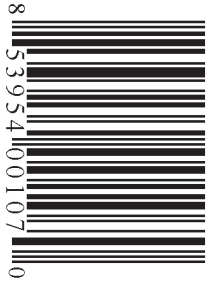

Harris Strong tiles still brighten the walls of homes

Before Harris G. Strong, 1950s wall décor was just an afterthought. The innovative designer's framed ceramic tiles essentially created the market for decorative wall hangings. "I was the first person to show them," recalled Strong. "Previously, furniture stores would say 'I only buy lamps — they go with the sofa.' We'd say, 'these will go, too.' And they did. Years later, over 50 percent of the exhibitors in New York's lamp building were showing wall décor."

Strong was born in Waukesha, Wis., in 1920. Early artistic influences included legendary carnival artist "Snap" Wyatt, who patronized the Strong family diner, and gave Harris art lessons in exchange for meals. "He did the weirdest things," noted Strong, "like sideshow paintings of 'The Snake Lady.' Not really 'The Snake Lady' you'd find inside, but what you thought she should look like."

More lasting was the influence of his artist aunt, 'Brownie,' who ran a greeting card company. Said Strong, "she had a little place in the village — 'Brownie's Block Prints' — and I used to go there. Well, I just got the idea that this was what I wanted to do — not to make greeting cards, but to be an artist. So I drew a lot."

Strong later enrolled at North Carolina State, studying ceramic engineering. "That way," he said, "I would have a fallback — I could always do engineering. It was the Depression, and your education was your meal ticket. But my hope was that I could start making pottery — manufacture it, not just 'play' with it."

After service in World War II and

completion of his college degree, Strong moved to New York in 1946, and was associated with the Brooklyn pottery, Kelby Originals. After a year, Strong and co-worker Robert Krasner left to found their own firm, Potters of Wall Street. "Basically," said Strong, "we made ceramic lamps, ashtrays, and small wares. I did all the glaze chemistry."

After dissolving the partnership in 1951, Strong set up a pottery for American Art Industries, devising all glazes and casting techniques. It was during this

Springfield Antique Show and Ohio Country Antiques Show joined forces

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — The weekend of April 18–19 brought a noticeable change to Ohio’s antiques calendar and the Clark County Fairgrounds, as the Ohio Country Antiques Show joined the long-running Springfield Antique Show & Flea Market. The pairing created a single weekend experience spread across multiple buildings and fields, giving shoppers access to two well-known shows with a single ticket.

Organizers Jenkins & Co. (Springfield) and Sabin Show Management (Ohio Country) teamed up to integrate both shows, housing the Ohio Country event in the Youth Building for its Springfield debut. The goal was to keep the popular country show’s identity intact while giving it the benefit of Springfield’s larger audience and long-established platform.

The concept was simple and, by most accounts, effective: two shows running

side by side, both included with a single admission. Jenkins said the combination would create “a true style sourcing mecca — from everyday treasures to investment pieces.” Saturday shoppers had the option of an 8 to 9 a.m. “Early Bird” buying hour for \$10, giving a head start browsing both shows. After 9 a.m. general admission dropped to \$3, and the grounds opened for regular shopping for the remainder of the event.

The Springfield Antique Show & Flea Market, now in its fifth decade, once again showed why it remains a cornerstone event for collectors across the Midwest and beyond. Held nine times a year, the show is known for its large footprint, broad dealer base, and mix of goods. The April edition brought together more than 300 dealers across outdoor fields and four packed buildings, with merchandise spanning traditional an-

Ty Cobb baseball cards hit a home run at auction

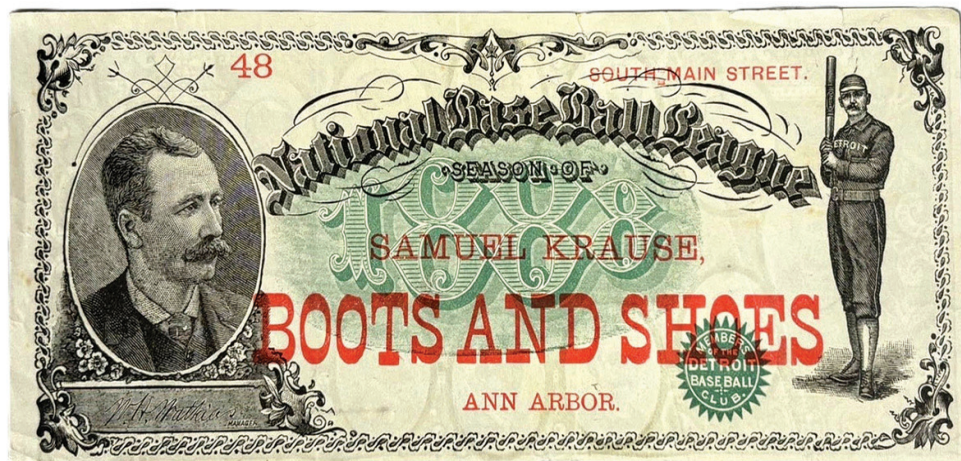

JACKSON, Mich. — All-time Detroit Tigers centerfield great Ty Cobb batted .366 during his 1905 to 1928 career. He continued to hit hard at a March Holler and Hammer sports auction.

Four different Cobb tobacco cards from 1909 to 1911 were sold. A highly recognizable Cobb “bat on shoulder” series T206 card, with its bold yellow background sold for \$10,000. The PSA 6 grade was an upper-tier condition for a T206 card, even with a “MC” (miscut) qualifier. Eye appeal in person and online was strong enough to command the premium price.

A different T206 yellow Cobb card with a grading drop to VG-EX 4 and with more visible wear, soft corners, and possible surface issues still sold for \$6,000. The hammer price underscored how strong demand remains for any clean, presentable Cobb T206.

The Cobb T205 issue is popular for its ornate gold borders and rich lithography around a more pleasant visage, but the outside design makes it notoriously

condition sensitive. A VG-EX 4 example sold for \$4,250, a respectable for its type price.

A red background T206 Cobb card is arguably the most famous in the entire set, striking, simple, and instantly recognizable. Even in a VG 3 holder, it

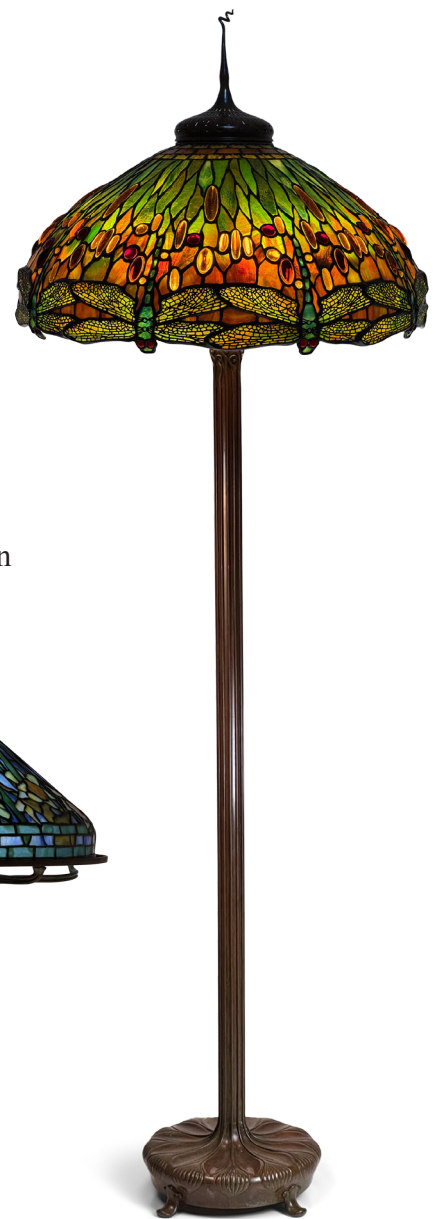

tiques, art, collectibles, and even vintage clothing.

The Ohio Country Antiques Show added a deep dive into the world of Americana, primitives, and folk art. Long held at the Roberts Centre near Wilmington, Ohio, it had developed a strong following for its boutique character and concentration on early decorative arts. The relocation to Springfield didn't dilute any of that identity. A spokesperson from Sabin confirmed 40+ curated dealers from nine states "[brought] early antiques, country furniture, and classic Americana — all under one roof, right in the middle of Springfield's outdoor season kickoff."

By aligning with the Springfield show, Ohio Country dealers gained access to a large built-in audience without losing the show's curated character. Organizers from both camps cited expanded marketing reach and stronger foot traffic as key benefits of the partnership, with dealers on both sides ap-

pearing to benefit from the increased attendance.

Shoppers clearly benefited from the juxtaposition of the two shows. Jenkins' April edition, already known as a more approachable early-season outing than their massive Extravanzas, remained easy to navigate, while the Ohio Country portion fit in neatly, giving buyers a heritage-driven specialty area to explore as part of the mix.

With Wilmington and Springfield located less than an hour apart, the decision to unify the weekends was as practical as it was strategic. For dealers, it streamlined scheduling by eliminating the need to choose between nearby shows that often overlap, or to book consecutive weekends in the same region.

Judy Leever, a shopper from Kentucky, said, "Looking forward to a wonderful change. We have talked to many customers, and they are excited to see what this collaboration will bring."

Early feedback from both dealers and shoppers suggested the combined format worked well and has lasting appeal. Beth Pulsipher, a dealer from Michigan, called it "a show within a show," adding buyers "[got] two shows

for the price of one admission."

Looking ahead, the combined shows return October 18-19, with the Ohio Country component again scheduled for Saturday in the Youth Building.

Jenkins semi-annual Springfield Extravanza featuring up to 2,000 vendors runs May 15-17.

commanded a strong \$4,000 winning bid because it was viewed as a cornerstone card, one that defined early baseball card art. Its slightly lower grade translated into the lower price, but in terms of visual impact and hobby status it remains the one Cobb card that many collectors chase first.

Two vintage Topps baseball card sets auctioned well. Compared side by side, the 1956 and 1958 sets offered a study in how condition and completeness shape the card market. The 1958 group, nearly complete and bolstered by a run of 11 graded stars, climbed to \$4,500 on the strength of marquee names like Mays, Aaron, and Williams. Even missing three cards, it had the feel of a curated set with key pieces singled out and preserved in higher grade.

The 1956 set was complete but entirely raw, a different kind of appeal rooted more in cohesion than condition. Its classic horizontal format and deep roster of Hall of Famers still drew strong interest at \$3,250, but with bidders left to trust their own eye. Together, the two lots illustrated a familiar divide in the hobby, one set shaped for the modern graded market and the other closer to how cards originally lived.

A couple of advertising pieces offered reminders that before trading cards and television, baseball sold itself through other objects. A Spalding "official National League ball" reverse-painted glass sign dating to the early 1920s sold for \$2,750.

A rare 1888 sports trade card, an early form of lithographed advertising tied to Detroit's first successful major leagues baseball team, sold for \$1,200. With the face of manager Bill Watkins on the front, the card advertising the Detroit Wolverines was handed to customers of an Ann Arbor, Mich., shoe and boot store hoping to employ the growing popularity of baseball to draw attention to the store.

"I've been collecting sports since I was a kid," auctioneer Jared Mark said, "and I've never seen a Detroit card like this."

Sadly, the trade card probably didn't do as much as was expected in its day. Even though they had won the league championship the year before, the Wolverines folded after the 1888 season supposedly due to high player salaries.

With a game time temperature of 60 and steady rain Michigan faced Ohio State for their annual football match-up on Oct. 25, 1919. As temperatures plunged during the game, Ohio State found better footing on a soaked Ann Arbor Ferry Field and pulled off a 13-3 victory. A nearly perfect condition program from that game sold for \$1,300.

A sealed 1954 Red Man tobacco premium package featuring Hall of Fame pitcher Warren Spahn brought \$1,000, its value tied as much to the card's apparent condition as to Spahn.

Even more unusual was the auctioning for \$500 of an unopened pack of Piedmont cigarettes, likely dating to the early decades of the 20th century. Such packages have been associated with the era of tobacco-insert cards, especially the famous T206 issue. As auctioneer Marks

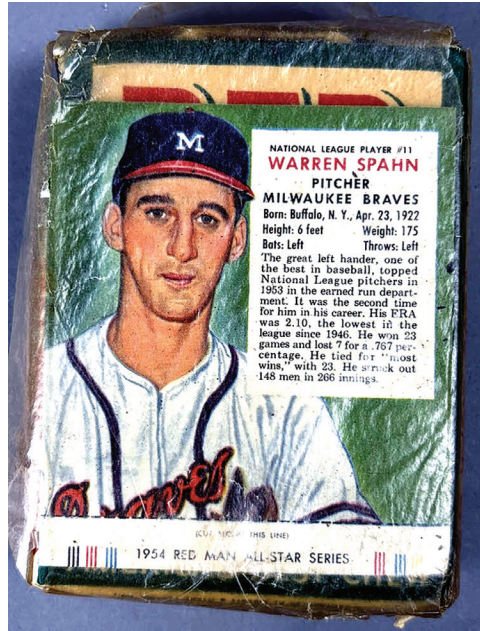

observed, the lingering question of what might be inside added more than a touch of intrigue that bidders found hard to resist.

On the other end of the bidding, a gold-tint framed 1937 airbrushed portrait of an obscure Illinois high school football player was hammered down for \$180. Sold in its day to the player's family by a traveling Chicago salesman.

A pair of signed former Detroit Tiger's pitcher Jack Morris and first baseman Darrel Evans baseballs were hammered at \$30, or \$15 apiece. And an

autographed Denny McLain "Year of the Pitcher" Time Magazine cover dated around his first 1968 win sold for an opening bid of \$25.

Thanks to the many readers of AntiqueWeek for continuing to reach out to me about their campaign memorabilia finds and questions! In this column we will try to catch up on the old mailbag.

according to Wikipedia. The concept became an issue during the 1940 FDR Roosevelt v. Willkie campaign, resulting in the production of this neat little 1 1/4 inch

celluloid pin-back button. It has never been reproduced to my knowledge and frequently sells today in the \$250 range.

Q: In 1972 the band Chicago issued a button supporting the candidacy of George McGovern for President. I have one in very good condition. Is it selling for much these days? — H.W.

A: Absolutely! The rock group Chicago's benefit concert for George McGovern in San Francisco in May of 1972 may not be remembered by many, but the creation of this fantastic 2 1/2-inch celluloid pin-back campaign button is memorable in of itself. One sold in the last year in a mail order auction for a most impressive \$6,000!

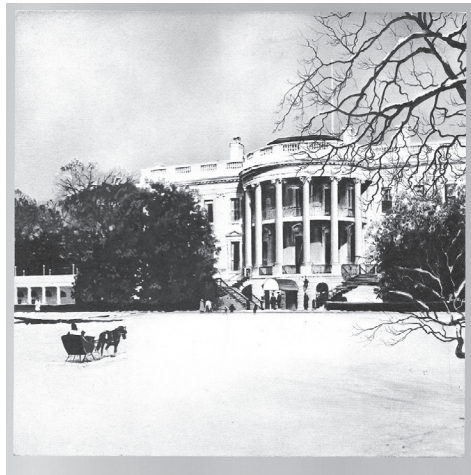
Q: I've been told that you're a Willkie specialist. I recently purchased a 1 1/4 inch Willkie CHEMURGY pin which has led me to wonder whether it was ever reproduced. Would you please provide me with the benefit of your knowledge on the matter? — J.K.

A: You've come to the right place! I have been collecting the 1940 campaign of Wendell Willkie for over 40 years now. It is amazing that I still find previously unknown buttons and items every year. However, I am very familiar with the Chemurgy button you referenced. "Chemurgy is a branch of applied chemistry concerned with preparing industrial products from agricultural raw materials. The concept developed by the early years of the 20th century,"

of items to collect. Some folks collect specific candidates and seek buttons, signs, badges, books, Christmas cards and anything they can find attached to their favorite campaign. White House Christmas Cards run from \$20 to several hundred dollars depending on the desirability, condition and number produced. One of my personal favorites is the 1962 Kennedy White House card. A horse and sleigh help create a peaceful image on the front and the inside features the presidential seal and Christmas greetings from the Kennedys with copies of their signatures. Hard to find, the card can command over \$300 when found.

Q: I recently inherited an extensive accumulation of White House Christmas cards and gifts dating back to 1929 including FDR, Ike, Kennedy and others. Do political collectors find these to be of much value? — R.F.

A: Everyone has their favorite types

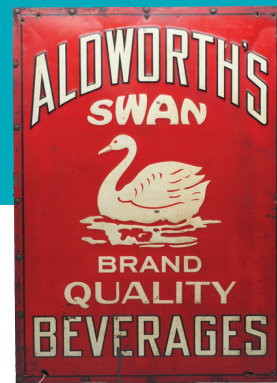

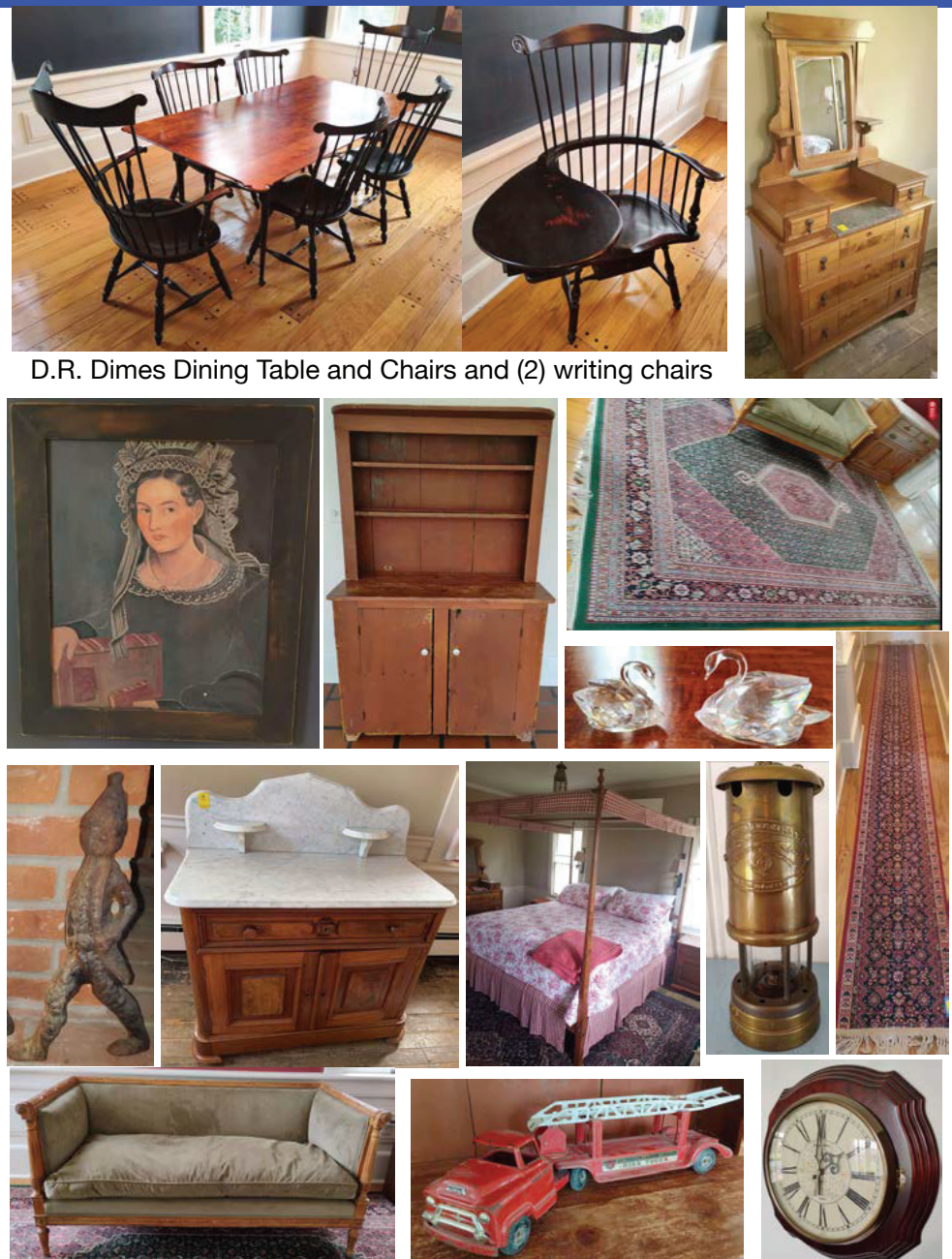

Collectors won't have to dig far to find construction cards

Heavy construction equipment has been used since at least the 1st century BC, when Vitruvius, an ancient Roman engineer, wrote about a crane powered by human or animal labor in De Architectura. His goal as an engineer was to decrease human labor and employ machine labor.

The earliest practical wind-powered machines, the windmill and wind pump, may be traced to the 9th century AD, to the Muslim world during the Islamic Golden Age, in what are now Iran, Afghanistan, and Pakistan.

Heavy equipment, today, consists of dump trucks, motor graders, backhoes, excavators, bulldozers, and the list goes on. Most heavy equipment machinery is designed to execute construction work, most frequently involving earthwork operations.

Man has built many heavy equipment machines that are larger than football fields. The Bagger 293, a gigantic German-made bucket-wheel excavator, holds the Guinness World Record for the tallest terrestrial vehicle, standing 315 feet tall and 738 feet long. This machine weighs an incredible 14,200 tons.

The earliest ancestors of the Bagger 293 excavator were known as mechanical diggers or shovels. Inventors in the early 19th century patented such primitive machines. In 1835, William Ottis and Charles French, working from steam shovel ideas from 1796, invented and built the first ever modern-type

steam shovel, called the Otis Steam Excavator.

Obviously, due to the enormous size of heavy equipment, few people actually collect pieces of heavy construction equipment. A simpler, and for most collectors, a more satisfying way to remember heavy equipment is to collect postcards depicting heavy equipment and the history of heavy equipment.

Postcards and heavy equipment make interesting bedfellows because both industries grew up together in the 1800s.

The Golden Age of Postcards exist-

ed from 1890 to 1915, with the Chicago World's Fair of 1893 popularizing picture postcards with the Fair's "Official Souvenir postals."

About the same time that postcards were becoming popular, John Froelich, 1892, added forward and reverse gears to his gasoline-powered tractor. Machines, such as Froelich's, set the stage for the development of today's heavy construction equipment, and this advancing heavy equipment caught the eyes of photographers and postcard manufacturers alike.

One of the earliest photos of a piece

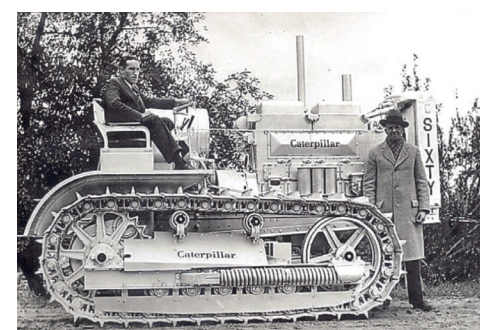
of heavy equipment is a photo of the Kilgore Steam Shovel, circa 1897. Kilgore built the first all-hydraulic excavator, and the advertising posters for this excavator should have been used as a postcard a long time ago. The photo is especially nice because it is a real photo, untouched, and real photo postcards (RPPC) are what heavy equipment postcard collectors desire most.

Heavy equipment postcards are, for the most part, inexpensive, so collections may be established for under \$10 per postcard. Many collectors search for and collect heavy equipment postcards about equipment they once operated, making the hunt fun and exciting.

For instance, if you have ever operated heavy equipment on a dam building project, then postcards showing construction of Hoover Dam or of a bucket crane loading train cars with debris during a dam's excavation are perfect for your personal heavy equipment postcard collection.

One of the great features of heavy equipment machinery postcards is they are cross collectible. The same card may interest postcard collectors, heavy equipment collectors, history collectors, farming collectors, and construction collectors.

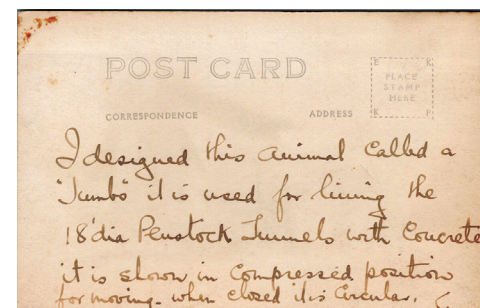
Heavy equipment machinery postcards offer a wonderful, photographic window into mankind's construction past—a simple look from where heavy equipment machinery has come.

Harris Strong Tiles

brief period that the ceramic tiles for which he would achieve his greatest acclaim made their debut — as an experimental by-product.

“There were not enough hours in the day to work on glazes, and I loved to work, so eventually I bought myself a little home kiln — I could fire seven tiles in it. I’d come home after work, and go down in the basement where I had this little thing. Well, I didn’t want to do casting and mess up the whole house, so I bought tiles — eight cents apiece in those days — and I worked out all my glazes with those. I couldn’t see throwing those glazes away, so I’d keep them. When I got my results back, I’d say ‘oh this is nice,’ and then I did designs on them. We used them for trivets.

“One of my former accounts was an outfit called ‘Lampland.’ Their representative came out to dinner one night, saw the tile trivets and said, ‘my God, these are beautiful — I could sell these things. How much do you want for them?’ I said, ‘they’re just tiles — they’re nothing. A buck apiece. I only paid eight cents for them.’ I had two hundred tiles, so he gave me \$200 cash. This was in 1951 — it was like finding money in the street!

“He called me up two weeks later and said ‘I sold all of those — I want some more. And if you put frames on them, we could really do a big job.’ So we added frames, and he kept selling them like crazy.”

The novelty of Strong’s tiles appealed to the buying public, and initial success led, in 1952, to the establishment of Strong’s own firm, Harris G. Strong, Inc. Located in the Bronx, the company began

with a staff of four, with Strong doing all glaze chemistry. From single framed tiles, Strong moved on to tile groupings, and eventually complete tile “paintings” — scenes and portraits comprised of multiple tiles. Subjects covered a wide range — among them, landscapes, urban settings, fanciful abstracts, Etruscan nobility, harlequins, and knights-in-armor. The vivid colors and rich detailing of the ceramic wall hangings helped brighten often-stark ’50s-modern decorating schemes, “People thought they were colorful and very well done,” said Strong. “I had some really fantastic artists working for me. The quality of the designs was excellent and the price was low: originally they retailed for \$6 per tile!”

Strong’s tile scenes, framed or mounted on burnished wood backings, proved popular with architects, interior decorators, and consumers seeking contemporary wall art at affordable prices. Hallmarks of a Strong work are vibrant color combinations, the three-dimensionality of the figures and scenes depicted, and specificity of detail.

The sheer size of larger Strong pieces made them ideal for wall accents in

hotels, office lobbies, restaurants, and other public spaces where arresting visual focal points were needed to break up vast expanses of wall, or to contrast with minimalist modern furnishings. Strong proved adept at adapting his work to the needs of almost every locale. Among the most unusual were ship’s lounges, office facades, elevators, and even bowling alleys.

A healthy balance between practicality and creativity best characterizes Harris Strong; his art was also his livelihood. When asked about sources of inspiration, Strong replied, “I’d look at the calendar and say ‘I’ve got six weeks before market! I’d better damn well start designing something!’ That first design you get out can be very difficult, but while you’re working on it, you get more ideas in your head, because now you’re focused. You can’t wait to finish one and start the next!”

Because paper labels were generally used on the back of Strong plaques, rather than signatures on the tiles themselves, attribution over the years has often been haphazard. In fact, Harris Strong has become so identified with decorative tile, that even unsigned tiles of the 1950s and ‘60s are often credited to him, even when the styles are markedly dissimilar. In the absence of a label, reliable indicators of a genuine Strong tile plaque are its distinctive heart-shaped hooks for hanging.

Although tiles were the cornerstone of Strong’s early success, the company

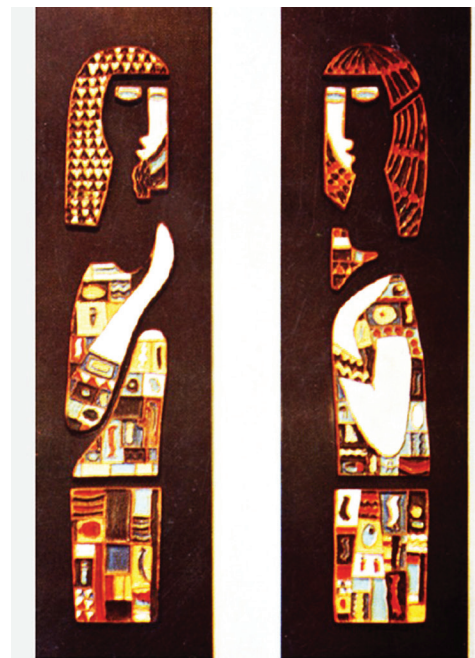
eventually phased out tile production. “Two things happened,” Strong said. “First, we reached a plateau where we were doing about all the business we could in tiles, and I wanted to expand. We came up with the idea of doing multiple paintings, and just couldn’t make them fast enough. So we raised the price — and sold more!

In 1970 Harris G. Strong, Inc. relocated to Maine. The firm closed in 1999, and Strong filled his active retirement with private design, stamp collecting, travel, and following with curiosity the popularity of his early work on the secondary market. “It’s like serendipity, finding something you weren’t looking for. You have no idea what it does for your ego! People always say ‘weren’t you clever!’ I wasn’t clever — it was just the way I could sell. Like I always say, I was standing on the right street corner when the bus came by.”

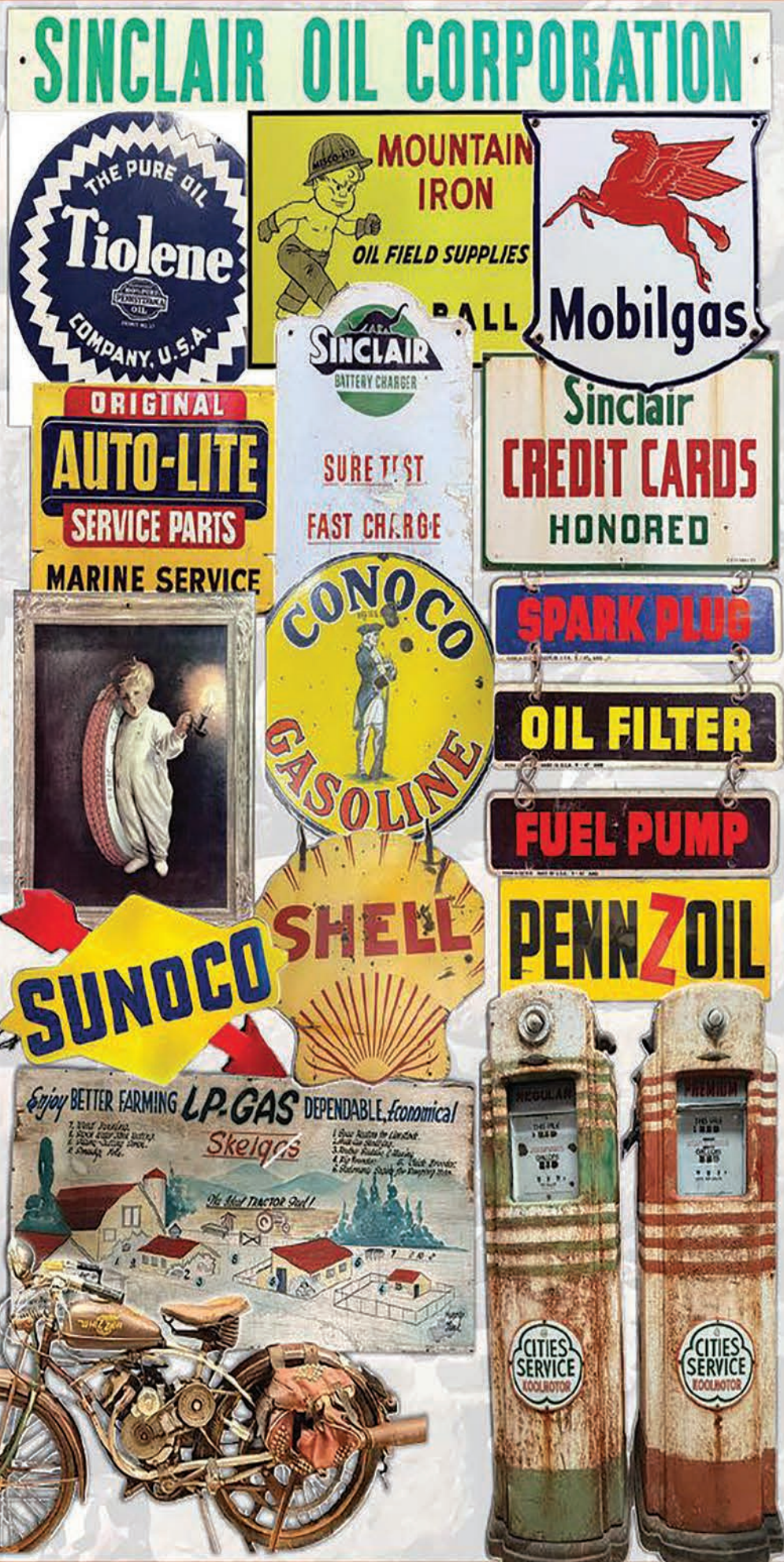
