# ompacts bring beauty to the collector

Compacts, portable vanity cases, typically containing mirror, face powder, and puffs, were popular from the early 1900s through the 1950s. Simple or swanky, all reflect women's eternal quest for beauty.

Wealthy Egyptians stored cosmetic oils, unguents, powdered minerals and kohl in luxurious glass, obsidian, or alabaster jars. Greeks kept theirs in wide-mouthed or narrow-bodied vessels. Upper-class Roman women stored kohl in decorative, double-tubed flasks, and their beeswax creams and lead-based whiteners in decorative glass, gold, or bone containers.

During the Middle Ages, women who enhanced their natural appearance were considered immoral. Yet some evidently brightened their faces and rouged their cheeks. Though the clergy continued to rage against "| painted ladies," 18th-century French beauties may have tucked bits of powder or rouge in their finger-rings for hush-hush touchups while out and about. Within a century, however, European attitudes towards cosmetic facial embellishments began to change.

Through the 1850s, some women smoothed their complexions or hid freckles with pastes or whitening powders purchased at apothecary shops. Others, more discreet, created lamp-black mascara, beeswax pomades, and rouge --- combining red powder produced from cochineal insect shells with French chalk (talc) — at home

Yet widespread disapproval continued. In 1860, for example, The Wisconsin Daily Patriot noted that "The use of toilet preparations, in the form of powder, paints, lotions, and other deleterious compounds, is becoming fearfully common, especially among young girls who have no sort of excuse for such an act of folly." Though similar sentiments prevailed well into the 1890s, newly-minted magazines, like The Ladies Home Journal and Women's Home Companion, offered an abundant supply of do-it-yourself formulas.

Attitudes changed when ready-made facial powders, balms, and lotions, like Pozzoni's Medicated Complexion Powder and Recamier Cream (an emollient applied at night), were marketed as healthful — free of lead, lime, arsenic, or any other dangerous matter.

As women joined the workforce at the turn of the century, many slipped powder or rouge in socially-acceptable lockets or chatelaine pendants for quick, on-the-go touchups. In time, enterprising five-and-dime stores carried round, hinged cases containing face powder, puffs, and mirrors. So did national mail-order houses, like Sears Roebuck & Co. Due to their small size, these containers became known as compacts.

As public preening became increasingly acceptable, the Cleopatra Vanity Box Company and the Scovill Manufacturing Company introduced bulky, loose-powder vanity boxes, marketing them as beauty aids. Though portable, they tended to be leaky and spilled.

## Federal period portraits painted a strong picture at Evans


MT. CRAWFORD, Va. — When Jeffrey S. Evans & Associates puts together an Americana event, one thing is guaranteed; quality. Over the years, Evans has created a safe haven for collectors to utilize when the time comes to down-size or disperse items gathered over a lifetime. And this past June 26-27 semi-annual Americana sale was no different.

Oh. Except for the pandemic, which apparently is not a negative factor where holding an online/absentee/phone bidding auction is concerned. Items included in this Evans-hosted, two-day event ranged from rare Virginia and other Southern material to 18th and 19th century formal and country furniture, American folk, fine, and decorative arts, as well as a fabulous American historical transfer-printed Staffordshire collection, stoneware, long rifles and textiles.

Of great interest and importance was the group of Brock Family (Madison Co. Virginia) folk art miniature portraits. Consisting of eight watercolor and pencil images on paper, the collection depicted Joseph and Agnes Brock and their six children; Susan, Elizabeth, Helen, Virginia, Anselm, and Malvina. Each portrait was waist-length and in profile. Some held flowers, the

youngest; Helen, held a doll. Each was identified with an inscription in the lower margin, and each were approximately 3¼ by 2 7/8 inches. All were unframed and together (along with a later 19th century Brock family leather photo album) commanded the sum of \$52,650.

Included in this lot's description were extensive notes detailing the popularity of profile portraits during the Federal period, the subsequent increase in demand



of Brock Family watercolor profile portraits on the open market represents a rare opportunity to acquire an intact, fresh-to-the-market group of Southern backcountry family portraiture from the Federal period by an as-yet unidentified individual hand."

## Little dogs carry a big bite of advertising power

James Buchanan founded James Buchanan & Company Ltd to manufacture Scotch whiskey. Buchanan's most famous brand was originally called "House of Commons," but due to its black and white labeling, the House of Commons brand was nicknamed "Black and White" and the name stuck. Buchanan designed the brand's label, featuring a black Scottish terrier and a white West Highland Terrier, in 1890, and Black & White Scotch Whiskey, as it is known today, was born.

Company legend reveals that after attending a dog show in London, Buchanan personally selected a black Scottie dog and a white Westie as mascots for his Black & White Scotch Whiskey. This pair of terriers became world famous as their images graced all Black & White advertising in the early 20th century.

Buchanan was born in Rockville, Ontario, in 1849, and less than 40 years later he owned his own whiskey company with Buchanan Blend serving as his flagship whiskey.

In November 1879, Buchanan moved to London and became an agent for Charles Mackinlay & Co, whiskey blenders. Buchanan quickly realized two things — he had a knack for making whiskey and all of England was an untapped market for bottled Scotch whiskey. Buchanan quit Mackinlay & Co. and Buchanan Blend became an overnight success, especially in the United States and in London, where members of the House of Commons sipped it. In honor of the House of Common members who drank his whiskey, Buchanan renamed the whiskey "House of Commons Finest Old Highland Whiskey." soon thereafter, drinkers began ordering that "Black and White" whiskey. In 1902 Buchanan officially changed the name of his whiskey to Black & White. By 1909, Black & White whiskey was the most popular whiskey in all of England.

During the 1920s, Black & White Whiskey began utilizing the black and white terriers more heavily in its advertising. Soon thereafter, the black and white terriers became the symbol for Black and White Scotch Whiskey.

Black & White Scotch Whiskey became a household name, and the black and white terriers captured the hearts of collectors—both drinking and non-drinking collectors. For nearly 125 years, Black & White has produced a continuing line of collectible signs, advertising, glassware, and ceramic figurines, all with the black and white terrier on them.

Some of the most valuable Black & White Scotch Whiskey collectible items are advertising posters. Posters for the company routinely are offered on eBay with some of the posters valued at \$1,400.

There is even a Black & White Scotch Whiskey mechanical advertising sign with Scottie dogs that bark. This sign has been offered on eBay for around \$200.

Terrier figurines are also highly prized collectibles. Some, such as the black and white Scottish terrier figurines produced in Rosenthal, Germany, circa 1940, bring as much as \$500 on today's secondary markets.

Several cast-iron versions of Black & White's Scottie dogs have been cast and offered for sale over the years. One set of figurines is the "Noir et Blanc" or Black and White Scottie Dogs that routinely sell for around \$60. These cast iron dogs make excellent doorstops.





mere 3¼ inches in diameter, this Cary's pocket terrestrial globe with its shagreen case brought \$8,775. The case was labeled on one half with a map entitled "The WORLD as it was known in CAESAR'S time / agreeable to D'Anville", on the other half with "A TABLE / of / Latitudes & Longitudes / of Places not given / on this / GLOBE".

Buchanan designed a striking black and white label for House of Commons whiskey, and very

Other artwork selling strong included a historical panoramic view of San Francisco, Calif., by George Henry Burgess (British-American, 1831-1905) which realized \$40,950. This watercolor and ink on paper image applied to a stretcher depicts a highly-detailed scene of the city by the bay in its infancy. Inscribed "San Francisco in 1850/From Head of Clay Street/Geo. H. Burgess/1868/ From sketch by Prendergast" the 14 ½ by 28 ½ inch framed image shows the bay filled with almost 100 sailing vessels.

A Boston canvaswork pictorial needlework panel made of wool and silk on linen sold for \$10,530. Completed in tent and moss stitching, the 16 3/8 by 11 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inches image shows a shepherd and shepherdess watching over their flock of sheep among a flower and tree-filled landscape.

Furniture offered included a circa 1780 New England Chippendale cherry miniature fall-front desk that realized \$11,700. Diminutive in size at 24 inches high, 22 ½ inches wide and 13 inches deep, this desk featured a dovetailed case and a hinged fallboard concealing a highly-developed interior including a carved shell prospect drawer.

A circa 1835 Ohio cherry chest of drawers with unusual outstanding carving surprised everyone selling for \$4,680 against an estimate of \$500 to \$800. Having full turned columns with ebonized detail, the carved elements included the owner's initials "WW", florals, cross-hatched banding, pinwheel designs, and stylized foliate devices to stiles.

The decorative items found at this June event were impressive. A Cincinnati Stove Workscast-iron figural trade sign of a Victorian lady wearing a top hat astride a leaping horse sold for \$15,210. "CINCINNATI/STOVE WORKS" was found on the saddle blanket with the manufacturer's mark "R/CIN IRON FDY./CIN., O,1903" on the reverse.

A 1791 Cary's pocket globe with shagreen

case was bid to \$8,775, while a labeled Ernest paint-decorated Civil War regulation infantry rope-tension snare drum at 16 inches high and 16 ½ inches in diameter made \$7,605. Earning the same final bid was the stamped "H.C. SMITH / ALEX A / D.C." Alexandria, Va., decorated stoneware 5-gallon jar with a bold, brushed cobalt floral vine decoration on the front with three, seven-petal vertical leaves on the reserve. And a Jose Formoso Reyes (1902-1980) Nantucket, Mass., purse basket having an oblong form with a bail handle dated 1967 commanded \$8,775.

Remote auctions being held during the COVID-19 pandemic continue to earn strong final sale totals with this Jeffrey S. Evans Americana event being no different. Consignors who might have had reservations about selling their collections during this unsettled time are finding it is instead ideal to put their things through an auction right now. As the times continue to be uncertain, it seems one thing is a given; selling via the online auction platform is not a risk.

Black & White Scotch Whiskey has produced serving pitchers, drinking glasses, tin trays, ashtrays, and many other collectible items over the years. Serving pitchers average about \$60 each, and tin trays from the 1950s, in good condition with clear images of the terriers, average \$80. While hardly anyone smokes anymore, ashtrays remain sought after collectibles. Black & White ashtrays often cost \$50 or more and seldom remain unsold when offered on Internet auction sites.

Not all black and white Scottie dog collectibles are associated with Black & White Scotch Whiskey. In fact, there are hundreds and hundreds

of Scottie dog collectibles that dog lovers collect every year that have nothing to do with whiskey. ## Living with the lack of conventions and trade shows isn't easy

As my regular readers know, I love going to conventions and trade shows, whether its comic books (not to mention regular books), antiques, trading cards, toys, video games, or records. You name the place and time, and if I can make it, I'll be there. Which is one reason 2020 has been such a bummer.

Most of the shows I had planned to attend this year have been cancelled (I don't need to tell you why), though I did visit a small record convention recently. I went to the DFW Record Show in the afternoon after the place had cleared out, and I felt safe doing so. Social distancing was no problem, and everyone was wearing masks. Hand sanitizer and gloves were available as well.

Despite the fact that the show had been going on for several hours, I did manage to find some deals, including a stack of LPs in excellent condition for a buck a piece. The stack included such artists as George Jones, Elvis Presley, Tanya Tucker, Bachman Turner Overdrive, and Willie Nelson-stuff I can put in my antique booth and easily sell for \$4 or \$5 each (more for Elvis).

I also bought a bunch of factory sealed special edition DVDs priced at two for \$5 in a big box under a table. Really cool stuff that I was surprised was still there. I'll put most of the DVDs in my antique booth, but I did save four for my collection: Alice's Restaurant (featuring Arlo Guthrie), Sid & Nancy (a bio pic on Sid Vicious), John & Yoko's Year of Peace, and Grateful Dawg (with the Grateful Dead's Jerry Garcia). Yes, even if you arrive at a show that's been going for hours, you can often still find bargains, especially if you're willing to look under tables and dig through boxes.

There is one show left for this year that I have on my schedule that has yet to be cancelled. It's the Houston Arcade Expo, taking

place Nov. 14-15 and featuring a vendor's have a fun yet smaller show. We'll follow room and arcade and console games set on free play. If things go as planned, I'll drive down from Fort Worth where I live to be an exhibitor, panelist, and guest author.

I reached out to the promoter, Keith Christensen, for an update on the show and the possibility of its cancellation. We talked a little history as well.

BRETT WEISS: Did you grow up around video games and arcades?

KEITH CHRISTENSEN: As a child of the '70s and '80s. I grew up with video games and pinball. It started with the home TV Pong games, moved to the Atari 2600, and then the TRS 80 color computer. Playing at the local arcades was a rite of passage. I still have many of the games I played in my youth in my collection.

WEISS: When was the first Houston Arcade Expo, and how did it come about? Are you the sole owner?

CHRISTENSEN: I was hosting parties at my house and having a blast. I started having kids, so the partying at my house stopped. I got with my buddy Callan Hendricks in 2002 and hosted a party at a club where I used to do sound called Fitzgerald's. I worked out a deal with the owner and did the first two shows there. After that, we moved to hotels, and the show became a multi-day event.

WEISS: What separates the Houston Arcade Expo from similar events?

CHRISTENSEN: It has more of a party atmosphere and is much more laid back. We treat everyone like family!

WEISS: As far as I know, all other gaming shows from April to the present have been cancelled because of Covid-19. How confident are you that Houston will happen as scheduled?

CHRISTENSEN: It's basically a gamble. I'm going to revisit the situation mid-October to check the numbers and see. We are not going to take any risks and are planning to



CDC guidelines for social distancing, and masks and hand sanitizer will be available. No entry without a mask.

WEISS: What would have to happen for the show to get cancelled? I assume it would be a decree from the city, but what specifically would have to happen? Covid numbers not going down? Something from the governor? Are large gatherings of people currently not allowed?

CHRISTENSEN: If things do not look safe for us to have the show, we will not have it, regardless of what anyone says. If the numbers go through the roof it is not worth it. However, if the Covid numbers are within CDC specs and the reproductive rate is below one, with the right precautions we can do it. If we have to, we'll postpone the show to the second weekend in November of 2021, and all tickets and vendor booths will transfer to next year's show.

WEISS: If the show gets cancelled, would you consider a virtual convention?

CHRISTENSEN: Since the Houston show is more about the people who attend and their energy coupled with the games and experience, I don't think it would translate well. Other, more structured shows have pulled it off, though.

WEISS: Anything else you care to share about the Houston Arcade Expo?

CHRISTENSEN: This show will always be a labor of love for everyone involved with putting it on. Our goal is not to be the biggest show in the land, but the most fun and engaging show we can have for us and all the attendees. I want to thank everyone who has helped put it on, including my wife Tina. Peace and arcades!



### Compacts

This problem was resolved in 1915, when Pozzoni's portable, metal, lozenge-shaped, Boodle Box reached the market. In addition to including rouge, it replaced loose powder with blocks of no-leak, no-spill compressed powder. Moreover, the attractive Boodle Box initiated a new industry — manufacturing metal cosmetic containers in an array of appealing finishes, shapes and sizes.

When stars of the silver screen, like Theda Bara, May Pickford and Gloria Swanson, popularized daring, dramatic, made-up allure, cosmetic compacts became musthaves. Everyone wanted to look like a celebrity.

The compact craze soared during the Roaring Twenties, when making-up was a la mode. Scores of bobbed-hair flappers partied with celluloid or Bakelite wristlet, finger-chain, or tango-chain compacts at hand. Some preferred pendant compacts, or sleek, stylish Art Deco ones glittering with gemstones. Others cached trendy red-and-black Oriental-inspired creations, or obelisk, sphinx, or pyramid-shaped compacts, inspired by the recent discovery of King Tutankhamen's fabulous tomb, in their pouches.

As compacts became more popular, the Zinn Corporation, like many other metal-case manufacturers, provided scores of unbranded, empty models to mail order houses, perfumeries and cosmetic companies, who filled them with their own products. Other companies, including Stratton, Volupté, Evans, and Elgin American, created name brands. Some, in addition to slots for mirror, rouge and powder, left space for personal items like coin holders or note pads.

During the Depression, flat, roomy, round, "flapjack" compacts were all the rage. Though initially designed for dressing table use, they were soon seen outdoors as well. When small, chic, inexpensive models replaced "flapjacks," middle- class women often purchased several, suiting them to attire or desire. Over time, compacts became not only practical fashion accessories, but also personal statements. Ready-made round, oblong, square, or seashell-shaped metallic models were particularly popular. Flower images were also perennial favorites.

Well-to-dos, however, often preferred prestigious silver, mother-of-pearl, tortoise-shell, enamel, gold, or platinum bejeweled beauties by fine jewelers like Cartier, Hermes, Boucheron, Cartier, Tiffany, or Van Cleef & Arpels. Some of these, in addition to powder, rouge and mirrors, contained lipstick holders, space for cigarettes, and netting to prevent powder blocks from popping out. Some, fashioned like suitcases, gift boxes, envelopes, globes, or grand pianos, were amusing conversation-stoppers. Others featured match-

ing evening bags, lipstick cases, and combs. Exclusive, commissioned compacts, however, came in any shape, size, and design imaginable.

As motorcar, rail, and overseas travel increased, inexpensive compacts, marking vacation spots from Yellow Stone National Park to Paris, made enviable gifts and souvenirs. Others commemorated noted events like the 1939 New York World's Fair, or depicted historic monuments.

During World War II servicemen often sent inexpensive, patriotic-themed, enameled "sweetheart" compacts to loved ones back home. Afterward, when plastics were re-purposed for civilian use, lightweight acrylics, first used in aircraft turrets, duplicated costly, handmade models. As a result, compact design, like cosmetic packaging in general, became more elaborate, sophisticated, and affordable.

Through the 1950s, quality compacts were still produced, by Stratton and Kigu, among others. Yet when leading companies, like Helena Rubenstein and Max Factor, marketed refillable or disposable models, and longer-lasting make-up meant women could touchup less often, compact use waned. Finally, when the "natural look" became fashionable, they were relegated to bottom bureau drawers.

Since so many vintage compacts have survived, collectors often concentrate on particular brand names or ones from particular eras. Some seek models in certain shapes and styles. Some collect only engraved, Lucite, or petit point pieces. Others seek compacts reflecting a personal interest, be it ballet, boating, butterflies, or bird watching.


Whatever a compact's age or style, its condition is paramount. Though a scratched, rusted, dinged, dented, or discolored model may be a no-go, minimal damage, say some, increases its charm. Still, others prefer unused models, especially those that include original powder cases, puffs, sifters, mirrors, and packaging.

Today, these delightful collectibles may be found at antique shops, flea markets, estate sales, and at auction. Simple ones are generally quite affordable. Rare, unusual, or exceptional solid gold or sterling silver pieces by exceptional jewelers, on the other hand, generally command exceptional prices.

Due to their quality and beauty, vintage compacts make memorable anniversary, birthday, or any-day gifts. Heart-shaped and bright enameled Italian ones are especially romantic.




Above: Vintage Yardley Powder Compact with mirror and pressed powder mesh, UK. Courtesy BeeBeeVintageUk at www.etsy.com
