Barbie suitcases can open up a new world for collectors

She stepped onto the world stage wearing a zebra-striped strapless bathing suit. Her hair was pulled back in a ponytail, and her only accessories were pierced earrings, white-rimmed cat-eye sunglasses, and open-toe slide heels. Clearly, this California girl would soon require a wardrobe of "date night" dresses and outfits to suit her career/careers, as well as casual wear, nightwear, and underpinnings. Although there had been other teenaged dolls before her, Barbie was different. Because, in the end, it was all about the clothes.

"Sheer genius" is the only way to describe the marketing of the Barbie doll. As one museum curator noted, Barbie was a "three-dimensional paper

doll." With every purchase, girls received a little catalog illustrating 23 ensembles, produced mainly by Japanese home stitchers. But even though she lived in a cardboard Dream House, Barbie needed more closet space. What was a girl to do?

Lucky for Barbie, plastic suitcases, some of which pictured the fashion doll in her most iconic costumes, would soon

be on the market.

As it happened, while Barbie was taking the toy world by storm, Don Levine had perfected a process by which cardboard could be encased in crimped sheets of vinyl. With Barbie's introduction at the 1959 American International Toy Fair in New York City, Levine, an astute businessman,

recognized a potential market. Using his developed newly technique, he produced carrying cases for dolls, clothes, and accessories, and they pictured a ponytailed young woman. Although it was obvious that these cases were intended for Barbie's clothing and accessories, Levine sidestepped any proprietary conflicts by labeling them "Pony Tail."

By the early 1960s, Mattel, the company that manufactured Barbie, and

Everything but the House turned local estate sales into global business

CINCINNATI. Ohio — Seventeen years ago, Everything but the House (EBTH) began connecting Ohio Valley estate sales with buyers across the globe, becoming one of the most trusted names in the business. The idea for EBTH began in the early 2000s when antique and vintage enthusiasts Jacquie Denny and Brian Graves set out to bring the traditional estate sale into the digital age. Their vision was to create a more seamless process for making estate-sale goods accessible to interested buyers. That vision became a reality in 2008 when they hosted the first sale on EBTH.com.

In their words, the goal was to revolutionize "how homeowners, estate managers, dealers, and collectors connect with a world of shoppers seeking rare and wonderful things." Estate sales were and still are typically local, in-person events, held much like a yard sale. And even when items were listed online, buyers typically had to pick them up in person.

As Denny and Graves developed EBTH, they strove toward a very full-service model. That word "everything" became something of a double entendre alluding as much to their unparalleled service as the merchandise offered. In

an industry that stops short, EBTH does "everything" for their clients. The service starts with a specialist who reviews and initially vet the assets. Once contracted, the EBTH team quickly organizes, packs, and removes items from the home and transports them to the company's facility. There, the merchandise is researched, photographed, and described for online

At the heart of it all is the user-friendly EBTH.com platform. It features high-quality photos and detailed descriptions, making shopping as easy as browsing in person. Instead of being limited to a small local turnout, sellers can reach a global audience, creating more competi-

tion and better prices. EBTH reports that sellers typically earn 3 to 5 times more far exceeding the typical industry rates.

For buyers, the website offers the convenience of bidding from anywhere in the world. The selection is vast, including everything from mid-century modern furniture to artwork, jewelry, memorabilia, and collectibles. With no buyer's premium and listings starting at just \$1, the opportunities are enticing. Plus, purchases can be shipped directly to buyers.

EBTH began its journey in Cincinnati, focusing on building a strong local presence. As the company gained traction, it expanded to Columbus with a satellite facility, and by the mid-2000s, it had become one of Ohio's top 50 startups. This

success fueled further growth, leading the firm to open offices in cities like Atlanta, Washington D.C., and Los Angeles. Along the way, EBTH attracted high-profile clients, including actors Ted Danson and Susan Lucci, members of the Cincinnati Reds, and musician Jack White of the White Stripes. As their reputation grew, so did their visibility, culminating in a feature on HGTV for two seasons around 2020. Over the years, EBTH has handled extraordinary pieces, such as Jack White's 2013 Tesla, a rare Matisse aquatint, and even a team-signed Orlando Magic jersey, that included Shaquille O'Neal's autograph, formerly owned by Rich DeVos.

Eventually, EBTH returned to its roots - back to their Cincinnati and Columbus - focusing on sellers in Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana. Yet, their influence still extends far beyond. With nearly 3 million registered users and bidders from over 150 countries, EBTH sells more than 26,000 lots each month. They've also aligned with well-known entities like the National Association of Senior Move Managers, A Place for Mom, and multiple real estate firms to help assist households in transition.

Their ties and visibility translate into a constantly changing selection of thousands of curated, authenticated goods. A glimpse at some recently sold listings included a circa 42 AD Roman bronze Imperial Sestertius coin with UK provenance from Malter Galleries, which sold for \$968. A mid-century Willett Trans-East cherry cabinet and hutch reached

\$576, while a late 20th-century Henredon Chinese-style bar cabinet in mahogany, teak, and glass brought \$400. Even under \$100, there were treasures like a post-World War II cast-iron horse-drawn trailer toy that went for \$85.

The crop of upcoming auctions looks just as thrilling. Featured sales will showcase Bohemian and Mod styles, contemporary furnishings, folk art, vintage fashion, and more. Fans of 20th-century merchandise can look forward to items like a 1996 custom Rolex

Datejust watch with a diamond dial and bezel, currently at \$4,000, as well as a restorable mid-century Adrian Pearsall for Craft Associates gondola sofa, which has hit \$375. Collectibles enthusiasts will find vintage treasures like a half-dozen cast-iron banks, still sitting at just \$1

Ultimately, EBTH wasn't just about auctions - it was about legacy. Jacquie Denny described their mission as making

estate sales more accessible. But their deeper objective was to ensure "the items and their histories would be treated with respect." That blend of vision and respect has allowed Denny, Graves, and their team to transform a localized industry into a worldwide marketplace.

Freedom Auction will sell the Robert Houston circus collection

SARASOTA, Fla. — Freedom Auction Company of Sarasota will present a single day auction containing 1,100 lots on June 21. The bulk of the catalog is represented by Robert F. Houston's Collection. Houston, at age 85, has been collecting since his youth and has shuttered his Philadelphia Miniature Museum of the Circus, hoping that the artifacts find their way into the hands of a new generation of collectors.

The auction will contain more than 35 sideshow banners and 400-plus posters of the genre. Among the goods are human and man-made oddities along with paper, advertising and photographs. Items from the P.T. Barnum era include Barnumiana,

more than 92 million tons of textile waste annually, and that it takes 200 years for polyester fabrics to break down in landfills (long live disco?). Toxic dyes and untreated wastewater pollute rivers and ecosystems, and globally, the fashion industry relies on

more than 168 million laboring children. With those sobering facts in mind, Danielle outlined a game plan for women navigating the racks and racks of used clothing that served as her background that morning. Build a "capsule wardrobe" with the basics: denim jeans; black slacks; and white, light blue, and black button-down shirts and tees. Personalize the look with accessories and maybe even a boldly colored or patterned vintage piece or two. Purchase durable clothing and take care to extend the life of elements in your wardrobe, she added. Upcycle entire garments or usable parts of them. Don't forget to repair small damages and sew on loose buttons. All of which was a perfect segue into the session's final presentation.

A small but mighty group was on hand that morning, sewing machines and sewing kits at the ready, to conduct a nocharge Repair Café. These volunteers

regularly offer to replace zippers and hem garments, mend small tears and reweave what moth larvae have eaten. As part of the international movement "Transition," these talented (and giving) people donate

appliances, and jewelry, all in an effort to reduce waste.

The session wound down amidst a flurry of exchanged contact information among the participants. As for those who arrived at the session with an unwanted t-shirt, they

Barbie Suitcases

Levine reached an agreement. The results were the beginning of a line of vinyl carrying cases for Barbie, with early ones also including the words "by Ponytail." Cover illustrations of Barbie modeling some of her most iconic outfits (think "Enchanted Evening" and "Solo in the Spotlight") further promoted the sale of clothes for the doll.

Needless to say, it did not stop there. It was love at first sight when Barbara Millicent Roberts met Kenneth Sean Carson, Jr., and the "Ken" doll was introduced in 1961. Dating Barbie, Ken needed casual outfits as well as a tuxedo for formal occasions. Without a Dream House of his own, Ken's suitcases took on new importance. Marketed in 1963, they pictured him dressed for "Rally Day," as well as showcasing him as a "Campus Hero." Because there was no Ken without Barbie, his early suitcases often pictured his popular girlfriend as well, including one that featured the couple dressed in wedding attire, although there is no evidence that the pair ever met at the altar.

In 1961, the same year as Ken's introduction, Midge, Barbie's all-American friend, made her debut. To keep it simple, the two girl dolls shared clothing, and cases were designed to hold their interchangeable outfits. As Midge became more well known, a red case, just for her, was offered. And as Barbie's circle of friends continued to grow, an array of cases to hold their wardrobes were also produced.

Not surprisingly, collecting suitcases for Barbie and her friends has its challenges, according to Jimmie Bucci, collector extraordinaire and a longtime fan of all things Barbie. He pointed out that it is sometimes difficult to determine the age of cases, as many of them do not bear a date. Online, second-market sellers often take it upon themselves to assign a year to their various examples, which can prove to be inaccurate. For example, Bucci described one Barbie suitcase offered for sale that purported

to have been made in 1958; in light of the fact that this is one year before the introduction of the doll, it cannot be correct.

On a positive note, however, there is always something new for those collecting carrying cases designed for Barbie and her wide circle of friends. Some cases, Bucci said, were intended to hold only one doll, with a space on the left hand side of the case reserved for the doll and the one on the right for her clothes. Other cases had sections for two dolls. And then there are those examples that included two drop-down beds.

Bucci continued, noting that early suitcases often mirrored the look of "black patent leather," thanks to their bright sheen. But hunting for original cases made in a variety of colors is part of the fun of collecting, he said. Some black suitcases sported a matte finish, while others were light blue or pink; one known suitcase for Ken was lavender in color.

Because suitcases were not limited to Barbie and Ken, Bucci has enjoyed collecting suitcases marketed for an array of Barbie's friends (and combinations of them). Not to be forgotten is Skipper, who sometimes shares a suitcase with Scooter. And then there is Francie; Bucci said that a suitcase made for Barbie's "mod" friend is often "one of the highest priced suitcases." Of note, Bucci is unaware of any suitcases intended for Ken's friend Allan, although, in the 1990s, he did share a suitcase with Midge.

All of which adds to the thrill of the hunt for collectors. Although many Barbie-related collectables can be pricey, that is not the case with Barbie-related

totes. "Most can be picked up for \$10 to \$25," Bucci said, although "really rare" examples, found in near-mint condition, might command \$50 to \$60. Sometimes, carrying cases offered for sale include a doll and clothing, which results in a higher price, as opposed to those cases that are sold alone, he added. It seems that condition is not necessarily a determining factor for collectors.

And then there are the knock-offs, cases for "high fashion dolls" who stand 11½ inches tall (in heels) and "kind of look like Barbie." Bucci conceded that many collectors find these cases interesting, and collectable, as well.

But in the end, there is nothing like the real thing, as Bucci highlighted the appeal of the "great graphics" found on original cases. Back in the early 2000s, "people took covers from damaged cases and made them into tote bags and pocketbooks," he remembered. At least, he said, they preserved the artwork.
