E. Lee's hair and the first contract that Marilyn Monroe signed with an agent, to a brick from the funeral home where Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow were embalmed and a Packard hood ornament.

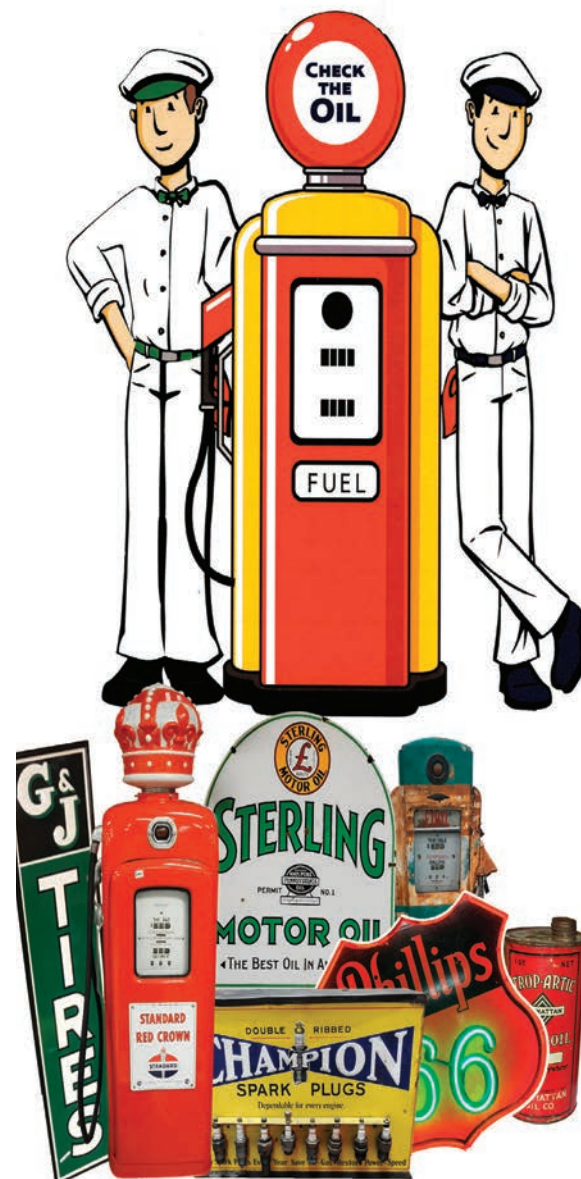

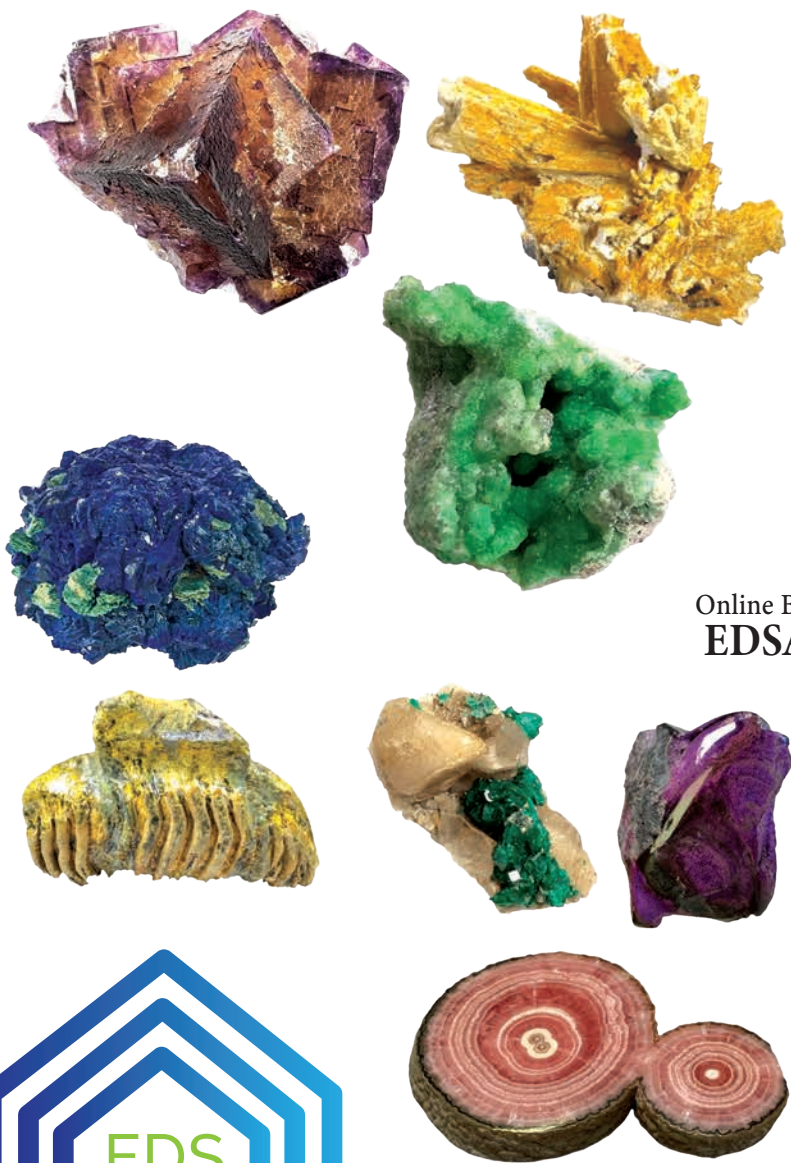

that people would pay \$40 to “adopt” his dolls.

In 1978, Roberts got together with five friends to form Original Appalachian Artworks, Inc. A key component of the enterprise was the renovation of an old medical center in Cleveland, Georgia, as BabyLand General Hospital, where eager customers watched the process of the Little People being born from “mother cabbages,” with the help of “licensed patch nurses.” At this surreal store, “premature” babies were placed in incubators, and some births required c-sections (or “cabbage-sections”).

By 1980, Roberts and his Little People creations were featured on the documentary TV show, “Real People,” and by 1981, they were causing a national stir, getting coverage in Newsweek, the Atlanta Weekly, and The Wall Street Journal.

All this buzz led to a licensing deal with major toy manufacturer Coleco in 1982, which changed the name of Roberts’ doll line to Cabbage Patch Kids. The Coleco toy versions of Roberts’ artworks were smaller in size (16 inches) and had vinyl, rather than fabric, heads. The “adoption fees” for the mass-produced toys were usually less than \$30, and each doll came with a “birth certificate” with a unique name and birth date.

In 1985, a Cabbage Patch doll named “Christopher Xavier” traveled aboard a NASA space shuttle, and in 1992 the doll became official mascot of the U.S. Olympic Team, traveling with the athletes to Barcelona. Then, in 1999, the Cabbage Patch Kids were honored on a U.S. postage stamp. The dolls inspired spinoffs like books, clothing, record and animated movies, as well as a 13-inch infant-like “Preemie” and animal-faced “Koosa” dolls.

They were also subject to parody. In 1985, Topps introduced Garbage Pail Kids sticker trading cards, which were conceptualized by Pulitzer Prize winning cartoonist Art Spiegelman. On each card, a Cabbage Patch-like child would be depicted deformed or plagued by some horrible misfortune above a clever nameplate like “Adam Bomb” or “Bony Tony.” Roberts quickly sued for trademark violation, and settled when Topps agreed to make changes to the appearance of the cards.

While the demand for the dolls was huge in the early 1980s, by 1986 Cabbage Patch Kids were no longer the must-have toy. Even though Coleco introduced a pricey “Talking” Cabbage

Patch Kid as a last-ditch effort to renew interest in the toy, the company went bankrupt in the late '80s.

But mass-produced Cabbage Patch Kids lived on, manufactured by Hasbro, Mattel, Toys R Us, and eventually its current licensee, Play Along Inc.

When Hasbro took over the rights, the company tried several gimmicks to revive the dolls’ previous popularity. Some Kids played kazoos, others were made smaller to appeal to younger children, and several specialty lines were established, including Birthday Kids, Splash ‘n’ Tan Kids, and Pretty Crimp and Curl.

Mattel bought the rights in 1994 and began making 14-inch Cabbage Patch Kids that were all vinyl. Even the cloth bodies had been replaced by plastic. The Mattel dolls often did tricks, too, including eating food, brushing their teeth or swimming. One line known as Cabbage Patch Snacktime Kids was withdrawn from the market a year after its premier in 1996. Children were getting their fingers and hair caught in the dolls’ mechanical mouths.

Just in time for the dolls’ 20th anniversary in 2003, Toys R Us took over the rights and released 18-inch and 20-inch dolls with vinyl heads and

cloth bodies. These debuted at the company’s flagship store in New York City, where they were sold in cabbage-leaf seats.

Play Along took over in 2004, and it produced 16-inch dolls, very similar to the Coleco versions of 1983. That same year Play Along produced Cabbage Patch Babies, as well as a 25th Anniversary Celebration Baby, which licks an ice cream cone.

In 2008, Republican and Democratic contenders for U.S. President and Vice President (John McCain, Sarah Palin, Barack Obama and Joe Biden) were made into Cabbage Patch dolls. And yes, Palin’s came with glasses.

Little People Original dolls were among the first dolls to ever be produced, so they tend to sell for more money, especially if they’re signed by Xavier Roberts, the creator. Signed Little People dolls from 1980 go for \$2,000-\$3,000. Hand-signed Little People twin dolls (1983) can fetch up to \$3,500, whereas the unsigned twins go for roughly \$700.

The signature also identifies the year of manufacture. Different colors were used in indifferent years, and the signature also sometimes had the year listed next to

it. Coleco dolls of 1983 were signed in black, in 1984 they were signed in green. Hasbro’s dolls of 1992 were signed in royal blue, while Mattel’s Cabbage Patch dolls in 1995 were signed with purple pen. Toys R Us dolls of 2003 were signed in hot pink.

Cabbage Patch dolls with rare head molds tend to sell for more than other dolls. Growing Hair, Designer Line, Sippin’ Kid and Talking Kid dolls had unique head molds.

Every mass-marketed Cabbage Patch Kid dolls has a number printed on the back of its head, which indicates the mold design. Coleco molds include numbers 1 through 49 (there is no 7 or 13) and the rare molds include “Brat” faces from 1983 (these tend to go for \$100 to \$500).

According to those at the Cabbage Patch Kids Collectors Club the value of a doll increases if its original box, body, clothes, adoption papers, and birth certificate are intact. For more information visit the club at <https://cabbagepatchkids.com>.
