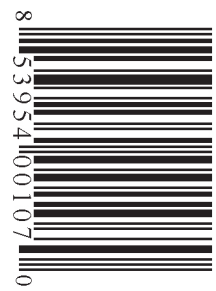

Business owners are optimistic as customers begin shopping again

Editor's Note: This is the third installment of a series looking at how shops and malls are facing the challenges of reopening and dealing with life in a world in the midst of a pandemic. Writers Barbara Beem, William Flood and Katherine Peach contributed to this article.

Indiana

With a few exceptions, by July 3, retailers across Indiana could operate at full capacity. Employees and customers are recommended to wear cloth face coverings, employees are supposed to be screened daily, and social distancing procedures are expected in stores.

National Road Antique Mall, Cambridge City

Owner: Beth Leisure

In eastern Indiana, Beth Leisure at the National Road Antique Mall said they are still going strong. While the post-reopening surge is probably not enough to recoup the losses during the lockdown, she acknowledges, "We're on a good trajectory." Leisure indicated there are plenty of people in her area who still haven't gone out yet. That group plus several upcoming area festivals have the potential to spur additional business. As for precautions, the mall doesn't require masks, and there isn't a mask-wearing mandate in their county. "A lot of people are ignoring it. Maybe 5 percent of the shoppers coming in have a mask on," she said. "If someone asks and they don't have to wear a mask, they seem relieved."

Found, Goshen

Owner: Keith Graber Miller

At Found in Goshen, traffic is fluctuating but sales have stayed good. Owner, Keith Graber Miller said he's selling a lot of high ticket items like furniture, even to out-of-town buyers. "We're on track for July to match last year's sales," he commented but said it's hard to predict because things are changing wildly from week to week. Nobody could predict the recent protests as close as the next corner; fortunately Found didn't experience any issues nor see a slowdown of business. And, their county is currently a "red"

one, not yet re-shuttering but also not moving to the final stage of reopening. Masks are mandatory but the store was requiring them anyway. A First Fridays event that always provided a big sales boost to the shop has been canceled by the city. Miller said he's OK

with that because it would have been irresponsible to amass that many people. Despite staying optimistic, Miller is concerned he might have to shut down again.

Antique Emporium, Carmel Owner: Peg Durrer

Social Media efforts aside, Peg Durrer is still getting 2-3 calls daily from people asking if she's open. She senses business has leveled off recently but acknowledged, "It's hard to judge at the moment." She believes the post-reopening surge was from people wanting to get out. "We were busy all week long, every day, the first couple of weeks." Yet, even weeks later, business on a mid-July Monday was stronger than usual. Mask-use parallels that in much of the state. "Based on conversations, people are not going to change their lifestyle," Durrer said. That equates to about half of the arrivals donning a mask. Among her biggest concerns is what's happening with schools. "Usually when the kids go back to school, the moms come back to shop." However, this fall parents can choose whether to let their children attend school or learn from home. Durrer wondered what effect that will have on the store.

North Carolina Antique Market Place, Greensboro Rhonda Aufderhar, Manager

Business has been booming at the Antique Market Place in Greensboro. Open seven days a week, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays through Saturdays, and 1 to 6 p.m. on Sundays, the mall has more than 45,000 square feet of quality antique and vintage merchandise. Dealers are briskly restocking their booths and are having excellent sales on

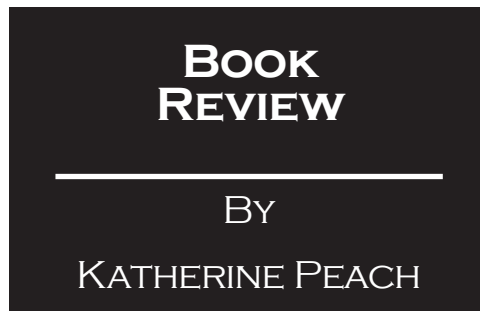
A look at what the tide washed in can be fascinating

All antique collectors are familiar with the saying "One man's trash is another man's treasure." By our very nature, we're obsessed with the stuff that other people just didn't want anymore. But the new book *Lost and Found: Time, Tide, and Treasures* by Amy Heller and Gail Browne takes the proverb even further, documenting six New Englanders' love for junk discarded off the coast of Cape Cod. This detritus has inspired them not only in their collections but in their artworks.

Provincetown, Mass., is the oldest continuous art colony in the U.S. After a major storm battered the town in 1898, artists began moving into the buildings the decimated fishing industry had abandoned. For more than 100 years, creative types have flocked to the Cape Cod town in search of community and inspiration.

The artists featured in *Lost and Found* have found their inspiration in the centuries' worth of junk that washes on shore with every tide. Until the 1930s, Provincetown residents dumped their trash into the harbor. Today, much like the famous Mudlarkers on the banks of London's River Thames, beachcombers head out in the mornings to find artifacts from Cape Cod's past.

After decades or even centuries, the objects



that wash ashore at Provincetown have been smoothed and worn by time and water. Amy Heller sums up the findings thus: "dolls, marbles, coins, metal, clay pipes, inner ear bones of whales, jewelry—and things you can't even imagine." The oldest objects represented are flint and granite tools used by the indigenous residents of Cape Cod long before the Mayflower arrived in 1620.

Lost and Found documents the artifact collections of six local artists: Heller, Gail Browne, Judy Berkowitz, Betty Bodian, Varujan Boghosian, and Paul Bowen. Although none of the artists featured were born and raised in Cape Cod, every one of them has lived at least part-time in the town for decades. Their chosen artistic media range from photography to painting to fiber art.

George Washington letter highlights July 30 Pook & Pook sale

DOWNINGTOWN, Pa. — General Washington leans over his maps in the candlelight of his tent. He hears the despair in the moans coming from the sick tent and feels the oppressive threat of the encroaching British forces bearing down on him after the Battle of Long Island during the New York campaign of 1776. The captures of two of his commanders, General Sullivan and Lord Stirling, weighed on his mind after the battle which had taken place in Brooklyn just a week before. "Good God, what brave fellows I must lose," General Washington remarked after watching the battle turn south for the revolutionaries. Legend has it that after he ordered the retreat of his men from Long Island, Washington himself was the last man to leave Brooklyn. In his tent on that September day Washington made a decision and had a letter written to request four ships on which to transport those poor souls injured in the battle. The General managed to make his tone cordial and dignified even though he must have felt a great deal of regret and responsibility for his men. A great leader even before he was the leader of a nation, Washington displayed in the letter both humility and dignity required of great men who fight for a worthy cause.

This letter, with an estimate of \$8,000-12,000, is among the first lots crossing the block in Pook & Pook's July 30 Firearms, Militaria & Ephemera Auction. The ephemera

side of the sale, the majority of which comes from the collection of Joseph Rubinfine of Merritt Island, Fla., features an impressive number of letters and signatures from the Founding Fathers and more. Standouts in the sale include John Hancock's very own John Hancock, an edition of Benjamin Franklin's *The Pennsylvania Gazette* from June 1752, an impeccable vellum ship's passage from 1803 signed by Thomas Jefferson and James Madison with a beautiful engraving of a lighthouse and tall ship, and a military appointment signed by Abraham Lincoln. Another fascinating lot is from an Ohio collection. It is a detailed World War I hand-written diary and archive of Wilson Kappel, Bolivar, Ohio, mechanic US Army, Company C, 6th Infantry, starting with his registration on June 5th, 1917 until his arrival back home on July 31, 1919. His accounts include 153 pages of riveting entries with stories detailing his life from the front lines.

A beautiful powder horn from the French and Indian War attributed to Jacob Gay is estimated at \$15,000-20,000 and another powder horn from the Revolutionary War belonging to Isaiah Thomas with scrimshaw decorations of a mermaid, a tall ship, geometric patterns, and more is estimated at \$10,000-15,000. Among the numerous Colt revolvers, be prepared for the standout "Cattle Brand" first generation single action Army revolver, highly engraved with a spare cylinder in a fitted silk and

velvet lined case. There is a really good collection of bayonets that were accumulated over decades by a local collector. There are many Brown Bess variations and also an extremely Scarce Ames Mfg. Co. Sappers & Miners model 1847 musketoon sword bayonet, one of only 830 produced.

Small arms included in the sale are a Spanish copy of a Kerr's pat-

ent percussion revolver, a French "Garde du Corps du Roi" model 1816 flintlock pistol, a Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, flintlock pistol, a Colt model 1911 US Army semi-automatic pistol, a Dan Wesson Arms double action revolver, a Les Baer Custom 1911 semi-automatic pistol, a DWM

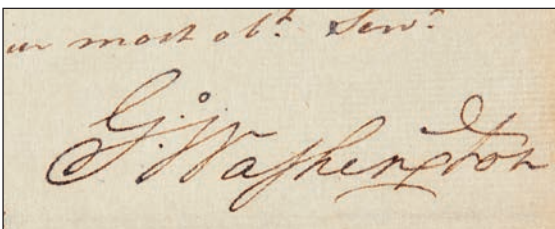

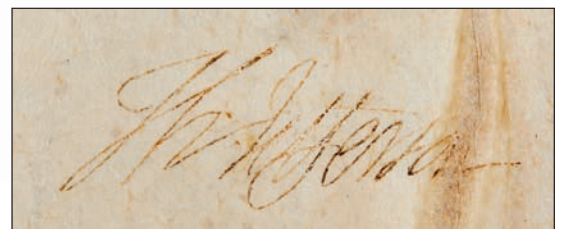

Tiffany lamps blazed with bids at Cottone Auction

GENESE0, N.Y. — Cottone Auctions was prepared for what could have been a serious setback to their March 28 auction due to Covid-19. Well in advance of the auction Cottone sent out reassuring emails to their subscribers, informing them that the auction would proceed as planned and outlined how that would take place. Although there would be no in-person bidding for the sale, the auction would proceed and be offered online and through their newly established app, which could be downloaded to a mobile device. Additionally, many items had extensive and interesting lot descriptions. “We were fortunate that we have been tailoring our auction venue to have a strong online presentation for years now,” said Matt Cottone. “We es-

tablished our own online bidding site, as well as utilizing other popular onsite auctioneers, and created the app shortly before the coronavirus. We also made the buyer’s premium a flat in-house rate, so buyers would not be penalized for having to bid online. Our consignors did not remove their items and bidders did not back off. I am eternally grateful to our clientele and do not take them for granted.”

Cottone is well regarded for their quality merchandise and this sale underscored that reputation. Fine and rare examples of vintage Tiffany lamps established the top lots of the sale. Chief among them was a Rose table lamp, often referred to as the “Rose helmet.” The leaded glass and patinated bronze shade was impressed “Tiffany Studios New York 1915,” while the base, circa 1914, was impressed “Tiffany Studios New York 367.” The catalog noted, “The price of the shade alone cost \$160 at the time of production. This was on a par with the Peony and other intricate floral designs.” The 35 inch high by 24 inch diameter shade carried a provenance from Lillian Nassau, Ltd., New York and a private Florida collection. The lamp sold for a strong \$91,450.

An 18-light Lily lamp had a bronze lily base with brownish gold patina was stamped “Tiffany Studios, NY #383.”

Book report

The first section of the book introduces the artists and tells their history with Provincetown. Heller and Browne interviewed the artists about their favorite beach finds and detailed how they have influenced their artworks. The reader gets to see samples of the artists’ work, as well as snippets of poetry celebrating the New England sea. There are also reproductions of vintage Provincetown photo postcards and brief historical summaries about the town and its people.

But the second part of the book contains the good stuff—photographs of finds. There are pages of marbles, clay pipes, keys and locks, transferware sherds and—most peculiarly—a preponderance of china doll parts. There are doll legs, torsos, arms, and heads. One of the most haunting images in the book is of a doll head with an open mouth. Worn by time, it looks like a carved ancient Greek tragedy mask pulled from an archaeological site.

My favorite part of the book is an anecdote about the doll parts, a theory proposed by a 5-year-old Provincetown resident: “Once upon a time, a little girl got very mad at her mother,

so she packed up all of her dollies in a paper bag and ran away from home to the beach. She didn’t know there was a hole in the bag.”

I also loved the pages of clay pipe bowls and stems. In centuries past, these smoking apparatuses were considered as disposable as cigarette butts are today, so every seventeenth- and eighteenth-century historical site worth its salt has hundreds of them in the ground. Provincetown’s beaches are no exception. My favorite clay pipe shown in the book was made to look like a fish with a gaping mouth.

Lost and Found is a beautiful book that anyone who loves Cape Cod will enjoy. On my first read, I wished that there had been more information provided about the artifacts. After all, I’m curious about objects and their histories. However, I later got the inkling that this was a conscious decision on the part of the authors to let the artifacts speak for themselves. Just as they have inspired generations of artists, the discarded bits and bobs of centuries past can inspire new ideas about community, time, and the sea.

model 1906 American Eagle Luger semi-automatic pistol, a Colt single action army revolver made in 1899, and a Pre-war commercial Mauser model 1896 Broomhandle pistol, as well as many Smith & Wesson revolvers.

There is a nice group of Civil War firearms with many saddle ring carbines. Of the long arms going up for sale are a Burnside, US Springfield model 1884, Colt contract musket, Spencer, Sharps New Model 1863, Gallagher Patent, Smith Patent, Colt 1851 Navy, and a Sharps and Hankins just as an overview. The auction block will also be visited by dozens of lots of

swords, knives, and accessories.

There is a nice selection of shotguns from all of the familiar makers. Charles Daly, A. H. Fox, Parker, Weatherby, Italian Remington, and Belgian Brownings are just a few of the names on the roll call. Headlining the rifles is a Mauser Obendorf commercial deluxe type A bolt action big game rifle estimated at \$4,500-6,500, a British Snyder officers’ carbine in .577 caliber, Winchester model 1873 lever action rifle, US Remington model 1903-A3 sniper rifle, as well as a contemporary flintlock rifle by Jesse Holder. The Downingtown, PA auction will also feature dozens of rifles from the Collection of Ed Hilliard of West Collingswood, New Jersey.

The 18 Favrile shades were all original and in excellent condition and the piece commanded \$70,800. The same price of \$70,800 was realized for a Dragonfly table lamp with a 20-inch diameter leaded shade with green dragonflies and red wings, stamped "Tiffany Studios, NY #1495." The base was signed "Tiffany Studios, NY #544." The entire piece stood 25 inches high.

Unusual museum quality items punctuated the sale and aggressive bidding from eager participants resulted in unprecedented prices. A staggering \$37,760 was realized for a Roman statue that was estimated at \$3,000 to \$5,000. The work was from the Imperial period and depicted a young boy sculpted in marble and mounted on a carved stone capital plinth. The figure stood only 15 1/2 inches tall and there were multiple condition issues. Both arms and legs were either

partially or completely broken off but the head and face were still in relatively good condition. The piece carried an impressive provenance from the collection of the honorable Larz Anderson (1866-1937), an American diplomat, and his wife Isabel (1876-1948), an author and benefactress. In their time they were the wealthiest residents of Washington, DC. Their 50-room palace and all of its contents were bequeathed to the Society of the Cincinnati, Washington, D.C., and the Roman statue was deaccessioned from there in 2000.

Another Roman marble sculpture of a 33 inch high veiled female bust that was mounted on a carved green pedestal brought \$27,140, outdistancing the presale estimate of \$5,000 to \$8,000 by a wide margin. It was signed by Gaetano Russo (Italian, 19th Century), a sculptor known for his marble depictions of allegorical figures and commemorative monuments. Russo is also known for creating the Christopher Columbus Monument in New York City.

An exceptional pair of Cherokee moccasins from the late 18th century came with a fascinating history. The black dyed buckskin moccasins were made in stylized floral patterns with French silk brocade, ribbons, and Italian cut beads. The catalog noted that they came from one of the tribal groups based around current Eastern Tennessee, North Carolina, Alabama, and Georgia. The moccasins originated from the family of Mary Sarah Wellesley, Countess of Cadogan, 1805-1873. The moccasins, which came from the original owners by descent and were shipped to Cottone from England, were estimated at \$15,000 to \$25,000, but far surpassed those figures when they sold for a hefty \$48,380.

Modern furniture was also well represented by a circa 1950 "Chieftain Chair," made by Finn Juhl (Danish, 1912-1989) and manufactured by Niels Vodder, Denmark. The chair descended from the estate of Inger-Marie Tanier & George Tanier, Knight of Dannebrog. It sold for \$49,560, which topped the estimate of \$15,000-\$25,000, and was accompanied by enameled and silver medals and a copy of the respected Danish design magazine, *Mobilia*, No 143 from June 1967. The magazine published an article touting "George Tanier as one of the outstanding figures in the post-war Danish furniture export trade, for which he had been dubbed a knight of the order of the Dannebrog by His Majesty King Frederik the Ninth."

the weekends, to boot. Some booths, such as the popular Vintage Life, are having summer sales to bring in customers, and the tactic is working. Customers are shopping for home decor, architectural components, vinyl records, and oddities. Face masks and gloves are encouraged but not required. Customers seem happy to be getting out of their homes and looking for new items to freshen up their indoor and outdoor spaces.

The Faded Farmhouse, Mooresville Bethany Hanby, Owner

The warm weather isn't keeping shoppers away from vintage store The Faded Farmhouse in Mooresville. In fact, owner Bethany Hanby is encouraging customers to combine shopping for decor and gifts with getting frosty treats at the old-fashioned ice cream parlor next door. Downtown Mooresville is also getting a facelift, which Hanby hopes will bring in more foot traffic as the year wears on. Farmhouse style continues to be hot in the Southeast region, and Hanby's boutique carries popular vintage and repurposed items such as galvanized steel buckets and milk-glass jars, along with a growing mix of new candles and fruit wreaths that accentuate the vintage country style.

Granddaddy's Antique Mall, Burlington Tim Marco, Owner

Granddaddy's Antique Mall in Burlington is bustling, to say the least. In fact, owner Tim Marco reports, "We have had the busiest two months since 2010." The 74,000-square-foot mall has plenty of space for shoppers who want to socially distance. Dealers are busily restocking their booths. One dealer, the Curiosity Shop, has even started selling "Mystery Boxes" for \$30. Sundays at the mall are particularly busy. That's due largely to the Food Truck Rodeo that continues to occur on Granddaddy's parking lot from noon to 5 p.m. every week. The mall also celebrated the Fourth of July with a raffle to help support an orphanage in Tanzania.

Ohio

Since reopening in mid-May, Ohio's antique stores have seen brisk business. Then, COVID cases spiked across much of Ohio, and protests in June caused concern for dealers in urban areas. Yet, many dealers in Ohio are pleased with how much they've bounced back.

Heart of Ohio Antique Mall, Springfield

COO: Karen Barber

Clark County, Ohio locked down pretty tight during quarantine but has loosened a bit. They're concentrating now on helping businesses get back on their feet. One of their actions was allowing the large Springfield Antiques show to take place at the fairgrounds, and that had spillover effects for Heart of Ohio. The boost was fortuitous although sales were already stronger than this time last year. Still, COO Karen Barber feels it will probably not make up for lost revenue from the shutdown. She said, "I think we're going into a more normal July with its ebbs and flows. Everyone is still guarded but optimistic." As they navigate a situation that seems to change by the week, she commented, "We're concentrating on keeping customers and staff happy and safe." That means all protective efforts remain in place. People actually thank mall staff for their efforts like providing sanitizer and providing masks for those who forgot one.

Heritage Square, Columbus Karen Kendrick

On a July Saturday, business was robust. Pondering the next day, Kendrick said, "I expect to be slammed." Dealers surveyed indicate sales were up year over year, some significantly. Reopening in

May to their regular schedule served them well as did their continued almost daily posts on Facebook to showcase dealer merchandise. Inside, floors remain clearly marked for flow, and customers seem to be quite courteous about distancing while shopping. The large amount of space makes keeping distance relatively easy although in bottleneck points like the cash register people often forget to distance themselves. Due to the recent spike in COVID cases in Franklin County, a mandatory mask order went into effect. But, the mall was ahead of that curve, having required masks for all staff and customers since reopening. Conspicuous signage at the doorway makes that abundantly clear.

Boomerang Vintage, Columbus Co-Owner: Karen Dilgard

At mid-century shop Boomerang Vintage, Karen Dilgard remains "cautiously optimistic." July is off to a decent start, and indications are business is back to its usual level." She added, "Compared to our worst fears - that being our bricks and mortar store would be over - it's way better!" Being early summer, it's hard to discern the overall direction of business. Fluctuations appear consistent with prior years. Summer is a big time when their customers relocate, and furniture sales have been good. "Art is doing surprisingly well, but decor and smalls are down," she mentioned, noting changes in buyers' tastes more than anything. The store remains marked for distancing, and with the recent COVID spikes, masks are expected as much as ever. Being in an urban area, there was some concern over the recent protests. While there was some local vandalism, their store did not suffer; and the protesting didn't seem to affect their sales. "It was just one more factor to navigate," Dilgard said.

Georgia

Greensboro Antique Mall, Greensboro Kim Lathrup, Owner

The Greensboro Antique Mall continues to be open seven days a week with a socially distant-conscious checkout process. Guests are encouraged to wrap and bag their own purchases and are separated from the register by glass. The mall boasts more than 11,000 square feet of fine antiques and vintage collectibles. There are more than 50 dealers selling everything from primitives to antiquarian books to antique furniture. Farmhouse-style decor is definitely on trend here. Shoppers are looking for items to spruce up their homes after quarantine.

Neat Pieces Antiques, Carlton Jimmy Poss, Owner

Carlton's Neat Pieces Antiques is the region's top destination for architectural antiques and curiosities. Visitors are "smiling under their masks." Recent finds include a set of solid brass locomotive train

bells from the early 1900s, a large 20-gallon cast-iron cauldron in great shape, and four authentic buggies from Georgia's Amish country. The store also sells a huge selection of vintage books, so there's something for everyone. Customers are eager to buy lovely and interesting items for both their homes and gardens, according to owner Jimmy Poss. Although in-person sales continue to be brisk, the store will continue to sell items online, especially via Instagram.

ForeveRetro, Thomasville Patti Smith, Owner

Concerned for the safety of her customers, ForeveRetro's owner, Patti Smith, is requiring guests to wear masks. And shoppers who want to peruse the racks at the record store inside ForeveRetro, Apollo Records, must also wear gloves. However, customers tend to be happy to comply. Foot traffic and sales are up, and Patti says that customers are starting to buy small items again. She opines that, having been stuck inside for so long, people want to have something new at home to look at. ForeveRetro has been selling top-quality mid-century modern furniture and accessories for years. Current best-sellers include "interesting" bamboo and rattan pieces — think Morticia Addams-style peacock chairs and vintage "pretzel" furniture. "People are motivated to make their houses interesting!" Patti says.

New York

By early July, seven of New York's 10 regions had reached the final stage of reopening. Three remain in Stage 3 but storefront retailers across the entire state are now permitted to be open.

Arcade Junction, Arcade Owner: Colleen Richardson

Sales have slowed at Arcade Junction this past week, but owner Colleen Richardson doesn't feel it's Coronavirus-related. Virus cases were fairly low in her area all along, and she attributes the drop-off more to warm weather and people increasingly engaged in outside activities. While there was an early surge in sales after reopening, she's worried it won't make up for the losses incurred while

shuttered. As for safety measures, her store is large so social distancing is not a problem - and overall, people are quite courteous about precautions. However, recent mask-wearing mandates meant denying entry to those who won't comply. Even with that, Richardson acknowledges a positive outcome: upon reopening, there was a sense of excitement, and shoppers were elated to shop somewhere beside big box stores or online. Richardson believes she's garnered lots of new regulars as a result.

Old Chapel Antiques and Artisan Market, Tonawanda

Owner: Jacob Wankansky

Jacob Wankansky waited until July 1 to reopen Old Chapel Antiques out of an abundance of caution. That move also pushed their reopening until after protests and curfews which affected neighboring areas. Wankansky said that business has been better than last July. "Customers have been excited to get back in." Since reopening, they've made good use of Facebook and various promotional events like "Breakfast with the Beatles" featuring all-day Beatles music, special prices, and promotional giveaways. When customers come in, they're wearing their masks, distancing, and using the available sanitizer. "We've had no issues with that," Wankansky said. He's hoping their area's early COVID bout means sidestepping the resurgence happening in other areas. Yet, when asked about his biggest concern moving forward, he responded, "Honestly, to just stay open and that we'll not have to close again," affirming there is still unease.

Stained Glass Antiques, Corning Owner: Joe Bartlett

Open since mid-June, Stained Glass Antiques is one of the few stores profiled that didn't experience a surge of business upon reopening. Owner Joe Bartlett attributes it to tourism being way down in the Corning area. NASCAR and other races have been canceled at nearby Watkins Glen raceway, which was a big blow. And, Market Street in Corning has been temporarily converted to pedestrian-only which

Prices for comics at Heritage were no laughing matter



DALLAS — Heritage Auctions began its four-day Comics & Comic Art event with a first session full of slam-bang action that smashed most expectations and pre-auction estimates. After a mere 105 minutes had elapsed, the Platinum Session filled with historic titles and significant works of original art had tallied almost \$3.3 million.

Session 2, which kicked off later in the day featured more than 150 additional comics alongside rare Pokémon and Magic: The Gathering items, brought in an additional \$1.7 million.

That pushed the first day's total past the \$5 million mark.

Tales to astonish, indeed. Nearly every single page of original art sold for well beyond pre-auction estimates. Some doubled and tripled expectations. Brian Bolland's Page 2 from *Batman: The Killing Joke*, his 1988 collaboration with Alan Moore that has influenced almost every Dark Knight tale since, set the tone early. The nine-panel slice of noir — featuring Batman and Commissioner Gordon striding past Arkham Asylum cells filled with villains, Two-Face among them — opened at \$62,500. Then bidders tussled over the coveted page, pushing it past its \$100,000 estimate to its final sale price of \$156,000 — the highest Heritage has yet realized for a page from that influential book.

Two extraordinary offerings by Jack Kirby — the man who helped save Marvel Comics, and reinvented himself and the way comics looked over four decades — also hit six figures, including his splash page from *X-Men No. 4*, which sold for \$132,000. This should not surprise: Not only does it feature the team's original lineup in the Danger Room, but on the back are Kirby's handwritten notes in which he brainstorms the names for a new character eventually called Scarlet Witch.

But not all the high numbers came from long-ago stories.

Joshua Middleton's cover to *Marvel's NYX No. 3* — the first comic-book appearance of X-23, a clone of Wolverine eventually seen in the 2017 *Logan* — sold alongside the character's concept art for \$78,000.

Said Heritage Auctions Vice President Barry Sandoval, "That is now the highest price ever paid at auction for a piece of 21st

century U.S. comic art."

Dozens of important comics likewise sold in Session 1 and 2, among them an issue of *Wonder Woman No. 1* graded CGC VF 8.0 for \$120,000. A *Superman No. 1* in CGC VG/FN 5.0 condition sold for \$360,000. And the finest known copy of 1940s *Batman No. 4* sold for \$40,800.

Marvel's debuts also exceeded expectations, including *Journey Into Mystery No. 83*, which, in 1962, introduced Thor. A copy graded CGC VF 8.0 sold for \$31,200.

has adversely affected customer volume. "If you don't have the people, you don't have the sales," he lamented. The store is currently open only Fridays and Saturdays, now outfitted with plexiglass around the cash registers, precautionary signs, and sanitizer. Mask wearing is mandatory in the state. "That's not been an issue," he said. He's still traveling out of state to buy antiques to sell in New York even though his antique sales are down. Studio work and stained glass repair are currently the main sources of business. His verdict, "We're not out of the woods yet."

Maryland

Retropolitan, Ellicott City Cindi Ryland, owner

Even the summer heat and humidity of the Baltimore area are not keeping shoppers from visiting Old Ellicott City, said Cindi Ryland, owner of Metropolitan, which is part of Taylor's Collective (managed by Ryland). "It's been crazy busy today," she said on a muggy Thursday afternoon. Among the most popular items at Metropolitan are vintage bohemian-style women's dresses and boudoir shoes — but, to her surprise, no hats. Online sales (Etsy and Facebook) to customers located primarily in Japan and the UK include "high-end" men's hats, wool slacks, and dress shoes. Men are also buying ties for themselves, even though many are working from home. Ryland reported interest in (but few impulse purchases of) large items (sofas and chairs, lamps and hanging lights). Artwork handled in other parts of the mall is selling "at all price points, from \$20 to \$500." Ryland continues to refresh her inventory "every once in a while" at online auctions, but only from "the ones I know and trust."

Frizzellburg Antique Store, Frizzellburg Laura Turner, owner

Laura Turner and her assistant recently compared notes and found that for many people, the first place they ventured out to visit was the Frizzellburg Antique Store, located in the countryside northwest of Baltimore. "We see new people every weekend." Open four days a week, Turner offers a wide range of wares, including primitives, textiles, and small furniture, but dolls are her specialty. In the past few weeks, she has found new homes for sever-

al antique bisque dolls, and she has participated in virtual doll shows, although many in-person shows have been canceled. Looking back, one good decision she made was to meet with customers by appointment while the shop was closed. On-site doll repair is once again offered on the third Sunday of each month. With time at home, collectors have spent time with their dolls and have subsequently "addressed their collection." Dolls have been through hard times before, Turner pointed out, and they have comforted many little girls. "Now they comfort big and little girls."

Blue Crab Antiques, Annapolis Mike Ernst, part owner

First the good news: Induction Day, when freshmen ("plebes") arrive in Annapolis at the United States Naval Academy, was spread over a week and a half this year because of COVID-19 concerns. For Mike Ernst at Blue Crab Antiques, that meant a steady stream of potential customers (their parents) visiting his shop. But the fate of the Academy's football season has yet to be decided. All the while, Ernst is making impressive sales, including complete sets of USNA plates (one from 1935 by Wedgwood, the other from 1932 by Spode), as well as a 1957 Army-Navy VIP football blanket. In addition to Navy-related customers, Blue Crab also caters to daytrippers from nearby D.C. who seek to furnish a traditional home and dinner table (there is a market for Waterford crystal, he noted), as well as representatives from embassies "trying to buy back their country's memories." A heightened presence on the internet has not only kept the shop afloat but also continues to attract new customers.

Virginia

Beck's Antiques, Fredericksburg Bill Beck, owner

Had he'd been asked a few years ago, Bill Beck could never have imagined that, thanks to images posted online, he would sell an early needlepoint rug and a needlework picture depicting a British house to a London-based dealer. But over the past few weeks, with help from *Instagram for Dummies* (a gift from his granddaughter), Beck did just that. "We've made some good sales," he said, even though foot traffic in Fredericksburg is not what it was. An early Causasian flatweave rug and a set of six "nice" dining room chairs are among his recent important sales; a late-18th century Virginia candlestand has also drawn

considerable interest. Buying and selling online has its challenges for Beck, who likes to touch what he buys. He agreed that a good rapport between careful buyers and trusted sellers is especially important now. Collectors fare well at home because "human beings like having stuff around them. I think in two years, we're going to look back on this as a turning point."

Williamsburg Antique Mall, Williamsburg Wes Taylor, manager

With Colonial Williamsburg re-opening in mid-June, business continues to pick up at the nearby Williamsburg Antique Mall. Even with reduced area tourism, June sales figures were down only 12 percent for the month. "I'd call that a major success," said manager Wes Taylor. From primitives to militaria, sports collectibles to Christmas decorations, the mall, with 45,000 square feet and 300 dealers, has something for everyone, he continued. Even kids can keep busy for several hours and win a prize by completing one of four scavenger hunts ("the parents love that"). The Veranda (Eats & Sweets) is serving at full capacity, and the mall's recent anniversary sale drew many buyers. During the time the mall was closed, an online store was opened; it continues to grow and thrive. Although it had been talked about before, "we finally had an excuse to do it." But it's the feedback from customers that pleases Taylor the most. "They come up to me and thank me for being open."

Factory Antique Mall, Verona Jason Brinkley, general manager

It's all in the numbers at America's largest antique mall: Situated in the Shenandoah Valley, the Factory Antique Mall just posted its best June in more than 20 years, including those with five weekends. The number of booths is even larger than pre-pandemic. And the in-mall café, Tasty Bites ("where happiness is homemade"), is operating at full capacity. Weekend sales are "strong," and activity during the week is showing gains as well. Because the mall did not close its doors, "we never lost our momentum," noted manager Jason Brinkley. Instead, he pushed forward, recognizing "you can't do it all yourself" and therefore relying on his staff. An emphasis on safety and customer service has paid off. An increased online presence includes a new website with "way more content." The only thing that looks different at the mall is the preponderance of face masks. "If you told me last year we'd be doing this, I'd have told you you were crazy," he concluded. "We can't wait to see our July figures."

Pennsylvania Gatchellville Store, Gatchellville Linda Sarubin, co-owner

Even though the Gatchellville Store has been open for only a handful of days (and for just three hours at a time), Linda Sarubin said business has been great. "I can't even believe it has been so good." Shoppers from as far away as New York

and Indiana have visited the old country store by appointment. Although buttons and sewing notions are her speciality, her husband has sold a number of guitars because "people are at home." Some shows at which they regularly exhibit have been canceled. Meanwhile, Sarubin has been "promoting the store like crazy on Facebook and Instagram." She mails purchases or leaves them on the store's porch with a basket for payment ("the honor system"). "For the past 17 years, we have given our customers personal attention, and that has served us well as the community tries to support us in return." It doesn't matter, she concluded, if someone is spending \$10 or \$1,000: "You have to have faith in who you're buying from."

A Stroll Down Memory Lane, Galeton Michelle Petito, Paula Hayes, owners

Plenty of fresh air, an abundance of natural beauty, and the ability to socially distance without thinking about it: Michelle Petito and Paula Hayes are grateful for their location in the mountains of Pennsylvania along Scenic Route 6. And "A Stroll Down Memory Lane," a vendor- and consignment-based multi-level store in Galeton, is doing a "booming" business, according to Petito. What's baffling is what's selling the best, she explained. "Last year, we couldn't sell a piece of glassware," even with sales designed "just to move it." This year, Depression glass ("all colors") is hot. Similarly, vintage pottery and floral-decorated plates and cups and saucers are being picked up ("I think they're for weddings"). One dealer has a "huge" collection of Pyrex, "priced to sell," and it's moving off the shelves. In one weekend, the store sold two enamel-top kitchen tables. But most curious is the popularity of character glasses featuring Elmer Fudd and friends. "You have to live one day at a time," she laughed.

Old Sled Works, Duncannon Laura Spease, manager

It's busy at the Old Sled Works these days, where business is "wonderful," sales are "terrific," and the dealers are "satisfied." In fact, there are no empty booths at the Duncannon mall, a fact that is remarkable considering the time of year and "what we've been through," according to manager Laura Spease. Why the success? "I don't know. I truly don't." Second-quarter figures for 2020 are better than those from 2019, she continued, even though the mall, located near Harrisburg, was closed for nearly two of those three months. People are buying a bit of everything, including vinyl records ("they're making a big comeback"). Anything mid-century modern is popular, as are bottles. At first, small pieces of furniture were being snapped up, but lately, even large pieces, including a Hoosier cabinet and a wardrobe, have been sold. "Everyday it's something different." Posting pictures of merchandise on Facebook has brought in a number of shoppers, many of whom are daytrippers to the mall. "People feel comfortable here."

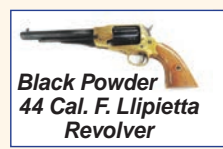
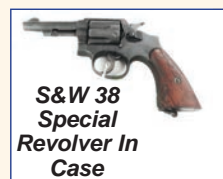
