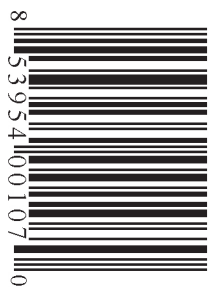

Author seeks to bring Rookwood history to life

An economic downturn, a global pandemic, and changing tastes: For America's first female-founded, female-owned manufacturing company, confronting these recurring challenges has been nothing new for 140 years. Having been put to the test many times since its brave beginnings in 1880, Rookwood Pottery, the birthplace of American art pottery, continues to endure. While the market for newly made pieces is brisk, collectors, young and old, continue to cherish wares made decades ago.

There has been no shortage of books written about the Cincinnati-based company, including Herbert Peck's 1968 definitive history of the firm's achievements (*The Book of Rookwood Pottery*). But a recently published book on the subject takes a new look at the company and its wares, as viewed from a 21st-century perspective. *Rookwood: The Rediscovery and Revival of an American Icon* by Bob Batchelor examines a number of themes relevant to a new generation of collectors and, at the same time, sets the record straight on some misperceptions.

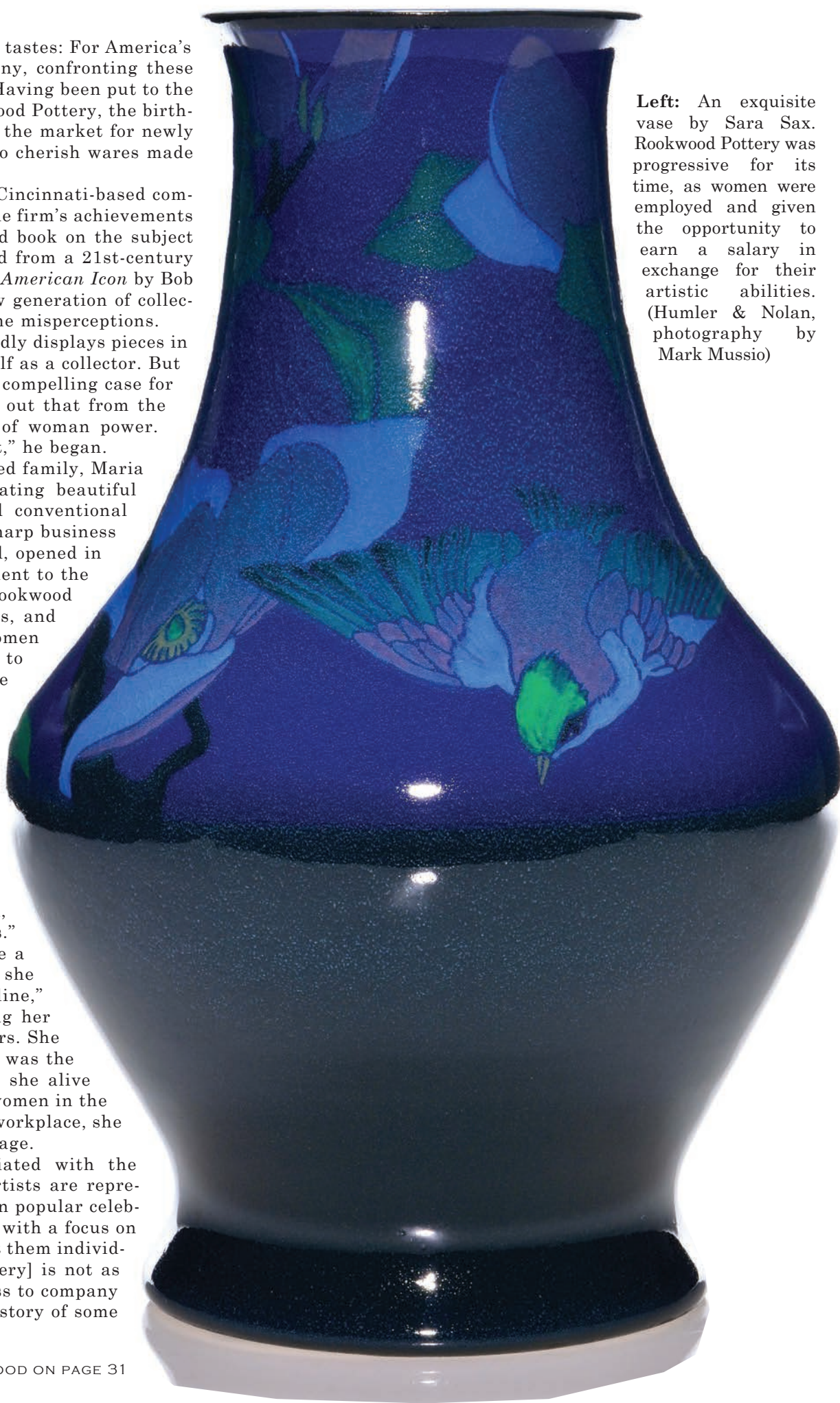
Although he celebrates the beauty of Rookwood and proudly displays pieces in his Cincinnati home, Batchelor hesitates to identify himself as a collector. But in his role as a cultural historian and author, he makes a compelling case for the pottery's relevance. In a phone interview, he pointed out that from the beginning, the story of Rookwood has always been one of woman power. "Female empowerment is a strong and important part of it," he began.

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, to a wealthy and well-connected family, Maria Longworth Nichols Storer (1849-1932) grew up appreciating beautiful things. As a young woman, she ignored naysayers and conventional norms when she combined her background in art with a sharp business acumen. The result was her own pottery studio, Rookwood, opened in 1880 (40 years before the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution) and was named after her childhood home. Rookwood produced utilitarian wares as well as hand-painted pieces, and although Maria hired men, her interest in giving other women an opportunity to earn money, as well as the chance to express themselves artistically, was progressive for the time. She stayed true to her wish that "the potter's wheel will be turned by woman-power."

Success came early. Within a decade of its founding, Rookwood won its first international medal, competing against European and Asian firms, many of which had been established hundreds of years before. By the turn of the century, the Rookwood Pottery was arguably the most famous producer of art pottery in the United States, known for its fine glazes and striking designs, thanks in large part to Maria's emphasis on experimentation.

Maria, Batchelor noted, was a "complex person." Indeed, "a goal of the book is to give a fuller sense of who she was." Although she was backed by family money ("she would be a member of what we would call 'the upper one percent,'" she was "not a dilettante." That, he asserted, is "an old story line," one without basis. Not only was she not afraid of getting her hands dirty, she literally loved the feel of clay in her fingers. She was a talented pianist and had a lovely singing voice; she was the author of several novels and spoke five languages. Were she alive today, Batchelor noted, "She'd be one of the most famous women in the world." But in spite of her strong support of women in the workplace, she was, herself, uncertain about the wisdom of women's suffrage.

Batchelor explained that the depth of talent associated with the Rookwood Pottery was remarkable. Even "second tier" artists are represented in museums, he pointed out. But unlike today, when popular celebrity is culturally important, the pottery was not marketed with a focus on its artists. Consequently, "we know virtually nothing about them individually." He added, "The paper trail [of the Rookwood Pottery] is not as deep as a historian would hope," even though he had access to company and private archives. Were it possible to bring to life the story of some of the artists, to add some context to

Tom Irwin estate will be larger than life offering

TUPELO, Miss. — Although this small northeastern Mississippi city still lives in the broad shadow of Elvis, there was one man – a bon vivant extraordinaire – who took the town by storm and died taking it by storm.

Tom Irwin arrived in Tupelo in 1980, a recent graduate from the University of Mississippi’s school of pharmacy. For the next 35 years he worked as a pharmacist. However, after a serious fall in his home, he immersed himself into civic work throughout Tupelo, Lee County and northeast Mississippi.

A talented pianist and organist, he loved nothing better than southern gospel music. His flamboyancy in dress and manners stood out in staid Tupelo; but his home soon became a landmark of culture, eccentricities, fine dining and the most elaborate Christmas parties of the city’s past 25 years.

“Tom had a lot to do with everything that is Tupelo,” Steve Holland, a long-time friend and the funeral director at his service told the local Daily Journal. “I met Tom in 1980. He was a dashing young man who’d come to Tupelo, taking it by storm. And he died taking it by storm.”

Evans died Aug. 5 in a hospice unit at North Mississippi Medical Center after being admitted to the hospital on July 26

with pneumonia. He was 72 years old.

Only hours before Evans died, Churchill Downs in Louisville, Ky., declared Aug. 5 as “Tom Evans Day” with photographs displayed on each jumbotron at the park.

Evans began hosting an annual Kentucky Derby Day party at his house 25 years ago as a fundraiser for the Regional Rehabilitation Center in Tupelo. Replete with Derby Regalia, mint juleps, hats,

foods (including Derby pie) and music, the party soon became a big fundraiser for the organization. It was also

Lost & Forged makes upcycling fun and attractive

I already knew the business “Lost & Forged” was all about reclaiming metal objects and reshaping them. And I own some of Doug Heifetz’s transformations that have produced surprising and interesting upcycled objects. But this is what, until very recently, I didn’t know: Not only does Doug craft beautiful handmade jewelry, but he also creates very swanky furniture.

Some background information here. I first met the imaginative silversmith just over two years ago at the Baltimore Art, Antique & Jewelry Show, where his booth, one among hundreds of others, caught my eye.

From the beginning, I loved his rings and bracelets, necklaces and pendants, much of which is made from vintage silver flatware. And then there are those distinctive pieces that were originally Harley-Davidson fender trim. Even though I didn’t purchase them, I admired his wall hooks, wall sconces, and iPhone stands. And then there were the figural sculptures of crickets and crabs (Doug lives in the Maryland suburbs of Washington, D.C.).

These days, with the cancellation of many events, “Lost & Forged” is relying heavily on the internet, engaging loyal followers with quizzes, images of new designs, and the occasional (and welcomed) note of encouragement. And then there was that one email



that mentioned coffee tables made from vintage metal travel trunks. I decided to find out what that was all about.

I called Doug, and we got to talking about the Before Times, when the “Lost & Forged” mobile boutique was a regular fixture at a variety of local shows. To display his wares, as well as to provide him a place to sit down, Doug relied on metal trunks. At every show, he laughed, there would always be at least one shopper who wanted to purchase those components of his booth, which got him to thinking.

As it happens, Doug has been making furniture for himself and his family for a while now. And having recently moved, he needed something to place in front of his sofa, hence the coffee tables. Doug posted them online as a “tease,” and, long story short, he now has to figure out something else for his living room (someone bought them on the spot). They’re not quite ready

a chance for Evans to meet and greet people, play his baby grand piano and give tours throughout his eclectic home. “He lived in a 1920 bungalow,” according to another good friend, Auctioneer

Dwight Stevens of Aberdeen, Miss. “And he loved to buy, and he had a great eye. He’d buy something at one of my auctions and, I always asked him, ‘Tom, where you going to put that?’” He always said, he’d find a place. I can’t guess how many times he added rooms onto the bungalow to store all his antiques.”

Evans was always updating his obituary and making changes to his funeral procession, according to both Holland and Stevens.

“It’s a tough one for me,” Stevens admits. “After he left the pharmacy, he worked for me and we traveled to Europe several times. He had so much of charisma and such joy in life. When he approached me with selling his estate, I refused. “Oh, he said,” you’ll want to.”

The auction is scheduled for Oct. 17-18, with much of the proceeds from the 40-year collection going to the Regional Rehabilitation Center in Tupelo. Although Stevens hasn’t yet got into digging through Evans’ estate, he knows there will be a huge quantity of American Fostoria glass, china, crystal, sterling silver, 19th century lighting, Persian and Oriental rugs, , distinctive antique furniture (including much Victorian-ware and accessories and lots of fine art.

The music room, which was often the hive of activity within the Tupelo home, contains two 12-foot Grand pianos (one a Steinway), a pipe organ, Hammond electronic organ, fiddles, guitars and other musical instruments.

There will be more than 1,000 items sold during the auction, Stevens said. “I know it’s going to be good stuff, because that’s all that Tom would buy,” Stevens said. “Some of his worst pieces would be

lead pieces in another auction. He didn’t miss anything ... he knew something about everything. He had this uncanny memory, a particular charm and - even though he walked with a cane during the last part of his life – he never let anything get in his way of living life to the fullest.”

cedar and felt, so the tables will have “visual, tactile, and olfactory appeal.” There’s more: the console table, with a wooden top and bottom supported by two vintage chrome fire extinguishers; the demi lune table with brass wire inlay; and the bar-height table he made using the front grill from a ’69 Ford. “I’m not sure what I was thinking at the time I bought that,” he said of the vintage car part, “maybe a giant Hanukkah menorah.”

(Doug was a rabbi before deciding he wanted to “bend things.”) Needless to say, Doug has more ideas for custom-crafted furniture, which he describes as “industrial” in style, working well with a mid-century décor. I would suggest that a little bit of metal perks up a room full of “brown” furniture. He reminded me, “It was never my goal just to make jewelry.”

Meanwhile, “Lost and Forged” devotees are still buying jewelry during these unusual times. Doug’s designs make thoughtful gifts, holiday and otherwise (shh! don’t tell my college Little Sister!). And a lot of his customers are treating themselves. I can confirm the fact that his creations look nice on Zoom calls, all the while brightening personal spirits.

2-gallon Hamilton crock stored a \$1,293 bid

WAYNESBURG, Pa. — After living in the massive 1905 Charles Grant Heasley House in Waynesburg for 15 years, Nick Carbonara and his family felt it was time to downsize. On Aug. 15, Carbonara had West Virginia auctioneer Joe R. Pyle offer his 20-room dream house and personal antique collections to the highest bidder.

The three-story 6,000 square foot Chateausque home with carriage house, por-cochere and swimming pool on an acre lot, sold two hours into the sale. The house located 50 miles south of Pittsburgh, listed for \$339,000 on an internet real estate site. Two days before the sale, the high bid was \$75,000. An hour before the sale, the bid doubled to \$150,000. That rose to \$225,000 at noon. Bidding crept up at \$10,000 increments, then settled in at \$5,000 increases. An internet bidder outlasted the competition and bought the house for \$297,000, a price that includes a 10 percent buyer's premium. The buyer's premium rose to 15 percent for the non-real estate lots and is included in selling prices quoted here.

Eighty percent of the 275 lots from inside the house sold for under \$100. Two exceptional lots were over \$1,000 with

three others topping \$500. The high dollar lots clustered in the furniture, pottery and lighting categories.

The top personal property item was a circa 1875 2-gallon stoneware crock with stenciled cobalt decoration and inscribed "James Hamilton & Co./EAGLE POTTERY/Greensboro, PA," which sold for \$1,293. Pre-sale bidders showed their cards early when it came to a Victorian Golden Oak double hall tree with seat and beveled mirror. It went into the sale with an opening bid of \$400 and emerged at \$1,178.

A full-size Eastlake burl walnut bed with paneled and carved headboard and

footboard was part of a set that included a three-over-two mirrored dresser with a marble top and a small marble-top washstand lacking a towel bar. The bed sold for \$862, the dresser for \$316 and the washstand for \$488.

A massive Victorian oak sideboard sold for \$747. Almost every open area on the three drawer, two-door server was filled with machine-made applied molding. Two serpent-form shelves stood on either side of the serving deck in front of a large, beveled mirror. A slag glass table lamp labeled Tiffany-style featured a segmented shade filled with swags, curlicues and foliate decoration on an incised base, the lamp sold for \$632. The lamp's success may have helped a slag glass boudoir lamp that was next in the lineup. Floor bidders were all over the small Tiffany style lamp with a shade filled with bell flowers, floral urns and swags. The small lamp sold for \$442.

Bidders get last chance at Shetler Dairy memorabilia

KALKASKA, Mich. — You know you are in the country when you see a “Cattle Xing” sign. When you look across the road from that sign and see the likeness of a Holstein cow fashioned from items from around the farm, you know you have arrived at what was formerly the Shetler Family Dairy in Kalkaska.

Established in 1979 by George and Sally Shetler, the dairy quickly became know for its quality milk, yogurt, and ice cream products that were delivered to schools and sold in stores for miles around. In his opening announcements, Auctioneer Jim Lambert reminisced, “This is kind of a hard day today because I have known George for 30 years. George had a dream and that was to milk cows. He said that in order to make it worthwhile they had to find a way to double their income, and he did find a way. He started bottling his own milk and did it his own way. And he knew how to do it.”

Forty years after its establishment and after a series of life-changing events which included the death of Sally in 2018 and then George less than a year later, the Shetler Family Dairy closed its doors in August of 2019. While many of the Shetler’s personal treasures and farm equipment were offered at public auction on Aug. 29, the very essence of the family business, the bottling equipment, production techniques, and trademark

recipes had been acquired by Farmers’ Creamery in Mio, Mich., a newly established dairy of similar design.

In addition to everyday restaurant equipment and supplies, industry-related collectibles could be found around every corner and were displayed against the backdrop of what had not-so-long ago been the dairy’s storefront. Bidders reminisced as they bid on cow print booth seats, \$22.50 each, a cow-shaped silhouette chalkboard sign offering a list of various ice cream flavors (\$50), and a large board painted to resemble the classic American Gothic scene but with cutouts for faces and even a hole to allow access to hold a pitch fork as a prop (\$25). Even Lambert participated in enthusiastically recalling days of the past when a vintage full-body cow costume (complete with Styrofoam cow pie) was held up. “Hey! I remember this from the Kalkaska County Fair!” he exclaimed. The costume quickly raced to a final bid of \$90.

A neatly preserved cow hide was yet another highlight as it climbed to \$275 without hesitation. In the same row of items, bidders discovered a black Kitchen Aid mixer (\$190), a vintage gumball machine (\$55), and a primitive pie safe painted tan with cream trim (\$100).

Other items that spoke to the classic farm-visit experience included 20 plus antique milk and cream cans. For upwards of \$45 apiece, bidders were able to take their

pick of which one they wanted to take home as a memento. The smaller cream cans were first pick, while others were gradually selected as the price dropped to \$17.50 each. For \$70, a bidder took home an extra long picnic table upon which many meals had undoubtedly been shared by both family and customers over the years. Similarly, a vintage ice cream parlor table with matching chairs found a new home for \$60, and a matching set of four vintage ice cream bar stools followed suit for \$40.

Household items varied from modern to antique. Among the bedroom sets displayed on the lawn stood a Thermal Life sauna that had not previously been assembled until it was clearly a favorite among bidders at a final hammer price of \$1,300. A few pieces of antique furniture stood out among the rest. A large, ornate, curved-front curio cabinet with a mirrored back and four solid wood shelves sold for \$325 while an antique two-tone wardrobe with beveled-mirrored doors and ornate trim followed close behind at \$300. Another solid oak piece in a lighter finish but of a much larger scale had previously held George’s toy farm implement collection. It sold for \$200 and will soon be used to store a collection of antique books.

Smaller collectibles included a vintage gossip bench (\$50), a wooden WE Meyers & Sons Merchandise Mart Laundry Kart com-

plete with wicker clothes basket (\$100), a pair of lightening rods with glass balls (\$65 each), and numerous boxes of carefully wrapped cow figurines from various eras (\$32.50 each).

Auctioneer Greg Zuiderveen commanded the second auction ring, which was dedicated primarily to farm equipment and was broadcast live online through Hibid.com starting at 11 a.m. First up was a Co-op 4, wide front tractor that was not in pristine condition but had been running earlier in the week. It sold for \$700. The Massey-Harris parked next in line resulted in the same final bid amount; however, bidders raised their sights with a Case 995 (\$1,500) and a John Deere B (\$1,700).

what was happening, interest in collecting Rookwood would, in his mind, be positively impacted.

In addition to the importance of the human interest aspect of the story, Batchelor pointed to the civic role played by Rookwood in the Queen City. “Rookwood helped establish Cincinnati as a leading city,” he said, and the pottery was an important tourist destination. Even now, weekend factory tours (conducted before the pandemic) were regularly sold out.

“Handcrafted,” “handmade,” “artisan”: These concepts associated with Rookwood are in keeping with today’s tenets, the author believes. Batchelor maintains that even though we live in a mass commodity society, there is an emerging appreciation for quality objects. “Rookwood fills that gap.” New collectors are attracted to Rookwood because it is an iconic American brand. Owning a piece of history, something with historic value, is desirable and within reach, he said.

Today’s collectors are introduced to Rookwood in a variety of ways. Batchelor suggested that a collection often begins accidentally, with the purchase or inheritance of one beautiful piece. Vintage examples are available at antique malls, and sometimes at a yard sale. Vintage pieces can be found for as little as \$100, although pieces by well-known artists are much more. The pottery is still in business and new pieces start at \$40.

No discussion of this subject would be complete without noting that the Cincinnati-based auction house of Humler & Nolan hosted its final auction of Rookwood pottery last spring, a bittersweet event as the pottery company marked its 140th anniversary. And although he does not discount the ramifications of this decision, Batchelor, who devoted one year of his life to his newly released book, remains hopeful. “It’s a travesty that very few people, nationally, know about Rookwood,” he concluded.
