
From a simple sketch Mr. Peanut grew into an icon

When 13-year-old Antonio Gentile entered a pencil sketch of an animated peanut in a 1916 logo contest, he couldn't have imaged how his life - and the history of advertising – would be altered.

The contest was held by the Planters Nut & Chocolate Company, founded in 1908 in Wilkes Barre, Pa., by 31-year-old Italian immigrant Amedeo Voltejo Obici. Obici had been working as a fruit vendor when he decided one day to invest in a peanut roaster. Calling himself "The Peanut Specialist," he peddled his bags of warm nuts from a horse-drawn wagon. In 1906, he invited Mario Peruzzi into the business. Peruzzi had developed a unique method of blanching whole-roasted peanuts. With two peanut roasters and six employees, the duo called their venture "Planters." Two years later, they incorporated as "The Planters Nut & Chocolate Company." By 1913, they had grown successful enough to open a mass production facility in Suffolk, Va.

Obici decided in 1916 that his company needed a logo. Amateur artists were invited to submit drawings, with the winning sketch to be utilized in future advertising. Gentile of Suffolk City, Va., entered the contest. The son of Italian immigrants, his father was a tailor in a clothing store with a wife and numerous children to support. Gentile's sketch of a peanut with limbs, a walking stick, a face and the name "Mr. P. Nut Planter" won the \$5 prize. It also won the personal attention of Obici who befriended the Gentile family and financed the Gentile's education, who went on to become a surgeon.

adding a monocle, shoes and a top hat. Mr. Peanut first appeared to the public in the Feb. 23, 1918 edition of The Saturday Evening Post. He went on to grace the containers of everything Planters sold from cooking and salad oil, to peanut butter, old-fashioned peanut candy, chocolate-covered nuts, salted almonds, cashews and pecans. Five-cent bags of Planters peanuts were billed as "The Nickel Lunch" and Mr. Peanut spoke from the pages of magazines and store billboards, announcing that peanuts eaten between meals "give you 2-1/2 hours of extra pep" and are always "fresh, crisp and munchy."

Mr. Peanut gained his own newspaper comic strip during the 1930s titled "Mr. Peanut's Nutty History," having become known as "the symbol of quality nut products." He made appearances on a number of promotional items such the Mr. Peanut charm bracelet which could

also contained the image of Mr. Peanut. He graced stickers and swizzle sticks, coffee cups, banks and books. Mr. Peanut would become one of the best-known advertising icons in history. Sadly, his creator would not live long enough to see the image he once committed to paper inspiring everything from toys to household décor.

On Nov. 16, 1939, Dr. Antonio Gentile

Postal appointment by Benjamin Franklin stamps \$75,000 bid


DALLAS, Texas — A rare postal appointment by Benjamin Franklin, the first U.S. Postmaster General, stamped its way to \$75,000, (including buyer's premium), topping the list of almost 400 items at Heritage Auctions' recent event.

The rare document, signed "B. Franklin" and dated September 25, 1775, named William Ellery as deputy postmaster of Hartford, Conn.

Franklin had been appointed Postmaster General by the Continental Congress in July of 1775 but his service was brief. By the following summer he was helping draft the Declaration of Independence and by October 1776 he was headed to France to solicit military and diplomatic support for the Colonies' war effort.

Franklin's name was among dozens of historical personalities highlighting the wide-ranging auction that realized \$1,146,960 for Heritage.

Treasure hunting in New Oxford, the antiques capital of central Pennsylvania

NEW OXFORD, Pa. — Just 10 miles east of Gettysburg, New Oxford, Pa., has earned a reputation as the antiques capital of central Pennsylvania, becoming a stomping ground for antiques shoppers in the Keystone State. Each year, thousands of collectors, dealers, and treasure hunters visit to browse the many antique shops and enjoy the town's biannual antique markets.

New Oxford's charm lies in its resemblance to a Norman Rockwell scene. At its heart is a classic town square, bordered by tree-lined streets and well-preserved 18thand 19th-century homes and storefronts. Running right through the middle is the storied Lincoln Highway, made popular during the days of the Model T Ford.

Along those streets is an alluring mix of antique stores, many specializing in quality primitives and early American pieces. Visitors and dealers alike are drawn by regional antiques, art, and collectibles. Twice a year — in June and October — the town hosts its signature events: Market on the Square and the New Oxford Antique Show, attracting crowds eager to uncover treasures.

Two of the more unusual signed items in the auction both came the wardrobe of the late Pope Francis, who died on April 21, 2025.

A white zucchetto, or skullcap, brought \$13,750, and a white cassock, both "boldly signed by His Holiness in black felt-tip marker with the Italian version of his name, 'Francesco,'" sold for \$6,875.

Both items were typically worn by the pope for daily use outside of liturgical functions.

The papal items came with certificates signed by the pope's private secretary and video clips showing Pope Francis signing each item.

A check for \$1 signed by billionaire investor and philanthropist Warren Buffett brought considerable interest when it sold for \$10,000. Buffett, CEO of Berkshire Hathaway, signed and dated the check in 2003 to his friend George W. Brumley III. In the letter, Buffett thanks Brumley for his consulting services and humorously notes that he is paying him more than "any consultant in the history of Berkshire Hathaway."

The auction also included several items with strong Texas connections, including an 1892 broadside advertising the 27th anniversary celebration of "the Emancipation in Texas,"

now known as Juneteenth, in Corpus Christi. The 12 by 20 ¼ inch sheet sold for \$6,250, up from a starting bid of \$2,500

Juneteenth is the celebration to mark June 19, 1865, the day when Union Army soldiers arrived in Texas to finally enforce the Emancipation Proclamation, more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the document which freed all enslaved people.

A \$3 Government of Texas note from 1838, with then-President Sam Houston's secretarial signature, sold for \$3,250.

The government notes were payable a year from the date of issue but, unlike the United States' gold, silver and copper coins, the paper money printed by the Republic of Texas represented only a promise of future payment. When it became clear the republic didn't have the funds to pay out, the value of the paper notes plummeted.

A rare document from the Civil War sold in the Heritage auction was a single page issue of the Vicksburg (Mississippi) Daily Citizen from July 4, 1863, printed on white floral wall-

paper. The newspaper sold for \$5,000.

During the 47-day Siege of Vicksburg by Union troops in 1863, the Daily Citizen's newsprint supply ran out so the staff resorted to printing on wallpaper, which had been lightly printed with a floral design. From mid-June until Vicksburg's fall on July 4, 1863, the newspaper issued six one-page "wallpaper" editions.

Collectors looking for a steal could have bid on a 1934 Bonnie and Clyde wanted poster seeking the arrest of the outlaw couple under the National Motor Vehicle Theft Act.


The poster, which sold for \$1,500, featured black and white photos of Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow.

The bottom of the poster reads, in part: "Clyde Champion Barrow and Bonnie Parker constantly travel together and extreme caution must be exercised by arresting officers as they are wanted in connection with assault and murder of officers." By the time Bonnie and Clyde were gunned down in a police ambush in Louisiana the couple was suspected of killing at least a dozen police officers and civilians in a series of robberies.




Above: Printed on wallpaper after its print stock ran out, this copy of the July 4, 1863 Vicksburg Daily Citizen sold for \$5,000.

Black Shutter Antiques and Unique Upscale Resale (4335 York Road): On the south side of Route 30, these two single-owner shops share a connected building. Black Shutter Antiques has been around for about 15 years. It's an old-school antiques store filled with rows of smalls and vintage pieces to browse. Roll up your sleeves and enjoy looking for everything from antique tools and hardware to century-old furniture, all at reasonable prices. Don't overlook the project pieces on the front porch! Next door, Unique Upscale Resale, which opened about six years ago, blends antiques, collectibles, local crafts, and upcycled items. Both stores welcome visitors daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

D&L Treasures (411 Lincoln Way West): Further east, also on the south side of Route 30, this family-owned shop features a curated collection of antiques, used furniture, and unique finds. It's currently open Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. with additional visits by appointment.

New Oxford Antiques Center (333 Lincoln Way West): Road warriors will appreciate this unique spot along the Lincoln Highway, housed in a 1920s Ford garage connected to a 1700s-era house. It's one of New Oxford's oldest antique stores, in business for about 40 years. Once home to 50 dealers, the current owner now manages most of the space, shared with nine remaining vendors. Organized like a boutique, the merchandise is thoughtfully grouped and staged for easy browsing. The owner is also a local real estate agent, and regularly adds fresh inventory from local estate sales. Open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., closed Wednesdays.



Collector's Choice Antiques (330 W. Golden Lane): Located on one of New Oxford's quiet back streets, this family-owned shop has been serving customers for over 30 years. The multi-floor building houses a curated collection of heirloom pieces, focusing on American antiques from the 17th through 19th centuries. Their specialties include furniture, redware, stoneware, silver, and unique decorative items. The store is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from noon to 5

Zelma's Emporium (11 N. Water Street): Named for the owner's grandmother, Zelma's occupies a former 30,000-square-foot factory building just off New Oxford's town

square. The building has housed an antiques business since 1995, most recently as Golden Lane Antiques. Reimagined during the COVID pandemic, Zelma's now focuses on quality items across wide genres, including Asian and European antiques, modernist items, and fine art. With over 50 dealers, the mall offers everything from affordable smalls to gallery-worthy pieces reaching five figures. Zelma's also hosts fine art and antique auctions via LiveAuctioneers, with a preview gallery on the second floor. This year, Zelma's will host the Adams County Antique Show - the area's oldest antiques event - scheduled for Oct. 18, featuring 30+ dealers. Store hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, noon to 5 p.m.

Kelly Kinzle Antiques (9 Center Square): Owner Kelly Kinzle grew up working in his parents' antique and auction business before founding his own company and relocating to New Oxford in 1990. Housed in the old bank building on the town square, Kelly's shop is known for its impressive collection of tall case clocks, firearms, firefighting memorabilia, and Pennsylvania decorative arts. A respected authority on rare and fine antiques, Kinzle has helped institutions like the Smithsonian and Colonial Williamsburg enhance their collections and has even consulted for Antiques Roadshow. Visits are by appointment or chance.

Finders Keepers Antiques (3185 Carlisle Pike): Approximately two miles east of the

town square, just off the Lincoln Highway, this multi-vendor consignment shop offers a wide variety of antiques, art, furniture, and home decor. Known for its friendly atmosphere and helpful staff, Finders Keepers is also a great place to hunt for markdowns, offering exceptional deals. Open daily from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

While exploring New Oxford's antique shops, you might need a break. Deja Brew Coffee & Bakery on the square is a great spot for a quick bite or a caffeine boost. Next door, Five Loaves Sandwiches serves fresh, inventive sandwiches and soups. If you're in the mood for a drink, Brookmere Winery is just steps away. With treasures to explore and cozy places to unwind, New Oxford promises a fulfilling and enjoyable

Dozens of vintage scales weighed in at Kaufman sale

GLENVILLE, W. Va. — On August 12, Kaufman Realty & Auction wrapped up a unique sale of a one-owner collection of antique and vintage scales. More than 125 scales crossed the auction block, ranging from mercantile and postal varieties to scientific, medical, farm, and household types. Also on offer were 100+ lots of weights and parts, along with a selection of complementary antiques and collectibles.

Surprisingly, the top-dollar item wasn't a scale. Rather, it was a Singer 29-4 treadle cobbler's leather patcher sewing machine which sold for \$315. From there, prices settled into more modest territory. A striking 50-inch-long Fairbanks-Morse Scales porcelain sign brought in \$136, while a mid-century jadeite green Hamilton Beach milkshake mixer — originally from Glenville State College — whipped up \$110.

As for the scales themselves. Spirited bidding kept things interesting. Leading the lineup was an early 20th-century brass and cast iron "computing" scale designed not only to weigh but also to calculate cost — from Detroit's Standard Scale Company. It landed at \$72. Close behind at \$60 was a barrel-style model by Dayton Barrel Scale, dating back to the early 1900s. Other computing examples included a 1920s Stimpson Model 104 from Louisville, Ky., which crossed the block at \$12, and a 1901 Computing Scale Company drum edition from Dayton, Ohio, which settled at \$27.

Fifteen platform varieties, both countertop and floor versions, were available. A rough but charming Vermont-made Howe floor unit was snagged for the

opening bid of just \$1, while a late 19th-century Fairbanks grain weigher fared slightly better at \$11. Countertop units held more appeal, with a Victorian-era Standard Computing Company example reaching \$23 and an 1867 Fairbanks cast iron machine with a brass tray picked up for \$36.

A half dozen hanging scales offered additional variety, selling from \$12 for a 1950s Chatillon with a 15-inch-diameter

round face, to \$60 for a 1912 Landers, Frary & Clark piece featuring a hefty Hanson scoop.

Among the more visually elegant offerings were two pre-1920s wood and glass-cased laboratory varieties: a Levitt-Ferguson from Baltimore, which sold for \$37, and a Voland & Sons of New York claimed for \$54. A similarly striking 1940s Seederer-Kohlbusch Inc. brass and glass balance, crafted in New Jersey, brought in \$50.

Doctor's office models also made an appearance. A Continental Scale Works patient version drew \$19, while two Chicago-made machines hit at \$11 and \$8 respectively. Meanwhile, collectors of vintage kitchenware had options like a





1940s R.A. Hunter Kitchen scale - rough but charming - grabbed for \$8, or a 1960s basic kitchen example with cattail pattern, won for the opening bid of \$1.

There were also quite a few specialty units, including a 19th-century W. & L.E. Gurley balance beam with weights in a leather case that garnered \$45, and a velvet-boxed brass jewelry version that followed closely at \$43. A Farm Master egg scale found a buyer at \$23. Even government-issued machines had their moment: nine postal scales ranged from a 1941 Chicago-made Triner balance that went for just \$1, to a 1941 Triner platform edition that scored \$11. A wooden-boxed balance-type stamped "Pennsylvania and New York approved" secured a \$15 bid.

Beyond intact machines, there was also an array of parts and accessories. Top bids among the parts included \$24 paid for a 20-inch brass pan and \$21 for a century-old Fairbanks Winchester bushel tray with a hanging brass arm. Twenty-four lots of apparatus weights were dispersed, ranging from \$1 for a trio from Toledo Scale Company to \$13 for a nested set of seven.

The antique and collectible section rounded out the sale with everything from old farm and workshop tools to decorative glassware. A pair of period handcuffs with keys locked in \$54, while a tire changer designed for Ford Model As and Ts turned over \$28. Two collections of numbering stamps also sparked interest: a trio of Bates stampers sold for \$18, and a pair of similar stamps grabbed \$16.

Doorknob collection turned \$1,150

NORTH LIMA, Ohio — When asked recently why he doesn't retire, auctioneer and real estate broker Paul Basinger enthusiastically said he is still having fun. At age 81 his career spans decades. His friendly, high-energy personality keeps both buyers and sellers happy. After conducting in person auctions for many years, his company now sells exclusively online, and he reports great success with it. A recent 529 lot auction contained a wide variety of quality items in excellent condition. Prices here do not include the buyer's pre-

The leading performer of the day was a fascinating selection of vintage Sargent and Company brass doorknobs and lock sets taken from now a closed Canadian Hotel. The former owner had spent thousands of dollars purchasing and polishing this handsome collection which consisted of 58 handles and 8 locks. Their beauty was obviously appreciated, as they drew a final bid of \$1,150.

Other elegant furnishings were also popular at this sale. An eye-catching antique French Vernis Martin Vitrine style display cabinet standing 45 inches tall featured a painting of a woman playing a lute on the front door, country scenes on the sides, and a selection of musical instruments and art related items painted on the metal rimmed top. The intricate design and excellent condition helped it earn a final bid of \$550. A massive 96 inch tall by 72 inch wide antique armoire featured hand carved panels and accents, beveled mirrors, and brass hardware. The unit consisted of a base, three cabinets, and was set off with a decorative top. The delighted buyer took it home with a final bid of \$310. For an extra splash of color there were three lovely antique Art Nouveau stained glass transom windows. They featured floral images and

other abstract forms produced in pink, lilac, turquoise, and blue. Each measured 44 inches wide by 25 inches tall and they left for a final bid of \$290 per window.

Books and other ephemera provided ample opportunity for buyers in that field. Leading the way, a set of 30 Franklin Library Collection Books included Moby Dick, War and Peace, The Iliad, The Scarlet Letter, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn, and several more great works of literature. Each book was bound in leather and printed with 24K gold on the spine. This selection was claimed with a final bid of \$525. Local history buffs showed up for a box containing Mahoning county maps from 1939, City of Youngstown arterial highway system books dated 1956, an Atlas of Columbiana county from 1902, and other related gems. It required a final bid of \$480 to claim these references.

In a category by itself, a beautiful Franklin Mint leaf brooch commanded attention. It consisted of nine diamonds which made up the stem. They were surrounded by a graceful leaf pattern consisting of maroon

enamel and the entire pin was mounted in gold. It was stamped FM81 on the back. The stones tested positive as diamonds on the Presidium Gem Tester but were not verified by a jeweler. This beautiful accessory left with a final bid of \$320.

Elegant antique clocks were also available for purchase. A 19th century French Bonhams brass and marble gilt style clock featured a smiling cherub suspended below the clock on a swing. A polished white marble base supported this timepiece which displayed Roman numerals on the face. It was taken with a final bid of \$270. A graceful figure standing next to a clock while holding a rose embellished a Chappe A'Paris nineteenth century French gilt ormolu figural mantel clock. Consisting entirely of the gold colored finish, this beauty was claimed with a high bid of \$190.

Fabergé eggs were also represented at this multi-faceted event. A lavish sterling silver House of Igor Carl Fabergé Firebird

musical egg in royal blue was quite a treat to see. Dated 1987, it was stamped .925 sterling and was offered in the original felt lined display case. It closed with a final bid of \$230. This popular item was complimented by an11-piece Fabergé Imperial jeweled egg collection by the Franklin Mint, complete with stands. This appealing collection of ceramic and porcelain decorated eggs consisted of finely detailed designs, each one unique. They sold together for a high bid of \$190.

A vintage Hires Root Beer wood barrel dispenser drew an enthusiastic response. The barrel had a metal tap on the side, an inner liner, and the sign on the front was clean and intact. It read "Hires Root Beer since 1876. With roots, barks, herbs" It stood 30 inches tall, and the wood frame was in very good condition. It required a final bid of \$400 to claim this prize.

succumbed to a heart attack while working at Elizabeth Buxton Hospital in Newport News, Va. He was 36 years old. Amedeo Obici died due to heart and thyroid issues on May 21, 1947.

In 1960, the Planters company was acquired by Standard Brands, which later merged with Nabisco. In 2000, it was acquired by Kraft Foods, which merged with H.J. Heinz Company 15 years later. In 2021, Kraft Heinz sold Planters to Hormel. Regardless of its owner, Planters remained "The Word for Good Peanuts," with clubs, shops and events dedicated to its leggy legume. "Peanut Pals," A Mr. Peanut collector's club was founded in 1978 by Planters memorabilia devotee Judith Walthall. Membership now numbers into the hundreds and stretches across the United States and Canada.

The Peanut Shoppe in Akron, Ohio – owned by Pat and Mike Stone – offers an eclectic variety of Mr. Peanut-themed gifts and goods. The Planters Peanut Center in Suffolk, Va., which opened its doors in 1967, tempts daily with offerings such as butter toffee peanuts, double-dipped chocolate cashews, raw Brazil nuts, and good old-fashioned sacks of roasted and salted peanuts – under the watchful eye of its nutty icon. The largest Planters Peanuts store, having once stood on the Boardwalk in Atlantic City, New Jersey, closed in 1978.

The world's most famous peanut has endured for 109 years and shows no signs of retiring. That's a good thing for his ever-growing fan base which

continues to scavenge antique stores and thrift stores, throw up bids at auctions and haunt flea markets in search of Mr. Peanut memorabilia. From 1950s spoons to 1970s brass belt buckles, magnets from the 1990s to the 2007 Mr. Peanut nut dispenser, it's all coveted. Money clips and mechanical pencils, golf sets and dart boards, dolls and blankets, hats, watches, mirrors, key chains, ornaments — the peanut frenzy is represented in hundreds of ways.

As usual, value depends on rarity. A Planters plastic swizzle stick, cloth sticker or six-inch bendable Mr. Peanut can be had for \$5 or less. An early tin peanut butter pail can go for \$300 or more, while a vintage Mr. Peanut Halloween costume can fetch as much as \$1,000. Undamaged early advertising

utilizing Mr. Peanut on cardboard or metal store displays or signs can range in value from a few hundred dollars to a few thousand.

Over the years, small details of Mr. Peanut have changed. He has gone from a simple pencil drawing to a color cartoon image with a more curvy peanut shape than he was born with. In 2006, Planters held a public vote to determine whether Mr. Peanut should gain a bow tie, cuff links or pocket watch. The consensus was that America's favorite nut be left just as he is. Despite the few subtle changes that have affected his appearance over the last century, Mr. Peanut hasn't veered far from that image a young schoolboy doodled back in 1916 for the chance to win \$5
