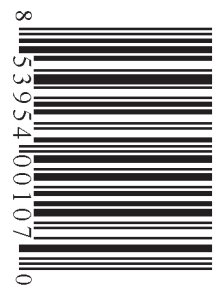

Baby dolls were a favorite under the 1950s era Christmas tree

Top Christmas gifts for kids this year? Try the Crayola "Ultimate Light Board," the Jurassic World Tyrannosaurus rex action figure, or a toy mechanical hand. But years ago, the gifts that Santa left under the tree were simple. Running on imagination, they required no batteries and no instruction booklets. Because for little girls growing up in the 1950s, the most awaited gift was a doll, or, more specifically, a baby doll.

Up until the mid-1800s, girls interacted with their dolls in one of two ways. Either they pretended that dolls were their companions, playing with them in the same manner in which they would interact with another girl their age, or their dolls were fashion role models. But with the advent of baby dolls, that dynamic changed, and girls had a new way to play. Although dolls had long taught "lessons in hygiene and feminine etiquette to girls," having a baby doll "idealized motherhood and homemaking," according to Michelle Parnett-Dwyer, curator for dolls and toys at The Strong Museum of Play in Rochester, New York.

The early decades of the 20th century saw the introduction of a number of baby

Modeled after a real-life three-day-old newborn, the Bye-Lo Baby was patented by Grace Storey Putnam in 1922. With a bisque head and stuffed body, she was nicknamed "The Million-Dollar Baby," attesting to her popular welcome, just in time for the 1924 Christmas season. Dy-Dee, the first doll to wet her diaper, was introduced in 1933, followed by Betsy Wetsy in 1937. And the real-life Dionne Quintuplets, born in 1934 and the subject of worldwide curiosity, were immortalized as baby dolls. But production of these toys was put on hold for the duration of World War II, as most toy manufacturers retooled their plants, and labor and materials were redirected to the war effort.

After the War, many men returning home were anxious to make up for time lost. They were ready to marry and settle down in the suburbs. While they were gone, civilian women had assumed increased responsibilities. Many of them welcomed the return to a "traditional family, with Mom, Dad, and the kids," noted Dee Smith. And after years of conserving materials necessary for the war effort, toys could be made of materials other than paper and wood. Plastics were the material of the future. Little wonder that baby dolls were popular with little girls.

dolls, eagerly embraced by the public. Inspired by Rose O'Neill's illustrated cartoons, Kewpie dolls were introduced in 1912; originally made of unglazed porcelain (bisque), composition Kewpie dolls were sold in the 1920s. Later, they were made of celluloid.

well as the American Character Doll Company and the Madame Alexander Doll Company. Dolls were designed to fit into a wide range of price points, with affordable examples sold at Woolworth's and through catalogs issued by Montgomery Ward and Sears Roebuck and Co. Local department

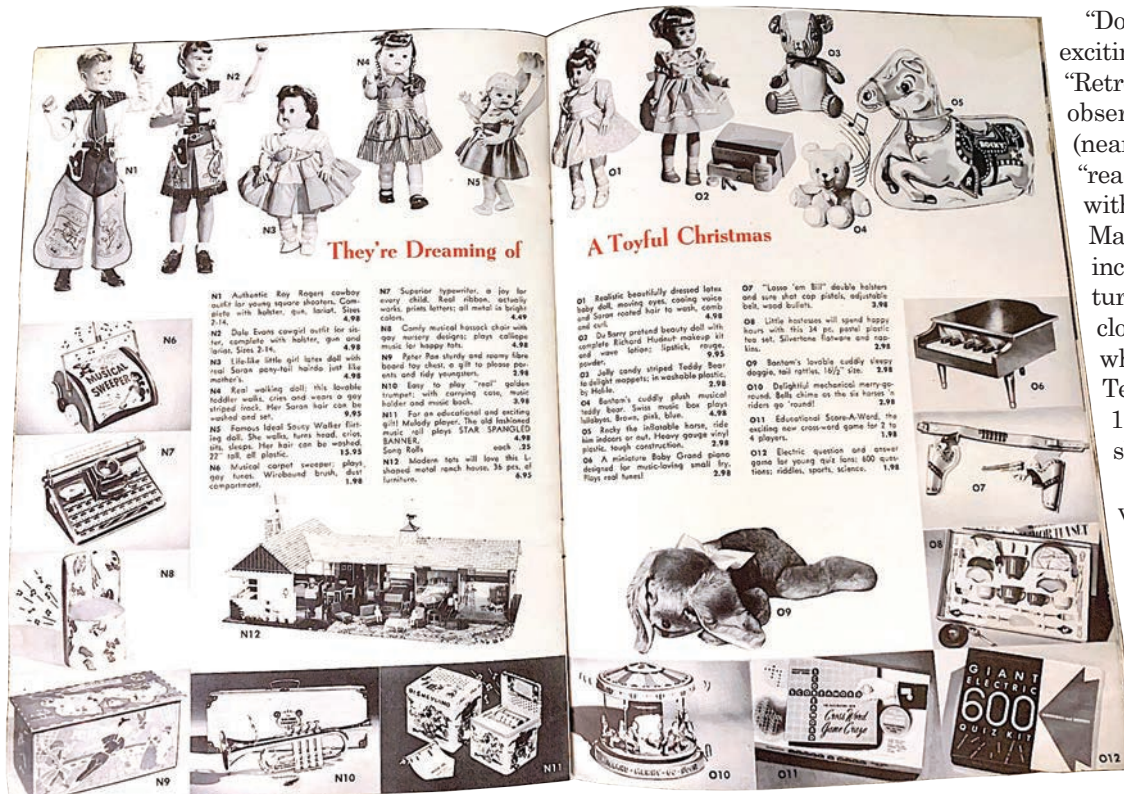

"Dolls of the 1950s were new and exciting," Smith, author of the blog "Retro Dee's Guide to the 1950s," observed. Made of vinyl, these (nearly) non-breakable dolls were "ready to be played with and loved without the fear of being dropped." Many dolls had moveable parts, including jointed limbs, heads that turned, and eyes that opened and closed. Some had molded hair, while others had rooted hair. Tiny Tears, who made her debut in 1950, was an instant favorite, as she could drink, cry, and wet.

Baby dolls were made by a variety of companies, including the Ideal Toy Company, Vogue, the Sun Rubber Company, and the Effanbee Doll Company, as

Hawkes round tray served up at \$24,000 bid at Woody Auction

DOUGLASS, Kan. — On November 9, Woody Auction held its final American Brilliant cut glass event for 2024. Highlights included items originally donated to the American Cut Glass Association (ACGA) for museum collections but deaccessioned and offered again to private collectors. The auction also included select pieces previously shown at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art, items from the collection of the late Linda Guyer (former ACGA webmaster), and contributions from several additional consignors. A total of 299 exceptional lots of finely crafted cut glass were offered without reserve, available for bidding both live at Woody Auction's facilities and through LiveAuctioneers.

The auction's highest bid went for an American Brilliant cut glass round tray that came from the ACGA collection. The deeply engraved 15-inch tray was attributed to Hawkes and featured an iris pattern with fleur-de-lys monogramming. It was considered a magnificent example, with no chips, cracks, or repairs. It ultimately sold for 10 times pre-auction estimates, fetching \$24,000 from 57 bids.

While no other lot hit five figures, 17 reached often high four-figure sums. Among them was a 4.5-inch American Brilliant wine stem also provided by the ACGA. The solid apple green/Vaseline piece was an extremely rare MacDonald pattern by Hawkes, with only 8 known to exist. No flaws were noted. 32 bids took it to \$8,500, over four times the pre-auction high estimate.

Bidding matched the low estimate of \$7,000 for a 10-inch by 7-inch American Brilliant vase in green cut to clear coloring. The Marilyn pattern piece with a Hobstar base was designed by W.C. An-

person on Libbey blank #377. Score lines were noted in the vase along the interior rim. Also coming within pre-auction estimates, at \$3,750, was an American Brilliant coffee pot from the ACGA collection. The good-condition 9.5-inch-tall vessel featured Hobstar, Vesica, prism, strawberry diamond, and fan light patterns. It sported a triple-notched handle, an impressive

spout, and a fitted pattern-cut lid.

Lower four-figure bids picked up items like a massive cognac consigned by a Mis-

AntiqueWeek Advertising Manager Dan Morris dies after cancer battle

AntiqueWeek lost a member of its family this week. Advertising manager Dan Morris died Dec. 3 at his home in Monticello, Fla., after a two-year battle with cancer.

Dan joined AntiqueWeek in 2001 and helped grow the paper into a nationally recognized publication. He was well-known in auctioneering circles as he attended the National Auctioneers Association Conference every year as well as numerous state auctioneers' conventions. He was a well-known speaker at these events as well as often serving as a judge for auctioneer bid calling championships.

"Dan was the consummate salesman, and truly loved all his advertising clients, wanting what was best for them," said MidCountry Media Owner Gary Thoe.

Wherever Dan went his voice and his persona often made him the most vibrant person in the room. He definitely never knew a stranger.

"Dan was more than a salesman he was a true gentleman and a great friend to everyone," said MidCountry Media Publisher Tony Gregory. "He was the type of man who genuinely cared for everyone, even beyond the sales. He asked about your family, he knew when your birthday was, he sent you pictures of his grandkids and asked you for pictures of yours. Not because of the sales but because he was truly, wholeheartedly interested in your life, whether you bought an ad from him or not. He would call the office and I could tell if anyone was on the phone with Dan because their mood instantly changed, their voice became more pleasant and animated because that's what he did. He

raised the mood in every situation. He will be deeply missed by the whole AntiqueWeek team and I am honored to have been able to call him my friend."

In addition to his love for selling advertising, Dan loved to talk about football, especially college football. He played for Florida State University from 1981-1984. His stories of his football days became the stuff of legend to his many friends who enjoyed reciting their favorite ones.

Family was also an important part of Dan's life. He knew years before his first grandchild arrived that his "grandpa name" would be Turbo and he loved telling everyone he met how Turbo would be the best grandpa ever.

"Dan cared about everyone he met. Even in the last months of his life, he would e-mail me and ask if I could do something special for an advertiser," said AntiqueWeek Managing Editor Connie Swaim. "He was fond of telling me he had gotten himself in a 'pickle' by over promising editorial but he knew he could always talk me into ensuring everyone would end up happy."

Services for Dan were held on Dec. 7 at Central Baptist Church in Monticello, Fla. Beggs Funeral home of Monticello assisted the family. As of press time complete obituary information was not available. Please visit <https://www.beggsfuneralhomes.net> for more information.

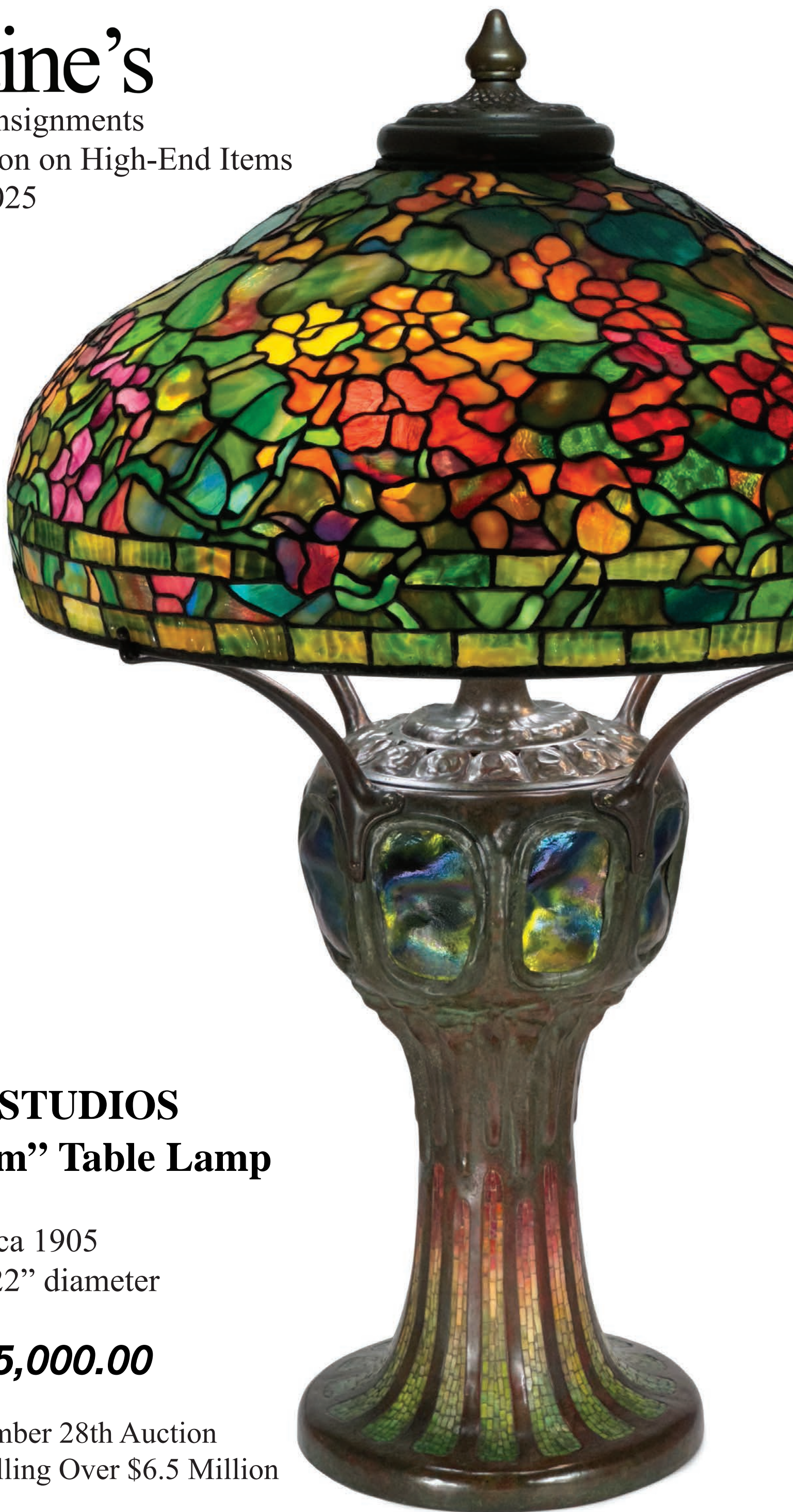

Bidders will be taking aim at Morphy's firearms and militaria auction

DENVER, Pa. – History buffs and collectors of fine antique, vintage and modern firearms probably didn't find what they wanted at Black Friday sales, but that doesn't matter. The collectible-arms community will gather for holiday shopping December 10-13 at Morphy's Pennsylvania gallery. The company's four-day series is packed with American, European and Japanese legacy firearms and militaria and opens with a very special December 10 session titled The Art of War in America, 1750-1850: The James L Kochan Study Collection. The December 11-13 lineup features one exciting highlight after another, including the Kenneth Smith-Christmas collection of Irish arms, and fresh selections from the Jim Cyr collection and Frank Brownell knife collection. In all, there are more than 2,100 lots.

The opening session (Dec. 10) is devoted exclusively to the James L Kochan Study Collection. It includes museum-quality martial artifacts, paintings, manuscripts and imprints from the crucial period of American history between 1750 and 1850, an era marked by hard-fought battles for

liberty and land. "James Kochan is a collector and dealer of the highest degree who has handled some of the most important of all known artifacts from the French and Indian War, Revolutionary War, and War of 1812," said Dan Morphy, president of Morphy Auctions. "He is also the author of numerous reference books that are highly respected by others who share his passion

for American military history. It is a tremendous honor for us to represent his collection at auction."

The spirit of Boston's early patriots comes to life in the form of an inscribed fusil (carbine) of the Charlestown, Massachusetts Minutemen that belonged to activist and merchant Benjamin Hurd Jr. (b. 1749/50-1821). The gun has a full-length cherry stock with relief-carved panels around the lock and sideplate. Its profile displays British influence and it has four fabricated brass ramrod ferrules, the foremost being trumpeted. Its escutcheon is inscribed Benja Hurd jr 1775. It comes with an iron ramrod appearing to be original to the piece. The fusil passed by descent through the Hurd family until it was purchased by James Kochan at Northeast Auctions in 2010. Subsequently, it became the property of Steve Hench, then was re-acquired for the Kochan collection. Its auction estimate is \$30,000-\$50,000.

Attributed to Matthew Pratt (American, 1734-1805), the Portrait of Captain John Barry, Continental Navy, circa 1776 is an oil-on-canvas work laid to a mahogany panel and presented in a contemporary carved and gilded frame. Irish-born Barry

souri collector. It landed more than double its pre-auction high estimate, at \$2,750. The 10.5-inch by 8-inch bottle was in good condition with no chips, cracks, or repairs. It featured a sterling silver "flame" stopper, cut base, and bore diamond, star, zipper, and fan motifs. A bid of \$1,600 picked up a stunning American Brilliant whiskey barrel mounted on a pattern-matching stand. It featured crosscut diamond and strawberry diamond motifs and had silverplate banded mountings, spigot, and bucket.

Of the remaining lots, 250 fetched \$100 or more, with nearly 50 topping \$500. Among the latter was a pedestal vase consigned by the Pullen Collection of Indiana that sold for its high pre-auction estimate of \$800. The 11-inch-tall vase, designed by Val Saint Lambert, featured blue cut to clear coloring and a miter-cut lattice design. A flower center vase, while not quite reaching estimates, nonetheless sold solidly for \$450. The 6.75-inch by 10-inch vessel was in Empress pattern by Libbey, with a facet-cut ring neck.

Many noteworthy items were picked up for lower three-figure bids. One was an American Brilliant cordial decanter, consigned from a North Carolina estate, snagged for \$250. It was in a green cut to clear flute pattern with a ray-cut base, and pattern-cut stopper, and in overall good condition with only a minor nick on the rim. A bid of \$175 picked up a dresser box offered by the ACGA. The 4-inch by 7.5-inch box on a ray-cut base was in Pattern #116 by Meriden, showcasing Hob-

star and fan motif.

Even bids below \$100 secured some fantastic pieces. Among the affordable pieces, a long-spouted pitcher in Harvard pattern by Libbey, with a triple-notched handle and pattern-cut base, was picked up for \$90. A modest \$60 bid won a biscuit jar adorned in a unique clear tusk and crosscut diamond and button pattern. It included a ray-cut base and silverplate lid and bail. A mere \$30 won an American Brilliant ice tub from the Pullen collection. Though not in perfect condition, the striking bucket featured tab handles, and a large Hobstar base, and was detailed in Hobstar, nail head diamond, strawberry diamond, and fan motifs.

New owners announced at fall Chicagoland Advertising show

GRAYS LAKE, Ill. — Many regular vendors and visitors attending the semi-annual Chicagoland Advertising and Slot Machine Show had heard rumors that the show had been sold and was changing hands — and they found out that it was true when arriving at the show Nov. 14.

Tilt Promotions, who have hosted the event for 20-plus years are turning over operations to Damon Granger and Dave Wolfe, owners of Granger Wolfe Promotions of Toledo, Ohio.

Granger, known for his ownership of the Spring Indy Advertising Show in Indianapolis and recent purchase of the Fall Indy Advertising Show at Lebanon, Ind., said he and Wolfe had “similar collecting and business interests” and formed the partnership to run the Chicagoland event.

The new team will be formally taking over operations with the 2025 Spring Chicagoland Show, to again be held at the Lake County Fairgrounds Event Center at Grays Lake, Ill., May 29-31.

Gas and oil advertising collectors stopped to check out a 6-foot-long lifesize bright red fiberglass Pegasus horse priced at \$35,000 and brought to the show by Rick Dynek, Milwaukee, Wis. The dealer said the horse was a replica of a similar piece that toured the country for Mobil Oil Co.

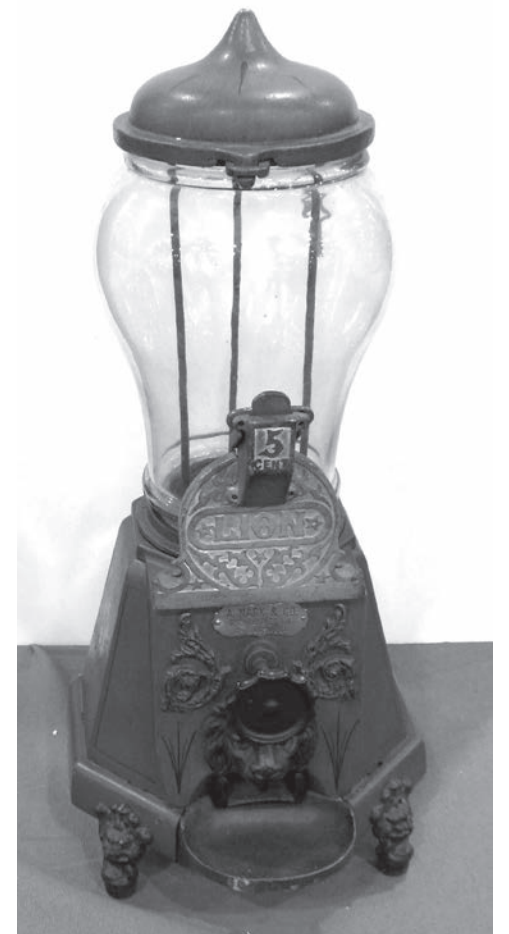
Coin op, advertising and Coca-Cola collectors hovered around a pair of upright restored Coke machines that traveled to the show from Knoxville, Tenn. Dealer Terry Pinto priced his 1940-50s VMC 33 model at \$3,700 and his 1950s Jacobs 26 model at \$4,600.

Slot collectors were drawn to a “scarce” 16-inch-tall junior size slot machine, the 1934 Benton Harbor Queen, made in Benton Harbor, Mich. and priced at \$3,500 by dealer Robert Wendland who lives near Benton Harbor in Stevensville, Mich.

Vending machine collectors looked close at an 8-inch-tall penny-operated 1915 “Mojo” penny vendor priced at \$2,200 by Jeff Scott of Huntsville, Ala. Others tested his 1930s 14-inch-tall green porcelain Northwestern Junior peanut vendor, priced \$1,600, but took home a hand full

of peanuts. Scott said “The best part of the show is just being with friends.”

“It took me five days with many stops for gas, and a pickup truck full of 20 years of accumulated coin-op parts to get to the show” said Terry Burns of Spokane, Wash. Among the many parts were several big bundles of vintage spinning slot machine reels he priced at \$20 each.

Once again, two Wisconsin “friendly competitors” who live near each other brought choice items to the show. Jack Freund of Lake Geneva showed off what he termed “the biggest coin op vendor of the show,” a 3-foot-2 inch tall 1930s cast aluminum Australian Nobby brand peanut

machine with glass globe tagged at \$4,395. Others checked out his 15-inch-long wooden glass front early 1900s coin-op bicycle trade stimulator priced at \$6,250.

Just a few booths away, Milwaukee dealer Paul Hinden showed off an early 1900s fancy wood 13-by-16-inch perfume vendor that he said “would make yourself and your handkerchief smell pretty for just one penny —and \$5,250.” At the same spot a 21-inch-tall 1904 cast iron Lion Vendor peanut machine could give you a handful

of goodies for one penny — and \$14,500.

mand was the 14-gun Lexington, while his last – due to being seriously wounded in battle – was the frigate Alliance, May 1781. With provenance that includes lateral family descent to Barry Hayes Hepburn (1886-1966), followed by private acquisitions, it comes to auction with a \$20,000-\$40,000 estimate.

The three-day Firearms & Militaria Auction to follow is crowned by a unique and historically-significant early 1960s Colt AR-15 machine gun that was presented to JFK's Chief of Staff General Earle G. Wheeler. Manufactured and specially serialized by Colt for presentation to Wheeler – who was instrumental to the adoption of the forward assist feature on the AR-15 – its markings include PROPERTY OF U.S. GOVT. and XM 16E1. The gun comes with a hardwood display rack bearing an extensively-inscribed brass presentation plaque. Displaying near-excellent original factory finish with showy gold plating on the receiver and barrel, this one-of-a-kind weapon is estimated at \$100,000-\$200,00.

Two spectacular World War II machine guns top the auction list of NFA arms requiring BATF approval prior to transfer of ownership. The first is a German machine gun manufactured by C.G. Haenel and marked MKMKB42H on the left side of the receiver. With a 16-inch barrel and chambered 7.92 x 33mm Kurz, it has an extended gas cylinder and enlarged long muzzle nut, and lacks the familiar safety on the grip housing – all indications that the gun was not one of the later MP or STG models. Approximately 8,000-12,000 units like the auction example were made between early 1942 and mid-1943. Nearly all were fielded into Russia, with few surfacing in the US. Estimate: \$40,000-\$80,000

The second premier World War II machine gun is a Nagoya arsenal Type 99 7.7mm with a 21-inch barrel and all visibly-numbered parts matching. It was manufactured in August 1944 and captured by the 1st Marine Division at the Battle of Shuri Castle, Okinawa, in July 1945. The lot includes two original unnumbered 30-round magazines and an original two-cell Japanese magazine pouch numbered 6738. Provenance: Given to US Navy officer Peter Mills aboard ship at Okinawa by the "Engineer of the First Marine Division," as documented by Mills'

One of the most coveted of all early California relics, it will convey to the winning bidder with a copy of an 1853 newspaper article documenting the sword's presentation, plus descriptions

from the 2008 auction where it sold for \$172,000. Estimate: \$30,000-\$50,000

Baby Dolls

stores and independent toy shops were other sources for Santa's helpers.

Some baby dolls were sold with complete layette kits. Most seem to have been accompanied by bottles, Smith pointed out. Furnishings included cribs, cradles, and beds (often well made of wood or metal), as well as high chairs and bassinets, strollers and carriages. Smith added that little girls and their dolls played "house" with a variety of miniature accessories, everything needed for a "housewife-in-training," she noted with a smile.

Not all mid-century baby dolls were White. Andrea Hughes, lead curator of the Arts and Humanities Collection at The Children's Museum of Indianapolis, observed, "There were a lot of Black baby dolls, although I think many of them at the time would have just been made from the same molds, using different color plastics." Parnett-Dwyer of The Strong concurred, but noted one exception, a doll named Sara Lee. Manufactured by the Ideal Toy Company in the early 1950s, she was the namesake of Sara Lee Creech, who championed the cause for a doll to look like every little girl who played with her. Unfortunately, there were issues with the dyes used to color the vinyl, a factor that contributed to an early discontinuation of the Sara Lee doll.

Nor were all baby dolls female. Boy dolls were marketed, but other than their names

and clothing, there was little difference between them and a girl doll. Interestingly, two popular examples of male dolls were based upon characters originally introduced in television shows: Little Ricky Jr. of "I Love Lucy," manufactured by The American Character Doll Company in the 1950s; and Ideal's Bamm-Bamm Rubble of "The Flintstones," the companion doll to Pebbles Flintstone. Although examples of both of these dolls have survived in like-new condition, that is not always the case with mid-century baby dolls.

"There are some fine examples of the dolls," Hughes noted, with some still in their original boxes, bearing near-pristine hang tags. "But many that I've seen have been well loved or have deteriorated, some because of the materials they were made with. Many plastics do break down over time."

Today, those interested in vintage baby dolls are either those looking back fondly on their childhoods, or younger people interested in all things mid-century. Laura Turner, proprietor of the Frizzellburg Antique Store in Maryland, said that she helps customers dress baby dolls that have sentimental value. "The clothes have often been lost," Turner said, or they might be in poor condition. But because many companies manufactured complete doll wardrobes in the 1950s, it is possible to find vintage doll clothing that fits, even if it is not original to the doll.

Finally, ephemera

collectors have a range of relatively inexpensive baby doll-related items from which to choose. These include photographs of children playing with their dolls and patterns for sewing baby doll clothes, as well as paper dolls and toy catalogs, especially those issued at Christmastime. All are affordable, fun, and collectable. Oh, baby!
