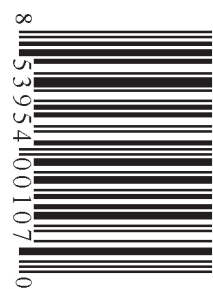

Don't wait until Christmas for the perfect table cover

Most people would agree that now is not the time to be decking the halls with boughs of holly. Nor is this the season to be jolly. For that matter, isn't it a bit too hot outside to be celebrating with a "blazing yule"? On the other hand, for many vintage tablecloth lovers, collecting Christmas-themed table linens is a year-round activity. And there is no better time than now to get a head start on the holiday season, according to longtime collector Jimmie Bucci.

Beginning in the 1930s and stretching into the 1970s, "tons of companies" manufactured Christmas tablecloths to suit every taste and holiday decor, Bucci said. With a tablecloth to fit every budget, Christmas linens, sometimes in boxed sets with matching napkins, were sold at a range of shops, including high-end department stores. A popular size was an oblong tablecloth measuring 54 by 62 inches, suitable for either a kitchen or dining room table. Square cloths measuring approximately 36 by 36 to 52 by 52 inches were perfect for a hostess' card table. Designs ranged from traditional to whimsical in nature. The best tablecloth was used on Christmas Day.

As family life in America changed and became more informal, a freshly ironed tablecloth was no longer a priority. But decades later, the status of tablecloths seems to have been elevated as people rediscovered these examples of kitchen textile art. In the summer of 2002, the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club (VTLC) was formed. And thanks to dedication and perseverance, the online club remains active, providing support to both new and seasoned tablecloth aficionados.

As president of VTLC, Bucci noted that even though Christmas carols might not be on their playlist, many antique malls are celebrating "Christmas in July." Yard sales abound with out-of-season offerings. And a recent check of eBay listings revealed nearly 8,000 "vintage Christmas tablecloths" for sale. Starting a new collection or adding to an existing one might be the perfect antidote to the summertime blues, he suggested.

Fortunately, starting a collection of vintage holiday-themed tablecloths need not be an expensive undertaking, Bucci

continued. A decent cloth with a typical design (poinsettias, candles, and holly, for instance) can be found for as little as \$10. On the other hand, for many serious collectors consider a Calaprint tablecloth that depicts cheery snowmen (and women) to be the "holy grail" of Christmas tablecloths. "It could sell in the range of \$200," Bucci estimated.

Another highly prized example is a stylish cloth designed by Pat Pritchard. Its memorable graphics, which include a "hip" Santa, coy reindeer, and a wassail bowl, pop, thanks to a color scheme of black and white, metallic gold and pink. In good condition, one on which the gold metallic is intact, could easily sell for \$300. Somewhere in between are interesting (and amusing) choices; among Bucci's favorites is a tablecloth that pictures a jack-in-the-box Santa,

his head on a spring, with the elves looking on.

Among those linen companies that produced what are now collectable tablecloths are "Willendur" (renamed "Willendure" in 1959.) Makers of a Christmas tablecloth that stretches 102 inches long, the company is valued for linens that do not fade. Bucci added

Flash Gordon sending collectors and fans into orbit

In the 1930s matinee movie idol Buster Crabbe stepped into the role of Flash Gordon starting a craze for space toys that is still going strong.

Flash Gordon was created and originally drawn by Alex Raymond in 1934. The comic strip was created to compete with the already popular Buck Rogers strips. Flash Gordon would go on to become a smash success, which resulted in a number of licensed products being sold, including books, comics, toy spaceships and toy ray guns.

Flash Gordon appeared in several serial films from 1936 to 1940, and even. The serial films starred Crabbe as Flash Gordon and Charles Middleton as Ming the Merciless. They were immensely popular at the time and established Flash Gordon as a household name.

According to Justin Pinchot, an expert on vintage space toys and tin robots, the space toy craze began when Louis Marx & Co. released the Flash Gordon Radio Repeater in 1937. It was a lithographed-tin gun that made a clicking sound when the trigger was pulled. This toy flooded the market.

In the early 1940s, Marx released several space-age masterpieces: the Radio Repeater, the Steel Siren Gun, Rocket Racer and the Air-Ray Blaster. The latter let out a blast of air, good for blowing away those little aliens oftentimes sold in gumball machines.

In 1978, Mego released a small Flash Gordon toy line. Included in the series were four figures: Flash Gordon, Dale Arden, Dr. Zarkov and Ming the Merciless. A small playset was also released with the figures. Mego's toy line did not sell particularly well at the time, but

have grown in appreciation over the years.

For Mattel, 1979 and 1980 were prosperous for the company when promoting Flash Gordon figures. The company released eight Flash Gordon figures and Sears Catalog was the sales vehicle. The series "The New Adventures of Flash Gordon" appeared on NBC during those two years. The film series was short-lived, but the toys were popular back and are a hot treasure for collectors today.

The Flash Gordon Live Action Movie was released by Universal Pictures in 1980, spawning even greater interest in Flash Gordon figures. While Flash Gordon was the sought after super hero, so too were his friends and foes. Sought

1979 Yamaha motorcycle flew out with \$1,100 bid

TOLEDO, Ohio — Leonard's Auction Service recently offered a 621-lot online auction which included signs, antiques, jewelry, firearms, and a 1979 motorcycle. One additional category was the dispersal of 20 rental storage units. The prices here do not include the buyer's premium.

Leading the pack was a 1979 Yamaha XS750F motorcycle that was an innovative design for its time. With a smooth running engine, sturdy handling, and improvements to the suspension and drive train, this model was awarded a



top ten recognition by Cycle magazine and "Machine of the Year" in the U.K.'s Motorcycle News. The odometer read 15,354 miles, the manuals were included with the bike, and it was reported to run in the past, but hadn't been recently started. It earned a final bid of \$1,100.

Vintage metal signs always sell well. A brilliant yellow and red "You'll Love Squirt" tin advertising sign was labeled Copyright 1942, The Squirt Company. Measuring 41 inches by 15 inches, it was housed in a narrow red frame. This single-sided, embossed sign was in very good condition and was claimed with a final bid of \$625. There was also a Ful-O-Pep Action Feed Service tin advertising sign. The cream colored sign with red and black lettering measured 3 by 6 feet and was produced by the Stout Sign Company of St. Louis. In very good con-

after were Ming the Merciless, ruler of planet Mongo and enemy of Flash; Thun the Lion Man, Flash's most trusted ally; Beast Man, ruler of the Beast Men of planet Mongo; Dr. Zarkov, scientist and friend to Flash; Captain Arak, captain in Ming's army on Mongo; and Vultan, ruler of the Hawk People on planet Mongo.

Next came the "Defenders of the Earth" in 1986, as Galoob won the licensing to this line of Flash Gordon toys. The toy line produced by Galoob was fairly well-received by fans at the time. It contained a total of six different figures, along with accessories and five unique vehicles. In addition to the Flash Gordon character, there was Garax, the most villainous robot in the galaxy, Lothar, a military genius among the group, and Mandrake the Magician, an expert in hypnotic deception.

Next up was another Flash Gordon TV animated series, this one launched in 1996. The series lasted just one season. Playmates secured the toy licensing rights to the show and released its action figure line in 1996, with eight different figures, along with an assortment of accessories.

That same year, Playmates released eight different action figures for their Flash Gordon line. There was Dale Ar-

den, Prince Talon, Ming and Merciless, General Lynch, Princess Thundar, Kobalt the Mercenary and two versions of the title character Flash Gordon.

The Flash Gordon enthusiasm waned only slightly at the turn of the century, and Bif Bang Pow caught the attention of collectors across the globe in several different formats. Their first action figure line was a seven-inch figures in 2007, followed by a second wave in 2008. A new retro eight-inch series debuted in

2010, before shifting to a 2.75-inch retro series in 2015, which was reminiscent of Mattel's vintage toy lines of old.

Bob Minton, a regular vendor and seller of space toys at the monthly Flea Market, Antique & Art Show in Champaign County (Ohio), says the outlook for Flash Gordon collectibles looks pretty bright. He receives inquiries about Flash Gordon at each monthly show.

"The vintage sci-fi collectible market remains popular due to an ever-present nostalgia of kids who once read the books

or comics, and grew up watching the animated shows and live action films of the 1980s," Minton said. "There's still a loyal fan base. This certainly bodes well for Flash Gordon fans and collectors.

dition, it went home with a final bid of \$330. A diamond-shaped RC Cola sign measuring 2 feet tall left with a \$145 final bid.

A few firearms also performed well. A sleek Ruger model 10/22 Carbine .22LR semi-automatic long rifle from Sturm, Ruger, and Company Inc. was clean with a handsome wood stock. Excellent for small game hunting, this rifle was taken home with a final bid of \$350. In contrast, there was a vintage Preduzece 44 model 98 8mm Mauser bolt-action rifle, likely from the late 1940s or early 1950s. It had some wear to the stock and pitting in the metal but was still in very good condition and also earned a final bid of \$350. A Winchester Trap 12GA shotgun model 12 with soft case drew a \$250 final bid.

Baseball fans had a couple of fun options to consider. There was a Cooperstown Detroit Tigers Major League Baseball autographed bat that had a picture of a growling tiger head and the words Detroit Tigers. It displayed a list of the years that the team became the American League Champions and the years they won the World Series. There was also an impressive collection of autographs on the bat, including Al Kaline, Alan Trammell, plus others. The one caveat was that there was no certificate of authenticity, so the buyer would be responsible for verifying the legitimacy. It pulled a victorious final

bid of \$355. Not far behind, an Upper Deck Frank Thomas autographed bat with COA, original box, and bag was taken with a final bid of \$335.

Beautiful jewelry was also found at this sale. A 14K yellow gold flat braid bracelet that weighed 5.36 grams was marked 585 Italy. Unlatched it measured 8 inches long. The triple strands created an intricate pattern. This lovely piece was rehomed with a final bid of \$270. A bold Native American silver and turquoise cluster bracelet featured 34 stones of varying sizes and shapes. They were framed in silver tooling and supported by a large cuff bracelet. The front measured 3 inches across the stone portion. It was claimed with a final bid of \$180. A slightly smaller Native American bracelet contained a central turquoise stone framed by two coral stones and intricate leaf patterns in silver. It drew a final bid of \$110. A Native American silver and turquoise, coral bear claw ring size 9 left with a

high bid of \$80.

Uranium glass provides a fascinating image when illuminated by a black light. The Harrach opalescent uranium glass Art Nouveau diamond pattern rose bowl was decorated with applied flowers. It appeared plain white, but when exposed to the black light it took on a blue green hue. Measuring 5 inches tall, this delicate bowl was taken with a final bid of \$170. A vintage Bryce Bros Lorne yellow uranium art glass 8-inch-long covered butter dish with lacy detail on the edges was transformed from clear glass to a glowing green with the black light. It realized a final bid of \$155. An ornate Fenton artist signed hand painted Burmese uranium glass fairy lamp was a faint shade of pink until illuminated. It was claimed with a high bid of \$130.

To set a nostalgic scene, a Cavalier C51 Coca-Cola coin operated vending machine boldly proclaimed, "Drink Coca-Cola in bottles" with the promise that it would be "Ice Cold". The 68 inch tall, rounded corner metal red and white frame was in rough condition with paint loss, cracks, and rust. The remaining parts were all original, including the power cord, but it had not been tested. It still drew a respectable final bid of \$270.

Then there were the 20 rental storage units. They were auctioned off with the provision that they were a cash-only transaction, and a \$100 deposit would be collected before the winning bidder

would be allowed to enter. All contents of a unit would be sold for one inclusive price and the entire unit needed to be emptied and cleaned within a week before the deposit would be returned. The highest selling 10 foot by 10 foot unit was #4152. The photo taken from the front view through the door revealed a rolling toolbox, hand cart, power washer, jumper cables, a microwave, Huffy bicycle, JBL speakers, fireplace heater, and other tools and household items. It was claimed with a final bid of \$230. Other storage units earned final bids from \$1 up to \$105 and a few remained unsold.

Collectors can ride into the sunset with Western LGBs

Baby Boomers and Old West collectors are both familiar with the Golden Age of TV Westerns. Let us return now to those thrilling days of yesteryear when The Lone Ranger and other western heroes rode for justice in the Old West.

On June 24, 1949, NBC premiered the first western television show — Hopalong Cassidy, starring William Boyd. The years 1940 through 1960 have been called the “Golden Age” of Western movies in Hollywood, but the earliest of television westerns were written primarily for a children’s audience. It wasn’t until 1955 when, with near-simultaneous debuts, The Life and Legend of Wyatt Earp and Gunsmoke brought adult Westerns to television. Westerns quickly became enormously popular. In 1959 alone, there were more than 30 different Westerns on television stations in America. However, by 1971, television production

companies acknowledged, “The Western in Hollywood is dead.” The two last traditional Westerns, Death Valley Days and Gunsmoke, ended their TV runs in 1975.

Western heroes may have been born in the 1950s world of television, but they have lived on for generations of children in Little Golden Books.

Chances are good that you have owned one or more Little Golden Books in your life. Their monetary value has risen right along with their value as collectibles. Today, expect to pay as much as much as \$50 or more for some TV western titles with the average price of a western Little Golden Book, in good condition, to be around \$10.

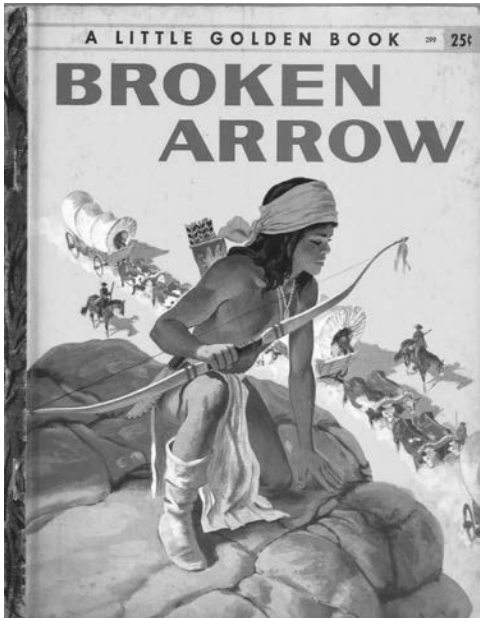
The Artists and Writers Guild, a subsidiary of Western Publishing and Lithographing Company of Racine, Wis., first published Little Golden

Books, in association with Simon & Schuster in 1942. There were 12 original Little Golden Books, and 1.5 million of them sold the first year. However, none of these original 12 books were westerns. Each book at that time cost 25 cents. Despite changes in detail over the years, the Little Golden Books maintain a distinctive appearance. A copy of The Poky Little Puppy (the top-selling children’s book of all time in the United States) bought today is essentially the same as one originally printed in 1942. So far over 1,600 Little Golden Books have been published and, according to Random House Kids, over two billion Little Golden Books have been printed, which is enough to “reach the moon.”

Mint condition Little Golden Books are rare since they were published for young children who colored in them, chewed on them, and transferred dirt and sticky candy from hand to page in nearly all of them. But even with these imperfections, popularity continues to make prices soar on the secondary markets, especially with rare western-themed books.

Collectors specializing in Western-themed Little Golden Books based on

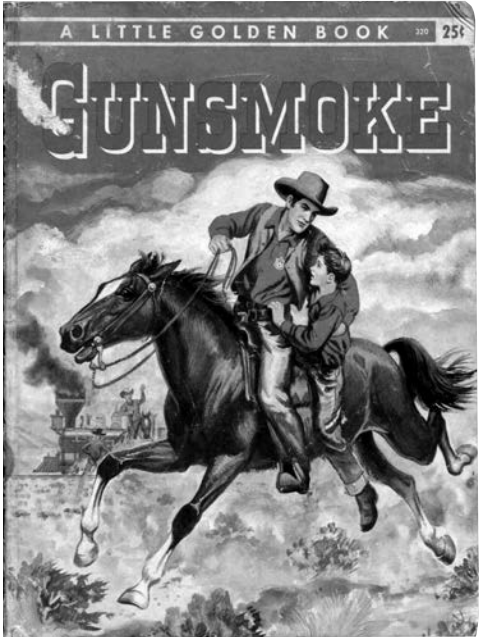


Above: Broken Arrow, from 1957, is valued at \$10.

vintage television shows and movies search for The Lone Ranger (1956), Roy Rogers (1954), Broken Arrow (1957), The Tales of Wells Fargo (1958), and Walt Disney’s Davy Crockett (1955). Other popular western Little Golden Books include Hopalong Cassidy, Wyatt Earp, Fury, Maverick, Gene Autry, Cheyenne, Lassie, and Rin Tin Tin.

Good condition or, rarely, mint condition books bring much higher prices and add prestige and depth to any collection.

If you are new to collecting Little Golden Books, don’t overlook their greatest value. Little Golden Books were printed for children and intended for those children to read them and play hard with them. So pull some of your collection off of the shelf, have your child or grandchild sit on your lap or next to you on the sofa, and read the books to them. These are the times when the memories are more valuable than the books will ever be, and by reading the books, the westerns we grew up with will live again in future generations of children and collectors.

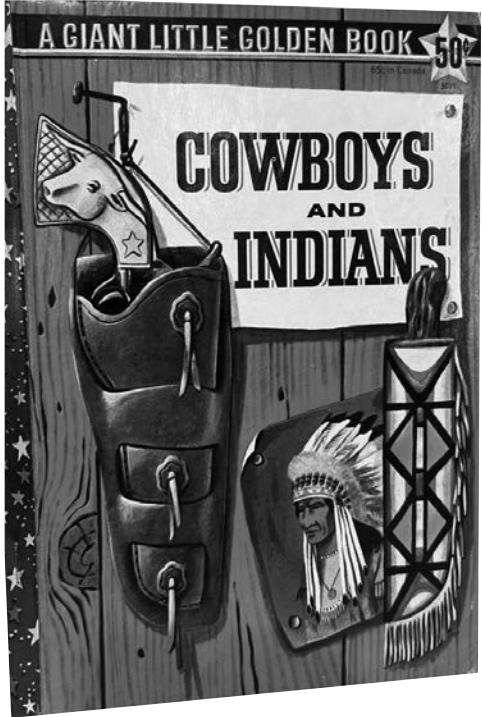

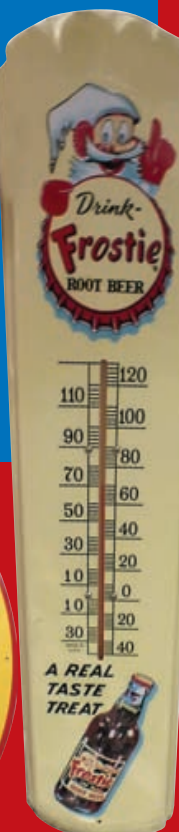

Christmas Tablecloths

that sometimes, the only indication that a Willendur (or Willendure) tablecloth has been used is a frayed label. California Hand Prints, another favored manufacturer, marked every one of the tablecloths with a cloth label. Identifying them is complicated if the tag was removed. And because “vintage” now extends into the 1970s, Christmas table linens by Vera now fall into this category.

Understandably, the condition of vintage tablecloths may vary, therefore affecting its value. Bucci said that many decades-old linens can be found in mint condition, saved for a special occasion that never occurred, or put aside in a cedar chest because it was too nice to use. As a result, he said that estate sales are often a good place to find tablecloths in excellent condition. On the other hand, others have been the backdrop for many family holiday gatherings and might have residual stains and tears. Bucci credited members of the VTLC with sharing methods to restore soiled tablecloths that are in otherwise good condition.

Which brings serious collectors to the question: To use or not to use? When a tablecloth is found in mint condition with a paper tag, “you have to decide if you’re going to keep it that way or use it as it was originally intended,” he said

Like other popular collectibles, vintage Christmas tablecloths have been (and are being) reproduced. But for the seasoned collector, there are ways to help identify those that are not originals. The cotton fabric that was used to make early tablecloths feels heavier than the fabric of newer ones (“you can tell by feeling it,” Bucci said). Additionally, while new tablecloths are seamed on all four sides, only two sides of older cloths were stitched, with selvage edges on the other two. There are subtle differences as well. Sometimes, what was black on the original cloth appears to be brownish on the copy. And finally, reproduction tablecloths often fade with the first washing. Bucci said he doesn’t have a

problem with using a reproduction tablecloth as long as it is recognized as such. “Just don’t expect it to last.”

Even after years of collecting, there are still new discoveries to be made. Although Bucci has seen tablecloths with wisemen, angels, and twinkling stars, “I’ve never seen one with the nativity scene.”

But if it’s out there, rest assured that members of the VTLC will track it down. Bucci explained that to date, club members have identified some 183 different patterns on its online database, one that lists more than 3,000 tablecloths by name, pattern type (be it, for instance, an overall design), theme, and keyword.

Today, vintage Christmas tablecloths are an easy way to decorate the home throughout the holiday season. Bucci continued that these tablecloths are

suitable for use on both kitchen and dining room tables. “I definitely have enough that I could do a different one every day, beginning when Thanksgiving is put away.” If a cloth is too small to cover a table, he suggested layering it diagonally over a solid-colored cloth. Folded tablecloths can double as dresser scarves or table runners, used on a coffee table or at the foot of a bed. Regardless of where and how they are used, vintage Christmas tablecloths “add a touch of hominess that fits in with the holiday.” What else would you expect from the president of a club whose stated mission is “Making the world a cozier place, one table at a time”?
