## Words to live by in a convenient wood-like plaque

"A penny saved is a penny earned". . ."A stitch in time saves nine". . . "An apple a day keeps the doctor away."

Some folks call them mottos. Or proverbs. Folk sayings. Adages. Often, they have a definite ring of truth. (After all, if you save a penny, then you do indeed have one more than you started with.) Other times, maybe not so much. "Words to live by" like these creep their way into our consciousness, and often into our conversations. If you tell someone, "every cloud has a silver lining," you know exactly what you're saying, and they know exactly what you mean. You've taken a short cut on the road to communication.

Words to live by have been with us for a long, long time. They've been found on tablets carved by ancient Sumerians in 2000 B.C. 



## Bidders flocked to John E. Bundy carved decoys

NOBLESVILLE, Ind. — On Sept. 15, Carmel auctioneer Castles and Attics, in collaboration with Ripley Auctions, held the second installment of the John and Valarie Bundy Decoy and Antiques Auction. This event paid tribute to John E. Bundy (1949-1973), a nationally renowned decoy artist and outdoorsman. Bundy's decoys, crafted from carefully selected local woods like white cedar and walnut, were celebrated for their flawless surfaces and high-gloss finishes. He famously remarked that his creations were "intended for the mantel instead of the marsh," emphasizing their artistic appeal.

This auction featured over 650 lots, including 77 Bundy decoys, alongside unique tools, antique decor, primitive furniture, hunting firearms, and other collectibles. The decoys represented an array of 46 duck varieties, including bluebills, mallards, and pintails, as well as varieties of egrets, loons, swans, and even fish. The various carvings, crafted from 15 different

types of wood, spanned five decades of Bundy's career.

The highest bid for a Bundy decoy reached \$600 for a 14-inch example carved from spalted curly maple. A 13-

inch bluebill decoy, crafted from burled walnut, sold for \$225, while a 9-inch courting ruddy, also made of walnut and part of the 1986 Carvers Collection, fetched \$180. Additionally, a pair of Bundy hand-finished decoys brought in \$160.

Among the other bird carvings was a 14-inch tall shorebird that reached

## Townsends continue tradition with Vintage Markets and Toy Shows this fall

ROCHESTER, Minn. – The "thrill of the hunt" is still the hallmark of the antique and collectible shows Kae and Richard Townsend have been running for more than half a century.

The couple are hosting their Fall 2024 Vintage Markets and Toy Shows on Sunday, Nov. 3, and Sunday, Dec. 1, at the Graham Park fairgrounds.

They've lined up 55 dealers who will bring a vast array of antiques and collectibles. Many dealers return each year – as do many customers – streaming in from Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and beyond.

"It's all about the thrill of the hunt," said Kae Townsend. "You just never know what the dealers are going to bring. They actively buy collections, go to auctions, they go to all the tag sales and garage sales. You never know what people are going to find."

This autumn marks the 45th year she and her husband have been hosting the November and December flea market and toy shows; their spring

and summer shows, dubbed the Gold Rush, have been running for 53 years. They had an antique store for many

years and are still actively buying, but their focus these days is on planning, organizing and promoting the shows.



\$160. A pair of exquisitely crafted 22inch Cranford wooden geese sold for

Bidders managed to pick up some bargains on Bundy pieces. Three unfinished Bundy pintails, the largest at 15 inches, sold for just \$22.50. And a collection of six unfinished spalted maple decoys, approximately 12 inches in length, was grabbed for just \$10.

Alongside the wildlife carvings, there were 15 lots of carved walking sticks, some made by Bundy himself. The top bid among these was \$160 for a dozen unfinished pieces. A striking 41-inch walking stick carved by Bundy sold for \$110, while another bidder snagged a John Bundy clock tower-style example, crafted from curly maple and walnut in its natural finish, for just \$25.

The auction featured more than just carvings. In fact, the highest bid of \$8,100 went for a pair of 1920s Fratelli Toso Tiffany Studios Italian art glass lamps. These 16-inch lamps were in very good overall condition but required rewiring. Bidding also six figures, at \$1,050, for an antique industrial Singer sewing machine designed for leatherwork. This impressive unit stood 62 inches tall and was still operational. In contrast, a mid-20th century wooden Bell Telephone booth, originally from Indiana University in Bloomington, was picked up for \$90.

There were more than 30 lots of antique and primitive furniture offered. An early two-piece painted oak cabinet fetched \$800. The 54-inch wide by 90inch tall cabinet still had its original hardware and glass, though it exhibited some paint stripping and needed

doors remounted. Later, an antique pie safe with six tin door panels, a center drawer, and bottom cabinet doors sold for \$375. Measuring 40 inches wide by 73 inches tall, it was in solid condition but missing some hardware. Bidding also reached \$300 for a 46-inch wide by 75-inch tall oak possum belly kitchen cabinet. It was in good condition, except for a missing breadboard.

There were also small primitives, including a 30-inch diameter early copper rendering kettle, which sold for a respectable \$350. Three antique homemade quilts were also offered. The highest bid was \$190 for a 72-inch square quilt in a log cabin pattern. A red and white circa 1888 quilt, measuring 68 inches by 86 inches, reached \$140. Meanwhile, an early 20th-century quilt measuring 84 inches by 72 inches, exhibiting some age-related toning, sold for \$55.

Small decor included nine lots con-

taining vintage boat paddles repurposed as coat racks. While they sold for modest prices ranging from \$15 to \$22.50 each, the unique pieces no doubt appealed to bidders interested in hunting and fishing collectibles.

Another 40 lots came from Bundy's substantial beer can collection. Three different lots featured six-packs of Six Twenty Grand Ale cone-top beer cans in their holders. Two made it to \$1,050, while a third sold for \$1,000. Each of the three was in expected vintage condition, with stains, can oxidation, and tears in the cardboard carriers. Other cone-top lots sold from \$20 for a pair of Gold Medal cans in rough shape to \$425 for a single 20 Grand Cream Ale can in good vintage condition.



## Sweet memories will be made during auction of Carmazzi family home

URBANA, Ohio -The name "Carmazzi" is known to nearly everyone who grew up in this west central town of just over 11,000 residents thanks to Carmazzi's Deli and Candy Store. The store has been supplying a sweet fix to residents young and old since the 1930s.

Now those residents may get a chance to own something connected to the Carmazzi name when Lile Auctions sells the contents of the Carmazzi home on Oct. 19.

Located downtown on Monument Square, Carmazzi's Deli and Candy Store was housed in a Federal style building originally erected to house the headquarters of Gen. Jonathon Meigs during the War of 1812. In 1893, it became Bianchi's Fruit Store.

In 1931, after Sam Bianchi died, his niece, Victoria and her husband Frank Carmazzi took over the store and renamed it Carmazzi's.

Upon buying the store, the new owners proudly added the gold "Carmazzi's" lettering, seen by generations, in an arc on the window, a welcoming sign to children of all ages. For within, Carmazzi's there was what seemed like millions of sweets to choose from: hoarhound candy, Tootsie Rolls, candy buttons, candy necklaces, Necco wa-

"We've been promoting since 1969," she said. "We love the business."

They also love the people – on both sides of the table - and over the decades recognize many familiar faces.

Dealers bring new, unexpected items each year and the anticipation has customers lined up long before the doors open at 9 a.m.

Among the items expected at the fall shows are advertising signs, hunting and fishing collectibles, gasoline and auto memorabilia, comics, postcards, vintage toys, tools, primitives, militaria, books, ephemera, vintage clothing, costume jewelry, glass, pottery, lamps, small furniture, home décor, Pyrex, picture frames, holiday items, kitchen ware and farm antiques. And for shoppers who get hungry there will be baked goods, pies, jams and more.

Nostalgia seems to drive a lot of the collectors' interest.

"People always seem to gravitate to things they had when they were children, things they'd forgotten about," said Townsend. "They say, 'Oh, I had that when I was young,' they start looking at it, picking it up and remembering things. That's kind of what it's about."

She suggested the internet has guided and even sparked some collectors' interest. "A person might have one piece of china or pottery handed down from their mother or grandmother." Though initially it may not seem significant, an online search may indicate its worth - "and once





they see it has value, they take a different attitude toward it. That's what starts them collecting."

She acknowledged the internet has changed the business of the buying and selling of antiques and collectibles and winnowed out many antique

"There are fewer shows than there were in the past," Townsend said. Nonetheless, she is not discouraged. "Now the younger dealers are coming, which is nice," a sign of the next generation of vendors.

Most dealers are well educated about what they collect and willing

to educate a new collector. "They take the time to talk to customers. We value that. It's a social thing for young and old. You form bonds and good relationships."

And not just with the dealers. "Our customers are real faithful, too. It's well worth them coming because they're always going to find something they like.'

The shows in November and December are held in two accessible buildings, Crawford Hall and Floral Hall, connected by a tiled patio. Both shows run from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Entry to each show is \$3 and parking is free.







fers, lollipops, jawbreakers, wax lips, chocolate cigarettes and cigars.

Of course, like all the stores of the era, the Carmazzis filled the store with other items for sale - jam packed all together in the relatively tiny sales area. Adults could buy most of the major Ohio newspapers, The New York



Times and periodicals. Cosmetics were available. Nearly anything one could imagine was for sale in the tiny store.

John Carmazzi began working in the store before he could barely see over the counter. Now, 90-years-old, John looks back to with pride, as the location became one of Urbana's most popular "hang outs."

Auctioneer Mick Lile remembers going into the store as a child and grabbing a handful of penny candy. "It was almost as good as things could happen at the time," he recalls.

The Carmazzi store is still open in downtown Urbana, and the new owners decided to stick with the old and trusted name.

"This is the kind of auction that all auctioneers dream about having," Lile said. "This offering is from one of the oldest families in Urbana."

The auction will also include many items from John Carmazzi's wife's family, William and Siverina Whalen who were longtime antique collectors.

The house, built in 1850, has been uninhabited for the past 20 years, Lile said. Some of the highlights of the sale include a 7-foot-tall wooden carved full figure of Jesus, bought from an antique dealer in the 1970s. There is a 19th century Steinway baby grand piano, a wooden tramp art clock, a twodoor Coca-Cola cooler (circa 1950), a Coca-Cola electric advertising clock (also 1950), a crank Victrola talking machine, a National Brass Cash Register (probably used in the Carmazzi store), a vintage fainting couch, a Wapak butter churn, a life-size Pillsbury Dough Boy advertising figure, several glass gumball machines, a crank wall phone and many 19th century-era books.

## Dealers traveled from afar to set up at Indy Advertising Show

INDIANAPOLIS — The third weekend in September again saw the gates open on the fall Indy Advertising Show at the Boone County Fairgrounds northwest of Indianapolis.

Dealers from as far away as Texas and California traveled to the event, filling all available buildings of the fairgrounds.

The show was hosted by promoters Damon and Angela Granger, who also host a similar spring event at the Indianapolis Fairgrounds.

"We're jam-packed full, using all buildings on the fairgrounds," said Damon Granger, who noted there was an additional breweriana and bottle collectors event added to this year's line-up.

California dealer Carl Lepiane traveled seven days from LaQuinta with a

whole van full of goodies, taking time to "shop along the way." Many admired his trio of 1930s country store Watta Pop plaster countertop candy sucker head figures priced from \$400 to \$600

each. Still others "ooohed and aahed" over a colorful screen-printed 18-inch self-framed 1920s Fatima Cigarettes tin tray that could hang at your home for \$1,400

It was a bit shorter drive for Terry Mcpherson who traveled 900 miles from Arlington, Texas, to set up for the fifth year at the show. Serious gas and oil memorabilia collectors stopped to admire his mid-1950s Around the World brand gasoline pump advertising glass globe — with a price tag of \$30,000 – and yet another tag marked "sold."

Another Texas dealer, Bart Stevens of Irving, showed off a large group of car racing and other sports collectibles. Twenty-one pennants priced from \$150 to \$6,500 each filled the booth, along with a 14-by x 22-inch 1960s Santa Fe Speedway Chicago-area framed cardboard poster for \$250.

Still another long-distance team, Dave and Allie Smith, showed goodies they brought from Bartlesville, Okla. Foot traffic stopped at their booth to check out an early 1900s furry 27-inchlong standing full figure cow that Allie called a "point of purchase piece." The clockwork mechanism milker's head would move up and down to attract shoppers' attention — and could entertain for you at home for \$1,750. People who like smaller items checked out their 9- inch-long pre-1900s Victorian style porcelain and cobalt glass straw drink dispenser, priced at \$850.





## **Wood Plaques**

beautiful in the eyes of its mother.")

Confusing? Well, "beggars can't be choosers," and the boundaries are blurry. What's important to remember is that each is an effective means of conveying an understood and accepted message, with a metaphorical or symbolic style that transcends everyday speech. By the mid 20th century, such "words to live by" made their way into American homes, thanks to inspirational wall plaques. When folks found themselves in need of advice, encouragement, a smile, or just a pickme-up on a dreary day, there it was, staring them right in the face.

Gazing at a wall plaque from the 1930s or '40s, you can't help but admire the hand-carved lettering and images, often highlighted with color accents, on burnished wood backings.

The Syracuse Ornamental Company of Syracuse, New York ("Syroco"), pioneered the concept of molded wood décor pieces, producing near-perfect replicas of hand carving. Although the plaques looked hand-carved, and of "real" wood, they actually weren't. Like other wood-like carved novelties of the era, these wall plaques were actually molded, pressed wood creations, putting them within the reach of almost every pocketbook. And, although numerous companies produced similar items, it was Syroco that developed the concept, and led the pack.

Syrocowood was a product born of necessity. In 1890, wood artisan Adolph Holstein, a recent immigrant to the United States, found his skills as an accomplished carver in great demand. Ornately carved woodwork was popular,

and Holstein's numerous commissions extended throughout New York. Soon, more master carvers were added to the staff of Holstein's new company, "Syroco," but the time-consuming process of hand-carving limited the number of orders that could be accepted. Training additional carvers required years of apprenticeship. Holstein's solution was to create a master carving, cast a mold, then cast replicas from that. Since only one master carving was required for each design, both production and affordability were greatly enhanced.

Syroco's oft-stated goal was to ensure its Syrocowood objects were as close to "wood-like" as possible. The effect of authentic wood was enhanced by carving each master from the specific type of wood its replicas were intended to resemble. A lead mold was cast from the carving, with the surface textured as per the grain of the original wood. The mold was then filled with a mixture of wood flour, waxes, and resins, and compressed. After removal from the mold, sanding removed mold lines, and the piece received either multi-color decoration, or a natural wood stain.

In the company's early years, the call was primarily for decorative furniture trim, a ready replacement for hand-carving, or for expensive, less-detailed, stamped designs. Syroco trim pieces soon adorned everything from caskets to armchairs, and took the place of hand-carved trim molding in home interiors.

But tastes change. As highly ornamented furniture and molding

trim fell out of favor, Syroco sought new avenues for its product. In the 1930s, the Syroco line of wood-like novelty items made its debut. Here, the creative impulses of Syroco carvers, and company designer Fred Fisher, could be given free reign on a dizzying array of ashtrays, door stops, dresser boxes, pen sets, picture frames, bookends, brush holders, corkscrews, bottle openers, clocks, paperweights, coasters, coin trays, desk calendars, bar trays, humidors, pipe racks, napkin rings, note boxes, thermometers, tie racks, statuettes...and motto plaques.

These were the sort of items vacationers might snap up, and that was actually the original intent. Billed as "just right for elegant living and gracious giving," pressed wood plaques made great souvenirs. On many, there was a molded circular space, for a decal heralding the specific vacation spot where it had been purchased. Across the United States, dime and department stores began stocking the plaques.

The popularity of Syroco soon gave rise to a host of imitators: main competitor Burwood Products Co. ("Karv-Kraft") of Michigan; the Canadian firm, Durwood; Multi-Products ("Décor-A-Wood); Ornamental Arts & Crafts Co. ("Orn-A-Craft); and even a Syroco associate company, Ornawood.

The 1950s also saw a major shift in what exactly constituted a Syroco product, with compression molding phased out in favor of injection molding. Although the appearance was still of hand-carved wood, the composition was now an all- polymer blend. Resulting pieces were lighter, sturdier and cheaper.

Today, vintage Syrocowood plaques and other novelties do a brisk business






at antique shows and online. Inexpensive in their day, pressed wood wall plaques still remain a very affordable collectible. Plenty offer up their words of wisdom with most averaging under \$25. Collectors should appreciate that. After all, "a penny saved is a penny earned."


