Candy dispensing PEZ enticing collectors

PEZ dispensers are often seen at the checkout counters of just about any store. But, they can also be found in the aisles of your favorite antique mall. Not only are their PEZ collectors, but the genre lends itself to crossover collectors.

Mickey Mouse, Winnie the Pooh and Hello Kitty have graced PEZ dispenser heads and recently Anna and Elsa from the movie "Frozen" have also joined the line-up. Elvis, Han Solo, Cinderella, Batman, Superman, Betsy Ross, Yosemite Sam, Chewbacca and The Beatles have graced the top of these plastic dispensers over the years.

PEZ was invented in 1927 in Vienna, Austria, as a peppermint flavored breath mint. Today the company's headquarters are located in Orange, Conn. It is owned by the Haas family who are descendants from the inventor of the candy, Eduard

The mints were marketed as a smoking cessation aid. In fact, when Haas joined forces with Oscar Uxa, who developed the first PEZ dispenser, the dispenser was shaped like a cigarette lighter. It was introduced at the Vienna Trade Fair in 1949 and held the same number of candies (12) that the dispensers hold today. These peppermint candies were stored in a small metal tin.

The product was so successful in Austria, that by 1935, just eight years after the product was brought into the market, a new factory was built in Czechoslovakia to keep up with demand.

Although the newly-introduced mints worked quite well as a smoking deterrent in Austria, they didn't have the same desired effect in the United States. Smoking didn't change much during the 1950s when the candies were brought to the American shores, so the manufacturers decided to shift gears, changed the flavor to include a variety of fruity options, and started marketing the candies to children instead.

At first, the candy was sold in rolls as "drops", similar to Life Savers and other hard candy. During the 1930s, brick- or two when you were growing up can shaped PEZ was also sold in small tins sell for an obscene amount of money that protected the candies when kept in under the right circumstances. the pocket. Customers could purchase refills that looked similar to the ones

sold today, but the multi-colored plastic dispensers we associate with PEZ would not be introduced until after World War

And then came the characters: Popeye, a bunny, and a witch were among the first to be introduced at the end of the 1950s, followed by Casper the Friendly Ghost, Bozo the Clown and several Disney characters in the early 1960s, like Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. Many of these dispensers had character heads as well as additional character images die-cut into their sides. For example, Huey, Dewie and Louie appeared on the sides of Donald Duck

Don't be scared of Halloween collectibles

The scene: a suburban basement, circa 1960. Orange and black crepe paper streamers have been carefully taped to the rafters. Cardboard die-cut images of hags, haunts, and assorted other hobgoblins adorn the walls. On the floor sits a metal tub, awash in icy water and bobbing red apples. A honeycomb scarecrow centerpiece, engulfed by Indian corn and gourds, reigns atop the refreshment table. Near the foot of the stairs, an eerily grinning Jack-o'-lantern awaits his prey.

And slowly down those stairs they descend: pint-size devil imps and fairy princesses, friendly ghosts and wart-nosed witches, each lugging a stuffed-to-the-brim trick-or treat bag. Their fresh-out-of-the-box costumes, (dime-store bargains that even included a mask), are at last making a long-awaited, once-a-year appearance.

It's 1960, it's Halloween, and the party is on!

By the mid-20th century, Halloween had been transformed into the kid-friendly celebration it remains today. But the holiday's customs, and many of the symbols we associate with it, had their origins deep in the mists of the past.

Some two thousand or so years ago, the Celtic New Year was observed on Nov. 1. The night before — Oct. 31 — marked the festival of "Samhain", when the boundaries between this world and the next intermingled. Ghosts, who had been lurking about waiting for their ideal opportunity, could then cross over. Friendly apparitions provided otherwordly advice to Celtic priests putting together predictions for the coming year. As for unfriendly apparitions, (yes, some of those slipped through, too), the Celts warded off their unwelcome interference by dancing around huge bonfires, attired in animal heads and skins. The ghosts, evidently a bit nearsighted, supposedly mistook the Celts for fellow spirits, and left them alone. And so, the first Halloween costumes were born. (Well, that's the story, anyway.)

When the Roman Empire absorbed the Celtic lands (about 45 A.D.), Samhain was absorbed too, into the Romans' late October festivals of Feralia (a day honoring the dead), and Pomona (a day honoring the goddess of trees, fruits, and assorted growing things.) Pomona's symbol: the apple, which somehow tied in, however murkily, to the later custom of bobbing for apples.

The rise of Christianity tossed a new batch of traditions into the mix. By the eighth century, the Celtic New Year, Nov. 1, had been re-christened "All-hallowmas" (or, as we now call it, "All Saints Day".) And, since few Samhain customs were suitable for such a religious holiday, they soon sidled back to their original celebratory date: Oct. 31. .aka "All-hallows Eve". .aka Halloween!

Halloween traditions in America were, like the country itself, a melting pot. Those who settled here brought the customs of their own countries along with them. In England, folks had gone door-to-door "a-souling", soliciting "soul cakes" (pas-

tries), in return for promises to pray for the dead. In America, "a-souling" transformed into "trick-or-treating", with a younger generation doing the door-to-door soliciting for an updated batch of goodies.

European belief in witchcraft added those high-flying crones to the roster of ghosts, devils, and others of the assorted undead, supposedly let loose to do their darnedest on All-hallows Eve. And, thanks to Irish legend, Halloween acquired its most recognizable symbol: that pump-kin-headed poster boy, the Jack-o'-lantern.

"Jack" so the legend goes, was the most miserly of misers. A smart one, though: he somehow got Satan to agree that, despite his evil ways, Jack would never be condemned to Hell. All went well, until the day Jack finally approached the Pearly Gates. Heaven wouldn't take him. And, since the doors of Hell were also barred to Jack, he was now doomed to spend eternity roaming the world with his lantern, (to fend off other restless spirits), in search of unattainable rest. Jack's original lantern was said to be a carved-out turnip, but that quickly gave way to the pumpkin - plentiful in autumn, more visually appealing, and, of course, lots easier to carve. Over time, it was Jack's lantern that took center stage. The term "Jack-o'-lantern" became a generic identifier for the Halloween pumpkin, rather than for its unfortu-

Today, Halloween is second only to Christmas as the biggest decorating holiday ever. We spend over \$6 billion annually on new and vintage Halloween decorations, costumes, treats, and other paraphernalia. Over one quarter of the candy sold each year is sold at Halloween. (That fills a lot of trick-or-treat bags). Halloween décor items have been fashioned from die-cut cardboard, crepe paper, metal, composition, plastic, fabric, wax, and ceramic. Among the most popular depictions of things that go bump in the night: Jack-o'-lanterns, witches, skeletons, bats, and black cats.

The relative rarity, and corresponding priciness of Halloween collectibles is primarily due to their ephemeral shelf life. Die-cut cardboard cats, and witches with accordioned crepe paper arms and legs, were really only intended for one-time use. Hung with a lavish application of Scotch tape, or poked with thumb tacks, the pieces were often damaged, then discarded when the witching hour had passed. The reason? They were inexpensive, and next Halloween would bring a brand new crop.

Fortunately, a treasure trove of Halloween bounty remains readily available. Some are items that received minimal one-time use, then were carefully packed away and forgotten for decades. Others, in even better shape and similarly stashed away, were given as party favors or takehome prizes. Best of all, and Halloween's hottest must-haves: "new old stock". These are surplus retail items never used, and, in many cases, never taken out of the original packaging.

Prices can sometimes be on the scary side: a U.S.-made die-cut witch face from the 1950s can fetch up to \$30. Her German-made pre-World War II sister can top out at an even scarier \$150. Each originally sold at dime stores for well under a dollar.

Because Halloween collectibles were mass-produced, and essentially throwaway items, few carry the mark of their maker. There are, however, exceptions. Tin noisemakers often bear the stamped names of such manufacturers as Chein, T. Cohn, and Bugle Toy. In many cases, kids' Halloween costumes, from such sources as Collegeville and Ben Cooper, have interior identifying tags, or are still in their original boxes. Gurley (formerly "Tavern") candles of spooky staples such as witches and ghosts, are also easily recognizable. And, among the best-known, and certainly most carefully executed die-cut hanging pieces are those by the Beistle Company of Pennsylvania. The mark "H.E. Luhrs" (the name of the firm's president) is a sure identifier of Beistle pieces produced during the 1940s and '50s.

When Oct. 31 rolls around, there's magic at work. Somehow, it's 1960 all over again. Those costumed kiddies are once again ready to make their way down into the Jack-o'-lantern's lair. They'll be amazed. Astounded. And maybe (just a little bit) frightened.

grand opening of the Red Dog Saloon in Virginia City, Nev., advertising the acid-rock group The Charlatans for a series of dates that never happened – is an expected star lot in Holabird Western Americana Collections' big, five-day Spooktacular Sale planned for Oct. 29-Nov. 2, online and live in the gallery located at 3555 Airway Drive in Reno.

The Charlatans concert poster will be offered Oct. 29 and has a pre-sale estimate of \$10,000-\$15,000. In 1965, when Red Dog Saloon owners Mark Unobsky and Chandler Laughlin made plans to open for business, they decided against a jukebox for music and instead wanted to enlist a house band. A friend suggested The Charlatans, a fledgling acid-rock group in San Francisco that had never even played a gig – just practiced. Oh, and dropped a lot of acid.

To advertise the event, one of The Charlatans, George Hunter, suggested a poster, only not the usual kind that featured publicity photos of the act. This one would be hand-drawn, in the style of an old circus poster, with the faces and names of the band members and the dates – June 1-15. Hunter himself did the artwork. Except The Charlatans were too stoned to keep the dates, so the shows had to be pushed ahead, to June 21. As a result, another poster was created. The one in the auction, for the June 1-15 dates, is the original and is a psychedelic rock rarity.

Along with the poster, Day 1 will be filled

with 679 lots of art, Native Americana, textiles, foreign and general collectibles, collector spoons, jewelry, scales, advertising items and signs, furnishings and 3-D items, music, theater, sports, tobacciana, saloon, cowboy, comic books, books and magazines, antiquarian books, bottle, marbles and gaming – a collector's paradise.

Day 2, Friday, Oct. 30 will be just as packed with 762 lots of firefighting memorabilia, fraternal organizations items, badges (which will also be offered on Day 5), numismatics, bullion, ingots, coins and currency, dies and hobbs, ephemera and exonumia, medals, so-called dollars (named because they are shaped like actual coins) and tokens.

Day 3, Oct. 31 will feature 685 'spooktacular' collectibles in a wide variety of categories: transportation, stocks and bonds, minerals and mining, tools, firearms, political memorabilia, World's Fair collectibles and militaria. Firearms sales subject to state and federal regulations.

Urbana monthly show comes back strong after COVID shutdown

URBANA, Ohio — From its humble beginnings, the Urbana Antique Show and Flea Market has grown to become one of the largest and most popular antique shows in Ohio. This year, because of COVID lockdowns, nearly the entire first quarter was lost and show promoter Steve Goddard had quite a bit of ground to retrace. When things started to loosen in June, the series restarted amidst plenty of precautions. Both the June and July shows went well, but Goddard had to deal with yet another pause in August when the county fair took over the fairgrounds. By September, things were rolling again and for the most recent Oct. 3-4 show, beautiful autumn weather once again brought out scores of buyers and sellers.

Taking into consideration both safety and the sometimes unpredictable Ohio fall weather, Goddard and his team spread the show about evenly across the Champaign County fairgrounds - in outdoor spaces, under covered pavilions, and inside several climate-controlled buildings. Both visitors and vendors were generally masked, plenty of sanitizer was available, and distancing was easy given the layout. In all, it appeared as if it was nearly business-as-usual given the current circumstances.

At enclosed buildings, greeters ensured the number of entrants stayed within county mandated capacity. Inside one of those buildings was Barb Dorgan, from Mason, Ohio, who had a cache of vintage cameras including a Brownie Model D for \$15, a Kodak Pony for \$20, and an early bellows-model Polaroid for \$40. At the other end of the building, Springfield's Danielle Finch had an undiscovered treasure — a 1950s live-edge table atop a tree-limb base reminiscent of a George Nakashima piece. It was priced at just \$150, and while not perfect, was probably worth several times that amount.

In the next building, Gloria Endicott from Millersport, Ohio, was selling at the show for the first time. She conceded that she had not sold a lot of her traditional antiques, but complemented the venue and noted she had plenty of people visiting her booth. She acknowledged her learning curve in getting familiar with what people were seeking at the Urbana show and at this time of year. Across the room were Josh and Jim Murray who have been selling for about 20 years - since they were teenagers. In addition to doing shows, they run the Ohio Vintage booth at Heart of Ohio Antique Mall. They feel the Urbana show is the best small-town flea market in Ohio, remarking on the number of shoppers and vendors present, even during the challenging times. In their booth, something a bit unusual - a pair of 70s-era Huffy skateboards, one sporting vintage Kryptonic wheels. Each was available for

One of the event's calling cards is its pricing, attractive to buyers with household budgets. It's evidenced by the number of shoppers toting rolling carts and wagons filled with smalls. No matter the venue - outside, inside, or under pavilion roof, buyers found items priced enticingly enough for them to open their wallets. For impulse buyers, there was a box of ceramic figurines and thimbles at just \$1 each. Even better, a container of vintage cocktail swizzles were a mere 50-cents each! An antiquarian book dealer from Troy, Ohio, had dozens of volumes slightly higher, ranging from \$2 for mid-century Hardy Boys editions to \$5 for a Boy Scout manual or several antique cookbooks. Her most expensive volume was just \$45. In conversation, she noted that purchases on Saturday were impressive. Nearby, another Ohio dealer's booth was anchored by two antique radios with good bones and ready to restore. One, a 1939 Philco 40-180 console model was priced at just \$35. Sitting atop it was a 1954/55 German Tonfunk Violetta shortwave radio for just \$25. She also commented on Saturday's buyers.

The Urbana shows also offer the proverbial "something for everyone." Across the acres of dealer spaces inside and out was a broad array of merchandise. Traditional antique buyers had items like a fine-condition 19th-century carpenter's box, with intact hardware and insets for \$275. Perfect for a garage or man cave was a 1950s Chevrolet truck grill marked down to \$150. For a den or over a fireplace, at just \$20, was a 24 by 36 inch framed Paul N. Norton print of the Mississippi Queen. A handful



American Life Bitters bottle pours a \$42,000 bid

EAST GREENVILLE, Pa. – An American Life Bitters bottle made in Ohio circa 1865-1875 sold for \$42,000, a Constitution Bitters bottle made in New York circa 1865-1875 brought \$23,000, a St. Drake's Plantation Bitters bottle patented in New York in 1862 fetched \$14,000, and a pattern globular bottle made by Zanesville Glass Works in Ohio, circa 1815-1835, hit \$7,500 in Premier Auction #143, which opened for bidding Sept. 21 and closed Sept. 28 by Glass Works Auctions.

The online-only auction was headlined by two outstanding collections: the Paul and Mary Ballentine bitters bottle collection and the Don Spangler Midwestern bottles and glass collection. Of the 275 total lots in the auction, 140 found winning bidders. By the time it was all over, the sale grossed \$354,600. All traffic was driven through the website, www.glswrk-auc-

The Ballentines were pioneer collectors from Ohio who started collecting in the early 1960s," said Jim Hagenbuch, the owner of Glass Works Auctions. "Paul passed away, but Mary retained the collection until her recent passing. Don Spangler is probably the last of the early collectors of



early Ohio glass. At age 90 he reluctantly decided it was time to pass it on to other collectors."

Following are highlights from the auction. All prices quoted include the buyer's

The American Life Bitters bottle (P.E. Iler, Mfg., Tiffin, Ohio) was from the Ballentine collection and was the top achiever of the auction. The 9 ¼ inch tall bottle (Ring/Ham, A-49) had a light to medium yellow color with an olive tone cabin, and featured a smooth base and applied tapered mouth. "This bottle was about perfect, save for a tiny spot of roughness on the tip of a lower log," Hagenbuch said. "It's rare in amber, but only a few exist in this yellow coloration."

The Constitution Bitters bottle (Seward & Bentley, Buffalo, N.Y.), also from the Ballentine collection, was medium pink amethyst in color and was in perfect condition. The bottle (Ring/Ham, C-223), 9 1/4 inches tall, featured a smooth base and applied tapered collar mouth.

"Only two or three are known to exist in amethyst," Hagenbuch said of the bottle, adding, "The others are so dark a strong light is needed just to see the color. That is not the case here. The color in this one explodes in normal lighting and is consistent throughout. Many bitters collectors had been waiting for this bottle. Some called it the 'Holy Grail' of the Ballantine collec-

The St. Drake's 1860 Plantation X Bitters bottle (Ring/Ham, D-105), just shy of 10 inches tall and manufactured in New York around 1862, boasted a medium moss green cabin, a smooth base and applied tapered collar mouth. A small chip off the inside edge of the lip and some light external staining on the front panel were its only flaws.

"The St. Drake's bottle was recently 'picked' at the Elephant Trunk flea mar-

ket in Connecticut – a favored venue of the Flea Market Flip reality TV show," Hagenbuch said. "It's possibly only the second known example in this unusual moss green color. In 1993 we auctioned the collection of Elmer Smith of Shelton, Washington. Lot 20 in that collection was at that time the only moss green Drake's Plantation Bitters known and it sold for \$10,000. This one brought \$4,000 more."

The pattern molded globular bottle made by the Zanesville Glass Works in Ohio was medium yellow olive in color and had a 24-rib pattern swirled to the right. The 8-inch-tall bottle (McK/Wil, color plate V), (Barrett, pg. 54), had a pontil scarred base and outward rolled lip.

"This classic Zanesville swirl was in a very rare and absolutely gorgeous color that remained constant throughout," Hagenbuch said, "and the pattern remained bold even to the pontil. With the exception of a very few scratches, it was in pristine perfect condition." The bottle came out of the Don Spangler collection and had been acquired from Jim Vitners in 1973, he add-

An H. P. Herb Wild Cherry Bitters bottle (circa 1885-1893, made in Reading, Pa.), in the motif of a cherry tree, changed hands for \$9,000. The 10 1/4 inch tall bottle (Ring/Ham, H-93) had an olive yellow cabin, a smooth base and a tooled double collar mouth. "The bottle was quite rare in this pleasing coloration, and a very minor base flaw was non-offensive," Hagenbuch pointed out. "How rare is the color? Only two have been sold at auction in the last 25-years, that's how rare."

A John Moffat (N.Y.) Phoenix Bitters bottle ("Price 1 Dollar"), made between



1835 and 1850 and with a medium emerald green coloration, finished at \$8,000. The 5 34 inch bottle (Ring/Ham, M-113) had a pontil scarred base, an outward rolled lip and was in perfect condition. "This bottle was in an extremely rare pure green color that is not recorded in Bitters Bottles by Ring/ Ham," Hagenbuch said. It's one of the best. No Moffat Bitters collection would be complete without it."

A double font teakettle ink bottle (Mathews, M427U), made in America between 1875 and 1890, opaque milk glass with applied mother of pearl panes, each segmented by a thin amethyst colored band, changed hands for \$3,250. The 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch tall, 8-sided bottle had a smooth base and ground lips. Both fonts had the original fancy embossed brass neck rings and

"Double font teakettles are extremely rare, as few were ever made, and this one was near perfect," Hagenbuch said. "The right font contained the traditional black ink while the left contained a red. This was evident by traces of each color being on the inside of the lips. We auctioned this teakettle in 2002 when we sold the Bob Mebane collection. At the time it was the only known example, and we believe it remains so today."



"The secret of finding valuable Pez dispensers is simple," says collectibles expert Tony Hyman. "In the mid-1980s, feet were added to make the characters stand up better. Pez with feet seldom have much value. But nearly all Pez without feet bring at least \$10 or more. And, one in three from the 1960s are worth \$100."

If you have a "Make-a-Face" PEZ on its original card you can put a whopping \$2,500 in your pocket. This rarest of PEZ dispensers had detachable parts so that children could make their own PEZ faces, in the style of Mr. Potato Head. Also valuable, and up to \$5,000, are dispensers with a shooting star on the side instead of the PEZ name.

"To be valuable to a collector, PEZ dispensers must work and be in perfect condition," Hyman said. "The polystyrene used to mold the dispensers often melted when two dispensers were stored in contact with each other. Melt marks are a kiss of death."

Though PEZ is available in 20 countries everything is made in Connecticut. To make all that PEZ, the factory goes through 50,000 pounds of sugar every four days which is compressed with 3,000 pounds of pressure to form the tiny candies. Nearly 12 million pieces of PEZ candy is produced daily.

A visitor's center opened at the factory in 2011, offering tours to the 4,000 square-foot facility and within the confines is the most comprehensive of PEZ memorabilia on public display in the world. And the tours, officials at the company say, spawn collectors of the dispensers themselves.

Mike Binkley of Montgomery, Ohio, is a perfect example of one who took the tour through the PEZ company and became enthralled with dispensers overnight. Binkley has an entire den dedicated to his hobby of collecting PEZ dispensers. His collection totals 3,800. Characters that line the many shelves of this den include Marilyn Monroe, Harry Potter, Luigi of Mario Brothers, Darth Vader, Sponge Bob, Minnie Mouse and Donald Duck. These examples didn't cost an arm or a leg.

On the other hand, Binkley has taken the occasional plunge to purchase a few high-dollar PEZ dispensers to add to his collection, such as a footless Rooster dispenser he paid \$125 for, a Hello Kitty test piece \$135, a Long Faced Clown (\$200), Candy Shooter (shaped like a gun, he paid \$200, now valued at \$350), Psychedelic Eye in Hand (\$200) and Brutus from Popeye (\$110) just to name a few.

Binkley has dispensers from the 1950s, like Popeye and Pinocchio, a Bicentennial set featuring Uncle Sam, Betsy Ross and a bloodied Minuteman. He is also on the lookout for error PEZ dispensers, for they hold high value to any collection. His "error" pieces include a Santa Claus with no face, a Mario Brothers with no nose and a Groot (the tree monster in 'Guardians of the Galaxy') facing backwards in its package

"My wife and I attend a few PEZ shows and conventions each year," Binkley said. "At a show in Chicago, one collector paid \$20,000 for one with a lemon head sporting a blue hat and blue classes. It was part of the "Crazy Fruit" series in the mid-1970s that was discontinued. At the same show one guy sold a PEZ from the 1970s that featured an 18th-century admiral wearing a powdered wig and cocked hat for \$30,000. There are people out there with deep pockets and whose collections are just as deep."

Modern day PEZ dispensers have garnered much attention, like the 2007 Limited Edition of three dispensers honoring the 80th birthday of Mickey **Right:** In 2007, PEZ produced the Elvis Presley Limited Edition dispensers in a 3-pack set. Today they're valued at \$100.

Below: Released in 1955, these full-body PEZ dispensing robots pre-date the character head dispensers we know of today. One of these in average condition can be worth \$300-\$500 on eBay. One in mint condition and still in the original package will increase the value to \$1,000.



Below: If you've never spotted this PEZ dispenser before you're not alone. This set is a rare prototype made for a PEZ employee's wedding and was never released to the public at large. Needless to say it's worth thousands.



Mouse. There were 400,000 made worldwide and the tin containing the three dispensers are numbered. First is Steamboat Willie from 1928, then a Mickey Mouse from 1940 and the current one of Mickey in 2000. These were sold for \$49 for the set and today they're valued at \$150.

PEZ captured the modern day limelight when a PEZ dispenser made an appearance on the History Channel's hit series Pawn Stars. The PEZ dispenser in question in the 2019 episode is a 1956 PEZ space ray gun, made the year before the toy character heads were introduced to the United States market. Pawn Stars store owners offered \$300 for the dispenser.

Right: Released in 1979 was this Crazy Fruit Pineapple PEZ dispenser, which sold for a whopping \$2,247 on eBay last year. The item only enjoyed a short time on the market due to a child safety issue.

Far Right: This Make-A-Face PEZ dispenser is worth roughly \$4,000, so long as you have all its parts. These Mr. Potato-style dispenser came with removable parts that allowed kids to rearrange their pieces.







Above Left: PEZ still produces dispensers, like this baseball theme. They sell for roughly \$2 and collectors are after these modern beauties.

Above Right: "Das Feine Pfefferminz". PEZ began as a mint long before becoming a candy dispensing icon. Advertising posters adorned stories across the globe. Pfefferminz is the German word meaning "peppermint".


