# Collectors like their barware shaken, not stirred

The jingle of ice as a bartender deftly shakes a cocktail in a bright container somehow enriches the experience. Today, we take cocktail shakers for granted; but before they were invented in the 19th century, drinks were either stirred with long-handled spoons or poured between two glasses. Enter the cocktail shaker; the multi-piece cocktail shaker as we know it didn't arrive until the mid-19th century, even though shaking drinks in some form has existed for millennia. The story goes that tavern keepers realized it was simpler to mix drinks by placing a larger tumbler over a smaller one — and shaking — rather than stirring or pouring between two glasses.

The emergence of the shaker coincided with an evolution of drinking habits, particularly in the United States. Cocktails were a departure from traditional European drinking customs, which primarily focused on wine, beer, and liqueurs. A major contributor to the rise of cocktail culture was the increased availability of ice, first supplied by ice houses, and then made more accessible through refrigeration advancements. In the mid to late 1800s, both Americans progressive Europeans enthusiastically embraced mixology, resulting in a vibrant array of drinks that were often best enjoyed shaken and chilled.

The cocktail movement was helped along by famous mixologists who published recipe books to support bartenders. Jerry Thomas wrote the first bartender's guide, "The Bon Vivant's Guide: How to Mix Drinks," in 1862. It was followed by Harry Johnson's "Bartenders Manual" published in 1882. Soon after, European bartenders, including Harry Craddock of the Savoy Hotel in London, penned similar publications like "The Savoy Cocktail Book," which featured an impressive 750 cocktail recipes. These books highlighted the importance of quality bar tools, including those for shaking cocktails.

The first shakers were simply two metal cups designed to fit together. They were typically made of tin, although more upscale establishments sometimes used copper or silver tumblers. The earliest U.S. patent for a cocktail shaking tool was issued in 1872, for a device that

could mix six drinks at once. During the 19th century, numerous patents brought forth an array of creative adaptations to the basic shaker, including one version with a built-in juicer. From that array came three iconic shaker types that have stood the test of time: the Boston, Cobbler, and French shakers.

The Boston shaker, which remains a favorite among professionals, was one of the original cocktail shaker varieties. Although its exact origins are not well-documented, it is believed to have been

developed by a bartender in Boston during the mid-19th century. This twopiece shaker consists of a larger mixing tin paired with a smaller tin or glass

# Automobilia collectors fueled their passions at Fall Carlisle

CARLISLE, Pa. — The weekend of October 2-6, the Carlisle fairgrounds in Pennsylvania came alive as Carlisle Events commemorated 50 years of automotive passion. Known for hosting some of the world's largest car shows, Carlisle Events has created a cherished destination for car enthusiasts of all ages. The 50th anniversary Fall Carlisle filled the 80-acre fairgrounds with a massive swap meet and flea market, while down the block was a thrilling car auction. Vendors, hobbyists, and pickers came by the thousand, all eager for the thrill of the

Carlisle has evolved from its modest beginnings in 1974 into somewhat of a pilgrimage destination for automotive enthusiasts. Things began as a small car club dedicated to post-war vehicles at a time when such cars were dismissed for collection or restoration. Before Carlisle Events came into being, there were few avenues for those interested in restoring post-war cars. Founders Bill and Chip Miller aimed to establish an event for like-minded enthusiasts seeking parts and accessories for later-era vehicles. Their inaugural event, dubbed "Postwar '74," was held on September 26, 1974, featuring 600 vendors and drawing over 13,000 attendees.

By the 1980s, the shows were consistently selling out, prompting the Millers to purchase the Carlisle Fairgrounds. They expanded the offerings by introducing specialty shows focused on brands like Corvettes, Fords, imports, and trucks, and added car auctions. Today, Carlisle Events hosts a dozen auto-themed events that draw over half a million visitors from

# Olympic mascot plush animals scored high marks at Renaissance

READING, Pa. —Offering various items from different estates kept the bidders interested when the Renaissance Auction Group listed an online

Maybe the most surprising item to sell for an excellent \$340 bid was a pair of plush souvenirs from the Olympics. Amik the Beaver came from the 1976 Montreal Olympics and was made by Might Star Ltd. It measured 15 by 7 inches and still had the original hang tag. It was in excellent condition. The second plush was from the Moscow Olympics. Misha the Bear measured roughly 8 by 5 inches. This one also had the original hang tag and was in excellent condition. These rare souvenirs came from the Dolores Bernecker Heinsohn doll collection.

Five consecutive \$2 notes were sold. These were from the 1976 series. These two-dollar federal reserve notes were

across the country and beyond each year.

This year's fall show was nothing short of spectacular. Over 8,000 vendors filled the fairgrounds with vintage cars, parts, accessories, and collectibles, making it a paradise for the nearly 100,000 enthusiasts who attended. A car corral boasted 650 vehicles for sale, while show fields held exceptional cars from the hobby. A Manufacturer's Midway featured a lineup of sponsors, OEMs, and aftermarket suppliers. Just two blocks away, the Carlisle Expo Center hosted an exciting two-day classic and collector car auction, showcasing over 400 vehicles and an array of memorabilia.

For collectors of automobilia and petroliana, the event was exceptional. Amidst all the engine blocks, manifolds, and tires, attendees found a treasure trove of collectibles, including auto ephemera, tangibles ranging from dealership signs to gas pumps, auto art, and car parts perfect for embellishing garages and basements.

Automobilia fans had a virtually endless array of items to choose from, including old license plates, displayable car parts, manufacturers' memorabilia, and miles of model and toy vehicles. One dealer showcased vintage Ford pickup doors priced at \$350, while another offered dashboard clusters in as-found condition for \$125, either perfect for a man cave or home bar. An inventive seller outfitted a 1955 Pontiac Deluxe hood ornament mounted on a Sunbeam Mixmaster stand, priced for \$475.

Vintage license plates were plentiful, available from both specialized dealers and those who had handfuls on tables of otherwise mixed merchandise. While prices were generally market rate, the availability was exceptional. Auto-related ephemera was also plentiful. Items like vintage car magazines, dealer brochures, and shop manuals were often priced between \$1 and \$5, while rarer pieces occasionally reached the low hundreds.

One dealer showcasing GM memorabilia had bins of merchandise categorized from \$1 to \$50. There was so much inventory, that even on day two, half of the bins remained unopened. Bargain hunt-

ers eagerly snagged items like sales quota trophies, GM paperweights, and old dealership calendars, even at \$1. Meanwhile, numerous sellers focused on vintage toys, offering collectible pieces like 1940s era cast-iron airplanes, Schuco vehicles, and Sun Rubber cars, priced from \$25.

Petroliana collectors also found plentv to enjoy. Predictably, gas pumps drew plenty of attention, with project pieces starting in the mid-hundreds and restored pumps reaching several thousand dollars. The selection of ever-popular signs was extensive, spanning categories from auto parts to soda brands. Prices ranged from around \$100 for small, rough examples to several thousand for pristinely-restored, crated neon signs.

For those in search of something distinct, watchful eyes could uncover the unusual. One dealer offered an array of vintage coolers, often sought by hot-rodders to use as battery boxes. Those were priced around \$75. Just a stone's throw away, a nostalgic non-electrified Dr. Pepper store floor cooler sat tagged at \$800. Further afield, a dealer with several amusement rides had a restorable "Buck Rogers" style rocket ride available for \$1,200. All

stamped April 13, 1976, with a Washington D.C. postmark and a 13-cent US flag stamp. They were listed as highgrade and were crisp and uncirculated. This set of five sold for \$100, and the second grouping of the same \$2 notes sold for the final bid price of \$120.

A single solitary \$10 note drove the bidding up. This one was dated 1921 from the Second National Bank of Reading. It had a nice, clean surface with no losses and sold for the impressive final bid price of \$170.


A series of six 1957 \$1 silver certificates attracted some interest. In crisp uncirculated condition they sold for

A centennial revival walnut library table brought a bid price of \$95. It measured roughly 30 by 52 by 30 inches. In the Empire style, it featured burl walnut and veneer. It dated to around the 1870s. The dual pedestal that led down to the platform base showed off four ornately carved lion's paw feet. It was structurally sound with no significant losses, so it was in good condition over-

A second library table was oak and measured 30 by 41 by 21 inches. It dated from 1880 to 1900 and had one drawer over one door. It had a carved skirt and two turned and carved pedestals that led the eye to the lower shelf. It had bun feet and a beautifully aged

patina. It showed no significant losses and was structurally sound, so it was in good condition overall. It sold for \$160.

A Victorian era pier mirror was absolutely gorgeous. It was ornately decorated at the top and was in cathedral style. It had a mahogany finish and ebony and gold gilt accents. The aged patina helped to make it look imposing. It was in very good condition overall. With the fancy filigree at the top and the bun feet proudly helping it stand, it stood an impressive 73 by 30 inches and sold for

A beautiful French Ormalu clock would have looked very royal sitting on either one of the library tables or above a fireplace. This antique mantel clock struck the time on the quarter hour. It had cherubs and mythological figures with pierced corner brackets. The dial was brass. This piece was in very good to excellent visible condition. It did not have a key with it, so it was untested as to whether it worked. It sold for \$170,

Some Beatles' records were well sought after. An original extended play 45 vinyl record was a souvenir of the Beetles' visit to America, which was proclaimed on the sleeve. It included the songs Misery, Taste of Honey, Ask Me Why, and Anna. This one was a Vee-Jay record and was released on March 23, 1964. It still had the cardboard picture sleeve, which was in excellent condition, and the vinyl was estimated to be excellent. It sold for \$170.

A Capitol record of the Beatles in 1964 brought just a bit more attention, with a selling price of \$180. This was also an extended play, with songs including Four By the Beatles, Roll Over

Beethoven, This Boy, All My Loving, and Please, Mr. Postman. It was released on May 11, 1964. The vinyl was estimated to be excellent, and the sleeve was estimated to be very good or better.

Another Capitol record by the Beatles brought a final bid price of \$120. Also, from 1964, this one included Honey Don't, I'm a Loser, Mr. Moonlight, and Everybody's Trying to Be My Baby. It was released on February 1, 1965. The cardboard sleeve and picture sleeve were in excellent condition.

Sticking with the Beatles, three ticket stubs were offered from their Atlantic City Steel Pier concert on August 30, 1964. These tickets were for the balcony seats, section 10, Row D, seats 10,11 and 12. The tickets were heavy cardboard stock and had the corners ripped off where the ticket taker handled them. These three pieces of history were sold for a bid of \$220.

Four 1964 Beatles posters were sold as one lot. They all measured 74 by 25 inches and were put out by the H.J. Heinz promotional premium. They were all black and white printed photographs, one of each of the Beatles performing with their instruments. They also each showed a facsimile signature, and each was marked at the bottom with "1964 Beatles (U.S.A.) Ltd.". They were all in very good condition overall, with some edge wear and some minor corner losses from where they had been displayed. The grouping of four sold for \$220.

Some stained-glass windows were run across the auction block. They brought

good prices. Both a lower and an upper window sash were sold for \$160 each. These beautiful stained-glass pieces were made up of mostly neutral colors, so they would fit in just about anywhere. They were all still contained in the original frames and were structurally sound with no significant flaws. They were of the Moorish or Rococo motif. The upper sash measured 37 by 32 by 2 inches, and the lower sash measured 34 by 32 by 2 inches.

A Tennessee River Burlington chert blade, which measured roughly 7 by 2 inches and came with a certificate of authenticity brought a high bid of \$130. A gray Kentucky Hornstone blade, dated from late Archaic to late Woodland and measuring roughly 6 by 2 inches, sold for \$65 with a certificate of authenticity.

Fifteen arrowhead points were sold for \$220. These varied in colors from grey, white, brown, and black. There were eight serrated, one obsidian, and one large round-tailed. They were contained in a vintage stocking box and sold as one unit.

# American classics muscled top bids at Carlisle Auctions fall event

CARLISLE, Pa. -- On the weekend of Oct. 3-4, automotive enthusiasts gathered for one of the nation's premier automotive events: the Fall Carlisle car show, marking its 50th anniversary this year. The weekend featured a standout car auction showcasing over 400 vehicles from every generation of production.

Since 2006, Carlisle Auctions has been a prominent name in classic vehicle auctions, with origins tracing back to 1974. The company now hosts four auctions each year — two in Carlisle and two in Florida. The fall auction offered collectors a diverse range of vehicles, from vintage project cars and daily drivers to impeccably restored classics.

This round, American classic cars took center stage, attracting numerous bids in the five- and even six-figure range. The top seller was a 1966 Corvette convertible, which commanded an impressive \$120,000. Equipped with a robust 425-hp 427 Top Flight engine, this vehicle boasted features like factory side exhaust, a luxurious leather interior, and telescopic steering. It underwent a meticulous frame-off restoration and came with all relevant judging sheets.

Bidding soared to \$90,000 for a rare original 1969 Camaro pace car, equipped with a 396/375-hp engine and just 26,744 miles on the odometer. This remarkable vehicle is one of only a handful known to exist, and its matching numbers have been certified by renowned appraiser Jerry

MacNeish. Close behind, a 1957 Chevrolet Bel Air fetched \$85,000. This classic had undergone a meticulous frame-off rotisserie restoration, featuring a rebuilt 283 engine with factory fuel injection, along with power steering, power brakes, power windows, and a Continental kit.

A standout from the truck category was a 1969 Chevy C10, which attracted an \$80,000 bid. The custom pickup featured a GM LS-3 376 430-hp engine paired with a 4-speed automatic with controller and overdrive. The chassis and suspension were powder-coated. It was outfitted with vintage A/C, custom grill, stained wood bed with gas door mount, custom red leather bucket seats, Alpine stereo, and Dakota digital gauges.

Bidding remained in the solid five-figure range on scores of vehicles like the 1970 Dodge Challenger R/T convertible with 84,369 original miles and matching numbers that pulled \$65,000. This classic featured a 383 engine generating 335 hp and 425 lb-ft of torque, paired with a Tremec 5-speed manual transmission. It also boasted a power convertible top, factory A/C, and original options such as factory cruise control and an AM/FM stereo. Also hitting the mid-five figures at \$47,500 was a 1959 Ford Skyliner convertible.

The AACA Grand National show winner was completely rust-free and showcased a stunning Grenadier Red exterior with a red and black interior. Under the hood, it housed a fresh 352-cubic inch H-Code V8 engine producing 300 hp, coupled with an automatic transmission. Additional features included a power top, dual exhaust, a Continental kit, stainless fender skirts, and whitewall tires. Later in the auction, a 1931 Chevy Independence Huckster truck sold for \$21,500. This vehicle underwent a frame-off restoration in the 1990s and won the AACA National First Prize in 1998. Powered by a 50-hp 6-cylinder engine and manual transmission, it featured a wood ceiling and bed floor, along with roll-down canopies on all three sides of the bed.

Even when prices dipped into the four-figure range, impressive vehicles continued to make their way off the floor. A clean, drivable 1940 Buick Super 8 sold for \$8,500. This four-door sedan was equipped with a 3-speed manual transmission. A winning bid of \$8,000 secured a 1962 Studebaker Gran Turismo Hawk, featuring a small-block V8, automatic transmission, power steering, power brakes, and a

woodgrain dash. A modest \$5,750 bid took home a 1977 MGB. The well-maintained roadster boasted a 1.8 MC B Series inline four-cylinder engine, 4-speed manual transmission, power front disc brakes, and a Pacesetter Monza exhaust system.

Some interesting bargains included a 2004 BMW 325 CI convertible with a 2.5-liter L6 DOHC 24-valve engine, which sold for just \$3,500. Another \$3,500 picked up a 1973 Volkswagen Karmann Ghia coupe with auto stick, in good restorable condition. The standout deal for the bargain-hungry was a well-maintained 1980 Triumph TR-7 convertible that sold for an incredible \$1,500.

The auction takes place at the Carlisle Expo Center, conveniently located just blocks from the Carlisle fairgrounds, where the car show occurs simultaneously. General admission tickets cost \$13, with discounts for military ID holders or if purchased in advance.

that fits snugly against its opening.

The cobbler shaker also referred to as a Manhattan shaker, was patented by Edward Hauck in 1884 and has become the most popular choice for home use. This all-in-one shaker features a metal tin, a lid with a built-in strainer, and a cap that often doubles as a measuring tool. The name "cobbler" may have originated from the Sherry Cobbler, a well-known 19th-century cocktail that required shaking and straining.

The French or Parisian shaker resembles a cobbler shaker but consists of just two pieces and lacks a built-in strainer. This design means bartenders must either use a separate strainer or carefully pour through a small gap between the two sections.

In addition to these classic styles, pour-type shakers gained popularity between the two world wars, often resembling modified teapots. Some were made entirely of metal, while others featured glass bottoms with metal lids. Some were made entirely of metal, while others featured glass bottoms with metal lids. A defining characteristic of these shakers is a small spout on one side. They are commonly referred to as "martini shakers" today.

In Victorian England, cocktail shakers became a symbol of sophistication. Their designs also frequently mimicked silver teapots, which suited the shift from tea time to cocktail hour. Notable retailers like Tiffany and Harrods capitalized on this trend by including silver-plated shakers in their offerings.

At the outset of the 20th century, silver and other metals still held sway, but stainless steel, developed in the 1920s, emerged as the preferred material for cocktail shakers, favored by bartenders on both sides of the Atlantic for its durability, rust resistance, and ease of cleanup.

The 1920s saw the emergence of fresh cocktail shaker designs, shaped by the fashionable Art Nouveau and Art Deco styles. The International Exposition of Decorative Arts and Modern Industries in 1925 introduced a machine-age aesthetic, and shakers began featuring forms that reflected progress and industrial innovation. Chrome and Bakelite became popular materials. Designers like Russel Wright and firms such as Revere created shakers inspired by everything from skyscrapers to zeppelins. German-made shakers from this period were particularly esteemed for their high-quality craftsmanship.

Prohibition in the United States had a profound impact on cocktail shaker design. With bars closed, the only legal

option for drinking was at home. Nevertheless, companies like Farberware and Chase Brass & Copper continued to manufacture cocktail shakers. Yet, because cocktail paraphernalia was under scrutiny, these shakers were made overly ornate or crafted in shapes that otherwise disguised their true identity. During this time, figural shakers became particularly popular, featuring whimsical designs like penguins and lighthouses.

The years between the repeal of Prohibition and the onset of World War II saw a revival of cocktail culture, with people enjoying drinks in bars and at home. Cocktail parties became trendy, making display-worthy barware as desirable as quality liquor. However, this period also coincided with the Great Depression, prompting manufacturers to mass-produce cocktail shakers from more affordable materials, especially glass. Companies like Cambridge, Fostoria, and Heisey responded by offering a variety of creative yet budgetfriendly glass shakers.

America's involvement in World War II halted the production of cocktail shakers, as metals and other materials used in barware manufacturing were redirected to the war effort. In the postwar era, the cocktail shaker surged back into fashion, with designs influenced by the new materials and bold creativity of the atomic age. During this time, many homes sported rec rooms or patios with bars, creating new spaces for socializing. Additionally, television and popular media repopularized cocktail culture, a

trend famously underscored by James Bond's iconic martini request, "Shaken, not stirred."

Meanwhile, a shift was underway that would soon reshape the cocktail scene. The rise of electric blenders and mixers made the art of shaking cocktails feel outdated. Tastes also evolved, and intricate cocktails gave way to simpler mixed drinks like highballs and Manhattans, which only needed a swift stir to prepare. By the 1970s, shaken drinks had largely fallen out of favor, making way for "boat drinks" such as piña coladas and frozen daiquiris, which needed a blender for preparation.

The 1990s ushered in a nostalgic revival of cocktail culture, largely driven by relaxed legal restrictions that enabled craft distillers to bring back traditional distilling methods. With that, bartenders returned to finely crafted cocktails and again embraced the art of using a quality cocktail shaker.

That rich history of cocktail shakers creates ample opportunities for collectors. Although there are over a century's worth of shakers on the market. generally, the most sought-after pieces come from the period between the World Wars, and those from the vibrant cocktail revival of the 1950s.

If you are looking for a trophy, particularly from the Art Deco era, some of the top designers include Louis W.

Rice (1872-1933), most known for "skyscraper" cocktail shakers in the late 1920s. Good examples of those can run upwards of \$2,000. Napier Company made the highly sought-after (and much reproduced) penguin shaker. An original 1920s version can run over \$1,000. Modern replicas, from companies like Restoration Hardware can be found for under \$50. J.A. Henckels was the company responsible for the famed Streamline Moderne zeppelin shakers introduced in 1928. An original can set you back several thousand dollars, while a newer vintage replica might fetch under \$200.

Mass-produced shakers from the 1920s to the 1990s are more accessible to most collectors. Made by brands like Farberware, Revere, and glass companies like Heisey, these shakers usually range in price from \$20 to \$200, depending on condition, age, and design. A crucial tip for new collectors is to avoid buying a cobbler or pour-type shaker without its cap; while it may look nice as a display piece, it won't be functional.

For those who collect them, vintage cocktail shakers offer a glimpse into the evolution of drinking culture and the innovations that have influenced how we prepare cocktails. From the early days of mixing in simple metal cups to the intricate designs of the 20th century, each shaker tells a unique story. That legacy provides a range of choices to accommodate every collector's taste and budget.

If you would learn more about collecting cocktail shakers, a good place to begin is "The Cocktail Shaker" by Simon Khachadourian. Additionally, the website, www.cocktailshakers.com is a good source for information or to acquire a piece.
