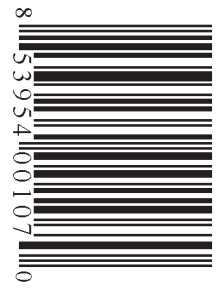

Trade with China part of America's birth

No doubt the Liberty Bell and Constitution Hall will enjoy an increase in tourism this year in Philadelphia. But there are other stories to be told there of America's earliest days. And from now until Jan. 3, 2028, visitors to the Independence Seaport Museum, located in the City of Brotherly Love, can delve into a new and thought-provoking exhibition.

"Seeking Profit and Power: Philadelphia, China Trade, and the Making of America" invites museumgoers to take a step forward, to look beyond the War and the borders of the new country and consider the direction of America, just as it achieved its independence. The economic and political decisions made by everyday citizens of the fledgling country have proved to be fundamental to the viability of the country that is now celebrating its 250th birthday.

To be sure, the years that followed the Revolutionary War were "a critical moment in the history of our nation," according to Peter S. Seibert, president and CEO of the Philadelphia-based

museum. To accommodate museumgoers seeking to visit and revisit what is "the biggest exhibition in decades for this institution," "Seeking Power and Profit" is timed to be on display before, during, and after the official celebration of America's Semiquincentennial.

In a recent interview, Seibert set the stage, explaining that then-colonists had come to enjoy imported goods, while, at the same time, benefiting financially from the sale of their exports. Having won independence from Great Britain, however, the balance of trade agreements was suddenly upended. To be decided was how best to establish and maintain those economic relationships critical to the economy of the new nation. Telling this story are some 150 unique and rarely seen objects, ones that bear witness to the fledgling country as it came to establish its place in the world of global trade. And as it happened, Seibert noted, "China became our first trading partner."

Not surprisingly, the colonists-turned-citizens were not about to give up the exotic luxuries that they had long enjoyed, including fine silk fabrics and imported porcelain wares, lacquerware and tea. The market for these items was not limited to wealthy city folk: Seibert personally attested to having found examples of imported porcelain wares at

country household sales. At the same time, Chinese consumers had grown accustomed to exotic raw goods from North America, including silver and animal pelts.

Speaking on a broader level, Seibert explained that just as Europeans had looked westward to markets across the Atlantic Ocean, Americans looked westward across the Pacific. Private citizens, separated from the rules and regulations that governed overseas trade, risked their lives to make the trip halfway around the world, hoping to secure their fortunes. But the promise of wealth to be gained was more than enough incentive for many.

Thinking about the process that led to the mounting of this exhibition, Seibert recalled the decision to not interpret either Revolutionary War battles or the political processes that led to the nation's formation. Instead, the focus was to concentrate on looking outward rather than inward. Addressing global trade issues was a comfortable fit for the

Museum, in light of its location in the Penn's Landing complex along the Delaware River in Philadelphia.

Organized by guest curators Susan Gail Johnson and Brett Palfreyman, the exhibition is divided into five parts: "Making a Nation," "Making it Work," "Making Money," "Encountering Each Other," and "The Old China Trade." Telling the story is a wide range of objects, from ship logs and silks to porcelain wares and portraits. In addition to those holdings from the Independence Seaport Museum are items on loan from George Washington's Mount Vernon and The Society of The Cincinnati, as well as The Dieterich American Foundation and Andalusia Historic House and Gardens.

"People," Seibert observed, "go to a museum to see cool stuff." And to be sure, there is a lot of "cool stuff" currently on exhibit, visual reminders of the life and times of those who lived just as the country stepped onto the world stage for the first time. By way of enticement, Seibert offered a taste of what is in the

Bud Stewart duck lure caught a \$1,025 bid

GLADWIN, Mich. — On March 10, John Peck Auctions conducted an exciting decoy and sportsman-themed living estate auction featuring 832 lots from an exceptional one-owner collection. The sale included angling collectibles, carved fish decoys, guns, ammunition, and wildlife art, along with numerous other sporting collectibles.

Firearms and related goods anchored much of the sale, with approximately 40 long guns auctioned. The selection included modern, antique, and reproduction rifles and shotguns, as well as several black powder firearms. Possession was handled through two federally licensed firearm facilities, allowing buyers to participate with ease.

Among the standouts, pulling \$2,100, was a like-new Henry H011 lever-action .44-40 rifle, featuring a brass receiver, deluxe wood stock, and 24-inch octagon barrel. Bidding hit \$1,525 for a Benelli Super Black Eagle 3 semi-auto 12-gauge shotgun with digital camo finish and 28-inch ventilated rib barrel. Competition was also strong on a good-condition Japan-made Browning BL lever-action .22 LR, fitted with a white maple stock and

engraved silver receiver. In good condition with only light handling marks, it brought \$720.

Handguns were a smaller segment, with just eight crossing the block. Leading the group was a Ruger Mark IV Hunter semi-auto .22 LR in like-new condition. It featured a Burris FastFire III red dot, stainless finish, fluted barrel, rosewood finger-groove grips. It came with two magazines and a range bag. The package closed at \$710. Markedly different was an Italian-made Pedersoli .45 caliber flintlock reproduction pistol, clean overall but needing work, which sold for \$140.

Shooters eagerly bid on more than 150 ammunition lots in a broad range of types and calibers. The high mark of \$150 went to a lot with 200 rounds of .300 Blackout 155-grain ammo, six rounds of .223 Remington, and an ammo can. Later, a box of 20 Winchester "Legendary Lawmen" 150 grain .30-30 cartridges closed at \$100. Meanwhile, 150 rounds of Nosler Partition .30 caliber (.308), in a mix of 150, 165, and 180 grain loads, finished at \$81.

Black powder enthusiasts had tempting items to consider. Among them was a 6-inch can of DuPont Superfine gunpowder that left for \$43, while a bid of just \$16 got an 8-ounce can of DuPont smoke-

less antique shotgun powder.

For shooters uninterested in firearms, there was a Ravin R20 Helicoil crossbow package that soared to \$1,275. It was armed with arrows, a quiver, broadheads, and a Vortex Strike Eagle scope. Practice gear was also available, like a Black Hole crossbow target, which scored a modest \$34.

Given the sale's sporting focus, decoys were naturally on display. Over 60 were available, many of them folk-art varieties. They included a 6.5-inch Bud Stewart turtle spearing decoy, which pulled \$580. A \$330 offer won a larger 10-inch Stewart bass spearing decoy. Others included a 9-inch signed swimming duck

spearing decoy for \$270, a circa 1992 6.5-inch Jim Nelson carved frog decoy for \$76, and a 7-inch Carl Christensen rainbow trout spearing decoy for \$53.

Duck decoys attracted their own attention, led by a 12-inch Tom Taber example, which climbed to \$190. A slightly larger 13-inch Taber decoy finished close at \$180. Field decoys also saw action, like a set of six plastic goose and two turkey decoys, finding a buyer at \$90.

Anglers also kept busy with a substantial variety of fishing gear. Roughly a dozen rods were auctioned, covering freshwater, fly, and ice fishing styles.

Sometimes keeping the collection is the best option

It all began with an elephant. Actually, a group of elephants. White elephants, literally and figuratively. Let me explain.

A few weeks ago, I was chatting with a friend, and somehow the conversation led to her telling me about her sister-in-law. It seems that my friend's relative

had inherited some carved ivory figurines depicting elephants. Decorative in nature, they ranged from small to smaller. They were not exactly something that fit in with the decor of their new home.

The new owner considered selling them, but an antique dealer said that no one would touch these miniaturized versions of the largest land-living animals, made from elephants' tusks. As it happens, their sale has been restricted by a late-twentieth century law. Hearing the story, I said I'd check with an appraiser friend who might have some ideas.

Long story short: Mike Ivankovich confirmed what we had already known. It's illegal to sell anything made of ivory unless the seller can prove that it's at least 100 years old. And the cost for testing the age of ivory usually exceeds its value, Mike pointed out. All of which is meant to restrict the needless slaughter of elephants. . . we've all seen those sad public service announcements on television.

While I had his attention, I asked

Mike what else is a drag on the market these days, for whatever reason. Without hesitation, he ticked off stamp collections, someone else's tourism mementos, and pop culture collectibles from another generation that mean nothing to younger people. To the list he added most brown furniture, prints made by early twentieth-century artists, and books written by Michael Ivankovich.

I suppose what all this boils down to is that if you have any of these "unsellable" objects in your possession, enjoy them while you can. I enjoy looking at these items, and they bring back happy memories.

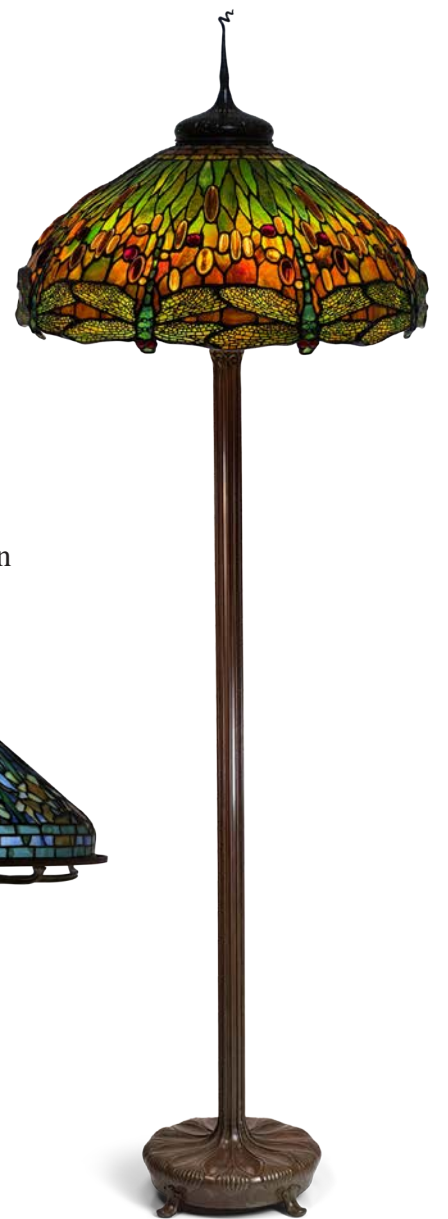

Prices remained modest, topping out at \$71 for a 27-inch Light-13 tickle stick with a Free Fall reel. A pairing of vintage three-piece South Bend and Monague fly rods landed \$41.

Reels followed a similar pattern, with both vintage and modern casting, fly, and spinning varieties, from makers like Johnson, Shakespeare, and Zebco, selling from \$2-\$25.

Fishing lures dominated the angling category, with about 150 lots available. A standout was a 1.5-inch Bud Stewart duck lure, which soared to \$1,025. Other Stewart pieces also did well, like a 2-inch duck lure that grabbed \$610, and a 6-inch custom-order frog lure that nabbed \$540. Some of the more unusual versions included a 3.5-inch Bud Stewart

duck lure at \$350, a 7-inch muskrat lure for \$160, and a 6-inch crippled eel lure at \$130.

Anglers also pursued practical gear. A 13.5-inch-long fishing creel basket, possibly Native American, reached \$350, while a smaller leather-and-clasp creel sold for \$27. Trout nets found favor, like a Vintage Ames MFG Co. "Troutster" net going for \$45, and an Ed Cumings (Flint, Mich.) trout net close behind at \$43.

The angling theme extended into the first of the sporting and wildlife artwork. A dozen folk-art fish wall mounts included a 48-inch wood fish decoy signed by Jim Nelson, which reached \$250, and a 30-inch steelhead at \$230. Over two dozen pieces of wall art spanned everything from wildlife portraits to ammunition displays. Highlights included a Nosler bullet display for \$370, a National Wild Turkey Federation stamp collection at \$220, and an original fly-fishing watercolor by Jerry Horan for \$74.

Sculptural art included a 1997 numbered bronze, 'The Sheep Hunter,' which achieved \$350, a Remington "Bronco Buster" Bronze on a marble base, for \$170, and a 13-inch 1995 Whitetails Unlimited bronze, 'Walking the Line,' at \$110.

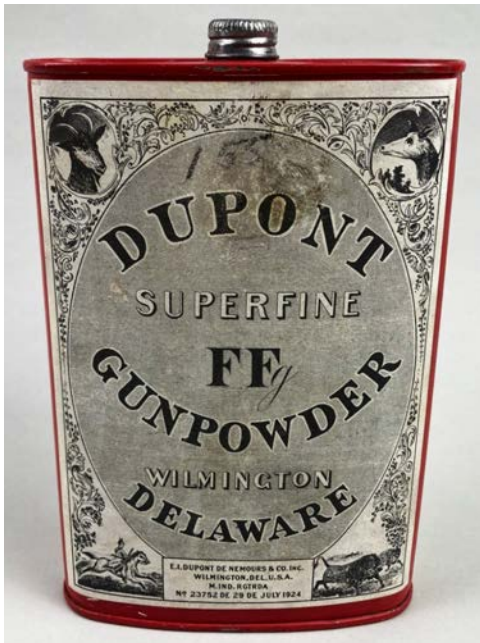

smile is an advertising card featuring Pete the Pirate, who, back in the day, introduced after school cartoons to after school television viewers in Baltimore.

The lesson of all of this, I suppose, is that trinkets and remembrances from days gone by are, in themselves, not really worth much to those who don't know the stories behind them. There are exceptions, of course. Think Abe Lincoln-related items, fine artwork, and sports memorabilia related to certain superstars. Everything else is collected pretty much for our own amusement. But that's just fine.

Taking another look at Mike's list of collectibles worth very little, I can think of one exception, that being a school-boy's stamp collection. As it happens, one young collector took great delight in drawing mustaches, beards, and pipes on Queen Victoria, King George VI, and others gracing his "Green Album." You might already have guessed that this was the work of John Lennon, and his album is now in the collection of the National Postal Museum in Washington, D.C. As for ivory objects, President John F. Kennedy enjoyed his extensive collection of scrimshaw, long before the institution of the 1989 worldwide ban on ivory.

Hull Collectors to meet April 18

MARION, S.C. — The Hull Pottery Association (HPA) will hold a regional show and sale at the Marion Opera House on Saturday, April 18 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Opera House is located at 109 E. Godbold St., Marion, SC. The show is free and open to the public.

The one-day show will feature dealers from around the country and hundreds of pieces of Hull Pottery for sale. Other American made pottery will also be for sale. The public will get the chance to learn more about Hull Pottery, HPA and meet long-time dealers and collectors.

The mission of HPA is to preserve, promote and educate the public about Hull Pottery.

Hull Pottery began production in 1905 in Crooksville, Ohio, under the leadership of Addis Emmet (A.E.) Hull. The company's early lines consisted of common utilitarian stoneware, semi-porcelain dinnerware and decorative tile. Hull continued production in Crooksville for the next several decades. During that time, the company introduced dozens

of different lines including artistic/decorative lines, cookie jars, dinnerware, planters and novelty pieces. Hull even survived a flood/fire in the 1950s. In the late 1960s through the mid-1980s, the company changed its production from artistic lines to predominately House 'n' Garden serving ware and Imperial florist ware. Hull Pottery closed in 1986. HPA is celebrating its 33rd anniversary in 2026.

Prices were shining bright at Roan lamp auction

COGAN STATION, Pa. — Collectors wanting to “light up their lives” made sure to shop the March 15 auction hosted by Roan, Inc. Auctioneers & Appraisers. Hundreds of lots (just shy of 690, to be exact) of oil lamps, lanterns, lamp parts, shades, wicks, fonts – any and everything vintage lamp related, crossed the auction block this day.

Student lamps were prevalent, as were hanging lamps, wall/bracket pieces, Gone With The Wind examples, and glass table top beauties. With names like Aladdin, Coleman, Rayo, and Juno being represented, there were styles for all tastes.

Leading the sale were two lots each realizing \$1,100. Prices do not include the 20 percent buyer’s premium. A large Victorian brass, three-arm hanging oil lamp or chandelier which sported clear patterned fonts, having three frosted paneled patterned glass shades as well as prism adornments was an exceptionally grand example of lighting from this era.

The other lot realizing \$1,100 was in another genre – railroad oil lanterns, and included three examples. Each member of the trio was created by a different manufacturer and included PRR with a clear unmarked (though cracked) globe; a Dietz example with a short clear globe marked “B&ORR”, and a no name “Bell Bottom” lantern with a clear broken globe made up the set.

A selection of five antique tin oil post lamp fonts sold together for \$800. A tin

oil post lamp font is a metal reservoir, typically made of tin or sheet metal, designed to hold liquid fuel (kerosene or whale oil) for lamps mounted on posts, walls, or brackets. One example in the lot was made of glass but was covered in tin with a “window” like opening in the tin revealing the glass so the amount of fuel inside could be determined.

A pair of antique Hitchcock & Wanzler nicked oil table lamps, both with working fan motors in their stems, were bid to \$750. Both boasted the Wanzler less burner with original winder key. The bodies of each lamp stood 10 ½ inches tall.

Wearing remnants of old green paint, an antique Defiance tin oil post or street lamp marked “Defiance Lantern & Stamping Co., Rochester, NY USA” sold for \$550. It sported a clear globe and stood 24 inches tall.

Featuring an owl figure with spread wings clutching a snake, an antique brass hand oil in a great cylinder form realized \$300. With its folding hand grip, this lantern was made of chased brass with a tin font inside, a clear cylinder chimney, and a pocket lens door at front.

Other lamps selling strong that deserve a “shout-out” would include the antique white cast metal Junior banquet oil stand lamp which came in at \$325. Attractive features include a fancy embossed foot base and a white china ball

shade wearing a stunning hand-painted lily-of-the-valley work.

Always a favorite, and often hard-to-find, was the antique brass double angle hanging oil light which retained its old surface and featured an embossed tank; clear elbows and a pair of second generation blue ribbed swirl shades with ruffled tops. This distinctive lamp was bid to \$250.

Antique lighting continues to be a

exhibition. Of particular note is Captain John Green's sea chest, made of mahogany and bald cypress wood. Its design and construction suggest that it was made either in port or aboard ship, but it returned to Green's home shores with decorative hardware, probably applied in Canton, China.

Although the owner's identity remains unknown, an exquisitely decorated lacquer sewing box, publicly seen for the first time, is on view. Seibert found it of particular interest in light of the fact that the box was fully furnished with ivory utensils, including bobbin holders and a tool to organize embroidery floss. Another luxury item that traveled halfway around the world to an American woman is a burgundy-colored embroidered shawl, made of Chinese silk crepe and embroidered with silk floss.

On view for the first time is a porcelain salesman's sample cup and saucer. The border of the pieces is decorated with multiple designs from which consumers make their selection of a pattern. Similarly, silk swatches were affixed to a sample card, taking some of the guesswork out of ordering fabric. Also of interest is a porcelain bowl, probably made around 1790; it was decorated in Canton, with an American flag, intended to please an American customer.

After the celebration of the Semiquincentennial, the museum will continue to host special programs in connection with this landmark exhibition. And if all goes well, a seminar will take place in the fall. Seibert hopes that visitors to "Seeking Profit and Power" will find it to be an "engaging" visual experience, one from which "we can learn together."

And finally, in keeping with the spirit of the exhibition, Seibert confirmed that the commemorative souvenir wares sold in the gift shop were made in China. The old trade routes continue onward.

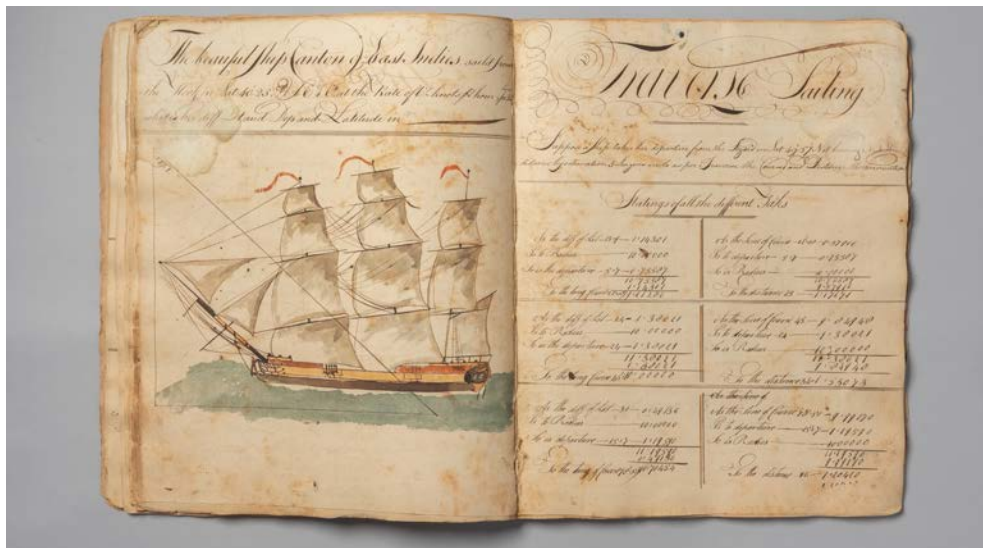

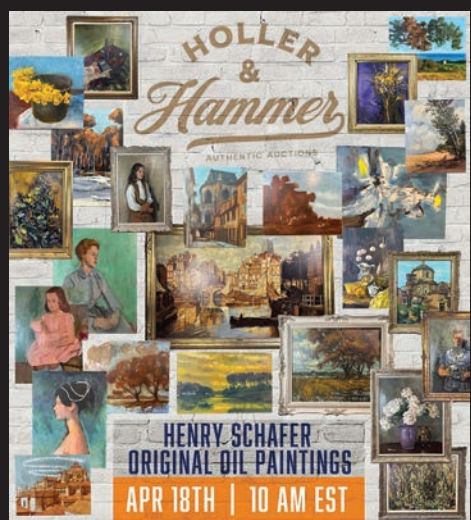

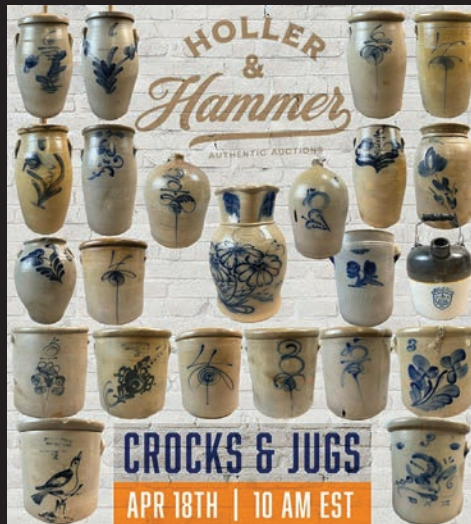
