Celluloid toys rattled, rocked and rolled into Easter baskets

What would Easter be without bunnies, chicks and eggs, and what kid wouldn't be thrilled to wake up in the morning and discover their basket stuffed with chocolate, jellybeans and a few surprises as well?

Just as it is today, that's the way it was a hundred years ago - but little playthings were very much different than they are now. In days of old, most Easter toys were fashioned out of a light-weight plastic material called celluloid - and they were adorable. Small enough to fit into eager little hands and charming enough to rattle, rock and roll into the hearts of collectors

The Viscoloid Company of Leominster, Mass., was established by Bernard Doyle and three other men in 1901, with the intention of replacing cattle horn with celluloid for the production of decorative hair combs and dresser sets. Their faux tortoise shell and imitation ivory goods enjoyed great success until around 1910 when ladies' hair styles began to change. With sales lagging, the company needed to expand their product line in order to make money.

The opportunity presented itself in 1914, with the onset of World War I. At that time trade with European toy makers ended and opportunity knocked on the door of Bernard Doyle. In order to enter the toy making industry, Doyle hired artist Paul Kramme — a German

designer

sculptor, whose whimsical designs reflected a distinctive old-world charm.

Metal molds for the toys were intricately detailed. They were fashioned into two parts - one side with rows of the toy front, and the other side featuring the back. In order to form the toys, two sheets of ivory colored celluloid were put into the mold, then steam was blown between the celluloid sheets via a

> hollow tube. By the use of heat and pressure, the plastic became pliable and expanded into the mold, fusing the front and back together. Upon cooling, the toys hardened and were

removed from the mold and separated from each other by snipping apart.

The next step involved employees who did piecework in their homes. They used sharp knives to whittle away the excess plastic "flash," from around the rough seams of the toys. Somewhere along the line somebody began to call the task "tickling," probably as an explanation to a child as to what they were doing when cleaning up the mold lines on the bellies of animal toys.

Stories were told of Leominster families sitting around the table after dinner "tickling toys" by the light of a kerosene lamp - which in itself was a dangerous hazard as celluloid plastic is

> extremely flammable. Once the tickled toys were finished, they were brought to Viscoloid painting department where they were sprayed with enamel colors through carefully fashioned stencil templates. The eyes and other tiny details

Brass centerpiece vessels carried a \$14,000 bid at Neue

BEACHWOOD, Ohio — On March 14, Neue Auctions concluded a highly anticipated sale on Live Auctioneers, featuring items from two prominent Ohio estates: one a meticulously filled saltbox-style home in Hudson, Ohio, and the other a fourth-generation Cleveland family. The 400+ lot auction offered rare collectibles, spanning Shaker furniture and Georgian glass to Chinese porcelain, American and European art, and schoolhouse samplers. Many pieces had never been available to the public

Highlights included a pair of circa 1925 "Aufsatz" brass centerpiece vessels, which received the auction's highest and only five-figure bid at \$14,000. Designed by Josef Hoffmann (Austrian, 1870-1956) and made by the Wiener Werkstätte, the 7.5 by 11-inch vessels feature gadrooned forms, scalloped rims, whimsical curlicued handles, and circular pedestal feet. Only 293 were made, with a pair exhibited at the 1925 Paris Exposition Internationale des Arts Décoratifs.

Two dozen additional lots received four-figure bids, including a pair of 56

by 26-inch Chinese lacquered doors that brought \$7,000. Despite age-related wear, the doors were in good condition and featured dragons chasing flaming pearls with bronze hardware. A 14K gold, circa 1963 cigarette case fetched \$4,900. Measuring 3\% by 3\% inches and weighing 124 grams, it had a solid yellow gold case, hinged cross security, and interior monogramming. A bid of \$1,500 won a 19th-century Roman-style faux marble architectural niche. Standing 44 inches tall, it consisted of a triangular pediment sitting on four columns on a stepped base with faux flaming urns.

Four of two dozen paintings and prints breezed past \$1,000. Among them was a 28 by 33-inch (framed) 19th-century American School oil on canvas depicting George Washington's Newburgh, N.Y., headquarters, bid to

\$2,800. The good-condition painting showed some craquelure and an old repair. A 1916-era 1114 by 161/8 Japanese woodblock print by Charles William Bartlett (1860-1940), published by Watanabe, brought \$1,600. Bidding also reached \$1,400 for a 27½ by 33½ inch (framed) 19th-century oil on canvas of a homestead and hay harvest, with minor condition issues like craquelure.


Three out of more than a dozen sculptural items also surpassed \$1,000. The highest went to a 19th-century Italian marble bust of a Medieval beauty, garnering \$6,500. The excellent-condition, 22 by 18 by 9-inch bust, was carved from polished white marble and sat atop a 45-inch pedestal with a green

Green Sales Company helps keep vintage vehicles on the road

CINCINNATI - They might be "built to last," but there comes a time when every motor vehicle, even a Ford, needs a repair job. From body parts (taillights and headlights, trim work and emblems) to motor parts and suspension components, one Cincinnati-based business has come to the rescue of car and truck owners for decades. And Green Sales Company continues to keep Fords, Mercurys, and Lincolns on the road, stocking parts for models that rolled off the showroom floor as early as 1949. For longtime readers of AntiqueWeek who have ever wondered about the ad in "Internet Collections," the one that advertises "Ford-Lincoln-Mercury Parts 1949-2015," read on.

Over the years, much of the business of Green Sales Company has been rather everyday in nature, mainly a matter of "keeping Mom's car on the road," according to Bruce Yeomans, speaking for himself and his brother and co-owner, Les. He explained that the business first opened in the early 1980s when their father had



marble base. Eight lots highlighted the sculpture of Pal Kepenyes (Hungarian/ Mexican 1926-2021). A 19-inch skeletal bronze bull with kinetic elements on a wood base landed \$2,900. A similar large bronze skeletal lion reached

Several furniture items also attracted strong bids, including a 17th/18th-century American pine two-drawer chest that reached \$2,600. The $36\frac{1}{2}$ by $41\frac{1}{2}$ by $20\frac{1}{2}$ -inch chest, featuring old hand-made iron hinges, had a rectangular lift top over faux drawers, two long lower drawers, and sat on a molded base with ball feet. A 19th-century American green-painted pine step-back cupboard scored \$2,000. This 78.5 by 38 by 18-inch cabinet, with good patina, had a rectangular top with hinged doors opening to fixed shelves and a lower section with hinged doors on a tapered leg base. Bidding went to a modest \$1,000 for a 70-inch-tall Massachusetts-made Eldred Wheeler Queen Anne-style tiger maple flat-top highboy. It was constructed as two parts, with a fan-carved drawer over two short drawers and four long drawers on top, and a frieze drawer and three deep drawers on the bottom, all resting on cabriole legs with pad feet.

While some lots commanded impressive prices, others showed that great finds didn't always require a hefty bid. For example, just \$325 won a stunning, schoolhouse samplers from the Hudfaded schoolgirl sampler, stitched with the alphabet and Greek key designs on high took home an 1845 English sampler, adorned with a fruit and floral

verses, and birds on branches. The 13% by 114 inch framed sampler, showing some conditional issues, was signed "Mary Davies finished her sampler in the 11th year of her age with Elizabeth and Caroline James at Victoria Trega-

Glassware and ceramics from around the world went for varying prices. The category's high of \$1,700 went to an 18th-century Chinese export armorial tankard. The good-condition vessel, with no chips or cracks, had a tapered mouth and floral designs. It was detailed with an armorial crest,

the motto "Loyal Jusq'a la Mort," the monogram "JB" and a "Marchant & Son, London" label. A tin-glazed Talavera earthenware barrel from Spain hit \$800. This 12¾ by 9½ inch vessel, with several conditional issues, was decorated with vellow, green, cobalt, and black floral patterns. An antique Pittsburg-made Joseph Fleming stoneware jug was picked up for \$700. The 12-inch-tall vessel with loop handles and hand-painted cobalt detailing, featured stenciling that read, "Joseph Fleming Wholesale and Retail Druggist, No. 84 Market Street, Pittsburgh, PA," and was in good condition with small chips.

Estate jewelry also drew varying final bids. A 14K white gold Deco-style diamond necklace garnered \$1,700, while two pairs of 18K yellow gold clip earrings brought \$1,100 each. Mean-

while, a 3-gram vintage amethyst and diamond ring in 10K yellow gold, featuring four oval-cut amethysts and melee diamonds, grabbed just \$50. Despite missing one melee diamond, it was nonetheless a good opportunity for a savvy buyer.

way of enticement, Greenleaf offered to work for two additional years to help establish the new company. And he brought with him a considerable collection of Ford parts, amassed because dealerships, due to space constraints, generally limit their inventory of parts to those that are two years old or less.

That's not the only way the young company's inventory grew. Yeomans related how, back in the day, people would travel the country, attend swap meets, and then "come to us to unload their finds. Those days are gone," he said. But he noted that the company's inventory undoubtedly still includes some of those early acquisitions. Just to give an idea of the scope of the company's current inventory, consider the fact that it includes some 760 fenders and 450 quarter-panels in stock, "from 1950 to current." And then there are the 34,000 Autolite and Motorcraft spark plugs, not to mention the inevitable examples of Ford-related memorabilia.

Today, the brothers are proud of the fact that they remain a "brick and mortar" company, in addition to maintaining an online presence that ships parts all over the world. "We never sold ourselves as a concourse auto parts place," Yeomans stated. But they have been involved in a number of interesting "rescues." He recalled how, for five years, between 2007 and 2012, he sent parts for a 1979 Ford LTD Country Squire to the Netherlands. Its current owner was particularly in-

terested in keeping this car on the road, having learned that his paneled station wagon was originally owned by "a Mr. Freddie Heineken" ("as in 'the beer," Yeomans pointed out). In the end, the effort paid off, with the car not "ending up in the salvage yard."

Another time, he related, there was an involved "back-and-forth" with a customer in the Republic of Georgia who sought parts for a 1989 Probe. And then there was the customer whose mother had won her Ford Festiva on "The Price is Right." Come on down!

Describing his typical customer, Yeomans characterized him as "a guy who

has been into cars his whole life, starting with Hot Wheels and slot cars. As he got older, his toys became more expensive." Yeoman knows firsthand that maintaining a vintage model can be both challenging and rewarding. He pointed out that while his 1971 Pinto is "fun to drive," it is not comfortable enough to use as his primary vehicle.

Asked about which vintage Ford models are currently the ones most sought after. Yeomans answered, without hesitation, Mustangs, particularly those made in the late 1970s through the early 1990s. What sold for \$7,000 to \$8,000 in the late 1990s can now command \$25,000 to \$30,000, he said. "When they were plentiful, no one was interested. Now that they're hard to come by, everybody has to have one," he chuckled.



Papier-mache Easter eggs provided a basket full of color

The Easter Bunny, or "Osterhase" is believed to have originated in Germany in the 1600s. Early accounts describe children hunting for Easter eggs (Osterei) hidden by the Osterhase, who also brought gifts and col-

In 1894 in the Erzgebirge region of Germany, the papier-mache Easter egg was created to hold treats for children. There was a secret process used to create beautiful egg-shaped boxes. Over the years a wide variety of sizes became available and the artwork covering the outside ranged from elegant to adorable. These two-piece candy containers were exported to the U.S. and throughout Europe. Common subjects are rabbits, chicks, ducks and flowers. Often the two pieces had dif-

ferent subject matter.

Older papier-mache eggs can be dated by the stamping inside. The paper that lines the inside is usually decorated in a cheerful repeating pattern and stamped with a German mark. Before 1918 the stamp would have been

"Germany." Between 1918-1933 it was "German Republic." After World War II the stamp would have been "East Germany", "German Democratic Republic", "West Germany" or "Federal Republic of Germany."

There are reproductions that are beautifully decorated and more affordable than the older eggs. There are a couple of ways to distinguish the old from the new. Originals would have been lithographed in solid color swaths whereas the graphics on the modern eggs will be made of tiny dots that can be seen with a magnifying loupe. Also, the lining on modern eggs will fluoresce white under a long wave blacklight.

Whether you prefer the older eggs or are open to the newer ones, using German papier-mache Easter eggs in your Easter decor is fun and cheerful!

From corn to cookie jars; Shawnee Pottery delights

Brothers Malcolm A. Schweiker and Roy W. Schweiker founded Shawnee Pottery of Zanesville, Ohio, in 1937, and, at the peak of their production, Shawnee Pottery was producing 100,000 ceramic pieces per day.

The Schweiker brothers used the remnants of the American Encaustic Tiling Company to begin their pottery operation. American Encaustic Tiling opened its million-dollar facility, located at 2200 Linden Avenue, on April 19, 1892. The building was dedicated by Governor William McKinley, who became President McKinley in 1897. American Encaustic's main product was the manufacturing of tiles, requiring a two-step process that first fired the clay and then the glaze. These tiles were quite durable due to the high temperature the kilns were fired at. The tile company became one of the largest tile manufacturing companies in the world, but due to the Great Depression, American Encaustic closed its doors in 1937 when the building and its kilns were sold.

Shawnee Pottery continued the twostep process used by American Encaustic Tiling Company, which helped Shawnee manufacture a very durable dinnerware. The greenware (unfired pottery clay) received a first firing. Then china under glaze was applied to the pottery, and the pottery was fired again. Finally, paint was applied. The application of paint over the glaze was referred to as cold paint. Due to the age of Shawnee pieces, the cold paint has noticeably deteriorated over time.

In its infancy, Shawnee Pottery produced dinnerware for George Rumrill. The first products were primarily decorative items like figurines and cookie jars that could be found in "five and dime" stores, such as McCrory, S.S. Kresge, and F. W. Woolworth Company.

Not long after Shawnee Pottery began production in 1937, Sears Roebuck and Company approached the pottery and asked the company to design a line of dinnerware known as Valencia, and a line of kitchenware exclusively for Sears stores. This contract with Sears helped stabilize

Shawnee Pottery and ensure its success.

Sears' 1945 catalog offered sets of the Shawnee salt and pepper shakers (farmer pigs, watering can, and winking owl) at 47cents each and Shawnee teapots for \$1.29 (horizontal ribbed base) and \$1.59 (vertical ribbed base) each.


According to Bev Mangus, author of "Shawnee Pottery," the firm began manufacturing dinnerware at just the right moment in history. As World War II approached many 'Buy American' campaigns were conducted". These "Buy American" campaigns coupled with Shawnee Pottery's durable dinnerware gave the fledging pottery some much needed sales.

Shawnee Pottery quickly became known for its line of novelty ware, including vases, planters, lamps, cookie jars, and flowerpots. The company also produced three dinnerware lines — Corn, Lobster Ware, and Valencia. Its line of Corn King pottery became its most successful line. This line included White Corn utility pieces (produced in 1945), Corn King pieces (produced from 1946 - 1954), and Corn Queen ware (produced from 1954 - 1961). The Corn King and Corn Queen lines of dinnerware were molded and color glazed to resemble actual ears of corn. Pieces in these lines included teapots, dinner plates, and salt and pepper shakers.

Today, collectors search for Shawnee Pottery items and relish finding Corn King pieces or Shawnee's prized colorful pig cookie jars. Shawnee Pottery's earliest Smiley Pig cookie jars were cold painted and offered with either a red or blue scarf.


If you are interested in all of the marks used on Shawnee cookie jars, Mike Schneider's "The Complete Cookie Jar Book" is an excellent resource.

A declining market, due largely to imported dinner wares and plastic wares, forced Shawnee Pottery to close its doors in 1961.

Everything Shawnee Pottery produced is collectible, but cookie jars are what collectors desire most. The Smiley Pig, Puss n' Boots, Winnie Pig, Muggsy Dog, and Dutch Jack and Jill are some of the more sought after cookie jars produced by Shawnee Pottery. Smiley Pig is the most desired of all Shawnee cookie jars. Smiley Pig gold-trimmed jars are the most desired and they normally cost the most. In 2002 a Shawnee Pottery Smiley Pig cookie jar sold for \$6,750 at Kent Mickelson Auction House in Missouri.

Novice collectors should study vintage Shawnee Pottery cookie jars before making expensive purchases. Terrace Ceramics bought Shawnee Pottery's cookie jar molds when the company closed in 1961. Some Terrace cookie jars look like a Shawnee Pottery jar, but Terrace Ceramics' cookie jars lacked the quality and design that Shawnee was famous for. These inferior jars should clearly be marked "Terrace Ceramics."

Also, in the mid-1990s, a second Shawnee Pottery Company began selling cookie jars with the markings "USA" and "Shawnee" impressed on their bottoms. Collectors need to recognize these knock-off Shawnee cookie jars.



Celluloid Toys

like ribbons, neck ties, buttons and smiles were all hand-painted. Quality control appears to have been lacking at times because some of the toys are beautifully decorated with multiple colors while others appear shoddily painted with only two colors.

By the end of the war and the dawn of the roaring twenties, the Viscoloid Company employed 350 full-time workers in their toy making division. Their Easter toys were especially delightful and affordable. In 1924, a toy catalog advertised a display of "Kiddie Easter Playthings," in 24 different styles measuring 3 ¼ inch tall, for the wholesale price of \$9.15 gross or 79 cents a dozen. A display of larger toys measuring 5 1/4 inches tall could be bought for \$2 a dozen.

Spring was in full bloom on the charming little Easter novelties. Figural rattles, roly-poly and rocking toys were chockablock with bunnies, chicks, ducks, geese, swans, lambs, bonnets, baskets, flowers and eggs.

Whimsical transportation themes were made with bunnies or chicks driving stylized cars loaded with eggs or little animals. Movable wheels were added to some vehicles or platform pull toys and these are harder to find than those with wheels molded into the design.

Another popular theme featured birds and animals pushing baby carriages, wheelbarrows and carts full of precious cargo. It appears only two toys with little lambs were made, and they are few and far between.

Some of the most desirable and difficult to find items are the rocking toys that feature bunnies and chicks riding or standing opposite one another on a curved base. Patti Guthrie, one of the administrators on the Facebook page "Everything Celluloid" is a dealer / collector who shared some of her insights on the current state of the celluloid toy market. "The eggs generally sell for around \$250 for the small and \$350 for

the large. Bunny cars can go for \$150 to or adding to an existing one, should \$225. Unusual pieces, like the rocking bunnies, can command high prices because of rarity."

In 1925, the DuPont Company struck a deal with Bernard Doyle and they acquired Viscoloid - but they continued to make celluloid toys in Leominster. That same year Doyle sold off some of the toy molds to Irwin Cohn, who started making celluloid toy tea sets in 1922.

Cohn eventually began to include the circular Irwin banner trademark on some of the toys. Later, in the very late 20s or early 30s, Irwin began to use nonflammable, brightly colored cellulose acetate plastic in place of celluloid. These were thicker and sturdier toys that came in bright white, pink, yellow and blue.

In addition to the Everything Celluloid site on Facebook, a companion page "Everything Celluloid for Sale" is the platform for buying and selling. Those interested in starting a collection check it out.

All celluloid collectors are invited to a three-day convention hosted by Anita Behrens in Minnesota the weekend of

July 11 - 13. For more information visit Everything Celluloid online. For those interested in learning about the history of celluloid there are two great resource books chock full of information and photographs. Although they are out of print, they can be found second-hand online. Look for the Celluloid Collector's Resource and Value Guide by Keith Lauer and Julie Robinson, and Celluloid Dolls, Toys and Playthings by Julie Pelletier Robinson (Robards).
