

## Collecting the Beatles eight days a week

President John Fitzgerald Kennedy was dead. People of color were assembling and standing up to protest segregation. Martin Luther King Jr. had a dream and the threat of nuclear war loomed on the horizon. A lot was happening during the 1960s – and it was all carried upon the strains of beatnik music.

The Swinging Sixties were made up of a generation that decided to shun the traditional rules of their parents. Anti-materialistic and more spiritual than religious, they viewed a new world through psychedelic eyes and a cloud of patchouli incense. Bell-bottoms and tie-dye, moccasins and fringe – most teenagers of the era were part of a curious collection of bohemian music lovers. By the time the long-haired Beatles stepped foot on American soil, the band already had a following bigger than the U.S. music industry had ever seen.

Liverpool native John Lennon was 22 years old when he and his band – The Beatles – signed with EMI records in 1962. A songwriter and rhythm guitarist, Lennon shared lead vocals with 20-year-old band member Paul McCartney, who played bass and keyboard and assisted with songwriting. Nineteen-year-old George Harrison played guitar, ukulele and keyboard while contributing vocals, and 22-year-old Ringo Starr added vocals and drums to the band.

The Beatles' debut single "Love Me Do" was released in the United Kingdom on Oct. 5, 1962 and peaked at number 17 on the music charts there. They made their debut on American television on The Huntley-Brinkley Report on Nov. 18, 1963. Over 20 million viewers tuned in. Within four months, the band held the number one and number two spots on America's

Billboard Hot 100 chart with their tracks "I Want to Hold Your Hand" and "She Loves You." The seeds of 'Beatlemania' had been planted and were growing rapidly.

On Feb. 7, 1964, the band touched down on US soil where they were scheduled to perform live on The Ed Sullivan show. The crowd of nearly 5,000 screaming fans that had gathered at John F. Kennedy International Airport in Queens was only a hint of what was to come. Over 73 million people watched the program, an entire generation instantly seduced by the Brits with their falsetto cries and addictive musical mix of dreamy folk and rollicking rock.

On Feb. 11, 1964, The Beatles performed before 8,000 people at the Washington Coliseum. The screaming from the audience was so loud that the music couldn't be heard. Teenage girls swooned until they lost consciousness and had to be carried away by security.




A level of delirious idolatry unlike history had ever seen would only rise in the coming months.

Later that year, the feature-length motion picture "A Hard Day's Night" featured 36 hours in the life of the band as they prepared for a television performance. The film was nominated for two Academy Awards and the soundtrack spent 14 weeks in the number one spot on the Billboard Top LPs chart.

A Beatles concert at New York's Shea Stadium in August of 1965 broke attendance records as it seated 55,000 people. Security measures never before needed for musical performers in America had to be instituted everywhere the band went. They traveled in armored cars and moved about under the cover of police escorts. Blockades had to be erected outside recording studios, and

## Black Willow mink coat wrapped up \$3,550 at Ivy sale

LAURENS, S.C. — Ivy Auctions held its Winter 2026 sale on March 10, with 468 lots from several private collections and estates. The diverse offerings included Americana, first edition books, folk art, furniture, silver, and a wide range of decorative arts, collectibles, and estate items that reflected the breadth of the consignments.

Leading the sale was a John Adkins “Black Willow” natural ranch mink coat, bringing \$3,550, over triple the high estimates, after an active round of 88 bids. The full-length fur was in very good condition, retaining its serial number plus original Saks Fifth Avenue, Revillon, and Black Willow labels.

Second place went to an 18-karat gold hunter-case pocketwatch stamped “Joseph French, Royal Exchange, Liverpool.” Weighing in at over 81 grams, the handsome example featured Roman numbers, sub seconds dial, and its key. It closed at \$3,200, easily surpassing pre-sale expectations. Close behind at \$3,150 was a 60-piece Gorham Chantilly sterling silver flatware service for 12, totaling 59.26 troy ounces, including forks, salad forks, teaspoons, butter spreaders, and knives.

Ethnographic items also performed well. A rare carved soapstone polar bear by John Louis “Cutapuis” Clarke (1881–1970) fetched \$2,750, well past estimates. Measuring 10.5 by 2.5 by 6 inches, the signed carving depicted the animal in stride. Clarke, of Blackfeet heritage, deaf since childhood, became one of the most celebrated Native American carvers of the early 20th century. Typically working in wood, soapstone examples are uncommon and were usually

inspired by Clarke’s visit to Chicago’s Century of Progress Exposition in the 1930s. The piece was authenticated by Clarke’s granddaughter, Dana Turvey of the Clarke Art Gallery in East Glacier, Montana.



It’s been a bit more than a year since Kimberly-Clark introduced a new line of Huggies diapers. Carefully engineered, “Little Snugglers” are designed to prevent even the worst “blowout.” (If you have to ask, you don’t need to know).

To prove the point (and to promote the sale of this line of diapers), McCann Advertising was called in with its team of marketing specialists. First on the to-do list was to brainstorm how best to demonstrate the superior coverage provided by these disposable diapers.

The decision was made to put Little Snugglers to the supreme test, outfitting a group of babies in these diapers, feeding them, and then putting them in a situation where diaper failure would be disastrous. But what would be the worst thing that might be ruined? The answer: antique treasures. Not just any antiques, though. Valuable treasures, items that are one-of-a-kind. And, of course, they had to be white.

The wheels were put into motion for a



over 40 bids, double the high estimates, at \$1,000.

Rustic charm was on full display with a good collection of primitives and country furniture. A 19th-century 12-tin pie safe with unusual tins punched "W.R. Jones," neatly met expectations at \$580. Meanwhile, a \$250 offer scored a pine dough-box paired with an early 20th-century cherry utensil carrier from the living estate of longtime primitive/country antiques dealer Nancy Roth. More unusual was the 65-inch-high hand-painted herb-drying wheel fashioned from a wagon wheel with herbs listed on the rim. Despite paint wear, the decorative folk piece pulled \$130.

Traditional antique furniture also found its buyers. A 19th-century leather Campeche chair and matching ottoman, with mahogany frames and nailhead-trimmed upholstery, reached \$420. An early 20th-century American Arts and Crafts oak settee came in more

modestly at \$190, while a Louis XV-style carved chaise lounge finished at \$160.

Among other appointments, three pairs of custom Scalamandré green silk drapes, with swag-and-jabot valances and tasseled trim, proved an unexpected standout. More than two dozen bids drove them to \$2,500, roughly four times their estimate. A late-18th-century English tall-case clock signed "John Morse of Southampton," with painted dial and eight-day weight-driven works, attracted 44 bids, passing double the estimate at \$2,450. An antique room-size rag rug from the Roth estate, composed of three sewn panels in shades of blue and rust, also doubled expectations at \$440.

A huge array of decorative accessories seemed to be at every turn, keeping bidding lively. A group of 14 English Diamond-Jubilee brass push-up candlesticks, bearing motifs like "King of Diamonds" and "Queen of Diamonds," climbed to \$580. A pair of Neoclassical-style brass urns with acanthus han-

dles garnered \$250, while a Chinese pique-à-jour enameled bowl, on a carved wood stand, changed hands at \$210.

Furniture and décor eventually gave way to other categories, including jewelry. Topping at \$2,100 was a 14-karat yellow gold and diamond necklace by Aurafin with a herringbone chain centered by a heart set with diamonds. Later, a platinum diamond ring of approximately two carats total weight saw more restrained bidding, finishing below estimates at \$1,700. Then came two antique cameo brooches: an Italian variety in 14-karat gold at \$240, and a shell cameo brooch in 14-karat gold at \$180.

Collectors of literary material found highlights among the sale's first-edition and signed books. An Ayn Rand lot hit an impressive \$1,200. It included a gift card

signed by Rand and her husband, Frank O'Connor, tucked inside a later printing of *The Fountainhead* (Bobbs-Merrill, 1943), along with a later printing of *Atlas Shrugged* (Random House, 1957). A signed first edition of *No Country for Old Men* by Cormac McCarthy reached \$760, while a signed first edition of *The Exorcist* by William Peter Blatty finished at \$640, rounding out a diverse sale that drew bidders across a wide range of collecting interests.

# Greener a top name in guns for collectors to hunt

A "Greener" is a hunting rifle or shotgun manufactured by W.W. Greener, one of the oldest and most recognized firearm manufacturers in England. William Greener founded W. Greener in 1829 in Newcastle, England. In 1844 he moved the company to Birmingham because most of the materials and components used to make Greener guns were manufactured in Birmingham. Although the founder's name was William, the "W.W." in the company's modern name refers to William Wellington Greener, the founder's son.

ing for the McCann campaign, Bleeden explained that the goal was to produce an hourlong "documentary" that could be viewed on a variety of online platforms. Thus, the search was on for 18 well-fed babies whose "resumes" included the capability of producing blowouts.

But it didn't stop there. What would be the perfect location in which to film an hour-long "documentary," one that would bring together a selection of white treasures and 18 babies with active innards? Chicago was the chosen location. And whatever site was selected, it had to be accessible for a luxury automobile (more about that later). In the end, Essanay Studios in Chicago was selected.

As for the perfect "props," the stakes were high. If the chosen whitish treasures were ruined, what then? There was no room for failure. That said, the hunt was on for the best of the best. There were a number of rugs that might have been just fine. But "fine" wasn't good enough. As it turned out, only one of them fit the "irreplaceable" category, and so the decision was obvious. As for the bed, the bones for the perfect handcarved headboard and footboard were discovered at an antique salvage yard. Restoration artists made the bed picture-perfect, and it was fitted with luxurious linens. A Chicago designer produced what was the perfect gown, made even more perfect with the addition of a 16-foot train. And a vintage shop provided what proved to be the ideal mid-century French provincial-style settee, not only exquisite but also safe seating for the babies.

Finally, the car. Not just any car would do. A "white-on-white-on-white" model was required and, as it happened, the one that was finally chosen was one of only five that met the criterion. It was noted that of all the irreplaceable items on the set, this was the one that was accompanied by a guard. But then, its sticker price is in the \$300,000 range.

Finally, the true stars of the show: The call went out for 18 babies with a history of reliably overactive gastrointestinal issues. That number grew by one when the baby of an employee was included. No "professional" babies were recruited. No stage moms were on set either, although those parents in attendance of what turned out to be a one-hour feature wore protective booties over their shoes and were always close at hand. Safety

was first and foremost, and professional "baby wranglers" monitored the set. Along with two hosts who kept up a pleasant patter, there was a strolling violinist and "spotters" who tracked the action. Even though the pressure was on, the on-set atmosphere was soothing. Thanks to ethereal music, a calming color scheme, and a comfortable air temperature, one observer suggested that the set felt a bit like heaven.

As it happened, it was just right for keeping the babies relaxed enough to do what it was that they were there to do. And if Huggies' "Little Snugglers" proved not to be up to what was promised? Just in case, there were a variety of insurance arrangements at the ready. On the other hand, no amount of money could replace the irreplaceable.

On a personal note, I never thought that the world of diapers and the world of antiques and collectibles would ever intersect. Nor could I imagine that I might be assigned to check into a project such as this one. Finally, there's one last question that has yet to be answered: What's to become of the babies? Where do they go from here? Their images will live on forever, along with their names, thanks to the rolling credits. Will they enjoy bragging rights, or shy away from their moment of stardom? Could this be just the beginning of a career on the big screen? Or an embarrassing video shown at their expense at a future wedding reception? Time will tell.

William Greener believed in muzzle loading weapons, and he flatly refused to modernize his company and produce breechloaders. Original breechloaders used crude "bullets," and most modern weapons are considered breechloaders. For this reason, William Wellington Greener opened his own company, in 1864, producing breech-loading rifles. Upon the death of William Greener in 1869, William Wellington Greener merged the two companies into the W.W. Greener Company, the name the company is still known by today.

Modern day collectors actively seek W.W. Greener rifles marked "Enfields," which were some of the first weapons W.W. Greener produced after opening his own company. A small number of these rifles were imported for use by the Confederacy during the American Civil War. These rifles are quite rare and increase in value each year.

The name "Greener" is so famous that it is sometimes used as product placement in movies. It is unclear in Greener's case if the marketing strategy of product placement was actually paid for by the company or is simply used in the movies under the "fair use" doctrine of product placement. Here are two examples:

In the movie *Big Jake*, a 1971 western

Greener shotguns have always been the pinnacle of British craftsmanship, making them some of the most sought after collectibles for gun enthusiasts ever made. As *Big Jake* and *Jaws* show, Greener shotguns and other weapons are also cross-collectible movie collectibles.

starring John Wayne, Wayne plays an aging rancher forced to track down a gang that has kidnapped his grandson. In one scene, Wayne says to Maureen O'Hara, his wife in the film, "Martha, you didn't happen to think of my Greeners, the double barrels?"

The interesting thing about this scene is that the "Greeners" that Wayne refers to are not real Greeners. The American Gun Company produced the double barrel shotguns used in *Big Jake*. Wayne uses the term "Greener" as a generic name for shotguns based on W.W. Greener Company's reputation for quality firearms.

Another interesting movie reference to W.W. Greener weapons came from the movie *Jaws* in 1975. In Spielberg's ocean-going masterpiece, shark hunter Quint, played by Robert Shaw, is seen using a W.W. Greener Light Harpoon Gun Mk.2 to shoot harpoons with barrels attached at the shark, which makes for a suspenseful scene in the movie.

Historians have noted that Shaw assembles and shoots the Greener Harpoon Gun

in "a way that basically follows the user manual verbatim," so Hollywood got this right. This is one of the few times in movie history when an exotic firearm — a Greener Light Harpoon Gun — is depicted and properly used.

The Greener Light Harpoon Gun used in the movie *Jaws* was offered this month at auction with a presale estimate up to \$500,000.





# Gallagher wood carvings have graced cigar stores for decades

Although Cigar Store Indians are the most famous type of tobacconist signs, few actual Native Americans carved them. One notable exception is Frank Gallagher a Man-Dan Indian.

Frank Gallagher's grandfather, Samuel Gallagher began hand carving Cigar Store Indians in the 1840s after tobacconists around the United States started hanging out trade signs to advertise their wares.

The use of a carved Cigar Store Indian as a tobacconist symbol outside of tobacco shops began in London, England, in the early 1600s. Ships from the American colonies brought large loads of tobacco to England. American Indians introduced tobacco to English colonists, so English tobacconists used these carved American Indian figures as trade advertising signs outside their shops.

The European wood carvers who sculpted the earliest Cigar Store Indians basically had never seen a Native American and knew nothing of the different Indian cultures. These earliest carvings represented how carvers envisioned American Indians, not how Native Americans actually were. Many of these earliest Cigar Store Indians featured feathered

headdresses and exotic facial features. British tobacconists did not care how the statues looked as long as smokers enjoyed seeing a Cigar Store Indian in front of a tobacco shop.

Sarah Elliot speaking for PBS in 2015 said, "Cigar store Indians traded on simple, demeaning stereotypes. The figures were a product of their time, a period fraught with prejudice

against indigenous peoples. The statues helped to invent and then reinforce the quintessential stereotype of an 'authentic' Native American by often depicting figures with bronzed-colored skin wearing feathered headdresses, long fringed skirts or shirts, and moccasins. Two of the more common types of Indian cigar statues portray the 'noble savage' with a stoic expression and passive stance; or the warrior, who brandishes a weapon he's poised to use."

Samuel Gallagher began hand carving Cigar Store Indians in the 1840s, selling several of them to tobacco

stores. Samuel began his craft arving furniture for a store owner named Gallagher, from whom Samuel took his family's name. Samuel passed on the gift and heritage of carving Cigar Store Indians to his son, Ralph, and then his grandson, Frank Gallagher.



# Collecting the Beatles

medical attention supplied to the hundreds of injured fans every time a frenzied riot charged past barriers at concerts.

The fan worship of the Beatles was detested by the older generation – making the concept even more appealing to millions of teenagers determined to rebel against society’s norms. The charges against The Beatles for fostering ‘cultish’ behavior would only become more vigorous when Lennon announced that the band was “more popular than Christ.”

In 1965, the Christian Crusade published a book titled “Communism, Hypnotism and The Beatles.” The book re-ferred to the band as “anti-Christ beatniks” who were destroying the mental stability of children with their vulgar and profane influence. It warned that the type of worshipful behavior taking place at Beatles concerts would lead to an eventual revolution. After Lennon’s comment regarding their godlike popularity, many fans burned their records and several radio stations refused to play their music. Protestors, angry at such a show of egotism, crowded outside concerts issuing threats of violence.

There were millions of others, however, who weren’t fazed by the comments, as they held the band in a divine light. Many people brought their sick and disabled children to concerts, begging the band members to ‘cure them’. A number of teenaged girls stood on ledges or sent messages, threatening to commit suicide if a band member did not agree to meet her. The unmatched chaos had turned into a dangerous hysteria that became more than John, George, Paul and Ringo had ever bargained for. In 1966, they decided to cease touring. In the studio, they recorded hits such as “Penny Lane” and “Strawberry Fields Forever.” The band split up in 1970. Ten years later, John was fatally shot by former fan Mark David Chapman. It was alleged that the assassin had become angrily disheartened by John’s ego and luxurious lifestyle. George died from lung cancer in 2001.

Over the last 40 years, music and motor sports promoter Chris Agajanian has amassed over 2,000 pieces of the band’s history. Appraiser Gary Sohmers, known as ‘The King of Pop Culture’, cataloged the collection. A former appraiser on PBS’s ‘Antiques Roadshow,’ VH1’s ‘For What It’s Worth,’ and a WBZ monthly radio show which fo-cused on valuing antiques, Sohmers is known for his colorful Hawaiian shirts, the collectibles store he runs, and the rock opera he produced. “I like to stay busy,” he said.

Sohmers has been buying and selling Beatles memorabilia for 50 years. “The moments the Beatles captured back then still reverberate with excitement,” he said. “They crafted a spirit and an energy. They put in the time to craft a sound and a vibe that didn’t exist. I listen to them and I can’t stop myself



from grooving. They are forever. Generation upon generation.”


When it comes to Agajanian’s collection, which includes George’s glasses, Paul’s pink and purple ruffled shirt, in-struments, posters and records, Sohmers noted what he believes to be the grandest item in the groovy accumula-tion. “He’s got John Lennon’s beige suit. I mean, come on. There’s only one. That’s the ionic item in that



collection,” he said. Sohmers has valued the collection at \$2 million.

Other items that make up the collection are a wax bust of John, George’s gold medallion, vintage fan merchandise, concert tickets, photographs, records, and posters.

For those who are not intent on purchasing 2,000 collectibles, flea markets and auctions regularly turn up vintage Beatles items to be bought

singularly. Vintage newspaper and magazine articles following the band’s rise to fame are going for as little as \$2, while photographs signed by the band are commanding over \$10,000. Although the market isn’t flooded with remnants of Beatlemania, it isn’t dry either. Eight days a week, there are plenty of old records and posters, far-out pin-back buttons and fab trading cards floating around with price tags on them.
