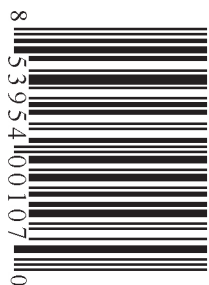

Philatelists finding First Day Covers can be fun, rewarding

What draws people to stamps? Why do we get a thrill from seeing Mickey Mouse, astronauts, presidents and Americana on these small pieces of affixable paper?

One possibility is that they are at once so many things: they're art, they're history, they're antiques, they're money, they're miniatures – all wrapped up in the romanticism of the letters they set into motion.

Stamp collectors (called philatelists) come in all ages. It's perhaps the most affordable hobby that is never ending.

Make no mistake, some collections are priceless. Two years ago, at the Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries in New York, 103 treasures from the collection of U.S. bond king William H. Gross sold for a shade over \$10 million, setting the all-time record for a single day stamp sale.

Gross' block of 1857, 5-cent Jefferson Perforated's fetched \$472,000. Even more astonishing, his 24-cent 1869 Pictorial Inverted Center stamps went for \$750,000.

Stamp collectors in the early 1900s had a very different set of concerns than do collectors today. A hundred years ago, new stamp issues were few and far between. Post Offices hadn't yet learned that they could subsidize postal operations by issuing stamps that collectors would buy and put in their collections. Every stamp that a collector buys and never uses is a donation to the Post Office and helps underwrite the cost of postal service.

In 1911, for instance, there were no new United States stamp issues. In 2011, a hundred years later, there were sixty different stamp issues with a postage value of over \$57.

From the onset, collectors scrambled to get the latest single postage stamp, put it in a protective sleeve and mount it in an album using a small hinge. The next rage in this hobby was the plate block. Until the late 1960s, United States stamps included two rows of stamps attached to one another in a block of four or more, with printing information, including the printing plate number, on attached margin paper. A number is used to identify one specific plate or cylinder used to print the stamps. Plate blocks began in the 1890s.

By 1910, the hobby of First Day Cover collecting took root. Collectors began to find and esteem older envelopes that were cancelled on the first day that the stamp had been issued. Nothing elaborate were these envelopes. They were just plain and collectors were fascinated at having mailed (and receiving) an envelope with a stamp that was cancelled on the first day that the stamp had been issued.

The U.S. Post Office, in a decision that greatly advanced First Day Cover collecting, began to announce upcoming issues in advance. This gave budding First Day Cover collectors time to prepare to buy the news stamps and have them used on the first day of issue.

"First Day Covers could still only be told by the date of the cancellation on the envelope. It wasn't until 1923 that the first envelope cachet, indicating that the cover is a First Day Cover, that First Day Cover collecting entered the modern phase," says Steven Mays, whose First Day Cover collection numbers just more than 4,000. He has 36 albums full of these covers, others he keeps in sturdy, protected boxes.

Mays, 74, a resident of Vienna, Virginia just outside Washington D.C., concentrates on First Day Covers of Great Britain and Canada, as well as the United States. He grew up in Vienna and has made multiple trips to The Smithsonian's National Postal Museum in Washington D.C.

"The Smithsonian National Postal Museum has it all, like a comprehensive specialized collection of 19th Century carrier and local stamps, Confederate stamps (1861-1865), Tax stamps, hand stamps, Pony Express saddle bags, Sea Post service bags as early as 1845 and letterboxes as early as 1900," Mays said. "The museum has it all and there are many aspects to this fun and lucrative hobby, but the most colorful and most popular these days are the First Day Covers."

The first cachet was on the 1923 Harding memorial issue that was released for the recently deceased President Warren Harding. The famous Harding cachet was designed and issued by George Linn, who was the publisher of the famous Linn's Stamp News magazine, which is still the mainstay philatelic publication today.

Benzing House will offer up its treasures at auction

FAIRFIELD, Ohio – To most of the “old timers” around this area of southern Ohio, it’s been known as the “old Benzing House.” While it has been closed for many years now; the old farmhouse was once the site of scholarly discussions, medical inventions and the swanky soirees of Esther R. Benzing, the renowned “First Lady of Fairfield.”

Mrs. Benzing, a local author, columnist, archivist and antique collector, was born in the house in 1903. And remained



in the house, with her physician husband and son, until she died in 2003. Her husband preceded her in death in 1952.

Esther’s father and grandfather had rented and farmed the area for 75 years from the original settler. The house was built in 1831 “due North and South to be right with the world,” according to builder Eratus Mack. About five years later, construction of a barn began on a foundation of land-cleared field stones.

Esther and her husband, George, Jr., purchased the house in 1929. Their son, George III, who died at the age of 93 in May, also lived in the house much of his life. George III was a graduate of the University of Cincinnati, and later became professor of pediatrics at the university’s College of Medicine from 1964-1998. Closely following his retirement, he was appointed as the college’s Professor Emeritus. In addition to authoring many peer-reviewed articles, he was also an inventor, including the development of a heart monitor used during open-heart surgery.

“It’s incredible to think of the history here,” Auctioneer Mark Mallette, who will be disposing of the estate, said. “To think that Esther Benzing tied together the ownership makes it a real multi-generational sale.

“She was a great collector of many things. There’s all kinds of glass – both pressed and cut, there will be lots of books, many of them leather-bound,” he said of the Oct. 24 sale. “We’ve got hundreds of postcards, two choice 1912 Winchester calendars all complete; over 30 crocks

Presidential pie safe easily won the bidding at \$37,400

LONE JACK, Mo. — Bidders at Soulis Auctions may have tried to guess the late Gerald Mueller’s occupation from his collection of trade signs. With 15 barber poles in the sale, he must have been a barber. Or maybe an optometrist? A reasonable guess considering Mueller owned nine wood, tin and metal spectacle signs, some with eerie eyeballs. With 10 iron watch face trade signs, perhaps he’d taken up watchmaking. He probably wasn’t a knife maker, locksmith, bootmaker or pharmacist though; there were only one, two or three signs for those jobs. Sorry, amateur psychologists. Mueller had careers in sales and finance in Sioux City, Iowa; he just loved trade signs, weathervanes, barber poles, pie safes and one spectacular wooden Indian.

The Sept. 19 sale led off with the Indian – a 19th century pine tobacconist figure attributed to New York master carver Samuel Robb (1851-1928). The 69-inch-tall wheeled figure of a Native American woman went into the sale with an \$8,000/\$12,000 estimate. On their website, Soulis provided a 4-minute video that examined every minute detail of the figure as well as every area of paint loss, repaint and damage. Soulis opened the bidding at \$4,000 and the wooden princess sold on-site for \$13,200.

It didn’t take long for that high mark to be surpassed. “Presidential pie safes are very rare with only four known,” said Dirk Soulis on his website. Each of the 16 tins in the 68 by 39 by 16 inch Midwestern pie safe was hammered with the name “Lincoln” surrounded by American flags, stars and a single strand punched border. The safe opened at \$3,000, one-half its low estimate and then soared to \$37,400.

Other than the tobacconist figure, the top trade sign of the sale was a zinc and gilded iron trade for optician L.D. Cutler of Windsor Locks, Connecticut. Cutler’s

double sided 23 ½ by 9 by ½ inch hand-painted sign with spectacles and human eyes sold for \$12,100.

Mueller’s weathervane collection included pigs, horses, deer, sulkies, cows, eagles, sheep, a pigeon, arrows, a rooster, a jockey, touring cars and one beaver. Bidders kept quiet in the days approaching the sale. There were only a few pre-sale bids for a 33 ¼ by 26 by 3 inch running stag weathervane attributed to J. W. Fiske & Company. That changed when the stag opened at \$1,500 and galloped through 23 bids to emerge the leader of the menagerie pack at \$20,900.

A rare zinc beaver lightening rod/weathervane was manufactured by W. C. Shinn of Lincoln, Neb., during the first quarter of the 20th century. The beaver with a maple leaf in its mouth sold on-site for \$7,150.

The sale’s top barber pole came with an unusual painted wooden bracket that set the pole on an angle from the wall. In red, white, blue, gold and silver paint with a large painted ball finial, the 43-inch pole sold for \$5,428.

There was only one carved carousel horse in the sale, a circa 1920 C.W. Parker outer row jumper with tucked head, flowing mane, glass eyes, carved blankets, original iron stirrups and the name “Betty” painted on her breast collar. The jumper sold for \$3,300.

Auctioneer Dirk Soulis has come up with a unique solution to the problem of large gatherings under COVID-19 restrictions. He allows guests to bid from their cars. To participate in the Drive-In auction, bidders drive their cars under the raised sides of the auc-

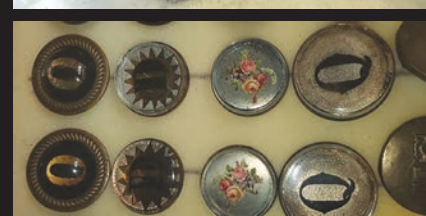
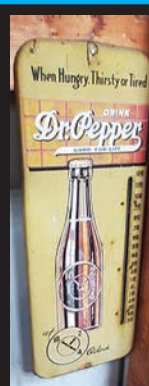

and jugs, and more than that many clocks.”

“I know we have furniture here dating to the 1850s, and I suspect that some might even be earlier,” Mallate says. There’s no limitation on styles either – there’s East-lake, primitive, Chippendale, William & Mary, according to the auctioneer.

There will also be about 30 pieces of Romweber furniture, acquired by Dr. Benzing III in the 1960s-1970s.

Among the fine art for sale are at least 10 limited prints by artist John Ruthven (who died Oct. 11 at age 92 years), several pieces of original art, old photographs, Native American pieces, in addition to diamond and gold jewelry.

“We’ll be selling out of the two barns and the house,” Mallette said. “We’ll be running two rings most of the time and have a tent ready in case of rain. It’s an auction I’m looking forward to.”

tion tent and encircle the floor bidders and the auction podium. Bidders remain in their car and bid either via the internet or with a large paddle they wave out their window. “In some cases, drive-in bidders are closer to the auction podium than those in chairs,” said Soulis.

Dolly Parton releasing new album on 8-track format

Dolly Parton has a new album out called *A Holly Dolly Christmas*. It features guest appearances by the likes of Michael Bublé, Jimmy Fallon, Willie Nelson, Billy Ray Cyrus, Miley Cyrus, and Randy Parton. It's available on CD, vinyl, and various streaming services. Pretty cool, huh?

What's really cool, at least for nostalgia buffs and retro tech collectors, is that it's also being released on 8-track tape. That's right: in the year 2020, there's new music coming out on a format most people probably assume is long dead. The release is from Kate's Track Shack, a home-based business in Arlington, Texas. In a recent phone interview, I asked owner Kathy Gibson about the Dolly Parton tape, as well as the 8-track business in general.

BRETT WEISS: Describe Kate's Track Shack for someone who has never heard of you guys.

KATHY GIBSON: We've been in business for 22 years. We sell everything you need to fix 8-tracks. We do tape repair and player repair. We sell supplies. We try to be your one-stop internet shop for anything 8-track related. We also do transfers. We can transfer 8-tracks and cassettes to CD and flash drive, VHS to DVD, 8mm and 16mm movies to DVD, etc.

WEISS: And you have an online store where people can buy old 8-tracks?

GIBSON: We do. It's www.katestrackshack.com.

WEISS: With records, you've got 20-something hipsters buying vinyl. Do you get that with 8-track tape customers, or does it tend to just be older customers?

GIBSON: We have a worldwide base of customers. It runs the gamut from young to old. People who had them back in the day. Kids who are starting to get into vinyl are starting to do 8-tracks. They find that it's a really cool format. Some of them like the portable players

since they can take them wherever they want.

WEISS: How much time do you spend per week working on the business?

GIBSON: I'm a workaholic [laughs]. The business hours are 9 to 5, but we work longer than that. There are some nights where I'm up until midnight or later making sure I have an order ready to go the next day.

WEISS: Your husband Dan works with the business as well?

GIBSON: Yes. He retired from his corporate job around three years ago. He is such a great help in our business. He does our tape/player repairs. He's also responsible for doing the layout and recording of new 8-tracks.

WEISS: Let's talk Dolly Parton. Did they contact you or vice versa?

GIBSON: They contacted us. A couple of guys called, one of whom I've worked with before. We did a few 8-track releases for him for a band called Midland.

WEISS: Did you actually speak with Dolly Parton?

GIBSON: We haven't yet, but we're hoping to. Or at least send her some 8-tracks to get autographed.

WEISS: You got to meet Cheap Trick when you did an 8-track for their *The Latest* album, correct?

GIBSON: We did. We met a couple of the guys before a concert they did in Dallas, and they signed tapes for us. We gave them a couple of tapes, and they held them up onstage and said, "We have the #1 8-track in the country" [laughs]. The crowd went wild, and we were like, "Woohoo!" [laughs].

WEISS: How do you go about manufacturing the tapes? Do you have a mold for the shells, or do you use old stock?

GIBSON: We use old stock. We've got tens of thousands of 8-tracks. Some are brand new, and some are gently used. We use a combination of those. However, we are speaking with some manufacturing companies about the possibility of

making new shells.

WEISS: The Dolly 8-track is listed at \$54.99 on Amazon. How did you come up with that price point?

GIBSON: We didn't. We told them the price we had set for manufacturing the 8-track and doing the label and the sleeves and the shrink-wrap and all that stuff. And then the record company and Amazon set the price based on that.

WEISS: I'm intrigued by the fact that the 8-track has a bonus song, "The Wish Book." I think that's enticing for collectors. Was that your idea or the record company's?

GIBSON: That was their idea. They sent us the music, and after we had already arranged it for the 8-track format, they decided to add the bonus song. So, we had to do a little bit more rearranging.

WEISS: Do record companies send you a CD or a computer file of the music for you to adapt to the 8-track format?

GIBSON: It's evolved over the years.

It used to be that we got CDs. These days they usually download the song to Google Drive or to Dropbox.

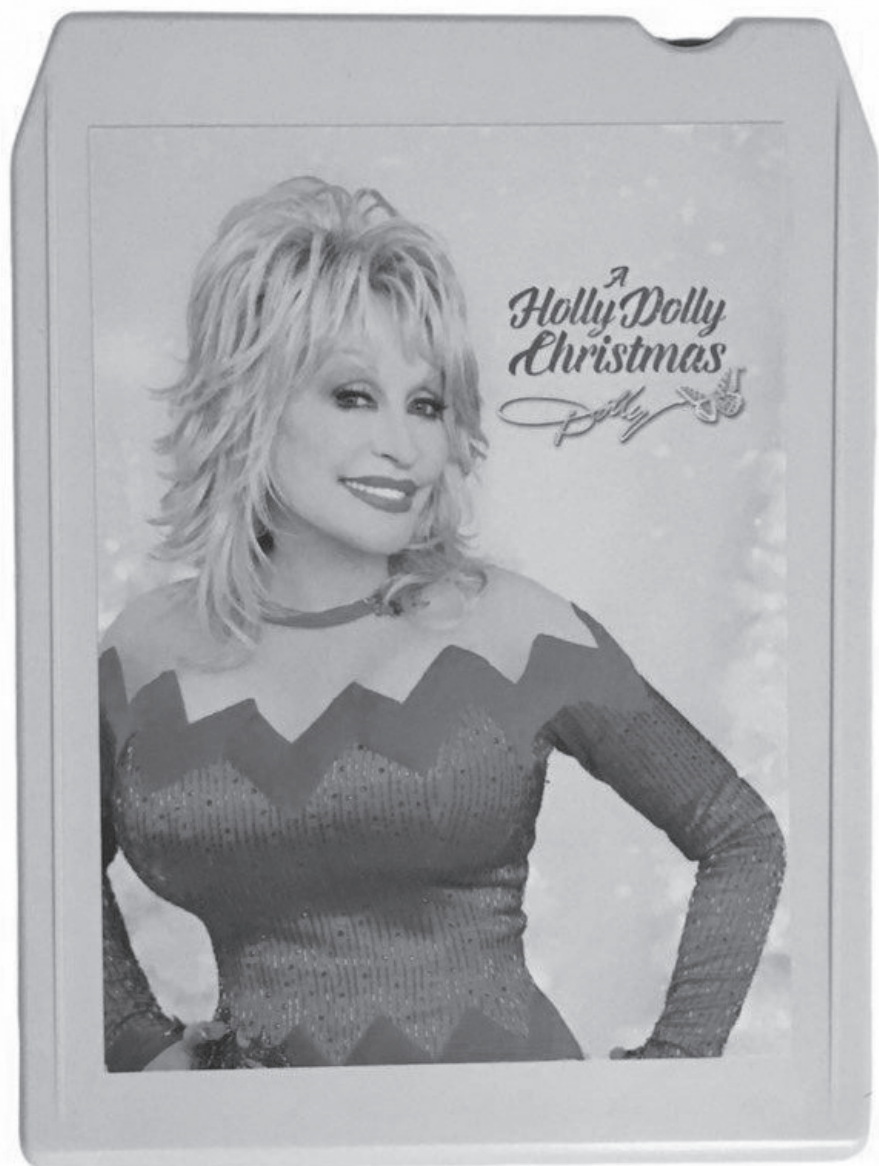
WEISS: Did you grow up a Dolly Parton fan?

GIBSON: I like all music. Not so much heavy metal, but pretty much everything else. I do like Dolly and some of the other country artists from that era. I really like the new album. It's great. I especially like the duet she did with Willie Nelson for his classic song, "Pretty Paper."

First Day Covers

FROM FRONT PAGE

Throughout the 1920s and for most of the rest of the last century, First Day Cover collecting continued to gain in popularity and the older First Day Covers shot up in price. Interest was increasingly on the cachets (the printed portion of the envelope design that complimented the philatelic issue that was commemorating some aspect of American History.)

“By 1940, most U.S. collectors collected First Day Covers as part of their U.S. collection, I know I did,” Mays said. “Beginning in the 1950s and 1960s, First Day Cover collecting became more cachet collecting than anything else. By the 1970s, there were scores of cachet makers creating these cachets, some in black and white so as not to distract from the beauty of the stamp itself. Many companies got into the act of producing cachets.”

Indeed. Favorite cachet makers sought by collectors include ArtCraft, Artmaster, Fleetwood, House of Farnam and Colorano. Because no cachet had official U.S. Post Office authorization, collectors were often puzzled as to which cachet to collect.

Again, a cachet is an informative illustration usually on the left-hand side of an envelope or postcard. The cachet is designed to be attractive, educational, or humorous and supports the stamp by usually giving a little information about the featured stamp. For example, a 2003 stamp featuring the American Purple Heart Award had an accompanying postcard with an illustrated cachet showing three soldiers carrying a fourth wounded comrade.

“The slow end of the U.S. First Day Cover collecting began around 1975 with the entry of both the Franklin Mint and Reader’s Digest into the monthly First Day Cover market,” Mays said. “Both companies operated a monthly service that sent numerous First Day Covers to subscribers. The prices were high, as much as \$15 per cover that had a 13-cent or 15-cent stamp affixed at that time, along with a 5-cent envelope. At the time, casual collectors never realized they were buying souvenirs, not just collectibles.”

At first, collectors were required to send in the covers before the stamp was actually issued. Those rules were later relaxed so that today for most stamps, collectors have 60 days after the date of issue in which to submit their requests. However, those covers must bear the stamp(s) to which the ‘First Day of Issue’ cancel is to be applied.

By 2000, the philatelic First Day Cover marketers were largely gone, having left millions of collectors with hundreds of millions of dollars cost in material that was very overpriced, undesirable, and not collected by modern philatelists. But collectors like May looks at it from a very different perspective.

“The fact that many collectors are bailing from the hobby of First Day Covers is a blessing to me and others who continue collecting,” Mays said. “It was said that the baseball card collecting hobby, for example, became inundated with card companies who produced their own cards. This occurred around 2000 as hoards of card manufacturers made the scent. Suddenly, it was too much for the average collector who felt swamped. In addition, young boys were less interested in cards and preferred video games and Pokemon cards instead. There’s been this 20-year drought, so if you’ve stayed with that hobby you’ll have rookie cards that collectors wished they had 20 years from now.

“It’s the same with First Day Covers. Their popularity waned the past 20 years or so and they’ve gone

through this lull, but 20 years from now collectors will try and fill those voids left when they, themselves, left the hobby.”

According to Mays, the U.S Postal Service began to juice up its stamp production machinery, issuing up to 100 or more stamps per year, at a postage cost of hundreds of dollars.

“The cost factor drove many away from First Day Covers,” Mays said. “There were just too many stamps, issued all too often. I can understand the worries about the cost of collecting these covers, but a gap in any collection isn’t good.”

Specialty First Day Covers still fetch a high price. Such cachets and stamps that depict Walt Disney (1968), Apollo First Moon Landing (1969), Elvis Presley (1955), U.S. Olympics (1972), Babe Ruth (1983) or Spirit of St. Louis (1927) are keepers, Mays said.

And some covers fetch a high price even in today’s market. The 18 Apollo Progress stamps of 1969 is worth roughly \$175. A cover depicting the \$1.30 Graf Zeppelin or 1930 is valued at \$600. A set of 2007 Star Wars cachets with cancellation is valued at \$50. The 1981 Bobby Jones golf stamp is worth just \$15, but some collectors added Arnold Palmer’s signature to the cachet, raising its value to \$350.

“Word of caution,” Mays said. “Computers can be used to create add-on cachets for earlier uncacheted covers, say from the 1930s and 1940s. Some collectors may be fooled into paying high prices for covers that appear to be classics but are modern creations.”

Key to this hobby is obtaining First Day Covers that are unaddressed. That is, having them sent to a home or business address using a removable label.

“There are still thousands of First Day Cover collectors out there and shows across the country involving First Day Covers and stamps,” Mays said.

Indeed. The Covid-19 is putting a damper on many gatherings, the First Day Cover portion of the Great American Stamp Show is slated for Aug. 20-23 in Hartford, Connecticut.
