Match collector loves fanning the flames of his collection

Even though humans have understood how to control fire for hundreds of thousands of years, the methods to produce it have often proven to be laborintensive (rubbing flint against steel), undependable (using a glass lens to focus light from the sun), or downright unsafe. Little wonder, then, that the relatively recent invention of the match, a simple tool, is lauded as a triumph of research and development.

Like many discoveries, development of the match was a process. Frenchman Jean Chancel is credited with his 1805 invention of what is recognized as the first match. In 1827, John Walker, an English chemist, went a step further, producing the first friction match, which did away with the vials of chemicals that were previously required. Dr. Charles Saurian, a French scientist, refined Walker's process in 1831, substituting a phosphorus compound for Walker's mixture of chlorate of potash, gum arabic, and sugar.

And several years later, Alonzo Dwight Phillips of Springfield, Mass., applied for and was granted a United States patent for the first friction match, one that he made entirely by hand. With the low number of 68, the patent covered "certain new and useful Improvements in Modes of Manufacturing Friction-Matches for the Instantaneous Production of Light, which improvements consist in a new composition of matter for producing ignition and in a new mode of putting up the matches for use bywhich (sic) the danger of ignition from accidental friction or from other causes is obviated." As an aside, the date on which this patent was granted, October 24, 1836, is noteworthy, as it was less than four months after the Patent Act of 1836 was signed into law on July 4.

Phillips' matches were dubbed "loco focos," and later, "lucifers," in light of the fact that they were highly combustible, ignited with the least amount of friction. This led to a number of injuries, as men would inadvertently strike a match on the seat of their trousers. For those lighting matches with their thumbnails, they risked the match head breaking off, at which point the wooden split (and the flame) would lodge under the nail. Not only did these matches produce unsafe conditions, they also emitted smoke and an unpleasant odor.

All the same, matches became

important tools in 19th-century homes, used to start flames in oil lamps and kerosene stoves, thereby enabling lighting, heating, and cooking. Secondarily, matches were used by smokers to light up. To meet consumer demand, 12 pioneer match companies combined to form the Diamond Match Company in 1881. Among the notable advancements made by Diamond was the replacement of white phosphorus, a deadly gas, with a nonpoisonous chemical, the patent for which was donated to the American people. When Joshua Pusey, a Philadelphia lawyer, invented the matchbook in 1892, Diamond purchased the rights in 1894. It was not long afterwards that the first commercially printed matchcover was produced. Businesses seeking to keep their name in front of customers

consulted a salesman's catalog and selected a suitable design; company names and contact information, as well as catchy slogans, were then added.

And so it happened that matchbooks and matchboxes, simple and inexpensive ways to advertise a product or service, came to be distributed, free for the taking.

Enter Terry Kemmeter, Growing up in Milford, Ohio, the young boy routinely visited businesses in his hometown and helped himself. "I'd see matches on the counter," he recalled, "and I'd pick them up in every store." From there, he would take his treasures home, where he would spend hours poring over them, examining them and noting their finer points. What

Robin Hood poster draws aim with \$47,500 at Heritage

DALLAS — Heritage Auctions' Cinema on Paper: The Dwight M. Cleveland Collection Movie Posters Signature® Auction, hosted March 27-28, took collectors on a cinematic journey through 125 years of movie history. This extraordinary sale, featuring 540 lots, highlighted the visual appeal of movie posters, with selections from early classics like Casablanca and King Kong to avant-garde international examples. Cleveland, a collector for more than 50 years, had amassed a legendary collection that captured the essence of films from across the globe. As Cleveland parted with these treasures, it created an opportunity for movie lovers and collectors to own a piece of cinematic history.

Cleveland's collection was a testament to the artistry of movie advertising. Over the years, he built a world-renowned collection, driven by a deep appreciation for their artwork rather than the films' fame. He sought out rare, exceptional pieces, often rescuing them from destruction. In an interview with NBC's Sunday Today, Cleveland explained that movie posters were once no more significant than "candy wrappers," typically discarded after a film's run. "Once a film finished screening, these pieces had no value whatsoever," he said. The fact that any survived is a testament to their visual appeal. These posters — especially those from silent films — are often the only remnants of films lost to time.

Lots began opening in early March, and by the week before the auction's close, prices for many pieces had soared. Some, like a pristine Italian

Fogli edition (39.25 by 55 inches) of "Casablanca" and a restored Czech edition of the 37 by 49.5-inch Style B one-sheet for 1933's "King Kong," surpassed \$20,000. This level of activity highlighted the strong demand and high value of these rare cinematic pieces


At the final tally, a three-sheet for

Warner Brothers' 1938 "Adventures of Robin Hood" won the Oscar, selling for \$47,500. The 40.75 by 77-inch linen-mounted poster, featuring the Errol Flynn classic, was graded in fine+condition with only minor flaws. The runner-up, at \$42,500, was a 27.25 by 41-inch linen-backed one-sheet for the 1933 Warner Brothers film "Picture Snatcher," starring James Cagney. Though listed in fine condition overall, it did have one significant tear.

Twenty-five more lots hit five figures, including the Czech "King Kong," which fetched \$32,500, and the Italian

"Casablanca" which scored \$31,250. Other solid five-figure sales included a 1921 one-sheet of Buster Keaton's silent film, "The High Sign" which reached \$38,750. The very rare piece, with expected age-related wear, promoted Keaton's first independent film. Bidding went to \$32,500 for a very-fine unrestored, circa 1933 stone litho one-sheet of Mickey Mouse and Minnie Mouse in "Building a Building." An even \$10,000 picked up a linen one-sheet for the 1928 film, "Dry Martini"

starring Mary Astor. The example, in fine/very-fine condition, showcased stunning flapper-style imagery.

An impressive 300 items sold for four-figure sums, including a linen-mounted one-sheet for the 1943 20th-Century Fox film "Stormy Weather," featuring Lena Horne, Cab Calloway, Fats Waller, Katherine Dunham, and Bill "Bojangles" Robinson, which hit \$9,062 in slightly-repaired condition. A bid of \$7,500 secured a roadshow window card for Disney's 1940 masterpiece Fantasia. This 14 by 22inch poster, which promoted a longer version of the film, showed signs of age and amateur restoration to one corner. Another, a linen six-sheet for the iconic 1962 Lawrence of Arabia from Columbia Pictures fetched \$6,562. Measuring 78 by 79 inches, it was rated as fine+ with expected flaws.

Exceptional pieces were still picked up, even when winning bids fell below \$3,000. Those included a one-sheet for the 1948 Columbia Pictures first run of Superman, which bid to \$2,500. Though showing folds, pinholes, and tape residue, it was considered in fine/ very fine condition. Coming close at \$2,437 was a reissue three-sheet for the 1937 musical, "Puttin' on the Ritz," by Art Cinema Associates, which was one of the first films to incorporate Technicolor. This one showed some heavy restoration attempts and other wear issues. A bit more contemporary was a Universal/MCA soundtrack poster for 1978's Animal House. Rolled but showing handling wear, it still scored \$1,625.

The remaining 300+ lots all sold for three figures, offering great buys for some lucky bidders. For just \$875, a British edition poster (40.75 by 61 inches) for Clint Eastwood's 1976 western "The Outlaw Josey Wales" (Columbia-Warner) changed hands. This linen-back example in fine condition showed some signs of restoration. A bid of \$687 secured a Japanese lightbox B1 copy (39.5 by 27 inches) of the 2018 scifi horror "The Predator." Bidding bottomed out at \$225 for 10 different lots, including one with a pair of 11 by 14-inch lobby cards for "Raiders of the Lost Ark" and "The Terminator," and another featuring an unrestored 14 by 22-inch window card for the 1934 pre-code film "Jealousy."

THE POP CULTURE COLLECTIVE

Celebrating 45 years of Pac-Man: A cultural icon that keeps on gobbling

In May 1980, an unassuming vellow circle with a pie-shaped mouth hit Japanese arcades —and the world hasn't been the same since. Now, as Pac-Man celebrates its 45th anniversary, it's clear that this ghost-dodging, dot-chomping arcade classic is far more than a game. It's a pop culture icon, a merchandising juggernaut, and a nostalgic cornerstone of video game collecting.

Created by Toru Iwatani and released by Namco (and later Midway in North America), Pac-Man was unlike anything gamers had seen before. At a time when most arcade hits focused on space combat or shooting, Pac-Man introduced a non-violent, maze-based game with a character as expressive as he was simple. It was easy to pick up, challenging to master, and downright addictive. It wasn't long before it took the world by storm — eclipsing even Space Invaders in popularity and becoming the first arcade video game to achieve true mass-market appeal.

For many of us. Pac-Man was a rite of passage. I still remember the convenience store near my junior high school where I'd stop after basketball practice. I'd ride my bike there, quarters in hand, just to squeeze in a few games before heading home. It didn't matter if I made it to the pretzel stage or got ambushed by Inky and Clyde — every game felt like a battle of wits in that neon-lit maze.

While Pac-Man was groundbreaking, its successors added layers of gameplay that made the series even more engaging. Ms. Pac-Man, released in 1981, introduced moving fruit, new maze layouts, and smarter ghost AI. It's still considered by many (myself included) to be the superior

game. Super Pac-Man took things a step further in 1982, giving players power-ups that let Pac grow to super size and bust through locked doors - injecting a fresh twist into the formula. These sequels not only maintained the franchise's momentum but demonstrated how much creativity could be mined from a simple concept.

But Pac-Man's legacy extends far beyond the screen. The character quickly became a household name in the early '80s, spawning a tidal wave of merchandise. From board games and lunchboxes to cartoons and breakfast cereals, Pac-Man was everywhere. Today, that merchandise — especially vintage items from the early years — is highly collectible.

In fact, the collector's market for Pac-Man memorabilia is surging in 2025, fueled by nostalgia and a renewed appreciation for vintage pop culture. Recent eBay sales reveal just how valuable these artifacts have become. A Bally Mr. and Mrs. Pac-Man pinball machine recently sold for \$3,888.88, while a Ms. Pac-Man cocktail arcade machine went for \$4,549. A rare 1982-83 7-Eleven Slurpee store display sign — used to promote video gamethemed cups — fetched serious collector interest, selling for \$1,999.

For fans of wearable nostalgia, a Nelsonic Pac-Man Game Watch new in its package sold for \$1,299.99, and a Coleco Midway Ms. Pac-Man tabletop electronic game, complete in box, went for \$498.77. Even the much-maligned Atari 2600 version of Pac-Man — a game infamous for disappointing fans and being blamed (perhaps unfairly) for the video game crash recently sold in its WATA 8.0 sealed firstprint orange box variant for \$499.

Other vintage collectibles continue to perform well too: a full wax pack box


of Fleer Pac-Man stickers brought in \$399.99, an unused Aladdin lunchbox and thermos combo went for \$150, and a sealed can of Pac-Man pasta from Chef Boy-Ar-Dee, in its glorious "golden chicken" flavor, also sold for \$150. Even more offbeat treasures have found homes, like a 19 inch vellow Pac-Man metal trash can for \$124.99, a CordBally telephone for \$120, a boxed Tomytronic handheld video game for \$99, and a factory-sealed Milton Bradley Pac-Man board game for \$115.

And of course, the crown jewel of any collection remains the arcade cabinet itself. A vintage Pac-Man machine in good working condition typically sells for around \$2,000, depending on the version and cosmetic condition. These machines are more than just collectibles — they're functional time machines, offering a direct portal to the golden age of arcades.

The rise of Pac-Mania in the collecting world reflects a broader trend: a growing reverence for early video game history. With Pac-Man turning 45, it stands as a symbol of gaming's explosive cultural rise. Its simple design, universal appeal, and unforgettable sound effects have endured across generations. Whether you're a highscore chaser, a console collector, or a lover of '80s kitsch, there's a place for Pac-Man in your heart — and likely, your display shelves.

So, here's to 45 years of pellets, power-ups, and pixel-perfect memories. Pac-Man isn't just part of video game historyit is video game history. And judging by the prices and passion in today's collector market, he's not slowing down any time

White jade statuette of Guanyin brings \$138,000 to top Cottone event

GENESEO — On March 27, Cottone Auctions hosted its Fine art sale totaling \$1.45 million, featuring an exceptional selection of fine art, decorative objects, and rare collectibles. The auction prominently included the estate of Sidonie Triepel Williams of Buffalo, N.Y., alongside collections from private institutions. Among the highlights were Tiffany Studios lamps, estate silver, Imperial Russian enamels, Chinese jade, and modern artworks.

One of the standout categories in the auction was the collection of Tiffany Studios lamps. A "Daffodil" table lamp, boasting a 14-inch shade on a mushroom base, commanded \$60,000, while a Pomegranate table lamp, set on a rare Moorish base, followed closely at \$57,000. Another significant sale within this category was a monumental special order decorated Favrile vase, standing 18 inches tall, which realized \$40,800. These results reinforced the enduring demand for Tiffany Studios pieces among collectors.

The auction also showcased an exceptional array of Chinese and Japanese art, drawing strong interest from bidders. The highest-selling lot of the event was a finely carved white jade statuette of Guanyin, the bodhisattva of mercy, from the Qianlong Period, which sold for \$138,000. Another remarkable piece from this period was a Chinese Cinnabar Lacquer scholar box and cover, which brought \$30,000. Additionally, a large iridescent ammonite, dating back 75-72 million years to the Upper Cretaceous Bearpaw Formation, fascinated collectors for its natural beauty and significance in Feng Shui selling for \$12,100. A notable collection of snuff bottles and netsuke carvings also crossed the auction block, collectively achieving \$6,600.

In the realm of decorative arts, an exceedingly rare Russian translucent enamel and gilded silver tabernacle by Pavel

Ovchinnikov (St. Petersburg, c. 1882) was acquired by an international collector for \$40,800. Another significant sale was an antique Turkish Oushak rug from around 1880, featuring a Gerus design in gold, salmon, pink, soft green, and neutral tones, which sold for \$8,100 to a private collector on the West Coast.

The modern and 20th-century art segment of the auction also generated significant interest. A standout lot was "Keyah Hozoni (Beautiful Land)", a 1987 mixed media work by renowned Navajo artist Emmi Whitehorse, which realized \$57,000. The sale further included three vibrant paintings by Orville Bulman (1904–1978), with the highest lot fetching \$15,600. Another highlight was a ceramic piece by Pablo Picasso, "Profil de Femme No. 67," which achieved \$6,600.

Among the offerings in estate silver, a Samuel Kirk repoussé silver ewer (circa 1830), originally acquired from J.P. Morgan's collection, sold for \$6,300. A set of Maison Odiot French sterling silver dinner plates brought \$8,400, while an early American silver cup by John Coburn found a buyer at \$4,080. Another fine example of craftsmanship was a George III Sterling silver teapot by Paul Storr (1771–1844), which sold for \$5,200.

Collectors of timepieces were drawn to several rare and valuable clocks. A French Ormolu & Bronze Empire clock by Manière, featuring bronze work attributed to Philippe Thomire (1751–1843), sold for \$36,000 to a private overseas collector. Additionally, an extremely rare French patinated bronze two-handled glass dial

mystery clock, sculpted by Victorin Subatier around 1900, also attracted international interest, selling for \$18,000.

The auction further featured an impressive selection of Americana and Native American art. A Sioux beaded buckskin dress from the late 19th century realized \$5,400, while a carved and painted Iroquois cradleboard achieved \$4,500. Additionally, fine examples of early American furniture drew competitive bidding, including an 18th-century New England tiger maple Queen Anne highboy, which sold for \$10,800, and a Chippendale chest-on-chest, which brought \$11,400

1965 Chevy Impala drives off with \$73,000 bid

NEAPOLIS, Ohio — Whalen Realty & Auction Ltd. recently held a large advertising auction, which generated some impressive sales numbers.

The king of this show was the featured item, which was a 1964 Impala. This Chevrolet Super Sport appeared to be all original, except for the battery and fuel pump. It showed only 8,077 miles and featured a 327 turbocharged engine. It was equipped with a four-speed transmission. It was a two-owner car, locally owned in the area where it was being sold. It didn't have any working brakes, but neither did the bidding, so it was perfectly paired. Rust wasn't an issue either, as the beautiful bluish-gray paint job made for a delightful image. The price continued to rise for this collector's dream, and it took someone digging deep into their pocket to become the new owner of this beauty. It ultimately reached a final bid price of \$73,000 before being declared sold.

A second Chevrolet Impala was also offered. This one was a 1963 four-door. It was

all original, with 42,667 miles showing on the odometer. It was powered by a 283 smallblock automatic and had been family-owned since new. This automobile was the same color as the other one, except it sported a white top. It brought a final bid of \$17,000,

A national Simplex clock face gasoline pump was offered. Even though this one needed to be completely restored, it stood a proud 90 inches tall. And it showed it was in demand when it pumped out the highest price of any of the gasoline pumps offered for sale. The hammer didn't fall on this project until the bidding reached an impressive \$4,300.

Trying not to be out-priced was a Fry visible gasoline pump. This one had a Texaco reproduction globe and a Powell twospeed nozzle. It had a plastic cylinder and a replacement top. However, it was also in demand and sold for the final bid price of

A Wayne Model 70 gasoline pump showed off a Sinclair H-C glass. It featured a Sinclair Power-X over 100 octane globe and had a super-octane cover. It was in nice shape and would make a good restoration project. It took \$2,800 to load this giant up.

A blue Sunoco Martin & Schwartz Inc. gasoline pump was only 62 inches tall. This one was more modern in appearance, but it came in with a final selling price of \$ 2,450. There was a partially restored Tokheim gasoline pump. This one was a Shell visible unit and brought a respectable bid of \$2,350.

Another visible gasoline pump was offered. It needed restoration as it had rust holes and the glass was broken. It stood 115 inches tall, and despite its rough condition, it brought a final bid price of \$ 1,900. A Gilbarco gasoline pump that required complete restoration was sold for \$1,100. It was 78 inches in height.

The advertising signs drew their share of bidders. An Ethyl Bartles gasoline sign was double-sided. This one measured 30 inches in diameter. It had some surface damage across the "Gasoline" lettering. The Ethyl Gasoline Corporation, based in New York, had its information lettered in the center of the sign. With a pretty sky-blue background, it was easy to see the wording on this sign. It took a bid of \$3,000 to take home this rare piece of advertising.

A Texaco sign was displaying the familiar red star associated with the brand. This one was a grand 72 inches in diameter and was double-sided porcelain. It sold for \$2,700. The red star had a large green "T" in the center, with "Texaco" written above

A 42-inch diameter Pontiac sign had attracted attention before it reached the auction. Someone had used it for shooting practice and left several holes in the piece. This sign showed the red colored outline of an Indian's head in the center, and this is what was shot at. However, the Pontiac Authorized Service sign was still an excellent display piece. The signature dark blue background made the lettering stand out, and this historical piece still had lots of life left in it. It was double-sided porcelain, allowing it to be seen from either direction. It garnered a respectable bid of \$2,600.

Falling a bit short of the Pontiac sign selling price, a Goodyear Tires sign still commanded a bid of \$2,300. This double-sided sign came complete with the flange sign bracket. The winged flying shoe was meant to convey that the Goodyear tires would move one down the road in record time.

Selling for \$2,200 was a Magnolene Motor Oils advertising piece. It was double-sided porcelain and measured almost 30 inches in diameter. The Magnolia Petroleum Company branded its name around the outside edge of this piece, and the lettering in the middle advertised that Magnolene Motor Oils were available for sale at this location. The white lettering stood out against the dark red and blue background.

A beautifully restored refrigerator attracted attention. This model was a Philco automatic, dating back to the 1950s. The glossy red finish made it pop. It brought a final bid price of \$2,000.



Match Collections

began as a childhood fascination, one that cost him no money at all, later segued into a 60-year hobby. As Kemmeter said, "One thing led to another."

That is an understatement.

Many phillumenists, as collectors of matches and match-related objects are called, choose to limit their collections. For example, they might specialize in match holders, a necessity before the advent of the safety match. A collection of holders could be narrowed down by subject, limiting it to advertising or souvenirs, or centered around other collecting interests, such as animals (cats, dogs, or camels) or everyday objects (shoes, buckets, or baskets). Similarly, because they were widely distributed and designed to appeal to the general public, a collection of matchbooks could be satisfying as well.

But for Kemmeter, he set about collecting anything and everything match-related that he could find.

Today, the Ripley, Ohio, home of this collector could rightfully be called a **Below:** Tabletop match holders, suitable for any decor.

shrine of all things match-related. Sixty years of collecting that began with matchbooks and matchboxes have resulted in a massive collection, one that covers a broad variety of categories, including those that depict sports and the Space Age, railroads and soda drinks, and beer and liquor. Matchbooks in his diverse collection include items from the 1930 New York World's Fair and a variety of funeral homes, as well as personalized matchbook covers, those that commemorated weddings and other special occasions.

And then there are tourism advertisements, matchbooks from restaurants and hotels that are now just a memory, and transportation-related matchbooks (including those with automobile and petroleum themes), not to mention now-closed local venues (grocery stores, hardware stores, and the like). From matchbook covers with recipes printed on the back to those used to promote a political candidate: It's difficult to think of anything that has not been represented on a matchbook. Of his favorites, Kemmeter noted that those

produced in the early 1920s represent what he called the "glory days."

Covering the walls of his house are 63 oversized frames containing carefully curated matchbook covers and boxes; the matches have been removed, not because they are self-combustible (they aren't). "The match is worthless," he pointed out, and the cover is better displayed when flattened and without the matches. "It's the covers that are valuable." He added that a cover with a striker that has been used is no longer considered to be in mint condition. He prides himself for the way his collection is displayed.

"I've been told they're ready for a museum."

That is only the beginning. There are the match boxes, the wall holders, and the table holders, the some 150 stove matches and the fireplace matches. Then there are the ladies' purse matches, "little bitty boxes," often sparkly and dating from the 1930s and 1940, designed to appeal to women as they too, lit up a cigarette and enjoyed a smoke.

Indeed, a match collection is of sociological and historical significance, marking something of a bygone era. Today, fewer people smoke, and when they do, they often depend on a disposable lighter. And then there's the fact that businesses have other ways to keep their name in front of the public, thanks to the internet and mobile phones.

And there comes a point at which it's time to move on. And so it is with Kemmeter. "I've enjoyed this collection for 60 years. Now it's someone else's turn," he said. He is hoping to sell his

entire collection, not because he's lost interest in it. Quite the contrary: The inveterate collector has decided that he now needs more room in order to enjoy his tobacco-related collection.
