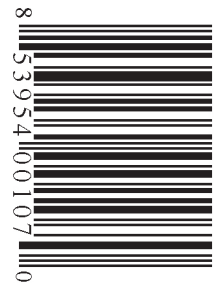

## Christmas tree pins continue to shine brightly

Since the mid-20th century Christmas tree pins have glittered with a blend of brilliant metal and glistening gemstones. This has made them yuletide's most popular jewelry.

Season after season, from Thanksgiving right up until Christmas Day (and spilling over into those 12 days after), collectors can pin on an entire forest of Christmas tree pins, without ever once being stabbed by a repeat. They're quite literally the gift that keeps on giving.

But long before the pins came the trees that inspired them.

According to legend, the Christmas tree was a Martin Luther brainstorm. Sparkling stars, seen through the limbs of a forest fir prompted Luther to place candles on the branches of a tree at his own home, recapturing the starry effect.

Prince Albert, German husband of Queen Victoria, brought the Christmas tree tradition to England. An 1848 Illustrated News holiday portrait of the Royal Family, complete with decorated tree, gave the custom widespread attention; by 1850, its popularity had spread to America.

For those whose childhoods spanned the 1950s and '60s, when Christmas tree pins were enjoying their first heyday, the most familiar Christmas tree is a traditional towering green one. Laden with tinsel, dripping with ornaments, and bedecked with ungainly colored light bulbs, the green tree was the baby boomer's ideal.

Of course, twinkling lights and

abundant greenery can only go so far in transforming a tree. Décor adds the defining touch. Apples, gilded candies, twists of colored paper, and even flowers were all early versions of Christmas tree ornamentation. By the early 20th century, homespun eye-catchers, such as strings of popcorn and berries, had been joined by painted glass ornaments, both imports and domestic. Whether ball-shaped, star-shaped, cone-shaped, or any-shape-imaginable, these are the colorfully fragile bits of Christmas cheer that baby boomers treasure. The most vivid source materials for Christmas tree pins are the trees where decorating imagination ran deliciously rampant.

Although Victorian jewelry included some tree brooches, the first mass-produced Christmas tree pins stretched their branches skyward in the 1940s. That came courtesy of such manufacturers as Weiss, Hobé, and Hollycraft. However, the pins achieved their greatest popularity during the 1950s and '60s, when nostalgia for

Christmases past was overlaid with a "modern" artistic interpretation of that nostalgia.

Since Christmas tree pins were essentially "costume" rather than "fine" jewelry, almost every costume jewelry design firm included at least several tree pins in its inventory. In addition to the early seedlings of the '40s, other prominent pinmakers of the times included Eisenberg, Gerry's Creations, J.J. (Jonette Jewelry), Art, Lisner, Monet, and Mylu. Soon, however, everyone was whirling aboard the Christmas tree pinwheel. Hattie Carnegie and Liz Claiborne designed Christmas tree pins. So did Miriam Haskell, and, (for a limited Franklin Mint edition), Kenneth J. Lane. The tree trend has continued into the present, with new names, including Swarovski, Tancer-II, Kirks Folly, Gale & Friends, Lunch at the Ritz, and many more joining the roster. Pin

## Buckeye railroad show celebrates its 75th running

COLUMBUS, Ohio — On Dec. 7, Golden Spike Enterprises marked a milestone with the 75th Buckeye Model Train and Railroad Artifacts Show. From a strong start, Golden Spike has evolved into the premier organizer of railroad shows across the United States. The biannual Columbus event has grown steadily along with it.

The story began in Columbus some 30 years ago. Charles Miller, one of the organizers, recalled that the first show was a success, with 150 tables and about 1,000 attendees. "People were a lot younger then," he chuckled, noting the railroad hobby's older following. This round, there were 325 tables and 1,500 attendees expected. Golden Spike has expanded into a multi-state affair, hosting shows not only in Columbus but also in Atlanta, Gaithersburg, Maryland, and two Florida locations: Deland and Jacksonville. Miller and a small team organize the events and are vendors themselves.

Railroad shows draw a dedicated crowd of sellers and attendees. Conversations often unfold matter-of-factly about times spent on the Norfolk South-

ern, or about the intricacies of couplers and traction motors. Even model train enthusiasts can be overheard passionately debating the merits of one scale over another.

Golden Spike takes pride in the loyal community of buyers and sellers it has built over the years. A major draw is the high-quality, often rare, merchandise available. The attendees tend to be from an older generation, many of whom grew up during railroading's golden era, whether they rode or worked on the rails or were introduced to model trains by family members. Thankfully, parents and grandparents still bring children to see the displays, helping to keep the hobby alive.

Among the longtime exhibitors was

## Antiquarian book groups embark on 'new generation of collecting'

If someone were to ask me if I know a book collector, without hesitation, I would name my cousin George. A retired attorney, he chose to spend a good deal of his discretionary income on his passion: collecting antiquarian accounts of piracy trials. For this avid reader who never stopped learning, the thrill of the chase and the possibility of discovering new information culminated in an important private collection.

On the other hand, I continue to dust shelves filled with books that I have read, books that I hope to read, and a rather decent library of books relating to antiques and collectibles, which, I suppose, makes me a keeper of books. But a collector?

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the Antiquarian Booksellers' Association of America. Founded in 1949 in New York City, the organization's stated goal is to promote interest in rare and antiquarian books and book collecting, as well as to foster collegial relations. In addition to books, members buy, sell, and appraise maps, letters, ephemera, and other handwrought and printed materials.

While honoring its 75-year history, ABAA embarked on a forward-thinking campaign, "The New Generation of Collecting." Assisting with this proj-

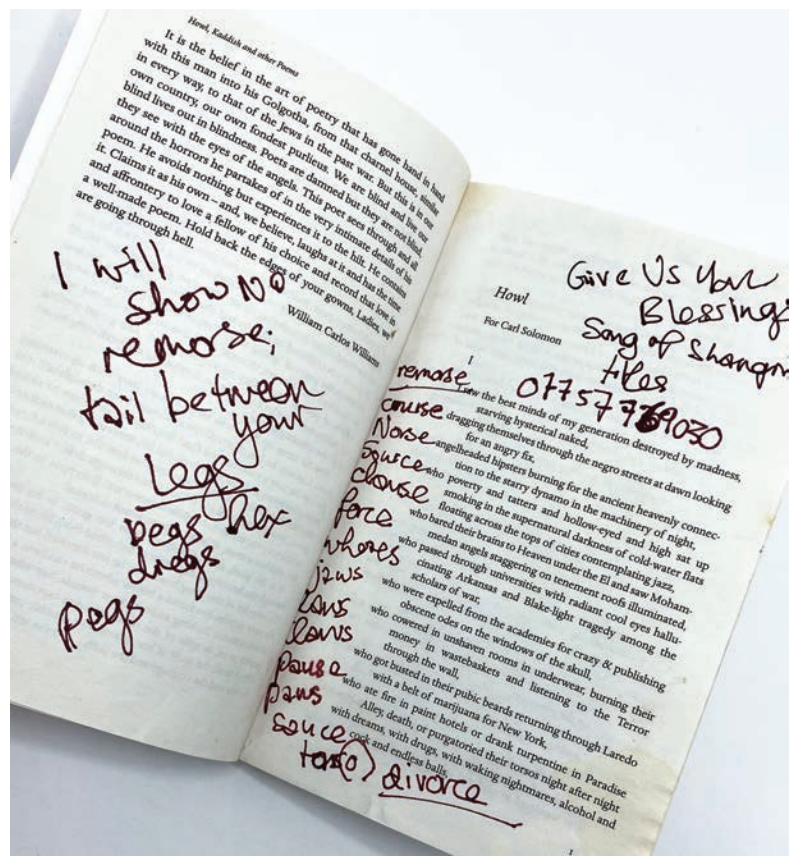

ect was AbeBooks, a global website for rare books, fine art, and collectibles (not to mention reading copies of favorites). Founded in 1995 in Victoria, Canada, AbeBooks, an independent subsidiary of Amazon, connects buyers with thousands of independent sellers from around the world.

From this collaboration emerged four insightful interviews with people who are breaking the mold and redefining the art of book collecting. One of them is Lisbet Tellefsen, a collector and community archivist who focuses on late-20th century African Americana. Based in Oakland, California, Tellefsen stated in her video, "What you are living right now will someday be history." But what will be important in later years is not always recognized at the time, she continued, and it is her mission to fill in some of those gaps. "History belongs to those who ensure that their stories are preserved for the next generation," she concluded.

Offering a different approach to book collecting, Rebecca Romney seeks the stories within the stories, "collecting books not because they are first

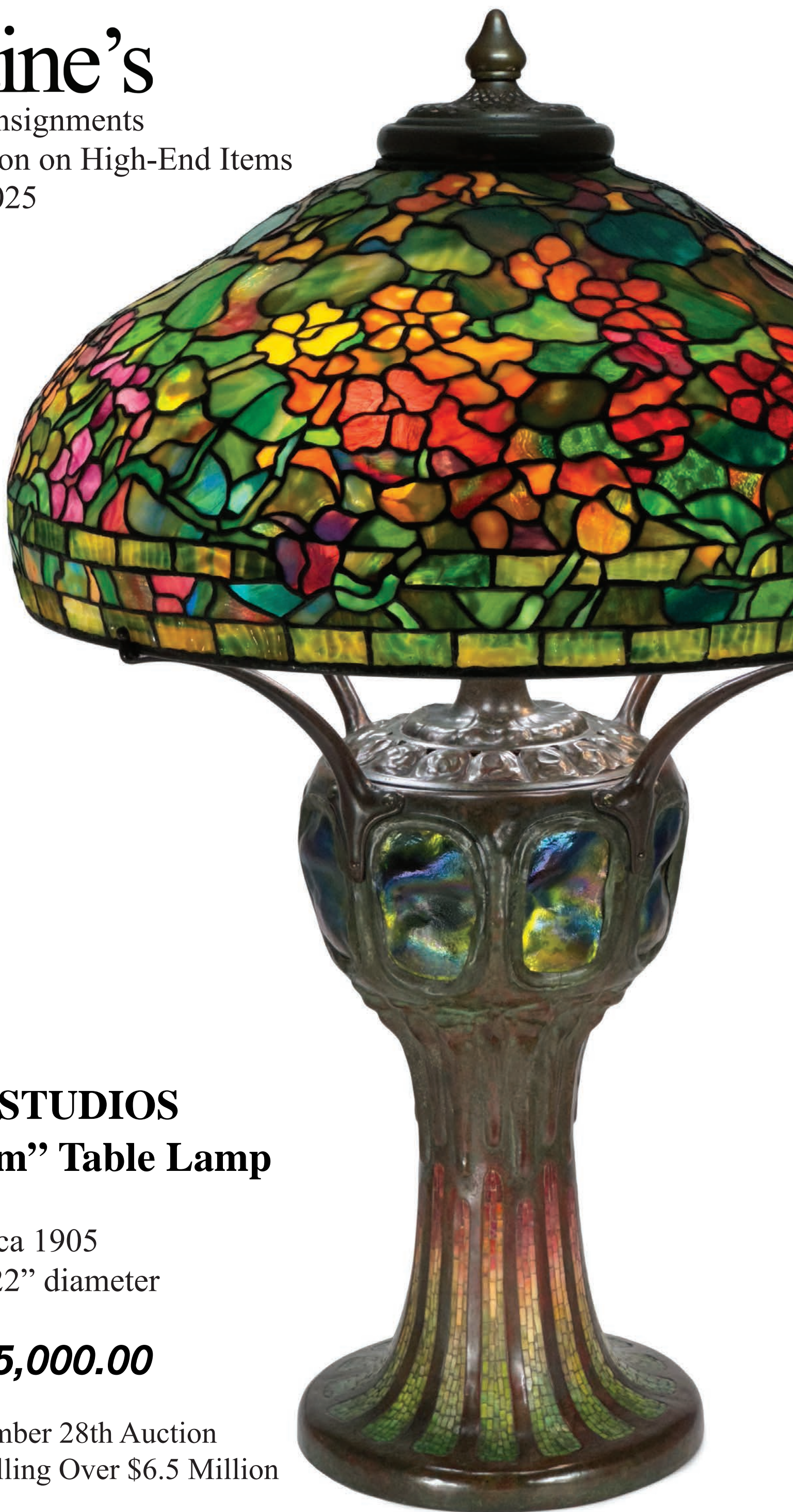

ly Climax cocktail smokers. The pedestal tables with ashtrays and drink slots were originally made in Indianapolis and are perfect for a home bar. At his booth, Painter displayed a Pullman-branded example and one from the Chesapeake & Ohio. "I've restored over 200 of these," he said.

George and Liane Seyk from Chicago have sold at the Columbus show for about 15 years. Their tables filled with popular railroad china and silver caught plenty of attention. Pondering the crowd, George remarked, "The people here are serious buyers." When asked what drew them to selling railroad tableware, George became nostalgic, recalling childhood train travels. "I like the historical context, and there's a certain beauty to it," he said, adding, "and it's a hobby we can enjoy together."

Some dealers were newer to the scene, such as husband and wife artists David and Line Tutwiler from Chicago, who have participated for just a few years. David often focuses on railroad and transportation themes, including com-

missions for Disney and LucasFilm studios and works displayed at the National Railway Historical Society.

Another addition was Jack Wall from Pittsburgh. The former railroad supply worker began collecting in 2004 before selling on Etsy and eventually at the Columbus show. Among his wares was a unique Aerotrain plate. With the ease of someone well-versed in rail history, he quickly pointed out, "There were only two Aerotrains built."

Of course, it's the merchandise that takes center stage. Whether searching for a model train engine, railroad artifact, or railroad painting, guests were eager to find that unique item. The room was divided into sections for railroad artifacts and model train gear, allowing attendees to focus on the area of their interest.

Of all the artifacts available, train lanterns and lights seemed to be most prolific, with prices varying from about \$65 to several hundred dollars. Next up was railroad china and silver, ranging from familiar B&O Railroad dining ware priced as low as \$15 to rarer pieces with high three-figure price tags. Other popular items included conductor uniforms, caps, buttons, and items like tickets and tokens.

Adding to the array were signs, train crests, and builder's plates, priced from under \$100 for small signs to over \$1,000 for crests and railroad crossing signs. For advertising collectors with limited funds, there was plenty of ephemera, ranging from timetables and train matchbooks costing as little as \$2 to locomotive operator manuals that could be purchased for \$10-\$25. Collectible railroad books were also popular, ranging from \$2-\$50 depending on title and condition.

Turning to model trains, a main attraction was several working train displays in multiple scales, intended to enthrall families and encourage an interest in model railroading. For those looking to build or expand their own layouts, there was a wide range of engines, cars, tracks, buildings, and accessories, including everything from pre-war Lionel engines to modern MTH sets.

Since airlines, buses, and steamships were often allied with railroads, a variety of related merchandise was also available. Examples included Pere Marquette rail ferry china, seen in two booths, priced from \$140-\$375. Another

er table had a fleet of assembled plastic model World War II airplanes for \$10. Another vendor offered a brochure for the President's Conference Committee (PCC) streamline trolley for \$10.

Despite challenges from the multi-year renovation at the fairgrounds, which caused parking issues, and probably got things off to a slow start, the show was a resounding success and marked a noteworthy accomplishment for Golden Spike. # Rifle arcade game scored \$319,800 at Morphy

LAS VEGAS — Held Dec. 5-7 in Las Vegas, Morphy Auctions hosted a major coin-op and advertising auction with over 1,200 lots. Offerings from collections and individual consignors went well beyond vending machines and arcade games, spanning 30+ categories.

Kicking off Thursday were 460 lots, including vintage jukeboxes, signs, and exceptional arcade, barbershop, carnival, and coin-op items. The day's high of \$28,905 went for an Auto-Photo Model 14 photo booth in very good condition. Designed in 1958 and manufactured until 1974, only a few dozen remain. This latter example came complete with original signage.

A \$27,060 bid secured a double-sided porcelain mortar & pestle drugstore sign. Circa 1910, it was emblazoned "Drugs & Soda" and carried its maker's mark, "Federal System Electric KC, MO." The very-good condition sign had been rewired and showed minimal loss, damage, and rust. Close behind, at \$24,600, was a 1950s double-sided porcelain Dog N Suds sign. The working five-color neon sign was in very good shape, showing light porcelain loss, scratching, and rust.

Eighteen additional lots topped \$10,000, including a 5¢ Mills Novelty Co. Violano Virtuoso music player, hitting \$20,910. Invented by Henry K. Sandell in 1912, it featured a keyboard and viola that played from perforated music rolls. Only 4,000-5,000 were made. This 1915 unit had a deeply-finished quarter oak cabinet with four-panel front glass dividers, original brass hardware, and interior lighting. The working unit was

in very good condition, rewired, recently tuned, and came with several rolls, plus the ability to play via wireless MIDI.

Bidding reached \$17,220 for a 1¢ Mlle. "Zita Tells Your Fortune" arcade machine by Gorsky Recreation. The floor model featured Madam Zita, who dispensed a fortune card when the handle was cranked. It was in good condition, with keys. Then came an unusual circa 1930 clown-sized delivery truck. It was made by Rebel Corporation of Berwick, Pa., and painted for Divco Dairy in St. Louis. The good-condition truck retained its original gas engine, green paint, and Divco advertising. It rolled off for \$14,760.

On Friday came 264 lots, including

more signs, barbacs, fire and police collectibles, kiddie rides, and classic vehicles. One of the most unusual items, hitting the session's high of \$172,200, was a 1930 Cadillac Anheuser-Busch "Bevo Boat." Eight of these inboard-styled cruisers built on automobile chassis were made. Named "Bevo" after the non-alcoholic beer, they traveled the country to promote the brand. They sported leather upholstery, thick carpet, and fine wood trim. This cruiser, restored for the 2004 St. Louis Exposition, was the only known survivor from the original fleet. It had provenance to a brewery sales manager who purchased the vehicle upon retiring in 1960.

The Bevo Boat was followed by other

vehicles including a 1927 Ahrens-Fox Model MX-4 triple-comb pumping fire truck. The fully-restored, museum-quality engine, painted for the Bristol Fire Dept and outfitted with all the engine's original gear, sold for \$129,150. A 1960 Volkswagen Type 2 Westfalia conversion camper bus pulled \$49,200. Restored for the 2004 St. Louis Exposition, it had 6,598 miles, and featured original equipment, including birch plywood interior, foldout seats, door table, and top carrier.

Seventeen other items exceeded \$10,000. A child-size traveling carnival carousel by Allen Herschell went for

editions, but because of their provenance, where they've been, who owned them." A co-founder of Type Punch Matrix, a rare book firm, Romney highlighted in her video a paperback copy of "Howl, Kaddish, and Other Poems" by Allen Ginsburg. In rough condition, it is nevertheless special because it once belonged to singer/songwriter Amy Winehouse, who highlighted passages in the text and jotted down ideas for lyrics and telephone numbers on the book's pages.

With a passion for horror, Obadiah Baird, one of the owners of The Book Bin, outlined several strategies within this genre of literature. One way to focus a collection, he suggested, would be with books, chatbooks, and other materials re-

lating to H.P. Lovecraft. Signed Stephen King novels can be "very expensive," but, as an alternative, Baird displayed a volume that had been signed by the illustrator. Other collectors, he said, might opt to

"go straight to the newer authors." Whatever the strategy, "collect what you read," he advised.

And then there's Walter Reuben, who deals in Old Hollywood ephemera. "There

are a range of options out there, such as posters, lobby cards, photos, and vintage film scripts," he said. "Whether you love Star Wars or classic Greta Garbo films, there will always be things that fall within your price range."

In the end, this year's introspective collaboration has demonstrated that there is no right or wrong way to collect, or, for that matter, what to collect. Telfenfen might have said it best when she described her world as "surrounded by overflowing bookcases and the treasures accumulated over a wild, rich life. A collector's life. I would wish it on anybody." Or, put succinctly in the words of ABAA's 75th anniversary campaign, "Everyone's a collector."

I guess that includes me.

\$29,520. The fully restored, operational ride had a link-belt motorized drive, mirrored wooden interior, 20 horses, and two benches. And, a beautiful 1920s mahogany barback with a marble top and stained glass reached \$21,525. The 103-inch by 118-inch bar was in very good condition, with all its original metal hardware.

On the final day, 553 lots of general store items, coin-op games, gumball machines, jukeboxes, slot machines, and collectible signs were auctioned. Saturday's highest bid, and the top bid of the entire event, went to a rare Automatic Target Machine Company "Ray-O-Lite" rifle arcade game, which sold for \$319,800. The circa 1905 machine featured a variety of unique targets. Originally battery-operated, the model fell out of favor when AC current became more common. This

one had an AC revamp from the 1920s. In all-original working condition, the machine was extremely rare and possibly the only known survivor with its original target cabinet.

While not six figures, a still-impressive \$51,660 picked up a 43-inch-tall corner drug store leaded glass mortar and pestle light. The circa 1910s commercial light wore "Corner Drug Store" in ruby-red stained glass around the top and "Cigars" and "Prescriptions scrolled around the bottom. The body was clean and all glass panels and glass jewels retained strong color. It was lit internally by a fluorescent bulb attached to a modern power cord.

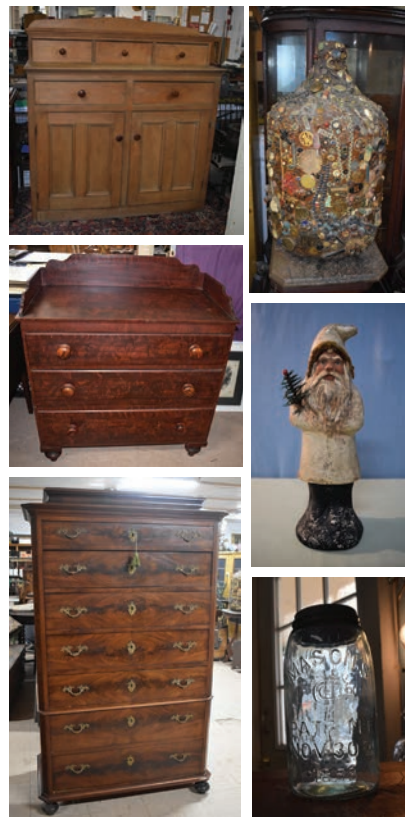
Seventeen of the day's offerings also broke the \$10,000 mark, including a refurbished 5¢ Caille Eclipse upright slot machine with keys that pulled \$20,910. The circa 1905 machine by Caille Brothers of Detroit was housed in an oak cabinet with ornate copper-flashed cherub,

claw legs, and trim. Restoration included replacing castings on the coin head, a refurbished mechanism, and a new back door.

An exceptional ceramic Coca-Cola dispenser, complete with its lid and original spigot, proved popular, grabbing \$17,220. Made by the Wheeling Pottery Company around 1896, the model was the first to serve the now-iconic beverage. It was in superior condition, with bowls still gleaming bright white, with only a glint of browning from the syrup. The base still displayed the words "Delicious and Exhilarating" and "Refreshing and Invigorating," along with vivid red and gold scrollwork.

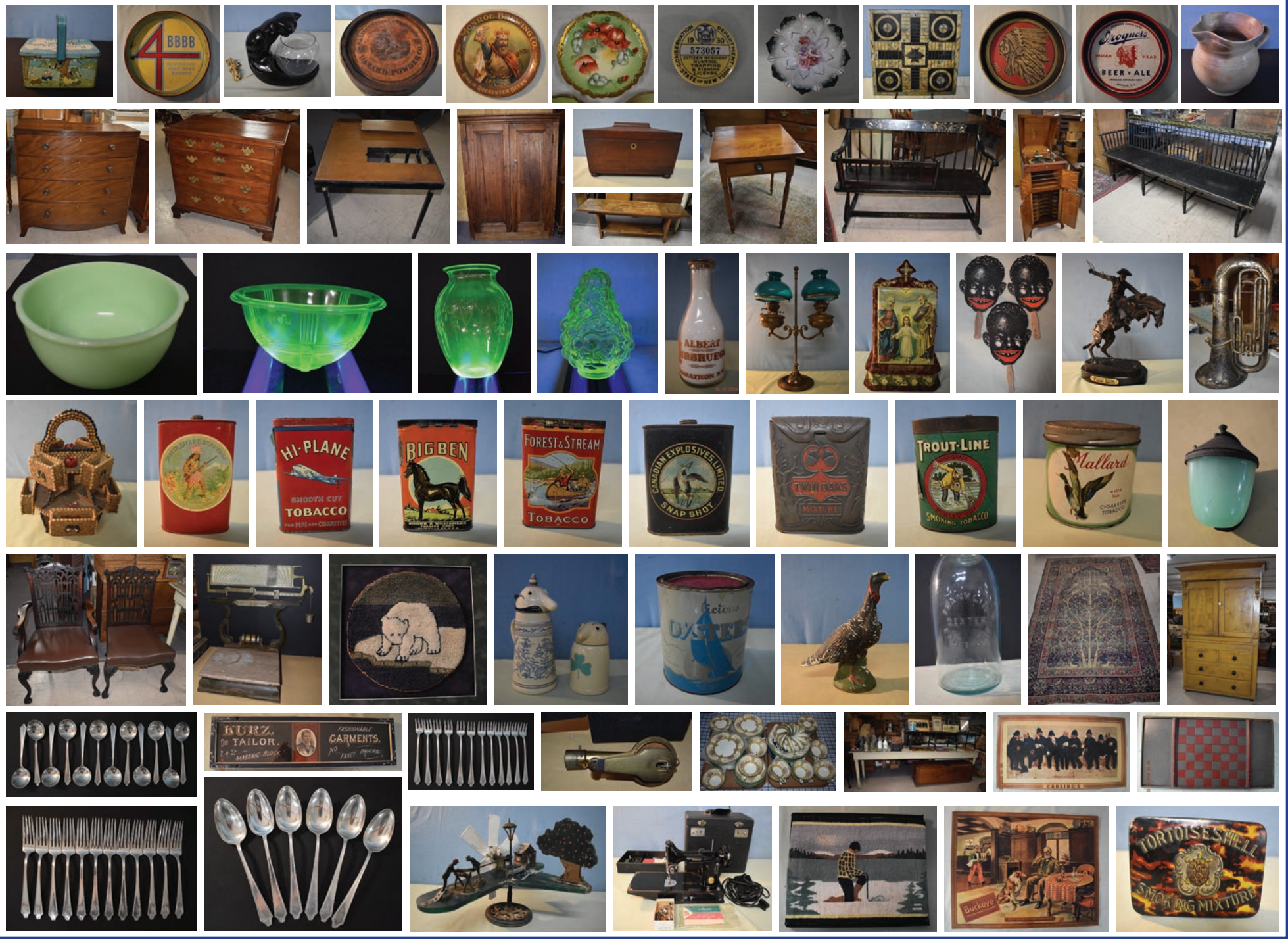
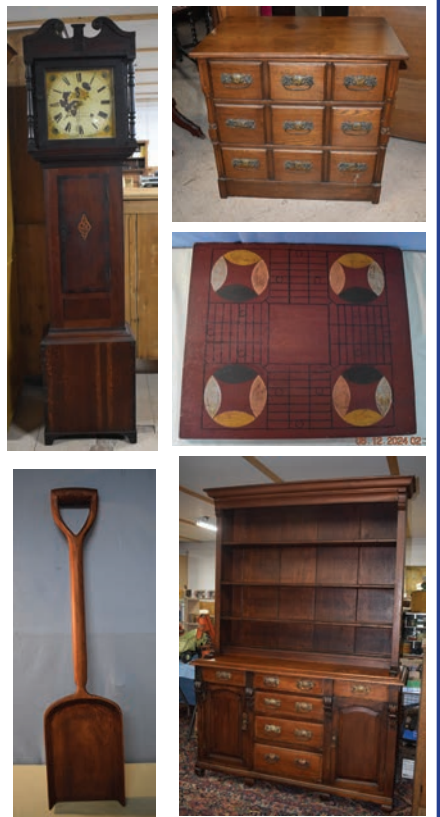



## Christmas Tree Pins

designers face the heady challenge of adapting their individual stylings to the depiction of a single common

theme: the Christmas tree. Some realizations are traditional, some abstract, but variety ensures their seemingly limitless collectability.

Like the full-size trees they represent, Christmas tree pins twinkle and shimmer, though the effect here is due to rhinestones, crystals, or other brilliants, rather than by way of electric lights and shiny ornaments.

Application of these sparklers marks the final step in the creation of a metal Christmas tree pin, which is first cast in a rubber mold, then polished and electroplated. Following attachment of the clasp mechanism by metal press or soldering, the pin is hand-enameled, and, at last, its tiny gleaming gems are firmly affixed. The result: a Christmas tree pin that's proudly present-worthy.

it's often impossible to credit every Christmas tree pin to a specific designer. Many were the work of European craftsmen, immigrating to the United States after World War II. Used to working with precious stones and metals, but going where the jobs were, they adapted their talents to the creation of superior costume jewelry.

While some tree pins, such as those by Weiss, bear clearly engraved markings, others were identified only by labels or paper tags which have long since disappeared. Happily, avid collectors have managed to track down the sources of many original pins. That information is now readily available in collector's guides, and on such websites as [www.christmastreepins.com](http://www.christmastreepins.com). Although it's still a "buyer beware" market, the novice pin buyer now at least has a fighting chance.

Once upon a time, Christmas tree pins could easily be found among the jumble of inexpensive costume jewelry on a dealer's "make me an offer" table. Many were, after all, pieces originally sold in dime stores, often for less than a dollar. Nowadays, most dealers know what they have, and most collectors know what they're looking for, so prices reflect this. While it's still possible to find lovely vintage pins for under \$20, unique pieces, such as Alexis Bittar's jeweled Lucite trees, can run into the hundreds. Rare vintage pieces may sell in the thousands. Regardless of the source, condition is all-important. While missing rhinestones on an inexpensive pin can easily be replaced without

affecting the value, dented, bent, rusted, or extensively paint-flaked Christmas tree pins have little monetary or visual appeal.

Christmas tree pins are the ideal collectible for those who don't like to see good things come to an end. Don't worry: you won't. Thousands of pins were made, and, as noted, thousands remain readily available. And, no matter how many you have, tree pins don't really seem to take up much room. Most average just two inches in height, and can be conveniently stored in drawers, on flat cushioned trays. Those who'd like to enjoy their pins on a daily basis can display them in velvet-lined shadow boxes, or pin them on vintage dress forms.

You might, however, find yourself temporarily distracted by other bright shiny objects: tiny standing jeweled trees; framed trees created from abandoned fragments of costume jewelry; and, of course, plenty of other holiday-themed pins. Santas. Snowmen. Carolers, candy canes, and partridges perched (where else?) in pear trees. With so many choices, you may want to start donning those holiday pins a bit earlier. . .say, perhaps, on the day after Christmas.
