Prosthetics have helped people for thousands of years

Since ancient times, people have been creating and utilizing prosthetics to replace missing body parts. In some cases, the artificial device is functional while, in others, it is merely cosmetic.

Two of the oldest known prosthetics are toes which were unearthed in ancient Egypt. One - famously known as the Cairo Toe - was constructed of wood and leather over 3,000 years ago. The toe, complete with a toenail carved into it, shows evidence of having been fitted and refitted to the foot of the wearer several times. Archaeologists discovered the toe fitted to the remains of a woman via its being laced to a wooden corset-like structure which was slipped over the woman's foot. The other ancient prosthetic toe, constructed of linen and a sticky paper substance, was discovered with the remains of a mummy during the 1800s.

An artificial device known as the Capua Leg, was discovered in a Roman tomb in 1884 and thought to be from around 300 BC. Found next to the remains of a man who was missing the lower portion of his right leg, it was fashioned from three pieces of thin bronze nailed to a wooden core. It is one of the earliest prosthetic limbs to ever be discovered.

Plaster noses, ears, and lips have been described in ancient texts from around 300 BC. During the 15th and 16th centuries, prosthetic noses and ears were constructed of silver, gold and crystal and painted skin tone, to replace appendages lost due to disease or injury. The ears and noses were held in place by strings, harnesses or straps fastened around the head.

A 16th-century manufactured iron

arm, complete with hand and fingers and believed to have been worn by German knight Gotz von Berlichingen after he lost his right hand from the effects of a cannon blast, is on display at the Jagsthausen Castle Museum in Germany. A marvel for its time, the prosthetic was made with buttons and levers so that it was functional.

Prosthetic legs can be transfemoral (above the knee) or transtibial (below the knee). During the 17th century, they were very rustic in design, often just a thin wooden post with an iron foot attached. It was that century in which surgeon Pieter Verduyn developed a transtibial leg with knee hinges that allowed for movement. But despite

During the Civil War, the need for prosthetics quadrupled as battle injuries robbed hundreds of men of their limbs. Most who had lost a leg settled for a replacement in the form of a peg-leg -asimple wooden device that resembled a small crutch, strapped to the existing portion of the leg with a belt-like leather strap. Often, a rubber knob was affixed to the bottom. Prosthetic arms of this time were made functional by the attachment of a hook or a double-hook at the end where a hand would be.

James Edward Hanger, who lost his leg while fighting in the Civil War in 1861, decided to spend his recovery time developing a better leg prosthesis. The

Anna Pottery pig flask had bidders squealing to the tune of \$8,330

WHIPPLE, Ohio — The Labor Day Antiques & Art event hosted by Hollie Davis and Andrew Richmond of Meander Auctions included a fabulous variety of objects, from contemporary art, jewelry, and furniture to silver, Navajo weavings, tapestries, and the fourth installment of quilts from The Virginia Gunn Collection, Wooster, Ohio.

There was truly something offered for all tastes. But the leaders of the day (for the most part) had an Ohio Valley connection, were made of clay, stoneware or redware and had an interesting history which Davis and Richmond thrive on tracking down. The couple feels the history of an item contributes greatly to its "how cool is that!" aspect and as well as its value. The results of this auction back that up.

Items created by Wallace and Cornwall Kirkpatrick of Anna, Il., aka Anna

Pottery have a strong following, so when pieces show up at auction, collectors take notice. The lead item for this auction was a much desired Anna Pottery stoneware railroad pig flask. The circa 1875 flask was molded as a pig with hindquarters spout sporting an elaborate incised railroad map and inscriptions including "St. Louis the future Capital/Latest & most Reliable Railroad/and River Guide/with a little good old rye in a hogs" pointing to the spout on the pig's backside. The incised map on the flask is of the Mississippi River and various rail lines. This flask sold for \$8,330. Prices include a 19 percent buyer's premium.


Another Anna Pottery piece selling strong was the "Little Brown" snake


jug that realized \$7,140. Just 5.75 inch high, this diminutive, ovid jug sported a brown glaze, a detailed snake coiled around the spout, and was incised "Little Brown Jug/from/Brachmann & Massard/Wines & Liquor/81 W 3rd St/Cin O 1876".

Sale of Bob Ross paintings will benefit public television

NEW YORK – Back in 1983, television audiences first tuned in to watch a curly-haired man with a wide paintbrush transform blank canvases into captivating pictures. Working from start to finish for a half hour, the artist also provided friendly encouragement to his audience, his 31 years after the death of "TV's favorite artist," the first official sale of Bob Ross paintings will take place on Nov. 11.

Featured at its upcoming "California and Western Art" sale, three of Ross' paintings will be offered at Bonhams' Los Angeles salesrooms, according to Maxine Osa. Speaking for the worldwide auction company, Osa noted that over the next year, a total of 30 of Ross' pictures will be sold through Bonhams New York, Boston, and Los Angeles salesrooms. Making this possible is American Public Television (APT), the distributor of syndicated shows, including Ross' "The Joy of Painting." Additionally, APT has pledged that 100

percent of the proceeds from the sale of these paintings will be directed to support the work of APT and PBS (public television stations) nationwide.

Labeled "historic," these auctions come at a time when public television is facing reductions in federal funding, as well as the projected demise of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. In response, Robin Starr, general manager of Bonhams Skinner, commented, "We're honored to offer this exceptional selection of 30 original Bob Ross paintings through Bonhams' series of upcoming sales." Bonhams, she further stated, holds the global world

both large and small, are considered some of the most iconic examples of the work of Wallace and Cornwall Kirkpatrick. Anna Pottery snake jugs are typically associated with the temperance movement, yet this snake jug was made for a spirits retailer in Cincinnati, and indeed, others exist of this type with the simple inscription "Little Brown Jug" and a snake, suggesting a serious or humorous warning about the jug's contents."

This early September event was chock-full of stoneware items including a mid-19th century Ohio cobalt decorated stoneware jar by the Havens family of Athens or Muskingum County. Two-gallon in size with lug handles and a brushed cobalt decoration (capacity mark, trees and stars) the jar was also stamped "HAVENS" with a backwards "S". At 11.5 inches tall, this jar sold for \$4,760.

The auction listing notes, "Potter Charles C. Havens (1803-1888) was born in New Jersey and came west to Muskingum County by the mid-1830s. Two of his sons and two of his grandsons became potters, with all documentary evidence placing them in Muskingum County," though it is not known which Haven potter created this jug.

Redware pieces were also included in

this Labor Day affair. Of great interest was the Zoar, Ohio, redware flower pot. Hailing from Tuscarawas County, Ohio, this lovely, simple 6-inch high flowerpot was stamped "ZOAR" and sported a stamped flower/star below as well as a stamped design around the rim. It sold for \$5,950. This piece sold with such a great provenance. It came out of a distinguished Midwestern collection; purchased from Jack and Pat Adamson (Zoar, Ohio); sold at the Reiker auction at the Hermitage in Zoar, and "is illustrated in Adamson, The Pottery of Zoar, Ohio; Research and Photos of Known Zoar Pieces, p. 13."

Ohio sewer tile pieces are usually whimsical and one piece sold this day was a great example. Up for grabs was an Ohio sewer tile sardine can. Stamped "SARDINES" on both sides, it featured a lid partially rolled back. At 9.5 inches long, this cutie sold for \$2,856.

Not all the top lots this day were made of some kind of ceramic. An Ohio carved blanket chest soared past its presale estimate when it stopped at \$7,735. Thought to be possibly from Fairfield County, Ohio (1820-1840), the walnut and poplar chest with one large drawer had panels and drawers carved with sunbursts and quarter fans. The sides featured incised fylfots (a cross with perpendicular extensions, usually at 90

degress or close angles, radiating in the same direction.) and the chest stood on high turned legs.

Another special piece selling was the Ohio Civil War presentation sword a Clauberg, M1850 staff and field officer's 32 inch example that did well bringing \$5,057.50. Contemporary pieces were also part of this event. Vulcan by Christoper Ries (American, b. 1952) of Columbus, Ohio, sold for \$3,570. This optical glass piece was signed and dated 1985.

"The auction was made up of more

than 600 lots, so it was a long, but exciting day," Richmond said. "We had registered online bidders from all over and a solid number of in-person bidders as well as phone bids which made for a great sale."

Meander Auctions' next event will take place November 15th and; like this Labor Day sale, will include Americana items as well as 20th century, European, and Asian pieces.



auction record for Ross' works. "We're expecting to see spirited bidding," she predicted, thanks to a "steadily rising" market, spurred on by the fact that the proceeds from "live-on-air works" are earmarked to support public television.

As for Ross, the Florida native was born on Oct. 29, 1942. He pursued what became a second (and overwhelmingly successful) career after serving for 20 years in the Air Force. For the show, he specialized in quick-painting pictures, many of which were landscapes, all of which were completed within the time constraints of the half-hour

show. WNVC in Falls Church, Virginia, was the first station to pick up his show, known as "The Joy of Painting," followed by WIPB in Muncie, Indiana. New shows aired from Jan. 11, 1983, until his death in 1994. Over time, the show has been seen across multiple public television stations in America, airing on small screens around the world, from Mexico and the United Kingdom to Japan and Greece.

Ross had a formula for ensuring the success of his shows. He would begin by creating an off-camera sample that could serve as a guide. A second picture, using his "Wet-on-Wet Technique," was then painted while two cameras were rolling. After the show, Ross would paint a third and final ver-

sion of the subject, one that took a bit longer to create because of added details. It was these pictures that were used as illustrations for the show's accompanying educational books, a side project of which Ross is said to have been particularly proud.

At the upcoming Bonhams sale, two of the three paintings are examples of those that were painted during the filming of the show. "Winter's Peace" is notable for its vibrantly saturated colors, a quality Ross employed to make his work particularly pleasing to those watching at home. The presale estimate for this picture, painted in 1983, is \$30,000 to \$50,000. A second picture, "Home in the Valley," was also painted on-air in 1993 in less than half an hour. Unedited, it has remained in secure storage at the Bob Ross Company. Its presale estimate is \$30,000 to \$50,000.

And a third painting, "Cliffside," is an example of a detailed painting that was after the show. It was reproduced on page 35 of Ross' "The Joy of Painting Volume 20" instructional book. Bonhams projects it will sell for \$25,000 to \$45,000.

As fascinating as it was to watch his creative artistry in action, a large part of Ross' appeal was his unassuming on-camera persona. After painting a tree, he would often paint another one, because he believed that every tree needed a friend. "Ever make mistakes in life?" he would ask when something went wrong. "Let's make them birds."

Ross urged viewers to take chances: "Go out on a limb. That's where the fruit is." While providing a running commentary, Ross somehow made his criss-cross strokes all come together by the end of the show, producing a work of art, not to mention good television. And then there were the cameo appearances made by Peapod, his pet squirrel.

Today, Ross remains a cultural icon. As Joan Kowalski, president of Bob Ross, Inc., observed, "Bob Ross dedicated his life to making art accessible to everyone through public television." She continued, "I can't think of a more meaningful way to share his works of art than by supporting public television's mission to educate and inspire."

Indeed, in his wisdom, Ross was unwittingly prescient decades ago when he observed, "We want happy paintings. Happy paintings. If you want sad things, watch the news."

Remington's Broncho Buster bucked the competition and hit \$400,000

PITTSFIELD, MASS. — Every fall, Fontaine's can be counted on to present a highly select grouping of fine and decorative arts. Boasting more than 1,000 lots, the September 27-28 auction was a powerhouse event that saw robust sales in nearly every genre. Dominating the sale were over 150 Tiffany Studios items with over 75 fine lamps that together accounted for more than a third of the auction's overall \$5.6 million tally.

The top lot, however, had buyers in a high state of anticipation for weeks before the sale when a rare and early bronze casting of Frederic Remington's most famous




\$75,000

subject, "The Broncho Buster," was announced as being offered in the sale. The sculpture came from the first group of castings done in 1899 through the Henry-Bonnard Bronze Co. Bidding for the sculpture, numbered 58/64, opened at \$220,000 and it jumped in \$10,000 increments until the final bid of \$400,000 was achieved, going to an East Coast buyer. "We were exceptionally pleased to have sourced this rare example of a beloved work coming from a Berkshire County home and with the response of the bidders to this bronze," said auctioneer and owner John Fontaine. "More than that though, we were gratified to see the across the board results of the auction that show the strengths of the present market.'

A handful of impressive lamps were found in the fall auction, led by an early and rare "Poppy" table lamp, circa 1898. The lamp featured a rare decorative rim collar depicting poppy buds and was outfitted with a 16 1/2-inch diameter shade. Bidding was heavy between the phones and online with 15 active bidders participating as the lamp steadily climbed in \$5,000 and







\$10,000 increments. It went past its high estimate and kept going until the dust settled at \$287,500.

Other Tiffany lamps that performed solidly or over estimate included a circa 1910 "Bamboo" floor lamp with a "Bamboo" base and finial, standing 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches tall, that attained \$225,000.

The output of fine Tiffany lamps kept coming Saturday morning. A circa 1910 "Drophead Dragonfly" floor lamp standing 67 $^{3}4$ inches tall, made \$200,000 as did a circa 1903 "Peony" table lamp having a 22-inch diameter shade. Also earning five figure prices were a 24-inch tall "Dragonfly" table lamp, circa 1910, and an "Apple Blossom" floor lamp, circa 1910, 66½ inches tall, that each took \$125,000.

Fifteen window lots were offered in this auction including a Tiffany Studios "Morning" window designed by Elihu Vedder that was likely one of his final designs for the company before going out on his own. Selling comfortably within its estimate, the circa 1888 window made \$262,500. It was designed with leaded glass, hand-faceted glass jewels, drapery glass, mottled glass and glass roundels and measured 10 feet by 6 feet.

Outperforming its estimate was a lavishly decorated Gothic Revival 14K gold chalice and paten, 20th century, that sold for \$75,000. Embellished with ornate and floral engraving, the chalice also had a precious stone embellished cross and was inscribed "Calicem Salutaris Accipiam." The paten depicted a scene of Jesus and the Apostles.

When it comes to 19th Century American furniture, there are few names that hold as much value as Herter Brothers. A Renaissance Revival center table was attributed to Herter Brothers and that was enough for buyers. They drove the price to \$50,000, more than double the high estimate. Hailing from a Boston collection, the circa 1875 table was made of rosewood and had mother-of-pearl and fruitwood inlay.

Another strong performer was a Louis Majorelle and Daum Frères "Nénuphars" table lamp,

conservatively estimated at \$2,000/3,000. The circa 1900 gilt bronze lamp having internally decorated glass achieved \$26,250. The Daum Nancy shades were marked with the Cross of Lorraine.

Also exceeding high estimate was a pair of signed oils on canvas by Susette Keast (American, 1892-1932), both depicting Gloucester Harbor, attracted a bevy of bids and selling for \$50,000 and \$43,750 respectively.

Colt semi-automatic pistol tops Morphy's firearms sale at \$102,000

DENVER, Pa. - At Morphy's September 9-11 Firearms & Militaria Auction, some of the finest and most important firearms ever to appear for public sale flew past their high estimates to land in the hands of elated new owners. The 1,285-lot selection of antique and modern rifles, shotguns, handguns, and Fully Transferable NFA-registered machine guns and accessories surpassed all expectations to gross more than \$7.5 million, inclusive of buyer's premium.

The top lot of the sale was a fresh-to-themarket factory-engraved Colt 1911A1 .45 ACP semi-automatic pistol accompanied by a Colt Archives letter. It was originally shipped to Tritch Hardware of Denver, Colorado, on October 16, 1925 as a shipment of one. Its features included a half-moon front sight, U-notch flattop rear sight, checkered spurred hammer, long A1 grip safety, arched mainspring housing with lanyard loop, and smooth ivory grips that were replacements from slightly after the period. Those grips were signed on the interior: F L Belmay / 1948. The engraving and patterns appeared consistent with signed examples from William Gough or his workshop. In Excellent condition, the pistol commanded \$102,000 against an estimate of \$40,000-\$60,000.

The market for NFA firearms has shown no signs of cooling down, and entries in Morphy's September event validated that trend. One of the top performers was an extremely scarce original Thompson Ramo Woodridge (TRW)

Tritch Hardware Co., Denver, Colo., Oct. 16, 1925 in shipment of 1. Engraving and patterns consistent with signed examples from William Gough or his workshop. The auction's top lot, it sold for \$102,000 against an estimate of \$40,000-\$60,000.

M1-14 select-fire machine gun in exceptional condition with an original TRW-marked bolt. Its receiver was stamped U.S. RIFLE/ 7.65MM M14 over a TRW triangular logo above the serial number 612891, and it was equipped with highly desirable walnut USGI E2 stock, with a pistol grip, bipod, original sling, sling loop, muzzle brake, and one magazine. It conveyed with an additional standard USGI original buttstock with the proper Department of Defense eagle-and-stars marking. Estimated at \$35,000-\$50,000, it soared to \$88,560.

Following closely behind was an all-original Fully Transferable Maget World War II German MG42 full-auto-only machine gun dated 1943. Its bolt head was marked dfb but did not show a serial number. Likewise, the barrel was not serial-numbered but bore its original cra mark. The top cover was Nazi-marked cof with Nazi Eagle proofs. The buttstock was clearly marked hvg 43 but did not have retrofitted reinforcement wire, suggesting the gun was captured in combat before this retrofit was fully implemented. A fine specimen, it sold for \$84,000.

The earliest of all auction highlights, by far, was a 1628-dated Dutch West India Company bronze cannon measuring 88 inches from muzzle to cascabel. Its 5-inch bore opened up toward the muzzle, indicating it was a "drake" - a lightweight tapered-chamber design that was favored by the British Navy. The cannon's bronze construction further validated that it was likely a naval gun. Embossed with decorative moldings throughout and, importantly, embossed with the monogram of the West India Company and the letters G and O for Groningen and Ommelanden over the chamber, it also had a secondary band ahead of the cascabel marked SICKMANS, for manufacturer Nicolaes Sickmans. Discovered outside of UK waters, its marked date supports the possibility that it may have come from a ship used for what was essentially legal piracy. At auction, it sailed to \$61,660 against an estimate of \$12,000-\$18,000.

A historical treasure of the American Old West, a silver-plated Colt .45 Single Action Army Revolver was presented to Territorial Mounted Policeman Apolonio A Sena in 1911 by citizens of Las Vegas, New Mexico, in gratitude for his role in capturing kidnappers of twoyear-old boy. It was shipped on May 25, 1911 to Simmons Hardware Co., St. Louis, Missouri, for the Gross-Kelly Company in Las Vegas, who commissioned the gun. Its inscription read: PRESENTED TO A A SENA BY CITZENS OF LAS VEGAS, NEW MEXICO. The gun was accompanied by a briefcase containing factory letters, copies of relevant newspaper articles, books, and other literature. It sold within its estimate range for \$56,580.

A Japanese (Edo Period, 1603-1867) three-barrel, swivel-breech .40 smoothbore palanguin matchlock pistol, equivalent to a Western coach gun, was nearly identical to two examples shown in Stone's Glossary which were donated to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. Morphy's firearms expert noted in the catalog description that he is aware of fewer than five other guns of this type over and above those depicted in Stone's Glossary. Such guns are virtually unknown outside of institutions. The auction example, in mechanically fine condition, sold for \$26,400.

All collectors of outdoorsmen's edged weapons know the name Bill Scagel (1873-1963). Scagel was a Michigan bladesmith and knifemaker whose style had a profound impact on the cutlery trade, influencing it for more than a century. At their September auction, Morphy's offered a scarce handcrafted Bill Scagel hatchet or camp axe that displayed the maker's renowned Kris stamps and W SCAGEL / HAND-MADE in small lettering on the reverse cheek. The 12 7/8-inch hatchet had a large, distinctive pommel that was created from a shaved antler. The piece had been obtained at Scagel's property by John Gordon Breland, a retired Muskegon, Michigan policeman who did carpentry jobs for Scagel, including the expansion of his home/ workshop. A lifelong hunter, Breland acquired the hatchet from available stock at Scagel's premises. Together with its leather scabbard, it sold for \$20,400.

The firearms advertising category was led by a desirable Winchester Repeating Arms Co., Double-W cartridge board. Of a type that Winchester distributed to dealers around 1897, it was numbered 245 on verso. The display itself included 200 shells, 13 bullets and 9 primer tins in an attractive arrangement. It handily exceeded its 20,000-30,000 estimate to settle at \$41.820.

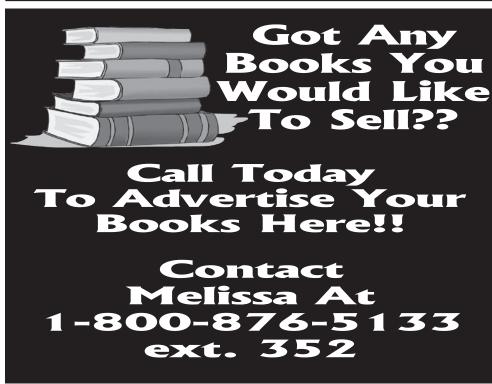

result was known as the Hanger Limb. The device contained rubber cushioning and hinges at the knee and ankle which provided shock absorption. His venture was so successful that he founded his own company to manufacture the devices. Today, the Hanger Clinic is the leading provider of prosthetics in America.


Prior to Hanger's arrival on the scene, the largest manufacturer of prosthetics in America was the A.A. Marks Company of Broadway, New York, which was founded in 1853. Their slogan was "The nearest approach to nature."

Another successful American producer of prosthetics as the 20th-century loomed was the National Artificial Limb Company located on Dearborn Street in Chicago. The sole manufacturer of prosthetics composed of leather reinforced with aluminum, their artificial limbs were very light with a reduced risk of chafing. The company asserted that wearers could ride a bicycle as easily as if they had two natural legs.

While many amputees preferred the split hook arms for their functionality, others chose a more cosmetic version in the form of a leather and wood arm painted skin tone and affixed with a stuffed leather glove at the end. Other arm prosthetics had immovable hands with carved wooden fingers. Like prosthetic legs, they were made in two lengths - from the shoulder down, or from the elbow down. Some intricate artificial hands had fingers that could be mechanically cranked open and closed, although the action required a great deal of attention and effort on the part of the wearer.

In addition to arms and legs, humans have sought to replace other missing body parts over the centuries. Some of the earliest known dentures date to 700 BC and come from the Etruscans of Italy. They were constructed of human and animal teeth fastened together with gold wires.

In 1728, French physician Pierre

Fauchard, who was known as "the father of modern dentistry" described in writing his inventive dental prosthetic, which was comprised of hand-carved animal bones fastened to wire brackets.

George Washington, who had but a single natural tooth at the time of his inauguration, wore dentures. Grover Cleveland, America's 22nd and 24th president, wore a rubber prosthesis after having five teeth and part of his upper jawbone removed due to cancer. Without the prosthesis, he was unable to speak normally.

Towards the end of the 19th century, comfort was becoming a greater consideration in the manufacture of dental devices. Whole and partial sets of artificial teeth were being inserted into vulcanite rubber as sharp wires and hard woods took a backseat. Prosthetic dentistry eventually became a booming business.

The earliest prosthetics for a missing eye are believed to have been manufactured as the image of an eye painted on the surface of a small plate and held over the empty socket by a string tied around the head. An actual artificial eye that fit into the socket was

discovered buried in Iran and dated to about 2900 BC. It was made of a paste and covered with a thin layer of gold.

began crafting glass eyes around 3000 BC. During the late 16th century, Venice began manufacturing artificial eyes made of lead glass. Some eyes were simple and clear, while others contained an intricately painted iris and pupil, with the color of the eye made to match the existing eye.

Glass eyes needed to be removed from the socket regularly to prevent infection. They were not functional and served only two purposes - one being cosmetic and the other being to prevent the eyelid from collapsing into the eye socket. By 1911, Germany led the world in the manufacture of artificial eves.

With construction materials such as plastic, silicone and aluminum replacing the heavy wood and iron of days passed, modern-day prosthetics are much more lightweight and comfortable than their predecessors. In addition, advancements in robotics and artificial intelligence are adding to the ever-evolving technology that is bringing prosthetics from the stone-age

to the space age. These advancements add to the value of antique and vintage prosthetic devices.

Finding antique prosthetics isn't easy. Their rarity may be due to the devices being buried with their wearers upon the individual's death.

A prosthetic arm from the Civil War era - manufactured of wood with a metal bar affixed to the side and a hinge which allowed the device to bend at the elbow - was listed at a recent auction with a value of \$749. Condition and interesting innovation sometimes trump age as an artificial arm from the early 20th century was recently valued at auction for \$1.750. A vintage hook. once attached to the end of an artificial arm, was recently listed at auction for

Antique prosthetic legs are typically valued at anywhere between \$400 and \$1,300. The majority that come up for auction are the not as old as the mid-19th century nor as new as the mid-20th century, but fall, somewhere in between. They are often made of wood and leather strapping, with a metal bar screwed down the outer length to hold the artificial thigh, calf and wooden foot together.

Ear horns, also known as ear trumpets - which magnified sound for the hard of hearing - can resemble a bell with a handle-like tube that inserts into the ear canal, or an actual small trumpet. Often made of brass, they typically range in value from \$70 to \$900 depending on age, condition, and rarity. Antique and vintage eyes with a colored iris are typically valued at auction between \$70 and \$185, with clear, glass eyes valued at about \$55.

Vintage dental molds for making false teeth might sell for as low as \$40. An entire vintage boxed set of necessities for creating dentures was recently listed at auction, valued at \$320. Dated 1912, the set included impression molds, steel sizers and mold holders. Antique and vintage books centering on the manufacture of artificial teeth are often valued higher than the teeth themselves, lingering around \$200.
