Not everyone who cut a record could sing; and that's just fine

Clint Eastwood. Rock Hudson. John Wayne, Sylvester Stallone. Fabio. Hulk Hogan. Mr. T. Oh, and "Lurch," from The Addams Family.

What could all these celebrities possibly have in common? Well, that's easy enough: at some point or another, each of these folks decided that there was one more one more challenge to face, one more river to cross, one more mountain to climb.

In other words, it was time to cut an


And so, many whose actual talents definitely led in other directions, entered recording studios, stepped before microphones, and bravely let fly.


According to Telly Savalas (who had more than one recording to his chromedomed credit), "What's an actor doing making a record? Hey - I was asked

After all, it's only singing. Sinatra made it look so easy. How hard could it be? As Steven Seagal, Keanu Reeves, Shaquille O'Neal, and a host of other earache-inducers quickly learned, singing is a lot harder than it sounds.

For the first of the modern recorded wonders (or wonder-whys), we travel back to 1912, when Florence Foster Jenkins first took the stage. With little encouragement from anyone who'd ever heard her, this wealthy Pennsylvanian with a flair for the dramatic became determined to win over New York with her wavery operatic soprano. When no venues came calling, Mrs. Jenkins bought them out herself, papering the houses with newspaper reporters.

As one reviewer baldly put it, Florence "couldn't carry a tune in a bucket." No one denied, however, that

she certainly seemed to be enjoying herself. More importantly, she sure knew how to put on a show. When, for example, an aria called for a heavenly presence, the matronly Madame Jenkins (her preferred title), happily obliged, donning full angelic regalia flowing robes, wings, and a tinsel halo. Soon, word got out: these recitals were something to see (and hear).

In 1944, 76-year-old Florence Foster Jenkins finally made her Carnegie Hall debut. Tickets had been sold out for months. Madame gave her audience what they'd been craving: an evening's caterwauling of the highest caliber. Her



encore, "Clavelitos," found Jenkins decked out in a Spanish lace shawl and jeweled hair comb, enthusiastically tossing carnations to her delighted fans. At the number's conclusion, she also tossed the flower basket. When the audience demanded a repeat,



Spirits awakened: Virginia museum explores Colonial distilling



CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — In a quiet corner of Virginia, a small museum is bringing the forgotten world of early American distillation back to life; one still, and story at a time. The SPIRITS Museum, founded in 2023, began by exploring distillation in the American colonies, not only for producing rum and whiskey but also for medicine, perfume, and scientific inquiry. The museum's expanding narrative reveals how distillation has influenced American history.

Though distilling may conjure barrels of bourbon or backwoods moonshine, early American stills had many uses. Colonists distilled not just for drinking, but to produce sterilizing agents, fragrant oils, and materials for scientific work. Small stills were common in workshops of the educated and well-to-do.

Dr. Bill Dodson, founder of the former Eight Shires Coloniale Distillery in Williamsburg, Va., was motivated by the often-overlooked history of colonial distillation. In the early 2010s, while researching 17th- and 18th-century spirit-making techniques, he realized how little attention the topic had received. This inspired him to launch Eight Shires, a working distillery dedicated to reviving historic recipes as an educational tool. In 2017, he expanded his

mission by founding the SPIRITS Foundation, a nonprofit focused on preserving and sharing the broader story of colonial distillation.

As the foundation's work gained momentum, the idea for a museum emerged. Clanci Jo Conover soon joined the effort as curator, helping shape what would become the SPIRITS Museum. posed launching the museum online first making its resources accessible far beyond Virginia — even as plans for a venue were being laid.

With financial support from the Virginia Spirits Board, the physical space opened at Eight Shires. By then, the virtual museum was gaining traction. After the closure of Eight Shires earlier this year, the museum relocated to the Virginia Distillery Company near Charlottesville. While a new exhibit space is nearly ready, Conover still believes a hybrid model remains the museum's greatest strength.

Widespread enthusiasm has propelled a growing lineup of digital exhibits and online events that spotlight lesser-known aspects of early American life connected to distilling. One exhibit examines the colonial rum trade's ties to the Atlantic slave trade, which relied heavily on enslaved labor in the West Indies. Others explore the James River settlements and how English colonists brought distilling endeavors to

the New World. A recent virtual talk even looked at the use of perfume in colonial America, for both medicinal and social pur-

The museum's holdings, a mix of original artifacts and well-researched reproductions, anchor both the digital and physical exhibits. One standout is a replica of one of George Washington's stills, created in partnership with Mount Vernon. Few people know that Washington operated one of the largest rye distilleries in the young country. Another popular item is a reproduction alembic still based on glass fragments unearthed in Jamestown. Among the original artifacts is a mallet-style wine bottle dating to the mid-1700s, unearthed at Berkeley Plantation.

While the museum team prizes authentic artifacts, reproductions are necessary because so few original items have survived. Glass and ceramic vessels easily broke. Copper stills were frequently dismantled and melted down for their metal, particularly at the outset of the Civil War. Smaller home setups often remained in the shadows. The result is a gaping hole in the physical record of early American distillation. For Conover and the team, every object - even a shard of glass — can capture a lost piece of distilling history. Yet, as she noted, "Recreations are the best learning tools we have when originals no longer exist."

While the SPIRITS Museum remains dedicated to showcasing colonial-era distilling, its attention is expanding to the broader history of American distillation. To tell the fuller story, it's developing three major timelines. The first traces America's early distilling roots from the 1500s to the 1700s. The second follows the post-Revolution period, highlighting commercial growth throughout the 1800s. The third covers Temperance, Prohibition, and today's craft distilling revival, illustrating how modern culture has shaped the industry.

Given its physical and virtual assets, the SPIRITS Museum is an invaluable resource for antiques enthusiasts interested in distilling artifacts. Collectors quickly learn that truly authentic colonial-era pieces are exceptionally rare. Most surviving artifacts date from the 19th or even 20th centuries. That doesn't diminish their value, but it does shift the focus of most collections to later periods.

sive, items like industrial-age apothecary stills or early 1900s moonshine gear are somewhat easy to find. Nineteenth-century liquor bottles frequently appear at auctions and antique shows, though authenticating them usually requires specialized expertise. Additionally, printed materials - like distilling manuals, billheads, and advertising ephemera - are also common, and offer rich insights into how distilling evolved as commercial production became widespread.

Jenkins died a month after her Carnegie Hall engagement, having finally achieved the pinnacle of her career. As the New York World-Telegram put it, "She was exceedingly happy in her work. It is a pity so few artists are. And that happiness was communicated as if by magic to her hearers."

recording Other artistes questionable artistry have also had unshakable faith in their abilities. The 1960s saw the emergence of Elva Miller, a California housewife whose wobbly renditions of such pop hits as "Downtown" and "These Boots Are Made For Walkin" caught the attention of Johnny Carson. Mrs. Miller's unique vocalizations, sometimes accompanied by equally unique whistling, made her a favorite with "Tonight Show" audiences; her album, "Mrs. Miller's Greatest Hits" became a best-seller.

Carson also championed the career of another of the era's more unusual talents, ukulele-playing, falsetto-voiced Tiny Tim. Thanks to "Tonight Show" publicity, Tiny's one-of-a-kind interpretation of "Tip-Toe Thru The Tulips" became a chart-topper. Unlike Mrs. Miller, however, the musically-adept Tiny Tim had a very clear image of the persona he was creating.

Television exposure seemed to draw neophyte vocalists to the recording studio like moths to a flame. TV hunks Jeff Chandler ("Our Miss Brooks") and Vincent Edwards ("Ben Casey") gave fans what they'd been dreaming of: soulful cover portraits, and heartfelt


renditions of pop standards. Could they sing? The album liner notes carefully skirted that topic. Chandler was "no Johnny-come-yesterday to the recording business—listeners already know his wonderful speaking voice." Edwards blurb was more circumspect, stating only that, when it came to singing, he offered "a wealth of natural feeling."


Some vocalizing newbies took the bull by the horns, downplaying their singing prowess before the critics could. Andy Griffith's album, "Andy Griffith Shouts The Blues And Old Timey Songs" carried this disclaimer by Andy himself: "I will admit that I'm not the best—but in all modesty, I will have to say that I expect I'm the loudest." The most musical, too. In later life Andy's recordings of traditional tunes earned him rave reviews plus a Grammy award.

Sometimes, entire television casts gathered around the studio mics, perhaps hoping for safety in numbers. The Cartwright clan, from that durable Western hit "Bonanza"—Lorne Greene, Pernell Roberts, Dan Blocker, and Michael Landon— came out with "Ponderosa Party Time," featuring their "fiddlin', banjo pickin', guitar strummin" (and of course, singing).

While the Ponderosa gang revisited cowboy tunes, other TV casts opted for original songs tailored to their series characters. On "The Beverly Hillbillies Album" all the Clampetts are heard on such howlers as "Vittles," performed with gusto by ex-vaudevillian Irene Ryan ("Granny").

Prime acquisitions for oddity aficionados are recordings by original "Star Trek" cast members. William Shatner ("Captain Kirk") has churned them out over the years, each featuring his distinctive vocal intonations, but in

even greater demand is "Leonard Nimoy Presents Mr. Spock's Music From Outer Space." From its captivating cover photo (Nimoy, in full pointy-eared Vulcan drag, hoisting a model of the U.S.S. Enterprise), to the opening strains of Alexander Courage's mesmerizing "Star Trek" theme, there's no doubt this album is indeed a voyage "where no man has gone before".

Interspersed with Nimoy's plaintive vocals on such melodies as "Lost in the Stars" are Spockish narrative ruminations ("Twinkle, Twinkle Little Earth"), plus the occasional bouncy instrumental ("Music To Watch Space Girls By").

In 1966, Tower Records took "extraordinary pride in introducing its sensational new rock 'n roll discovery — Mae West!" Decades after her reign as a 1930s screen queen, Mae recorded "Way Out West". Accompanied by "the dynamic young group Somebody's Chyldren," Miss West put her one-of-akind sultry stamp on everything from "Day Tripper" to "Twist and Shout." Plus, the heavily retouched cover photo of a septuagenarian evening-gowned Mae, surrounded by her youthful, and somewhat nervous-looking backup boys, is alone worth the price of the album.

For appreciators of the absurd, the list of album oddities is (fortunately) endless. The prices are right, too. "Christmas with Colonel Sanders" will set you back just a finger-lickin'-good \$5-10. Robert Redford narrating "The Language and Music of the Wolves" is in the \$10-15 range, probably because the album also includes a full side of actual wolf noises. In the \$20 and up category are albums boasting themes completely out of synch with the performers. TV's pistol-toting "Paladin"

recorded "Richard Boone Reads The Story of Jesus For Children." The cover features the grizzled Mr. Boone, ready to recite from his favorite book to a somewhat apprehensive youngster.

When you spot an album oddity at the next garage sale, take an inexpensive gamble and snap it up. Regardless of what it sounds like, just remember: it took plenty of old-fashioned fortitude to brave the terrors of the microphone. Celebrity is fleeting. Cashing in on it remains a time-honored tradition.


