Nutting's furniture reproductions are now antiques in their own right

In the world of antiques and collectibles, there are several "dirty words" for buyers and sellers alike. But in the case of one line of furniture and accessories, the fact that they are "reproductions" is a sign of high-quality workmanship and fidelity to original design. And, as it happens, these benchmade pieces were produced under the direction of a man best known for his hand-colored photographs.

Most people associate Wallace Nutting with his thousands of framed pictures that illustrated romanticized views of New England. Capturing bucolic scenes, Nutting's intent was to freeze in time a landscape unmarred by paved roads and telephone poles. But Nutting's interest in preserving the past did not stop there.

Born in 1861 in Rock Bottom, Mass., Wallace Nutting was still an infant when his father Albion, a Union soldier in the Civil War, was killed in battle. With her young son and his older sister in tow, Wallace's mother Elizabeth returned to Maine to live with her family.

Growing up, Nutting was welleducated, attending Phillips Exeter Academy and graduating from Harvard University in 1887. The following year, he married Mariet Griswold, a wealthy widow. With a Doctor of Divinity degree, Nutting, a Congregational minister, served a string of parishes across the country until he was overcome with anxiety. Pointing to the pressures of preparing sermons, Nutting stepped back from the ministry in 1904 to pursue his growing interest in photography. When the couple settled in Southbury, Conn., the following year, he opened an in-home photography studio. Seven years later, in 1912, they relocated to Framingham, Mass., at their new home, which they named "Nuttingholme," his photography

business grew and flourished. With a keen eye for business (as well as a pretty picture), Nutting captured scenes on glass plates that were then printed, hand tinted, and named with titles intended to appeal to New England farmers

appeal to New England farmers.

period. To furnish these rooms, Nutting began collecting what Michael Ivankovich

It wasn't long before Nutting's quest for preservation, as well as his visionary impulses, expanded beyond photographing pretty landscapes. Intrigued with the Colonial Revival, Nutting widened his lens and focused on capturing images of well-appointed home interiors. Recreating these historically-inspired domestic scenes for posterity (not to mention for sale), Wallace painstakingly decorated rooms in his "Chain of Colonial Houses," five Nutting houses in the Greater Boston area, each one exemplifying a unique period. To furnish these rooms, Nutting began collecting what Michael Ivankovich

called "the finest forms of chairs, stools, shelves, benches, tables, mirrors, dressers, beds, desks, and clocks," as well as "most other furniture forms," all dating from the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries. All of this was made possible, thanks to Wallace's vision and Mariet's wealth, according to Ivankovich, a longtime Nutting enthusiast and collector.

Mechanical bank pockets a \$1,050 bid at Tom Hall

SCHNECKSVILLE, Pa. — On Feb. 27, Tom Hall Auctions hosted a unique online event on Hi-Bid, featuring a carefully curated selection of 51 lots. The sale highlighted antique cast-iron banks and early 18th-century Gaudy Dutch pottery as the main attractions. This intriguing mix made for an exciting auction, especially for collectors interested in those niche treasures.

Nine vintage cast-iron mechanical banks were offered, two of which pulled the auction's highest sums. A Shepherd Hardware cast-iron "Leap-Frog" example set the bar at \$1,050. Measuring 7.5 by 5 by 3.5 inches, it was marked with a patent date of September for a Shepherd Hardware "Leap 15, 1891. It functioned though not Frog" mechanical bank. perfectly, and showed age-related wear. Coming in second was a 10 by 2.75 by 7-inch J & E Stevens "Darktown Batters" model featuring a baseball batter and catcher. While it had several flaws, including cracks in the casting and was marked as damaged, it caught \$800.





Picking up a tidy \$460 was a castiron "Kicking Donkey in the Barn" bank. The 8.25 by 3.5 by 5.25-inch piece, patented August 3, 1880, featured a donkey that would jump into a barn. It was in working condition but missing its stopper and showing some wear. Coming in a bit lower, at \$320, was a J & E Stevens "William Tell" model that would shoot a penny from a rifle. The 10.25 by 3.75 by 6.75-inch piece was patented June 23 1896 and showed only paint wear. Another J & E Stevens piece — an unnamed one in the shape of a mansard-roofed house - reached \$300. This one, patented October 22, 1872, featured a butler

with a tray greeting the user upon opening the front door. It was in good shape with only age-related paint loss.

The lowest bid for a mechanical bank, at \$200, went for a J & E Tammany piece that portrayed a seated man who puts a penny in his pocket and nods his head. It was complete with its stopper but had paint loss throughout.

In addition to the mechanical banks, two multipiece lots of still banks were offered. The first batch, which went for \$30, featured six promotional pieces: a bronze Forty Fort State Bank by Milt Lenowitz, two Easton National

Bank and Trust Company editions shaped like their building, an Old Ironsides & USS Constitution double-sided ship, a possibly silver-plated piggy bank, and a square Merchant's National Bank tin model that counted the change. Each was missing its keys. The second lot, which went for \$20, contained seven Banthrico vehicle banks,

Flamingos have been decorating our yards for 80 years

Modern American society may one day be judged on the social icons it collects. Among these will be the cheap, plastic flamingos that have sprung up everywhere in lawns and gardens and have become an icon of American pop culture.

The history of pink yard flamingos began in 1946 when Union Products of Fitchburg, Mass., first manufactured "Plastics for the Lawn." Among the many animals homeowners could purchase were ducks, frogs, dogs, and, yes, flamingos (early in their history labeled Flamingo Plasticus, Latin for "plastic flamingo"). These earliest yard ornaments were twodimensional, making for rather cardboard appearances in the yard. That changed in 1956 when Union Products hired Don Featherstone.

Union Plastics hired Featherstone, a serious art student and sculpture, to redesign its yard products into threedimensional objects of plastic-realism, beginning with their most popular animal — Charlie the Duck. The company

made social history when it assigned Featherstone the task of redesigning its yard flamingo.

National Geographic for his models, and, from them, he made an original clay model sculpture. His clay model was used Featherstone used pictures out of by Union Products to make a plaster cast,

which was then used to create aluminum molds for plastic flamingos. Featherstone originally designed the birds to have detailed wooden legs (that showed the bird's unique elbow joints), but Union

each representing a different financial firm.

Then came the Gaudy Dutch Pottery, brightly decorated earthenware made in England for the American market in the early 1800s. Thirty-four lots were presented, with the top bid of \$725 going for a circa 1840 sunflower-pattern teapot, complete with its lid. Measuring 10.25 by 5.75 by 5.25 inches, the teapot bore a vibrant floral and butterfly design in orange, blue, green, and yellow. It was in good condition, with only minor scratches and

Two circa 1840 butterfly-pattern plates each sold for \$480. Both measured 9 7/8 inches in diameter; one featured a hand-painted butterfly surrounded by florals, while the other had the butterfly positioned toward the top. Both were in good shape with only minor use-related wear. Also fetching \$480 was a double rose-pattern sugar bowl with its lid. This circa 1840 piece,


decorated in vivid blue, red, orange, and green, measured 4.75 by 5 by 3.5 inches and featured lion's head handles and a fluted floral lid. It was in good condition, except for a small nick in the lid.

Later, a butterfly pattern cup and saucer set rang up \$340. The pair, featuring a hand-painted floral and butterfly motif, showed minor imperfections and moderate wear. Another cup and saucer set pulled only half of that at \$150. The circa 1840 single rose pattern, featuring floral and vine motifs in cobalt blue, red, orange, and green, showed no chips, cracks, or repairs. Bids on Gaudy pieces bottomed out at \$35 for yet another 1840s single rose cup and saucer. It had floral and foliage details in cobalt blue and orange and showed age-related crackling in the glaze.

A small handful of artworks and collectibles filled out the auction. A highlight was a framed Penn State jersey signed by legendary coach Joe Paterno that brought in \$90. An abstract tapestry by Israeli artist Moshe Monson landed a modest \$55. The hand-woven piece, measuring 58 by 43 inches, featured vibrant geometric shapes in a rich mix of colors, was signed by the

artist, and came with display hooks on the back. Coming close at \$50 was an original oil painting by Ann Elizabeth Schlegel. The 41.5 by 34.75-inch painting, set in an ornate red and silver frame, depicted the Nazareth National Bank in Pennsylvania. One lucky bidder acquired for just \$5 a 69 by 49.5-inch abstract textile resembling a quilt with a grid of colorful geometric shapes in red, blue, purple, and orange, set against a muted background.

Flamingos

Products decided the cost of production was too high, so they substituted straight metal rods for legs, and these same metal rods are still used today. Union Product's pink flamingo was officially born in 1957.

Luckily for Union Products, the 1950s proved the perfect era in which to unveil such a worthless trinket. Eisenhower was president, the word "beatnik" was coined, and Velcro was patented in Switzerland. During this same period, bright, bold colors were in designer vogue, and America was moving to new housing tracts in the suburbs. Advertisers convinced Americans that a natural lawn was one that was treated with chemicals and mowed, and all lawns needed a lawn ornament. In stepped the brightly colored pink plastic flamingo. These flamingos quickly became accessory pieces to homes that prized pink refrigerators, pink washing machines, and, thanks to Elvis, pink Cadillacs.

Sadly for the pink flamingo, love children of the 1960s labeled the pink flamingo the stereotype of everything that was bad and distasteful in America. Plastic was out and nature was in, so shockingly pink flamingos became the epitome of bad taste in America. By the 1970s, pink flamingos were considered "trailer trash" trophies, and people placed them in their yards simply to "bug" their neighbors. More than one fight ensued over these kitschy, pink birds.

The true turning point in the life of plastic pink flamingos seems to be the early



1980s. College students across America made the gross-out flick Pink Flamingos a cult film. This inspired people to rethink their opinions of pink flamingos, especially when rich hotels and casinos where using the pink flamingo motif. The premier of Miami Vice on television in 1984 moved pink flamingos from trailer trash lawn junk to true yard art.

1985 marked the first year that Union Products sold more pink flamingos than any other yard animal, including its famous duck. And, today, these cheap plastic pink flamingos are sold for every purpose known to "civilized" man, including wedding decorations, reindeer replacements at Christmas, house warming gifts, and even nativity scenes. And some people actually travel with their pink flamingos, taking the plastic birds camping, skiing, and even on European vacations.

The pink yard ornament has also grown to be one of the most stolen items in America, where every year thousands are stolen from vards and gardens. Some pink flamingos have even been kidnapped and




held for ransom. And, to directly flout laws banning pink flamingos in yards, Union Products introduced blue flamingos.


If you wish to collect the authentic bird, look for Don Featherstone's signature beneath the bird's tail feathers.

A flock of flamingos is actually known as a "pat.'

Human's love for flamingos may be traced all the way back to ancient Egypt. A prominent and easily recognized symbol of Egyptian hieroglyphics is the flamingo symbol (dsr in Egyptian) that literally means "red." Egyptians used the flamingo symbol often, showing their love for the color and the exotic bird. Others, over the vears, have also shown their love for this loveliest of all God's creatures, making some flamingo items quite valuable to collect.

Flamingo items worth collecting include casino chips, cookie jars (one by Metlox now sells for over \$600), cut crystal flamingos by famous glass artists like Swarovski, hand-blown glass finials and other flamingos that sell for over \$100 each, and a great pink potpourri of other flamingo collectibles. For the true pink procurer, there are trash cans bearing flamingo pictures, decks of cards, art work from Alice in Wonderland,





"Pink Flamingo" bubble bath containers, Mojolica flamingos, beautiful porcelain pieces (such as Will George's "Flamingo and Dish"), and even flamingo cigarette lighters.

With each passing year, more and more items are manufactured as flamingo items, making the availability of pink flamingo collectibles seemingly inexhaustible, and the love of pink forever in the blood of 1950s collectors.

Buick Flying Goddess blew to \$1,500 at auction

JACKSON, Mich. — A lovely goddess easily won first place at a recent online auction by Holler & Hammer Auction Company. A 1933 Buick Flying Goddess hood ornament radiator cap measuring roughly 7 by 4 by 4 inches swooped in to take the honor.

The Flying Goddess was designed by Casimer Cislo while employed at Ternstedt Manufacturing, who designed automotive trim such as door handles and gas caps. She was initially sculpted nude except for a billowing scarf to memorialize Isadora Duncan, a scandalous bohemian dancer. One fall evening in 1927 in France, Duncan was a passenger in an automobile owned by a French mechanic. She wore a flowing hand-painted silk scarf, which was a gift. The scarf became tangled in the open-spoked rear wheel of the speeding car, which pulled her from the open vehicle and snapped her neck. This sculpture of Duncan was made to be at home on an automobile. She had seen better days because of exposure to various weather conditions, but she still held her own as the most beautiful piece on the auction block. Flying through the air with grace and beauty, this vintage piece would be stunning to find her home again on a Buick. It took a bid of \$1,500 to take this beauty home with you.

Need an oil change? All automobiles do, sooner or later. But don't be too hasty in throwing away those old empty oil cans. A Transport 3000 Mile Graphited 2-gallon motor oil can brought a very respectable price. This one sported a brilliantly colored can. The yellow background made the red lettering and mostly red truck displayed on the front command attention. It had a


blue stripe almost on the bottom with more red lettering, ensuring the user knew this was 3000-mile oil. It showed signs of age along the top, but the graphics were still eye-catching. This one sold for an impressive bid of \$550.


Another can from the past sold for \$325. This one was an Edelweiss light beer quart can. It had a cone top and said "Schoenhofen, Edelweiss, Chicago" on it. It measured almost 4 by 7 inches and was in highgrade condition. "A case of good judgment" was printed in white on top of a red strip, ensuring the buyer was buying the best.

A Sunoco advertising piece sold for \$250. This 5-gallon Dynalube Heavy Duty Motor Oil can featured yellow coloring, making a canvas for the oil's name, which stood out with simple black lettering. This was a great display piece.

Most people associate the Jaguar name with high quality and high dollar. Another motor oil can with that name proudly emblazoned across the top kept the high dollar prices coming. This 100-percent pure virgin motor oil Therm-X can held 2 gallons of

the distinctive brand. It was stamped with "Commack, NY" and sported an almost two-dimensional-looking jaguar head that appeared to command attention with its position in the exact center of the can. It took a bid of \$275 to claim this vintage treasure as your own.

A collection of spark plugs attracted a lot of interest. These were sold in lots, and each had various brands. Selling for \$250, were 30 spark plugs, including Meaker, Leonard, Champion, and a priming plug. But upping the ante a bit were 27 early spark plugs from the 1900s-1920s. Auburn, Browne, Stewart, Mosler, Poky, Rex, Splitdorf, and Mor were in this grouping. They brought a high bid price of \$300. Yet topping them all were a grouping of 28 early spark plugs. This one consisted of Mosler, Champion, Rentz, Bosco with the primer, Jumbo, Auburn and more. They were sold for the impressive bid price of \$375.



Hull Pottery Association host meet April 12 in Oklahoma

GLENPOOL, Okla. — The Hull Pottery Association (HPA) will host its regional show and sale on Saturday April 12. The event will be held at Frankoma Pottery in Glenpool. The show is free and open to the public.

The one-day show will feature dealers from around the country and hundreds of pieces of Hull Pottery for sale. Other American made pottery will also be for sale. The public will get the chance to learn more about Hull Pottery, HPA and meet longtime dealers and collectors. Additionally, guests will be able to see and learn more about Frankoma Pottery (Frankomapottery.com), an Oklahoma based pottery found in 1933 known for its use of Oklahoma clay and unique glazes.

The mission of HPA is to preserve, promote and educate the public about Hull Pottery.

Hull Pottery began production in 1905 in Crooksville, Ohio, under the leadership of Addis Emmet (A.E.) Hull. The company's early lines consisted of common utilitarian stoneware, semi-porcelain dinnerware and decorative tile. Hull continued production in Crooksville for the next several decades. During that time, the company introduced dozens of different lines including artistic/ decorative lines, cookie jars, dinnerware, planters and novelty pieces. Hull even survived a flood/fire in the 1950s. In the late 1960s through the mid-1980s, the company changed its production from artistic lines to predominately House 'n' Garden serving ware and Imperial florist ware. Hull Pottery closed in 1986. HPA is celebrating its 32nd anniversary in 2025. Learn more at Hullpotteryassociation.org

Sticking with the automobile theme, the 1920s - 1930s ensured the vehicles had some prominent class. They dressed them up in various ways, hoping to grab the potential buyer's attention to get them to buy their brand. A grouping of three uranium glass car shift knobs would help to accomplish this task. Measuring only 2 inches in diameter, these would glow as the vehicle was racing down the road and be great attention-getters. This grouping of three sold for an impressive \$275.

A collection of Buzzzz The Motorcycle News magazines from 1949 was missing only one issue, from June of that year. The other 11magazines were in good shape and would provide some interesting reading material while taking the reader on a trip down memory lane—the magazines sold for

In days gone by, businesses had a door push sign on the screen door, which helped to protect the door from having the screen pushed out. A Canada Dry Spur metal door push sign reminded those entering the establishment to pick up their cold drink before they left. This small tin embossed sign measured only 4 by 12 inches and advertised the Canada Dry drink for only five cents. However, it took a lot more than that to become the owner of this sign. It wasn't marked sold until the hammer went down on a bid of \$225.

A glass game advertising panel from a 1920s fortune teller boasted that "she knows all the answers." The panel was reverse-painted and showed that it only cost one penny to find out what you needed to know. It measured a bit over 9 by 18 inches. The graphics were still in good shape and the writing was very readable. There was a list of questions to pick from running down the left side, such as "Will I get a job?" "Am I going to travel?" and "What are my lucky numbers?". She knew all the answers as long as one deposited that penny and picked from that list of questions. This unique piece was in demand and it wasn't pronounced sold until it reached a final bid



Forget the luck of the Irish, rub a Billiken's feet

Florence Pretz of Kansas City, Mo., an American art teacher and illustrator, created Billiken charm dolls. In interviews, Pretz claimed the idea for the mysterious, elf-like Billiken came to her in a dream, and in 1908 she patented the Billiken figure and started marketing his

Billiken's pointed ears, mischievous smile, and tuft of topknot hair on his pointed head make him immediately recognizable. His arms are short and he is usually sitting with his legs stretched out in front of him so that believers can rub his oversized, lucky feet.

Billiken's name was adopted by the distributors of the doll, the Billiken Company of Chicago. In 1909 Billiken banks and statuettes were manufactured followed by Billiken dolls the next year. At the same time the Times Publishing Company (Seattle) sold small Billikens as a publicity stunt for the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition.

Supposedly, the Billiken was named after the then, newly elected, President of the United States, William Howard Taft. And legend has it that anyone touching the Billiken will receive good luck and inner peace.

After only a few brief years of popularity, like many other fad toys, the Billiken faded into obscurity. Today, collectors best remember Billikens.

The Billiken rose to prominence during the height of the "Mind-Cure" craze in the United States at the start of the 20th century. Billikens represented the "no worry" ideal, and they were very popular. Variations appeared, such as the "Teddy-Billiken Doll" and the Billycan/Billycan't pair (to drive petty problems away). For a period of about 10 years, the Billiken likeness was turned into basque dolls, clay incense burners, marshmallow candies, metal banks, hatpins, watch fobs, pickle forks, belt buckles, auto hood ornaments, salt and pepper shakers and glass bottles, so collectors have a large selection of Billiken collectibles to look for.

In his heyday, Billiken enjoyed worldwide celebrity. In America he became the athletic mascot of Saint Louis University and the school's athletic teams remain the Billikens to this day.

In Japan, Billikens were elevated to almost god-like status and became so popular that he was considered to be another god of luck in addition to the traditional seven Japanese gods of luck. Inexplicably, Billikens live on in some regions of the country as an icon of the exotic. Since Billiken was selected as the patron saint of the 1909 Alaska-Yukon Exposition, his image has cluttered the shelves of souvenir shops throughout

An area of great success for Billiken was Alaska, where, in 1909, Billiken began his appearance in souvenir shops. In Nome, Alaska, Angokwazhuk, an Eskimo carver, copied a Billiken figurine in ivory brought to him by a merchant. Since that first appearance in Alaska, some Eskimo carvers began to include the Billiken in the collection of figurines they create. Billikens are still created in Alaska today.

Japan's reverence of Billiken led to many representations of the Billiken being formally enshrined. Pre-World War II statues of the Billiken can be found in Kobe city's Chinju Inari and Matsuo Inari shrines. Both of these statues were removed from display for many years at the onset of the war when foreign deities fell out of favor, especially American ones.

The most famous representation of the Billiken was in an amusement park, Lunar Park, in the Shinsekai district of Osaka, Japan. In 1912, he was enshrined in the park as a symbol of Americana and there was revered as


park included dolls. When the park closed in 1923, the wooden statue of the Billiken was stolen.

A replica of the 1912 Billiken statue still stands on the fifth floor observation deck and has become closely associated with the tower. Each year thousands of visitors place a coin in his donation box and rub the soles of his well-worn feet to

Even though he became a national craze in the early 1900s, the Billiken's fame was short lived. The Billiken reached its peak of popularity in 1911, when it was recognized the world over as a universal symbol of good fortune

Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck - good, better and best. To buy a Billiken gave the buyer luck. To have one given to you is better luck. The best luck came if the Billiken were stolen from someone else.

find, much less affordable. Nutting recognized that the finest examples of American antique furniture were being "gobbled up by museums and the wealthy," rapidly making these antiques "unobtainable by most Americans," Ivankovich continued. And for those who could afford these treasures, many were reluctant to use them in their day-to-day lives. Nutting saw a market here, and thus was born a new project, the accurate reproduction of antique furniture.

Beginning in the 1910s, Nutting used examples of antique furniture in his own collection as templates. He established a furniture workshop and hired skilled craftsmen, many of whom were Europeans. As an aside, the identities of those who worked in Wallace's shop are still somewhat unknown. And even though Nutting hired women to color his photographs, Ivankovich said that it has not yet been determined whether women were employed in the making of furniture.

Nutting directed these skilled workers to reproduce the original by hand, using "the finest of woods and old-school production techniques." No design was undertaken before a process of "in-depth research," whereby Nutting carefully deconstructed his antique American furnishings, measuring every element and documenting its unique properties. Each piece was photographed, which, in turn, later led to the subsequent publication of a series of books, including his three-volume "Furniture Treasury." published in 1928 and again in 1931. "It is still regarded as the best book ever published on early American antique

furniture," Ivankovich said.

As for the shop's reproductions. Nutting chose Windsor chairs to be its first offerings. To illustrate Nutting's attention to detail, Ivankovich explained that Nutting determined that every Windsor chair would measure 18 inches across the front, tapering to 17 inches. The style of the turnings and the positioning of the spreaders had to be according to Nutting's exact, specifications. Subsequent pieces would follow, but Nutting's demand for perfection was never compromised. Finishes for the pieces sold were limited to dark mahogany or light maple; no piece of furniture made in the shop was ever sold "in the raw." Ivankovich said that each piece produced was subjected to eight hand-rubbed finishing coats. "That's why they were so expensive," he said.

Nutting's output expanded to include desks, beds, and cabinet pieces. His offerings were not restricted to pieces of furniture, as his shop produced maple plates and bowls, shaving glasses, and candy boxes, treenware and a variety of mirrors, as well as clocks, footstools, and unsigned iron finials. Nutting's company also produced radiator covers, which, obviously, were not patterned after earlier designs.

Nutting furniture was not limited to use in private homes, as banks bought pieces for their waiting rooms, as evidenced by brass tags affixed to surviving pieces. From the beginning, Nutting's reproduction furniture pieces

were only identified by a paper label, dating from 1918 to 1921, but later pieces were marked with his branded name. Those seeking to buy Nutting's wares could do so in person at his Framingham location, from distributors, or through catalogs. He regularly advertised in "The Magazine Antiques."

Wallace Nutting died at his home at 24 Vernon Street in Framingham on Saturday, July 19, 1941, at the age of 79. But his legacy lives on among faithful admirers of his work, both his hand tinted photographs and his reproduction furniture. Sales of his furniture on the secondary market peaked during the 1990s, but even when new, his furniture commanded high prices. Ivankovich noted that a Goddard School block-front secretary desk was originally advertised in a 1930 catalog for \$1,800, the cost of a small house at the time. That same desk sold for \$45,000 during the 1990s. Similarly, both a tall clock, costing \$600 in 1930, as well as a Savery highboy, originally priced at \$1,230, were each sold for nearly \$40,000 some 60 years later.

Today, many pieces of Nutting furniture sell for a fraction of what they once commanded, when adjusted for inflation. But for Ivankovich's part, he continues to enjoy purchasing and owning examples of Nutting furniture that he never thought would be affordable to him. The informed buyer can own extraordinary pieces of American antique furniture for pennies on the dollar, he said. And because Wallace Nutting reproductions are now more than a century old, they are

not just old furniture. These reproductions have stood the test of time to become antiques in their own right. And not just any antique pieces: As Ivankovich concluded, "I think this is the best benchmade furniture of the 20th century."
