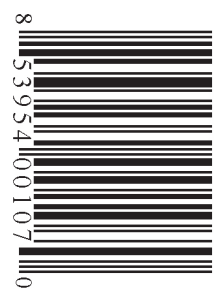

Souvenirs from national and state parks keep memories alive

Traditionally, when school let out for the summer, dusty suitcases were unearthed from the basement and packed with several weeks-worth of clothes. The luggage was crammed into Chevy station wagons or the family's four-door sedan, along with a picnic basket containing ham salad sandwiches, cold fried chicken and thermoses of hot coffee and lemonade. The Kodak Brownie camera hung around Dad's neck. Mom sat beside him with the large, unfolded map. The newspaper and milk delivery had been temporarily halted. The neighbors were going to keep an eye on the house. It was finally time to set out for a memorable vacation at one of our nation's many natural wonders.

America is home to 63 designated National Parks covering over 85-million acres. The parks lie within 30 states, with California claiming the highest number at nine. The largest national park is the Wrangell-St. Elias in Alaska, covering over 8 million acres.

Yellowstone National Park is the oldest, its existence signed into

law by President Ulysses Grant in 1872. In 1916, as additional areas became National Parks, the National Park Service was created to protect the wildlife and natu-ral resources contained within.

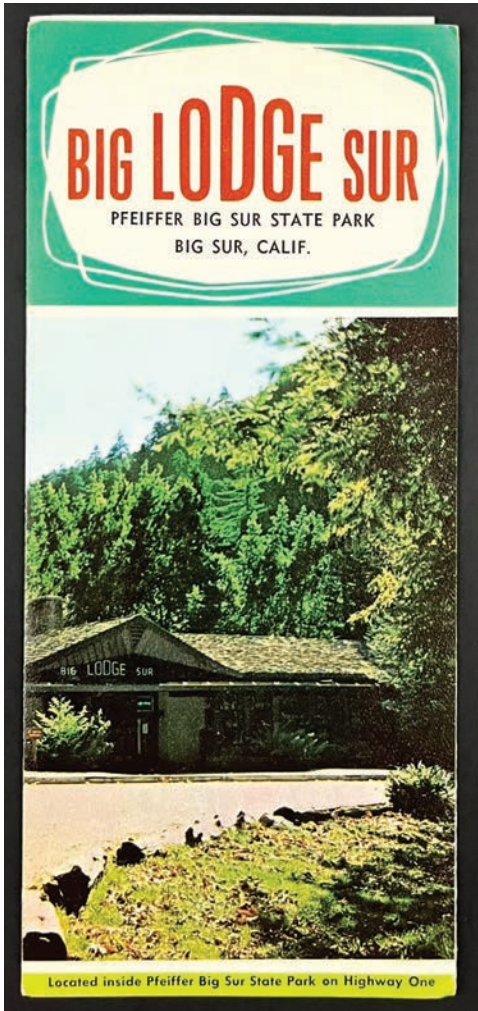
Niagara Falls State Park in New York became the country's first designated State Park in 1885. Over 6,000 State Parks in our country are each managed by the government of the state it lies in. California has more State Parks than any other state, numbering 270.

Decades ago, families who traveled to State or

Britains battled Mantle to both earn top spots at Morphy's

DENVER, Pa. – A 1952 Topps Mickey Mantle rookie card and a circa-1893 W Britains Germanic boxed set of royal fusilier soldiers brought identical selling prices of \$51,660 to share top lot honors in Morphy's Toys & General Collectibles auction held June 2-3.

"We broke records in the soldier, marble and lunchbox categories," said Dan Morphy, the owner and principal auctioneer of Morphy Auctions. "Bidders weren't shy about going after what they wanted to add to their collections."

The 1952 Topps Mickey Mantle rookie card, an absolute must-have for serious sports memorabilia collectors, was a recent find from a 50-year collection and had not yet been submitted for grading. However, the card displayed well, with strong color and corners, and the centering was fantastic for a Mantle card from this elusive year of production. The selling price of \$51,660 was within estimate.

The W Britains Germanic boxed set of royal fusiliers is one of the best sets of Britains known. This is the only known boxed example and its condition was outstanding. The set contained eight figures and a mounted officer. The final selling price of \$51,660 easily bested the high estimate of \$15,000.

That wasn't the only Britains set to make the list of top lots. A first-version

275-piece set of W Britains' Types of the British Army No. 131 lead toy soldiers, which included both cavalry and infantry figures, was housed in a wooden box measuring 45½ inches by 24 inches by 6 inches, with two trays that could be lifted out. The set changed hands for \$41,820.

Back to baseball. A complete and original unopened wax box of 1972 Topps baseball

Christensen Agate No. 1 guinea box set, containing five blue base guineas, seven amber guineas, and 13 clear base, nine of which were cyclone guineas. The set brought a record \$49,200.

Colorful graniteware took kitchens by storm

In the American collective memories of early TV westerns, dusty cowboys gathered around the chuck-wagon fire pouring cups of java from a rusty, old graniteware coffee-pot. In real life, however, graniteware, also known as enamelware, existed long before cowboys and covered wagons and has been widely used for utilitarian purposes in homes throughout the world.

Fusing powdered glass to metal through the process of firing has been around for centuries. It was used to produce decorative pieces throughout Europe and Asia. Although the process was popular in several European countries two brothers in 18th century Germany adapted the process from the purely decorative, beginning a new era for enameled kitchenware. After paying a European maker \$5,000 to observe the process and learn the technique, the Niedringhaus brothers applied for a patent and started the business of coating the inside of cast iron pots to stop the metallic taste from leaching through to the food.

Over the next several decades, the demand for enameled ironware grew through-

out Europe, and coated kitchenware was very attractive to many a European cook. By the mid-1800s, the brothers decided to win over American cooks as well with this new process and they opened a factory in St. Louis. Even

though it was easier to handle and to clean, early enamelware was plain and utilitarian, a long way from the colorful, mass-produced utensils of the late 1800s and early 1900s.

By the 1860s, two large U.S. companies

were making enameled housewares, creating a surge in creative competition. Along with the Niedringhaus brothers, came Lalance and Grosjean, a French company that set up a factory in New York. In a quest to maintain a market edge, the Niedringhaus brothers took the science of enameling a step further and developed what became known as graniteware. While the enamel was still wet, they

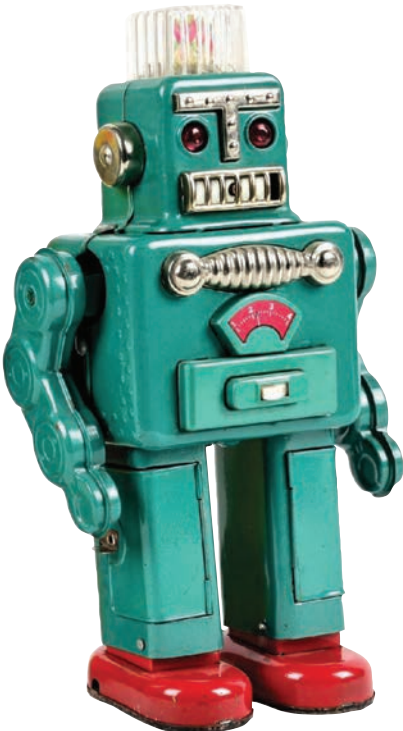
cards (Series 3, cards #264-394), containing 24 factory-sealed packs, each with 10 cards, totaling 240 cards in all, rang up \$35,670. The uncirculated display box, presenting beautifully with crisp structure and minimal wear, housed the high-grade unopened packs inside.

Leading the way in the marbles category was a Christensen Agate No. 1 guinea box set containing five blue base guineas, seven amber guineas, and 13 clear base, nine of which were cyclone guineas. "This was the best box set of guineas we have seen," Morphy said. "The marbles were hand-selected to make this special grouping of killer examples." The set brought a record \$49,200.

A large green glass marble loaded with heavy lutz, measuring 2 1/8 inches in diameter and with dazzling eye appeal and presentation, realized \$29,520 against a high estimate of \$25,000. It's rare to find one

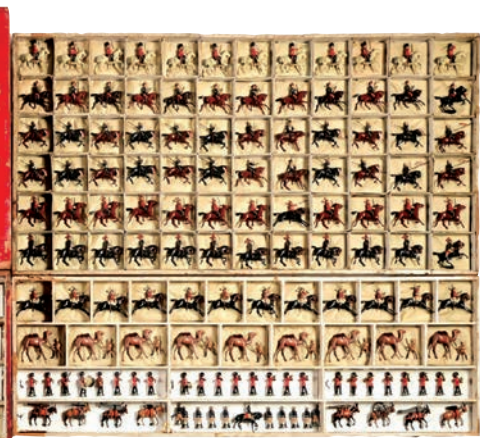

in this large size with a high-condition grade of 9.7, but this marble checked those boxes.

A sulphide marble with an outstanding painted detailed figure of a rearing horse with brown mane and tail on green grass, graded 9.3 for condition, came into the sale with a modest \$6,000 high estimate. But eager bidders overlooked the very slight three-point surface fracture, which didn't distract from the strong figure and paint on this rare sulphide. The final selling price was \$27,060.

A wildly colorful single pontil Joseph's Coat clown marble with great surface condition and graded well at 9.7, knocked down at \$24,600. It was

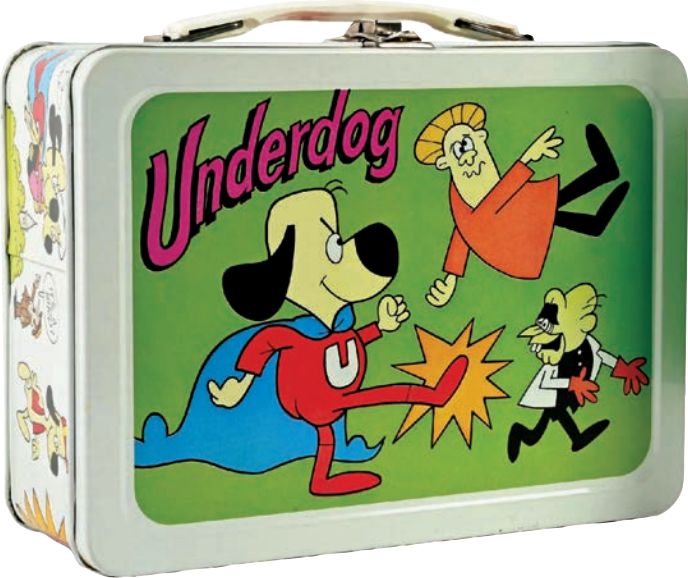
an outstanding marble, one that boasted a white base and great spotting colors of red, yellow, green, and blue.

A hard-to-find single-pontil Maglite blue 360-degree Indian marble having a Maglite blue base with spotting colors of green, pink, white, and orange, and great surface condition, hit \$9,840. It was one of the real sleepers of the sale, considering the pre-sale estimate was a minuscule \$800-\$1,200.

A rare Superman lithographed metal lunchbox with Thermos and protective case, manufactured by ADCO Liberty and released by Universal in 1954, breezed to \$31,980, well beyond the \$20,000 high estimate. The front of the box's metal housing colorfully depicted a fierce battle between the Man of Steel and a giant gold robot against the city skyline.

An ultra-rare circa mid-1950s Toppie the Elephant metal lithographed lunchbox, decorated with cheerful balloon motifs and playful cartoon imagery typical of early post-war children's design, netted \$16,605, a little bit more than the high estimate. This near-mint

example retained its original matching Thermos with red cup lid and coordinating elephant graphics. Additionally, the lot included two original Toppie companion books, an uncommon and highly desirable inclusion.

A stunning circa-1974 Leonard TTV metal Underdog lunchbox in fantastic condition, showing some extremely mild surface scratches but still nearly mint overall, found a new home for \$22,140, nearly tripling the \$8,000 high estimate. The Thermos-Sew brand Thermos wasn't original to the lunchbox.

A Yonezawa (Japan) tin litho battery-operated Smoking Robot in the original box, with inserts, the very rare green litho variation, achieved \$14,760 against a high estimate of \$6,000. The box had some slight creasing and wear, but the 8-inch-tall robot had little wear and was in fine condition.

An exceedingly rare spelter spread-winged owl bank in beautiful original condition, diminutive at just 4 inches in height, crossed the finish line at \$10,455, easily beating the \$6,000 high estimate.

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Collectors can build a diverse grouping of bisque dolls

Bisque is unglazed porcelain, so a bisque doll is one that is made of unglazed porcelain, where the clays are fired at temperatures exceeding 2,300 degrees.

In the late 1860s, French doll companies created the first bisque dolls by simply not glazing the porcelain dolls their factories were famous for. Since bisque porcelain gave dolls a more realistic skin tone, bisque dolls soon caught on. Bisque quickly became the material most doll manufacturers preferred, especially for dolls' heads.

Bisque remained the popular doll material until about 1920 when composition material overtook bisque as the preferred material for dolls. When collector dolls became popular in the 1980s, bisque once again became the material of choice for popular collector dolls.

In one form or another, bisque dolls have been continuously manufactured since about 1868. These dolls usually have a head made of bisque porcelain and a body made of another material. Bisque is unglazed porcelain with a matte finish, giving a doll a realistic skin-like texture and coloring, allowing the doll to appear more human.

In general, bisque dolls are too fragile to be considered "play" dolls, which made them perfect additions to collectors' markets.

Any doll with a bisque head is considered a bisque doll. While bisque dolls range in size from ½-inch up to life-size dolls of 5 feet

tall or more, the sheer weight of the heavy bisque clay often limited the size of the doll. For this reason, small dolls, known as "all-bisque," were highly sought after from the late 1800s until about 1930.

Over the years, thousands of doll companies have manufactured bisque dolls.

Following their creation in France, bisque dolls moved to Germany, where production remained for about 25 years. In the early 20th century, production of bisque dolls once again moved—this time to the United States. By the 1930s and on into the 1950s, Japan was a world leader in the manufac-

turing of bisque dolls. And, today, nearly all bisque dolls are manufactured in China.

Bisque dolls should be cared for in much

applied a thin piece of paper with an oxidized pattern on it. Once the piece dried, the paper fell away, leaving a design with the appearance of granite—hence, graniteware.

The name and the cookware caught on and thus began the great graniteware boom in America, which lasted beyond the turn of the century. Success brought growth and the brothers built a new factory on 3,500 acres in what would become Granite City, Ill.

Speckled, swirled, mottled and solid, graniteware came in a variety of colors—red, blue, purple, brown, green, pink, gray and white. As the years passed, each period had its own style and color. One of the most popular patterns, even with today's collectors, was called "end of the day." Whatever colors were left over at the end of the day were mixed together to make a very unusual and unique color.

Although graniteware was lighter weight than cast iron, there were some problems with it. It tended to crack and then rust all the way through. There were also suspicions that some formulas leaked toxins into food. In the

1890s, agate nickel-steel ware ads claimed a "chemist's certificate," proving that it was free of any toxins. Also known as agataware or speckle ware, mottled pieces of every color became available at low cost and were a huge

ed with seams and possibly riveted. Much of the ware was first issued with cast iron handles during the 19th century, and wooden handles were used at the turn of the century through 1910. Despite the heavy production of graniteware, many of the pieces were not marked, so those with marks of the original manufactures are sought after.

Collecting vintage graniteware is very appealing and people use the pieces in creative, new ways to decorate their homes. Some collect a particular color or pattern. Designers are on the lookout for older pieces to add a touch of color to a room. Prices are affected by color and condition and those that tend to be popular with collectors include cobalt blue, red-and-white swirls, green, brown, and pieces with unusual designs. Purple, brown and green swirl pieces seem to command higher prices. Buyers should be aware that reproduction pieces are made today in all colors.

Although the advent of aluminum in the 1930s crimped the popularity of graniteware and, thus, its manufacture, it was definitely not as much fun to use.

the same manner as other antique dolls are cared for. Do not place the dolls in direct sunlight or where there are extremes of heat and cold. The safest place to display or store bisque dolls is in a display case, where household dust cannot reach them, that is located away from windows and direct sunlight.

Care should also be given when cleaning a bisque doll. Many antique dolls are dirty, but soap and water can destroy a bisque doll's color and facial details, especially the inexpensive Japanese bisque dolls.

Doll preservationists often use mild liquid detergent and cotton Q-tips to gently clean bisque dolls. Even when using these materials, one should test clean an inconspicuous place on the doll, and if color appears to be fading, stop washing immediately.

The price of a bisque doll is often dependent upon the quality of the bisque, the way the doll's face has been painted, and the body style of the doll. Quality bisque has few if any pinholes or pimples, and it should be slightly translucent in color without being chalky. Quality bisque doll faces are finely detailed with beautiful eyebrows and lashes, perfect lips, and expressive eyes.

Finally, a few words of nomenclature always help. "Googlie" is used to describe bisque dolls with eyes that are round and glancing to the side; although, the term "Peek-a-boo-Babies" also applies to such dolls. "Cake Baby" refers to tiny, approximately 1½-inch, unglazed bisque dolls that have stiff limbs and projecting forearms. These dolls are also referred to as "Frozen Charlottes."

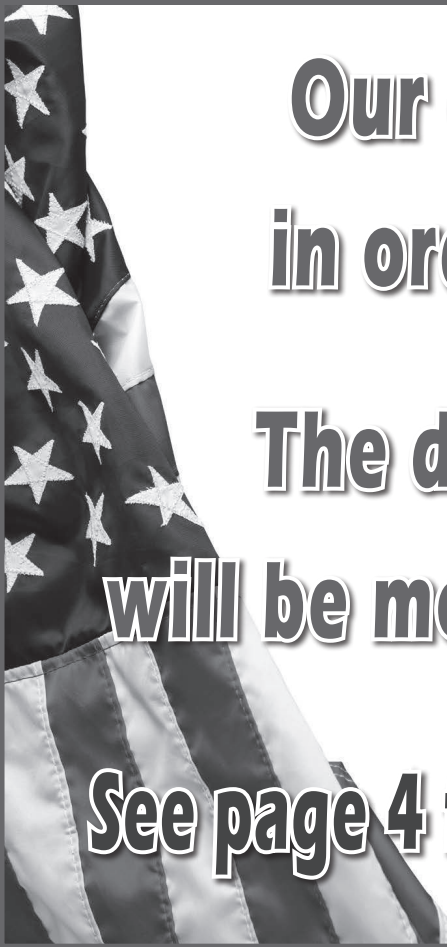

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Statue of Liberty collectibles shine bright this year

The Statue of Liberty was a gift to the United States from the people of France in 1886. French sculptor Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi designed the Statue and Gustave Eiffel, of Eiffel Tower fame, built the metal framework.

The Statue of Liberty is designed as a classically draped woman, inspired by the Roman goddess of liberty — Libertas. The woman holds a torch above her head with her right hand, and in her left hand she carries a tablet inscribed “JULY IV MDCCLXXVI,” which is July 4, 1776, in Roman numerals. The woman’s left foot is stepping on a broken chain and shackle, commemorating the national abolition of slavery following the American Civil War.

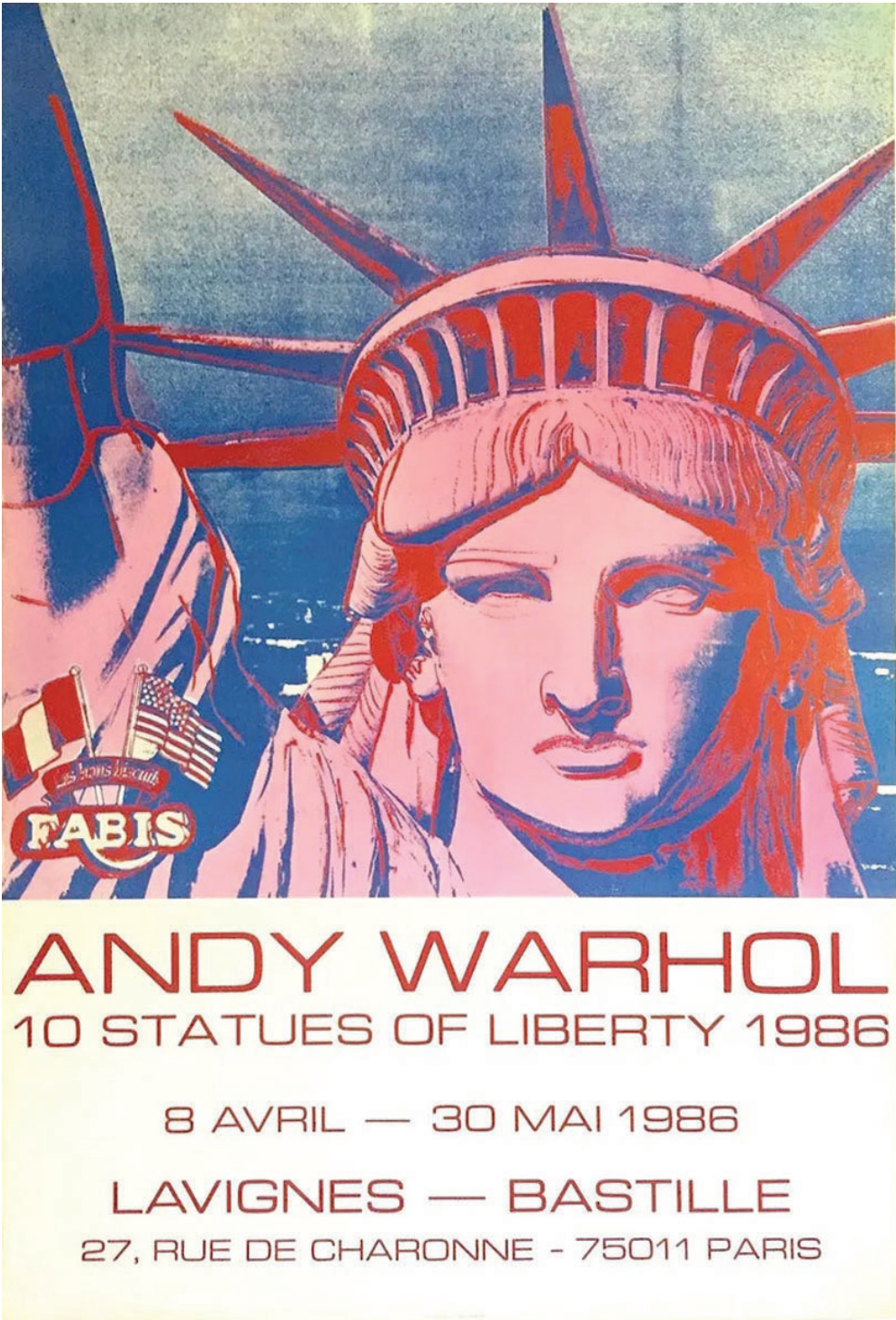
The plan for the Statue of Liberty was for the people of France to pay for the sculpture’s completion and shipping, and for the United States to pay for the site and pedestal upon which the statue would rest. Financing for the project proved difficult for both countries.

Originally intended for the United States centennial in 1876, the completed statue was not dedicated until 10 years later. The sculptor, Bartholdi, completed the head and torch-bearing arm first, so these pieces were displayed at several different international expositions in the hope that donations would follow, and the torch-bearing arm was displayed at the Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia in 1876, and it remained on display for six years, 1876-1882, in Madison Square Park in New York City.

Finally, the statue was finished, and it was shipped to New York City in crates. The statue was assembled and placed on the completed pedestal on what was then called Bedloe’s Island (now Liberty Island). Following the statue’s placement on the pedestal, New York City held its first ticker tape parade for the Statue of Liberty with President Grover Cleveland presiding over the parade.

Famous American poet Emma Lazarus was asked to write an original poem for the dedication of the Statue of Liberty. She initially declined because she thought she could not write a poem about a statue. Finally she wrote “The New Colossus,” which includes the lines “Give me your tired, your poor/Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free.”

Today, the proud lady still stands as a shining beacon for all who are lost, hopeless, yearning for a new life and

home in the land of the free and the home of the brave.

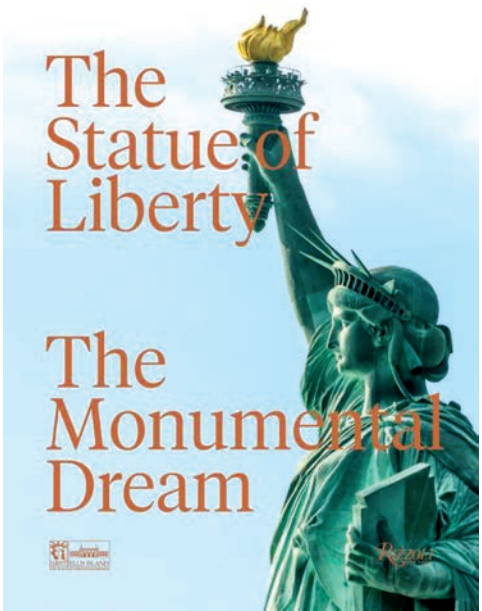
People have collected anything and everything connected to the Statue of Liberty ever since its dedication. As an American symbol, the Statue of Liberty has graced many of America’s postage stamps and coins, both of which collectors love to have.

Hundreds of replicas of the Statue of Liberty are centerpieces of collections worldwide. Collectors search for an original replica of the Statue of Liber-

ty that was created and donated by the Boy Scouts of America as part of their Strengthen the Arm of Liberty campaign from 1949-1952. These statues were made of stamped copper and were over 8 feet in height.

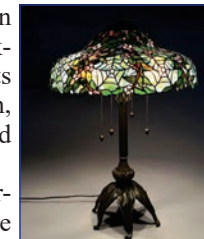
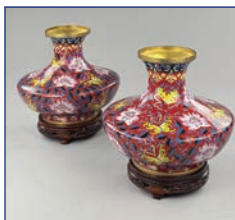

And, believe me, it’s not a future where anyone wants to monkey around in!

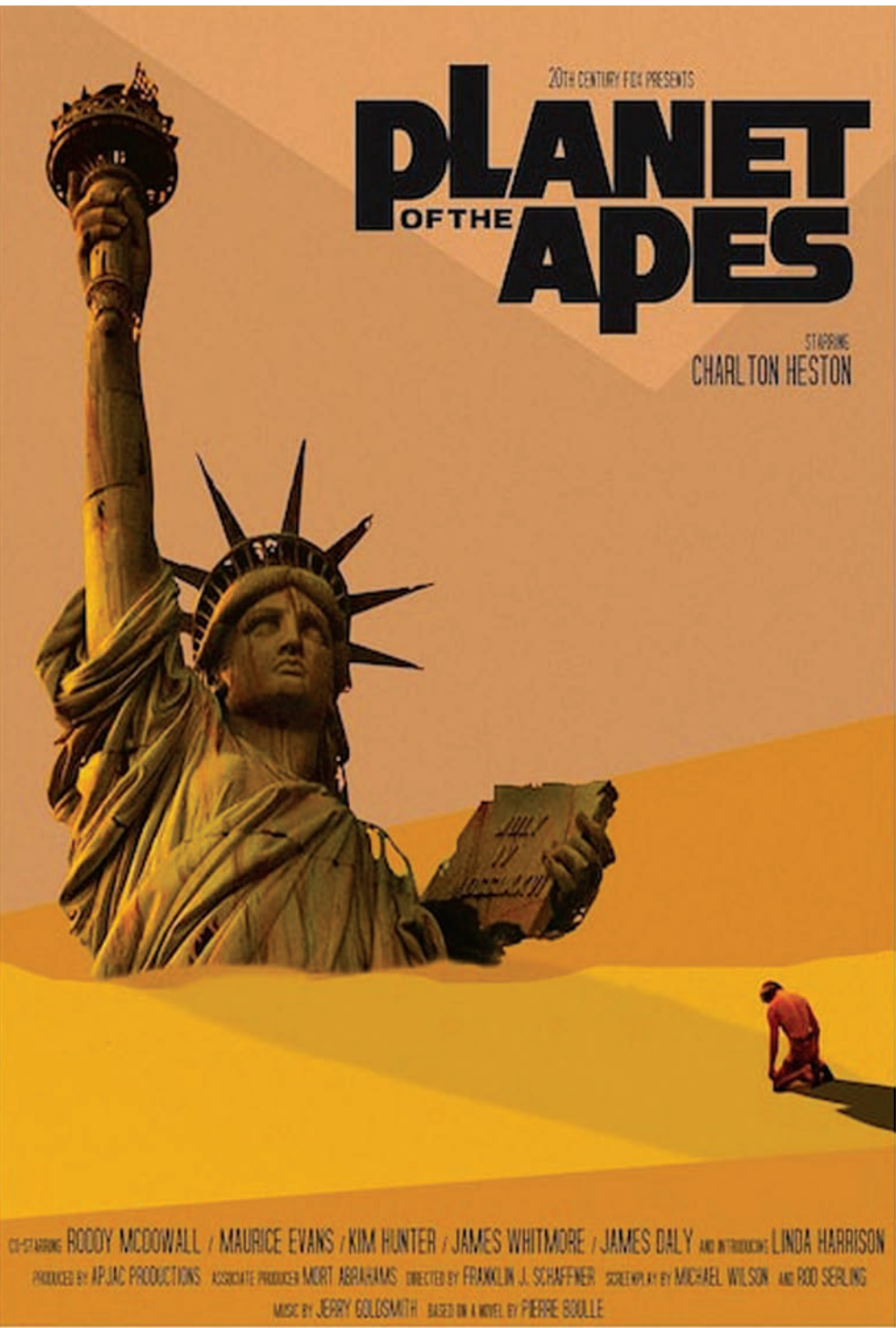

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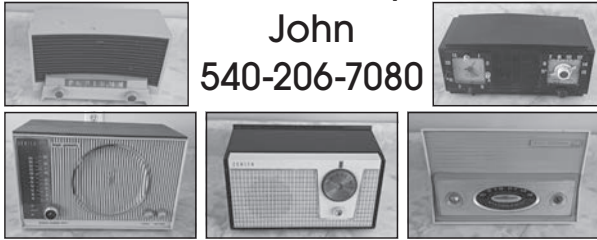

park contribute about \$2.5 bil-lion to the local economy. One attraction to be found there is the synchronized light display of mating fireflies in mid-June. A phenomenon known as mountain waves can also be experienced between October and April when winds gust up to nearly 100 miles per hour.

The least visited is Big Bend National Park in Texas. Designated in 1944 and covering 801,163 acres, the highly remote location often reaches over 100 degrees during the summer. If comfort is no issue, visitors can view over 1,200 species of plants and 56 reptile species. Kangaroo rats and roadrunners live among the petrified wood, prickly pear cactus and desert willow. There are dinosaur bones, sea fossils, and Native American cave paintings. Standing sentry are the Chisos Mountains, the only American mountain range to be completely enclosed within a National Park.

Yellowstone National Park sits in the northwest corner of Wyoming, extending into Montana and Idaho. Desig-nated in 1872, over two-million acres contain five active geyser basins. The park’s most popular sight – ‘Old Faithful’ – is a water volcano which spouts at regular intervals.

In 1921, Hot Springs National Park was designated in Arkansas. For centuries, it’s been believed that the water at the site possesses medicinal properties. Grouped around the base of Hot Springs Mountain, the springs flow at a rate of up to 850,000 gallons per day. The water is directed into several bathhouses where, during the 1920s, one could enjoy a bath for less than two dollars “for health and recreation.” The 47 hot springs present at the park are along a fault which developed due to internal earth strain. The average temperature of the water is 143 degrees.

Yosemite National Park in California was designated in 1890. Its 1,187 miles contain waterfalls with drops up to 900 feet, as well as groves of sequoias standing about 300 feet high with a circumference of 100 feet at their base, and many over 2,000 years old. In 1921, Yosemite became the first National Park to open a cafeteria. In just five months, they served about 250,000 meals at an average cost of 48 cents each.

In Utah, Bryce Canyon National Park stands upon 35,835 acres designated in 1928. Outdoor amphitheaters of natural domes, spires and temples in shades of orange, pink, red and white share space with huge rock formations and a collection of giant hoodoos – rock spires formed through erosion.

Carlsbad Caverns National Park in New Mexico was designated in 1930 on

46,766 acres. With a large limestone chamber almost 4,000 feet long, and calcite formations hanging above like icicles, the site produces cave pearls and stalagmites. Until two elevators were built in 1932, visitors walked down a ramp which descended 750 feet below surface. The 119 caves contain 17 species of bats. One of them was mined for bat excrement in the early 1900s – a component in fertilizer and explosives.

In 1919, Grand Canyon National Park was designated upon 1,217,262 acres in Arizona. A gorge of the Colorado River, the Grand Canyon is visited by nearly five million people every year. The El Tovar – a luxury hotel – was built in 1905 on the south rim of the canyon. Travelers during the 1950s could order a glass of claret for 35 cents, jellied chicken broth for 25 cents, or prime rib beef steak with grilled tomato for \$2.10. Those with smaller budgets might choose the park’s Bright Angel Lodge. With cowboy music entertainment and a dining room that seated 225, their menu during the 1950s offered a cup of split pea soup for 15 cents, a deviled egg sandwich for 35 cents, and stewed prunes for 20 cents.

America’s State Parks welcome nearly 870-million visitors every year. Though smaller and less elaborate than National Parks, each still has something amazing to offer. Valley of the Fire State Park in Nevada was designated on almost 46,000 acres in 1935. Illuminated by the sun’s rays, its red sandstone formations appear to be on fire.

Hartwick Pines State Park, designated in Michigan in 1927, contains 49 acres of virgin white pine forest, with most of the trees standing over 160 feet tall. During the 1950s, a campground within the park offered families a place to pitch their tents or park their trailers. Electricity, running water and pit toilets were features of the campground.

Letchworth State Park, designated in 1906 on 14,427 acres in New York, offered 1950s visitors rentals of cabins outfitted with electric ranges, refrigerators, cots, mattresses and chairs. A small cabin for two cost \$16 per week while larger cabins could cost up to

\$48 per week. At the park’s Glen Iris Inn, 12 guest rooms and four two-room suites were available for those who didn’t feel like roughing it. The inn contained an air conditioned dining room.

Vintage State and National Park souvenirs are not difficult to find. Postcards, brochures and maps are plentiful and can be scooped up for under \$10. Vintage family scrapbooks filled with black and white snapshots of park vacations can go as high as \$150 or more. Those wanting such historical items as an old vending machine which dispensed National Park maps should be prepared to pay about \$3,500.

When it comes to vintage park advertising, few people know more about the subject than Douglas Leen of Washington. Back in 1971, Leen was working as a park ranger when someone threw an original Grand Teton National Park poster in a burn pile. Leen was inspired to spend the next two decades tracking down more posters. He even-tually located 13 negatives in the file drawers of the National Park Service, along with one actual poster.

Leen explained that, after World War II, the prints were tossed aside. “But some survived,” he said. “As cardboard file drawer dividers or book jackets. They

were simply cardboard.”

Between 1938 and 1941 the Works Project Administration printed 14 park designs on a total of 1,400 prints. Only 43 have resurfaced. In 1992, Leen began the laborious mission of restoring these “relics of art” and offering them for sale as hand-made serigraphs. His store ‘Ranger Doug’s Enterprises,’ in Seattle, Wash.,nhas become the only source for faithful reproductions of WPA National Park serigraphed posters.

“Our parks bring out the best in the human spirit,” Leen said.
