# All the world's a stage with Broadway albums

What's the last Broadway tune you can recall that propelled itself up the pop music charts? Was it Judy Collins' plaintive "Send In The Clowns" (from "A Little Night Music")? Barbra Streisand's soulful "People" (from "Funny Girl")? Maybe it was Louis Armstrong, cheerfully growling out "Hello, Dolly!" (guess what show that's from).

Nowadays, you won't find pop stars peppering their releases with Broadway ballads. They know what sells, and fans aren't clamoring for show tunes. But once upon a time, they did. Tunes like "76 Trombones," "The Impossible Dream," and "Tomorrow" were popularized by big bands, belted out on the radio, and given the Hollywood treatment. For entertainers of the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, Broadway was an inexhaustible gold mine. Performers gave their unique "takes" on show tunes, and we happily listened to the results.

And records were the way people listened to these show tunes on the "original Broadway cast album."

The earliest cast albums were recorded in England, and were, oddly enough, of American shows with their London casts ("Show Boat," in 1928, was one of the first). Until the introduction of the LP ("long play") record in 1948, recording a show was an unwieldy process. A 78-rpm disc could only hold between 3 1/2 and 4 1/2 minutes of music per side. Recording a show's entire score would have required many more 78s than the five or six that could conveniently be packaged in a set. Less notable songs went unrecorded (or

at any rate, unreleased). Features considered non-essential, such as overtures, instrumental breaks, and verses, were truncated, or eliminated. And, while leading performers were usually called upon to repeat their stage successes for listening posterity, the chorus and orchestra were often just assembled for the recording, and had no connection to the stage presentation.

In 1943, Decca released the first recording that could truly be billed as featuring the "original Broadway cast": Rodgers and Hammerstein's "Oklahoma!" As before, the leads were the Broadway originals — but so were the chorus, the orchestra, and even the conductor. Issued as a set of 78s, "Oklahoma!" sold over one million copies. If you saw the show and loved it, reliving the musical thrills was now as close as your record

player.

Soon, it seemed as if every show was being committed to record. The debut of the LP, with a playing time of 40-50 minutes, meant that more of a show's score could be preserved, in approximately correct running order — all on one disc. There were the hits, such as "West Side Story," "South Pacific," and "My Fair

# **Crowd flocks to Spring Chicagoland**

GRAYSLAKE, Ill. — Once again, serious buyers plunked down \$50 each for early admission to the spring edition of the Chicagoland Juke Box Slot Machine and Advertising Show on May 30 and 31 at the Lake County Fairgrounds in Grays Lake, Ill. More frugal visitors waited a day and paid regular admission of \$10.

Serious – or just curious – those show goers rubbed shoulders with a sold-out crowd of vendors offering what one shopper said was "a mind-blowing mixture of nifty stuff that you'll ever see in one spot."

Slot machine collectors hovered around the booth of Frank Zygmunt, Westmont, Ill., for a closer look at his 1938 Jennings Tri-Plex slot machine which offered a chance to win with nickel, dime or quarter play – all on one machine. The dealer said the slot was "only one of a handful" he had seen over the years and priced it at \$8,000. His copper-finished 1910 Mills Little Duke nickel play slot with rotating base was tagged at \$15,000.

Two Wisconsin dealers that usually "wow" the crowd with their offering did it again.

Jack Freund, Lake Geneva, Wis., lined up three different color porcelain animated figure 1930-50s penny operated Pulver vending machines priced between \$1,275 and \$1,750 plus a 1910-era 16-inch-long oak construction penny operated counter-top Bicycle trade stimulator, tagged at \$3,350.

Fellow Wisconsin dealer Paul Hinden showed off a rare countertop Watling Fortune Teller machine that he said

was one of less than four known with asking price of \$3,795. He also showed off an oddball tin countertop 1940s apple vending machine that could deliver a healthy treat in apple orchards or novelty stores, tagged \$4295.

John and Michelle Costa said they drove 19 hours to the show from Pearland, Texas, in a 10-foot box truck and quickly sold a 4-by 6-foot porcelain and neon Budweiser Beer sign that was woodcrated and ready to move. The couple also offered a 1941 World War II -theme all-original 88-inch- tall Ace Bomber nickel- operated 300 shot arcade game that could test your skills for \$9,500. The first-time vendors said they operate the Drop-A-Coin Repair Shop back home for all sizes of coin-operated games.

Restored children's pedal cars filled the booth of Tony Thull, Darlington, Wis. Collectors of all ages checked out 11 different models, including one airplane and several motor boats, tagged at \$1,500 to \$2,400 each.

# Militaria ranks high in Gettysburg antique shops

GETTYSBURG, Pa. — If you're a history enthusiast, you likely understand the importance of the Battle of Gettysburg - and may have even visited Gettysburg National Military Park. Over three days, more than 50,000 soldiers from both sides were killed, wounded, or captured in one of the Civil War's most pivotal conflicts. Shortly after the Union victory, President Abraham Lincoln de-

livered the Gettysburg Address, dedicating the new Soldiers' National Cemetery. In just a few words, he honored the fallen and reaffirmed the nation's ideals of unity and equality.

Today, Gettysburg National Military Park commemorates the site of the pivotal 1863 Civil War battle. Spanning thousands of acres, it serves as both a solemn memorial and a living history site, conveying the scale and significance of the war's bloodiest conflict. If you haven't visited, any trip to Gettysburg should begin with a tour of the battlefield.

After exploring the battlefield, turn your attention to the town itself, which played a vital role during the conflict. For antique and history enthusiasts, local museums and historic sites offer rare opportunities to see authentic period artifacts in their original context. Even better, Gettysburg features exceptional antique shops, many specializing in military items — especially Civil War-

For collectors, it's a compelling destination where history becomes tangible, linking artifacts to the people and events they represent.

Gettysburg is located in southeastern

Pennsylvania, about an hour north of Baltimore and two hours east of Philadelphia. In the Civil War, its location at the junction of several major roads made



Bottled soda pop vending machines are a popular show item. Three different restored models were shown by Russ and Joann Newman, Elgin, Ill. They included a 1957 Dr. Pepper, \$5,600, 1958 Coca-Cola, \$5,800 and a 1959 Cavalier, \$6,000.

Still another Coke bottle vending machine, a 1950s all original Vendo offered by the father-son team, Robert and Nicholas Kindness of Pheasant Run, Ill. could cool soda at your home for \$1,800. Sign collectors checked out their 1950s 36-inch round Golden-Girl Soda pop tin sign.

Dealer Robert Wendland of Stevensville, Mich., said he was adding "some musical class" to his booth at Chicago by playing and offering an 1895 Brittania (England) double comb music box tabletop disc player. "The tones are very robust" said Wendland, who pointed out the mahogany wood construction and clock finial on the top front edge. Complete with 10 discs, it sported a price tag of \$5,995.

More than 1,000 vintage early tin toy cars, trucks and other countertop toys were displayed on layers of shelves by Dan Davis, who traveled to the show from Reno, Nev. "Prices range from \$100 to \$55,000 each and it takes me over 8 hours just to pack up" he said adding "I do over 40 shows each year, all over the country." He said one of his personal favorite toys was a larger 1920s Richfileld Toy Tanker priced at \$4,500.

Milwaukee dealer Nick Carini teamed up with Tim O'Donnell of Nashville,

Tenn., filling two booths with vintage coin-op machines. They priced a "rare" 1933 Mills "Catch the Ball" cast metal and wood trade stimulator at \$2,400, and 55-inch-tall Victor Triple-Viewer metal vending machine at \$800.

Otto Dorris and wife Karen once again drove to the show from Bixby, Okla., to show off unusual offerings, Many folks stopped to admire their 1920s fancy brim 28-inch-tall boudoir lamp with built-in brass speaker tagged at \$4,800 while others checked out their 1940s Indian Maiden-themed Old Gold Cigarettes 38-by 51-inch framed advertising sign priced at \$2,000.

An animated 30-by 48-inch 1960s tongue-licking milk cow advertising sign, priced at \$850, caught the attention of young and old alike. It was shown by Dave and Allie Smith, Bartlesville,

Okla. Brewery collectors hovered over their lushly-illustrated Peter Brau, New Jersey, beer tray tagged at \$1,750.

The spring show was the first event under the leadership of the new owners, Damon Granger and David Wolf, Granger Wolf Promotions. As the show ended, Granger said, "We knocked it out of the park with a sold-out dealer count and a full parking lot of visitors, and Dave and I are working hard on future show improvements."

Starting with the fall show, the massive event will be changing location to the Schaumburg Renaissance Event Center, Schaumburg, Ill., just 10 Miles from O'hare Airport. It was noted that the change will mean the entire event will held under one roof, with food. Lodging and similar needs at the same facility, just a right turn off the expressway.

it a key transportation and supply hub. This strategic value drew Confederate General Robert E. Lee to the area in 1863, hoping to disrupt Union logistics and score a decisive victory on Northern soil.

Today, Gettysburg is a quaint town known for its inviting, history-filled blocks. Friendly locals, with strong appreciation for the past, add richness to a visit. In the center of town, a roundabout links several lively streets: Baltimore Street runs east-west, York and Chambersburg Streets run north-south, and nearby Steinwehr Avenue parallels Baltimore Street. This compact, pedestrian-friendly district is perfect for exploring on foot. Within the walkable blocks, antique shops, bookstores, and gift stores showcase Civil War and other wartime artifacts - ranging from armaments and uniforms to battlefield photographs and soldiers' letters - offering a unique shopping experience deeply connected to the town's historic roots. If militaria interests you, be sure to catch the following great shops while in town:

Baltimore Street Books & Antiques (28 Baltimore Street) focuses on books with historical themes and also features military antiques - everything from firearms to battlefield surgical tools. Owner Colleen Stevens has been an area antique dealer for over 25 years, previously running the adjacent antique mall. When she relocated, she brought 25 of her dealers with her.

For the Historian Books and Miniatures (42 York Street) is one of Gettysburg's unique specialty stores. While

not an antique shop, it offers items that appeal to military collectors, including military history books, wartime ephemera, historic prints, and other artwork.

The Horse Soldier (219 Steinwehr Avenue) is a family-owned antique store started in 1971 with excavated relics like bullets and buckles being sold from their living room. After moving several times, they settled at their current location in 2010. The shop focuses on authentic Civil War items including artillery, edged weapons, insignias, military photographs, and wartime letters. In addition to their physical store, they maintain an extensive online presence.

Regimental Quartermaster (49 Steinwehr Avenue) has served collectors, living historians, and re-enactors for over 50 years. Founder George Lomas was a black powder enthusiast and re-enactor who took part in recreated skirmishes at Antietam, Gettysburg, and Manassas. Over the decades, he gathered original Civil War artifacts spanning cannons to uniform accouterments that helped launch the shop. Today, the store offers both authentic items and period-appropriate gear for re-enactors.

Just around the corner from the store is the free Lomas Center Museum (50 Mayor Alley). Though not a shopping venue, it's a must-visit for military history buffs. The museum displays 50 years of Lucas' collection, which chronicles American armed conflict from Colonial times through the 20th century. Exhibits include artillery, cannons, muskets, and guns - highlighted by the first U.S. 3-inch Ordnance Rifle, complete with patent documents, the most widely used artillery piece in the Union Army.

Union Drummer Boy (34 York Street) specializes in authentic Civil War artifacts and relics, including armaments, bullets, currency, flags, and tintypes. Owner Brendon Synnamon opened his first shop at just 12 years old. Today, he calls it a "museum where you can shop." Everything is 100 percent authentic no reproductions - and backed by thorough research, giving buyers well-documented histories with each purchase. Customers can also shop online, where relics from other campaigns, including World War II, are available.

Be sure to set aside time to visit the Farnsworth House Inn (401 Baltimore St) for a meal or a stay. The inn's Civil War history is remarkable - from the attic window where a Confederate sharpshooter once nested to the dozens of bullet holes left by those trying to stop

him. The tavern restaurant was a favorite of the "Gettysburg" cast during filming, and many still visit today. Along the restaurant's walls, you can browse costumes and set props from the movie.

# A Gothic revival wall clock ticks off \$6,500 bid

YPSILANTI, Mich. — Schmidt's Auctioneer hosted its Spring Clock Auction, showcasing over 160 exquisite timepieces. Presented were antique floor, table, and wall clocks, along with a selection of fine watches, representing craftsmanship from



American, European, and Asian makers. These pieces originated from collections and estates from Indiana, Michigan, New York, and Ohio — many sourced from a single, distinguished collector.

Bidding was particularly strong for the wall clocks, with two commanding the auction's highest prices. Leading the sale at \$6,500 was a late 19th-century Gothic Revival bracket clock, complete with its bracket, originally sold by Camerer, Cuss & Co., London. It featured an engraved silvered dial, 8-day triple train fusee movement with quarter-hour chiming on eight bells and coiled gongs for the hours. The cathedral-form oak case was extensively carved, with an arched peak, corner spires, and a carved frieze. In good condition, with its original finish, it showed only minor repairs and wear.

Next in line was a circa-1912 Lenzkirch open-well variety that hit \$5,500. It had an 8-day spring-driven time and strike movement, and cast brass dial with porcelain markers. The Craftsman-style rosewood case was richly decorated with an arched crown, turned finials, cast columns, a cast dial door, and an Apollo compensating pen-

# **Steinway Concert Grand** to take note at Fontaine's

PITTSFIELD, Mass. — Hot on the heels of its \$6 million auction of Tiffany Studios glass masterworks in May, Fontaine's Auction Gallery will present a two-day Fine and Decorative Arts auction June 21-22 to include over 850 lots of 19th/20th century lighting, art glass, leaded glass windows, fine silver, porcelain, marble and bronze statuary, paintings, Aesthetic Movement items, American and European furniture, clocks, watches and jewelry.

Auction highlights will feature fine table lamps, including nearly two dozen Duffner & Kimberly lamps. Standouts include a rare "Poppy" floor lamp (\$70/90,000), circa 1910, standing 71 inches tall and having a 28-inch diameter shade; a "Wisteria" table lamp (\$25/\$35,000), circa 1915, 28 ½ inches tall with a 21¼ -inch diameter shade, and a "Louis XVI" table lamp (\$20/30,000), circa 1910, 31 inches tall and with 21-inch diameter shade.

Fine art will be well represented in this sale, led by an oil on canvas by Maqbool Fida Husain (Indian, 1913-2011) titled "Raging Horse" (\$20/30,000) and a rare Demetre Chiparus "Friends Forever" sculpture with a matching base, standing 66 inches tall. Also of interest is a Dan Garrett (American, b 1948) bronze sculpture of an Indian chief (\$12/16,000), measuring 55 by 86 by 13 inches.

Expected to hit a high note in the auction is an 1865 rosewood Steinway Concert Grand Piano (\$35/50,000). The 88-note piano, measuring 8 feet 5 inches long, is fully restored with a custom hand-carved bench and retains the original rocker action with Abel Natural hammers.

While sublime examples of Tiffany glassworks shone bright at Fontaine's last month, silver standouts expected to put a gleam in bidders' eyes in June include a rare Tiffany & Co. sterling silver seven-piece tea and coffee service (\$25/35,000), circa 1853. Each piece is marked "Tiffany & Co., Quali-

Lavishly decorated, the grouping comprises a large tray, coffee pot, hot milk jug, two tea pots, covered sugar and creamer.

Rounding out the auction will be a monumental Belcher Mosaic Glass Co. three-part floral window (\$15/25,000) from the early 20th century, measuring 231 by 48 ½ inches overall; a contemporary Rolex Yacht-Master II, Ref. 116681M wristwatch in 18K gold and Oyster steel (\$12/16,000) and a circa 1900 Gallé (1846-1904) cameo glass "Chrysanthemum" vase, conservatively estimated at \$800-\$1,200, and standing 8¾ inches tall.

dulum. It showed only small flaws.

The other four dozen sold from \$80 for a late 19th-century Junghans Dwarf German model in restorable condition, with a walnut cabinet and 8-day spring-driven time and strike movement, up to \$2,300 for a late 20th-century Elmer O. Stennes "L. Curtis Patent" Girandole clock in good condition, with an 8-day weight-driven time-only movement housed in a shaped mahogany case with extensive brass and glass detailing.

Twenty regulators, mostly wall-type, were also available. Bidding hit \$2,100 for a good-condition 20th-century one-weight Vienna three-dial calendar example. Its crested walnut case housed an 8-day







weight-driven time-only movement and a two-part porcelain dial and day/date dials within molded brass bezels. A 19th-century Vienna regulator in a serpentine cabinet, with a 30-day weight-driven time-only movement and two-part porcelain dial, reached \$1,600. A modest \$200 scored a 19th-century Gustav Becker Vienna wall regulator. Its Altdeutsch-style walnut case held an 8-day weight-driven time-andstrike movement with a two-part porcelain dial.

While several regulators featured calendars, nearly two dozen other clocks were calendar models. A late 19th-century Ithaca "Index" model shelf clock sold for \$950. In walnut, its 8-day time and strike movement featured a lower calendar mechanism using papered metal disks to indicate day and month. It showed refinishing, re-papered dials, and some replaced glass. Meanwhile, a late 19th-century Waterbury Oswego shelf clock brought \$225. Housed in an oak cabinet with pressed details, it had an 8-day time, strike, and alarm movement, plus a lower calendar mechanism with papered metal disks for day and month. It also showed refinishing, re-papered dials, and some glass replacement.

Turning to table clocks, two dozen attracted their share of attention. Bids soared to \$2,300 for a circa 1900s Lenzkirch bronze clock with a Bacchanalian motif. Its two-tone bronze form featured Putti on a keg and Satyr supports on a filigree base. It housed a 14-day time and strike movement with a cast dial, filigree hands, and red enamel inlay. An early 19th-century French Empire gilded bronze mantel clock later sold for \$1,700. Its gilded composition, attributed to Louis-Isidore Choiselat (Choiselat-Gallia), displayed Orpheus holding a harp beside a torch, wreath, and lute surrounding the dial. Other table and mantel clocks sold more modestly, including the \$100 bid that won a circa 1900s Japy Freres mantel clock with an 8-day time and strike movement in a gilded allegorical figure Spelter form.

The auction's momentum continued with a half-dozen floor and hall clocks. A circa 1900 German hall clock reached \$2,600. The walnut cabinet featured a shaped crest, carved foliage, and fluted pilasters. Inside was an 8-day time-and-strike move-

ment with an etched brass dial, matching weights and pendulum. The older finish showed some wear and damage. Close behind at \$2,500 was a circa-1900 Austrian hall clock by Johann Salfer, Wien. Also walnut, the case had a fruit basket finial on a molded crown, fluted columns, and a stepped base. It featured a 30-day time-only movement with an engraved brass dial, silvered chapter ring, and subsidiary seconds dial. It took just \$500 to score a good-condition late 20th-century oak hall clock, with brass ornamentation, an arched crown, and scalloped crest. It had an 8-day weight-driven time and strike movement, embossed brass dial, silvered chapter ring, and cast pendulum bob.

Pocket watches also generated lively bidding, with five hitting four figures. A 14k gold AWW Co. "Appleton Tracy & Co." model sold for \$4,000. Weighing in at 153.4 grams, the 18-size, 15-jewel watch featured a gilded full plate, 14k gold cuvette, and key wind/set from the rear. It was in solid condition with just minor issues. Next, an early 20th-century Patek Philippe 18k gold pocket watch made for Cowell & Hubbard

Co., Cleveland, sold for \$3,750. The 44mm 18k open-face watch, under an 18k cuvette, bore several markings, including a 1905 inscription attributed to Cleveland's notable Arthur P. Williamson. It was in running condition with only small flaws.

Offerings even extended to quality wristwatches, including a 14k yellow gold Hamilton with a Packard Motor Car dial, that landed \$500. Measuring 20 by 27mm and weighing 26.3 grams, the "Brock" model gentleman's watch was manual wind, 19 jewel, 982 movement, with a silvered dial and subsidiary seconds. It showed slight wear, including a replaced leather band. Another \$500 secured a 1927 Chevrolet Used Car Sales Quota Award wristwatch with a "radiator" body. This Etna manual-wind Swiss watch had a 15-jewel, 3-adjustment movement, silvered dial, and a hinged cover inscribed on the rear cover. It had a replaced leather band and showed some wear.






# **Broadway**

Lady"; the semi-hits, such as 1960's "Wildcat," (its main selling point, TV's "Lucy"-- Lucille Ball -- croaking her way through the bouncy "Hey, Look Me Over"); and lots and lots of no-hits-at-all, such as a musicalization of "Gone With The Wind," complete with an onstage burning of Atlanta.

Scores of movie musicals were also recorded, but there's an important distinction. "Original cast" albums refer to recordings made of a stage presentation, generally recorded in a studio, soon after a production's opening. The goal: to create an accurate representation of what would be heard in the theatre, minus glitches and, in most cases, audience response.

An "original Broadway cast album" means that the show played on the

Great White Way, with substantially the same personnel as heard on the recording. A "studio cast" recording indicates performers have simply been selected for the recording session, with no inherent attachment to a specific production. And, if you write a musical that makes its debut in Hoboken, and are lucky enough to have it recorded there, you'll certainly wind up with an "original cast album". . .just not an original Broadway cast album.

A movie recording is a soundtrack, its selections taken from tracks prerecorded for the film. Although the goal is to present what audiences have seen and heard onscreen, there are exceptions. Sometimes, pre-recorded songs are edited, or cut entirely before a movie opens, due to time limitations or artistic considerations.

Make no mistake about it: during the 1950s and '60s, Broadway cast albums were very popular. Just thumb through the records on offer at nearly every garage sale. Chances are, you'll find well-played copies of such past Broadway blockbusters as "The Music Man," and " My Fair Lady." Each reigned for a time in the #1 spot of Billboard's list of album best-sellers. And, what would a collection of cast albums be without "The Sound of Music?" In 1960, the Mary Martin-led stage recording, decked out with a "deluxe gatefold jacket", spent 16 weeks at #1. The 1965 movie soundtrack recording, starring Julie Andrews, did even better: to date, it's sold over twenty million copies.

"The Sound of Music" is a good case






Above: One of the biggest stage (and LP) hits of the 1950s: "West Side Story." 1957, Columbia.

in point for puzzling out just why folks collect Broadway cast albums. Since the show's opening night in 1959, over 60 different versions of "The Sound of Music's" score have been recorded, including renditions in Spanish, Italian, French, and German, plus the original Brazilian cast vocalizing "Do-Re-Mi" in Portuguese. There's even a specialty release featuring the Trapp Family Singers, whose dramatic life story provided the musical's inspiration. The determined cast album collector wants to acquire every variation. Why? Because they're out there.

When the CD made its appearance in the 1980s, musical fans were overjoyed. Approximately 80 minutes of a new show's score, (even more on double-disc sets), could now be immortalized. Dialogue intros, instrumental breaks, and even "cut" numbers created a comprehensive theatrical experience. There were also re-issues of shows originally released on 78s, (with missing numbers restored), plus re-issues of older, lesser-known productions, previously available only on hard-to-find, pricey, LPs.

Even in their tiny boxes, Broadway musical CDs retain a sense of tradition. Little booklets filled with show photos, original art, anecdotes, and song lyrics are tucked inside. It may take a magnifying glass, but reading a CD insert is almost as satisfying as reading

the liner notes on the back cover of an LP. Almost.

Thanks to the streaming proliferation in recent years, prices of original cast LPs and CDs have dropped drastically. Even the rarest rarely top \$100, and most can be acquired for well under \$20. For the adventurous, there are always all those garage sales, with their stacks of vintage records piled high. Paw past "Sound of Music." Make a detour around "My Fair Lady." Sooner or later, you're bound to find a forgotten treasure lurking amongst the "regulars."
