Casino chip collectors gamble on hobby

Most die-hard poker players regard the cities of Las Vegas and Reno as the original gambling meccas. After all, gambling in the U.S. began in Nevada in 1931.

There are now 18 states with commercial casinos, filled with card and dice tables with throngs of gamblers tossing colorful chips on the felt tables. And each casino has its own embossed design on these chips, a form of trademark if you will. Nothing advertises a casino quite like the casino chip.

The casino chip (which is made of either clay or ceramic) appeals to our most basic senses – it feels good to the touch, the sounds of chips clacking around a tournament floor is downright pacifying, and the colorful nature of the different denominations appeals to our basic instincts of sights.

The world of casino chips is broad, deep and fascinating on all levels and in the past 15 years there is an increase in the number of chip collectors who are buying, selling and trading these 1.5-inch diameter money tokens.

Collectors are particularly attracted to chips from the heyday of casinos, the glamorous era of Las Vegas, Reno and Atlantic City after World War II. To be more specific, collectors of these chips concentrate on famous hotel casinos that are now defunct. Collecting casino chips from as many different casinos as possible is the goal of many collectors, while others prefer ones with a historical connection to them.

"Two recent developments have fueled collector interest in casino chips," says Archie Black, founder and president of the Casino Chip & Gaming Tokens Collectors Club (CCGTCC). "Every time a new gaming jurisdiction opens up, the people from that area become instant chip collectors. The second reason may be evident to anyone who's visited a casino in the past few years. New computer-aided design capabilities, laser-etching technologies and manufacturing techniques

now allow manufacturers to produce chips with beautiful full-color designs and photographs."

Most casinos now regularly issue limited editions of chips to commemorate casino events. Examples of past chips issued include a George Foreman fight chip from the MGM Grand in Las Vegas, a George Burns 100th birthday chip from Caesars Palace, a Luciano Pavarotti chip from Foxwoods in Connecticut and Resorts International in Atlantic City, and a Kentucky Derby chip from the Tropicana in Las Vegas and in Atlantic City.

"These commemorative chips are 'live' and can be used at the gaming tables, though they're usually snapped up by collectors within days of their issue," Black said. Chips from casinos that have gone out of business, like the Playboy Club in Atlantic City or the Dunes in Las Vegas, are most desirable.

Sands Hotel and Casino, for instance, was a historic hotel and casino on the Las Vegas Strip in Nevada that operated from 1952 to 1996. The Sands was the seventh resort to open on the Strip. During its heyday, the Sands was the center of entertainment, and hosted many famous entertainers of the day, most notably stars like Jerry Lewis and the "Rat Pack", which included Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis Jr., Peter Lawford and Joey Bishop.

Another example is El Rancho Vegas, which opened in 1941 and closed its doors in 1960. Chips from this old hot spot evoke a particular nostalgia.

The Silver Slipper operated from 1950 to 1988. In April 1964, the casino became the first in Nevada to be shut down on cheating charges. Agents raided the Silver Slipper for using "flat" dice and for having other rigged games. In 1968, the casino was purchased by businessman Howard Hughes for \$5.4 million.

The Dunes opened in 1955 and closed its doors in 1993. It

was the 10th resort to open on the Strip. Bellagio now stands on the former grounds.

The Golden Goose was a casino located on 20 Fremont Street in downtown Las Vegas. It was among the most popular casinos on the Strip at that time. It opened in 1975 and closed in 1991. During a convention of the Casino Chip & Gaming Tokens Collectors Club in 2014, a \$5 chip from the Golden Goose sold for \$75,000 at auction.

Boone County Treasure Hunt brought out shoppers

LEBANON, Ind. — "This is pig-out time for antique advertising collectors," said one patron, while walking onto the Boone County, Ind. Fairgrounds for two days of shopping Sept. 25 -26 with a 350-piece evening auction on the final day.

Known as "The Boone County Treasure Hunt," the twice per year event, near Indianapolis, drew dealers and collectors from coast to coast in the U.S. and even some from Canada.

"The show is for serious collectors," said promoter Joe Cancholla, adding, "Dealers here offer 'the best of the best'



for a discriminating crowd of buyers." He added that "a significant number of dealers and shoppers wore masks at the event and practiced social distancing" while following current pandemic guidelines.

Collectors drawn to American Indian themes crowded into the booth of Otto Dorris of Bixby, Okla. They checked out his colorful 30-by- 8-inch self-framed tin 1899 Wyandotte Cleanser advertising sign featuring a full-size Indian hunter with bow and arrow cocked into firing position. It could hang on your wall for \$6,000. Still others "oohed and ahhed" over a 16-inch-tall Indian offering an Admira- by Kerry Peel of Auburn, Ind. tion Cigar priced at \$850.

You could have your choice of two early 1900s porcelain advertising soda pop syrup dispensers offered by Bill Prock of Prock's Crocks and Antiques, Springbrook, Wis. Either Almond Flash or Dixie Flip could vend "your flavor" for \$15,000 each. Prock said he had 10 more dispensers at his shop, priced from \$800 to \$4,500 each.

Looking for a restored cast-iron 12-by 20-inch Railway Express strongbox? You could find one for \$1,495 at the booth of Tim and Leevona Blair of Keeper's Antiques, Harrisonville, Mo. Watching over their booth, was the couples friendly 2- year-old poperanian dog, Oliver, who Leevona

said "keeps an eye on everything."

"Tm not a collector — I tear down buildings for a living and find stuff too cool to throw away," said Ed Marzec of Hammond, Ind. Among his finds was a 1930-40s 24-inchlong advertising display showing full sample glass containers from Standard Oil of Indiana. It's thought to have been used in a school tech class, and was priced at \$650 at the show.

This was the first time to set up as dealers after shopping at the show in the past for Janet Purcell and family from Herrin, Ill. Among their offerings was a 30-inch-tall tin and wood construction early 1900s "Goo-Goo Goodies" penny operated vending machine that was "found 25 years



Button Power explores 125 years of 'saying it with buttons'

And now, the joy of pin-back buttons is celebrated in a new book, Button Power: 125 Years of Saying It with Buttons. Lavishly illustrated with color images, Button Power is the result of a collaboration between Chicago-based Christen Carter (a lifelong button aficionado, the proprietor of the only museum dedicated to pin-backs, and herself the producer of "millions and millions" of buttons) and Ted Hake (founder of Hake's Auctions in York, Pennsylvania, and described by someone who knows as the "alpha and omega of pop culture"). So much for their bona fides. Below: New this month, Button Power is an

entertaining (and educational) history of pin-back buttons, "the greatest fad of all."





Whereas Hake is primarily interested in what he called the "history aspect," Carter is fascinated with pin-back buttons as a "communication device." All the same, Hake said that the two were able to blend their

differences in backgrounds and points of view to produce this first-of-its-kind book (although Hake once published a catalog-style book, in which he "tried to show every single button").

Their decision to make tough choices and to opt for color rather than black and white makes all the difference. Beginning with 4,000 favorite buttons, the pair narrowed it down to 2,000, Hake recalled, and then to the 1,500 finalists. Somehow, it all makes sense, thanks in large part to employing 12 different categories. History buffs will enjoy seeing, among other examples, the earliest known dated button, that being from a May 1896 meeting of the Indiana State Medical Society.

and to understand the popularity of pin-back button collecting, beginning in 1896 and continuing to this day. Originally, they were handed out for free, courtesy of advertisers and politicians, thereby making pin-back buttons accessible to all. "Almost overnight, they replaced the tradecard," Hake noted, as early enthusiasts spent their evenings admiring their finds and organizing them in scrapbooks. "The novelty took the country by storm." To this date, every four years, thanks to presidential elections, there is a re-energized surge of interest.

ceptions, Hake pointed out that "if you can afford to collect anything, you can afford a button." As for what makes one button more desirable than another, he suggested "color, graphics, and rarity," although personal taste is the ultimate decider. Asked if there is anything that has not been portrayed on a button, Hake provided a detailed explanation of a rather graphic illustration. Suffice it to say that the answer to this question is a decided "no."

Perusing Button Power, with a release date of Oct. 13, it's easy to get caught up in the authors' enthusiasm

ago in an old grocery store." Said to be perhaps the only one known, it could vend sweet treats for you for one penny – plus \$14,000. At the same spot, a countertop penny-operated 1930s Steeple Chase Horse Racing gambling machine was priced at a modest \$975.

Gas station advertising collectors swarmed the booth of Kerry Peel from Auburn, Ind., to check out his large selection of antique pump top glass globes priced from \$300 to \$700 each. Advertising clock collectors admired his 1940-50s light-up glass 28-inch-diameter round neon Eagle Stamps clock with "spinner dial" that could

keep time for you for \$2,000. A pristine 6-foot-tall 1940s self-framed tin Phillips 66 gas station sign was priced

tin Phillips 66 gas station sign was priced \$3,200 while a 5-gallon Sinclair round "rocker" can was tagged at \$700. Both were shown by Pete Shambeau of Two Rivers, Wis., who offered items priced from \$50 and up.

Mike Karberg of Schereville, Ind., showed off a jam-packed booth with items he found "after doing some serious detective work, tracking down the contents from an 1890s hardware store that changed locations in 1925, leaving over 1,000 goodies behind and untouched." Multiple boxes of old goods and advertising pieces were on display. including a 29-inch-tall 1920s papier mache, glass eye key-wind "nodder," a full-figure store window youngster with animated bobbing head and original key, which could entertain you for \$4,650. The veteran dealer said the Boone County show offered "the greatest selection of antique advertising on earth."

It was a 15-hour drive for Shaun Higgins of Berkley, Mass., who wowed the crowd with a 38-inch-tall double sided tin "Fisk Tire Boy" sign featuring the famous advertising boy with a full size Fisk rubber tire, priced at \$7,500. Also drawing attention was an animated 1930s 4-foot-long metal Goodyear flying Zeppelin hanger window display with moving doors and moving "pop-out" Zeppelin tin nose piece intended to attract store shoppers. The brightly colored display could be taken home for \$9,500.

"Tve been doing this show for 10 years" said 82-year-old Larry Marafka, who drove six hours from Ira, Pa. He showed off a pair of Penn Eaton oil advertising signs that he said were "found in a barn near Chicago." A 14-b 50-inch tin sign sported a price tag of \$2,000, while a 1920s 3-by 4-foot canvas was marked \$900.

As the show wrapped up Saturday night, the final festivities featured an auction with more than 350 items. The top piece was a die cut 21-by 29 -inch porcelain Ford

radiator advertising sign, designed to fit the front of a vintage vehicle. Spirited bidding ended with a hammer-price of \$3,500 plus 18 percent buyer's premium.

Although about 350 dealers were set up inside and outside at three large fairgrounds buildings, promoter Cancholla said there is room for expansion to several other large buildings at future shows.

The next Boone County Treasure Hunt is scheduled for April 30 - May 1, at the fairgrounds 25 minutes west of Indianapolis.

Contemporary pottery, folk art will highlight Nye & Co. event

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. – While Nve & offered. Company Auctioneers still can't hold in-person auctions at their facility, that is not stopping them from offering an Estate Treasures auction on Wednesday, Oct. 14.

"In accordance with the New Jersey State mandate, we cannot open our doors to the public," said Andrew Holter of Nye & Company Auctioneers. "However, we plan to deliver clients a seamless online experience and will strive to deliver accurate condition reports and images for all items on offer. We'll be closely monitoring our email account and all the bidding platforms."

The auction is headlined by several contemporary collections, including a well-curated group of Southern face jugs primarily from Georgia and North Carolina potters, including pieces by the well-known Meaders and Hewell Wonderfully whimsical, families. expressive and sometimes grotesque, this collection of Southern contemporary face jugs is an homage to an earlier time, when it was believed that slaves near Edgecombe, S.C., started making them as early as the 1840s as a form of spiritual expression. Their popularity expanded as they were being produced by a much broader market, and they're still popular today among folk art collectors.

Continuing along the lines of contemporary pottery, there are several pieces from a number of private collections, which contribute to a broad and diverse selection of Southwestern and Native American pottery. Santa Clara red and black pottery and Acoma pots well represented. Also, are Southwestern themed art by artists such as RC Gorman and Howard Carr will delight bidders. A number of contemporary Kachina dolls are also being

There are two spectacular bronzes by Dave McGary included in the sale. The first, titled The Bounty of Grey Hawk, is a stunning representation of a Native American covered in a decorated buffalo hide. McGary is so accomplished that the textures of the hide, the ruffles of the feathers and the emotion of the sitter can all be felt. The second bronze, titled Thunder Dreamer, is also a stunning representation of a Native American deep in contemplation.

A nice complement to the contemporary home furnishings is a selection of Outsider/Self-Taught Art by Fayette, Ala., artist Jimmy Lee Sudduth. Known for painting with house paint, mud and found pigments such as motor oil and juices, Sudduth often painted with his fingers because "they never wore out" like a brush would. His paintings are a window into the soul of the artist and often portrayed things that spoke to him or that he saw. The sale features three prominent works, including one of a large brown Toto dog, a courthouse and an exceptionally large factory. His work can be found in the Smithsonian, the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, the Birmingham Museum of Art in Alabama and the Corcoran Gallery in Washington, D.C.

Those seeking more traditional works will be treated to a fine selection of American and European furniture and decorative arts. Finally, there is a nice selection of Majolica and art pottery for ceramic and pottery enthusiasts. Of note is a small George Ohr pot that is indicative of the work from the "Mad Potter of Biloxi". Saturday Evening Girls, Rookwood, Newcomb, Stellmacher, Hampshire and Zsolnay are all also represented.





Golden Eagle will fly high once more during auction

BROOKVILLE, Pa. - A local landmark for 50 years, the Golden Eagle Inn and Restaurant was the kind of steakhouse and watering hole that both locals and antique-alley seekers into west-central Pennsylvania, spent more time gawking at the walls than avidly eating one of the diners' many delicacies.

There were antiques in the restaurant when Rick and Pat Ochs, now happily retired at 80 years old, bought the business 1971 from a couple, who had opened the business in 1962. But one thing Rick didn't like - emptv walls.

Back in the early 1970s, when locals heard that Rick was collecting moonshine stills, suddenly folks started bringing in their "grandfather's" still. Rick had more than 20 stills and parts of stills - both copper and tin-sheet adorning his walls. There's a lot of corn grown in the Brookville area.

On one of his earlier "picking" trips, Rick is said to have discovered a still hidden in a local barn, his pitchfork striking metal under a pile of straw.

The stills and their parts are all individually hand made. None of them look the same or look like they are distilling tools; the only thing they have in common is that sour mash bubbled in kettles, pressure gauges and venting systems controlled the compression and mash oozed through the pipes.

On the walls of the Golden Eagle, the copper and tin sparkle within the "Still Room" each an individual piece of art, designed not for whimsey, but for aiding production.


The restaurant also had a "Tack Room," rich with old saddlery, old bridles and bits and several advertising pieces devoted to the famous racehorse, Dan Patch. The family restaurant also had a horsehair carriage basket on the wall, complete with strings of sleigh bells by the dozens.

From the Tack Room, one could choose to eat in the "Bell Room." Rick had an affinity for bells. Hundreds of brass, silver, tin and ceramic bells populate the room. There the gawker is confronted with old wooden-handled classroom school bells, retail counter customer bells, cowbells, brass concierge bells, crystal and glass bells, brass doorbells, and more

Complementing the collection is the old streetcar bell purchased by Rick from the motorman of No. 341 which serviced downtown Zanesville, Ohio, from 1906 until the 1930s.

Outsizing them all, though, is the 17inch wide (at the bell's horn) bell which used to ring in Locomotive 200 of the Pittsburg and Shawmut Railroad that, according to a plaque, was a short-line track operating passenger and freight services throughout central and southwestern Pennsylvania from the 1930s to 1950s. The company was chartered in 1899, when the "h" in Pittsburgh was most commonly left out.)

The railroad bell often sat in the entrance to a main dining room. Once rung, and it often was, it sent deep rich, loud and almost urgent reverberations throughout the inn and restaurant. "It's usually the adults, not the children, who are guilty of ringing the bell, jokes Marnie Ochs, part owner and self-described "curator" of the Gold Eagle. Rick and Pat ran the businesses for years, and the walls kept getting fuller and fuller. In 2016, his son Craig and wife Marnie, bought the business after managing since 1999. When recently offered a price for their property (which, itself, is valuable), they couldn't refuse, the decision to sell and liquidate was made. Entering their mid-life years, after having spent the last 20 years in a kitchen, Marnie says, she and Craig are "ready for a new chapter." The contents of the Gold Eagle Restaurant and Inn will be sold Oct. 22-24. The first day of the three-day sale will concentrate on the more commercial part of the inventory, with the antiques and collectibles being sold on Oct. 23 and 24. The sale will be conducted by True Blue Auctions at the Main Street restaurant site. True Blue also will be providing a live webcast of the auction from their company website on all three days.

"There's some real unusual stuff at this auction," True Blue Auctioneer Skip Dreibelbis said. "We'll have around 500 antique and collectible lots selling during the second and third days. There's a lot of unusual stuff ... things collected for nearly 50 years."

There is one item in the auction Rick and his family have never figured out. Purchased more than 20 years ago, the piece is made of wood, looking as if it has been hand carved, measuring about 16 inches in length, close to six -inches wide. At one end of the frame of the apparatus, there is a spring attached to a spool, that puts enough pressure on the spool some few inches away to forge a firm grip.


"We've had that hanging in the bar during the 20 years I've been here - and I think, long before that - and no one can tell me what it is, Marnie Ochs says. "One of the many guesses it might have been something to do with a loom, or something to do with saddlery. One guy suggested it might have been a crutch for Tiny Tin ... he might have been at the bar a little too long."

She hopes to learn something at the auction where the piece will be selling. "I would hate to turn my retirement into a worldwide quest for the answer to what this thing is."





of buttonmania," and so many of the pictured examples brought back memories to me. Additionally, if you're looking to improve your mind or to win bar bets down the road, there are curious bits of trivia sprinkled throughout the book.

Obviously, Button Power is a musthave for pin-back button collectors, or even those looking to start a new collection. Nostalgia fans will get lost in its pages. For those of a certain age with younger family members, this

book might prove to be the perfect launchpad for oral history-type conversations. For anyone who doesn't fit into one of these categories, the book is just plain fun.

Chips from casino hotels like Saraha (1952), Flamingo (1946), Golden Nugget (1946) and El Cortez (1941) are sought after, with higher denomination chips bringing in higher dollars. A \$5 chip from the Lucky Casino sold for \$52,500.

Chips from the Golden Gate (1906) are extremely rare and quite the collector's item. The casino operated for just three years after gambling was banned from the state in 1909. It resumed in 1939 when gambling became legal.

Collectors turn to casino chips, seeking fun, profit and a link to gambling history through these fascinating and colorful pieces of clay and plastic that don't lose their value even after they leave the gaming table.

High-denomination chips are particularly valuable to the collector of obsolete chips. A \$100 chip from Benny "Bugsy" Siegel's two-year, 1946-1947 reign at the original Flamingo in Las Vegas sold for \$3,500 at the CCGTCC 1997 auction. A 1950s-era \$100 chip from the Dune sells for about \$2,500. A \$100 chip from The Brighton in Atlantic City, now the Sands Hotel and Casino, sells in the low four figures.

"Most gamblers may have taken a \$1 chip home with them, but how many would leave the casino with a \$100 chip in their pocket," said Bill Ackman Jr., who publishes Gaming Times magazine.

Many collectors are drawn to even older chips made of ivory or bone, such as an 18th century Europe and China chip, or chips made out of mother of pearl.

It's important to distinguish between poker chips and casino chips, as poker chips are mass produced and widely sold for private play. Poker chips have little value and have a picture on them, such as a portrait, animal or other object. Vintage casino chips from the 1920s to the 1950s were often made of Bakelite of Catalin, finally giving way to clay or plastic chips. Casino chips tend to be marked with the name of the casino, the city, state and denomination.

In 1975, chip manufacturer Christy & Jones Co. patented a chip with a metal inlay, usually of aluminum or brass, with the details stamped on them. These chips, known as brass core, are made by a plastic injection mold over a core metal. Collectors should note that counterfeit brass core chips have been discovered.

In 1985, ChipCo introduced its ProTech chip made of a patented clay compound that allowed a full-color photographic image to be printed on the entire chip. **Below:** Perhaps no poker chip is more popular than a Sands chip. The Sands Casino operated from 1952 to 1996. (photo submit-
