These cloth dolls strike a pose with collectors

Some dolls cry. Some say "Mama." Lots of them open and close their eyes. And diapered baby dolls often put those tiny diapers to practical use.

Fabric dolls, with their flexible wire underpinnings, just bend. For buyers in the 1940s and '50s, that was enough. The same holds true for today's collectors. These dolls don't really need to "do" anything. Just pose them and, when the mood strikes, change the poses. The dolls won't mind.

Fabric dolls have been around for ages, whether dolling up Egyptian tombs, or being dragged around in the dust by those Little House On The Prairie girls. Early cloth dolls have a folk art look, as many were handmade.

Although cloth-covered dolls with concealed wire armatures allowing poseability had been available from the 1930s onward, their widespread popularity came as Spanish souvenir dolls. In the early 1950s, companies including Larrea, Nistis, Roldan, and, most notably, Klumpe, released imaginatively designed bendable fabric dolls that tourists gleefully snapped up and brought home. The dolls, most less than a foot tall, initially offered humorous interpretations of standard Spanish clichés (bullfighters, flamenco dancers, and cigarette girls). Soon, however, the roster included hundreds of varied characters, from dentists and ballerinas to the occasional bagpipers and snake charmers.

To satisfy growing interest from consumers not fortunate enough to travel to Spain, U.S. importers, including Effanbee and John J. Schneider brought bendable fabric dolls stateside. According

to a 1956 Schneider sales catalog, the possible uses for Klumpe dolls were so varied that the dolls practically sold

Toy motorcycle spins off for \$5,500 at Over and Above sale



TIMONIUM, Md. — On Jan. 30, Over and Above Online Auction and Estate Sales hosted a major toy auction on Live Auctioneers. The online event showcased 526 lots of antique and collectible toys, including tin, diecast, and celluloid items from US manufacturers as well as those from England, Japan, and Germany. Featured makers included Arnold, Dinky, Marklin, Schuco, and more.

The auction was highlighted by the \$5,500 offered for a rare pre-war Japanese Masudaya wind-up motorcycle. A copy of an Arnold design, the toy featured a German soldier riding a camouflage bike with a searchlight. Measuring 7 ¼ inches, it was stamped "Made in Japan" on the bottom and was in good cosmetic and working condition, though requiring a flint to actuate the sparking mechanism.

Four additional lots reached five-figure sums, including an Alps Japan Friction Series 62 Cadillac convertible with its original box. That sold for \$1,900, in line with pre-auction estimates. The all-original car featured a painted tin-plate exterior and tin-litho interior. It featured original red paint, and clear graphics despite minor age-related wear. Its box, while showing some wear, still contained the original "Rock Valley Toy" tissue paper.

Also meeting estimates, bringing \$1,500, was a Schuco Elektro-Construction 6095 set, complete with a clean original box and an unbuilt truck still fastened inside. Another standout was a vintage Star Trek phaser, which shattered high estimates, bringing nearly 20 times its expected value at \$1,300. The wood and plastic gun, possibly a prop from the show, was in rough shape with cracked plastic, snapped battery wires, missing battery



case, and significant paint loss, making it a prime piece to restore.

Bidding remained strong, with four additional lots selling well above the \$500 mark. Among them was an Osaka "Mechanised" battery-operated "Robbie the Robot" with its original box, which fetched \$900. This approximately 13-inch-tall, nickel-plated robot, one of only 20 made, was near-mint. Bidding reached \$700 on a Yonezawa Japan tin-litho Atom race car

#8. The 16-inch-long friction racer was well preserved, with some fading and wear.

Competition remained strong on two dozen additional lots, pushing them into the mid-hundreds. A Banner Toys space helmet with radar goggles, complete with its original box, rose to \$400. The plastic helmet was in very good shape, though it lacked the die-cut "face" insert. The box


Superman is flying high with new movie and record comic sale

Superman has been a cultural icon for nearly a century, embodying hope, strength, and the idea that doing good is always the right choice, especially for the downtrodden. Since his first appearance in Action Comics #1 in 1938, the character has been reinterpreted in countless ways, across comic books, television, and film (the less said about the video games, the better). I discovered Superman when I was very young via The Adventures of Superman with George Reeves and The Super Friends cartoon series, right around the time I began reading the comic books.

Recently, a handful of Superman-related events have reminded fans why the character remains so compelling, from the emotional finale of a television series, the excitement surrounding an upcoming movie, a deeply moving documentary, and even the staggering sale of his first appearance for a record-breaking price.



was fair, showing bends and missing/detached flaps. A JNF Auto Union Rennwagen #2 wind-up tin-litho race car hit \$350. The working racer, complete with its driver, displayed moderate to heavy wear and oxidation. Close behind, hitting \$325, was a 1950s Soviet Russian clockwork Sputnik space toy. The 4 1/2-inch-tall tin-litho piece featured a satellite that traveled across a spinning globe when wound. It was working and had only light surface and edge

Even when winning bids dropped into the lower three figures buyers still picked up plenty of exceptional items. A bid of \$250 won a 9-inch-long Gunthermann "Los Angeles" tin-litho zeppelin. The wind-up dirigible had an integral key, rear propeller, celluloid fan blades, and gondolas beneath the body. It was working but showed heavy

cosmetic wear. Coming close, at \$225, was a German tin-litho gas station, labeled, "U.S. Zone Germany," possibly made by Greppart & Kelch/Fischer. The fair-condition garage featured a car lift, detachable marquee, Shell branded pumps, and came with a tin-litho wind-up sedan.

A bid of \$170 secured a Buddy-L army set #5560 with its original box. The nearly complete painted pressed-steel set included an untested searchlight truck, a transport truck with its canvass top, cannon, conveyor, and nine large plastic soldiers. The box was rough, with water damage and other wear.

Even wins under \$100 grabbed some exceptional items. An Alps Northwest 701 four-engine tin-litho friction airplane took off for \$90. The 14-inch-long, working plane showed only light scuffs and wear. Another aviation toy — a Technofix 276 wind-up airport/plane — landed for \$70. Measuring 14 inches across, the tin-litho wind-up set was in very good cosmetic and working condition and was paired with a reproduction box. Pulling off for \$60 was a vintage Tri-Ang Minic Motorways racing set in its original box. The 1960s British-made slot car set, with diecast racers, appeared complete and displayed very minor wear. Even a modest \$15 scored a vintage Staba "Fahrzeug Baukasten" (vehicle construction set) in its original box. It was mostly complete, including the original instruction booklet.

One of the most recent and heartfelt interpretations of the character came through Superman & Lois, a TV show that not only honored the legacy of Superman but also presented him in a way that hadn't been explored in live-action before. Rather than focusing on the origin story or endless battles against alien threats (though there were some), the show centered on Clark Kent and Lois Lane as parents, raising their two sons in Smallville while navigating the struggles of family life alongside Clark's duties as Superman.

The final season delivered an emotional conclusion, bringing closure to four seasons of interesting, well-written stories. The finale featured a climactic battle against Doomsday, a fight that pushed Superman to his limits, while also reaffirming his core values - protecting his family, his friends, and the world at large. But what made Superman & Lois truly special was its ability to balance the larger-than-life heroics with small, deeply personal moments. Tyler Hoechlin's portrayal of Superman captured both the power and kindness that define the character, making his journey resonate in a way few other adaptations have managed. I wasn't crazy about his take on the character in the Supergirl TV show, but I thought he was great in Superman & Lois.

While Superman & Lois brought an end to its story, another take on the Man of Steel is just beginning. James Gunn's Superman, set to release in a few months, has already generated massive excitement, especially after the trailer drop in December. The teaser introduced audiences to not only a new Superman, played by David Corenswet, but also several DC characters making their live action cinematic debut. Krypto, Superman's superpowered canine companion, stole the spotlight in the trailer, and the mere confirmation that he'll be in the movie thrilled longtime fans. Nathan Fillion's Guy Gardner, complete with his signature bowl haircut, promises to bring some humor and arrogance to the mix, while Hawkgirl and Mr. Terrific expand the film's scope beyond just Superman's personal story. There's a clear sense that Gunn is embracing the broader DC Universe, making this film feel like a fresh and exciting new chapter for Superman on the big screen.

Superman's legacy has always been larger than just one actor, but there's no denying that for many, Christopher Reeve remains the definitive portrayal

of the character. The 2024 documentary Super/Man: The Christopher Reeve Story is a powerful, deeply moving look at his life, career, and the unimaginable tragedy that changed everything. Watching it, I couldn't help but tear up, thinking about the contrast between the towering, handsome, and robust man who defined Superman for a generation and the reality of his later years, where he faced incredible adversity after a riding accident left him paralyzed. It's hard to comprehend going from being the embodiment of power and grace to suddenly losing nearly all

mobility. And yet, rather than retreat into bitterness, Reeve became an advocate, using his platform to push for advancements in spinal cord research and to inspire millions.

Superman: The Movie starring Christopher Reeve was one of the few films my parents took me and my brother to see in theaters when we were kids. That experience is forever etched in my memory — the moment when Superman first took flight, the way Reeve seamlessly transitioned between Clark Kent's awkward charm and Superman's commanding presence. Watching

the documentary reminded me of those early memories, of how that film defined what a hero was supposed to be. It wasn't just the superpowers or the fights against Lex Luthor; it was the warmth, the unwavering sense of right and wrong, and the belief that one person — superpowered or not — could make a difference.

Even decades after his first appearance, Superman continues to hold immense value, both emotionally and financially. Recently, an original copy of Action Comics #1, featuring Superman's first appearance, sold for a staggering \$6 million, setting a new record. It's incredible to think that a single comic book, one that originally sold for just 10 cents in 1938, could be worth that much today. But that price tag is more than just a reflection of rarity it's a testament to Superman's lasting impact. He isn't just a character; he's a symbol, a piece of cultural history that has resonated across generations.

Thinking about everything Superman represents — from the hopeful father in Superman & Lois to the fresh start in James Gunn's film, the bittersweet legacy of Christopher Reeve, and the historic sale of Action Comics #1 it's clear that he is more than just a superhero. He's a reflection of our ideals, our struggles, and our hopes. No matter how many times his story is retold, whether in comics, TV shows, or films, his message remains the same: that doing good, standing up for what's right, and believing in the best of people will always matter. In a world that often feels chaotic and divided, especially in today's political climate, Superman endures, reminding us all that we can still strive to be better.

Johnson received a championship buckle, trophy, and entry into the International Auctioneer Championship in July in Schaumburg, Ill.

Professional auctioneering is in Johnson's DNA, as his late uncle, Darell Dunkle, was a well-respected auctioneer from 1965-2022. When Johnson was a little boy, he remembers attending the Clare County Livestock Auction with his father, Matt Johnson. Colt is now an auctioneer for the Clare County Livestock Auction and sells every Monday.

The 2016 Clare High School graduate attended the World-Wide College of Auctioneering in Mason City, Iowa, when he was just 15. After graduating from auction school, he began working with Sykora Auction Service and is celebrating his 11th work anniversary with the firm. Johnson also works at the Clare County Livestock, which he says, "it is the highlight of my week". He enjoys all auctions, but his favorite types of auctions are farm equipment and cattle auctions.

'Moulin Rouge Can-Can Dancer,' or the 'Drunkard In Full Dress.' For the world traveler, the 'Gypsy Queen Dancing.' For the religious, the 'Choir Boy Kneeling on a Cushion.'

"By looking over the Klumpe list, one can find a doll for each occasion suiting the personality of any recipient."

Spain wasn't the only country filling the doll carriages. Portugal produced the "Maria Helena" dolls, noted for their oversize feet, which helped them maintain freestanding balance. On the high end were Italy's more realistic Lenci dolls, produced in Turin from 1919 until 1944. Exquisitely hand-stitched by Elena "Lenci" König, Lenci dolls are noted for their "sideways glance." That downcast gaze gives the dolls a forlorn look, and author Dare Wright featured her own childhood Lenci doll, "Edith," in the best-selling photo book, The Lonely

In the United States, designers quickly joined the fabric doll parade. Some companies operated on a limited scale, making their dolls the most sought-after today. Among those with an interesting backstory: the "Four Sisters" dolls, created in Independence, Mo. These handmade dolls were indeed the work of four sisters — the Bullards. Although each sister achieved artistic acclaim, the best-selling Four Sisters designs were created by Aileen Bullard Franklin. Her "Little Troll" elves, and "Charles Dickens Character Dolls" first emerged in the 1950s, and proved holiday perennials.

Also climbing aboard the holiday express were the Byers' Choice "Carolers." Their mouths always open in song, the limber, elongated Byers dolls are particularly well-suited to wintry action poses. The first Byers' Choice dolls were created by Joyce Byers in the

1960s, their hand-crafted stylings intended to capture the spirit of traditional Christmases. The Byers' Pennsylvania enterprise began in a garage workshop staffed only by family. Today, more than 80 employees create thousands of Byers' Choice Carolers each year.


The most ubiquitous mobile dolls, however, are those created by Annalee. Named for their designer, Barbara Annalee (Davis) Thorndike, the rationale behind their creation is clearly stated on each doll's hangtag:

"We hope you'll enjoy your doll's whimsical charm for many years. Its mobility and flexibility allow you to create your own ideas in positioning, resulting in the best of display and decoration."

Annalee Davis began creating fabric dolls as an outgrowth of her interest in puppetry. Although her initial handmade dolls were sold through local craft guilds, Annalee's design dreams were put on a back burner following her marriage to Charles "Chip" Thorndike. From their Meredith, N.H. home, the two operated "Thorndike's Eggs and Auto Parts." In 1950, with the poultry farm failing, Annalee turned again to dollmaking. Her first design studio: the converted chicken coop.

Like most bendable dolls, those by Annalee have molded felt bodies, with painted faces.


Expanding in 1964 to a 34,000-foot "Factory in the Woods," Annalee quickly cornered the market on holiday celebrations. The seemingly limitless



Unlike many mid-century dolls, flexible fabric dolls remain in remarkably good condition, despite the passage of years. The reason is simple: these were dolls to look at, not dolls to play with. Other than dust, and occasional felt fleabites, fabric dolls of the past continue to present a pleasing picture.

Also pleasing are the prices. Dependent on the intricacy of their costuming and accessories, Klumpe and Klumpe-like dolls are generally less than \$75; Byers' Choice, less than \$100. Four Sisters dolls top out at \$200. Priciest by far are Lenci dolls: rare editions can reach \$1,000 or more. The best deals are dolls by Annalee, with many vintage pieces from the 1970s still available at less than \$25. And they are plentiful: a typical day's Annalee inventory on eBay offers nearly 10,000 choices.

Identifying the maker of a fabric doll is often catch-as-catch-can, as many imported dolls had only long-sincevanished hang tags and labels. Unmarked dolls of similar style are often lumped under the "Klumpe" banner, although Klumpe dolls are generally distinguished by their "V"-shaped eyebrows. Lenci made things easier, with the company's marking indicated on the doll's foot. Easiest of all

Bendable fabric dolls are particularly winsome examples of mid-20th-century consumer-oriented design, capturing the irresistible innocence of an earlier time. As Annalee Thorndike herself once put it, "it's the 'positive-ness' of the face. It's the smile. If you smile, someone's got to smile back."
