Friends call him 'Derby Harry' due to his collection

The 146th running of the Kentucky Derby is now in the record books with Authentic coming down the homestretch as the winner in this most unusual of Derbys. The event, which normally is held in May was moved to September due to the pandemic. But, even the date change didn't help as the event ended up happening without the usual 150,000 raging fans at Churchhill Downs. There were no souvenirs, no programs and no mint juleps enjoyed at Louisville this year.

But there is one collector's item as coveted today as it has been for decades – the Kentucky Derby glass. And perhaps no one's collection is as monstrous as the one belonging to Harry Goldberg of LaGrange, Ky. His Derby memorabilia totals 4,700 pieces, including 1,800 drinking glasses and almost every Derby Festival pin.

When he began collecting Kentucky Derby memorabilia 22 years ago, Goldberg thought it would be a fun, cheap hobby. "Twenty-two years ago I was working parttime at an auction house and saw these glasses come through, selling at three for two dollars, five for three dollars," said Goldberg, who lives just 22 miles from Churchill Downs but has never attended a race there. "Right then I thought I could get into this cheap, affordable hobby. Derby glasses from the 1980s and 1990s were reasonable, but things got more expensive when I went back in time. To this day my collection goes back to 1945"

The 'birth' of the Derby glass is a rather odd one. After the 1938 Kentucky Derby, the Churchill Downs staff noticed they were short more than a few water glasses. Fans, it turned out, were stealing the glasses to take home as souvenirs of their big day at the races.

Officials at the track had an idea: rather than continue to lose glassware to pilfering fans, why not make a special glass they could sell to fans to commemorate the day?

Churchill Downs took that idea to Harry Stevens. Stevens had built a successful business as a catering company for sporting venues. The next year (1939), Churchill Downs offered the first-ever commemorative Kentucky Derby glass. The next two years a true julep glass was produced for general distribution and these are the most valuable, ranging from \$6,000 to \$16,000 depending on the condition and variation. There are few of these in existence.

The drink they chose to serve in the glass was the mint julep. The julep started out in Virginia as a high society beverage served in goblets with brandy or rum. The poorer denizens of Kentucky chose to mix the drink with a more proletariat liquor – bourbon.

World War II made glass hard to find tumblers were made in an aluminum version for 1940 and 1941 and a Bakelite version for 1941 to 1944. Bakelite glasses can fetch up to \$2,500 and up depending on the color.

Selling the drinks in the special glasses more than tripled drink sales at the track after that. In the early years, there were fewer than 100,000 commemorative glasses made. Today, more than 700,000 are made each year.

Goldberg's oldest Derby glass is the 71st running for the Kentucky Derby, held on June 9, 1945. The race was won by Hoop Jr. and was ridden by jockey Eddie Arcaro.

He has glasses from all Kentucky Derbys but two: 1951 and 1959. His collection is full of glass misprints and imperfections, which drastically increases the value of those glasses.

"Some of my favorites are the mistake glasses," he said. "Variations with typographical errors, like Triple Crown titles attributed to the wrong horse, or difference in the image, like a horse missing a tail. Some of the 1982 glasses omitted the red star which indicated that Genuine Risk was a filly. The 1971 glass had Cananaro II on it but roughly 500 glasses were made without the Roman numeral on it. Mistakes glasses are out there."



Advertising galore at Indy Ad show and auction

LEBANON, Ind. – The Indiana antiques show, and auction venues will come back to life at the Boone County Fairgrounds with more than 250-antique advertising and toy dealers from around the country setting up for the Indy Ad Show on Sept. 25, followed by a 350-lot auction on Sept. 26

The popular show and auction, sponsored by Route 32 Auctions, is the first large event at the Boone County Fairgrounds since closure earlier this year due to the COVID-19 virus. In Indiana, any event drawing more than 250 persons required by the state to file a safety plan to ensure precautions.

Route 32 Auctions Consignments Director Joe Canchola said the company's plans to protect dealers and customers at both events has been approved by health department officials. Masks will be required at the events, while hand sanitizing stations will be available at all three fairground buildings. Extra staff will be assigned inside the buildings

Upcycling is the name of the game at Three Bs Finderys

BRANCHVILLE, N.J. —On Route 206 just across the road from Culver Lake, there is a wonderland for antiquers and collectors.

Three Bs Finderys, the brainchild and passion of Danielle Scarpulla Dippel, Jennifer Dahl Domarecki and Lori Campbell, has a wide variety of collecting and decorating opportunities, along with some very imaginative creations that are quite irresistible.

The operation includes a flea market, an outdoor display area for large objects and a barn that serves as an antiques center. Much of the material for sale is the product of up-cycling, the B's philosophy and guiding practice. Up-cycling, also known as creative reuse, is the transformation of by-products, waste materials, and useless or unwanted products into new materials of greater quality and value. In other words, the Bs turn trash into treasure.

Dippel, Domarecki and Campbell are neighbors in the nearby lake community and met while attending town events in 2015. They rented the property on which their operation is located and later bought it and went to work making it a destination for things both useful and fanciful. Their philosophy is that saving things from winding up in the landfill is an urgent and worthwhile activity.

"People may think it's garbage and not worth anything", Dippel says, "but we see those things as possibilities. We are hoping to attract a new generation of enthusiasts who would be drawn to these objects, knowing that they came from the past and have some life left in them. We want to be the ones to create this new life."

The results of this thinking and the

owners' skillful efforts are clever, amusing and attractive items such as dresser harps turned into shelves, fanciful flower stands, metal table bases and cabinets filled with unusual containers and accessories.

Three Bs Finderys is open Friday through Sunday, from Spring until the end of the year. One highlight is their famous Christmas tree sale. Special events will be ongoing. There is a rotating display of work by local artists and free Appraisal Days. The Bs plan to expand these events in the future

Three Bs Finderys has a website (threebsfinderys.com) and a Facebook page, and you can find them on Instagram and Pinterest. They are always looking for sources of material they can infuse with new life.





continually wiping down tables and other interior features. Social distancing will also be suggested.

"We've had a lot of questions about whether the show is on, and everything is going as planned," Canchola said. The auction scheduled at 4:30 p.m. on Sept. 26 will also be hosted by Proxibid and LiveAuctioneers bidding platforms.

"We'll be offering phone bidding and absentee bids," Canchola said. "There may be some people who are not comfortable yet in large crowds, so we want to offer as many options as possible."

The auction will offer a myriad of petroliana signage, gasoline globes, vending machines, and vintage advertis-



"The market for automotive advertising is pretty hot right now," Canchola said. "I think we're going to have a good turn-out. There's a lot of people who want to get out after being cooped up with this virus ordeal."

Canchola said Route 32 Auctions, whose owners Kevin and Jill Parker recently purchased Showtime Auctions of Ann Arbor, is now looking to "build up" the company's interest in country store advertising. As a result, there will be plenty of old-time store items in the auction. The material for the auction has been sourced from throughout the coun-

"There should be something for everybody," Canchola said, referring specifically to the auction. "We'll have items for the beginning collector, up to the person who has collected for 40 and 50 years. On the high end of the sale, there will be signs that should sell for between \$15,000 and \$20,000."

One of those signs, found in an early Ford dealership in Minnesota, is a rare diecut porcelain Ford Service sign shaped in the fashion of an antique radiator. Measuring 29 inches by 21 inches, the sign is estimated at \$10,000-\$20,000.

Another large sign, measuring 60 inches by 60 inches, is a Long Island

Duckling sign, with great graphics. Ducks, initially imported from Peking, China, to the east-end of New York City, were a popular choice among restaurant chefs in the 1900s, "admired for its quick maturation and tender flesh," according

to the publication, Modern Farmer.

By the 1970s, however, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation set stricter regulations on land use, subsequently causing as many as three-fourths of the farms to go out of business or move to the Midwest.

Later, skyrocketing Hampton real estate prices, urban sprawl and numerous complaints of neighbors about the pungent smell of duck droppings resulted in the demise of Long Island Ducklings.

Consequently, the sign is considered rare, and is expected to sell for \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Whenever a style comes back 'in' collectors are ready

Sometimes, the best inspiration for using old things in new ways pops up from people who surround themselves with new things. And sometimes, not so much. As such, what follows are two hits and a near miss.

Inspiration number one, which happens to be a "hit," came my way in an email a few weeks ago. Because I am a longtime lover of jewelry, it got my attention. "The Brooch is Back' it read. My first thought was, "Back from where?" Then came the thought, "What's the difference between a





brooch and a pin? And finally, why do people confuse "brooch" with "broach"? Is there a difference? I decided to read

What followed was a rather lengthy discussion of the history of brooches, beginning with fasteners used in the Bronze Age and going through centuries of jewelry fashion until the Modern Era. I started collecting brooches back in the 1950s, and I still wear some of my childhood favorites, including my Christmas-themed pins. Then there's my modest collection of milk glass jewelry which I began years ago when an AntiqueWeek reader pointed out how even the least expensive pins sold in dime stores featured handset stones. I have some rather interesting examples of costume jewelry, pins left behind by various grandmothers (mine and others). And more importantly, there are the cameos passed down to me. For fun, I have a voluminous collection of poodle pins, assembled over the decades, a reminder of the little

sometimes in groupings, because life is short. All of which means that I'm happy to see that I am somewhere between the old trend and ahead of the next one. As to the other two questions, there's not much difference between what we call a "brooch" and a "pin." But a broach is entirely different, having to do with machinery and drilling holes

Inspiration number two, another "hit." Online decorating articles indicate that houseplants are once again in vogue, not only for their decorative purposes but also because they're good for the environment. I can't remember a time when I have not shared my air with living green things. And although I did not inherit my maternal grandmother's African violet gene, I continue to nurture the descendant of a cast-iron plant that she had at least 75 years ago. A bit of research reveals that it's a variegated screw-pine, native to the Pacific islands. How it came her way we have no idea. Whereas it is often considered undesirable as a houseplant because of its spiky leaf edges, let me just say that it's indestructible and easily separated for cuttings.

But even if you don't own a "vintage" plant from cuttings handed down over the generations, consider displaying your own cacti and Norfolk pines, philodendra and peace lilies in an antique or vintage container. Jarenideres made by Weller, RRPC (not to be confused with Roseville Pottery), and Baltimore's Edwin Bennett Pottery, among others, provide a regal presentation to my flora. What better way to display collectible pottery than using it as it was first intended? A reminder: don't overlook protective liners.

Finally, there's the "miss". . .well, at least a partial "miss," as some decorators are suggesting that, in order to save space, now's the time to lose that

piece of furniture that sits in front of the sofa(s). But think of this: The idea of a coffee table dates to Victorian times, when a central table was the focal point of the parlor. Banishing something that has long served a function, even if it's not for serving coffee, seems like a bad idea.

On the other hand, the idea of using something other than a table might be a good one. Use your imagination: There are a variety of vintage pieces that can be repurposed to hold books, cheese plates, and unique souvenirs. There are limits, though. Within the past month, I read an article that suggested using such diverse pieces as oversized drums and chicken cages (I am not making this up). On the other hand, might I suggest an old chest (which offers extra storage)? Any sug-

wo Cats claw past estimate to \$49,200 at Nye

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. — When asked for his take on why the July 8 online-only auction performed well beyond expectation on many lots, John Nye replied, "Fresh, diverse merchandise, conservative estimates, and good advertising yielded a nice solid sale. People are now comfortable bidding online and we had three different internet platforms. Considering the environment we are now in we had a solid sale and we are pleased."

The advertisement he referred to was a full page image of a George III inlaid mahogany linen press wearing a blue face mask. The ad said it all; high quality with limited up-close and personal previewing. Although a few prospective bidders made appointments to preview at the auction house the greater majority viewed online.

The top lot of the sale soared past its presale estimate of \$1,500 to \$2,500 to a hefty \$49,200. The Japanese mixed media on paper work of art, titled "Two Cats," measured 13 inches high by 17 1/2 inches wide and depicted two cats in a reclining position. It was signed, "Foujita," which likely referred to Leonard Tsuguharu Foujita, (1886-1968). Foujita, a Japanese-French painter and printmaker, was born in Tokyo. He is known for his Japanese ink techniques applied to Western aesthetic paintings and is one of the most applauded Japanese artists who worked in the West during the 20th century.

An oil on canvas abstract painting by Herbert Bayer (American, 1900-1985) was titled, "Convolutions in Grey," and was signed, 1.1. Herbert Bayer and dated 51. The 23 ½ inch high by 29 ½ inch wide painting portrayed a swirling ribbon effect in tones of grey with accents of blue and red. It sold for \$22,140, far surpassing the estimate of \$2,500 to \$3,500.

Although art took the top two lots, the diversity of the sale was impressive and high prices were realized in all genres. Period furniture and decorative items included a pair of English George III giltwood wall sconces from the late 18th to the early 19th century. The sconces were





One of oldest American homes headed for auction

PHILADELPHIA – One of the oldest homes in America – located on America's Oldest Occupied Residential Street - in the old city section of town where shipwrights, silversmiths and glassblowers once lived and heroes of the Revolutionary once walked - will be sold in an online auction on Sept. 24.

"The whole street is a museum, from the cobblestones to the beautiful brick facades," auctioneer Bob Dann from the Max Spann Real Estate and Auction Co., says. "I can see a person who loves history buying the place for a weekend getaway as it is move-in ready. It is a real opportunity to own a piece of his-

The three-level home, not counting the full basement, at 139 Elfreth's Alley in the Old City section of historic Philadelphia, was constructed in 1703. It is the first house to have been built on the alley named after Jeremiah Elfreth, a blacksmith and early land developer.

It is only three blocks from the city's wharf, a short walk from the Liberty Bell, Penn's Landing and neighbor Betsy Ross's house.

The 900-square-foot home will be sold

with several antique period pieces within the house. Historic artifacts and furniture include old flags, a rocking chair and several paintings.

The current owner, Alfred Krawitz, has owned the home since the 1970s, according to Dann, adding he "has maintained it beautifully." The home, which is on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places, features trinity spiral stairs, rare moldings, mortise and tenon construction, two original fireplaces, cedar shingles, exposed brick walls and even an antique outhouse, Dann said.

At the same time, it has an updated bath and kitchen, in addition to central air. The house, which has been previously presented for sale at \$1.2 million, will be offered at a minimum bid of \$600,000. "It is guaranteed to sell at or above the minimum bid on Sept. 24,"

Elfreth's Alley, which is anchored by the home for sale, is a tourist attraction and a rare example of 18th century working class housing. Among the alley's residents were tradesmen and their families, including shipwrights, silver and pewter smiths, glass blowers

and furniture builders.

Throughout the 300 years of history, the area surrounding Elfreth's Alley radically changed into a more industrial cityscape due, primarily to its location near the city's waterfront. Many of the new residents moving into the alley were successive waves of immigrants, lured by nearby jobs.

In 1934, the Elfreth's Alley Association (EAA) was founded to preserve the alley's historic structures, saving the row houses from impending destruction. There are 32 houses on the street, which were built between 1703 and 1836.

For more than 70 years, Elfreth's Alley has celebrated "Fete Day" in early June, which celebrates the Alley's diverse ethnic heritage. Residents open



elaborately embellished with oval mirror backings that were topped with an urn and floral decoration and each held two candles. They were an imposing 38 inches high and achieved \$11,685, outdistancing the estimate of \$2,000 to \$4,000.

A classic Chippendale reverse-serpentine mahogany chest of drawers, Massachusetts, 1760-1790, more than tripled the high estimate when it realized \$9,840. The piece carried an important provenance from the late John Walton, New York City, who was a highly respected figure in the field of early American antiques.

A pair of north German bronze lions that dated to the late 15th century brought \$9,225, against a \$1,000 to \$2,000 estimate. Each was mounted on a plinth and stood 8 inches tall overall. They were portrayed in a seated position with one paw on the ground and another on a round ball.

Jewelry was highlighted by a late Vic-

torian necklace by Carlo & Arthur Giuliano. It was created in the Renaissance style, designed with black and white enamel tapered links that were set with diamond, pearl, enamel, bezel set old cut diamonds, and seed pearls. The total diamond weight was approximately .26 carats. The elaborate piece sold with a presentation case and commanded \$8,610.

The large selection of silver had much to offer. One standout was an English sterling silver chamberstick that stood on three low scroll feet and had an understated scroll handle. The piece was minimalistic in its presentation, standing 8 inches tall with a 5 inch diameter, but showed several hallmarks. It soared past the estimate of \$100 to \$200 to yield \$6,400.

A lot that was comprised of two Chinese carved hardstone seals and a Chinese carved jade ornament sold well beyond expectation. The 19th to 20th century grouping measured 3 ¼ to 4 inches high and was estimated at a conservative \$300 to \$500, but flew past those figures to realize a strong



Another one of Goldman's prized possessions, and sets that few collectors have, are color-by-color production glasses.

In addition to having Kentucky Derby glasses, he's obtained glasses from the Arkansas Derby, Florida Derby, Louisiana Derby, Pennsylvania Derby and others.

His collection also includes an extensive collection of Louisville Stoneware pottery, including coffee mugs, an ashtray and a lemonade pitcher.

And not just official merchandise, either. If it has to do with horse racing, it's in the room somewhere. There are several shelves of bobble-head dolls, representing trainers and jockeys. There are media passes, owners' passes and ticket stubs tucked in a drawer. He has a special glass case containing nothing but Secretariat memorabilia.

A large part of his collection is dedicated to Kentucky Derby Festival

"All I'm missing in the 1973 pin," he said. "It's the rarest."

It is also the first pin, and according to the Kentucky Derby Festival website, it will cost about \$1,000.

There are boxes and boxes of pins stacked on the floor and in display cases. There are metal pins, pins featuring different sponsors and pins for specific events.

But glasses dominate Goldberg's

collection. From Derby shot glasses to wine glasses, plastic to aluminum. The variety is stunning.

Goldberg prefers to hunt for his collectibles. He searches yard sales, flea markets and estate sales. He rarely travels very far to fetch the items. For Goldberg, the "chase" for the glasses is more precious than the "ownership" of them.

"I have so many memories with my collection," he said. "So many people have found items and given me pieces, or they told me where I could get

them. I won't mind trading someone for a glass, as long as I don't break up a two- or three- glass set. And I'll gladly add to my collection, as long as it's something good, something I don't have or just a rare oddball."

Just one bedroom of the Goldberg house is dedicated to Harry's passion. These items could easily fill another room and the living room. His wife, Bonnie, doesn't share the enthusiasm for his hobby and simply reminds her husband to "always keep the door to that room closed."


