Pinback buttons brought candidates and slogans to the masses

Even though this is an election "off year" in America, some voters will cast their ballots in several gubernatorial and state legislative elections, as well as in various mayoral and local races. But for dedicated collectors of political memorabilia, there is no such thing as an "off year." And with the spotlight not focused on national elections, this might well be the year for new collectors to throw their hats into the ring.

A wide variety of campaign-related items have survived decades of political contests. From flags and whiskey bottles to posters and banners, candidates have employed diverse durable items intended to put their names before the voting public. But according to Tom Morton, a longtime collector, it is the pinback button that remains "the most collectable and the most collected."

In 1896, George B. Adams of Irvington, N.J., applied for and was granted United States patent #564,356 for "a celluloid pinback button with a corkscrew in place of the pinback mechanism." His timing was perfect, as the ensuing newfangled handout no doubt

McKinley's successful campaign for the presidency. Prior to that time, Morton noted, candidates had distributed small metal disks stamped with their image. But because pinbacks could be worn and displayed, they an effective

campaigning tool. By 1920, the process was streamlined, with pictures lithographed directly onto metal, thereby omitting the celluloid covering. Bypassing this

expensive process, pinbacks became extremely inexpensive to produce. And not surprisingly, the numbers of these small wonders increased dramatically.

Every collector has a story. As for Morton, his collection began with a garage sale "find," a felt pennant ("it was either for Wilkie or Dewey") that was covered with pinbacks dating from the 1940s. "It was interesting to me," he recalled, even though he was only 12 years old at the time. This was just the beginning. Morton began seeking out and collecting contemporary pinback buttons, beginning with



Springfield Extravaganza scores big for Midwest antique lovers

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — Midwesterners are especially lucky when it comes to antique shopping because major events like the Springfield Extravaganza in Ohio take place nearby. While massive shows like Springfield, Brimfield in Massachusetts, and the Round Top Antiques Fair in Texas draw national crowds, many parts of the country don't have access to large antique fairs without traveling far. In the Midwest, though, top-tier antique shows are often just a short drive away. Among these, the Springfield Extravaganza stands out for its size and reputation as one of the best antique shopping experiences anywhere.

Held each May and September, the Springfield Extravaganzas are part of a year-round series of antique shows organized by Jenkins Management of Ohio. For over 40 years, these biannual events have taken place at the Clark County Fairgrounds in Springfield. More than 2,000 dealer spaces are filled by vendors from across the U.S. — and occasionally from around the world. The show stretches across 120 acres and features a mix of

shopping in outdoor booths, semi-enclosed pavilions, and eight climate-controlled buildings filled with antique and vintage finds.

This year's event took place the weekend of September 19-21, drawing dealers from as far away as Florida, New York, and Oklahoma. Many arrived in RVs or pulled fifth-wheels and campers, which served as their temporary homes during the show. Their booths stretched in every direction over nearly the entirety of the fairgrounds. The variety of merchandise was so extensive that no description could fully capture it all. But to paint a picture, you'd see merchandise like heirloom-qual-

ity antiques, architectural and industrial salvage, farmhouse, mid-century modern furniture, primitives, electronics, collectible toys, and vintage clothes. Intermingled were over 30 food vendors, including a beer tent and one stand offering frozen cocktails.

Many of the dealers came from close by, like Larry North, who traveled from Gallipolis in southern Ohio. In his booth, among plenty of furniture, sat a half-dozen primitive pie safes, priced from \$350 to \$675. The eye-catching space of a Central Ohio seller sported an awning from the recently-razed Columbus Spaghetti Warehouse

for \$500 and a gleaming chrome carnival ride that hailed from the old Buckeye Lake Amusement Park for \$3,500. From further afield came Maine Vintage, with a booth laden with vintage home decor, kitchen items, and old toys, oftentimes priced under \$10. And Vintage Vice, traveling all the way from Texas, brought a mix of treasures — from antique copperware under \$25 to a vintage farm cupboard priced at \$289.

These shows can draw over 20,000 visitors. Like the dealers, visitors came from far-off places like Alabama, New York,

Thrift stores can help create the perfect Halloween costume

600 million pounds of candy are purchased for parties and treats.

If you're opening the door to trick-ortreaters this year, you're likely to see kids in costumes that came from a big box store, characters including Joy from "Inside Out," a Minion (or two), and Godzilla. Many of these outfits require the purchase of a one-time wear bodysuit. Worn for just a few hours, the average Halloween costume, when bought new, can easily cost at least \$50 or more. Talk about spooky.

But it doesn't have to be that way. By



putting a little vintage style to work, we can still enjoy the holiday and have fun, all within a reasonable budget.

Half the fun is in the planning, beginning with the de-

cision of who (or what) to be. Homemade costumes require a bit of creativity, but the possibilities are endless when you are not limited to popular licensed characters. Looking for inspiration, I recently took a trip to one of my favorite local thrift stores, where the first thing I saw was a Halloween display.

Not surprisingly, there were a number of

previously worn "manufactured costumes" for sale. But there were also racks and racks of various pieces of apparel gathered together, any one of which might be part of a unique costume. Needless to say, there was a wide variety of black dresses. Add a black hat and a broom to make it scary. A less tame witch might opt for fishnet tights and heels.

A plaid flannel shirt can be the starting

point of a number of costumes. Pair it with jeans, a vest, boots, and a cowboy hat, and you're a cowgirl (or cowboy); if your shirt is bright yellow, you're not just any cowboy, you're Woody from "Toy Story." Wear that same shirt and jeans, top them off with a straw hat, and a bit of makeup, and you're

and Texas. Fortunately, it was three days of near-perfect shopping weather, with morning temperatures in the 70s and afternoons in the low 80s. Only a brief rumble of thunder and light showers passed through on Sunday afternoon, but with most dealers sheltered under tents and plenty of indoor spaces, the event continued without a hitch.

Early Bird shopping kicked off on Friday, running from 7 a.m. to noon. For \$20, eager shoppers could explore dealer booths for five hours before the crowds showed up— and that price also included entry for the rest of the weekend. General admission was \$12 per day thereafter. Discounted tickets were available online.

Whether a local visitor or a distant one, if you are considering a future visit to the Extravaganza, a few tips can help make the most of the experience. While it's a fantastic shopping opportunity, it's nearly impossible to see everything in just one day. Serious shoppers may want to book local lodging (well in advance) to allow for a two-or even three-day stay.

It's also wise to prepare for the physical demands of the venue. Comfortable shoes are essential, and a rolling cart or small wagon can help reduce trips back to your car, which might be parked as far as a quarter-mile away.

Once you're there, a little strategy can go a long way. Don't be afraid to make an offer — most sellers are open to negotiation, especially as the weekend progresses. And, while many vendors now accept credit cards, it's still a good idea to bring plenty of cash. Finally, when it comes to decision-making, trust your instincts. If something catches your eye, don't wait — items often sell quickly, and retracing your steps in such a large venue can be surprisingly difficult.

Looking ahead, there are plenty of chances to return — whether for the full





Devotional panel brings \$390,000 at Cottone in spirited bidding

GENESEO, N.Y. - Cottone Auctions' Sept. 25 Fine Art, Antiques & Clocks Auction achieved a total of \$2.4 million, led by a rare devotional panel, Saint Mary Magdalene by Ambrosius Benson (c. 1495-1550). The Northern Renaissance painting sold for \$390,000 after spirited international competition, underscoring both Benson's enduring significance and the continued strength of the Old Master market.

Women artists commanded top results. An exuberant canvas by feminist painter Alice Baber, Green Around Green, realized \$170,800. Baber, who studied in Paris and exhibited internationally, developed a luminous technique of thin glazes, guided by her belief that "color is light made visible." A vibrant modernist oil, Cat Lady (1978), by Sally Michel Avery, , achieved \$82,960. Late Summer by acclaimed Navajo artist Emmi Whitehorse brought \$85,400.

Other highlights of modern and 20th-century art included Larry Poons' Fiddle Stop, an impressive oil from



brass to produce ethereal tones when touched by air currents, achieved \$106,140, setting an auction record for its size. A fine watercolor by Andrew Wyeth, Adam and His Wagon (1940), brought \$85,400.

In decorative arts, a Duffner & Kimberly Wisteria table lamp sold for \$47,580, while a rare Handel Poppy lamp realized \$46,360. The firm rivaled Tiffany Studios in artistry and craftsmanship during the early 20th century. Arts and crafts pieces were



Stanton's sells contents of Lesterhouse Antiques

HASTINGS, Mich. — His niece remembers the painted portraits hanging on the walls of William Lesterhouse's antique store as a child. To her, the eyes of the people followed her around the various rooms, watching her every move.

"It was kind of creepy," Joyce Olson said. But her Uncle William loved 18th and 19th century antiques like furniture, glass, ceramics, primitives, Asian art and paintings of long forgotten men, women and children forever staring into space.

Lesterhouse, 89, died earlier this year. He operated his antique store in downtown Mattawan, Mich., for over 50 years until it closed in 2022.

The building was sold earlier this year and his personal lifetime collection of antiques was auctioned by Stanton Auctioneers on Sept. 13 in Hastings, Mich. Listed prices do not include the buyer's premium.

True to Olson's memories, a matched set of unsigned early childhood portraits, maybe of a brother and sister, were auctioned together for \$2,100. To many onsite the eyes of the children had a vague ghostly look, almost as if their sale had unsettled them. Itinerant folk painters traveled house to house in

early 19th century New England and painted such portraits before photography was invented.

Probably the oldest auction piece was an 18th-century Dutch faience columnar tankard. Made of an early tin-glazed opaque white earthenware and dated 1736 on the bottom, it had a hand-painted polychrome Asian-style design with pewter lid and bottom. It sold for \$300.

Top selling honors went to an early 8-inch handblown goblet with a gold coin in the stem. Spirited bidding drove the final price to the \$3,000 bid of a floor buyer. The coin was hard to read in the stem but such an example could have come from an 18th century Venice glassmaker as no other marks were vis-

highlighted by a Roycroft oak table with macmurdo feet, selling for \$7,564, and a Grueby faience vase totaling \$8,235.

Clocks drew strong interest, highlighted by a rare Walter H. Durfee Girandole Clock from the collection of Bruce Austin, Pittsford, N.Y. The timepiece with reverse painting signed D.J. Steele, circa 1922, sold for \$24,400. Another from Austin's collection was a fine and rare Simon Willard Bride's model banjo clock, with thermometer throat glass, bringing \$7,625. A Federal Tall Case clock with Rocking Ship Movement, attributed to Simon Willard, achieved \$26,840.

Noteworthy Americana included a 19th-century still life with watermelons by Donald Fisher Jr., which realized \$26,230.

"We were thrilled with the results across all categories," said Matt Cottone of Cottone Auctions.

lions reached a bid of \$2,800. Manufactured in Nancy, France, probably in the 1880s, they were also made of a tin-glazed earthenware. Each was hand-painted and gilded and featured a mirror-opposite lions holding a turret between its front paws.

"We ought to be selling tea and crumpets instead of hot dogs and pop," auctioneer Michael Bleisch quipped given the European and New England ambiance of the auction.

An early 19th-century 35-inch Aaron Willard single-weight shelf clock fit that bill as well. Willard and his brother established one of the first American clock factories in 18th-century Boston and their products were prized in early American high society. Spirited online and floor bidding led to a hammer price of \$1,900 to an online buyer.

A bronze sculpture of a pair of stylized slender women draped in black signed by French designer Romain de Tirtoff, better known as Erté, sold for \$1,500. Most appreciated for art deco designs like this sculpture, documentation revealed that Lesterhouse paid \$8,500 for the statue in 1989.

Two early Staffordshire spill vases of matching hand painted elephants went for \$1,300. Another group of giraffes, lions, and deer sold for \$225. Both groups dated to the 19th century Staffordshire region of England, famous for pottery dating back to the 15th century. Spills were thin strips of wood or paper stored in such containers.

Lesterhouse collected a variety of Asian-themed items. A large Chinese Wucai-style porcelain vase of undetermined age with a wooden stand and cover sold for \$1,300. An undated lacquered Chinese sewing box complete with lace, thread and a variety of sewing tools and decorations was hammered down for \$850

A pair of export porcelain Chinese peacocks took \$700, and an undated early Chinese decorated bowl sold for \$175. A late 19th century Japanese Imari bowl with floral patterns was priced at \$700. Such high-quality imported ceramics continue to be prized for vibrant colors, intricate designs and distinctive styles.

Auctioneer Steven Stanton noted that a few of the auction pieces had some damage, "but that's to be expected for items of this age." It was hard to say if one cast iron pedestal urn that sold



for a high floor bid of \$300 was damaged or not. The urn itself looked in good condition, but Lesterhouse left a note that the hexagonal base the urn rested on had been made from an antique headstone.

A Dutch silver brandy bowl circa 1790 must have commemorated a child's birth since an image of a baby was on each handle. It sold for \$250. A 33-inch gold-tipped walking stick engraved "J. Skotzky from his son Abe" was bought for \$100

Western Michigan hosted several waves of Dutch immigration in the 19th and early 20th centuries, travelers who settled in modern towns such as Zeeland, Vriesland and Holland. The Dutch city of Delft first started producing porcelain in the 17th century to compete with Chinese imports. Dutch immigrants brought or sent such items to Michigan. Two lots of Delft apothecary drug jars, including a pair that read "morphine" and "arsenic", auctioned for \$325 and \$175 respectively. A Delft vase honoring William V, the last Stadholder or Dutch Republic prime minister, sold for \$300. Various Delft wall plaques were priced from \$90 to \$125. Two blue and white Delft-style tankards, with appropriate Dutch iconography, sold for \$150.

An early hanging wall display cabinet with a single four-paned door and scalloped interior shelves was hammered down for \$70.

Of the auction Olson observed that almost every item had a backstory, a unique provenance that only her uncle had known. "Too bad all that is all lost," she said.



Pinback Buttons


chapter of the American Political Items Collectors (APIC), Morton shared some pointers to those new to this collecting category.

When starting a collection, there are no hard and fast rules of how to collect pinbacks, but there are multiple ways to begin. For example, Morton explained, some people focus on candidates representing a specific party, be it Democratic, Republican, or a third party. Some zero in on all of the campaigns of one specific candidate, or one specific political office. Some are attracted to souvenirs from campaigns for a specific cause: Morton cited efforts to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) as an example.

For others, it is the physical properties of pinbacks that is the defining factor. Flashers, that is, buttons with images that change depending on how they are held, attract a number of collectors. Whereas many buttons measure five-eighths inches in diameter, some buttons are 3 ½ inches wide. As collectors seek these larger buttons, they are faced with the fact that these larger ones often command a slightly higher price than the smaller examples.

And sometimes, it's as simple as being attracted to a pinback's artwork. A button bearing a humorous slogan, or one that is somewhat slanderous in nature, might be an interesting specialty. Expect to pay more for them, as well as for portrait buttons. Morton added that jugate buttons, those bearing the images of both the



presidential and vice-presidential candidates, are especially prized.

But for those just starting out, a pinback collection need not break the bank. Morton pointed to one particular example, "Nixon Now" buttons, which date from his successful 1972 presidential campaign. "You can't sell them for a quarter," Morton commented. In general, though, a collection can easily begin with an initial outlay of one to five dollars.

On the other hand, serious collectors are prepared to pay thousands of dollars for rare and desirable buttons, and for these examples, today's market remains "very strong." By way of example, Morton noted that pinbacks from John Kennedy's 1960

campaign can command

\$8,000. The "holy grail" of political pinback buttons might well be a Cox /Roosevelt jugate like the one that sold in 2020 for \$185,850 at Hake's Auctions. Even though a button featuring Franklin D. Roosevelt is among the most valuable of all buttons, there are other FDR buttons that can be scooped up for \$5 or less. Morton added, "You can acquire a more common Cox pin for \$25 or less."

As for storing a pinback collection, many advanced collectors utilize display cases or cabinets with pullout drawers. Those just getting started might opt for pinning a burgeoning collection to a piece of felt and hanging it on the wall. As Morton agreed, a "plus" for collecting pinbacks is the fact that, for the most part, they are not generally subject to easy breakage, and they are easily stored and displayed, due to their diminutive size.

Morton warned against buying reproduction pinbacks. Among the buttons for presidential tickets that buyers should be particularly cautious are those promoting the 1972 Democratic ticket of George McGovern and Thomas Eagleton,

the latter of whom suffered bouts of depression and was forced to step

And then there are those buttons that are not reproductions, nor were they issued by the campaigns, but were produced by a "third party." Souvenir buttons might fall into this category, and collectors should be wary not to pay top dollar for them.

On the other hand, "third party" has another definition in the world of political buttons, as the term can

also refer to candidates not affiliated with either the Republican or Democratic parties. In this case, Morton suggested that memorabilia from the 1990s campaigns of Ross Perot might well be an interesting collecting niche.

As with many other collecting categories plagued with reproductions, knowledge is the best defense. Morton encourages new collectors to consider becoming a member of the American Political Items Collectors, a non-profit membership organization dedicated to promoting the collection, preservation, and study of materials relating to political campaigns and the presidency. The national group hosts conventions every two years; plans are already underway for the 2026 National APIC Political Memorabilia Show, set for July 27 to August 1 in Boston. In addition to "magnificent" displays, the show will feature sales at some 200 tables of political memorabilia.

In the meantime, local shows are $scheduled\,throughout\,the\,county, including$ one sponsored by the Southern California chapter of the APIC. Set for Nov. 8, the show will feature thousands of political items for sale, as well as exhibits of collectibles from the 1800s to the present. Campaign buttons will be given away for free to new collectors; admission is free for children under 13, as well as students.

Finally, Morton stressed the value of friendships shared among collectors. And ironically, in a collecting field that is all about politics, he concluded that political views have no place in this realm of collecting. Instead, he concluded, "It's all about the history."
