The 20th century brought us eyeglasses that were fashionable

Dorothy Parker once declared, "men seldom make passes at girls who wear glasses." Judging by what, for many years, constituted eyewear fashion, Dorothy may have had a point.

Although eyeglasses had been around since medieval times, they were originally regarded as necessary evils, available only to the wealthy and the well-connected. Functional and unattractive, they were also handcrafted, and thus affordable for only a select few.

Mass-market availability came with the Industrial Revolution of the mid-1800s. Inexpensive glasses were now within the grasp of every consumer, but the emphasis was on serviceability rather than style. The choice of a frame was generally left to the optician, much as the choice of medication was left to the family doctor. Those in need of visual aid gave no more thought to the concept of "fashionable" glasses than they did to the concept of fashionable dentures. Glasses were what they were—and what they were wasn't very appealing.

By the mid-twentieth century, glasses-wearers, after years of interchangeably dull frames, were in the mood for something more flattering. Paving the way for change were the eyewear manufacturers themselves, who saw possibilities in a previously untapped market. In 1930, for the first time, eyeglasses were featured as part of a major fashion show, held at New York's Waldorf-Astoria. In 1939, Altina Sanders won an America Design

award for her "Harlequin" frame, regarded as the first real fashion frame design, and forerunner of the upswept cat-eyes so popular in the '50s. Then, following World War II, cellulose acetate emerged as an inexpensive, workable frame component, leading to 1948s introduction of the first molded frame. Finally, eyeglass designers could let their imaginations run wild.

Eyewear advertising soon focused on the appeal of glasses as a desirable fashion accessory. Who could resist Ray-Bans, with "frame styles so flattering they're almost wicked?" Who

could say "no" to American Optical frames that guaranteed "everything will look dazzling tomorrow. Especially you?" Even Hollywood chimed in, with glamorous Marilyn Maxwell not only owning up to being a glasses-wearer, but also, according to news reports, "posing for cheesecake photos, to prove that glasses don't detract from a girl's attraction." Dorothy Parker's vision of things was finally laid to rest in 1953, when eyewear giant Bausch & Lomb crowned the first "Miss Specs Appeal," ("America's prettiest model who wears glasses"). Said the happy winner, "of course men make passes at girls who wear glasses. It simply depends on the frame."

Different eye fashions were now specifically geared for work, for play, for dress, and for everything in between. Bausch & Lomb ran an entire campaign based on the premise that "one pair of glasses is not enough," and 1954s "Miss Beauty in Glasses" declared "modern frames for various occasions are as much a part of fashion today as shoes, hats, or jewelry." "Miss Beauty's" personal collection included "Hi-Lites, Balrims, Ray-Bans, and

18th century celebrity showcased at Colonial Williamsburg

WILLIAMSBURG, Va., - Before fan magazines at the check-out counter, long before nearly everyone had a camera in their pocket, and at a time when the word "celebrity" was not used in the modern sense, people began putting a face to a name. Highlighting the emergence of this phenomenon is a recently opened exhibition at the Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg, one that examines a grouping of 18th century people who continue to live on, thanks to portrai-

"Celebrity in Print" tells the story behind the faces of individuals whose image was shared in print. Thirty-seven artifacts are currently on view, primarily prints but also ceramic pieces and a medal, according to Katie McKinney, Colonial Williamsburg's curator of maps and

McKinney explained that the idea for this exhibition took root "a couple of years ago," when she was involved in a project to rethink the interiors of the town's taverns. Research led her to discover that Jane Vobe, then-proprietor of what is now the restaurant known as King's Arms Tavern, had purchased from the in-town print shop the likeness of the Duchess of Ancaster. Whether for her personal use or to decorate her business remains unknown. But this finding led McKinney to wonder why certain people are chosen to be the subject of a print, and taking that one step further, "why would people buy images of people they don't know."

In selecting images for the exhibition, McKinney decided to include

"faces that you don't expect to see." To be sure, famous beauties of the day and stars of the stage, esteemed authors, and political figures were among the obvious choices, but she

extended the net to include elderly and poor individuals, as well those with diverse backgrounds and talents. All the while, she limited her selections to those who had a tie-in to

The leading piece was the 1957 Tonka B-206 trailer sales set. This multipiece collection featured a blue pickup truck, horse trailer with 2 horses, a boat with trailer, and a utility trailer that were all intended to be hitched to this truck. A second orange truck read "Sportsman" on the side, had a cargo box mounted on the bed, and carried a rowboat on top. It also had a box trailer hitched to it. The original cardboard box was included. It was in poor condition, but the items were fine. This fun set was taken home with a final bid of



Among renowned individuals included are George Washington, represented with a portrait that, even though it was said to be "drawn from life," bore little resemblance to the man, and Benjamin Franklin, who was so pleased with a 1763 mezzotint made of him in London that he gladly handed out copies to his friends and correspondents.

Additionally, the exhibit showcases individuals who are not household names. One such example is the image of Charles Ignatius Sancho, pictured in a frontispiece to "Letters of the late Ignatius Sancho, an African," published in 1782, two years after his death. The story of the abolitionist's life, from humble beginnings to becoming the first Black man in England to vote in a parliamentary election, is made personal, thanks to the pairing of his image and his words.



Just as celebrity-related memorabilia is popular today, so it was in Colonial times, when portraits of famous people adorned such objects as hand-

kerchiefs and snuff boxes, drinking vessels and more. An example of this is a soft-paste porcelain figure of comedic actor Henry Woodward, in costume for his role in David Garrick's first play, "The Fine Gentlemen." It is currently displayed beside the print that inspired it.

Other personages highlighted include Margaret Patten, who achieved local fame during her lifetime by professing to be 136 years old in 1737. Attributing her longevity to taking long walks and drinking only milk, she died in a London workhouse in 1739. Today, she is remembered in a print based on a portrait that hung in the workhouse.

And then there is Elizabeth Gunning, who was married to the Duke of Hamilton, widowed, and then married to the 5th Duke of Argyll, there-

by making her twice a duchess.


McKinney pointed out that this is not a static exhibition, citing the fact that pages in a book of Macaroni prints will be turned every six months. Next year, some of the objects on display will be switched out for different ones. For example, a print of the first Chinese man to visit Williamsburg will take the place of Anne Oldfield, an English actress buried in Westminster Abbey. Both prints bear handwritten annotations.

"Celebrity in Print" is only the second exhibition presented in a relatively new gallery of the DeWitt Wallace Decorative Art Museum. Relating the stories behind these portraits (and those of others featured in the exhibition), McKinney presented an introductory lecture that was accompanied by three actors who brought to life some of the personages in print. Looking ahead, she concluded, "I hope we can reprise this."

trucks stepped up as the next popular category. First, the massive 37-inchlong Mohawk Mack gasoline tanker red semi-truck was offered with its padded boxes. The door (which opens) wore the logo "Smith Miller Smitty Toys, California", and "Famous Trucks in Miniature". Other impressive details included a Mack the bulldog hood ornament, the detachable polished silver finish tank, and the accurately depicted stacks. This handsome model was captured with a final bid of \$1,200. The next Smith Miller tanker was the orange and blue Union Oil delivery truck. It measured 35 inches long and included several accurate details such as two side panels with retractable hoses, a Minute Man Service drawing on the tank, and a Union 76 logo on the door. Also sold with its padded box, it left with a final bid of \$950. For something completely different, the Smith Miller log hauling truck also did well. The door read "Smith Miller Mackinac Escanaba Michigan Logging Works" and the trailer was carrying five lengthy wood logs. It finished with a high bid of \$850.

There were some very realistic implements offered with the model tractors. The Scale Models brand 1/8 scale Farmall 806 tractor came with a George Pippenger New Idea 2-row picker. A 1/8 scale model tractor is approximately 16 inches long, so this is a very large scale series. The set was reported to be in excellent condition and

drew a final bid of \$800. Another 1/8 scale George Pippenger pull type New Idea 2-row corn picker sold by itself for a \$550 bid.

Moving on to the pedal cars, there were 17 attractive options to choose from. It was the pedal tractors that lead the pack. First up was the brilliant green John Deere LA custom pedal tractor with rubber tires, original vintage style metal seat, and John Deere decals intact. Measuring approximately 30 inches long by 20 inches high, this toy left for new adventures with a high bid of \$1,200. Three orange pedal tractors produced by Eska included one IH McCormick Farmall and two Allis Chalmers (models CA and C) that went for \$900 each. In addition to the tractors, there were some vintage Murray pedal cars that were restored and looked great. The Murray Ranch Wagon pedal car in burnt orange with rear compartment for cargo or a passenger and ball bearing drive collected a \$450 high bid, as did the forest green

Country Squire pedal car.

The variety and quality of these auction items were impressive, and it is difficult to select just a few items to feature. For example, there were four custom made scenes consisting of model horses, harnesses, and equipment. A team of two Breyer model horse Belgians wearing intricate draft harnesses and pulling a handsome Stenson box wagon was a stunning example of workmanship. The entire set up measured 27 inches long and had signs that read "Zumbrota Auction Market". It was claimed with a final bid of \$800. The custom plow hitched to three Breyer horses left with a final bid of \$250, and the custom horse-drawn manure spreader and the custom hay mower with their teams of harnessed horses each cleared final bids of \$200.

Interspersed with the newer items there were also vintage toys and models for consideration. The highest selling was the Keystone pressed steel air mail plane. It measured 25 inches long, and except for some paint loss it was in good condition. This collectible plane had a mechanism underneath which caused the propeller to rotate via a gear connected to a shaft when the wheels were turned. This nostalgic toy was claimed with a final bid of \$500.





DELAWARE, Ohio — On No. 29-30 Amelia Jeffers and her team will offer Americana enthusiasts a special alternative to the typical American "Black Friday" activities. Reviving an annual tradition that began over 60 years ago with Ohio auction legend Garth Oberlander, Jeffers will oversee the auction of select items from three lifetime collections in a 19th Century barn known to many as "Garth's Auction Barn."

Day one of the two-day auction will feature the lifetime collection of Robert Horn, from Eaton, Ohio, selling unreserved. Over a 50+ year span, Horn has maintained a low profile personally but purchased from some of the most legendary names in the Ohio and Indiana antiques market, including his friends and "running buddies" Clark Garrett, David Good, and John Auraden. Additions to his collection were chosen based primarily on intuition, a keen eye for unusual and special folk art, and a willingness to step up when opportunities presented themselves.

Gleaned by establishing a trusted connection and then visiting lodges throughout Ohio and Indiana, an extensive grouping of fine Odd Fellows material from the Horn collection includes heart-in-hand and ram staffs, cornucopia, bows and arrows, quivers, urns, ark figures, and architectural letters with original gilt decoration. Known as a sophisticated weathervane collector, Horn has handled several iconic vanes, including a dozen that will be offered in the sale, such as a full-bodied steer with copper body and wonderful verdigris surface attributed to Cushing & White of Waltham, Mass.

Horn's large trade sign collection runs the gamut from the 19th to 20th centuries and from simple, lettered examples to dimensional signs. Of note is an ornate sign reading "Western Inn" showing a grouping of turkeys. The sign last sold at Mike Clum's Auction gallery in Rushville, Ohio, for nearly \$140,000. Passing through the hands of Greg Kramer of Robesonia, Pennsylvania, the sign returned to Ohio when Camden dealer David Good purchased it after the auction.

"The pre-auction process with Robert has been a lot of fun," said Jeffers. "I so appreciate when my friendship with a consignor deepens over their collection, and that has been the case in this situation. His passion for the material and people of this business is incredible and heartwarming. Robert is not only a savvy collector, but a good human being and a loyal friend and supporter of the people he has met along the way."

Day two of the packed weekend features highlights from the collections of Carol Schulman of Chesterland and Joanne and Dr. David Woodyard of Granville (both in Ohio). "Carol is a spitfire," Jeffers said when asked about the collection. "We signed her contract back in April, and then she bought things in my May auction. I asked if she planned to take them with her when she moves, and she said "No! You'll sell them in my auction!" Schulman has

been a regular on the midwestern antique scene for decades, and counted among her closest friends are Gus Knapp, Marj Stauffer, Joan Darnell, and others. But her buying wasn't limited to Ohio. Schulman regularly bought at Pook and Pook, New England Auctions, and Northeast Auctions. "Carol's focus was less regional," says Jeffers, "and more about period. She's largely an 18th and some early 19th Century collector."

Among the folk art and paintings highlights are 19th century portraits by Charles Balthazar Saint-Memin, William Matthew Prior, and Jane Anthony Davis; dozens of charming watercolors, including a pair of full-length portraits of a mother and daughter, a Samuel Bentz fraktur, and a wonderful valentine from the Tom & Carolyn Porter auction at Garth's in 2004. Also of note are a gimbaled early iron and wood stick, a tin "clip-on" booklight candle holder, and a folded tin make-do shelf candle holder. Many pieces of redware came from good friends Lew Scranton and David Good, several with great decoration and form - one described by Scranton on his invoice as "exciting!".

the single-owner collections being offered, Joanne and Dr. David Woodyard have a concentrated group of early New England furniture and decorative arts with terrific provenance. While living "back East" during the 1970s, the Woodyards built a collection buying from such illustrious names as Liverant, Tillou, Riordan, Maine, Prickett, and Stuart. Moving to Ohio for Dr. Woodyard's post at Denison University didn't slow them down, as they continued to buy from Ohio dealers like Pick Richardson and Robbins Hunter. Early clocks include a documented Reuben Ingraham, a scarce Phineas Pratt, a lovely clock with silver engraved dial by John Avery, and a shell-carved block front from Nathan Howell.

"The apothecary pewter cupboard from C.L. Prickett has gotten a lot of pre-auction attention," says Jeffers. "The surface and form are just great." The Woodyards also collected select early brass candlesticks from Robert O. Stuart of Maine. "Sticks aren't bringing what they once did," Jeffers continues, "so this should be a great opportunity to scoop up some nice buys!"

"The three core collections really do not compete with one another," commented Jeffers. "The Woodyards are strong on early, very good furniture; Carol has great early smalls; and Robert's folk art stands on its own. It came together beautifully, and it is not lost on me that these folks could have gone anywhere, and they chose us. Once again, I am so, so grateful to be working with amazing people and beautiful things!"

20th Century Eyeglasses

rhinestone-studded Cordelles for evening." Eyewear production firms had a new guiding principle: sell the consumer one pair of glasses, and the market is limited; sell the consumer a different pair of glasses for every occasion, and the market is limitless!

Romantic style names and decorative accents became the norm, for even the most basic designs. "Venus Pearl," "Twilight Jewel," "Sweetie Delight," and "Coquette" all sound enticing, but each was a model intended primarily for daily use, suggesting that even office-wear could be alluring. And, bowing to what Business Week called a "teen-age rebellion against the solemn, round, owl-eyed type of hornrims," young girls could enjoy the same styles in scaled-down versions. The accent was definitely on the feminine, with an eyeful of available options; eyewear for men and boys received scant attention. When it did, the result was no-frills; such heartysounding model names as "Hawkeye," Everyman," and, (for the boys), "Cub" and "Jr. Attorney" reflected their stolid

Eyeglasses, of course, had to retain their basic function: vision improvement. Within that framework, however, there was plenty of room for creative experimentation. Short-lived eyeglass innovations included "radio glasses," which came with a built-in transistor radio; "headband glasses," which combined hair care and eyewear; "earring glasses," which did doubleduty as jewelry; "eyelash glasses," and even "awning glasses," equipped with mini-shades to ward off raindrops. Such novelties attracted fleeting attention, then were abandoned as new looks caught the public's eye.

Achieving longer lifespans were glasses that kept the function simple, experimenting instead with form. Prominent among them was 1950s "cat-eye," successor to Altina Sander's "Harlequin." Although the cat-eye's upswept brow edges were almost uniformly unflattering, the style remains identified with the 1950s. Variations included the "double cat-eye," the "triple cat-eye," and even versions with yellow, blue, or green lenses.

Also popular were "highbrows," among the most imaginative (and most expensive) of eyewear designs. These were most definitely not glasses for everyday wear. Liberally dotted with rhinestones, pearls, and other decorative accents, highbrows came in a variety of fanciful shapes deliberately intended to attract the eye. Some were built up like sparkling tiaras; others took on the form and patterning of colorful butterflies, or had brow edges reminiscent of soaring bird wings. Entertainer Dame Edna referred to her highbrows as "face furniture," and glasses like these do seem to serve a furniture-like purpose: complement (or in many cases dictate) the overall décor.

As fashion eyewear grew in popularity, it also grew respectability. In 1961, the Fashion Eyewear Group of America was established, and in 1962, Vogue devoted an entire section to the topic. Name designers such as Schiaparelli, Christian Dior, and Pucci turned out their own signature lines: lessexpensive knock-off versions quickly followed. For those not yet ready to admit the need for glasses, manufacturers obliged with sparkling "readers" (half-glasses), folding glasses, and even modern adaptations of the hand-held lorgnette. Glasses became seen as an outer manifestation of the inner personality, with certain styles indelibly linked to certain personalities. Think of oversize smoky oval sunglasses, for instance, and the image of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis comes to mind. Imagine glittery, rockand-roll eyewear, and Elton John takes the stage. Glasses may not have created the persona, but they certainly enhanced it in the public eye.

Today, vintage eyeglass frames continue to grow in popularity. Their revival began as far back as the late 1960s, when "The Outasight Co." capitalized on the then-popular "hippie" look by marketing round metal frames from the late 1800s as "the original granny glasses." More recently, those with an eye for recycled fashion acquire highbrows, cat-eyes, and other period frames, then have the original lenses replaced with a new prescription or restyled as sunglasses. New frame designs that embrace the look of the old are also popular, echoing the 20th century decade by decade. Retro, whether authentic or re-created, is in demand.

Eyewear of the 1950s and '60s continues to make an extravagant fashion statement all its own. Whether on the face—or simply on display—one word sums up their enduring appeal:
