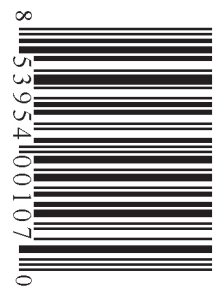

The roundup of model horse collecting

People have been collecting model horses for decades, and many still have their original collections. It is a hobby for all ages. It may have started as a birthday gift or a purchase made with allowance money, but the horse herd on the shelf slowly grew. Horses are a very appealing collectible, whether made of plastic, ceramic, metal, wood, marble, or resin.

Breyer plastic horses currently in production may retail for \$5-60, while special runs can cost \$100-200 and a vintage Breyer in pristine condition could be worth hundreds of dollars. Peter Stone horses, in production since the late 1990s, provide a totally different experience in plastic horses, offer-

ing several one-of-a-kind creations. Retail prices range from \$15 to several hundred dollars, depending on size and workmanship. The broad category of ceramic horses includes models by several manufacturers. Horses that were made in Japan in the 1950s-1970s, usually marked as such, can be found for \$10-40, depending on the age, condition, and detail of the model. Hagen-Renaker California pottery horses from the 1950s-1980s will sell for \$100-600, while the currently produced models sell for less. European ceramic horses such as Royal Worcester, Albany, and Hutschenreuther (most no longer in production) represent the top of the line ceramics and can sell for \$1,000-3,000, depending on the model.

The model horse hobby continues to evolve, and a new medium for models has emerged. Companies that in the past made figures for promotional contracts or movie props out of resin are now casting model horses. This material allows equine artists to have an original sculpture, complete with all the intricate details, mass produced so that fans can have their own version. It can then be painted by the purchaser, or by an artist of their choice. Unpainted resins can be purchased for \$25-125, depending on the size, while painted resins will vary substantially in price depending on the finishing artist. As a final nod toward the future, some people are beginning to experiment with 3D printing, to create a model horse from a drawing.

As early as the 1950s, companies such as Breyer Molding Company, Hartland Plastics, and Hagen-Renaker Pottery produced model horses. The interest in these models grew. When young girls (and some boys) would write to Breyer and ask about other collectors, the company would send them an informative booklet about the hobby, with contact information for Ellen Hitchins (California) or Simone Smiljanic (Indiana). Those two early pioneers were organizing photo shows and live shows in the late 1960s, and together managed the International Model Horse Association. They also ran ads and articles in the

Collectors of the paranormal find spooky is fun

Ancient superstitions hold that Halloween is when the "veil" between our world and that of the spirits is at its thinnest. Whether or not you believe that, there's no denying that October feels like the perfect time for ghost stories, seances, Ouija boards, and other supernatural pastimes.

However, there's a growing number of young collectors who are interested in "paranormal" items year-round. Calvin Von Crush is one of them.

The professional tattoo artist lives in Meriden, Conn., with his pets: a live two-headed turtle and a black cat named Elvira, Meowstress of the Dark. Besides collecting occult antiques, Calvin enjoys martial arts and performing with his horror-punk band, Room 21.

But it's his passion for collecting that really takes over his free time. He has created his own "museum space" devoted to his collections in his home, and he also stars in a show available on Amazon Prime called *The Occult Collector*.

"I've always been a collector," Calvin explains. "My earliest collections were most likely dinosaur figurines and action figures. Then I moved on to comic books and natural history specimens. As a small child, I had buckets of gravel I believed to be moon rocks that an older neighbor gave to me on false pretenses. I cherished them, as I wanted to be an astronaut."

However, being raised a "good Catholic boy" sparked Calvin's inter-

Halloween: Tricks and treats, and bags to hold them

A history of paper bags is actually a short history of trick or treating in America. In 1852, Francis Wolle invented the first machine to mass-produce envelope-styled paper bags. In 1871, Margaret Knight designed a machine that could produce flat-bottomed paper bags. In 1883, Charles Stilwell patented a machine that made square-bottom paper bags with pleated sides. And in 1912, Walter Deubener used cord to reinforce paper bags and to add carrying handles.

A "Deubener Shopping Bag" could hold 75 pounds and became the standard for department store bags. By 1915, a million Deubener Shopping Bags were sold each year, and the number grew by leaps and bounds over the years. By 1976, plastic shopping bags were replacing paper bags in nearly every store, and on Halloween night, children all over America cried as they lamented the passing of the Deubener, handle paper bag and the 75 pounds of candy it could hold.

If Halloween trick or treat bags had a Golden Era, it was the 1950s. All bags in the '50s were paper, many had handles, and the vivid black and orange decorations and pictures on the bags quickly associated them with Halloween. Surprisingly, many of these vintage, 1950s Halloween bags are still available for collectors. Today, in good condition with vivid colors, a '50s trick or treat paper bag sells for around \$50.

Cloth "trick or treat" Halloween bags from the 1950s are also highly sought. Two, Popeye the Sailor Man and Casper the Friendly Ghost, are exceedingly rare and are occasionally offered for \$100.

Some collectors limit their Halloween trick or treat

Skeleton becomes my highest ticket purchase to date

With Halloween just a few days away, it seems a good time to write about my most recent auction purchase, which to date, is also my most expensive auction purchase.

I bought a human skeleton. And yes, it's real.

It all started when I saw an auction advertisement in *AntiqueWeek* from Ripley Auctions in Indianapolis. It featured a skull and a skeleton. For nine years I have been a member of Midwest Search Dogs, a volunteer search and rescue organization. During that time I have been the handler of two certified human remains detection dogs. While searching for live people and getting them safely home is also an important aspect of our team; many of our searches are for bodies. It sounds gruesome but often people are able to find closure if a search team is able to locate a body.

To train a human remains detection dog; one needs human remains. While there are a couple of body farms in the United States that allow limited training by search and rescue (SAR) dog handlers, they are far from me and expensive to train at. Like most organizations; my training aids are a mishmash of things I've purchased, swapped for or had donated. Most of what I train with is very small in comparison to an entire body. Blood is the easiest thing to get as anyone can donate a vial full of blood to our cause. Several of my friends have donated towels from the cleanup of massive bloody noses or traumas. Some people donate their placentas to teams such as mine. I have teeth that friends have had extracted and kept for me and even some cremains. And it is legal to own human bones. You can buy them online at places such as The Bone Room. The Bone Room actually sells a SAR pack of bones that are damaged.

While I have several small bones and other training material, it is important for dogs to have a scent picture to train on that is stronger so when they do encounter a full body on a search they won't discount it due to the stronger scent pattern. A few states have donated bodies that SAR teams are allowed to train on in a very limited fashion but my state is not one of them.

This means my teammates and I are

constantly on the lookout for ways to work with our dogs to help them find what they need to find.

When I saw the skeleton I knew this would be a great training opportunity. Prior to my purchase of the skeleton I had four human bones total and the largest was a long arm bone. That one bone would smell very differently to a dog than an entire skeleton would. I knew Ripley Auctions personnel were extremely dog friendly, so I reached out to see if my dog could work the skeleton. I was definitely interested in bidding but wanted to ensure it was real (even though everyone was sure it was).

This turned into an enthusiastic response and an invitation for our entire team to come on two different days in the week before the auction to let our dogs be exposed to the skull and the skeleton. On one day we took our experienced, certified dogs and on the second day we brought our puppies and young adult dogs.

I was terrified my dogs would jump on something fragile and expensive. Both Skywalker and Falcon are extremely athletic and think jumping on things or crawling under them is always the best way to move through life. I kept them on leash for this training with a watchful eye out for anything breakable. It was a fantastic training opportunity for our dogs, especially the young dogs.

I decided to place a bid on the skeleton and on the top of a human skull. I had some hope of getting the top of the skull as it was just a piece and in bad shape. Full skeletons on the Bone Room can be \$5,000 and skulls can sell for \$2,500. I knew I couldn't spend that much. The auction house had estimated the full skeleton at \$500 to \$900.

The skeleton most likely is that of a young woman and dates to the early 20th century. She was at one time a medical model. In the last few decades someone had built a small coffin for the skeleton and she had been used as a prop. Because the coffin was too short for her; some of her bones

aren't in the best of shape and she is only about 95 percent complete.

I had to leave an absentee bid as I was unable to attend the day of the auction. I was however, watching it online. On Saturdays I usually have three or four dog training clients and I was watching the bidding between clients. Of course it turned out the skeleton and skull would come up for bids right as I was supposed to meet a client. Luckily, the client was very accommodating and I ended up sitting in my vehicle outside of her home watching the auction.

The skull top sold well above my \$180 top bid; which made me decide my chances of the skeleton were slim. I had left a high bid of \$1,100 and the online bidding before the auction had started was at \$700. There was an \$800 bid then a \$900 bid from me and it kind of stalled. Then the online screen started flashing "fair warning." After what seemed a long time (but was really

just a few seconds) the screen flashed sold. I owned a skeleton. The auction house staff was so excited; they applauded when I went in to pick her up.

She will now be used to help our dogs become better resources for police and emergency management personnel. I have been researching the best ways to respectfully store her.

For anyone who has human skeletons or bones that they don't know what to do with, almost all states have at least one search and rescue unit; most states have several. All would most likely be delighted with a donation. According to the website at the Bone Room, "It is perfectly legal to possess and sell human bones in the United States. This is not to say that such laws do not exist in other countries, or at the local level. For example, three U.S. states, New York, Georgia & Tennessee, all have independent State Laws prohibiting the import or export of human remains across their state lines."

est in the occult. "I think my curiosity with paranormal fields really stemmed from my Catholic upbringing," he says. "I was pretty devout and believed so deeply in the struggle between Heaven and Hell. Ghosts and spirits and demons were so real to me."

But there were more earthly influences, too. "I also loved monsters. Ray Harryhausen's stop-motion creatures really struck a chord with me."

Calvin's interest in the unknown grew into a desire to encounter the paranormal firsthand... and led to his present collections. "I wanted to experience the paranormal and thought my best chance was by bringing these items we were all warned about into my home."

His first paranormal purchase was innocent enough: "Ouija boards are the gateway drug to occult collectibles," Calvin says. "I got my first one at the tender age of nine."

Today, Calvin has one of the world's largest collections of antique Ouija boards, dime-museum taxidermy, Halloween decorations, fortune-telling supplies, and other spooky oddities. It's all housed in his private museum.

"I have a custom-built museum space in the basement of my condo," he says. "I designed the space and arranged a combination of store-bought bookcases and custom-built shelving."

There's also an element of theatricality to his display. "There's spooky lighting and even Bluetooth speaker lightbulbs for an eerie soundtrack. My next addition will be a fog machine for ground effects," he says.

In Calvin's home museum, you'll find early 20th-century crystal balls and fortune-telling cards along with kitschy souvenirs of the Loch Ness Monster. There are also a number of sideshow gaffes—hand-made sideshow displays that were advertised as real, organic oddities (think Fiji mermaids).

And then there are the Ouija boards. Regular readers of this column know that talking boards are a hot collectible. Although many of us grew up with the standard Parker Brothers board, during the early decades of the 20th century, hundreds of colorful and varied talking boards

were produced by many companies. Calvin has dozens of different boards on display, along with many different planchettes and other Ouija-related memorabilia.

"I'm partial to my Ouija boards, of course," Calvin says. "They kinda started this whole mess!"

Calvin has been very active in a club for Ouija collectors, of which he is a director. "The Talking Board Historical Society (TBHS) was formed in 2013 by a group of Ouija and talking board collectors focused on documenting and preserving the history and culture behind such items," he explains. "We raise money through special events, educational programs, and merchandising to fund monuments and gravestones for places and people connected to the history around Ouija and talking boards."

"It can be a lot of hard work, but it's a ton of fun and very rewarding at the end of the day."

Calvin's group recently made the news, too. "Recently, a small group of us helped build the world's largest Ouija board, dubbed 'Ouijazilla' by its creator and fellow TBHS director, Rick Schreck." Ouijazilla made its debut, fittingly, in Salem, Mass.

Although he does buy items online, he loves the "thrill of the hunt" when it comes to boots-on-the-ground collecting. "Antiquing with friends is such a cherished pastime," Calvin says. "I've definitely earned my stripes walking the rows at Brimfield Antique Fair the past eight years or so."

"Antiques are where we come from. There's so much to learn about our past and, quite frankly, I've learned so much about myself while collecting."

But has Calvin's collecting "experiment" worked? Has he had an occult experience thanks to his collectibles? "It's actually made me more of a skeptic," he says.

Still, there's no sense of loss. "Now that I no longer believe in the possibility of an item bringing some kind of spooky attachment into my home, my obsession with the subject matter lies in this history. It's so rich and fascinating to hear these tales of magic and monsters and ghouls and ghosts."

"I think the psychology that goes into people's continued belief still excites me, too. I'm always amazed at what people think about having a home filled with such bizarre treasures."

bag collection to bags advertising companies. There are many to choose from. Recently a Chevron "trick or treat" bag, with Hawaiian girl, was offered on eBay for \$111. This bag is a true work of art, and its reverse side featured "safety tips" for Trick or Treaters to follow. During the 1970s, Burger King gave away free paper bags as promotional advertising. A harder-to-find advertising bag is the Dog n Suds bag from the 1960s. At one time there were 650 Dog n Suds operating in the United States, but today there are only 14, so all Dog n Suds items are collectible.

Charmin toilet paper gave away Mr. Whipple trick or treat bags in the 1970s that depicted Mr. Whipple in a witch's costume astride a broom. These bags are especially fun for any collector who has ever "squeezed the Charmin." Some other companies that offered collectible trick or treat bags include Brach's candy, A&W Root Beer (featuring the Munsters), and Orange Crush soda.

Today, kids use plastic bags or pillowcases to entice homeowners to "give up the candy." But there was a day when Halloween trick or treat bags were beautifully decorated, and today, these special Halloween bags are considered "treats" in themselves, and that's no trick.

Realistic nature sculptures set the high standard

For those who feel the joy of nature few works of art will delight the heart and excite the senses as much as the glasswork of Karen Willenbrink-Johnsen (American, born 1960). As a second generation naturalist and an avid birdwatcher, her depictions of birds are not an interpretation, but an uncanny realism that captures attitude, reaction, energy, and activity as it exists in natural surroundings. They express an imperceptible knowledge and intuitive awareness where the artist and her subject meet on a soul level.

Karen was born and raised in Ohio and her father, a landscaper by profession, took great delight in camping trips with his family where he taught them to have an in-depth familiarity and keen appreciation for birds and other forms of wildlife, trees, and other natural elements. The joys of nature were central to the family's core values, and when Karen found her talent in glassblowing it spontaneously followed that her awe of the power of nature would be her artistic expression and serve as her constant inspiration. She wanted to share with her audience those indefinable characteristics of wildlife that mesmerizes the watching world.

Karen's creative sculptures represent all elements of nature in precision accuracy, and her work has been hailed by leading institutions in both the art world and nature conservatories. In observing Willenbrink-Johnsen's work, Cathleen Malok, Rehabilitation Director at The Raptor Trust, a leading avian rehabilitation center located in New Jersey, commented, "I'm looking at her birds and I can't believe they are made out of glass! Her work is amazing. She captures the very essence of the Peacock and I love the stance of the Great Horned owl in the birch tree, looking down from its high perch in a way that only an owl can. You can sense the natural movement of her subjects. The fact that they are glass challenges the imagination."

Karen not only succeeded in capturing the pure essence of birds and other forms of nature, she wowed the global art community with her expertise in glassblowing. The combination of capturing the pure realism of her subject, down to the texture of a feather, with an unrivaled technical expertise has created an unprecedented artistic presentation that has met with universal applause among the most respected art platforms.

While attending Ohio University, where she received a BFA in Sculpture, Karen entered a glassblowing class as an elective and discovered her unique talent. After graduating, she moved to New York's Catskill Mountains to perfect her craft and in 1987 she relocated to Washington State to serve as an assistant to the renowned glass artist William Morris at the Pilchuck Glass School and remained there for 16 years. She now works with her own team that includes her husband Jasen, who worked as the head studio technician at Pilchuck Glass School. "Collaborating with other artists has taught me to stay open, be a sponge and soak up as much as I can," Karen said.

In addition to her studio work she continues to teach at Pilchuck during the summer sessions and also holds demonstrations and instructive seminars at prestigious institutions across the globe. Sharing what she knows is critical to her life's work.

In the artist's own words, "I can't get over the glory of the natural works. If I could give my younger self one piece of advice about working with glass, it would be that we all have our own path, trust in it. Live for your spirit. It is the only true wealth. Love life and live passionately."

In addition to birds, Karen's sculptural creations depict fish, flowers, elements of nature, and dogs. Her dogs were done in a riot of humorist characterization, "just for the joy of it," for the Tacoma Museum of Glass 2005 "Best in Show" exhibit.

Karen has been the recipient of a number of awards, including the coveted Corning Award for Outstanding Student and the Washington State Arts Council Grant, among many others. Her work has been exhibited in leading art museums and is represented in multiple leading galleries.

live horse magazines such as *Horse and Rider* and *Western Horseman* which drew many people into the model horse hobby.

Collectors began to find each other, form clubs, and participate in local activities. Hobbyists were communicating via snail mail and expensive long distance phone calls as the scope of the hobby grew. Linda Walter of Alabama launched the *Model Horse Shows Journal* which ran from 1969-1980. Many people still fondly remember the impact it had on their lives. Collector Marney Walerius, who lived in the Chicago area, was near the Breyer factory. She became a driving force in advancing the hobby in the 1970s and 1980s with great emphasis on quality and realism. Her annual Model Horse Congress was a legendary example for other shows around the country. Now it is much easier to find fellow collectors as online groups and clubs draw thousands of members. Resources such as Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest, YouTube, and Twitter encourage the sharing of photos and information.

Some folks enjoy collecting original (factory) finish models. The hunt for "the find" is an addictive activity and it is fun to share a successful catch with friends. While it may be tempting to speculate on what the future value of models might be as an investment for profit, the market can be unpredictable. Prices have risen and fallen with the economy and long-term collectors have seen these cycles.

Others will take an original finish horse and alter it. This may be as simple as adding white facial markings or stockings. It can also involve repositioning the horse, replacing the head with a different head, adding a fur mane and tail, or giving it a completely new color. Vintage remade horses from the 1970s and 1980s still trigger a nostalgic attraction but the modern customized horses look real enough to whinny. Many hobby artists have their own websites or Facebook groups. Some will take custom orders to create a portrait model of a living horse. There are also tutorials online for those seeking to try their hand at customizing.

One of the more social aspects of the hobby is model horse showing. This can be done by submitting pho-

tos of the horses, either by snail mail or electronically, to online shows, or via in-person live shows. Photo showing is a very challenging and rewarding pursuit, as showers strive to place their horses in realistic settings, either created indoors or captured outdoors. Scale is important, as a 9-inch tall horse must have suitable surroundings to make the scene believable. Meanwhile, the model horses at the live show are not marched around the ring by their owners. They are placed on a table and the judge will walk along and evaluate each model on its merits. They are being judged on realism, condition, breed appropriateness, and additional competitive qualities. Getting together with other collectors to talk about the hobby is a way to share stories, gather information, and have fun. Shows are organized by regions of the country and may be advertised through social media or club newsletters. Some clubs will also host swap meets or other non-competitive events to bring people together.

Every year thousands of model horse fans gather for BreyerFest in Lexington, Ky. Started in 1990, it has grown each year, creating a large

(nearly over-whelming) experience. Hosted at the Kentucky Horse Park, it features live horses performing for the crowd and numerous outlets to purchase model horses of all types and other related items from park vendors and at the Clarion host hotel. There are seminars, workshops, and ample opportunities to learn about the hobby and to connect with others. Next year's BreyerFest will be held July 10-12. Some people arrive a few days early to expand their visit to Kentucky horse country. The theme will be Celtic Fling and many of the models and activities will be related to that.

Exploring the Model Horse Hobby was recently released. The new book features a comprehensive look at the modern model horse hobby. It includes the major brands of horses, where to find them, tips on collecting, showing, and creating horses, as well as an in-depth look at the rich history of the hobby and a chapter exploring BreyerFest. It consists of 120 glossy pages and 535 photos. It is available at www.fairportpress.com. 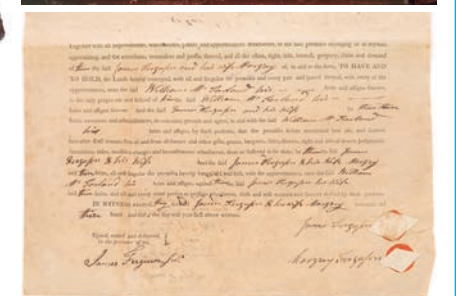
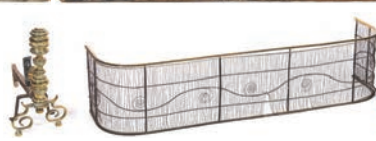

Art and silver will spark bidder interest at John Moran auction

MONROVIA, Calif. — Moran's Nov. 19 20th Century Art + Design auction event is filled to the brim with an exciting mix of works from the century's most coveted artists and craftsmen. 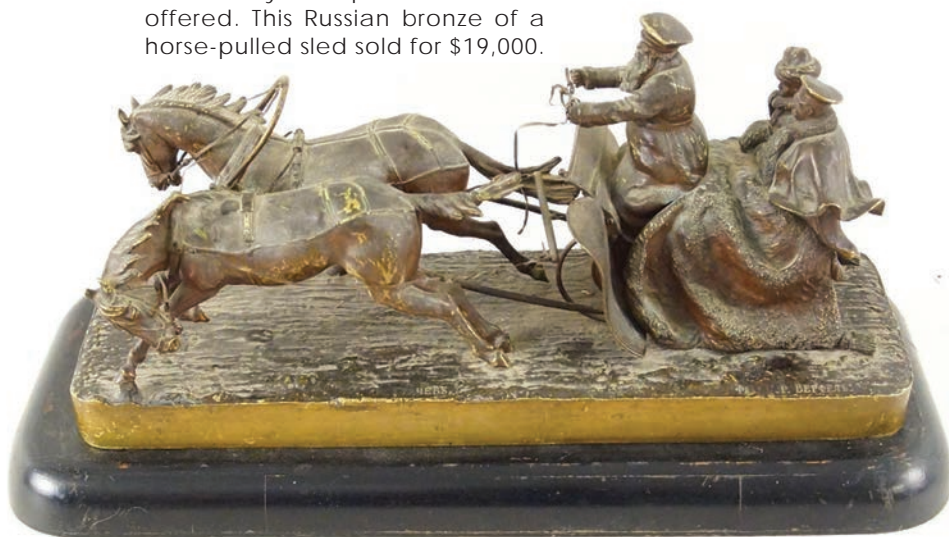
California Auctioneers and Appraisers offers taste of the Old West

VENTURA, Calif. — Auctioneer John Eubanks of California Auctioneers and Appraisers called his Sept. 22 auction "electric" adding that about a dozen pieces set records. The dazzling array came from the collections of Donna Decker Harcourt, heir of Harcourt Publishing, and the Ernie Hovard Collection of Western and Native American objects.

Multiple pieces grabbed five-figure winning bids. The auction's highest, at \$27,000 went to a circa 1876 tintype featuring both Wyatt and Morgan Earp at

the beginning of their law enforcement careers with the Dodge City Peace Keepers.

Several pieces of Western art also reached five figures including an Edward Borein (1872-1945) Western watercolor entitled *Lone Cowboy* that sold for \$23,000. That painting hung in New York's Whitney Museum of Western Art in the mid-1960s. A Channing Peake abstract oil painting went for \$17,500. A Western oil on board by Jack Swanson (1927-2014) entitled *Making of a Cowhorse* sold for \$16,500.

Several bronzes by Remington, Jim Davidson, Henry Bonnard, and Jack Swanson, among others, were offered. Selling for \$19,000 was a Russian bronze depicting a driver carrying two passengers by horse-drawn sled. Another, a numbered piece (2 or 25) entitled, *Vaquero* that sold for \$5,000 was featured on the cover of the 1987 Cowboy Artists of America exhibition guidebook.

A large Chumash Indian sandstone metate went for \$2,750. A beautiful polychrome Acoma seed pot by Emma Chino, done in Anasazi style with pictograms of fish, rabbits, eagles, and other animals reached \$425.

Other Native American items included a circa 1910-1920 Red Mesa Third Phase revival Chief's blanket, sold for \$3,500, while an early 20th-century Chemehuevi Olla basket came close at \$3,000. A pair of Sioux beaded moccasins,

sinew sewn on rawhide, in excellent condition, was picked up for a modest \$500. There were also prehistoric artifacts like the collection of 14 stone carved axes that hit \$475.

For lovers of the iconic old West, plenty was offered. Bidding went to \$1,100 on an 8-inch barrel .44 caliber Colt Army model percussion revolver from 1863, graded in “very good” condition, with visible matching serial numbers. Ten lots of antique Wells Fargo items, included numerous strong boxes like the Wells Fargo Railway messenger’s trunk with original paint, strapping, lock and key that brought \$2,500. A beautiful Wells Fargo black and yellow-painted buckboard with leather seat sold for an astonishing \$750.

Images of swinging saloon doors were probably on the minds of buyers chasing a collection of 14 antique liquor bottles, spanning back to 1840. The lot, won at \$130, included bottles for Cutter Bourbon No. 1, Duffy’s Malt whiskey, E.G. Booz Old Cabin Whiskey, and Avan Hoboken & Co Rotterdam gin. Better yet was the unopened bottle of 152-year-old Scotch Whisky from Greenlees Brothers in Leith Scotland which a lucky buyer picked up for \$500.

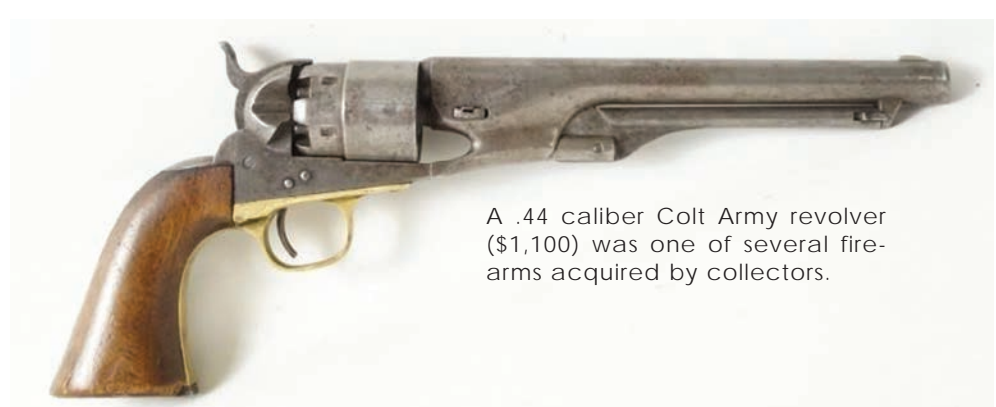
