Vintage Kodak Brownies click with collectors

The modern era of photography began in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Complex methods like daguerreotypes and tintypes that required specialized skills and cumbersome equipment, gave way to technologies that made photography accessible to amateurs. Eventually, photography became a part of everyday life. This change was largely thanks to George Eastman, who introduced easy-to-use roll film and the first handheld camera - the Kodak - in 1888.

The Eastman Kodak Company continued to dedicate significant resources toward creating userfriendly cameras and film tailored for amateur photographers. In 1900, they introduced the first Brownie camera, reminiscent of the original 19th-century Kodak #1. Over the next 60-plus years, various models including box, folding, and plastic versions - made photography accessible to the masses. The Brownie brand became virtually synonymous with point-and-shoot picture taking, forever linking Kodak with that corner of photography. Here is a look at some of the pivotal Brownie models that contributed to the evolution of snapshot photography.

Introduced in 1900, the first Brownies were simple devices, essentially leatherette-covered cardboard boxes with a lens and shutter. Priced at just \$1, they had a fixed-focus lens, no viewfinder, and used Kodak's 117 roll film developed for the unit. These No. 1s were Initially intended for the youth market but

quickly gained popularity among users of all ages. Sales of around a quarter-million units helped foster widespread interest in photography. Today, because of their historical significance, even a rough-condition No. 1 can fetch over \$50.

The Brownie No. 2, released a year later, was slightly larger and boasted a more robust shutter and mechanicals. It came with two small reflecting viewfinders, enabling photographers to frame images both vertically and horizontally. This model was also the first to use Eastman Kodak's 120 roll film, which is still manufactured Left: This tested and working Starmatic was available for \$22. The availability of 127 film means it can still be used.

today. In 1926, the Model 2-C offered a leather-covered metal frame, improved brilliant viewfinders, and a flash attachment. These cameras are often available for \$25 or less, even in working condition.

In the 1930s, multiple Brownie models sported striking brass accents capturing the elegance of Art Deco. The Six-16, introduced in 1933, was both fashionable and functional, equipped with a close-up lens, adjustable f-stop, and a shutter release for timed exposures. It used Kodak's 616 film introduced the same year, which produced postcard-sized negatives. Kodak continued to employ the two brilliant viewfinders that allowed for taking horizontally- or

Sulfide marble with rooster crowed to \$22,140 DENVER, Pa. - Good things Left: Exceptional 2-1/8in

came in small packages at Morphy's Nov. 6-7 Toys & General Collectibles Auction, which closed the books at more than \$1.1 million. The Pennsylvania company's last major toy auction of the year featured a diverse mix of popular collecting categories within its 1,600+ lots, and when all was said and done, it was an antique baseball card and the smallest of handmade artworks – marbles – that made the biggest impression.

A mesmerizing 2-1/8-inch teal-blue sulfide marble with a nicely-detailed, well-centered rooster had a lot to crow about. It boasted 9.8 condition and earned high praise from Morphy Auctions' president and longtime marble fancier Dan Morphy, who described it as "one of the best sulfides we have ever seen." Against an estimate of \$8,000-\$12,000, it rolled confidently to a winning bid of \$22,140. Another diminutive beauty, a painted china marble with pink pinwheels at each end, was adorned with images of a lady holding a rake, a house and trees against a desert scene. The artful 1-15/16-inch orb in 9.7 condition ultimately sold for \$7,995.

Another prized item requiring only minimal shelf space was a No. 30 Ty Cobb 1914 Cracker Jack baseball card graded SGC2. Its striking image showed the legendary "Georgia Peach" against a scarlet


teal-blue-colored sulfide marble with nicely-detailed, well-centered Condition 9.8. Sold for \$22,140 against an estimate of \$8,000-\$12,000 background, suited in his Detroit Americans uniform and holding a bat. The card attracted 24 bids before rounding the bases and landing at the top of prices realized for \$34,440. A sought-after sports treasure, it far exceeded its

\$10,000-\$20,000 estimate.

Sports cards of a later era also found favor with bidders. A 1962 Topps Baseball 3rd-Series cello pack with a San Francisco Giants team card visible on top was graded PSA 7, Near Mint. It rose to the mid-

point of its estimate, settling at \$5,658. From a galaxy far, far away came an unopened 1977 Topps Star Wars Series 1 wax box of Movie Photo Bubble Gum Cards in crisp NM condition. The box was wrapped and certified by Baseball Card Exchange, Inc. and entered in the sale with a \$4,000-\$8,000 estimate. It ended up selling for a strong \$12,300.

Star Wars fans seemed bullish on rarities from the beloved franchise, with 27 bids placed on a 1977 Kenner Star Wars Boba Fett 21 Back action figure. The back of the card retained a large premium-of-

fer sticker advertising a free secret Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back figure with the purchase of any four Star Wars figures. The toy was bid to \$4,920, nearly five times the high estimate.

The auction was anchored by several

Corn sheller ground up an \$18,000 bid at Chupp auction

SHIPSHEWANA, Ind. — A tiny corn sheller proved that big prices come with small packages during a recent auction conducted by Chupp Auctions in Shipshewana, Ind. Made of wood and cast iron it was originally intended to mount on a table

It was offered with an estimate of \$100 to \$500 and the wheel had been repaired. It was marked 'Little Excelsior Corn Sheller, Whiterow & Tuley Mfg of New Albany,' and featured the date 1868. It was small enough to carry to the car in one hand with no effort. The bidding was intense, and the crowd was on edge as the price kept rising. It was finally marked sold once it reached an impressive bid of \$18,000 to become the highest-selling piece at this auction.

A second corn sheller also ground up the bids. Made of cast-iron it was advertised as a corn nubber and sheller. It was operated by holding an ear of corn down and pushing it through the grinder. It sold for \$10,250.

A new old stock Bireley's drink sign attracted a lot of bidders. This bright yellow



sign would attract interest anywhere it hangs. It measured 18 by 54 inches and was single-sided tin. It was a sign put out Left: This Little Excelsior corn sheller was the star of the recent Chupp Auction held in Shipshewana, Ind. It sold for \$18,000

by Stout and was in excellent condition. The bottle featured on the sign contained an orange soda with refreshing-looking water dribbles running down the side. The sign read, "Bireley's happifies thirst." And it does invoke a delighted feeling just from looking at the sign. It brought a final bid of

A Howel's root beer sign was die-cut like a bottle. AAA made this one, and it was in excellent condition. It measured almost 9 by 30 inches and was also single-sided tin. The bright yellow of the bottle contrasted nicely with the dark liquid inside. "Root beer bottled with that good old-fashioned flavor" was emblazoned across the bottom. The Julep company bottled this beverage

erence-book author Mark Kuster. One of the most sought-after lots was a complete circa-1950s set of four Linemar Popeye tin-litho windup "hopper" character toys depicting Popeye, Mean Man, Olive Oyl and Wimpy. Each of the cartoon favorites came with its own original pictorial box. The first complete set of its type to be offered by Morphy Auctions in 20 years of operation, it was "strong to the finich" and sold just below its high estimate for \$11,685.


High-quality trains barreled through the saleroom, led by a Buddy 'L' pressed-steel Outdoor Railroad engine, tender and cars with three additional straight track sections. This very presentable outfit included an Improved Steam Shovel with original paint and decals. In overall VG+ condition, the railworthy set sold for \$13,530 against an estimate of \$2,000-\$3,500.

A very early 1 Gauge Carlisle & Finch freight train set was pulled by a three-banded engine with original bell and P.R.R. emblazoned on both sides of its cab. The well-detailed locomotive was followed by a matching eight-wheel tender and three eight-wheel freight cars. In VG-Excellent condition, it reached its final destination with a winning bid of \$7,380 against an estimate of \$2,000-\$4,000.

The November 6-7 auction continued the Morphy tradition of always offering rare banks in its toy sales and included a scarce black-coat version of a Shepard Hardware Santa at the Chimney. In all-original, Excellent+ condition, it delivered a pleasing \$6,765.

Another category that has developed

organically for Morphy's is antique occupational shaving mugs. Of the 42 entered in the auction, perhaps the most unusual was a mug bearing a sepia photographic depiction of several men and a dog aboard a craft identified as the Germania. The name F.M. Paloer and the title Captain were applied in gilt, suggesting that the mug possibly belonged to the skipper of the double-decker vessel. Under its base it is stamped Eugene Berninghause / Cincinnati, Ohio. The auction selling price was \$3,936 against an estimate of \$500-\$1,500.

and would have been proud to see it bring a final bid price of \$2,500 for this advertising piece that was in excellent condition.

Nesbitts of California was not to be outdone in this bidding war. Standing 22 by 84 inches, this single-sided tin sign was also a die-cut bottle shape. It was in very good condition. They also used orange soda to draw customers in. They made no advertising brags—just showed the refreshing beverage they were marketing and let it do the talking. And it did work. This sign drew a bid price that outdid the other soda advertising pieces when it sold for \$4,000.

An A & W root beer sign was round in shape. This one took on a darker hue, resembling the color of the root beer liquid. It measured almost 36 inches in diameter. It was a single-sided tin sign that enticed the customer with simple advertising about a good cold drink. It was made by Stout and was in good condition with a few scratches. This simple advertising piece was sold for \$2,750.

Mountain Dew has always been a favorite since it was marketed. A 1980s version of their advertising was self-framed with wood. This one measured almost 59 by 39 inches and was single-sided tin. Showing off the old hillbilly now associated with this drink, the sign said "It'll tickle yore innards" and showed off their now famous "Ya-hooo" in bright red letters across the top. This vintage advertising piece was in excellent shape, with all the graphics popping off the sign. It brought the hammer down at \$3,500.

Sticking with something edible, a Wonder Bread sign rose to the occasion. This single-sided tin sign was shaped like a loaf of bread and was in excellent condition. It measured 36 by 26 inches and was able to make the customer feel the freshness that was displayed. Stating that "it's slo-baked Wonder Bread builds strong bodies and



ways." The brightly colored various-sized bubbles that wrapped around the ends of the loaf gave it a playful look that would have appealed to the youngsters. If you wanted this one to hang in your kitchen, you would have to dig pretty deep into your pockets and pull out an impressive \$4,700.

A Sunbeam sign measured 19 by 55 inches, so it stood tall. It was a single-sided tin embossed sign and was in excellent shape. It showed a charming young housewife holding a tray with a hamburger and a hotdog enclosed in enticing-looking buns. The bright red background made the yellow lettering pop as it said, "Come in. We serve the best made with Sunbeam rolls." It looked delicious. The price to hang this one on your kitchen wall was an impressive

Automotive advertising pieces in any form always attract buyers, and this auction had some rare items to sell. A Rapidayton 300 gasoline pump kept rising in price. It was a visible pump with the original glass and etching still in good shape. The bidding rose to \$5,000 for this piece.

An Associated Gasoline sign was complete with a metal frame and hanger. This double-sided porcelain sign was in good

condition with some fading and chips. It measured 28 inches in diameter. The yellow lettering stood out well on the faded red background and the gasoline can in the center of the sign made for a great place to put the important lettering. "More miles to the gallon" which is still as much of a draw today as it was back when this sign was made. It sold for the final price of \$9,750.

A Dodge Plymouth service sign was in good condition. It had an alternating blackand-white background and lettering. The sign was made of double-sided porcelain and measured 42 inches in diameter. It was hung outside a service dealership to show that the owner could service Dodge Plymouth vehicles. It sold for \$5,250.

Kendall Motor Oil made a large sign measuring only 12 inches wide, but this one stood 72 inches high, so it couldn't be missed. This self-framed single-sided tin sign was in very good condition. "The dealer sign of quality" was lettered in small letters, while the sign's main purpose, "Kend-

all." took up most of the height on this one. The fact that Kendall oil was advertised couldn't be missed. It sold for \$8,750.

Standard Oil came in right behind Kendall with the bidding. Selling for \$7,250 was a sign measuring 74 by 63 inches overall with the torch and the frame. This double-sided porcelain service station sign was very imposing. The oval shape on this one and the familiar red and white lettering brings memories back for people, and the selling price of this vintage advertising piece showed that many gentlemen desired

Blue Harlequin teapot poured a \$20,000 bid at Strawser

WOLCOTTVILLE, Ind. — While Fiesta was the highlight of a recent two-day auction conducted by Strawser, it was another piece by Homer Laughlin that ended up taking top bid honors.

In 1936 F.W. Woolworth reached out to Homer Laughlin and asked the firm to make an exclusive line for their store just in time for the Christmas holidays. The store released 16 pieces in four new colors. A Harlequin blue teapot that was part of that line was offered at the Strawser auction. It was from the John Belsom/ George Dansker Collection and is the only one known to exist. It ended up reaching \$20,000.

Several of the Fiesta serving pieces were in great demand. A simple white-glazed onion soup bowl with red striping attracted much interest. The finial handles, the top handle on the lid, and the upper edges of the soup bowl had contrasting red striping, which set this one off. It reached a final bid of \$13,000. A green onion soup bowl was sold for \$850, while a Fiesta cream soup bowl of medium green coloring brought the same final bid.

A pair of Fiesta candleholders in a beautiful, brilliant green had decals that were in mint condition. The candleholders sported a yellow sun surrounded by a reddish glow and some black stars floating around. This gorgeous pair was sold for \$950, and a second pair brought a bid of \$700.

Several dancing lady cookie jars in just about every color were sold. The best price was \$2,100 for an orange one. A yellowish-green one and a blue one brought a bid of \$600 each.

Ramping up the price was a daffodil two-cup teapot. This one was an exceptionally rich-looking yellow glaze with daffodil decals and some green leaves scattered

around. It was sold for the most impressive final price of \$3,750.

A pair of sugar bowls sold for \$1,100 each. An ivory example had the same red striping as the onion soup bowl and one the other was so dark it appeared black.

A maroon Harlequin high-lip creamer sold for \$800, while a Harlequin relish tray with all of the compartments a different color reached \$500.

Some pieces were offered for sale in the original boxes and sold as complete sets. An original juice set brought a bid price of \$700. A four-piece place setting in the original box was sold for the bid of \$425.

<u>Vintage Kodak Brownies</u>

following year, smaller footprint Six-16 and Six-20 Brownie Juniors were released. While they retained the look of their older siblings, they lacked the advanced features. Thanks to their attractive styling, all these models make great display pieces and can often be found for \$10 or less.

During the interwar years, new materials and manufacturing processes emerged, prompting Kodak to transition to cameras crafted from Bakelite and plastic. In 1934, they unveiled one of the trailblazing models, the Baby Brownie, made of molded Bakelite. The small cubeshaped camera was outfitted with a single fixed-focus lens and simple foldup frame viewfinder. It used 127 film, which had been around for about two decades and was Kodak's more compact alternative to 120 film. The Baby Brownie was a favorite among service members during World War II, thanks to its small size and simplicity. Today, expect to pay around \$15 for an example in good condition.

At the beginning of the 1950s, Kodak launched the Brownie Holiday aimed at suburbanites. Drawing inspiration from the earlier Baby Brownie, this model also featured a compact, cube-shaped solid plastic body, single lens, and retained the popular 127 format film. Enhancements included an optical direct vision viewfinder positioned at the top center.

Both flash and non-flash models were introduced in the same year. Examples without a flash can often be found for under \$10 and will jump to \$15-\$25 with the flash and original box.

The post-war years also marked the introduction of one of the most beloved models in the Brownie lineup: the Hawkeye. This camera quickly became a favorite among consumers who praised its design, features, and ease of use. This camera featured a sturdy Bakelite body — that while offered in a variety of colors — was most typically purchased in basic black. Kodak continued the use of two brilliant viewfinders as well as relying on the popular 620 film which could produce square or rectangular prints. The Hawkeye Flash variation could accept a wide range of Kodak and aftermarket flash attachments. Pricing on Hawkeyes tends to follow that of the

Pursuing innovation, Kodak added twin-lens reflex models to its camera lineup. These featured a large, brilliant viewfinder tucked into a

folding hood on the camera's top. The initial models —the Reflex and Reflex Flash — debuted in 1940 and used 127 film. A mid-century model, the Starflex, took cues from the Holiday line, including the black, somewhat squarish plastic body, and also used 127 film. Reflex and Starflex units can easily be found for \$10-\$25 while the associated flashes will typically add \$5-\$10.

As indoor flash photography became more popular in the 1950s, Kodak expanded its line of Brownie cameras to accommodate the trend. Debuting in 1957, the Starflash featured a sleek molded plastic body that incorporated a flash gun and was available in various colors. It included an optical direct vision finder and used 127 film. Two years later, Kodak released the Flash 20, which resembled the Starflash but offered greater functionality. It took larger 620 film and had features like simple focusing adjustment and three aperture settings for different lighting conditions. While visually attractive, Starflashes don't typically command more than \$10-15. Flash-20s can sell for two to three times that amount, particularly with original packaging.

As the 1960s approached, Kodak began integrating automatic exposure systems into the Brownie series. The Starmatic, launched in 1959, had a modern look but nonetheless harkened back to earlier models like the Holiday. Kodak maintained the use of 127 film but added a photocell for automatic exposure. A flash attachment and a two-speed shutter were eventually added. The Starmatic targeted

consumers who desired both ease of use and the capability to capture high-quality images. Its advanced counterpart, the StarMeter, was equipped with a selenium meter for even more precise exposure control. These cameras typically sell for between \$20 and \$30, especially if they have been tested and are in working order.

Spanning eight decades and nearly 100 models, the Brownie brand is a testament to Kodak's innovation in photography. The 1970s marked a pivotal change, as Kodak's shift to color and cartridge film signaled the end of the beloved roll film era of the Brownie line. The models produced between 1900 and 1960 are celebrated by collectors who appreciate how the roll-film models popularized taking snapshots and made photography a mainstream activity.

For collectors interested in early Brownie cameras, Brian Coe's Kodak Cameras: The First Hundred Years is an excellent resource. Another valuable tool is The Brownie Camera Page, at www.brownie-camera.com.
