Schwinn pedaled through history with quality bikes

For many 20th century American children, an early sense of freedom came with riding a Schwinn bicycle. Millions have memories of riding along leafy hometown streets to the corner store, or to a friend's house, or just around the block on a Schwinn bike. For many, the Schwinn name alone is enough to conjure a cascade of memories of cycling home from school or on summer days and enjoying the range and speed of travel which a bicycle offers to its rider. For decades, Schwinn was the premier American bicycle manufacturer, its bikes famous for their craftsmanship and lasting quality.

Ignaz Schwinn was born in Hardheim, Baden, Germany in 1860. A mechanical engineer, in the 1880s he worked in a machine shop producing parts for pennyfarthing bicycles. Ignaz immigrated to the United States in 1891, and after working for various American bike firms, in 1895 founded the Arnold, Schwinn & Company in Chicago with investor Adolph Frederick William Arnold, to manufacture bicycles.

The establishment of Schwinn coincided with a bicycle boom in America. The production of bicycles in the U.S. grew to one million units per year, and by 1900 the bicycle market was saturated. In 1905 bike sales had collapsed to 25 percent of what they had been in 1900. Amidst this competition, Arnold sold his share in the firm to Ignaz and went on his way. Ignaz bought several other bicycle makers, and had a production plant constructed on Chicago's East Side. At this stage, of perhaps 300 American bike manufacturers, about a dozen remained. Schwinn expanded into motorcycle production after forming Excelsior-Henderson, and became the third largest motorcycle producer behind Indian and Harley-Davidson.

The Depression put an end to Excelsior-Henderson, and Schwinn teetered on bankruptcy. Ignaz's son Frank W, vice president of Schwinn, took over daily operations and focused the company on bicycle production. Gathering ideas for a simple, cheap, solid-selling bicycle while on a trip to Europe, Frank developed the Schwinn B-10E Motorbike, later called the Streamline Aerocycle. This was a kid's bike designed to look like a motorcycle, with a faux fuel tank, balloon tires, fenders, headlight and a pushbutton bell. The Aerocycle helped the company weather the Depression.

Schwinn began sponsoring teams for six-day races across the country. This led to the introduction of the Paramount series in 1938, a range of racing bikes. These were made of high-tensile chrome-molybdenum steel alloy tubing. A Paramount went to 108.92 mph behind a car on Highway 99 in Bakersfield, Calif., on May 17, 1941 — a speed record. The bike was ridden by French cyclist Alfred Letourneur.

In 1941, Schwinn sold 1.8 million bicycles. Frank W Schwinn, in his book Fifty Years of Schwinn-Built Bicycles: The Story of the Bicycle and its Contributions to Our Way of Life, explained: "At the beginning of World War II, Americans fearful of the rationing of tires and fuel for their motor cars called for bicycles and more bicycles. Arnold, Schwinn & Company, working day and night, achieved the record production of its history." Soon Schwinn devoted its factory operations to the war effort, and from 1942-45 manufactured its Defense models – utilitarian bikes devoid of accessories. Schwinn received the Army and Navy "E" Award for excellence in the production of materiel.

Schwinn issued a catalog in 1946 which featured movie stars. These spokespeople, all shown in photos posing with Schwinn bikes, included Joan Crawford, Bob Hope, Humphrey Bogart, Lauren Bacall, Bing Crosby, Barbara Stanwyck, Alan Ladd, Roy Rogers and others. However, the importation of European bicycles was growing and continued to expand into the 1950s. The European bikes were lighter than most American-made models, and so were favored by U.S. buyers. Schwinn countered this trend by introducing its middleweight range.

By 1950, one in four bikes sold in America was a Schwinn. The Schwinn marketing team convinced bicycle retailers to exclusively sell Schwinn bikes, and created its authorized dealer network. Authorized dealers were trained in repairs, parts, maintenance and on selling points. To be an authorized Schwinn dealer was a seal of quality which earned the trust of shoppers.

In 1957 Schwinn enlisted Clint Walker, star of the ABC TV series *Cheyenne*, to advertise the Corvette in its catalog. Through these years, Schwinn quality and the fact that the bikes were made in America were emphasized in their ads.

In the 1960s the company worked assertively to dominate the market for child and youth bicycles. Schwinn had been sponsoring the children's TV show *Captain Kangaroo* since 1958, and had its bicycles promoted on the program. Frank W died in 1963, and Frank Valentine Schwinn took over. By this time, designer Al Fritz had heard about California kids modifying their bicycles to make them look like motorbikes. By installing high-rise handlebars and banana seats, the bikes were meant to emulate chopper-style motorcycles. Fritz decided to create a bicycle

While many incredible pieces will hit the auction block, select items from the hotel are historically priceless and have been carefully preserved for future display in the hotel upon reopening. A best-in-class team of preservationists working on the restoration of Waldorf Astoria New York thoroughly analyzed the contents of the hotel and identified key historical artifacts. Notable items like the Spirit of Achievement statue that graces the Park Avenue entrance, the 1893 World's Fair Clock which anchors the central lobby, acclaimed American composer Cole Porter's 1907 Steinway grand piano, a John F. Kennedy Rocking Chair, and more have all been carefully analyzed, conserved, and restored for future generations to enjoy.

"We are grateful for the continued generosity of our neighbor and fellow landmark Waldorf Astoria New York," said Carole Bailey French, President of St. Bartholomew's Conservancy and named a Living Landmark by the New York Landmarks Conservancy in 2019. When it reopens, the full block property will include 375 condominium residences in The Towers of the Waldorf Astoria and 375 keys in the Waldorf Astoria New York hotel.

George Jensen bracelet appears to be increasing in value

I have a Georg Jensen silver bracelet set with a few small, oval blue stones. My husband purchased the bracelet for me in Florida several years ago. There are several markings on the back of one of silver floret pieces: "18 S / DENMARK / [circle of dots inside of which is '830'] / [circle of 23 dots inside of which is "GEORG" in an arch at the top and "JENSEN" in a reverse arch at the bottom]. I am thinking of giving it to my 16-year old granddaughter. What are your thoughts?



A First, thank your husband for his generosity and good judgment. Second, do not give the bracelet to your 16-year old grand-daughter. Third, keep the bracelet and wear it.

Your bracelet is a hidden gem. The story behind it reveals how the approach to costume jewelry has changed over the years.

The Georg Jensen No. 18 bracelet was made beginning around 1915 and remained in production into the 1950s. Age is a value factor and easily determined by the markings on the

The 1893 Danish Hallmarking Act set a silver standard of 826 parts out of 1,000. The Sterling standard is 925 parts silver per 1,000. The balance is made up of copper and other minerals designed to strengthen the silver. Around 1915, the Danish Hallmarking Act was revised and the silver content raised to 830. Georg Jensen did not switch to the sterling standard until 1927, albeit he made some earlier pieces designed for export to America in 925 silver.

Georg Jensen used the oval circular bead mark between 1915 and 1930. It could contain between 19 and 25 beads. Your mark contains 23 beads. Starting in 1944, Georg Jensen used a similar mark. By this time, Jensen used 925 silver.

Based on the information above, your bracelet was made between 1915 and 1927. Being conservative in my dating approach (not every example is made in year one), I date the bracelet between the early to mid-1920s.

WorthPoint.com has multiple listings for the Jensen No. 18 bracelet. Recent sell through prices on eBay are \$595 (Nov. 23, 2019), \$587 (June 13, 2018), \$399.88 (Jan. 12, 2017), \$271.88 (Oct. 10, 2016), and \$363 (August 18, 2016). The obvious conclusion is that buyer interest in the bracelet seems to be increasing each year; and, it is reflected in a steady price increase.

A Ruby Lane seller currently is offering a "Georg Jensen Arts and Crafts Bracelet No. 18 for \$950." This size is 7 3/8-inches long. It is marked "Sterling / Denmark / 925 / 18 / [conjoined "CJ"]." The conjoined "CJ" mark dates from 1933 to 1944. The \$950 dealer asking price is in marked contrast to the sell through prices on eBay. Buyers seeking an example would save money if they had patience and were willing to watch for the bracelet on other secondary sale sites.

A viable secondary market value for your Georg Jensen No. 18 bracelet, based on its early production markings, is between \$650 and \$700.

I purchased a cedar chest at a yard sale. It is a generic, rectangular cedar box design. Inside the lid is a label from the West Branch Novelty Company of Milton, Pa. I am curious to know what year the cedar chest was made.



F.S. Chapin, George C. Chapin, H. R. Frick, and Marshall Reid founded the West Branch Novelty Company in 1893. Initially, the company made bamboo furniture. Within a few years, the company was the largest single importer of bamboo in the United States.

By 1913, West Branch Novelty Company cedar chests became the most financially successful product line. Production of bamboo furniture ceased following the end of the first World War. After that, production focused only on the manufacturing of cedar chests.

The cedar came from the southern states. Hard veneer woods used on design-style chests came from Africa, Asia, Australia and other countries. Although West Branch Novelty Company cedar chests were sold worldwide, the principal market was the United States east of the Mississippi River. Department stores were the primary retail outlet.

The West Branch Novelty Company made cedar chests into the 1950s. I was unable to find information on the internet as to when the company ceased operations.

The company made two basic types of cedar chests. The first is a generic six-sided chest that consisted only of



cedar. This is what you own. The second is a cedar-lined chest whose exterior is a stylistic interpretation of earlier furniture design styles such as Tudor, William and Mary, Chippendale, Hepplewhite, and Spanish.

The type face and design of the label on the lid of your chest suggests a manufacturing date in the late 1940s or early 1950s. The late 1930s is a possibility, but a remote one.

I know you have no interest in the secondary market value, but I could not resist doing a "Sale Date" search on WorthPoint.com. I was surprised to find that the design-style chests from the 1920s through the 1940s are experiencing a strong secondary market with sell through prices above \$250 to \$300 as standard fare. Generic examples sell through for close to \$100.

I purchased a children's porcelain tea set that belonged to a woman who was approximately 80 years old. The set had previously belonged to her aunt. The set has three cups, six saucers, six plates, creamer, sugar bowl, and teapot. The teapot has style elements on the lid, handle, and spout similar to those found on RS Prussia children's tea sets but no decoration. I do not really care what it is worth. I just wonder if it is RS Prussia in origin. –

A In 1869, Reinhold Schlegelmilch established a porcelain factory in Suhl, Germany. In 1893, Reinhold began exporting dinnerware and other porcelain to the United States. When the U.S. Tariff Act of 1894 lowered the duties on decorated porcelain, Reinhold increased the exportation of tablewares between five and ten times. His sons Ehrhard and Arnold joined the firm.

Ehrhard succeeded his father as the head of Reinhold Schlegelmilch in 1899. The firm continued to update its mold and decorative patterns, focusing heavily on Art Nouveau styles. The use of decals (decalcomanias) began around 1900.

American tastes shifted around 1905 to simpler form. Cheap Japanese imports gained market strength. The use of the "R.S. Prussia" trademark ended in the early 1910s.

The 1891 McKinley Tariff Act required that goods imported into the United States be marked with their country of origin. It did not require every piece to be marked. In some cases a mark on the packing crate was enough to satisfy the Act's requirements.

Firms such as Richard Schlegelmilch did not have an endless supply

of shape molds. Diversity was created by varying the decorative patterns placed on the shapes. The result is that collectors develop shape vocabularies to identify unmarked pieces. This requires a study of marked pieces. Manufacturers often knocked off rivals' shapes. Often the design change requires a sophisticated eye to spot.

Fortunately, there are an abundance of R. S. Prussia and children's tea set reference books. They are out-of-print but available on the secondary market or through interlibrary loan. Your mission, should you choose to accept it, is to acquire these reference books and start paging through them.

If you get lucky, you will be able to identify the "exact" shape that is found on your children's set. The match needs to be exact. There are no apple/orange matches in the antiques business.

My best guess is that your children's tea set is not RS Prussia in origin. The form shapes appear to be too simple. Also, if the porcelain is thick, chances are it is not RS Prussia. RS Prussia bodies are extremely thin.



Declaration of Independence copy sparks \$30,000 bid at auction



DALLAS - A copy of the Declaration of Independence that was published by The Democratic Press publisher John Binns sold for \$30,000 to lead Heritage Auctions' Americana & Political Auction to \$1,182,076 Sept. 14-15.

"Rare and unusual pieces, items that don't often come to market, did very well in this sale," Heritage Auctions Americana Director Curtis Lindner said. "The fact that almost 1,500 people bid in this auction and the prices realized throughout proves that the demand for such items remains very high."

The final price was nearly four times the pre-auction estimate for the Declaration of Independence: John Binns Version Published in 1819, an engraved broadside facsimile of the Declaration of Independence with medallions of seals of the 13 original colonies forming a decorative oval surrounding the

text. At the top are medallion portraits of founding fathers John Hancock, George Washington and Thomas Jefferson, above which is an eagle with shield, olive branch, and arrows holding a streamer reading "E Pluribus Unum." A Philadelphia journalist and publisher of The Democratic Press, Binns was one of the first to realize, in June of 1816, the potential market for a "splendid and correct copy of the Declaration of Independence, with facsimiles of all the signatures, the whole to be encircled with the arms of the thirteen States and of the United States" (as described in his solicitation for subscribers).

An daguerreotype of John Sutter, which also carried a pre-auction estimate of \$8,000, presents the man who, along with James Marshall, accidentally discovered gold in California, sparking a stampede to the West Coast of people hoping to strike it rich. As it turns out, neither had much wealth at the time of his death, but their names will be linked forever with one of the most well-known events in American history. It also sold for \$30,000.

A Samuel Tilden Portrait Flag sparked competitive bidding that drove the final price to \$27,500, nearly five times its pre-auction estimate, for one of just two known examples of the historical relic. Also doubling its estimate was an Antebellum 28-Star "Texas" Flag, which brought a winning bid of \$20,000, while a Roosevelt & Fairbanks: Wonderful "Roos-e-Field" Jugate, perhaps the first ever brought to auction, found a new home at \$18,750, the same amount spent for a Lyndon B. Johnson Civil Rights Act Bill Signing Pen.

Historical curiosities were extremely popular among bidders, including a Franklin D. Roosevelt wheelchair he used in Hot Springs, Ark., that nearly tripled its estimate when it closed at \$17,500. Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow sometimes eluded prosecution by eating what was caught with the contents of Barrow's tackle box which more than tripled its estimate at \$15,625, and a Western Union Thomas A. Edison Stock Ticker Tape Machine drew nearly two dozen bids before finishing at \$15,000.

modeled after the choppers, a work initially called Project J-38. This resulted in the famous Sting-Ray bike, introduced in June 1963.

The Sting-Ray had tires ideal for skidding and burning out, and the small-diameter wheels combined with the high-rise handlebars were conducive to popping wheelies and jumping on and off curbs. Once kids saw the bikes, sales began to soar. By the end of 1963 Schwinn had sold 45,000 Sting-Rays, and struggled to keep up with the demand. During this boom, Schwinn sold one million bikes in 1968, and Sting-Ray sales increased into 1970.

An evolution of the Sting-Ray, the Schwinn Krate appeared in 1968. The debut models were the Orange Krate, the Lemon Peeler and the Apple Krate. The Krates had spring-suspension front forks, a front brake "for extra stopping power," and an ingenious stick-shift lever mounted on the top tube of the frame to shift the Krate through its five gears. In 1969 came the Pea Picker, 1970 brought the Cotton Picker, and in 1971 the Grey Ghost came out. The Krates, with their automotive-like stick shift and slick "drag racing" rear tire. were the equivalent in bicycle terms of the American muscle car. Schwinn produced these souped-up Sting-Rays until 1973.

Schwinn had brought out the Varsity and the Continental in 1960, 8-10-speed bikes which were a response to the multi-geared European bicycles sold on the American market. By 1972, Schwinn's bikes meant for sport and speed, due to their heaviness were losing ground. Buyers were drawn to lighter frames with aluminum components, and the elimination of "clunky" features such as kickstands. The Schwinn Varsity, for instance, was as much as 40 percent heavier than some of the 10-speed imports.

Schwinn sold 1.5 million bikes in 1974, but was falling behind European and Japanese makers in technology. As a result, Schwinn didn't dominate the 10-speed sport bike boom of the early 1970s, when the bicycle outsold the car in America

Despite Schwinn faltering in the struggle against the foreign market, in the early '70s Schwinn was producing 6,000 bicycles per day. The demand was so great most of those units were sold before they left the factory. A drawback was that quality control began to slip under the strain of the demand. Schwinn did make up for this partially by rebranding some Japanese import sport bikes as Schwinns. Though low-cost, these were quality bicycles. Schwinn then expanded its range of rebranded Japanese sport bikes in the low, mid and upper range of quality and price.

Schwinn entered bicycle motocross (BMX) manufacture in 1977, and developed this line into the 1980s. But

due to being slow off the mark, Schwinn only managed to acquire a modest percentage of the BMX market. Schwinn also didn't capitalize on the mountain bike concept which came out of Northern California in the late 1970s. The company produced a couple of mountain bike models, but was soon passed up by the competition.

Edward R Schwinn took over in 1979, a time when Schwinn had fallen behind competitors from Japan and Taiwan which constantly upgraded to new technologies and materials. Schwinn was selling one million bikes per year in the late '70s, but these were mostly children's bikes; the adult bike market was being lost to the competition. The company turned to importing more Asian-made bikes and selling them under the Schwinn name. During these times, Schwinn emphasized its AirDyne stationary exercise bike. It also opened a Greenville, Miss., plant and closed the antiquated Chicago factory in 1982.

The company transferred its frame design and manufacture to Giant Bicycles of Taiwan, focused on mountain bikes, and by 1985 was competitive again, selling half a million bikes annually. This grew to nearly one million in the later 1980s, but a disagreement with Giant led that maker to produce and market bikes under its own name. Unable to compete in the early 1990s by assembling bikes domestically, Schwinn sought to import more from the Orient, and closed the Greenville factory in 1991. Despite these moves, Schwinn went bankrupt in 1992.

Pacific Cycle acquired Schwinn at an auction in 2001. Pacific Cycle was then acquired by Dorel Industries in 2004. Dorel launched an advertising campaign in 2010 to reinvigorate the Schwinn name, relying on the latter's heritage and the affection which millions felt for original Schwinn bikes. Focusing on these attributes, Dorel released a reissue of the Sting-Ray which turned out to be immensely popular.

Today the economy range of Schwinn bikes is sold through retail chain stores, while the higher-end line is marketed through the company website and in specialty shops. Schwinn veterans will be happy to know that, besides the Schwinn brand name, these bicycles carry favorable ratings.

In recent auctions, a restored 1968 Orange Krate closed for \$1,800, a 1950s Paramount Racer went for \$1,750, a 1966 3-speed Speedster sold for \$275, and a 1966 2-speed Typhoon fell under the hammer for \$575. Meanwhile a 1969 Sting-Ray went for \$561, a 1969 Pea Picker Krate sold for \$1,800, and an Apple Krate auctioned for \$1,995. Looking at earlier bikes, a 1941 D97XE realized \$1,125, a 1946 DX Ballooner Tank sold for \$499, and a 1948 B 607 Deluxe Autocycle realized \$1,500. The foregoing represent some of the higher values of vintage Schwinns; many examples can be acquired for substantially less.
