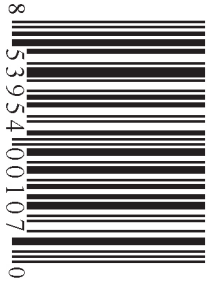

Keychains can open up a collector's heart

Sometimes, it's the little things that matter the most. And so it is with keychains, small objects kept in a pocket, jostled amongst a handful of change, only to be tossed onto the top of a bureau at the end of the day. Collecting them can be challenging, as antique examples are often misidentified, mistaken for buttons or tie clasps, pins or watch fobs.

Complicating the situation is the fact that keychains do not conform to any hard and fast description, as they can be found as rings alone, rings with fobs, or fobs alone. And then there's the matter of what to call them: "keyrings" or "keyfobs," or, as many collectors have agreed upon, "keychains."

"Even though they are fairly ubiquitous, keychains are not widely collected," according to Patrick Cottrell, a longtime collector. Living in the outskirts of Asheville, N.C., Cottrell said that many keychains have been lost to time simply because they were "used and not often preserved." In addition, he

said, "Most of those who have an antique keychain collected it for the subject matter, not because it was a keychain."

All the same, for those seeking a challenge, a keychain collection can be satisfying and rewarding.

Locks and keys date back thousands of years, when ancient Babylonians and Egyptians devised ways to safeguard their belongings. Instead of keeping their house keys on a cord (as did the Egyptians), the Romans kept their keys close at hand, attached to rings. Cottrell cautioned that while these Roman relics, unearthed by metal detectorists, can be found for sale for as little as \$20, he recommended caution when purchasing

Clyde Singer paintings drew highest bids at Meander Auctions

WHIPPLE, Ohio — Five Clyde Singer paintings and one of his prints were a main draw during the September 28 Fall Antiques and Art Auction presented by Meander Auctions of Marietta, Ohio. Held at the company's auction gallery in Whipple, Ohio, this event also included Part 1 of the textile collection of Dr. Virginia Gunn of Wooster, Ohio, a wonderful group of Blenko glass coming to auction via Toledo, Ohio, as well as a variety of smalls, furniture, silver, etc. to make for one interesting event.

The top lot of the day was Subway Crowd, oil on canvas by Clyde Singer (Ohio, 1908-1999). Signed and dated 1973 at lower right, the work was also signed and dated on the back. The image, which realized \$10,620, is of a view of a crowded 34th Street, New York, subway station. Prices include a buyer's premium.

"Singer's New York scenes showing the subway, street scenes, bar scenes," these are always popular with collectors," said Meander Auctions' co-owner (along with wife, Hollie) and auctioneer, Andrew Richmond.

Singer was born in Malvern, Ohio, (near Akron); attended the art school of the Columbus Gallery of Fine Arts (later the Columbus Museum of Art) and in 1933 won an art scholarship to the Art Students League in New York. After a year in New York Singer moved back to Ohio living in the Boardman, Canfield, and Youngstown areas. In 1940, he accepted a job from close friend, Joseph But-

ler III, director of the Butler Institute of Art in Youngstown, Ohio, and continued his fine art painting, finishing over 3,000 paintings during his career.

According to an article by Elizabeth McClelland, published in "Little Bits of History, Clyde Singer, American Scene

Painter" in *TIMELINE*, December 1966, a publication of the Ohio Historical Society, during this time working at Butler, Singer, "painted daily and returned to New York at least once a year, so his paintings

of New York are about as numerous as his paintings of Ohio." Singer died at his Canfield home in 1999.

Other Singers selling this day included the signed and dated 1949 oil on canvas

Uncle Wiggily first hopped into our lives in 1912

I must confess, I had never heard of Uncle Wiggily Longears until I saw one on his books at the Staunton Antiques Center in Staunton, Va. That's what I enjoy most, having the lost world of antiques come alive in antique stores I've never ventured into, especially on rainy days in May. Out of curiosity, I picked up Uncle Wiggily's book, *Uncle Wiggily's Picture Book*, and started reading.

Uncle Wiggily Longears is the main character in a series of children's stories and books written by Howard R. Garis. Garis, an American author, started his writing career in 1910, writing for the Newark News. Garis proved an avid writer, writing everyday of his life for more than 52 years, except Sunday, which was his day of rest. In all, he published 79 Uncle Wiggily Longears books in his career.

Garis claimed he was inspired to write about Uncle Wiggily while taking a walk in the woods near Verona, N.J., where he lived. He observed nature at its finest, see-



ing several interesting rabbits, so he began to attribute anthropomorphic or human characteristics to them, eventually creating Uncle Wiggily Longears.

Uncle Wiggily is a friendly, elderly rabbit,

who is lame from rheumatism. His infirmity forces him to carry a red, white, and blue crutch, which he describes as "striped like a barber-pole" wherever he goes. In later stories, his crutch became a "candy-striped" walking cane, with spiral red and white striping like a peppermint candy cane.

While the star of the stories, Uncle Wiggily is just one of many recurring characters. One interesting character that serves as a nemesis to Uncle Wiggily is Pipsisewha, a rhinoceros-like bully. Pipsisewha's head has a snout, two snorting nostrils, and two small horns. He always wears a black, conical cloth hat and patched scarlet trousers. Pipsisewha has a giraffe-skin body and a cow's tail, and he walks upright on two legs.

Uncle Wiggily stories often have "bad chaps" in the story lines. Animals such as



Woozy Wolf, Bushy Bear, Skillery Skallery Alligator and the "fierce" Bobcat are all created to serve as foils to Uncle Wiggily's aging kindness and ingenuity. It has been said that all of Uncle Wiggily's enemies "seem bent on nibbling the 'souse' off Uncle Wig-

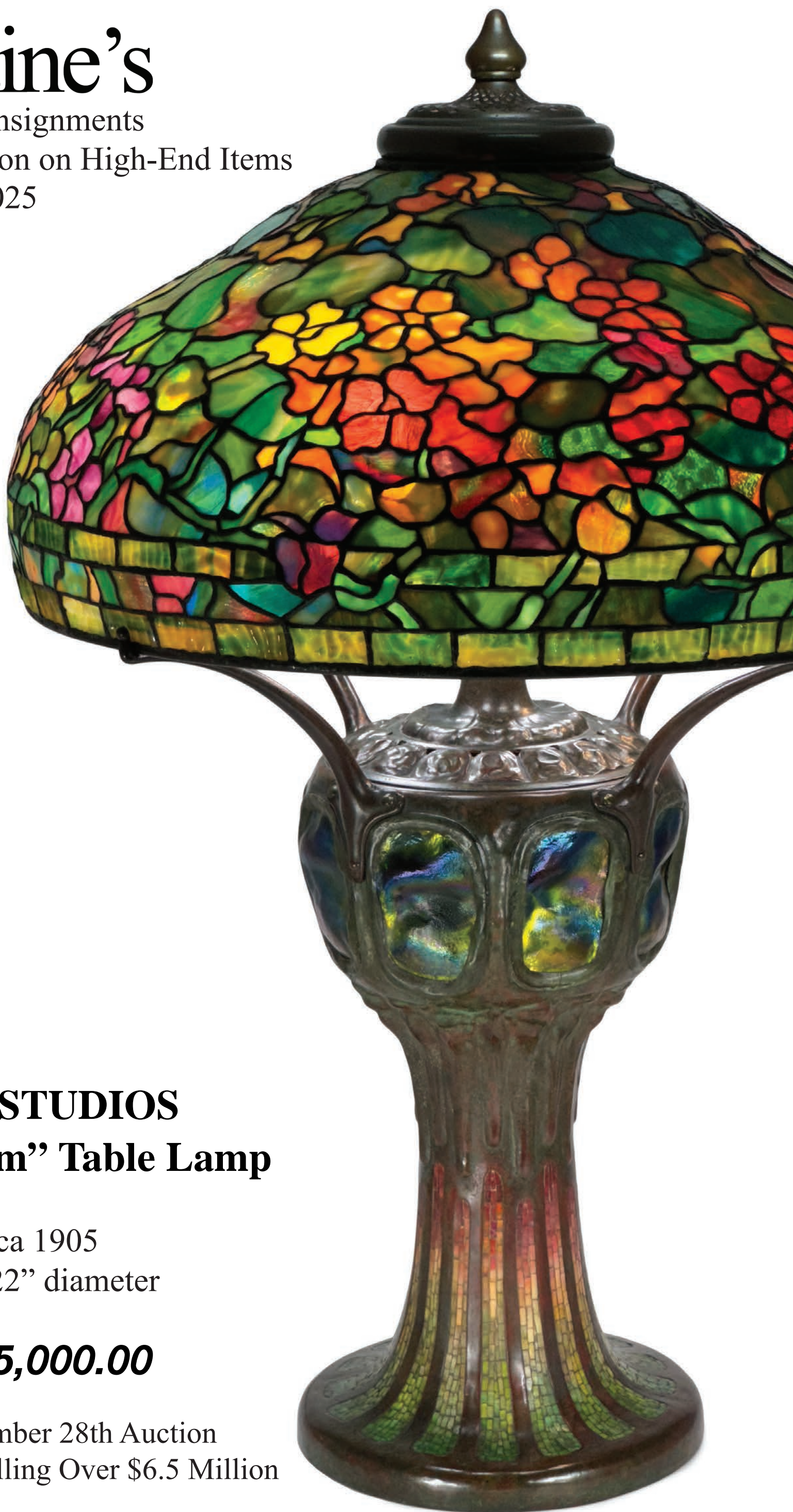

Beaten Ball Club showing a view of ball-players in the dugout. This sold for \$7,995. The catalog listing notes, "On the back is the date 1939 scratched out, and on the stretcher is inscribed 'The Coal Trucker.' It may be that this work was painted over an earlier painting, something Singer is known to have done."

The signed and dated 1966 oil on canvas Long on Bar, Short on Customers by Singer reached \$5,535; and the signed and dated 1963 oil on masonite of a woman wearing a white dress walking down the street sold for \$4,612.50. Richmond said, "Singer was known for doing full length portraits of woman, and this was a great example of that."

All of the Singers came from the collection of Pete Slates of Carrollton, Ohio. Pete's paternal aunt was Peg Cranston. Peg and her husband Jack were very good friends with Clyde Singer. Jack Cranston obtained many paintings directly from Singer.

Meander Auctions received the nod to disperse the textile collection of Dr. Virginia Gunn of Wooster, Ohio. Richmond said, "Gunn was a pioneer in the collection of 19th century textiles," acquiring and researching these items that many simply discarded. She began collecting in the 1970s, obtained her Masters in applied arts, clothing, and textiles from Syracuse University, as well as her Ph.D. In history from the University of Akron. Now in her mid-80s, Gunn has decided to put her collection into the hands of other like-minded people. Meander will host several auctions to disperse her highly acclaimed and thoroughly researched collection with Part 1 selling during this September event.

An Indiana appliqued cotton quilt, the work of Mary Evert Tharp Bradley of DeKalb County 1877-1878 and featuring a large foliate design at center sur-

The fact he is holding a glass of wine up might suggest he was a wine maker or a wine seller and wanted his image to memorialize that."

rounding berries with a geometric border in red, green, and yellow sold for \$2,040.

An exceptional circa 1862 Ohio signature quilt from Steubenville (Jefferson County) featuring a complex floral applique design in printed red and greens and with numerous inked signatures was taken to \$1,440 while a Logan, Ohio, coverlet in red, green, and blue with a centerfield design of stars and large tulips and architectural border with corner blocks signed "F.E. HESSE WEAVER LOGAN, OHIO 1862" was won with a bid of \$1,320.

A collection of Blenko (made in Milton, W.Va.) glass also saw strong results this day. "The collection included some really different examples of Blenko, specifically those

designed by Wayne Husted for Blenko," Richmond said. "Pieces with a great mid-century modern feel did very well."

A 36.25 inch tall Blenko floor decanter by Wayne Husted was bid to \$2,337. The monumental 5929 "chess" decanter was done in a red/orange color and included its stopper. Another lot of Blenko by Wayne Husted; three "blob" vases including one done in green, one in yellow, and one in cobalt realized \$1,320. Each vase was 5 inches high.

A marked "TIFFANY STUDIOS NEW YORK 531" early 20th century bronze lamp base which stood 25 inches tall sold for \$1,353. An Elizabeth II sterling hollow ware sterling silver tea service (teapot, coffee pot, lidded sugar, open sugar, open creamer, oval tray) by Cooper Brothers and Sons with the coronation mark on some pieces made \$5,900. And three mid-19th century, half plate daguerreotypes — a portrait of a lady, a group portrait of five men, and a gentleman drinking wine were bid to \$5,535.

"Overall, we were very happy with the auction," Richmond said. "We had a good crowd in the gallery and lots of participation through our online platforms — liveauctioneers and hibid resulting in a great outcome for our consignors. Our sell-through rate was 95 percent, and we felt the market's response to what we offered was very positive."

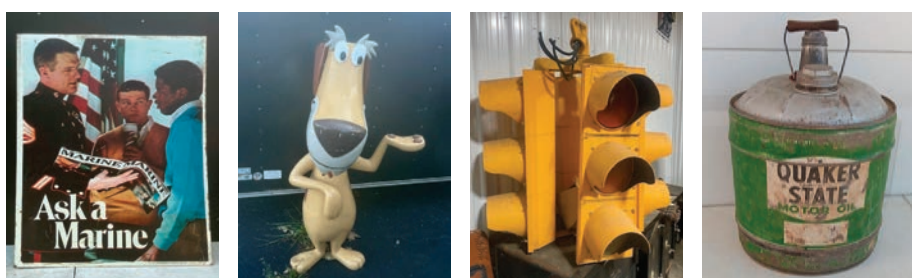

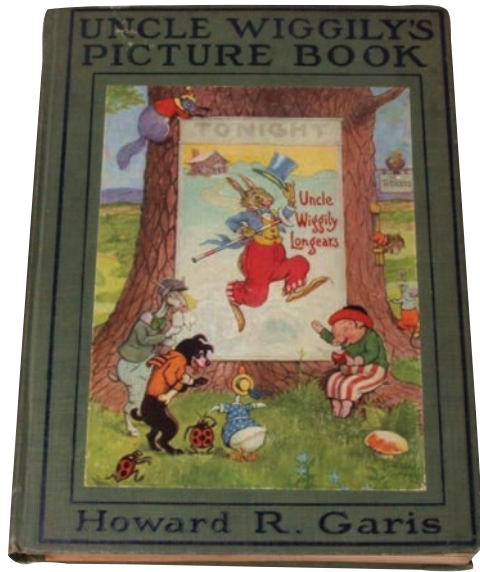
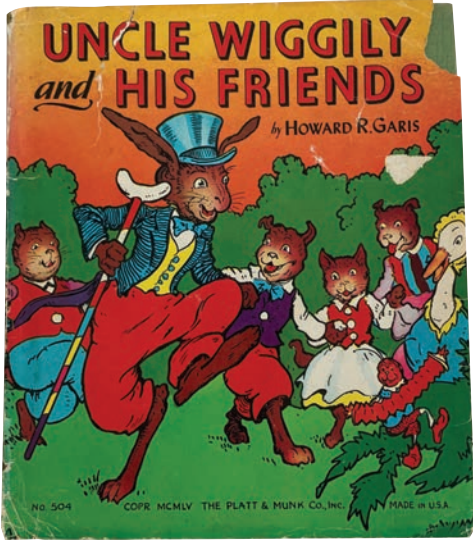

gily's ears. But we all know the good guy always wins, so in every story Uncle Wiggily outsmarts the bad guys and escapes.

One interesting development in Uncle Wiggily stories is how he escapes the bad guys. In most stories, Uncle Wiggily uses a common everyday item to escape bad situations. For instance, in one story, Nurse Jane Fuzzy Wuzzy, Wiggily's muskrat housekeeper, sends Uncle Wiggily to the store. In this story, Uncle Wiggily purchases an umbrella, and on his way home, Skillery Skallery Alligator confronts Uncle Wiggily. With quick thinking, Uncle Wiggily thrusts the umbrella in the alligator's mouth and opens it, preventing Skillery Skallery from biting old Uncle Wiggily.

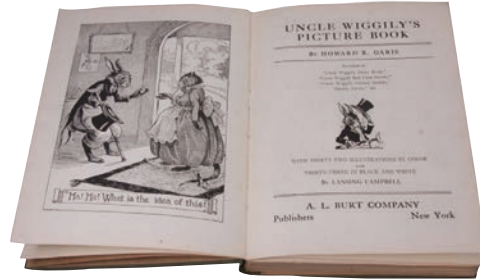


Some of Uncle Wiggily's books, such as Uncle Wiggily at the Seashore, tell of Uncle Wiggily on extended journeys, such as camping, touring in his car, or going to the beach. Usually Uncle Wiggily travels with friends, and together they must fight off repeated attacks by mean-spirited bad guys who are always lurking in the background. Often Uncle Wiggily uses his crutch to defend himself, but sometimes he reaches into his satchel, that he always seems to carry, and pulls out a "thing-a-ma-bob" to help him ward off attackers.

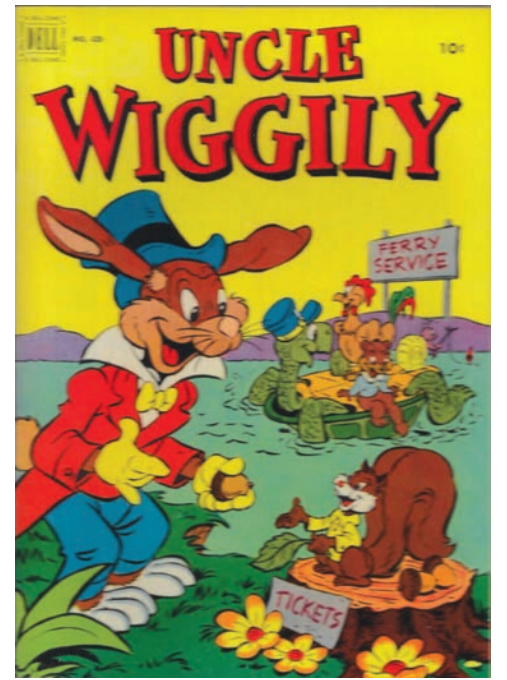
Howard Garis wrote and published a total of 79 Uncle Wiggily storybooks.

Collectors enjoy looking for first edition books, books with dust jackets still on them, and some of the Uncle Wiggily memorabilia that has been manufactured over the years, including The Uncle Wiggily Game, which has been continuously manufactured for over 100 years.

In 1916 Milton Bradley began selling an Uncle Wiggily board game that had players drawing cards to show how far they could move their Uncle Wiggily figurines across the board. The game was redesigned in 1929, 1947 and 1955. In 1987 Parker Brothers bought the rights to The Uncle Wiggily Game, and made further changes to the game board and rules. In 2018 Winning Moves was manufacturing The Uncle Wiggily Game, making the game 102 years old at that time.

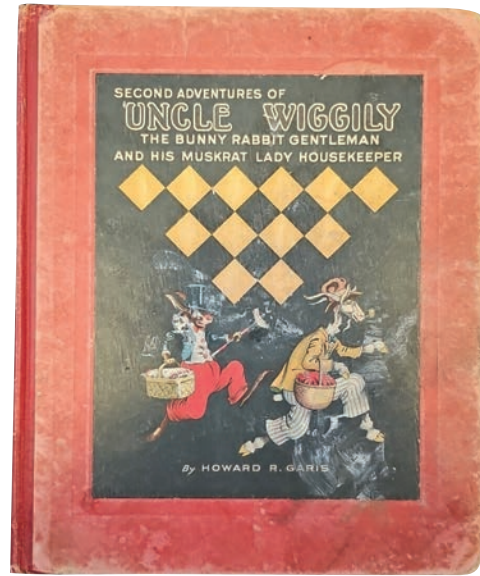


Left & Above: Uncle Wiggily's Picture Book, first printing in 1922, with 32 color frames. Considered rare, this book is valued at \$800.

Halloween fans are not scared when they see Cracker Jack toys

As Halloween approaches collectors may be searching their trinket boxes for vintage spooky charms and other jewelry. Many of these small items may have once been found inside a box of Cracker Jacks. Cracker Jack is an American brand of snack food, consisting of molasses-flavored, caramel-coated popcorn and peanuts. Beginning in 1912, a toy prize was included in every box of Cracker Jack.

Over the years, Cracker Jack toys were made of Celluloid, plastic, and metal, and the line of toys included Halloween figures, such as witches, jack o lanterns, pumpkins, black cats, ghosts, and charms intended for a charm bracelet to ward off witch's incantations and spells.

A substantial secondary collector's market exists for Cracker Jack Halloween toy prizes. Some are quite valuable.

Today, collectors search for Cracker Jack toys made before 1970 or so. These are considered the truly collectible toy prizes. Until 1937, all Cracker Jack toy prizes were made in Japan. Beginning in 1938, Carey Cloud designed them. TootsieToy made

many of the metal toy prizes. Fortunately for toy lovers, Cracker Jack toy prizes live on in collections all across America. Some of the best collections ever assembled are from the 1950s and early '60s when little girls bought charm bracelets and strung their favorite Cracker Jack toys on the bracelet. These collectors were quite proud of their achievements. Today those very same 1950s era Cracker Jack charm bracelets are centerpieces in adult collections. And many of those charm bracelets are full of Halloween Cracker Jack toys.

them, because they may or may not be reproductions.

Centuries later, in the 1800s, locks and keys became increasingly common due to the rise in industrialization. Beginning in the 1830s, the earliest keychains were mass produced. The first U.S. patent for a keyring was granted in 1869. And during the 1890s, keychains became a popular way to advertise businesses and products. By the 20th century, keychains were a part of everyday life.

Not surprisingly, this demand resulted in the making of a keychain to suit nearly every taste and interest. And for beginning collectors, this realization might prove to be a bit overwhelming. Sharing his own story, Cottrell said that his first keychain was one with a holographic design of a dragon, a "neat" Christmas gift when he was six years old from his Dad. Over the years, Cottrell has refined his search, and for the past decade, has concentrated on adding examples of antique keychains to his collection. He estimates his current collection of keychains to number in the neighborhood of "10,000 or so."

But where to begin if you are not so gifted as a child? "Puzzles might be a good place to start," Cottrell suggested. An initial outlay of \$50 to \$100 can procure an interesting lot of vintage keychains. Or concentrate on the more than 100 game-inspired miniature reproductions produced by Basic Fun, some of which are playable. Think "Don't Break the Ice" and "Monopoly."

A Disney fan? Love all things Barbie? G.I. Joe? There's a keychain for that, or perhaps even a set of keychains. Sports fans might consider collecting keychains from "Lil Sports Brats," he continued,

noting that, as with all collectibles, those with crossover appeal might sell for a bit more money. Other interesting possibilities include novelty keychains such as Sankyo's miniature music boxes, which can be found for \$10 to \$30, and egg-shaped scenes with animated clockwork windings, issued in the 1990s by the toymaker Toca.

Those up for a challenge might attempt to track down the keychains made by Tupperware; originally intended as premiums for sales associates, they were made to generate interest in all of the company's product lines. "That's a subset that's hard to get," Cottrell conceded.

Especially popular among Japanese collectors are keychains associated with "Sweet Orr," a manufacturer of what is now highly collectable vintage workers' clothing. Cottrell said that even reproduction keychains bearing the company's name are highly coveted,

adding, "They are the only reproductions I've seen selling for more than \$100."

High-end collectable keychains abound, including "figurals" that were popular in the 1920s and 1930s, and vintage Swiss gold keychains by Reuge that feature a watch. Cottrell reminded that keychains were a popular fad in France during the 1960s; Francophiles might seek those keychains produced by the Bourbon Company, often with a clip in the shape of a rounded horseshoe. Also notable is the "Return to Tiffany" keychain, introduced in the 1960s.

But in Cottrell's opinion, the "Holy Grail" for collectors "at the moment" would be those made to commemorate the World's Columbian Exposition, held in Chicago in 1893; these silver keychains are considered to be the first ones intended as souvenirs. On the other hand, a collection of keychains associated with a favorite vacation destination might be a fun category to pursue. And don't overlook the idea of making your own keychain, as Cottrell has done using a fishing lure found on a beach.

On the topic of condition, Cottrell said that flaws do not automatically negate a purchase. Because keychains were intended to be used, they often show signs of wear. He said that collectors need to weigh any less-than-perfect condition against the possibility of never finding a similar keychain that is more perfect.

As for how to best store a collection, Cottrell said that many enthusiasts display their favorites on a pegboard. He favors using a flat file cabinet, which allows him to view and appreciate his holdings. On the creative side, he has also repurposed an old spool holder to display some of his keychains. His earliest method, he said, a binder ring,

has long since been proven to be inadequate. Meanwhile, he is reluctant to use his rarest examples for their original intended purpose.

For those wishing to learn more and to connect with other collectors, Cottrell recommends joining Keychains Collectors International. Once an in-person club that met every other year for in-person conventions, the group has transitioned into an active Facebook club, with approximately 3,000 members from around the world. Trading information and swapping with like-minded collectors is among the benefits members enjoy. You can find it here: www.facebook.com/groups/Keychainrecruiter

In the end, it's the thrill of the chase that motivates collectors like Cottrell. "The fun thing is that you never know what's out there."
