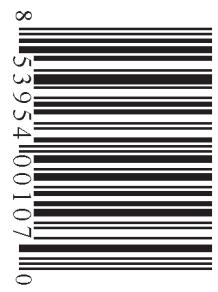

## Bookends make solid stand-up collectibles

Over the years, bookends have quietly gained popularity as collectibles. Though they may be simple and functional, these often-overlooked objects offer much more than just book support. Bookends can be small-scale works of art, showcasing the design, craftsmanship, and history of previous generations.

Interest in vintage and antique bookends has surged among collectors, designers, and history lovers who value these objects as artistic accents that enrich any space. Whether simple wooden pairs from the 18th century, carved marble ones from the Edwardian age, or streamlined Art Deco brass sets, each offers a glimpse into the design trends of their era. A closer look at their history reveals why these objects continue to captivate collectors today.

The story of bookends begins with ancient civilizations that used objects to hold scrolls and manuscripts in place. The earliest libraries in places like Egypt and Rome used shelves with simple ledges or built-in supports to hold their collections. The modern bookend, however, emerged in the 18th century, when books became more accessible to the growing middle class. As printing presses became more common and literacy spread, books began to play an important role in many households. As people accumulated books, they needed a way to organize and display them, leading to the creation of objects specifically designed to keep books upright. These early bookends were typically simple in design, often just rectangular or cylindrical blocks crafted from heavy materials like wood or stone.

In the late 18th century, bookends began evolving into decorative objects, influenced by the Baroque and Rococo styles that were popular in Europe.

Bookends from that period were often ornate, intricately carved, or adorned with decorative accents. Crafted from fine materials by skilled artisans, they were intended for wealthy households that could afford such luxuries.

By the 19th century, bookends had transformed into the decorative pieces we recognize today. The Victorians, known for their love of elaborate décor, adopted ornate bookends as a popular accessory in their libraries and parlors. These bookends often took the form of animals, historical figures, floral patterns, and mythological creatures. Over time, materials shifted from wood to ceramics, quarried stones like marble and quartz, and metals such as bronze, brass, and cast iron.

As the Industrial Revolution gained momentum, mass production allowed bookends to be made more affordably, making them accessible to a wider segment of society. Notable manufacturers like the American

Foundry Company, known for its popular iron bookends, metalworker Frankart, and The Bradley & Hubbard Manufacturing Company, celebrated for their finely crafted bronze and brass pieces, helped fuel this shift. Today, these manufacturers' works are highly collectible, with their pieces often fetching impressive prices at auctions.

During the Arts and Crafts movement, which spanned the late 19th and early 20th centuries, there was a renewed focus on natural materials, craftsmanship, and simplicity. Some of the most sought-after bookends from this period were crafted by prominent designers like Charles Limbert and Gustav Stickley, who favored minimalist forms made from sturdy materials like oak and wrought iron.

As industrialization progressed in the 20th century, bookend design evolved, with glass and ceramic options gaining popularity. Early 20th-century Art

## Many timeless treasures await in historic Annapolis

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — Nestled along the sparkling Chesapeake Bay, Annapolis, Md., is a timeless gem. As the state capital and home to the U.S. Naval Academy, this 350-year-old port city pulses with history and charm. Wander through its cobblestone streets, where antique shops brim with everything from classic furniture and nautical antiques to unique regional artifacts. With its perfect blend of rich heritage and eclectic shopping, Annapolis invites you to uncover the past and find something special to take home.

If you've never visited Annapolis, here's a quick lay of the land. Spend most your time in the historic district and harbor area, which are exceptionally walkable. Three landmarks will help you get your bearings. The first is City Dock, a picturesque inlet surrounded by shops and restaurants. Once a working waterfront,

it's now a top tourist destination often called "Ego Alley," where boaters like to

flaunt their fancy vessels.

Just a few blocks northwest of the docks are two historic circles. Church Circle is where you will find St. Anne's Church with roots dating back to 1700. A short walk away, State Circle is home to the Maryland State House, a significant historic landmark. Built in 1772 and first used by the Continental Congress in 1783, it's the oldest capitol building still in use. It was here that the Treaty of Paris was signed in 1784, officially ending the American Rev-

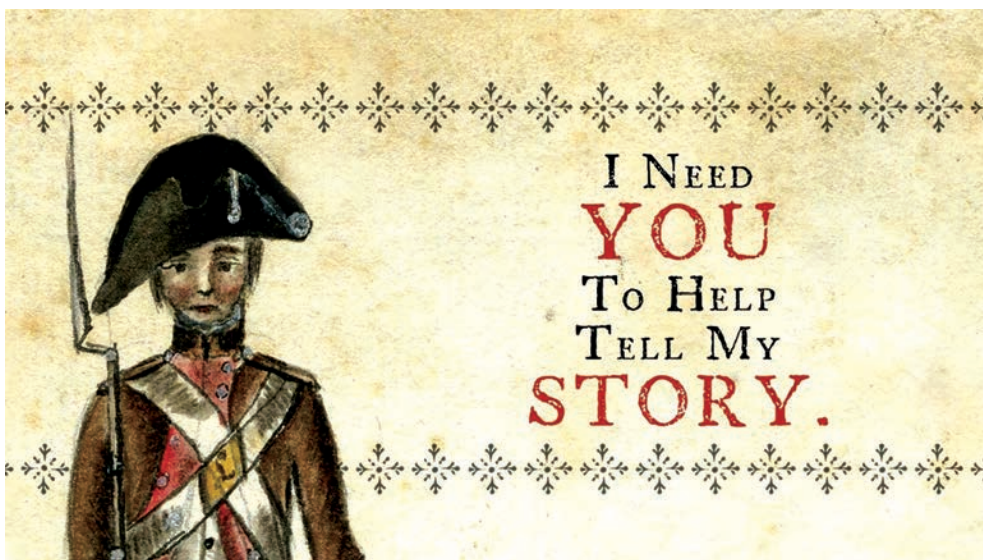
## If you can read cursive, the National Archives wants you

Remember penmanship lessons? Can't forget the impossibly perfect cursive alphabets (both upper and lower case) on those green classroom banners? Do you break out in a cold sweat when you hear the words "Palmer Method"? If your answer is "yes," you are not alone. But, as it turns out, if you can read cursive writing, you are now something of a national treasure. And your time and talents are needed to serve as a "citizen archivist" in a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

In June 2023, a team from the National Park Service approached the staff at the National Archives and Records Administration for help. Applications and other records pertaining to claims for pensions and bounty land warrants, dating from 1800 to 1912, needed to be transcribed. But these weren't just any records: They were those of the soldiers who served in the Revolutionary War.

And thus was born the "Revolutionary War Pension Files Transcription Mission," a project tasked with transcribing

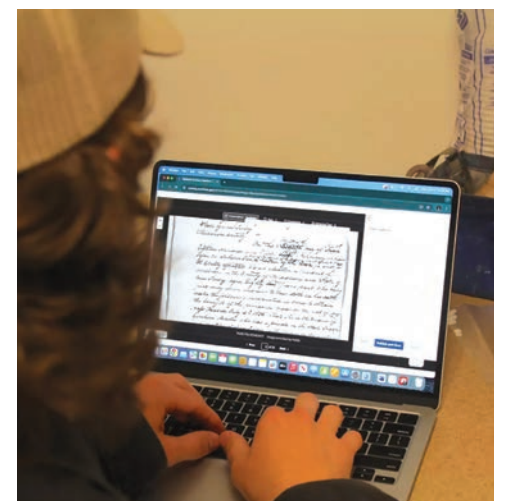

some 2.3 million pages of pension records. The self-imposed deadline for this project was set to coincide with the celebration of America's 250th birthday in 2026. "We thought this would be a great way to honor America's first veterans," according to

Suzanne Isaacs and Nancy Sullivan, community managers for the National Archives Catalog. An ambitious goal, to be sure.

Little wonder, then, that there is an on-going appeal for volunteers. Those who

accept the challenge will be transcribing documents, many of which were written in cursive, into digitized records for the National Archives Catalog. Currently,

olution. For a brief time, it even served as the capital of the United States.

Leading from the waterfront to Church Circle is Main Street, its charming brick sidewalks begging to be explored. Wander in any direction and you'll uncover impressive history. Annapolis boasts more 18th-century buildings than anywhere else in the country, including the homes of all four Maryland signers of the Declaration of Independence. Two landmarks are the William Paca House and Garden, the former home of one of the signers, and the residence of Charles Carroll House, who helped settle Annapolis and served as Maryland's first Attorney General.

A must-see is the United States Naval Academy located adjacent to City Dock. Since 1845, it's been training Navy and Marine Corps officers. The white-uniformed midshipmen are a familiar sight around town. If you're lucky enough to visit on graduation day, you'll be treated to flyovers by the Navy Blue Angels, who put on an unforgettable airshow right over town!

The historic area is a shopping haven, with several streets lined with specialty stores and boutiques, often showcasing the charm of the Chesapeake Bay. This includes the antique shops, most of which are tucked in the heart of the historic district. With a few exceptions, Annapolis' antique scene is concentrated along Maryland Avenue, one of the spokes extending from State Circle.

To help plan your antique shopping adventure, here's a list of shops on Maryland Avenue and nearby:

Blue Crab Antiques (57 Maryland Ave.) Here, you'll find a space filled with Annapolis and Maryland heritage, including Naval Academy memorabilia, militaria, maritime art, and Chesapeake treasures like antique oyster plates and waterfowl decoys. This shop has been visited numer-

ous times by Antiques Roadshow hosts. Evergreen Antiques and True Vintage (69 Maryland Ave.)

In business for over 20 years, it's the oldest antique shop in Historic Annapolis. In 2016, Joanna Young, an Annapolis native living in New York City, learned that the store was at risk of closing and decided to acquire it. The shop offers an eclectic mix of antiques and vintage items, including local advertising and memorabilia, estate jewelry, specialty silver, ship models, clocks, and even vintage clothing spanning the 1920s-1970s.

Roberta Bell Vintage Treasures (71 Maryland Ave.)

This cozy shop features a captivating selection of merchandise from the Victorian era to World War II, with a focus on the Jazz Age. Highlights include Art Deco and

Art Nouveau decor, small furnishings, tableware, jewelry, and vintage clothing.

Object & Entropy (62 Maryland Ave.)

The newest Maryland Avenue shop is a go-to for mid-century and retro fans. Long-time dealer Tom Levine draws from his expertise in 20th-century design, offering a curated selection of pieces from the era.

Silk Road (53 Maryland Ave.)

This friendly, veteran-owned store, inspired by the historic Silk Road trade route, brings fine antiques and collectibles from around the world to Annapolis. You'll find an eclectic array of treasures like Persian rugs, sculptures, and Victorian lamps coming from across the globe.

Annapolis Maritime Antiques (128

Severn Ave.)

Though not on Maryland Avenue, this store is just a short stroll from the waterfront in the charming Eastport neighborhood. Founded in 2014, it originally operated out of a waterman's shed but is now housed in a quaint corner shop. Brimming with top-quality nautical antiques, this store offers unique pieces — each with a story, and often connected to Maryland's maritime history.

Antiques at Annapolis (27 Riverview Ave.)

Just a short drive from downtown in West Annapolis, this expansive 7,000-square-foot antique mall is the largest in the area. With over 35 dealers spread across two levels, it's easy to get lost among the treasures, including plenty of Maryland and Chesapeake Bay antiques.

Bon Vivant Antiques and Period Furnishings (104 Annapolis St.)

Also in West Annapolis, this shop is a perfect stop for high-quality period decor. It's filled with elegant merchandise ranging from antique lighting and fine dinnerware to silver, porcelain, and crystal, ideal for adding a touch of history and sophistication to any home.

Whether you're strolling Annapolis' historic streets or diving into its unique antique shops, you'll always find something special. Its vibrant mix of history, shopping, and waterfront is a perfect blend for antique lovers who want to uncover a piece of the past.

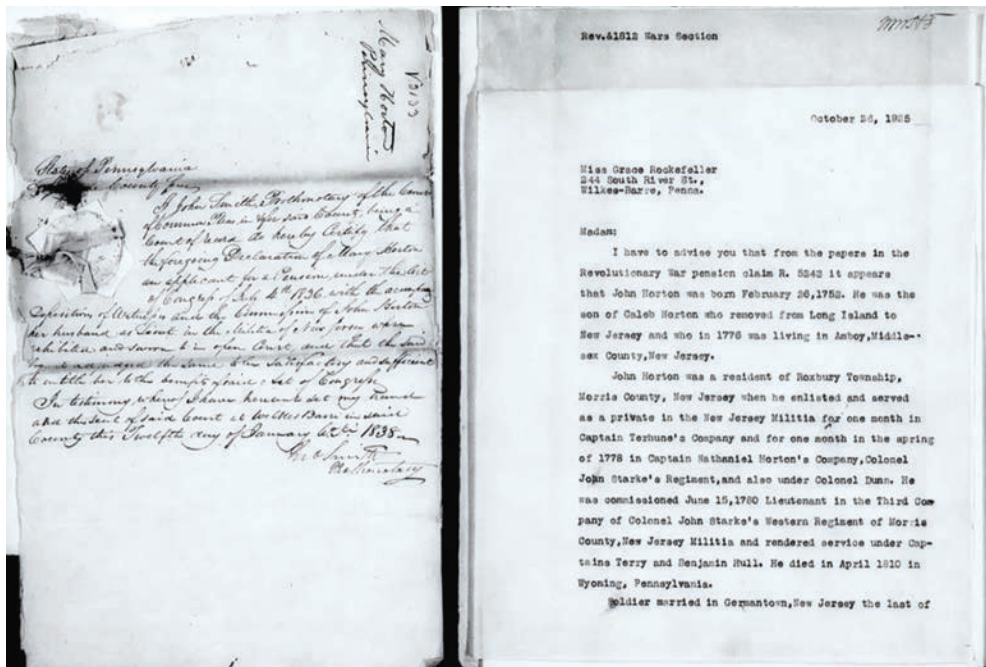

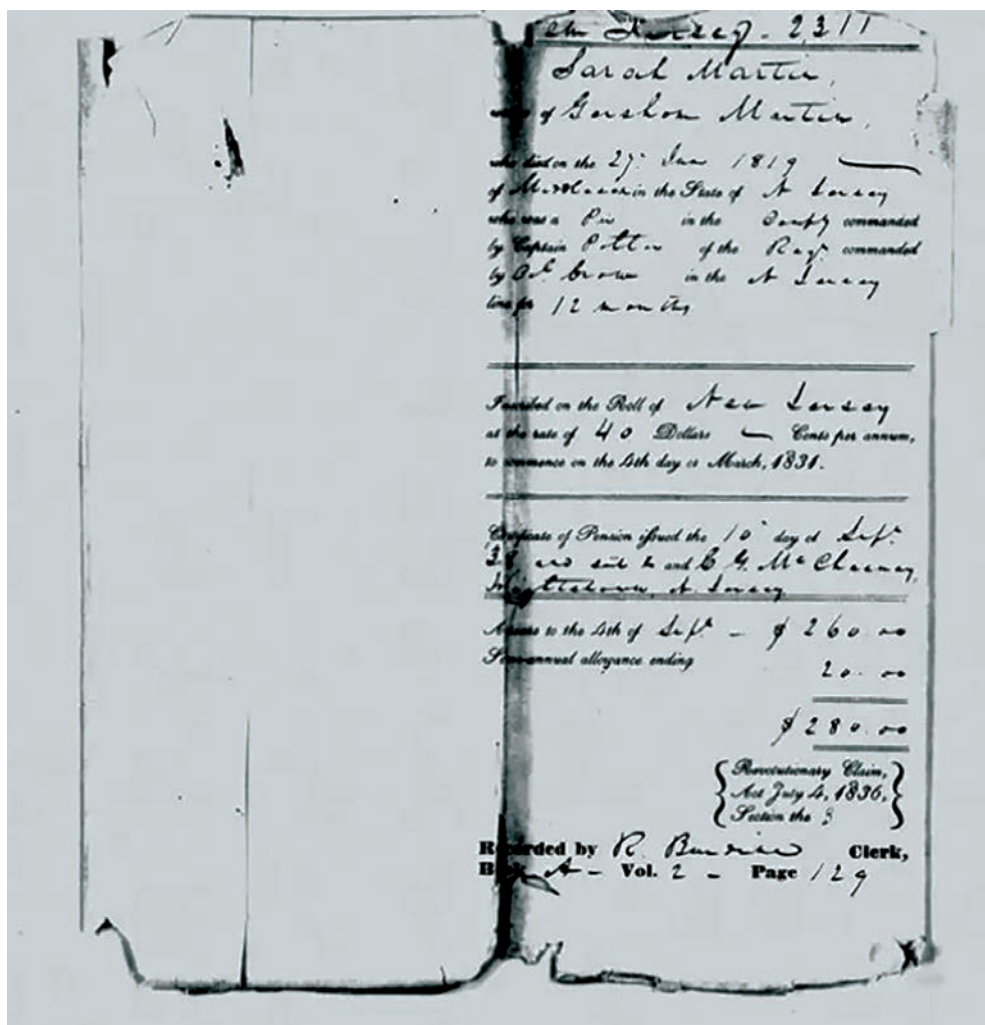
this information is stored on 2,670 microfilm reels, more than 83,000 files in all, having been photographed decades ago. But thanks to modern technology, with the completion of this project, all of the words on the page will become searchable in the Catalog, thereby making it easier to access these important American records.

But why rely on humans in this day and age? While Optical Character Recognition (OCR) and AI, in the form of Extracted Text, can be helpful, it has been noted that there are issues involved in these records that only the human eye can best interpret. Examples of these instances include pages of odd sizes and ones that have been folded or torn, as well as ink bleeds. And then there is the fact that one handwriting style is not like another and might require trial-and-error detective work.

Volunteering to participate in this patriotic transcription project begins with a user-friendly application at archives.gov. The log-in process is straightforward. Helpful information, including multiple short (and easily understood) videos, address questions, as well as providing encouragement. Volunteers are reminded that if there is something that is unclear, it is okay to mark it "illegible" and leave it for another volunteer. Because the records have been sorted by state, citizen archivists can select a state that has meaning to them, if they choose.

Most importantly, this need not necessarily be a full-time job. Citizen archivists can choose their own hours, be it a half hour a week or a whole lot more.

As an extra bonus, the stories uncovered through this work are not always "dry." Records may contain valuable details about Revolutionary War veterans and their families, such as rank, unit, and period of service, the veteran's age, residence, and date and place of marriage, and the date and place of death of his

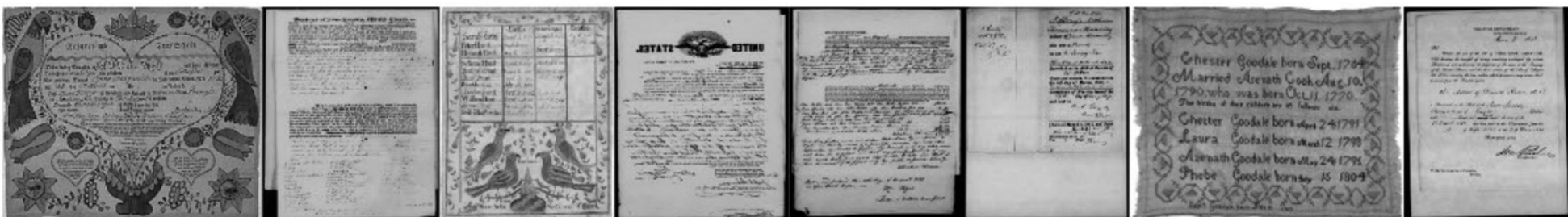
spouse. Also within these records might be copies of marriage or other family records, information pertaining to military activities, or details about soldiers' lives, along with letters, diaries, or family trees. Volunteers uncovering interesting stories are encouraged to post them through a survey linked on the project page. From there, these stories can be shared with the public through publications and social media. Isaacs and Sullivan pointed out that these newly-discovered stories might be integrated into interpretations of the Revolutionary War at properties managed by the National Park Service.

What if you want to help, but you don't count reading cursive writing among your skills? Consider reading over the transcriptions and adding tags to them, thereby enhancing searchability.

This work is, of course, on a volunteer basis, which means the only payment comes in the form of a feeling of pride and satisfaction. But come July 4, 2026, volunteers can enjoy the parade down Main Street, the backyard barbeque, and the fireworks display on the high school grounds, knowing that they have made a piece of American history accessible for future generations. archives.com

# Duck decoys and fishing lures will call to buyers at Ohio convention

INDEPENDENCE, Ohio — The Ohio Decoy Collectors and Carvers Association, and the Great Lakes Decoy Association, are holding their two shows March 15–16. “Collectors will find an outstanding selection of vintage and contemporary decoys, fish decoys, antique fishing tackle, hunting and fishing memorabilia, and wildlife art for sale throughout the weekend,” said Brad Falkenburg, ODCCA president. “Ballroom and room sales are great opportunities to buy, sell and trade.”

# Collectibles Bookends

Nouveau bookends featured organic, nature-inspired motifs like flowers and curving lines. Eventually, the bold, modern designs of Art Deco and Streamline Moderne took over, which introduced materials like aluminum, molded glass, and plastics. Bookends from the period often showcased sleek, geometric shapes and motifs such as streamlined cars and skyscrapers, reflecting the era's fascination with progress. Notable manufacturers like Donald Deskey and Rookwood Pottery, whose pieces often appeared in upscale department stores, are still some of the most sought-after bookends of the era.

World War II temporarily halted the production of decorative bookends as materials were redirected to support the war effort. After World War II, the production of decorative bookends revived as the growing suburban middle class, bolstered by the GI Bill, sought to furnish new homes. This period saw a revival of early American style, with bookends featuring traditional materials like wood and brass, evoking a sense of heritage. At the same time, modernism emerged, with designers such as Eames, Herman Miller, and Nelson experimenting with new materials like fiberglass and exotic woods like teak. Their minimalist, sleek bookends reflected the optimism of the atomic age, appealing to a new generation of consumers.

The 1970s and 1980s brought a major

shift in bookend design, moving away from the sleek, modern styles of the previous decades toward more experimental forms influenced by the cultural and technological changes of the time. Bookends from this era often featured bold geometric shapes, industrial materials, and designs inspired by the space race and the rise of computers. The materials used also changed, with plastics, acrylics, and molded resins becoming more popular. These materials were lighter, more affordable, and easier to produce, making bookends affordable for virtually any consumer. They could be found at neighborhood stores like Kmart and in catalogs from major retailers like JCPenney and Sears.

By the late 1980s, the emphasis on artistic design in bookends had waned. Most bookends from this period were imported and mass-produced from inexpensive materials. While more affordable and widely available, they lacked the craftsmanship and character of earlier examples. Nonetheless, these pieces still hold a special place for those collectors who cherish the culture of the late 20th century.

The trend of collecting bookends goes back to the 1950s, starting with a resurgence of interest in colonial and

early American antiques. By the 1980s, the focal point shifted to Victorian decor, while today, modernist bookends are the most sought-after pieces. A key reason for bookends' popularity is that they provide an affordable way to own a piece of history. Unlike large, costly furniture or fine art, bookends are small and relatively inexpensive, making them accessible to collectors on a budget. Furthermore, they offer both functionality and style, serving as practical objects that also enhance the aesthetic of a space.

While bookends can sometimes be found for \$5 or less at yard sales or thrift stores, expect to pay at least \$20 for a pair from an antique dealer or online. Several factors help them retain their value. Many antique and vintage bookends were crafted from high-quality materials such as brass, marble, or carved wood, which contribute to their enduring appeal. Even mass-produced pieces from the 1920s to the 1950s can start around \$50 due to their craftsmanship and reflection of their era. Finer vintage examples, especially those crafted by well-known makers like Stickley or Rookwood, can see auction

prices ranging from \$100 to \$500 due to strong demand. It's even relatively common for collectors to purchase a single bookend remaining from a broken, yet otherwise desirable, set. The condition also plays a critical role; well-preserved bookends in good original condition are worth significantly more than those that are badly worn, damaged, or repaired.

Whether you're an experienced collector or just starting out, collecting antique bookends is a captivating journey into both design and history. This timeless hobby allows you to preserve beautiful, well-crafted pieces while adding flair to your home. Whether you're drawn to the intricate designs of the 19th century, the sleek lines of modernism, or pop-culture pieces from the late 20th century, collecting bookends is a rewarding pursuit that will keep your books standing tall and your spaces filled with character.

If you'd like to dive into the world of bookend collecting, *The Collector's Encyclopedia of Bookends* by Kuritzky and De Costa (2005) provides an excellent overview.
