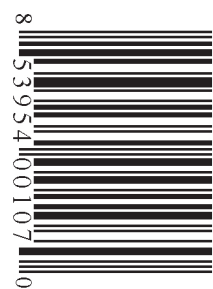


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Collectors still fascinated by the Dionne quintuplets

Twenty-five-year-old Elzire Dionne didn't know what to expect at the conclusion of her pregnancy. It was believed that she was either carrying twins, or a single baby with some sort of abnormality. She and her 30-year-old husband Oliva were already raising six children on their Ontario farm, an acreage of stony soil on the edge of a heavily forested area. The land hadn't produced much for their family – the youngest of which was two years old.

On the evening of May 28, 1934, Elzire began experiencing premature labor. Over the course of the night, a doctor and two midwives were put into service – as one baby after another arrived. Before morning, identical female quintuplets with a combined birth weight of 13 pounds had entered the world. Following labor and delivery, Elzire went into shock.

News of the babies' birth spread quickly. Soon, the Dionnes were receiving donations in the form of incubators and breast milk. Caring for the quints – who developed from a single fertilized egg – was so time-consuming that Elzire and Oliva had to send their two-year-old son to reside with neighbors. Marie was the biggest quint, while Yvonne was the smallest. Annette, Cecile and Emilie rounded out the group of girls who were soon to become unwilling international celebrities.

The cost of raising the quints proved too high for a poor farmer and, when the babies were four months old, the Dionnes transferred custody to the Canadian Red Cross, which financed their needs. Canadian legislature later took over custody and passed the Dionne Quintuplets Guardianship Act to handle the girls' commercial interests until they were 18. Soon, 'Quintland' was

constructed.

'Quintland' was a large nine-room nursery compound where the girls were put on display for the entertainment of tourists. An outdoor horseshoe-shaped playground surrounded by a glass-enclosed promenade allowed visitors to watch the quints at play. The first showing was from 10 a.m. until 11 a.m. They would be brought out again for half an hour in the afternoon. Because the glass was one-way, the girls had no idea that their playground was enveloped inside an audience.

The grounds included a staff house for three nurses, three police officers, a housekeeper and two maids. An expansive parking area accommodated the cars and busses bringing in between 2,000 and 7,000 visitors per day. Those arriving to view the girls were paraded through a check-in turnstile and allowed to stand and watch the toddlers at play

for a total of three minutes. Police officers stood guard, demanding silence so that the quints would not be aware of the crowd eyeing them. A large sign with a clock on it announced to the public what time the next exhibition would be held. A seven-foot-tall chain link fence topped with barbed wire circled the property like a prison. Inside the compound, the girls followed strict routines concerning meals, baths, and exhibitions. They had private tutors and lives which did not extend much past 'Quintland.'

Across the street from 'Quintland,' Oliva had set up a souvenir shop. There, three large bins were filled with stones daily. Supposed to have come from the farm where the quints were born, they were marketed as fertility stones and

they sold with amazing speed. Oliva also peddled photographs and other items which he happily autographed. His token stand was only one enterprise along three miles of chaotic activity. The once-barren stretch of road now supported hotels to shelter travelers coming to see the quints, gas stations to fill up their automobiles, restaurants for them to eat at, hot dog stands, popcorn carts, and any enterprise that allowed a landowner to cash in on the global phenomenon of the Dionne quintuplets.

The two midwives who had attended the birth invited visitors to climb the steps of a platform on their property from which the quint nursery could be

Schrank auction brought farm history to the block

BATESVILLE, Ind. — An impressive collection of antique and vintage farm equipment drew buyers to the Denis and Pat Schrank Antique Farm Auction on Aug. 22. Conducted by Kraft Auction Service, the live, on-site sale, with limited online bidding, featured hundreds of heritage items, including antique tractors, planting and harvesting equipment, hit-and-miss engines, 19th-century implements, antique heavy machinery and more.

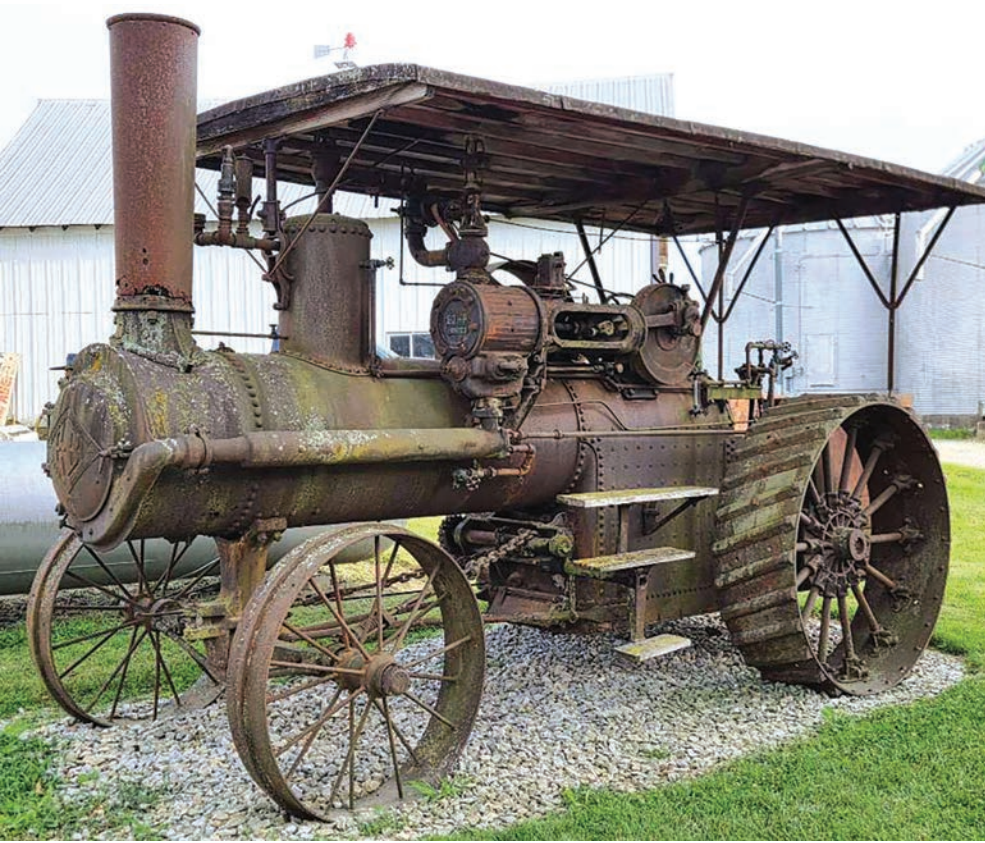
The 852-lot auction showcased a museum-worthy collection spanning the early years of agricultural machinery. Some pieces were dated as early as 1916; others were even older. The collection included horse-drawn equipment, steam-powered machinery, and early fuel-powered models.

Among the earliest dated pieces was a 1918 International Harvester Motor Cultivator, which saw the auction’s highest bid of \$38,000. Only about 300 examples of this rare, low-production machine were built between 1917 and 1919. This complete, running example had been expertly restored by Denis Schrank and featured a 12-hp LeRoi four-cylinder gasoline engine.

Equally impressive was the running and driving 1916 International Harvester 8-16 Mogul drawing the auction’s second-highest bid of \$33,000. Originally offered as an affordable, kerosene-pow-

Oddities & Curiosities Expo gives the macabre a home

RICHMOND, Va. — Halloween started early this year for fans of the bizarre and unusual, with the ninth running of the Oddities & Curiosities Expo.

Founded in Oklahoma by Michelle and Tony Cozzaglio in 2017, the Oddities & Curiosities Expo was created as a traveling event devoted to the strange, unusual, and bizarre. What began with 25 vendors at the original Tulsa show has grown into an international series, with some shows hosting more than 150 vendors and 10,000 guests.

Vendors are all selected for their unusual offerings. “We work with the best exhibitors in the world and curate our show to highlight exactly what our attendees hope to see,” Michelle said, adding, “Visitors can expect to find the kinds of things that don’t turn up at an ordinary antiques or collectibles show.” That includes merchandise like funeral collectibles, insect mounts, quack medical tools, taxidermy, and wet specimens.

The 2026 circuit kicked off in Los An-

ges in January, then made its way to locations like Atlanta, Boston, and Detroit. The expo is scheduled for 40 cities across North America this year, includ-

ing Canadian stops, before wrapping up in Australia.

The show landed in Richmond, Va., the weekend of August 22-23. Rich-

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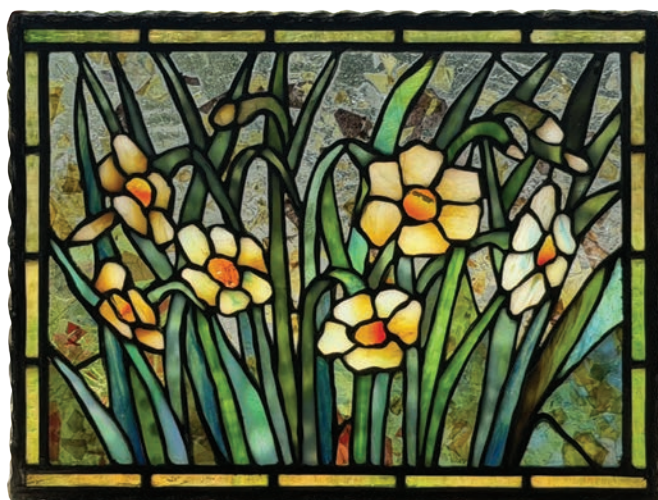

ered farm tractor, it was powered by a 16-hp, single-cylinder Mogul engine and featured planetary forward and reverse gearing, a correct magneto, muffler and toolbox, along with a clutch pulley and drawbar.

Bidding reached \$21,000 for an Indiana Tractor, powered by a LeRoi 2C four-cylinder engine. Built in Anderson, Ind., the tractor featured chain drive to the wheels, parade rubber on all four wheels, and custom steps and rear fenders below the seat. Schrank often exhibited the operational rig at farm equipment shows.

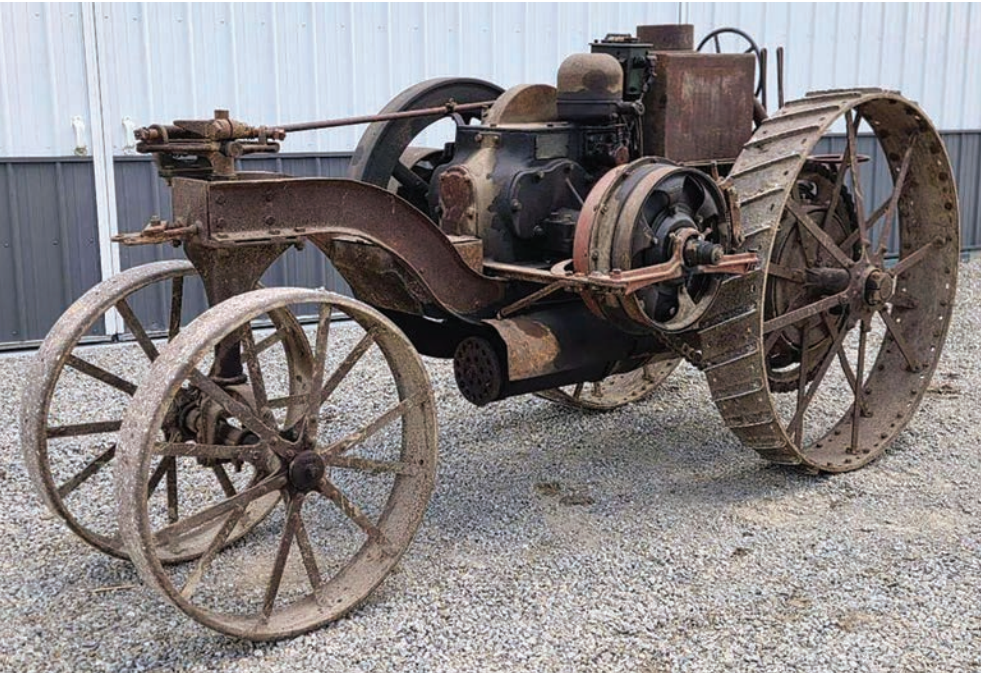
Not far behind at \$20,500 was a 1919 60-hp Emerson-Brantingham Steam Engine. Schrank and his family often exhibited it at local shows until its boiler was deemed unsafe to operate and it was retired to static display. It retained its whistle, pop valve, lubricator, full canopy and good gearing, making it an excellent restoration project.

The historic pieces continued with a 1918 International 1.5-ton truck that was one of Schrank's prized possessions. Running and drivable, it was often seen at local parades. It was outfitted with a four-cylinder gas engine similar to those in an 8-16 tractor, plus a custom electric start, and a wood bed with seats for carrying passengers. Due to its age, it was sold with a bill of sale rather than a title.

Also selling for \$15,000 was a 1930s-era Massey Harris GP tractor. It was powered by a four-cylinder gasoline engine and two-speed transmission, and featured a full set of steel wheels, belt pulley, drawbar and electric start, and new radiator. Retaining its original patina, the tractor was operational but lacked the rear-extending PTO shaft.

The first winning bid below five figures

was \$7,500 for a running 1927 Farmall Regular Custom High Crop "Big Foot." Built for sowing wheat into standing corn, the custom tractor offered a four-cylinder gasoline engine, three-speed transmission, belt pulley and PTO, along with eight-foot-tall rear wheels.

High four-figure bids also landed several historic engines. A 4-hp International Harvester Famous vertical engine, made for export, changed hands at \$6,000. Mounted on a cart with a cooling tank, the still-loose engine had been used by the Schrank family for years to make ice cream at shows. Another cart-mounted 4-hp tank-cooled Famous engine went for \$5,000. Partially restored and operational, it featured a new cooling tank, belt pulley, rebuilt muffler, and battery-and-coil ignition, along with repairs to the bottom of the head and cylinder. A 6-hp Appleton gas engine on a cart scored \$3,000.

Schrank exhibited the engine at shows to power an Appleton drag saw or husker-shredder. It included a clutch pulley, battery box and belt, and Farmall belt pulley. The head had been repaired, and the engine retained its Webster magneto.

That bid range also included several pieces of historic heavy machinery, including a bladeless but running/driving Cletrac W crawler that fetched \$5,000. Introduced in 1918, the crawler was in very straight, original condition and featured a four-cylinder gasoline engine, good undercarriage and steering-wheel control. It also had a rare right-angle front belt pulley attachment, although the pulley and shaft were missing.

Other machinery included a non-running 1923 Fordson-powered H-P one-man road grader, going for \$2,300. It was powered by a four-cylinder Fordson engine with a three-speed transmission and upgraded manifold and carburetor, and featured an eight-foot blade and industrial solid-rubber wheels. Coming close, at \$2,100, was an early horse-drawn wooden-wheeled pan scraper of unknown manufacture.

A bit further down in the bidding, but still rich in historical merit, were several notable pieces. A 1927 McCormick-Deering 10-20 bid to \$1,500. The complete

but non-running tractor was in original condition, with some original stenciling still visible, with a four-cylinder gasoline engine, three-speed transmission, custom contractor cab, belt pulley, and a full set of steel wheels. Later, a 10.5-foot-long Birdsell wooden wagon, in original condition, with 40-inch front and 45-inch rear wheels, got \$900, while just \$550 won a 1929 McCormick-Deering 10-20 with a partially disassembled four-cylinder gas engine, belt drive, and full set of steel wheels.

Some of the collection's historic pieces even sold for under \$500. Those included a wooden horse-drawn dump wagon with an 8.5-foot by 42-inch box along with 41-inch front and 45-inch rear wheels that rolled off for \$350, a Taylor-Way tractor-pulled subsoiler mounted on steel wheels for \$350, and a partially disassembled 1931 McCormick-Deering 10-20 project tractor with a loose engine, belt pulley, and assorted parts that left for \$225. Meanwhile, a White and Conner pull-type barn thresher in original condition, with paint and stenciling still visible, hammered for just \$200, helping round out a remarkable auction of agricultural history.

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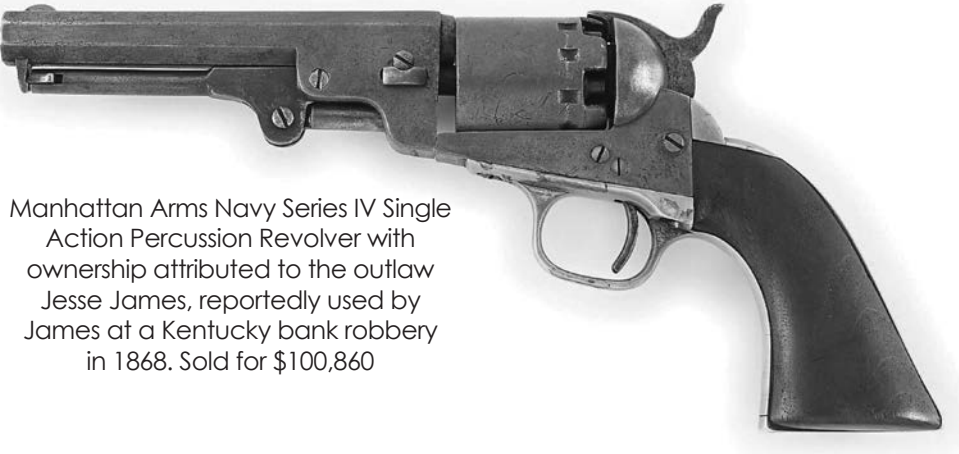
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Jesse James revolver holds up bidders at \$100,860 bid

SANTA FE, N.M. – A Manhattan Arms Navy Series IV Single Action Percussion Revolver with ownership attributed to the outlaw Jesse James hit the mark for \$100,860 to take top lot honors at Morphy’s Old West & Native American Art Auction held June 20 at the Santa Fe Community Convention Center. The auction dove-tailed nicely into the 36th Annual Old West Show, held June 19-21 at the same venue.

The Old West & Native American Art Auction featured 515 lots of top-quality Western art and antiques and rang up more than \$900,000, including the buyer’s premium. “It was a strong finish to our time in Santa Fe,” said Dan Morphy, the president of Morphy Auctions. “We are grateful for the support we have received over the years and look forward to continuing the event in Mesa, Ariz., in May 2027.”

The Manhattan Arms Navy Series IV Single Action Percussion Revolver with ownership attributed to the outlaw Jesse James was reportedly used by James at the robbery of the Southern Bank of Kentucky in Russellville, Ky., on March 20, 1868. A letter signed by James’s son Jesse Edward James and daughter-in-law Stella James attested to the legend. The selling price of \$100,860 was within estimate.

A wonderfully-detailed sculpture titled *The Rattlesnake* by American sculptor Frederic Remington (1861-1909), cast in silver sold within estimate for \$86,100. The 17-inch-tall sculpture, #3 from an edition of 100, was cast at the Maiden Foundry in Oregon in 1989. With the price of silver reaching record highs, the work wasn’t just displayable Western art; it was also a fine investment piece.

The first silver parade saddle built by Nolte-Olsen in San Francisco, representing the pinnacle of high-end parade saddles produced by Al Nolte, circa 1937, realized \$46,750. The silversmith responsible for the fine dec-

orations was Robert Schaezlein, who operated a shop out of San Francisco, and the tooling was by Gene Sisco. The saddle had been mounted on a horse only twice. It was accompanied by an original 1930s photograph of the Nolte-Olsen storefront.

A rare 18K pink gold Waltham hunting cased pocket watch with exceptional alternating inlaid panels of pink and white gold-quartz surrounding a central yellow gold California grizzly bear brought \$27,060. The watch was fitted with a size 18, 21-jewel, circa-1889 Vanguard-grade lever-set movement and the case diameter was 54mm. The white porcelain Roman numeral dial had blued steel spade hands and the gross weight was 138.7 grams. The watch was running and in good condition.

A fantastic Sharps “Old Reliable” cartridge belt, similar to the belt worn by the famed buffalo hunter Jesse Hendricks, blew past the \$6,500 high estimate to settle at \$24,600. The belt measured 43½ inches long by 4 inches wide, with 2-inch cartridge loops, twin



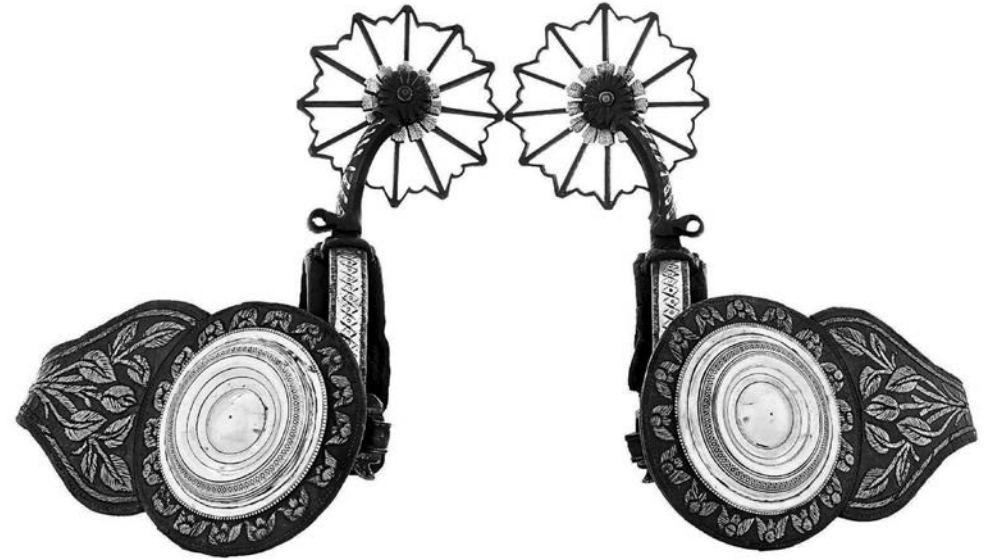

buckles and two thin leather shoulder straps with roller buckles for adjustment. It was found in an old hunting camp in Northern Ontario, Canada.

A hitched horsehair bridle with original kissing-bird-style half-breed bit crafted in a Montana prison was bid to \$17,220. The bridle was executed in

a black-on-cream ground with bright color combinations of turquoise, pink, orange, green, purple, red and blue colors throughout. Domed rosette conchos with nickel edges had images of horse heads and running horses.

A pair of Mexican colonial silver mounted spurs, rarely seen in such fine a condition and still together as a set, climbed to \$14,760. The spurs were finished in the finest traditions of Spanish-influenced master Mexican craftsmen of the colonial period in the Republic of Mexico and Alta California. They were crafted from hand-forged iron and double-mounted with inlaid silver bands with stamped dot and diamond designs. Straps were lined in fine maroon Moroccan leather.

A bronze statue of "The Duke" – John Wayne – depicted in Old West

garb and carrying a rifle, by the sculptor David Manuel (b. 1940), achieved \$9,840. The statue, 28½ inches in height, was signed, titled, dated (1979) and editioned in the cast (#26 of 250). It bore the publisher's mark "Bianchi Frontier Museum" and foundry mark "Maiden Bronze Foundry, Walla Walla, Washington". Included was a Certificate of Authenticity from the Frontier Museum Historical Center.

Realizing the same final selling price of \$9,840 was a large-format Buffalo Bill "Rough Riders" poster, produced by Wieners lithography (London and Paris) and advertising shows in Belgium. The poster, measuring 44 inches by 68¼ inches and mounted in a contemporary poster frame, was graded well at 8.9 for condition and featured a dynamic bucking bronco and cowboy in woolie chaps. The text was partially in French and partially in English. It was accompanied by an original postcard from the event.

A pair of black woolly chaps made by

the renowned maker Hamley & Company of Pendleton, Oregon, fetched \$9,225. The 37-inch-long chaps were in excellent supple condition, with no shedding or hair loss. The tops had a striking incised leather black diamond pattern under ivory. The maker was stamped on the end of the belt (HAMLEY & CO / PENDLETON / ORE).

seen. They also exhibited a basket which they claimed had been the girls’ first bed, and sold their autographs making about \$75 per day.

Pictures of the quints sprang up on merchandise around the globe. They became the face of Karo Corn Syrup, Lysol, Palmolive Soap, Carnation Milk, Baby Ruth Candy Bars and dozens of other items. Companies which didn’t have licensing deals with the quints still jumped on the bandwagon. J.C. Penney advertised that if the quints had been born locally, “Penney’s could have completely outfitted them.” One creamery’s ad, which promised “a smile with every bite,” added “That’s what would happen when Yvonne, Cecil or Annette sunk their teeth into a delicious cone of McKay’s homemade ice cream.” Even car lots were profiting off using the quints’ image in their ads.

It was the town they lived in, however, that profited the most. Newspaper articles there raved about the girls

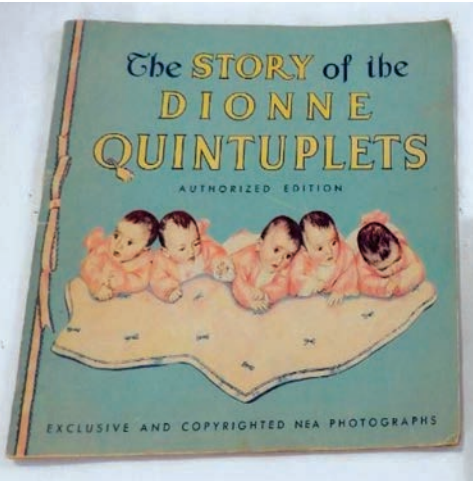

“bring-ing the jingle of cash” to the area and creating hundreds of jobs. Referred to as “a natural monopoly with no living competitors,” the quints generated millions of dollars in tourist revenue.

Publications paid for exclusive rights to specific quint photos while their faces were splashed on calendars, paper dolls, cookie boxes, books, candy, card games, dolls, and even dinnerware. When Hollywood came calling, three quint films were made, two in 1936 and one in 1938.

Elzire and Oliva fought to gain back custody of the quints when they were nine years old. The family then relocated to a 20-room mansion financed by the five girls. The quints later remembered it as a very unhappy home. As adults, they chose to avoid commercial publicity, and spoke out against child exploitation. Sadly, Emilie died at the age of 20 due to the effects of a stroke. Annette, the last of the quints died in 2025.

While vintage Dionne quintuplet memorabilia is available and affordable, it is not a flooded market. A full set of vintage Dionne quintuplet spoons

usually goes for under \$25. Vintage quint books sell in the range of \$10, with vintage quint paper doll books commanding about twice that amount. The Dionne quintuplet birthday bowl, put out by Quaker Oats in 1935, was originally sold for 10 cents and two Quaker Oats trademarks. “The very same kind of oatmeal chosen for the Dionne quintuplets,” the ad announced. The bowl can be scored today for around \$15. A photograph of the quint’s first home, copied and sold by their father back when they were infants, has gone for less than \$30. Such photos are stamped on the back in purple ink “Purchased at booth operated by Quint’s Parents.”

In 1985, after the Dionne farmhouse had been moved from its original site to North Bay, the birthplace of the girls became the Dionne Quintuplet Museum. In 2016 the museum closed and the Dionne Quints Heritage Board was established to resuscitate it. The following year, it was moved to the area’s waterfront where it reopened in 2019 as the Dionne Quints Home Museum.

The Callander Museum and Alex

Dufresne Gallery is housed in the old homestead of the quints’ physician, Dr. Al-lan Roy Dafoe, located at 107 Lansdowne Street East in Callanader, Ontario, Canada. “The home was built in 1904 and Dafoe lived there from 1914 until his death in 1943,” said the museum’s curator Natasha Waitr. The museum covers the history of Callander, hosts local art exhibitions, and houses a large collection of memorabilia concerning the Dionne quintuplets. “This year we welcomed people from Costa Rica, Japan, India, Ukraine and Russia,” said Waitr, who added that the quints “continue to fascinate the public almost a century after their birth,”

Calling the story of the quintuplets a miracle as well as a tragedy, Waitr said, “As their fame skyrocketed, the girls became symbols of hope during the Great Depression, but they were also heavily marketed for commercial profit.” She pointed out that questions concerning the rights of children in the public eye remain just as relevant today as “Society’s fascination with the unusual and extraordinary has changed very little.”
