# Collectors open their wallets for vintage mesh purses

Michael Kors. Gucci. Coach. Marc Jacobs. Chanel. Louis Vuitton.

These modern-day purse makers and their meticulous designs have captured the attention of fashion-minded women everywhere. The luxurious craftsmanship of fine quality and opulence are the lure of these modern-day purse and bag makers. Accompanied with a hefty price tag, these coveted purses can be found at any mall in America to this day.

Women coveted purses more than 100 years ago, too, but tiny metal mesh was the fashion.

Metal mesh dates back to the Middle Ages, when chainmail was first invented. Thin strips of iron and precious metals were cut and hammered into interlocking rings, then soldered together. Mesh purses were first seen in the 1700s. But with up to 100,000 links per bag, each one made by hand, purses took weeks to produce. By the early 20th century, however, new manufacturing techniques would change all that.

Two manufacturers of metal mesh bags stood out when the bags were first produced and are in the crosshairs of purse collectors to this day: Whiting & Davis and Mandalian.

The American company Whiting & Davis of Plainville, Mass., (named after founders Charles A. Whiting and Edward P. Davis and formed in 1876) was producing wildly popular designs. Its bags, often made of German silver, gunmetal or sterling, featured hand-etched frames and graceful silhouettes. Fringed dangles completed the flapper look of these bags, and polychrome enameling allowed for geometric patterns and pictorials. Mesh necklaces and coiled-mesh snake bracelets were also popular.

For nearly a century, the company dominated this market, and Paul Poiret and Elsa Schiaparelli both designed for them.

The unique interlocking mesh of Whiting & Davis provided an evocative new texture that was seen of green, black, orange and red on a creamy white background is as cutting-edge and elegant. The first production runs were hand linked. It was standard practice for from the 1920s and sold for \$350 at auction recently. The purse meathe company to send materials home with workers so the entire family could make bags at night.

Employees were then paid for their quotas. Many Whiting & Davis bags were also made by local women in "sewing circle" fashion who worked linking about 1,000 rings per day. This process proved to be slow, laborious and unreliable.

By 1910 the company used machines to produce the mesh, which then pushed the company's handbags onto the national stage. Styles ranged from mixing and matching different colored mesh to employing enamel paints to create various scenes and designs on the metal itself. Popular looks include Art Deco style, geometric and zigzag patterns in dazzling pearlized enamel or sterling

The metal mesh from this company was so finely woven that it feels like fabric. The company's styles were various and the most fashionable was the Dresden Mesh, with its gentle patterning. Dresden mesh bags were of fine mesh and painted with vivid patterns. Dresden mesh had softer hues and a more muted appearance. They were all decorated through silk screening accomplished over several days, with one color dried for 24 hours before another color was applied.

The company also boasted its Beadlite bags, billed as being chip resistant, though many collectors will attest that it wasn't. At one point, Whiting & Davis offered more than 1,200 frame designs. Some were jeweled or had cutout designs. Others were stamped openwork. Sometimes enamel on the frame matched the design on the bag.

Working with a young inventor named A.C. Pratt, Whiting developed an automated mesh machine in 1912. According to Antique

Purses by Richard Holiner, "mesh for handbags was then produced at the rate of 400,000 links a day." By 1920, the company expanded from 12 mesh production machines to 500, with offices in Canada, New York and Illinois. By 1926, Whiting & Davis was considered the world's largest manufacturing house of its kind.

From 1912 through 1925, most of the bags Whiting & Davis produced were fashioned of sterling silver or vermeil (essentially gold plating over sterling silver). Many of the frames were set with genuine sapphires and other colorful gemstones. In 1923, First Lady Grace Coolidge carried a specially made gold handbag to her husband's inauguration.

By 1930 the goal was to make the bags more affordable and have broader appeal. Bags were then made of base metals, silver or gold plated brass, copper and nickel silver (a form of false silver) and the frames were machine stamped rather than hand engraved.

As seen in advertising from the late 1930s in Vogue and Harper's Bazaar, Whiting & Davis teamed with famed French designer Elsa Schiaparelli to produce silk-lined handbags labeled "After Schiaparelli." These bags were made of metal mesh in varying sizes

## A lunchbox inspired Joel Magee to collect his childhood memories

Joel Magee (The Toy Scout) has been collecting toys for more than 30 years. His mission is to reacquire toys from his childhood; his personal collection now stands at more than 500 toys.

It all started with a purchase of a GI Joe lunchbox that looked just like one he had when he was in grade school. The lunchbox, which he still has, was shining like a beacon of light at a flea market.

"I was shopping at a flea market in Sioux City, Iowa, and didn't really want to be there because there was a bunch of clothing and furniture and other items, then I saw the GI Joe lunchbox," Magee said. "It was like I had tunnel vision. I saw a GI Joe lunchbox just like the one I had as a kid. I walked over to the lunchbox and a ton of memories came flooding back. It was like a video recording had gone off in my mind. I could see my friends and could see myself having lunch with my friends as I did when I was eight or nine years old."

He said his mother used to take photos of him with his toys every vear and he remembered a photo she had taken of him with the lunchbox.

Magee is a regular guest on the television show Pawn Stars where he is known as the Disney expert. He also appraises items for the show. He buys toys and repairs them as well as selling toys to others.

purchases was for a collection of 650 vintage lunchboxes at a cost of \$260,000. All were from 1950s and 60s television shows. He found a Star Trek lunchbox and a Lost in Space lunch box in that group, each are valued between \$2,000 and \$4,000.

"All of the boxes were in mint

that kind of condition from one collection. The collector had traveled all over the U.S. looking for rare boxes in new condition," Magee said.

## Dali etching stolen in less than a minute

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A brazen thief stole a Salvador Dali etching valued at \$20,000 from a San Francisco gallery, then walked off down the street with the work in his hand.

Burning Giraffe, a 1960s hand-colored, limited-edition surrealist work, was stolen in seconds last week from Dennis Rae Fine Art off Union Square.

Rasjad Hopkins, a gallery director, said he was working alone and may have turned his back away from the front of the store, where the piece was displayed on an easel facing the window.

"He was in and out of there in a shot. He probably did it in less than a minute," Hopkins said.

The gallery has a video camera, but it wasn't on at the time, Hopkins said.

However, surveillance video from another business showed the man strolling down Geary Street with the artwork in his hand.

Although art thieves sometimes have clients who pay for certain pieces, "I think it was a theft of opportunity," Hopkins said.

The etching was insured, he said. It was one of about 30 pieces on display for the gallery's ongoing Dali exhibition.

Hopkins said the etching is relatively rare. "I'd say it's one of the most desirable pieces out of that period," he added.

It is very well-known and is also numbered, Hopkins said.



# A tisk-it; a task-it – folk art sewing boxes and baskets

Ancient tools suggest once it was determined clothing was a good thing, binding hides and then cloth together in some manner – aka sewing; was a life skill practiced by many. As the human species evolved and developed so did the sewing implements used to create garments. And while needles became finer, and scissors sharper and less likely to bind, what also evolved were the items used to hold said sewing paraphernalia.

For lovers of folk art, this is when it becomes interesting. Sewing baskets or boxes were, and continue to be, a mass-produced item, but there were also plenty of handcrafted beauties created to keep cherished sewing implements safe and easy to find.

Like all folk art, the sewing basket/box is a utilitarian item that takes on the folk art moniker when it is created with artistry and beauty that goes way beyond its simple function. During the Victorian era, needles and scissors were made of metal. These easily rusted if they came into contact with water, so the sewing basket helped with this.

Sewing baskets/boxes held thimbles, buttons, notions, threads, and any other sewing items the seamstress deemed essential. Sewing baskets were almost akin to one's purse; a statement of one's tastes, but a holder of many items.

Store bought sewing baskets and boxes were items owned mainly by the wealthy, but that did not stop seamstresses of lower income levels from creating their own from whatever materials were available, and these handmade or handwoven sewing containers are now highly desirable.


Folk art sewing baskets/boxes can be found in any era and reflect said era as well as its maker. Most sewing baskets have a cushioned area – be it under or on top of the lid – used to hold pins and needles. Some have sewn-in pockets used to secure scissors, buttons, and seam rippers. Still others have small dowels either on the outside or inside that were used to hold spools of thread.

Folk art sewing boxes are the most prevalent with the paint decoration of the box being the folk art aspect. A handpainted, circa 1860 early wooden sewing box with a sloping green fabric pincushion lid sold via Early American History Auctions (Rancho Santa Fe, Calif.) in August of 2018 for \$600. It wore rustic painted drawings of buildings and trees on the exterior and had painted designs on the interior as well.

Cape Cod artist, Peter Hunt, was known to paint a sewing box or two. Dutch folk art or Hindeloopen painted sewing boxes are stunning. Young ladies often used the exterior of their sewing boxes to show off their painting skills, but painted boxes are just one category of this genre.

Let's talk tramp art. Yep tramp art is folk art and tramp art/folk art sewing baskets are easy, and often times, affordable finds. For example in June of 2019 Jeffrey S. Evans & Associates held an Americana and Fine Arts auction with several tramp art pieces crossing the auction block. A two-tiered American folk art/tramp art sewing box with two lids and applied leaf and crescent decorations sold for a reasonable \$140. It was partially made from cigar boxes.

On the flip side, some folk art/tramp art sewing boxes can be costly. Currently on eBay, an early chip carved sewing box with rope trim and a pincushion top (https://tinyurl.com/y2gzzzja) is being offered for \$395. The box has a green "velvet" fabric pad on the top for a pin cushion with matching patches on all sides, rope trim around the lid and base and a red velvet interior. Its chip carving is five layers deep and was obviously made by a craftsman who cared about his/her work. Large in size, this sewing box is 15 inches across, 9 inches tall, and 10 ½ inches deep.

Sewing boxes in the shape of houses seems to be a category all its own, and honestly, it would be hard to top the late 19th century American folk art sewing box in the form of a Victorian home sold by Skinner, Inc., for \$3,075 in 2015. The dormered mansard roof of the house was hinged to reveal a well with a divided lift-out tray with a fabric-covered pincushion in the center. Talk about a showpiece! This fanciful house complete with a brick foundation and front porch placed in a square "yard" surrounded by a white picket fence is just over-the-top!

Keeping with the house theme, there are folk art sewing boxes in the shape of log cabins, and sewing boxes featuring shell decoration are also a popular category. Turnbridge ware; a form of decoratively inlaid woodwork, typically in the form of boxes, that is characteristic of Tonbridge and the spa town of Royal Tunbridge Wells in Kent in the 18th and 19th centuries, are found as sewing boxes and command top dollar as well. And then there are sewing boxes that are just plain charming in their obviously homemade design like the primitive painted wooden folk art sewing box with a drawer, four spool holders and pincushion currently for sale on eBay (https://tinyurl.com/y674arzt)

Though folk art sewing boxes are plentiful, just as many folk art sewing baskets also exist. Many sewing baskets were mass-produced, but handcrafted, folk art versions do show up. A 19th century Victorian era folk art wicker woven straw sewing basket currently for sale for \$175 at the Rhode Island Antique Mall of Pawtucket, RI (https://tinyurl.com/ y2cnnaxv) is one that is lighter in weight so possibly it was a sewing basket made for travel? The weaving of the basket features solomonic-style twisted side, top, and bottom trim with geometric panels inset with printed Braquenie-style fabric. The interior of the basket is lined with its original cotton floral striped fabric.

Sewing to many might seem a tedious task, but when stitching with style was a very important household skill, the work needed done was surely much more fun if a folk art sewing box or basket was in the mix

These treasures still show up in today's marketplace, and if at first glance the item in question appears to be simply a small container, don't be afraid to lift the lid to see if in fact what's been unearthed is instead a unique folk art sewing staple from the past.



Electric Purple Farm Yard 3-in-1 Edge bowl selling for 4,250; a Millersburg Purple Cleveland Memorial ashtray, going for \$4,000; a Fenton Marigold Grape and Cable low fruit bowl from Pacific Coast Mail Order that achieved \$3,400; a Fenton 9-inch Electric Green Peter Rabbit plate that made \$3,300; an Australian Crown Crystal Marigold Kiwi bowl

that sold for \$2,100; and finally an extremely rare 9-inch Blue Thistle plate that garnered \$2,000.

With a surprise collector comes surprise results most notably, on the first day of the auction when seven Fire King Jade-Ite coffee mugs achieved a staggering \$2,200 and three Anchor Hocking Jade-Ite coffee cups reached \$1,150. Also worth recognizing is a very rare five-piece Hazel Atlas bathroom set which sold for \$700.

Magee said, "I would watch the shows and take notice of all the different gadgets used on the shows. There are toys made like the gadgets used on the shows and characters from the shows and those are the toys I collect for my personal collection."

Selecting one or a few favorites or rarest toys of such a vast collection is difficult. Nonetheless, Magee said his top three favorites include a *Lost in Space* Roto Jet Gun, a rare *Star Trek* lunchbox and thermos and a rare, limited edition *Bewitched* Tabitha doll. He added a limited-edition Batman Playset to that same list when talking about the rarest toys.

Magee said, "The Lost in Space gun was limited because it shot flying saucers and the projectiles were deemed dangerous, so they stopped making the toy. The one I have was never opened, the box is actually still wrapped in cellophane."

He said sometimes parents would buy two of the same toy for their kids. One they gave for use now and then put the other one away for the kids to use some other time. Many times the parents would forget they had the second toy and find it years later when the kids were grown and gone from the home. The second toy would still be completely sealed in the original packaging.

"I've done that myself where I bought a toy and put it away and forgot I had it. Right now, I'm buying Harry Potter toys and storing them in my attic for the future because they will be in demand from upcoming toy collectors," Magee

Magee said, "I am always surprised by the toys that show up at the different shows. I always seem to find a toy I've never come across before and that's really exciting to me. That's also what keeps collecting new and fresh, when you see the golden nugget like the *Spider Man* #1 comic that I bought in Chicago recently."

The comic book did have yellowed

scotch tape down the spine. The collector told Magee he taped all of his comics when he was young to protect the spines from getting roughed up when it was being read. Magee said he has a person that specializes in removing scotch tape and he is hoping to get the tape off without any damage to the comic.

Magee also collects items that were used or sold exclusively inside the Disney parks. He has one room in his house filled with Disney items.

"Disney used to hold parking lot sales, they don't anymore but when they did, you could purchase signs and other items that were used in the parks. I also have a collection of Disney toys sold only in the parks," Magee said.

Collecting the toys holds meaning to Magee for several reasons. The toys represent recreating his favorite shows of his childhood. Plus, he says collecting is good for his health.

"First, collecting anything is always a way to preserve history. But collecting toys is a bit more than that for me,

collecting is therapy for me. It's a way for me to relieve stress. My doctor tells me I have the blood pressure of a 20-year-old and he always asks what my secret is to maintaining my good blood pressure. I honestly believe it is the toys," Magee said.

He added that his toy collection "takes me to a happy place, I can be having a bad day and I go spend some time in the toy room and I feel much better."

His recommendations for collectors is to first and foremost buy what they like and enjoy. He also suggested to only clean toys when researching the best ways to do so or finding an expert to clean the toys. Magee said a toy can be forever damaged if the wrong cleaning products are used.

Selling tips include making sure the toys looking as good as possible. When selling online, make sure to take photos of all sides including the inside of a toy so the buyer can see the condition more clearly.

# Bus No. 99 comes back home to Weirton, W.Va.

WEIRTON, W.Va. (AP) — It's back from the "graveyard," but there's nothing spooky about a proposed effort to restore something that once roamed the streets of Weirton, Steubenville, Ohio, Follansbee, Wellsburg, New Cumberland and beyond.

Bus No. 99 from the Pittsburgh and Weirton Bus Co. has come home to Weirton, where it awaits a new chapter in its history as something to see and appre-

The story of how the bus ultimately made its way back on Sept. 3, a game plan for its restoration and storage as well as fundraising possibilities came into view when a committee of interested supporters gathered recently to hear a presentation by Dennis Jones, project chairman and executive director of the Weirton Area Museum and Cultural Center.

A past-to-present overview began with an explanation that organized bus service started in Weirton in 1926 on a line operating from Avenue C through Holliday's Cove, up the hill to Weirton Heights and then to the Pennsylvania state line. In 1929, the service was incorporated as the "Heights Bus Line Co." with Mike Starvaggi, Charles Danze, William Sundale, James B. Marino and Rudolph Pozzanzini as incorporators.

In 1931, the Pittsburgh & Weirton Bus Co. was incorporated with Starvaggi as president, according to Jones.

"Almost everyone who lived around our area before 1978 had some sort of experience with a P&W bus, a common sight on Main Street in Weirton," Jones noted. Hundreds of people, he said, are sharing their experiences about riding the bus through the Weirton Area Museum and Cultural Center's Facebook page, which has posted old bus photos.

The gesture also has generated interest from people wanting to help with the res-

People rode the bus line to work, to school, to shop — everywhere, according to Jones. "Everybody rode the bus." he said. "Almost every photo of Main Street from the 1950s and '60s has a P&W Bus somewhere within the scene," he said.

The bus line ceased operations in 1978. For close to 30 years, Bus No. 99 was at the Starvaggi garage but in early 2007 Starvaggi Industries donated it to the Ohio Museum of Transportation. Another bus - No. 136 - was donated to the Antique Motor Coach Association of Pennsylvania.

Jones said he has been trying to get Bus No. 99 returned to Weirton ever since.

In February 2007, it was delivered to a maintenance facility near Lake Milton, Ohio, where unfortunately, he said, it was stored outside for the past 12 years. Jones tried to get the bus returned to Weirton, but the museum in Ohio was using it due to its good condition of the interior.

However, that all changed this summer. "The president of the Ohio Transportation Museum called me and asked if I was still interested in the bus," Jones noted. "He informed me that the person in charge of the bus had passed away, and they now had a big bill to pay for the storage and maintenance of the bus (\$2,780). If I would pay that bill, the bus would be ours. So I went up to the place where it was stored outside for the past 12 years near Lake Milton, Ohio, and paid the bill with my personal credit card."

The next two complicated hurdles involved the title transfer and getting the bus hauled back to Weirton.

"I worked with the Ohio Transportation Museum president to have the title transferred to our Weirton museum and also spoke with Luke Myers at Starvaggi Enterprises to have a letter written to the Ohio Transportation Museum declaring the bus was originally donated to them,'

Jones said of the process involved in getting the bus titled to the Weirton museum.

"The final step was to get the bus hauled back to Weirton, and it was difficult to find a hauling company locally that would do the work," he said. "We needed a company with a lowboy trailer long enough and wide enough to hold the bus, which is 30 feet long. Also, the tires on the bus were flat and sunk into the ground about 5 inches, so before agreeing to haul the bus, the hauling companies wanted assurances that the tires were inflated and were not locked in place," he continued.

"Although the tires are becoming dry-rotted, I asked the storage facility owner to try and pump up the tires. To do

this he had to run several air hose extensions out the bus parked outside behind the garage. He was successful in getting most of the tires inflated. These were still tube-type tires, and the tubes inside the tires were still in good enough shape to hold air," Jones noted.

Now come plans to raise money to restore the bus and create a garage to house it on the museum lot across the

"All of us look forward to the day the bus will once again roll down Main Street, just as it did more than 40 years ago, bringing back memories we experienced in the '50s through the '70s riding up and down the streets in Weirton," Jones said.

predominantly in gold- and silver-tone colors.

White enameled bags made of larger bubbled mesh known as Alumesh were also manufactured during the late 1930s. These durable bags featured both metal mesh and handles made of plastic along with high-quality grosgrain fabric lining.

Wartime production caused Whiting & Davis to shift focus to a partnership with Raytheon, making essential radar equipment during the World War II years.

After a decade of decline during the 1940s, the mesh bags made a comeback in the '50s as stars like Ingrid Bergman and Jane Russell sported them in the movies. As late as the 1970s, mesh was even used in halter tops with matching disco bags.

After being run by family members of Charles Whiting through 1966, handbags and purse accessories were licensed to Indolink Corp. in 1999. In 2010 the original company, which still produces metal mesh "fabric", was acquired by Darrin Cutler. The new owner revived the company's jewelry business by introducing an anniversary line of fine sterling and gold jewelry to commemorate 135 years of Whiting & Davis quality in 2011.

When coming upon a Whiting & Davis bag, purse experts say collectors should look for bags with minimal tarnish and little loss to the mesh or enamel. The hinge and clasp should work smoothly. Bags may be lined in silk, and chain lengths vary. Most are marked inside with the Whiting & Davis logo, often engraved on a cartouche secured to the mesh

Prices for vintage items range from \$200 to \$2,000 at auction, depending on the design and the condition of the mesh and frame. Collectors prize bags made during the late 1920s and '30s, although treasure seekers will find good examples into the 1950s.

Whiting & Davis did not monopolize the mesh purse market, however. Sahatiel Gabrabed Mandalian emigrated from Turkey in 1889 and began making jewelry and novelties in the U.S. in 1906. Mandalian formed a partnership with

Eugene A. Hawkins and started producing mesh bags under the name Mandalian & Hawkins. In 1915 the company name was changed to Mandalian Manufacturing Co. and was headquartered in Massachusetts.

Many of the designs used on the bags look like Turkish carpets. Early mesh bags were expensive because the mesh was made by hand. After an automatic mesh-making machine was invented in 1912, bags became more affordable. Mandalian bags in good condition sell for \$200.

Mandalian patented its "Lustro Pearl Finish" used on their metal mesh purses, and the pearlized enamel was guaranteed to be chip resistant. The colors used on these bags were vibrant and attractive, and many of the frames that held them were more elaborate than those of other competitors. It wasn't unusual to find Mandalian bags incorporating intricate filigree frames or lavishly embellished frames with faux gemstones, and their original prices were steep as well.

The Mandalian purses were pricey. For example, Mandalian bags of 1929 that included enameled metal beads dangling from the bottoms ranged from \$4 to \$30. That's the equivalent of \$55-

\$400 in modern terms.

Mandalian bags were most often V-shaped, and many of them had delicate chain fringe embellishing the bottom edges. They were sold both with and without silk fabric linings.

Most bags left the factory marked "Mandalia Mfg. Co." on the rigid metal frame. Early Mandalian bags were market with just a capital "M" inside a diamond, according to Sherry and Mike Miller of PurseCollector.com.

The company was eventually sold to Whiting & Davis in 1944.

Well-known antiques appraiser Dr. Lori Verderame offers a few tips when searching for any vintage handbag: check the hardware and check the lining, she says.

"When it comes to vintage handbags and purses, they're only as good as their hardware," Verderame said. "The hardware of any handbag is the structure or bones of the piece. The hardware should be carefully considered for its quality and durability, and for its good looks. Sturdy metal frames are designed to keep their shape and support the rest of the materials that comprise the handbag. Metal zippers are the gold standard for most 20th century handbags, but when you are purchasing a vintage handbag with

metal zippers make sure there are no missing teeth and that the zipper glides easily. All of these factors affect value."

According to Verderame, the materials that support the contents (or lining) are vital.

"When shopping for an antique (more than 100 years old) or vintage (less than 100) handbag, check out the quality of the lining and the stitching that connects the lining to the hardware structure," she said. "It should have no holes, be free of mold or mildew from improper storage, and show no tears or rips if you're looking for top value. Some of the more expensive or higher quality handbags may have a silk, suede or leather lining. Inexpensive bags have linings of nylon, polyester or other synthetic blend."

Verderame realizes that collectors want to display their finds, but should do so cautiously.

"When it comes to displaying your vintage handbags, purses or pocketbooks, remember to place them on a shelf rather than hanging them from a hook, dresser knob or rack," she said. "The straps will take a beating by the weight of the bag. Cover them in cloth bags when storing them. This will reduce dust and dirt on the bag which can damage the look of the bag over time."

## After 30 years on the road Walter Holtz now has new building to call home

WEST ALLIS, Wis. - Wally Holtz is an American success story. And he has made his mark in one of the toughest businesses in town - buying and selling antiques.

Starting out nearly 30 years ago with \$400, Holtz began selling on the flea market circuit, driving his van for hours to neighboring states, setting up for shows in all kinds of weather then sleeping in the back of the van before the long trip back to his home near Milwaukee.

"I was in the business for three years before I saw a hotel room," Holtz says. "All the bad food, horrible weather ... it was like the movie, Planes, Trains and Automobiles times 100. I can laugh about it now, but there were times it surely wasn't funny."

On Sept. 14, he officially opened the doors to Walter Holtz Antiques at the busy corner of 72nd and Greenfield avenues in the dead center of West Allis, about 10 minutes west of Milwaukee. Inside the store are the fruits of his labor, more than \$3 million in high-end antiques – the very best of the best.

The new headquarters of Holtz's antique empire was, at one time, the first J.C. Penney store built in Wisconsin. As Penney's it was in business from 1934 until 1975. After that, it became a wedding apparel shop until Holtz purchased the property in October 1975.

"The building was literally falling apart at the seams," Holtz says. "I thought we could get it up and running in six months. It took two years to renovate ... the electric, plumbing, structure, floors everything needed work. We're about 90 percent done now. We still have some windows to do and

For years, Holtz sold out of his 9th Street Antiques shop in Milwaukee;

some floor work."

20,000 square feet to show off his inventory. The former Penney building, with its 10-foot high tinned ceilings and large structural columns, enhances the ambiance.

He sells wholesale to auctioneers across the country and has retailed to such celebrities as Cindy Crawford, Bette Midler, Meg Ryan, former NBA basketball great Scotty Pippin and "dozens of influential people."

Holtz built what he calls the "backbone" of his business while on the road during the past 23 years. Starting out at the Kane County Flea Market in St. Charles, Ill., in his early 20s he pounded the road - picking antiques, salvaging, building relationships with dealers and customers, and learning the business inside and out.

Within that span of time, he elevated himself (and his inventory) to setting up at some of the top antiques shows in the country, including the New York City Pier, the Miami Beach Antique Show, and the Baltimore Art, Antiques and Jewelry

He also became a permanent fixture at Midwest shows. "I've

done between 20 and 25 shows a year for the nearly the past 25years," he says. "For the longest time I was out on the road 20 days out of the month. I can tell you all kinds of 'road stories."

But what Holtz took away from the road was not only a good swath of knowledge in antiques, but most importantly, an ever-demanding call to continually upgrade his inventory.

"That was always the key to the business," he now says. "If I sold something for \$1,000, I was looking for something I could

# Buyers were banking on mechanical offerings at Morphy's

DENVER, Pa. — Morphy Auctions is known for putting together some pretty interesting auctions, and the Sept. 24-25 event featuring wonderful toys, dolls, and figural and mechanical cast-iron items did not disappoint.

The mechanical banks offered were quite spectacular. A Kyser & Rex roller skating cast-iron mechanical bank; one of the top lots of the sale, stormed to \$98,400. The elaborate mechanics of this bank were a major draw. Once a coin is placed in the slot on the roof and a lever was pressed, roller-skaters would glide to the rear of the rink and a man would turn as if to present a wreath to a little

Also earning a \$98,400 final bid was the Freedman's Bank, which was made of wood, metal, and cloth. The circa 1880 bank had a windup mechanism. The bank required that a coin be placed on the desk and when a lever was pressed, the "Freedman's" right arm would pull his outstretched arm to his right which caused his left hand to rake the coin into the hole in the desk. But wait. There's more. Then the figure would raise his right hand, thumb his nose and wiggle

had a unique color variation and sold for

his fingers in a humorous gesture as his head turned to the right. Finally, the figure would lower his right arm back to its original position.

A Henry Hart Presto cast-iron mechanical bank that created an illusion sold for \$27,600. Users would place a penny in the slot and look through the viewer where it would appear as though the penny had changed into a 25 cent piece. Once the lever was pulled, the penny would then drop into the bank.

The joy of these antique mechanical banks is the unexpected. Another example of this would be the J. & E. Stevens Home Bank cast-iron mechanical bank that realized \$19,680. The user would pull the lever until it catches, then place a coin in front of the cashier. A push of the knob and the cashier disappeared into the bank with the coin. Morphy's said the unique color variation of this example was a major draw.

Two mechanical banks required a \$15,600 final bid for ownership. A J. & E. Stevens Calamity cast-iron example featuring three football players had the user move the right and left tackle into position, place a coin in the slot in front of the fullback, and press the lever. The figures then come together and the coin

dropped into the bank. At the same price The 9 inch long toy was in near mint was a cast-iron American Bank in the form of a sewing machine. When a coin was placed in the slot, a turn of the crank made the needle go up and down.

Vintage toy vehicles also delighted at this auction. A tin-litho friction T.V. Space Patrol space vehicle made in Japan sold for \$9,000. The toy's friction motor made the space vehicle move forward as the astronaut with a video camera rotated under the car's dome.





was always looking for the next big piece. I was doing a lot of picking and salvaging myself. I'd go down to Chicago and just made a killing there ... there's just so much good stuff out there. I eventually got to the place, when I set up at a show, people would come there just to deal with me."

Calling his business "recession-proof," Holtz claims he had his best years as other dealers were bemoaning the future of antiques becoming passé among the younger crowd.

"I had my best year in 2013-2014," he says, "the best year in my 29 years in business. "I've had people walk into my store and say, 'I don't like antiques,' and walk out after making up to \$100,000 in purchases. That not only happened once, but at least 20 times. It's a constant.

"All this talk about young people not buying, and antiques not selling is just talk. The problem is that the antique dealer is not putting the right product out to the customer. It's that simple. Prospective customers have gone into antique shops and been exposed to nothing but a bunch of junk.

"I think too many of the antique dealers just grew complacent during the good years, and just kept doing what they were doing. And now, the kids or anyone else for that matter don't want to go into an antique shop and see grandma's old broken-down pie safe. That's what they think about antique shops. And unfortunately, that's what they're seeing across the country."

Holtz looks for what he calls "timeless pieces."

"I love antique furniture, especially those heavily carved ornate pieces," he says. "I don't try to over think these things. I just buy what I like and, fortunately, a lot of people like what I like. I like those curvy Art Nouveau pieces, good art glass, or the Tiffany Studio pieces from the early 1900s that are bringing record prices. That's what I call the timeless pieces. They're quality and hold their value."

Holtz ships his pieces nationwide, having a good handle on what sells best in specific areas. "Most of the bigger items, I sell throughout the South and in Texas. The smaller items go to New York and parts of the East Coast, where a penthouse with 1,500 to 2,000 square feet is a large

Holtz plans on adding Mid-Century Modern and contemporary furniture to his inventory once he completes the 7,000 square foot basement renovations in the




