Having a blue Christmas is nothing to be sad about

Close your eyes and think Christmas thoughts. If you dream in color, you're likely to see the world awash in red and green, trimmed with ivy and holly, evergreens and poinsettias, not to mention Santa's red velvet suit. If you have an aural memory, you probably hear in your mind Bing Crosby's renditions W h i t e Christmas" and "Silver Bells." Or maybe, even, Elvis' heartwrenching "Blue Christmas."

But here's the good news: For many collectors, Elvis might well have gotten it all wrong, as the color blue can be (and remains) a pleasantly nostalgic reminder that Christmas is just around the corner.

Over the years, various potteries have produced annual commemorative Christmas plates. However, those that are both the best known and the most popular are the plates issued by two Danish factories, Royal Copenhagen and Bing & Grøndhahl. In a world of uncertainty, their distinctive pure blue and white porcelain plates, issued every year for more than a



Japanese robot car sells for \$233,700 at Morphy's toy auction

DENVER, Pa. - Morphy's November 11-13 Toys & General Collectibles Auction launched a sweet honeymoon trip for a Japanese robot car that soared to an astronomical winning bid of \$233,700. Extraordinarily rare and possibly one of only two known that retain their original pictorial boxes, the sensational fantasy toy known to space toy collectors as the "Honeymoon Car" led a stellar 1,375-lot auction lineup that totaled \$1.66 million.

Made by ET (Japan), the silver convertible was complete and all original, with a blue windshield, large grille and tailfins typical of midcentury American cars. Why it is known in the toy-collecting hobby as the "Honeymoon Car" is unclear - even more so when considering one lithographed robot serves as the driver, while the other rides along as a passenger in the backseat, engrossed in a TV screen broadcasting an outer-space scene. Not exactly a love match! Undoubtedly, the colorful lithographed box added a tremendous amount to its desirability factor, perhaps even doubling the value of the elusive postwar gem. The box lid is lavishly illustrated in full color, with a depiction of the sleek convertible against a setting reminiscent of Chicago's Lake Shore Drive. The lot attracted 37 bids before selling to a U.S.-based buyer for almost three times its high estimate. To put things into perspective, this toy, which rolled out of Morphy's gallery for \$233,700, is more valuable than a 2026 Tesla Roadster, whose base price is expected to be around \$200,000.

Another visitor from a faraway galaxy, a very rare Yonezawa (Japan) battery-operated Jupiter Robot ar-

rived with its original pictorial box with all inserts and its correct plastic remote control. The toy showed no cracking whatsoever to its dome. This fine example of a coveted, boxed Jupiter sold at the midpoint of its estimate range, for \$29,520.

A fellow who knows everything about toys, Santa Claus, made his presence known in the form of a wonderful 4 foot-tall Villeroy & Boch terracotta figure. The three-dimensional depiction of the holiday gift-giver holding a fir Christmas tree is documented in the German manufacturer's catalog from the year 1900 and may have been intended for display in a

was obvious that the artists behind the piece paid extraordinary attention to detail during every stop of the creative process. The original paint they applied had mellowed very nicely over the past 125 years, only adding to the beauty of the figure's facial features. The figure sold for \$86,200.

Christmas pyramids offer holiday entertainment

Christmas pyramids are unique Christmas decorations that blossomed in the folklore customs of the Ore Mountains in Germany. These decorations have a pyramidal outer frame with candleholders encircling the pyramid. A central Christmas carousel, often a nativity scene, sits inside the pyramid with a rotor at the top of the pyramid that is turned by warm air lifting from the lit candles. Besides nativity scenes, Christmas pyramids may be decorated with angels, shepherds, sheep, wise men, mangers, mining folk from the Ore Mountains, forest scenes, and buildings.

Christmas pyramids are thought to be one of the predecessors of the traditional Christmas tree.

Historically Christmas pyramids are made of wood and sit on four-to-eightsided raised platforms. Each pyramid has a long pole in the middle, serving as the axle on with the entire decoration spins and which helps support added platforms. Christmas figurines used as

decorations on Christmas pyramids are also, historically, made of wood.

Christmas pyramids originated in the late-Middle Ages, roughly around 1500 AD. Originally, European families collected evergreen branches and hung them from their homes' ceilings to ward off cabin fever on dark, cold winter nights. Northern and Eastern European families used candles to ward off gloominess in the winter. Eventually, these two customs mixed, and families hung boxwood branches and candles to decorate their homes for winter. This quickly led to a more lavish Christmas Season decoration, immersing the family in the lights and scents of Christmas.

A Christmas pyramid, or its direct forerunner, unified candles and evergreen boughs with a symbolic light stand called a Lichtergestelle. These light

35 Hall of Famers in PSA NM to Mint 8 condition, including a No. 10 Mickey Mantle and No. 514 Bob Gibson rookie card. A fabulous set that took the original owner years of dedicated searching to complete, it sold well above its high estimate, for \$67,650.

Another great find for some lucky bidder was an incredibly rare 1955 Topps baseball cello pack graded PSA 6. One of few examples known and in NM condition, it sold near the top of its estimate range, for \$33,600.

From the world of superheroes, a circa-1940 Marx Superman Rollover Plane was offered together with its colorful, profusely-illustrated original box. The toy itself was also all original, including its back fins, and its condition was graded Excellent. It sold for \$5,412.

Morphy's team was pleased to welcome the worldwide contingent of toy soldier collectors who, for decades, had followed the late Ray Haradin's Old Toy Soldier Auctions. As the new steward of auctions conducted for the OTSA brand, Morphy's allocated 500 lots of military and civilian sets, figures and accessories to the Nov. 13 session. A boxed W Britain 12th Lancers "Prince of Wales Own" Set No. 4 with bugler and officer figures, manufactured 1893-1896, sold for \$5,904.

Holiday collectors were "all in" on 61 lots of vintage Christmas and Halloween goodies. A rare composition Halloween "Lettuce Man" candy container shaped as a lamp with a built-

in candle holder proved irresistible. Its esoteric design included facial figures carved into the lamp's shade, with translucent paper-insert-covered eyes, nose and toothy smile that had survived many decades in fine, undamaged condition. A prize for any

collector of Halloween antiques or "veggie people," the rare collectible sold for \$20,910. Additionally, a group lot of eight delightful Halloween jackolanterns in various colors with a variety of expressions sold for \$9,225.



stands were constructed of four poles and decorated with evergreen boughs at the top. Lit candles brought cheer to this simple decoration.

Not long after these decorative light stands originated, the modern Christmas tree took their place in the home. But the German people were not done decorating. In the Ore Mountains, the miners who lived there did not see Christmas trees as simple trees lit by candles. When looking at Christmas trees, these hard-working people were reminded of the capstans, much like the ones used on ships, which were commonly used in the mines to lift heavy loads. Mining families in the Ore Mountains added the spinning motion of a capstan to the earliest Christmas trees and primitive Christmas pyramids were

The name "Christmas pyramid" also has historic significance. French soldiers, under the command of Napoleon, invaded Egypt around 1800. These soldiers brought back illustrations and other artwork depicting the Egyptian pyramids. Eventually these images made their way to the Ore Mountains where the industrious mining families quickly applied the name to their Christmas invention, and Christmas pyramids were officially named.

Christmas pyramids were originally hung from the ceiling of Germanic homes, but later these decorations became tabletop decorations where the entire family could enjoy the spinning nativity scene.

In the 1670s, significant numbers of German immigrants arrived in what would become the United States, settling in Pennsylvania, New York, and Virginia. From 1840 to 1890, Germans were the largest group of immigrants coming to America. Following the Revolutions of 1848 in Germany, a wave of Germanic political refugees fled to the United States and became known as the Forty-Eighters. This group of German immigrants brought with them the custom of erecting Christmas pyramids as decorations at Christmas.

Christmas pyramids in all shapes and sizes are found all over the United States. Some of these pyramids still use candles as their power source, and others use electricity and some burn time-honored kerosene lamps (which is quite dangerous).

The first large Christmas pyramid erected in the United States still stands in Fredericksburg, Texas. The pyramid is 26feet tall, and it serves as the centerpiece of Fredericksburg's Christmas marketplace each December.

Today, Christmas pyramids take on many intricately carved variations of the Christmas spirit.

Lalique dragonfly necklace flew off for \$207,400 at Cottone

GENESEO, N.Y. — Cottone Auctions held its Fine Art & Antiques Auction on Nov. 20, achieving \$1.1 million in total sales. The auction opened with outstanding works by Art Nouveau masters René Lalique and Louis Comfort Tiffany, both of which attracted exceptional interest.

René Lalique's fine and rare Four Dragonflies (Quatre Libellules) pendant-necklace and brooch, circa 1903–1905, drew spirited competition. Crafted in plique-à-jour and champlevé enamel with aquamarines set in 18K gold, the jewel exemplifies Lalique's sculptural approach to Art Nouveau design. Fresh to the market from a Rochester, N.Y., estate where it had descended in the same family, the piece offered both rarity and impeccable provenance. It sold to a collector for \$207,400.

Louis Comfort Tiffany's 22-inch Peony lamp, one of the finest examples of his large-scale work — its expansive blue-ground shade rendered in rare drapery glass — also performed strongly. Featuring an adjustable Library Standard Cushion base with a distinctive pod design, the lamp sold for \$201,300.

The modern and 20th-century art section was led by Andy Warhol's silk-screen Sarah Bernhardt from Ten Portraits of Jews of the Twentieth Century (1980), portraying the famed French stage actress celebrated for her dramatic intensity and worldwide acclaim. The work sold for \$26,840. A 1965 oil on canvas by Orville Bulman, Vaisseau de Ligne Victorieux, rich with the artist's Caribbean-inspired palette and theatrical energy, realized \$51,850.

The sale featured notable silver and jewelry, with estate highlights including Van Cleef & Arpels gold, diamond, lapis lazuli, malachite, and coral ear clips, which achieved \$10,370.

Collectors of fine paintings responded enthusiastically to the offerings, including Charles Gruppe's coastal painting, which captured the luminous atmosphere of the Holland coast; it sold for \$35,380.

There was beautiful music in the house at Stanton's

HASTINGS, Mich. — Two impressive phonograph collections made their way to Stanton's Auctioneers and Realtors in November for a three-day auction.

Don Gfell started collecting Edison phonographs in the 1960s and never looked back. He was known as the "Edison Man" to friends and other collectors. He died in 2023. The other large offering in this sale came from "Mr. Gramophone" as Domenic DeBernardo was called. The Toronto resident died in 2024.

All prices listed are gavel prices and do not reflect the buyer's premiums.

The top seller was an Edison Class M cylinder phonograph from the DiBernardo collection, which achieved a gavel price of \$50,000. One of the first London Stereoscopic Company tinfoil models produced,

it was manufactured around 1878 under Thomas Edison's license and closely following his original design.

A number 16 marking on the machine was probably its sequential production number, signifying that it was one of the earliest models for the British and Canadian markets. Its fragile tinfoil could record and play a few times but couldn't be switched or saved. Wax cylinders, introduced around 1884, were the first means of preserving and replaying sound.

The second-highest lot, at \$30,000, was a circa late—19th-century Western Union Calahan-type ticker tape machine displayed in its original glass dome and pedestal cabinet. Such machines fed real or near real-time stock quotations and news to banks and brokerage houses through Western Union, automating the distribution of information for the first time in history.

A late 1890s Edison Standard wax-cylinder phonograph nicknamed the "flower machine" sold for \$23,000. The original paint on the bedplate of the model and an intact Edison wooden base pushed the price higher. Floral decorations domesticated the male technology of early phonographs and helped blend them in a feminine parlor culture previously dominated by pianos.

One of the most successful European alternatives to Edison's flower machine was a similarly dated German Polyphone wax cylinder phonograph. A model in near excellent condition reached a gavel price of \$18,000. Polyphone's background was in music boxes, not inventions. As such, the auction example looked more like a pre-

cision music box than Edison's clunkier mechanisms.

Another German music machine sold for \$17,000. However, unlike Polyphon's finely engineered cylinders, Berliner gram-

ophones abandoned wax tubes in favor of flat wax or plastic discs that could be more cheaply duplicated beginning in 1887, an approach that ultimately shaped the entire recording industry. A plain looking example, circa 1898, represented Berliner's interest in making money selling media (records) rather than machinery as Edison

An either Swiss or French automata coin-operated music box that used a rotating metal cylinder, sometimes called a corncob, to play music and operate five dancing figures along with a drum and six bells sold for \$16,000. Unlike phonographs, coin-operated automaton music boxes were designed to be public spectacles, combining sound, motion and cabinetry to transform a simple song into a theatrical experience.

A short-lived Edison phonograph that offered to disciple children through repetitive moral suasion was hammered down at \$13,000. The no-name doll (she did not even have a persona or backstory) was sold as a voice housed in a doll rather than a doll with a voice. It delivered moral instruction when it wasn't praying or singing about obedience, all in a child-like voice.

Like four other talking dolls that also

auctioned for \$2,900 or less, their interior sound machines broke easily. And most frightened rather than delighted children as their mothers found them unsettling. It would take another 70 years before a successful talking doll was produced.

Before phonographs became common in formal Victorian parlors, mechanical music boxes had their day. Made of precision machinery and finely-crafted woods, the most expensive models came in floor cabinets, to hold interchangeable disks and cylinders, much like the console radios of the 1930s.

Swiss B. A. Bremond made his music boxes like he made his watches. A circa 1890 model sold for \$5,000 in the auction, featuring furniture-grad cabinetry a sound that made contemporary

phonographs sound crude. A Swiss-made Empress player, circa 1895-1910, sold for \$4,500 included nine different disks. The transfers and gilt work on the front were aimed at an upper-class feminine parlor market.

Table-mounted music boxes allowed private listening rather than a room-sized console. A 1900 Swiss-movement table-top model with a glass window to allow listeners to view its mechanism as it played sold for \$4,500. It would take several decades for phonographs to be able to reproduce bass sounds as well as the auctioned Breitinger & Kunz player.

One of Thomas Edison's inventions was the Model VV-XXV schoolhouse phonograph, sold between 1910 and 1925. Edison developed and promoted them to replace what he thought was poor singing and piano playing by elementary school teachers of

the day. With huge speakers so they could be heard in an entire classroom, two models sold at auction, the better for \$1,300 and a less attractive version for \$1,100.

Edison's and other early phonographs all shared a common problem, speed inconsistency from their hand-wound motors. The Milan, Ohio-based Janette Manufacturing Co. offered a solution between 1908 and 1914 in a pneumatic-driven phonograph, which used a stream of air to uniformly spin its turntable.

A rare console-sized pneumatic model sold at auction for \$800. The compressed air turntable ran more smoothly than wound motors, but was unwieldy compared to the electric motors that started appearing in phonographs around 1913.

A frequent purchaser of Edison phonographs, Henry Ford bought an expensiveat-the-time \$250 customized version of Edison's Model C-250 turntable photograph in 1917 to give to his marketing director. Featuring a high-end Chippendale-Louis XVI wooden cabinet, the piece sold for \$1,700 at auction with a letter of provenance naming Ford.

Edison claimed that the C-250 more faithfully reproduced music than any other contemporary phonographs. Ford appreciated that because he thought that all advertising and publicity should be properly curated, not the sensationalistic spectacles reflecting most other advertising of the day.




A Blue Christmas

FROM FRONT PAGE artist's technique to work. And the results: the production of the first of many annual Christmas plates. Recognizing a good thing, Royal Copenhagen followed suit 13 years later, offering its first Christmas plate

in1908. Today, the tradition lives on, as companies both continue to produce a limited edition, dated Christmas plate. Each plate begins with drawing. Remaining constant over the years is the fact that every selected motif has been rooted in either Danish folklore or history, or it has portrayed Danish Christmas customs or familiar landmarks. Think "Danish Landscape," "Shepherds in the Fields," and "Sailing Ship," as well as "Vicar's Family," "Little Skaters," and "Hare in Winter."

> every added step during its production increases chance of its ruination. After the successful production of the predetermined number of plates has been completed, the mold is ceremoniously broken.

But there appears to have been one slip-up in the process: As the story goes, back in 1911, production workers stole several prototypes of a plate by designer Stephan Ussing. Some 120 "unofficial" renderings of "House in Winterlandscape" were surreptitiously made that year. This so-called "Thief" plate remains one of special interest to many serious collectors.

Although Royal Copenhagen purchased the Bing & Grøndahl business in 1987, both factories continue to produce separate Christmas plates. Over the years, the Danish blue and white Christmas plates have enjoyed times of increased popularity. After World War I, the plates' color scheme was embraced, considered a good fit for the fashionable tastes of the time. Years later, when American soldiers returned from Europe at the end of World War II, they brought plates home as souvenirs. And during the 1970s and 1980s, both Bing & Grøndahl and Royal Copenhagen experienced a surge in popularity, which they met with an increase in production numbers.

These days, beginning a new collection is not difficult, with plates easily accessed on the secondary market. One such source is Allen's Jewelry and Collectibles. Providing online images of more than 8,000 collectibles, the Ohio-based company, according to Fawn Ward, has dealt with plates since the late 1970s. Among the wide range of collectibles that Allen's

plates in particular.

As for today's buyers, many seek to fill in a collection or replace a plate that has been damaged or broken. Others are hoping to find a plate from a year that holds special memories. Serious collectors might favor one designer over another and collect those wares associated with that artist. And then there are those who are, quite simply, drawn to the plates' beauty and craftsmanship and hope to begin a collection of vintage plates.

As for values, Ward stated that prices for the oldest plates, as well as those difficult to find, remain high. Plates dating from the early 1900s, she said, might sell today for as much as \$6,000. Not surprisingly, Ward added that those who purchase vintage plates seek them in mint condition with no flaws, including scratches and minor defects. The presence of an original box and paperwork results in a higher price.

But in the end, for many, the monetary value of these blue Christmas plates is of little importance. Their value can't be measured in dollars. Because in the end, no one can put a price tag on what is part of a family's holiday heritage, handed from generation to generation.
