Mid-20th century ceramicists took us around the world

In 1872, when Jules Verne's "Around The World In 80 Days" first appeared in print, readers were thunderstruck. 80 days to traverse the globe? Impossible! And yet, readers couldn't get enough of the serialized adventures of Phileas Fogg, as he raced 'round the earth by rail, steamship, and even balloon, in an effort to beat the clock. Would he make it? Readers waited breathlessly for the latest translated chapters to reach American shores.

Well into the mid-20th century, much of the world remained unexplored territory for most of the world's population. Curiosity, however, continued to run rampant. Those folks from elsewhere: what did they look like? Dress like? What did we all have in common? For giftware designers of the 1940s and '50s, engaged in an ongoing quest to fill store shelves with new inventory, providing the answers to questions like these opened up a world of possibilities.

Prior to World War II, inexpensive ceramics from Europe and Asia dominated giftware sales in the states. With the onset of the war however, those production outlets were closed for export. If America wanted knickknacks, then America would have to produce its own. With clay one of the few raw elements not affected by rationing restrictions, a multitude of domestic ceramic firms sprang up, particularly on the West Coast.

Nearly every U.S. ceramic firm included at least one representative of another culture in its product line. Translating impressions of "other lands" into three-

dimensional depictions for the mass market, however, seems to have been a uniquely American undertaking. Even before the war, few European knickknacks celebrated cowboys, dance-hall girls, or other examples of stereotypical Americana. But for mid-century American ceramic designers, the globe was fair game. Among those leading the international design brigade: Betty Harrington and Hedi Schoop.

Harrington has more than 00 different international figurines to her credit. Her Madison's Ceramic Arts Studio ranks at the top of ceramic's world explorers. Some sure-fire sellers were the expected (a squadron of "Chinese Boys and Girls"; "Dutch Dancers" of assorted shapes and sizes), but other Harrington designs ventured further afield. Among the rarest of her creations: the "Temple Dancers," their precarious poses based on her research into authentic dances of the Siamese court. Although authentic, those poses meant that, with limited base support, the "Temple Dancers" often tipped over.

Harrington was a stickler for accuracy. A

detailed scrapbook, with reference illustrations and her own sketches, aided in figurine creation. As she noted in a late-in-life interview:

"Whenever I got an idea that I thought was worth doing in clay, I'd make a sketch of it. Pencil sketches in my scrapbook date back some seventy years. For historical themes I spent a lot of time in the library looking at costumes. I thought it was nice to

20th Century Cincinnati turns the big 3-0

SHARONVILLE, Ohio — The highly-anticipated 20th Century Cincinnati modernism show returned to the Sharon-ville Convention Center near Cincinnati Feb. 21-23. This year the show celebrated a special milestone— its 30th running — securing its place as the nation's top-billed and longest-running vintage modern expo.

What began as a small gathering of modernist design enthusiasts from the Cincinnati area has grown over three decades and two owners into the nation's premier modernist design show. Now showcasing material culture from the Art Deco era to the 1980s computer age, the event gives special recognition to contributions from the Midwest. Each year, guests are treated to an expanding collection of vintage décor, chic art, modernist furniture, pop-culture artifacts, postwar housewares, and funky fashion, with something for every taste and budget.

In celebration of this year's milestone, promoters revealed a 30th-anniversary

multimedia exhibit featuring a timeline of the show's history alongside Cincinnati's mid-century modern contributions. Highlights included limited-edition mer-

chandise by Cristina Bottia of the Design Museum of Chicago and a display of vintage Moto Guzzi motorcycles from Cadre Cycle in Cincinnati. The event also introduced a new partnership with the Simon Kingston Foundation, which supports emerging local artists.

Also rolled out this year were luxury VIP packages, offering a select few guests the "ultimate mid-century modern weekend." The packages included a two-night stay in a luxury suite at the 21C Hotel in downtown Cincinnati, full weekend passes to the show, exclusive VIP events, and gift cards for local dining and services.

The popular Mid Mod Mixer returned Friday night, offering early shopping and a chance to mingle with dealers and guests in a relaxed atmosphere, complete with complimentary champagne and




selves contending with yet another volume.

visiting during regular hours, guests enjoyed a 40,000-square-foot exhibition hall filled with more than 70 dealers. Reflecting the show's success, many of those dealers have been returning for years. One fixture at the show, Illinois' 29 Palms, had their usual huge booth with a curated selection of desirable items, ranging from top-tier furniture to popular swung vases with modest prices. Another returning favorite was Matthew Gosch Antiques from North Tonawanda, N.Y., who brought a highly-coveted Witco tiki bar, complete with stools, for \$2,400. Jim Linz's Deco-Rations, a familiar face from the DC area, brought plenty of gleaming Art Deco and Streamline Moderne to contrast with the exotic woods so common to mid-century modern. His 1930s chrome John Vassos RCA Victor "Special" phonograph (\$2,595) caught plenty of attention.

While longtime dealers created a sense of the familiar, the show's strong reputation also attracted a number of new vendors. Many of them signed up simply based on word of mouth, without ever having attended before. Alix Korda, owner of Columbus-based Your Hip Grandma, was one of them. Despite never having visited the show, she took the leap to set up a booth. Her space held a stunning selection of items, including a pair of Milo Baughman-style Jydsk Mobelfabrik mid-century rosewood case chairs for \$2,500 and a rosewood cabinet by Egon Ostergaard for \$545.

Hailing from the outskirts of Lansing, Mich., former roller derby star Carmen Weatherbee (aka Carmen Slam Diego)

made her debut at the show — her very first time exhibiting anywhere! But there was no trace of inexperience in her booth, which boasted a selection of mid-century furniture, including a pair of Bassett Gondola chairs, professionally reupholstered in NOS fabric, priced at \$3,250 for the pair.

Ty Travers, also known as Tonka Ty from Illinois, was another fresh face at the show, offering a unique mix of merchandise. A well-known collector of cars, motorcycles, and vintage toys, his booth showcased automobilia, radios, and toys from the 1940s to the 1970s. "I'm so impressed with this show," he said, adding, "I've seen pieces here I've never seen before."

Some newcomers had a bit of history with the show, like David Carter of Chicago's Pegboard Modern. He'd been

attending for years and, as he shared, "I gave a hand to a fellow dealer last year to get a dealer's perspective." This year, he was ready to jump in, offering pieces like a Bertolli child's chair by Knoll (\$475) and a Saarinen tulip side table (\$450).

Thanks to its vibrant community of dealers, supporters, and attendees, along with the hard work of the promoters, 20th Century Cincinnati has become a true institution in the Midwest's vintage scene. Cheers to 30 years of celebrating modernism and its enduring influence — here's to 30 more!

If you weren't able to attend this year's anniversary show, mark your calendar for next year - 20th Century Cincinnati is held annually on the third weekend of February. For more info, head to queencityshows.com.

ing to subject and author, not appearance, seems to me a better option.

Looking for inspiration to decorate using vintage items? No need to buy a new book: Check out the primary sources, both mid-century books and magazines. I have a few examples on my bookshelves. As an aside, I have yet to see any mention of how, during that time period, young adults on a budget fashioned their own makeshift bookshelves using wooden boards and cinder blocks. This omission is probably a good thing, just saying.

Next topic.

It seems that some modern crafters are reviving an age-old hobby, that of bookbinding. With X-Acto knife in hand, and with a pot of glue and recycled cardboard and fabric on the side, old books are being given a second lease on life. Just an internet search away are a number of instructive videos that demonstrate steps that can transform a paperback book into a hardcover one.

I have mixed feelings about this. On the one hand, anything to get a book into someone's hands, for whatever reason, is good. And this might save some reader's copies of paperbacks

are any number of collectable vintage paperbacks that are appreciated for their cover art, and they should be left

Finally, a look back at last year's book sales on AbeBooks, an online marketplace that connects buyers and sellers of used, rare, and out-of prints around the globe. Topping the 2024 list is a collection of four different first-edition UK impressions of J.K. Rowling's "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone." The third most expensive sale ever on AbeBooks, the set was sold by "First and Fine" for \$105,700.

And it was a good year for those of us who were English majors in college. "Peter Harrington Books" sold "Moby-Dick; or The Whale" by Herman Melville for \$87,650. Published in 1851, this American first edition was an expanded version of the earlier British first edition.

California-based "Biblioctopus" reported the sale of a collection of works by George Gordon Byron (familiarly known as "Lord Byron") for \$80,000; among the first editions sold was one of "Childe Harold's Pilgrimage."

And for \$40,000, "Burnside Rare Books" sold a rare copy from the first American edition of "Frankenstein; or the Modern Prometheus," printed 15 years after the first British edition. Adding to its appeal is the fact that author Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley's last name was misspelled.

Auction records abounded at Crocker Farm sale of Wahler collection

SPARKS, Md. — To define collector, curator, dealer, and scholar Dr. Carole Wahler's (1937-2023) importance to the history of American ceramics; specifically Tennessee pottery, is a tad intimidating, but Crocker Farm afforded the uninformed the best visual representation of all that Wahler accomplished with the selling of the majority of her vast collection during their Winter 2025 event held January 22-31. Both online and live bidding took place and the results; well they were record-breaking.

The catalog listings Crocker Farm puts together for any of their sales are wonderful. They outdid themselves for the Wahler event. What a spectacular reference tool!

The catalog included the following homage to Wahler, "As an ambitious collector, Dr. Carole Carpenter Wahler (1937-2023) amassed a vast assemblage of seminal examples of American ceramics spanning the Southern states and beyond. In terms of depth, breadth, and quality, her collection has few rivals past or present. As a guest curator, Wahler established herself as the recognized authority on Tennessee stoneware and redware while drawing deserved national attention to the state's rich ceramic tradition. As a dealer, she was a pioneer in the field of American primitive antiques, becoming an early specialist in stoneware. And as a scholar, Carole Wahler's painstaking research has forever shaped our understanding of stoneware and redware, fleshed out in books, articles, and her landmark collection."

The top lot came as no surprise and yes, set a world auction record for Tennessee pottery. Hammered at \$90,000 against a pre-sale estimate of \$25,000 to \$40,000 was the circa 1895 salt-glazed stoneware face harvest jug inscribed, "The Hon. Fred Dougless" and stamped "J.A. ROBERTS / COOKEVILLE / POTTERY / TENN / 25 CTS," on the reverse and "Negro" on the underside. This ovoid form jug stood 11 inches tall and boasted individually-thrown and applied spouts on the front and reverse shoulder as well as a handle modeled in the form of a square tree branch with incised bark. The clay face was created via hand-modeled and applied clay. It must be noted the fact the jug was stamped with a price "25 CTS" is not the norm and suggests the piece may have been displayed for sale at a local event. Prices include a buyer's premium.

The catalog listing further said, "Regarded as Roberts's masterwork, this jug was likely made to commemorate abolitionist, Frederick Douglass, upon his death in 1895. Only a handful of face jugs by this potter are known. The sculptural quality, fine condition, and large impressed maker's mark found on Roberts's Frederick Douglass jug place it among the finest face vessels known from the state of Tennessee. However, its extraordinary inscription honoring America's most prominent abolitionist establish this work as one of the most historically significant pieces of American stoneware known."

A world auction record for a piece of Upstate South Carolina stoneware was also set this day. An alkaline-glazed stoneware jug inscribed "Aug the 30 / 1864 / Maid an Sold at / A low price fore Confedrent / Money by me Thomas Ownbey," for Thomas Owenby, Union District, S.C., realized \$78,000. The ovoid jug stood 14 inches tall, had a thin strap handle and a surface covered in a glossy, olive-green alkaline glaze. Thought to be one of the most famous examples of South Carolina stoneware made outside of the state's Edgefield District, the inscription poked fun at the value of the Confederate dollar near the end of the Civil War.

This was the jug Wahler coveted most and eventually acquired because it was part of Georgeanna Greer's collection; a woman whom Wahler admired. The catalog notes, "Previously owned by legendary collector, Georgeanna Greer, this jug was

the top lot in the first sale of her pottery at Harmer Rooke Galleries in New York on November 18, 1992, bringing a total of \$18,150, including buyer's premium. In an unsent letter written to Greer in March 1990, Carole Wahler stated, "Tve always told my husband if I could pick just one of Georgeanna's Southern pieces it would probably be [this] jug," and her acquisition of it at the 1992 Greer sale speaks to her high regard for this object."

A5-gallon lidded stoneware water cooler standing 18.5 inches tall and created by John Floyd at the Grave Pottery in Knox county, Tenn., in 1857 also made a statement when it sold for \$84,000 (est. \$20,000-\$30,000). Inscribed "Made by Jn Floyd / June 30 1857 / Knox Couty(sic) Tenn," this ovoid cooler had two ribbed vertical handles applied at the shoulder, and an individually thrown and applied bunghole in the form of a jug spout. The shoulders of the cooler were decorated with an incised and cobalt-highlighted design of a flower with hollow details to the blossom.

Redware was another passion of Wahler's and her collection offered up some beauties; specifically a glazed redware jar with elaborate manganese brushwork stamped "HAUN" for Christopher Alexander Haun of Greene County, Tenn. This ovoid jar created sometime between 1840 and 1860 had a footed base, tall collar with a flattened rim and heavily-ribbed

strap handles with loads of impressed asterisk decoration to the terminals. Arching manganese brushstrokes against an olive ground with orange spotting decorated the jar's surface. A bid of \$42,000; a world auction record for the potter, won this piece.

Another glazed ovoid redware jar presenting with a dipped manganese surface stamped "J. A. LOWE" for John Alexander Lowe of Green County, Tenn., did well bringing \$54,000.

The catalog added, "Lowe operated a pottery in Greene County near the Harmon Cemetery, where hundreds of shards bearing his maker's mark have been excavated. He is perhaps most well-known as an associate of the artistic potter and Union sympathist, Christopher Alexander Haun (1821-1861). Haun was hanged by the Confederate army on December 11, 1861 for participating in the burning of the Lick Creek railroad bridge, one of nine strategic bridges that President Lincoln had encouraged the destruction of. One of two surviving letters written by Haun to his wife, Elizabeth, while imprisoned before his execution names 'Low,' presumably John Alexander Lowe, as one of three potters to 'finish off that ware' to sell after his death. Lowe's work strongly resembles that of Haun's, suggesting he apprenticed under him. Both potters used related jar forms, coggled maker's marks, and handle constructions with impressed treatments. Lowe enlisted in the Confederate Army only two days after Haun's hanging. Like so many other potters of the period, he progressively moved west; in 1865, he was living in Indiana and by 1880 he had moved to Arkansas, where he would live the remainder of his life."

Also a North Carolina glazed redware jar inscribed "Henry Watkins / 1852" (either from Guilford or Randolph County) came in at \$31,200. This jar is one of only a few signed examples known by this potter; a Quaker.

A 17 inch tall Alabama alkaline-glazed

stoneware torso jug inscribed "W" created sometime between 1850 and 1880 sold for \$57,000. An alkaline-glazed stoneware face harvest jug from the Edgefield District of South Carolina, whose face included kaolin eyes with almond-shaped lids brought \$51,000 and an over-sized Presentation Ring jug wearing cobalt decoration and inscribed "Samuel Davault / June 25 / 1896" attributed to the Decker Pottery of Washington County, Tenn., sold for \$26,400. Created sometime between 1872 and 1910, this wheel-thrown, ring-shaped form is, according to Crocker Farm, "the largest 19th century American stoneware ring jug that we are aware of as well as the only documented cobalt-decorated example of the form by the Decker family."



have costume designs of different eras and different countries, and I had to be sure that I was at least 'sort of' right on what would be accepted as proper. The most important thing is to have a clear image in your mind before you start production."

Hedi Schoop was also accomplished in the production of foreign costume figurines, although more limited in her ethnic scope. A native of Switzerland, Schoop, with her husband, composer Frederick Hollander, fled Nazi Germany in the early 1930s. Hollander's career writing music for the movies gave him the wherewithal to initially bankroll Schoop's foray into ceramics.

Schoop's early studies in dance and fashion design carried over into her work as a ceramist. Schoop figurines often appear caught in motion — arms extended, skirts aflutter, heads bowed — but that motion is fluid and unhurried. Rough and incised textures combine with smooth ones; colorful glossy glazes contrast with bisque. Her subjects seem captured at a specific moment

In homage to Schoop's Swiss heritage, it's only natural that her figural lineup would contain assorted barefoot "Tyrolean Girls," and peasant-bloused, laced-bodiceclad "Mountain Maidens." Others earning repeat visits: interpretations of Dutch and Chinese couples. Broadened horizons resulted in Schoop renderings of Caribbean market women, and, from India, sari-clad water-bearers.

When it came to secondary uses, Hedi Schoop international figurines covered all the bases. There were Hedi Schoop figural flower-holders, planters, wall pockets, candlesticks, bowls, ashtrays, candy servers, and even soap dishes. Thanks to that added marketability, Hedi Schoop became the most commercially successful California ceramics designer of the World War II/postwar period, and certainly the most ubiquitous.

Although Betty Harrington and Hedi Schoop were the most prolific ceramic designers taking the world tour, their contemporaries also brought unique perspectives to envisioning inhabitants of other lands. Here's just a handful of California notables:

Florence Ceramics. Florence Ward's delicately detailed figurines are noted for their elaborate costuming. French and Chinese characterizations were among her favored subjects. Regardless of country of origin, the facial features of Florence figurines remain remarkably similar (and are much like those of the artist herself).

Joy Thompson. Produced in limited quantities, each hand-decorated Thompson ceramic is literally "one-of-a-kind." Languid and long-limbed, Thompson's vine-draped,

flower-bedecked figurines are quite deliberately of non-specific Asian or mythic European heritage.

Copa de Oro. The work of ceramist Mary Jane Hart, these fanciful figurines of terra cotta or white clay are noted for their gold ornamentation and applied hand-made flowers. Due to the detailed work involved, these were costly even in their day. Hart's international figures, like Joy Thompson's, are indeterminately Asian.

Walter Wilson/McCarty Brothers. Although many exquisite international figurines bear the mark or label "Walter Wilson," it's unclear whether he actually designed the pieces, or simply manufactured and distributed the work of others. What is known is that the McCarty Brothers, Lee and Willard, whose ethnic figurines Wilson distributed in the early 1940s, later successfully struck out on their own. McCarty works, both before and after the separation, are remarkably similar. Wilson's work varied, perhaps dependent on his firm's roster of designers.

Will-George. Famed for their flamingos, the three Climes brothers who comprised this partnership proved equally adept at figural design. Often their figurines were part of a console set: a narrow bowl "boat," for example, accompanied by Chinese oarsmen, a seated maiden, and bambooleaf candleholders.

Ceramic designers of the 1940s and '50s fashioned figurines that ran the global gamut. Thanks to their creative ingenuity, the buying public of the time received a no-limits passport; they could explore the world without ever leaving home. Today, we can encircle the globe in far less time than Jules Verne's 80 days, but the thrill remains. Ceramics of this wide and wonderful world send us on a journey to parts unknown. . .a journey that continues to beckon and enthrall.
